# Say Her Name: A Love Cross for Emily Pike

A grieving community found renewed hope on the fi rst Saturday of May with the raising of a 1,700 pound cross, made and gifted to the community by a foundation called Brady's Love Cross Ministry.

The wind whipped around, sending a few chairs forward, knocking into the backs of other chairs both empty and full. "There's wind because a woman is mad," joked one of the bystanders in the back. A few of us stood up to collect chairs, others made sure the seating arena tent was secure enough to withstand the gusts. Once everything was secure, strangers spoke amongst each other over light refreshments, an ode to the inclusivity that has been fostered in the community, a trait only heightened in the

"I've been up since 3:30 to make it here. I've had nieces go missing from group homes. They were found, fortunately, but Emily's story hits close to home for me." Over 100 people from all over gathered to witness the raising of Emily Pike's cross behind Bashas near the water tower that's been memorialized with a mural of her vibrant smile, bright eyes, and beautiful golden skin.

She has become the face of awareness for MMIW, or Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women, through not only her tragic ending, but also through her relatability. Crossing over at just 14 years old, Emily has become everyone's daughter, niece, cousin, sister, friend.

Her immediate family, though, knew her best. They described her as strong and "free like the wind," perhaps a reason for the strong gusts that day, as a way to say I am stronger and freer than ever. She was a kind and loving girl who wouldn't think twice about helping another, there was nothing holding her tenacious spirit down.

At about 9AM, Redrum bik-

ers escorted in the honored guests of Brady's Love Cross Ministry, who had built and then delivered the cross all the way from Mineral Wells, Texas

Brady's Love Cross Ministry was started by Michael Collins, who began building crosses after the tragic loss of his own son, Brady. Brady had come to him in a dream, creating the image of the cross that Collins knew he had to build. In this specially designed cross is a heart carved into the sturdy steel and positioned East to refl ect the light perfectly at sunrise. The light makes the cross come alive, emitting a shadow of a heart upon the ground. The heart is also carved at an angle that only allows water from rain to flow in a certain way, leading to a strategic rust pattern that represents the bleeding heart that grief entails. While Brady's cross holds his ashes and will one day be Collins' resting place as well, Emily's cross has a letter to Heaven box, bold pink lettering of both her name and MMIW, the red handprints of MMIW, as well as images of the Apache Tribe seal, Hello Kitty, cat paws, butterflies, and a cartoon likeness of her fur daughter, Millie.

Millie now is a mother herself to a litter of kittens and spends her nights cuddling and bringing comfort to Emily's grandmother. When curiosity struck about butterflies, her family shared, with smiles lighting their faces at the memory of Emily, that "she used to catch butterflies with a giant net. There is a stream not too far from us, and many butterflies would pass through there." She loved butterflies, her kitty, and also enjoyed eating cranberry sauce by the spoonfuls, a treat Emily did not reserve strictly for family gatherings.

Brady's Love Cross Ministry has built 6 crosses before Emily Pike's, and the crew headed out Sunday to

continue work on their upcoming builds. All crosses are built on donations and gifted to communities free of charge. Michael Collins attests that God speaks through his heart, and that is how he chooses who to build a cross for. In previous interviews, Collins has also commented on Emily's smile, a show stopping feature that is surely noticed nationwide.

God speaks to Collins through dreams and intuition of the heart, one of the ways he has pieced together his group of 5 board members. His group consists of a fellow welder who helps with the build, named Clark Brooks who also serves as the president; a minister who holds service after a cross has been raised named Clell Eskew who also serves as director: the treasurer Shawna Collins; James Lindley, the vice president; and a secretary, Dusty McCray, who is his self-proclaimed

wingman. "I ride in with him and we sing along to Christian rock and have conversation. We gotta keep it light." Dusty and Collins became acquainted when Collins felt the intuitive call to reach out to Dusty on TikTok one day, where they began conversing. They learned that they had each lost a child all too soon to a car accident, on the exact same street. Dusty has also felt another layer of loss when her husband ended his own life. Traveling with Collins has given her a humbling purpose to help others find peace after grief.

Dusty and Collins first met in person at the cross raising of Laken Hope Riley, a Georgia nursing student who had been murdered by an illegal immigrant. Dusty shares that while she was there, she extended a hug to Riley's sister, who lingered for a longer hug. Something about it,

Dusty could not completely let the sister go, so she kept her arm around her for a portion of the build. When she rested her head on Dusty, tears streaming down her face, Dusty also lost it, crying alongside her, sharing in the grief. "It's humbling," she explains about the peace and closure they try to bring. She has been Collins' right hand ever since, sitting shotgun, answering questions, and taking care of the traveling dogs that had once belonged to Brady.

The raising of the cross for Emily Pike exposed tears streaming down Dusty's face, a quiet strength radiating from Collins, and words of God spoken in the free space. There was hesitation about whether Emily Pike's cross would be installed on May 3, as planned. Collins provided trust in God as he reminded vice chair Tao Eptisom that it was in God's hands, and that it would happen. Sure enough, by the evening of May 2, a location was decided upon and the cross had arrived safely in Gila county.

The water tower behind Bashas in the Peridot district of the San Carlos reservation was adorned with a mural painted by local artist Myron Starr alongside 6 other Arizona-based artists. Beside it is a plot of land with no piping underneath and thus the perfect spot for the cross, which required a 5 foot hole to secure the 1,700 pounds of crafted steel. Without even realizing it, the location of the cross has even more meaning than sitting beside a well done mural. To the North of the cross, in plain view, is a plateau in the distance. Emily was close with her cousin, many calling them "two peas in a pod." While in the home, Emily made a simple "I love you" video for her cousin who could not visit. With sad eyes and a gentle vet glowing smile, Emily's cousin showed off a lettered bracelet Emily made for her while explaining that they used to hike together on that plateau, often resting and chatting with each other where it splits off. Emily's cross will forever look out towards the plateau, perhaps another glimmer of God's plan.

Before building crosses paved God's purpose for Collins, he had to overcome a heavy addiction. Less than 5% of meth addicts will stay clean after 3 years of sobriety. Shortly after his passing, Collins made Brady's initials

out of metal and branded them into the flesh near his heart as a commitment to living a clean life. He has been sober for 5 and a half years, and with his purpose of building crosses and bringing peace to grieving communities, he has no worries of ever going back.

With tragedy, a renewed sense of community and purpose can be found. While the family shared that Emily loved fashion and would walk on her toes as though she were wearing high heels, there is no tip toeing around the fact that at 14 years of age, Emily Pike's life ended all too soon. Her killer is still out there, and although all attendees prayed that he be caught or step forward, this cross is meant to act as a reminder that we cannot let this happen again.

Roughly 84 percent of native women have experienced violence in their lifetime and homicide is the third most common cause of death among native women. Homicide is the third leading cause of death, as

native women are 10 times more likely to die by homicide than any other race (stats can be found on the NCAU website). Welded and cemented into the ground, painted with a total of 10 coats of white pearl and clear coat paint, this cross is a reminder of all the indigenous women who go missing and murdered without

justice. It is a reminder that something has to change so justice can be found. It is a reminder that everyone's daughter, sister, cousin, niece, and friend is part of the MMIW statistic at too young of an age. So the next time the wind blows or a butterfly flutters by, think of the community and say her name: Emily Pike.

You may believe you have done such horrible wrong that you are irredeemable, but it is not your position...rather your direction that God judges.

> Take the very intriguing passage found in Ezekiel 18:21-28. Here God clearly explains that it is the direction of a man, not his position, that causes judgment. You may have done some very horrible things in your life, but if you repent and draw closer to God, you can find tremendous blessings from God. But if you once did good things, but turn back and move away from God, then you may be denied God's blessings-regardless of what you may have once accomplished for good.

on to nursing school and graduated in 1986 from George D. Wallace State Community College in Dothan. AL.


Penni worked as a traveling nurse for several years before settling down in Globe, AZ and continued her nursing career at CVRMC until retiring in 2014. Penni then went on





# INDIAN TRUST SETTLEMENT

# Are you an Heir of an Individual Indian Money Account Holder?

# \$38 MILLION IS AVAILABLE TO PAY HEIRS. THE DEADLINE TO FILE A CLAIM IS JUNE 30, 2025.

A \$3.4 billion dollar settlement was approved in a class action lawsuit, called *Cobell v. Salazar*, that claimed individual Indian land, funds and other assets were mismanaged by the federal government. \$38 million is available to pay heirs and awards could be significant.



#### Who is eligible?

You are eligible for a money award if you are an heir of one or more of the over 17,000 Individual Indian Money (IIM) account holders whose *Cobell* settlement awards were not distributed. You must submit a claim form with proof that you are an heir. Claim forms can be submitted online or can be downloaded and mailed to the administrator by **June 30, 2025**. More details are available on the website.

#### Here's what you need.

Heir eligibility proof includes any of the following:

- A state or tribal probate order identifying estate heirs; or
- A last will and testament approved by a probate order; or
- A small estate document from an approved state in accordance with small estate procedures; or

- Documentation showing the appointment of an estate Executor, Administrator, or Personal Representative; or
- A federal probate order that directs distribution of trust funds or trust lands.

A copy of a tribal, or state, or federal probate order is needed to establish whether the Settlement Administrator can pay the heir(s) directly for the estate's Settlement award.

If you do not have a tribal or state probate order but a personal representative or executor has been named for the estate, funds may be released to the representative or executor and they will be responsible for distributing the funds according to the wishes of the deceased Class Member.

You must act quickly.

The deadline to file is June 30, 2025.

After the deadline, all remaining funds will be distributed to the Cobell Scholarship Fund, which is managed by Indigenous Education, Inc.




