County rejects likely toothless moratorium

Board members suggest they could approve resolution minus moratorium

CLINTON — A majority of the DeWitt County Board voted Oct. 19 to reject a moratorium on C02 pipelines in the county that would be ultimately unenforceable, state's attorney Dan

Markwell said.

County board member and land use committee chairman Buck Carter introduced the moratorium, which he based on similar moratoriums passed by other counties in the path of the pipeline.

One company plans a CO2 pipeline that would pass through DeWitt County on its way to sequestration wells in Macon County. A second company has proposed

another project that would include C02 wells in the northwest portion of DeWitt County.

Carter and others worry there could be a risk to the Mahomet aquifer posed by the wells and pipeline. He suggested the moratorium apply to any aspect of a pipeline project, including agreements or requests, until federal agencies approve official regulations for governing CO2 pipelines.

DeWitt County State's Attorney Dan Markwell, however, said such a moratorium would not be enforceable because the federal government has sole regulatory power over pipelines.

Board members
Joe Witte and Terry
Ferguson expressed
their willingness to vote
in favor of a resolution
asking the state and federal
government to reexamine
pipeline regulations. But,
they said they couldn't
vote for a moratorium if
the county had no power
to enforce one.

Ferguson said the ideas expressed in the resolution

could be submitted to the Illinois Commerce Commission as testimony from the county for permitting purposes.

"I brought that up two months ago, and Mr. Markwell declined to advance it," Carter said.

"Just to clarify, I didn't decline to advance anything," Markwell said. "I don't have that authority."

Markwell said board chairman Dan Matthews asked his opinion about the original motion, and Markwell explained he would not be able to attend the meeting.

attend the meeting.

"I suggested we not proceed unless I'm here, and people could ask questions," Markwell said. "And, that was a motion to intervene within permit applications with the commerce commission."



He said he could also explain why the county should not intervene in someone else's permit

Carter said he felt the resolution with a moratorium might help get some answers for people living in the path of the proposed pipeline.

He said the county might not have any say over how pipeline projects are handled, "but, we can express our concerns to the commerce commission."

Some board members have been consistent about resisting the C02 well and pipeline projects in the county, while others

have said they do not yet have enough information to decide.

The board voted 7-4 with 1 abstention to reject the resolution. Some of the board, however, was receptive to bringing back a resolution that did not include moratorium language



2002 - Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva was elected president of Brazil in a runoff. He was the country's first elected leftist leader.



A pledge for improved health care

Veterans Affairs has hooked up with 13 civilian health care systems with the goal of improving veteran health care, whether those veterans are getting their care in or out of the VA.

The Veteran Interoperability Pledge has been made by those systems health care with agreements to exchange information and collaborate with the VA in several ways: Identify veterans when they go for civilian care, connect veterans with resources (especially ones that reduce the veteran's expenses) and coordinate

The Department of care. The information will be shared both ways.

> Specifically, the VA will: -- Let the civilian health care systems into the VA system to determine a veteran's status.

> -- Automate the process of determining eligibility and referrals.

-- Let the health systems have access to health resources at the state and federal levels

-- Let the health systems have access to clinical and admin data to assess and coordinate care

Will the veteran have a say in whether his personal information is shared with the VA after seeing a civilian provider?

A recent VA news release states that the VA will "safeguard the privacy and security" of veteran information.

Is anyone concerned about hacking? This year one health care group (of the 13 systems that have made the pledge) had a data breach of 1,600 patients. 

Stir-fry Yangzhou Chau fan

Welcome to my little corner of culinary delights.

Yangzhou Chau fan is a fried rice in the style of Yangzhou. This is a popular eastern China dish that I hope you like as well as I. I chose it since it is relatively easy, but with sufficient challenge for the beginner. It should be enough to serve a dozen people.

Last article covered making char sui which will be used in this recipe. If you have not made it, the simply use roasted pork butt roast. Follow the slicing procedure given in the last article and let us begin.

Part of your mise-enplace is to have 5 large eggs beaten with ¼ teaspoon of salt. Reserve. Combine 1 ounce soy sauce, 2 fluid ounces of rice wine, 1 ounce oyster sauce, 1 tablespoon sesame oil, and 1 ounce each of salt and sugar. Reserve.

The other part of your mise-en-place is to have the roast all sliced, cooked, and ready to go. If you do not already have rice cooked, then cook some.



4 cups each of long-grain rice and water will give you approximately 8 cups worth of cooked rice. I chose long-grain since it is less starchy. Thinly slice scallions on a bias.

Place the wok ring over a stove burner. Put about 2 ounces of lard into the wok. Peanut oil can be substituted. Turn the heat up to high. As soon as the lard just begins to smoke, add 6 ounces of shrimp. The shrimp should be at room temperature. It is important to not cool down the grease. Stirfry until all the shrimp turns pinkish (about 30 seconds). At this point, remove the shrimp and reserve. Then pour off the grease and reserve. Return wok to its ring.

Now that there is only a coating of grease in the wok, one must work very fast. Stir-fry the eggs until they just begin to solidify. In past articles, I cautioned about not over cooking eggs. That holds true here. Slide the eggs off onto a cutting board. Slice into strips for eating with chopsticks.

Here comes the fun part. Return the wok to its ring and add 2 ounces of lard. When it again gives off whiffs of smoke, put in the ginger and cook for 5 seconds. No, this is not a typographical error. 5 seconds, not 5 minutes. Then add the garlic and cook 5 more seconds all the while stirring.

Next, add the pork and stir-fry for about 1 minute. Add the shrimp, rice, eggs, and the sauce concoction. Keep stirring. The scallions go in last. Add the reserved lard and you are done.

Yes, I know how most people feel about lard. It might not seem so bad if you recall my article regarding cooking oils. It is article 170 and published on April 17, 2020. But as stated above, you can substitute peanut oil in this recipe.



A GOOD ATTITUDE


Against 4♥ West leads the Club Ten, won by East's Ace. A Diamond shift is clearly called for, and the standard play from that holding is the Ten, the socalled "top of an interior sequence". Is that your choice or are there other considerations?

If West has Ace doubleton in Diamonds then East can envisage a trump promotion if West also has the right trump holding. But, as it happens, West has ◆AQ and the danger is that West will win the ◆Q on the first round of the suit. That would be the right play if East held a trump honor but not the ♦K, but it would be disastrous on the actual layout, killing the chance of a trump promotion.

In the middle of the hand (starting at Trick 2), many partnerships play "attitude leads", whereby shifting to a low card usually shows a high card in the suit, and shifting to a high card is either from a weak holding or from the top of a sequence. So, reasoning that it is more important to advertise his ◆K than it is to make an ambiguous interior sequence lead, East shifts to the Diamond Two. Of course, West must be alert and majestically squander his Ace on that trick. Then, back comes the \(\Phi \)Q overtaken by East's King, and the third round of Diamonds promotes the setting trump trick. Nice defense!

A Spectacular Deception! Next, imagine that West holds ◆AQ9 and East ◆KT2. Again the opening lead is a Club to East's Ace and again a low Diamond comes back. West, who is a shockingly devious fellow, wins with his Ace and returns the ◆Q. East overtakes that and sends back a third Diamond. Naturally, Declarer ruffs high, and later finds out to his chagrin that trumps are 4-1 and that he has just gone down in a cold contract!
