Michael Collins, who resides in Texas, generously donates his time, skill and labor of love to create amazing memorial cross projects for families who have lost loved ones tragically, especially young people. It all started when he lost his son Brady in a car accident. The Lord said build a memorial and he did. Then for the kids in Uvalde, then for Athena Strand who was taken by the FedEx driver and murdered and most recently for Laken Riley who was murdered while jogging in Georgia. Laken's memorial cross was just finished and will be delivered to Elon Cemetery in Woodstock, Georgia on March 29. His latest

calling was for Emily Pike, a young member of the San Carlos Apache Tribe whose remains were found North of Globe on Valentine's Day. Mr. Collins stated "Indigenous voices will be heard through this cross for sure!"

He will be delivering Emily's memorial cross to the San Carlos area in May. This will be the largest cross he has ever made and delivered. Collins sister, Shawna, spearheads the Gofundme pages for all of the crosses



and travel expenses. There is currently a Gofundme account for Emily's cross materials and travel expenses to get himself, his team and the massive cross to San Carlos. You can donate by scanning the QR Code dis-



The Christian Life Can't Be Explained, It Must Be Experienced

One of the challenges I have as a pastor is trying to convey to non-Christians the value of turning to Jesus Christ and God. For the dedicated Christian, this is a no-brainer. We're talking eternal life, a God who bestows His blessings richly upon us, a life full of purpose and direction, a spirt-filled life. the tools to fight depression, anxiety, and stress, strong relationships with those I love, and a personal relationship with the God of the universe. Again, it's a no-brainer.

But for non-Christians, they tend to only see the so-called restrictions of Christianity. And it's true. God asks for us to make changes in our lives, one that reflect His holiness, His righteousness, and His purpose. I live a certain way, don't do certain things, and avoid certain places so that my life is a reflection of God's holiness. He asked us to be holy because He is holy (1 Peter 1:16). To do that takes sacrifice, dedication, and the willingness to change your old lifestvle.

I'm not perfect at it. Far from it. I'm, at best, a sinner saved by grace. But I do try for several reasons. First, I owe my eternal destiny to Jesus Christ who died on the cross to pay for my sins—sins that would send me to hell otherwise. Second, the Christian life has brought me so much joy, happiness, and fulfillment that it defies my ability to express it.

And that's the point. Even if someone could prove there is no God, I would still live the Christian life because of what it has given me. But non-Christians aren't necessarily convinced of hell or even of God's existence. They often seek a life that is fulfilling to them, doing things they think will bring them happiness. They can't see that end result in the Christian life, and I won't be able to argue it successfully.

Because the Christian life must be experienced to understand it.

There are some things in life that simply must be experienced to fully appreciate and comprehend it. Take skydiving. Until you strap on a para-

chute and jump out of an airplane, you will never fully appreciate or understand the thrill (or terror) of it. It can only be experienced, not explained. The same is true with the Christian life.

If I could convince people to truly give the Christian life a shot, to make the sacrifices and changes necessary, I believe everyone—and I mean everyone—would want to be a Christian simply because of what God does for each person who comes to Him. I can't explain it with words. It must be experienced.

In fact, there are many Christians who have not strapped on the parachute and not jumped out of the airplane. They may go to church. They may claim a belief in God or Jesus Christ, but they have never really experienced the Christian life. They still cling to worldly habits and ways. This keeps them from fully enjoying everything that God would love to give them.

My only advice to anyone reading this is give Jesus Christ a try—a real try. I dare you.
