How Desert Plants Survive the Dryest Time of Year

Now that it's May, the days are getting hot and the last rains of spring are over. If you're a gardener, that means giving your plants plenty of water and maybe shading them. So, how do the wild plants of **Tonto National Monument** cope with the hot and dry summer on their own? Here are some of the tricks that Sonoran Desert plants use to survive the harshest time of the year. All green plants perform photosynthesis-using energy from sunlight to convert carbon dioxide into oxygen—but the pores they use to "breathe" carbon dioxide in and oxygen out also let

water evaporate. Woody plants like ocotillo and paloverde have their

breathing pores in their leaves, so during hot and dry conditions, they simply lose their leaves and wait it out. They

don't grow during this time, but they save precious water. When the rain returns, they produce new leaves and resume photosynthesis.

While most plants need to keep their breathing pores open during phosucculents tosynthesis, like cacti split the process into two steps. During the day, they keep their pores closed while the sunshine charges a sort of chemical "battery" inside the plant. Then, in the cool of the

night, they open their pores and continue the process using the stored energy. Look up "CAM photosynthesis" if you'd like to know more.

For many of Arizona's

little as a few weeks. They sprout from seeds after winter rain, grow quickly, produce new seeds, and die. The tough seeds can survive the heat of See DESERT on page 2



summer until the next winter's rain lets them sprout and start the cvcle over.

Finally, a few large species survive dry seasons through brute force. Even in the worst droughts, water persists deep in the soil-too deep for most plants to

reach. However, mesquite trees can sink their roots over 50 feet deep to reach reliable water all vear.

Visitors to Tonto National Monument will get to see all of these plants weather the harsh conditions, but they should be ready for those conditions themselves. The

GLOBE, AZ - Cobre Valley Regional Medical Center (CVRMC) is excited to announce the future opening of its much-anticipated "Highway 60 Clinic," a walk-in clinic located near Cal Ranch and Walmart. This new facility is set to provide essential healthcare services to the community, offering a convenient option for those seeking immediate medical attention without the need for an appointment.

The journey to establish the Highway 60 Clinic has not been without challenges. The initial plans for the clinic encountered an unexpected delay when it was discovered that the proposed location fell within a designated floodway.

On July 29, FEMA issued a LOMR, paving the way for the new clinic. The new facility will offer extend hours to walk-in patients, providing a convenient, affordable option for healthcare services. While the specific timeline for construction and opening is still being finalized, the team is working diligently to bring the project to completion as swiftly as possible.

CVRMC is committed to keeping the community informed as progress continues. Updates on the clinic's development will be shared regularly, with a focus on ensuring that residents are aware of the new healthcare options that will soon be available.

The opening of the Highway 60 Clinic represents a significant step forward in CVRMC's mission to provide comprehensive, accessible healthcare to the region. The medical center looks forward to welcoming patients to this new facility and continuing its tradition of high-quality care for the community.

Becoming a Christian is not so hard. All you need to do is trust Jesus as your Savior, trusting Him for your eternal salvation. Doing that adopts you into the family of God, you become a joint heir with Jesus Christ, and you become a citizen of Heaven. It's that simple (John 3:16: Romans 10:13: Ephesians 2:8-9). But living a Christian life is a completely different story, and it was never meant to be easy. And thank God it is not! The value of something is often determined by its rarity and its higher standards. Take a diamond. Diamonds are rated on size, clarity, color, and cut. The more rigid the standards, the greater the value the diamond has that can meet those standards.

 Love Jesus more than yourself (Lule 14:26).

3. Take up and bear a cross of suffering, of duty, and of sacrifice (Luke 14:27).

4. Forsake everything else for Christ (Luke 14:33).

And those are just the tip of the iceberg. God meant for the Christian life to be one that requires work, dedication, and determination.

Think of the military. If you want to be a Navy SEAL, a Green Beret, or join the Force RECON, you must meet a higher standard than merely joining the Army as a buck private. These higher standards give these men and women more value and a greater pur-
