Upgrades planned for CHS sports complex

CLINTON — At the Sept. 19 school board meeting, it was agreed to seek bids to upgrade the football field and track at Clinton High School during the summer of 2024. This plan includes moving the football field and track to the west to accommodate an eight-lane track in maroon and gold as well as putting turf on the football field. In addition, it would situate new light poles to accommodate a future phase of improvements.

Dubbed “Lanes, Lights and Turf,” according to Superintendent Curt Nettles, the project is

estimated to cost about \$2.5 million.

Board member Sondra Baker inquired if the Future Farmers of America (FFA) plot and the tree line would be impacted.

“Some of those trees are going to have to go,” said Nettles, but added “we don’t plan on eating into (the FFA plot.)”

The board also approved getting bids for new flooring for the commons area and bathrooms at Clinton Junior High School. A quote of \$88,347 was provided last April but Assistant Superintendent Drew Goebel was hopeful new bids would show a decrease in cost.

No board consensus after CO2 ‘no’ vote

CLINTON — The county board continued its discussion Sept. 21 about the future of CO2 injection wells in DeWitt County. The board already voted unanimously in August to ban carbon sequestration wells from all of the county’s zoning districts.

The board’s vote in August came despite a plea from former Logan County board chairman David Helper. Helper said his county hired an expert to guide it through the process of making a decision. He cited the high

number of Nobel Prize scientists who support carbon sequestration as a method of removing climate damaging CO2 from the atmosphere.

Helper said DeWitt County’s decision should be based on “substance and evidence.”

The county has not yet banned CO2 pipelines passing through the county. One firm has proposed such a pipeline, which would terminate in Decatur. Another firm has proposed sequestration wells in northwest DeWitt County.

CLINTON — Late on Tuesday, September 19, the motorcade from the final 2023 Land of Lincoln Honor Flight arrived in Clinton with three local veterans.

The men were escorted home via motorcade, arriving in the parking lot of Tractor Supply Company, located on Clinton’s west side. This

last flight carried two World War II veterans, 10 Korean War veterans and 82 Vietnam era veterans for a total of 94 veterans participating.

The vets were able to experience the awe of the armed forces memorials and some of the museums in Washington D. C.

Those returning from this flight were U.S. Army veteran Larry Humphreys, U.S. Army veteran David S. Randolph and U.S. Air

Force veteran Bob Carter. All three men are Vietnam era veterans, who served the country at home and abroad.

The veterans said they were impressed and enthusiastic by the sights they saw and encouraged other veterans to make the trip themselves if they have not already.

If the bids are acceptable and the board approves the project moving forward, Nettles hoped the it could be completed over the upcoming Christmas break.

Bids to make the playgrounds more accessible were also discussed with board president Dan Matthews expressing surprise at the cost.

"I didn't think it would be three-quarters of a million dollars," said Matthews after learning of a bid for approximately \$750,000 to make the outdoor play areas at Lincoln, Douglas, and Clinton Elementary schools more accessible for special needs students.

Board member Jenny Haycraft Rudat asked how long the rubberized surface would last but an answer was not immediately available, so the board agreed to continue to review the possible project.

In other matters, the board:

- approved the FY 2024 budget.
- appointed board member Rudat as the Illinois Association of School Board (IASB) liaison.
- approved a reading curriculum alignment plan.
- approved the following

appointments: Lee Mendez, custodian; Tanner Schmid, Ashley Huffman, Megan Andreae, and Kyle Patterson, paraprofessionals, Amy Mason, Brenda Phelps, Maggie Phillips, bus monitors; Brenton Baise, bus driver; Judy Thompson, crossing guard; Denise Hickman and Samantha Water, CHS aides.

County board member Joe Witte said he felt the vote to ban sequestration wells was important to establish the county's position on the subject, but he also said he did not yet feel he knew enough yet about sequestration that his "no" vote would be permanent.

"For me, there are a lot of things I still have questions on," Witte said. "Even as far as where the county's jurisdiction

begins and ends."

He urged additional study about the topic by the county.

"Do we want to consider looking into the science behind some of the questions we might have," Witte asked.

Witte said, as with some other board members, he too was concerned about the Mahomet Aquifer, from which most of the county draws its drinking water.

"There might be science out there that says it can be done," he said.

Board member Patrick Ryan said he feared, once the CO2 wells were introduced into the county, it would cause a proliferation of additional wells. Ryan also questioned whether sequestration would have any meaningful effect on reducing CO2 in the atmosphere, saying it would be "infinitesimal."

The U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) released a comprehensive assessment of geologic carbon sequestration in 2013, which estimated a mean storage potential in the U.S. of 3,000 metric gigatons of carbon dioxide and a likely storage range of from 2,400-3,700 metric gigatons.

Board member Buck Carter objected to the wells and also any pipelines passing through the county. He felt it was crucial to protect the aquifer.

"As far as these wells, as far as I'm concerned, that's a 'no'," Carter said. "You'll never get me to vote for a well."

Carter said he felt any risk to the aquifer was too great.

"There's other places they can do it," he said.

The board did not make any firm commitment to additional action.

Also, during the Sept. 21 meeting, the board approved the appointment of Tony Harris as new DeWitt County animal control administrator at a salary of \$22,000. Harris also will continue his duties as the county's CenCom coordinator.

Questions & Answers

General Question:
I usually get my benefit payment on the third of the month. But what if the third falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or holiday? Will my payment be late?

Answer:
Just the opposite. Your payment should arrive early. For example, if you usually get your payment on the third of a month, but it falls on a weekend or legal holiday, we will send payments on the business day prior to the due date. Question:
I got married and I need to change my name in Social Security's records. What do I do?



Answer:
If you change your name due to marriage or for any other reason, you'll need to report the change and get a corrected Social Security card with your new name. You will need to fill out Form SS-5. You can get a copy of this form by visiting www.ssa.gov/forms/ss-5.pdf or by calling our toll-free number 1-800-772-1213 (TTY 1-800-325-0778). You'll also need to provide the original marriage certificate showing your new and old names. You can mail or take the documentation to your local Social Security office. In some cases, we may need other forms of documentation as well. For more information, visit www.ssa.gov/ssnumber.

In the world of scams, just when you think scammers can't possibly come up with new ideas, they do.

One of the worst now is the fake fraud alert for protection services. You'll get an emergency message or call saying that someone is trying to access your account. The "helper" from your "bank" asks if you want to temporarily transfer your money to a safe, protected account while officials work it out, and you say yes. And ... there goes your money, never to be seen again. If you ever get a call such as this, hang up and call your bank to ask if they called you.

And then, of course, there are all the old standard scams. There is the grandparent scam where a thief calls and pretends to be a grandchild who is in jail and desperate to be bailed out. There is the romance scam where a supposed suitor pretends to get close to you over time and then asks for money or wants to do a joint financial investment. And the driveway repaving/home repair scam where they promise to do a fine job on the work, but you'll need to pay a bit upfront for materials and supplies. And lest we forget, there are the computer repairs wherein they need remote access to your computer,

the work from home scams, fake Amazon text alerts, etc.

Beware any calls or text messages that push you to act now, that insert urgency or fear into the situation. Don't fall for it. Hang up and don't click links. Make a call yourself to see if the situation was legitimate and carefully delete the text message.

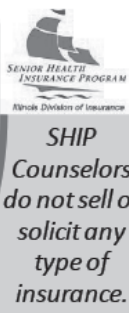
Darlene was preceded in death by her parents, two brothers and one sister.

1960 - “My Three Sons” debuted on ABC-TV.

1992 - Brazilian lawmakers overwhelmingly voted to impeach President Fernando Collor de Mello.

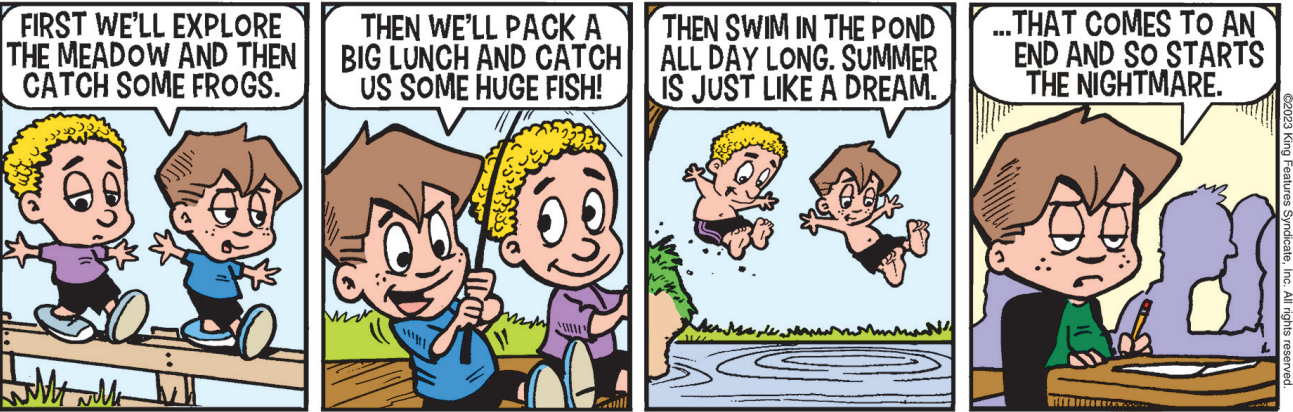
1993 - Bosnia’s parliament voted overwhelmingly to reject an international peace plan unless Bosnian Serbs returned land that had been taken by force.

Protect your privacy, change your Facebook settings

Facebook “hacking” is a countywide concern. Rarely a week goes by that I don’t see someone I know who has been hacked or “cloned” on Facebook. Many of these intrusions originate from Nigeria and other nations. Arguably, this is neither a law enforcement problem nor a public safety responsibility, but it is a more serious threat than it might seem at first glance. We do, after all, host a nuclear power plant in our county. Consider the impact if

a bunch of fake profiles impersonating local people were to spread misinformation during some future event, real or imagined, surrounding our nuclear plant, our schools or some other event. It is important to review your Facebook privacy settings and change “Who Can See Your Friends List” from “Public” to “Only You.” Most users should also review and change: who can “follow” them, “tag” them, or post anything on their page. Allowing



anyone from anywhere around the world to see your friends list, “follow” you, or like or comment on your activity on Facebook is why so many people are being stalked and hacked. Most users chose the default privacy settings suggested by Facebook when they set up their account years ago. Those

are the most lax settings available, and should be reviewed and changed. Help stop the spread of Facebook hacking. Protect yourself. Help your friends. Review your Facebook privacy settings. Those of you who do not know if your friends’ lists are public or are not public, please review your privacy settings. If you need help, please ask. Stop letting the entire world see your friends list. **Bradley Barnes**

Wait times for community care

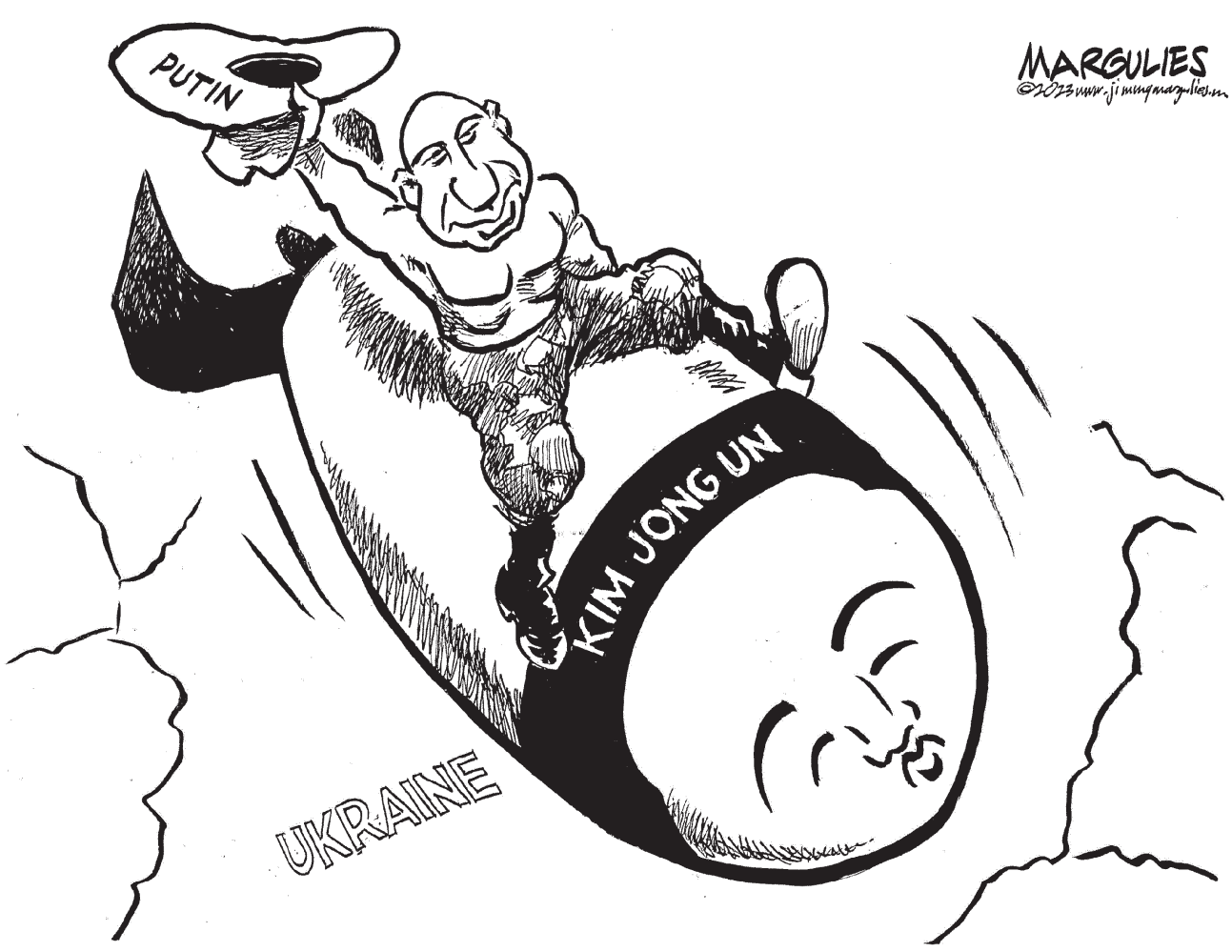
Despite the amount of attention paid to it over the years, the Department of Veterans Affairs still struggles with wait times for medical appointments. Wait time eligibility becomes crucial when a veteran seeks medical care through Community Care. With the wrong wait time, the veteran can be denied treatment out in the community. The calculation of wait times has to be exact, either 20 or 28 days depending on the type of care. If you are a VA staffer in charge of making Community Care medical appointments for a veteran patient, which



of the following options do you choose in setting the appointment for a patient and starting the wait time clock? The date the provider wants the patient to be seen ... the date the patient wants to be seen ... the date the care provider or the veteran makes a request for an appointment? Only one of those is correct. The correct answer is that the starting date for calculating wait time is that moment when

a care provider or veteran asks for an appointment. Unfortunately, in one location, staff was using a combination of methods for calculating wait times using their own unauthorized wait time calculator they created from an online app. It threw off the numbers by 12 days, making it look like veterans were not eligible for Community Care. The ongoing mistake only came to light when a trainer used that same calculator in another facility. At the same time, a veteran had been denied Community Care because the inaccurate calculations

indicated that he was not wait-time eligible and he was given a VA facility appointment instead. As a result, there was a congressional inquiry. The Office of Inspector General for the VA stepped in and discovered a great big mess of confusion and inconsistency at both facilities due to staffers using a calculator that a member of staff had made. A SALUTE TO FARMERS

IFB outlines must-pass farm bill provisions

Illinois Farm Bureau is urging federal lawmakers from Illinois to enact a farm bill this year that features must-pass support for farmers when markets and the weather turn for the worse.

In a letter sent Sept. 12 to Illinois' congressional delegation, IFB President Richard Guebert Jr. outlined the organization's priorities among the 12 titles in the five-year legislation, which is set to expire Sept. 30.

Above all measures, Guebert wrote, the bill should maintain commodity and risk management

programs that address drops in market prices and help farmers recover quicker from natural disasters.

Other reforms topping the IFB list for Title I are commodity program provisions that would let farmers update their base acres and yields and allow farmers who elect a Harvest Price Option to receive the harvest price if it is higher on prevented plant acres.

For Title II conservation programs, Guebert called for "serious debate" on policy proposals like shorter, five-year Conservation Reserve Program contracts, carbon sequestration incentives for farmers who use cover crops and new credits for

improving water quality.

He further pushed for discussion on expanding the Conservation Security Program (CSP) to reward farmers for practices they've adopted and giving farmers opportunities to earn more CSP points for maintaining conservation practices over time.

IFB also strongly supports reauthorization of the federal crop insurance program in its current form, a message IFB leaders for months have communicated in meetings with lawmakers.

But were Congress to improve federal crop insurance, IFB recommends a \$5-per-acre discount for farmers who plant

cover crops, with provisions to reward early adopters, Guebert added.

"This mirrors USDA's Pandemic Cover Crop Program which was very popular in Illinois and incentivized many farmers to plant cover crops and improve soil health on their farms," Guebert noted.

Providing USDA's Natural Resources Conservation Service with sufficient funding to hire more conservation engineers and granting farmers additional flexibility to harvest cover crops for livestock feed during normal growing conditions is another IFB recommendation.

And regarding the 2023 farm bill's dairy title, Guebert

said IFB supports dairy risk management programs that address negative price differentials and improvements in the Dairy Margin Coverage feed price component.

IFB also supports providing sufficient resources to the National Agricultural Statistics Service for accurately estimating alfalfa prices.

Weather History

September 29
1927: A tornado in downtown St. Louis crossed the Mississippi River into Illinois, killing 7 people in Illinois and 72 in St. Louis before dissipating near Granite City. Six of the Illinois deaths occurred when a crucible of molten metal was overturned by the tornado. Debris was carried for 50 miles. The tornado followed a path similar to other tornadoes which occurred in 1871 and 1896.

1986: Severe thunderstorms moved across central Illinois, causing damage along a 55 mile path. Two tornadoes occurred, but most of the damage was caused by high winds. Hundreds of structures were damaged or destroyed, including a large microwave tower near Lexington, in northern McLean County. Total damage was around \$4.2 million.

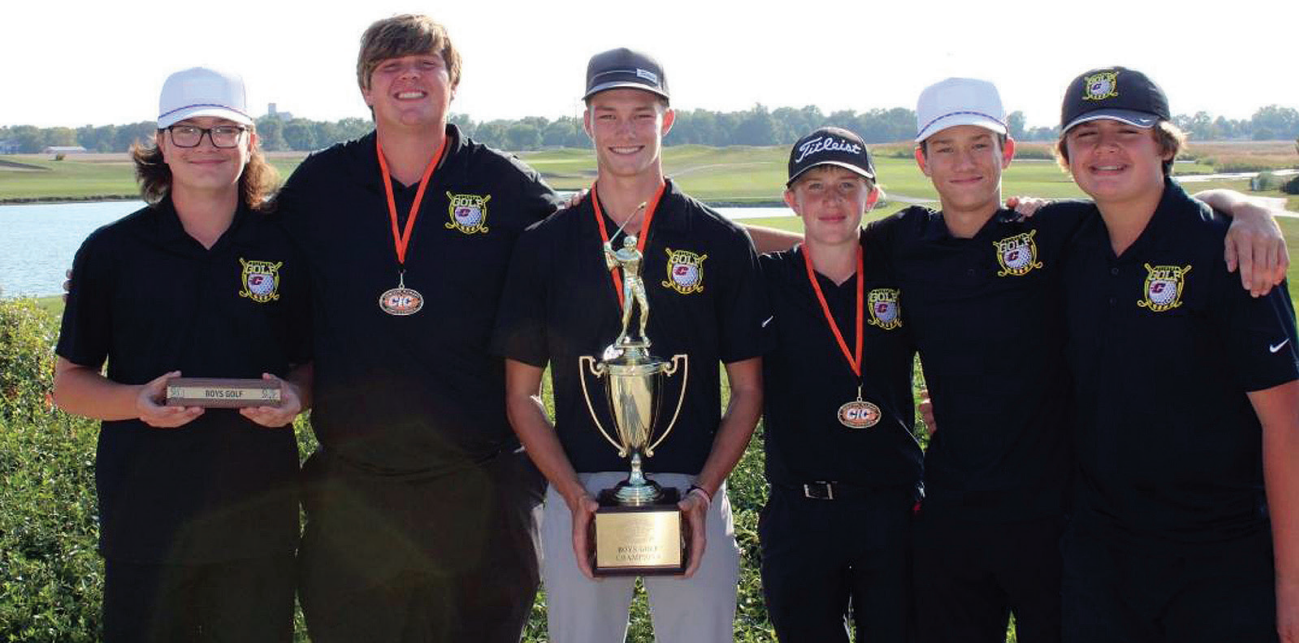
