Trojan gridders hope hard work translates into wins

MENDOTA—After getting a taste of playoff football in 2021, the Mendota Trojans missed out on the post-season last year with just three wins. Many of the returning players worked hard in the off-season in hopes of getting the Trojans back to the playoffs in 2023.

"Our attendance percentages and effort was very consistent this summer," said head coach Keegan Hill. "The players' retention of the concepts this first week of camp has been good. That is a testament to their investment in June and July at camp."

Scoring points has been a strength of the football team in the past several seasons and Hill sees no reason why that won't continue this fall.

"We have had opportunities to score because we use the strengths on the unit," Hill said. "I think we need to be a little more consistent game-to-game and start the game faster in the first quarter."

One of the highlights of the 2022 campaign was the play of quarterback Justin Randolph, who is back for his senior season in 2023. The signal-caller completed 89 of 169 passes for 1,472 yards last year. He threw for 12 touchdowns and only five interceptions.

"Justin has had a positive summer and will continue to grow as a passer and a leader of the offensive unit," explained Hill. "His understanding of the game and attacking what the defense presents is critical to our production."

Graduation takes toll on MHS golf team; spots up for grabs

MENDOTA – Graduation took a toll on the Mendota Trojan golf team, so filling the playing roster will be up for grabs in the 2023 season.

Head coach David Ross said six seniors departed from last year's squad, so there is for sure going to be a need for the younger players to step up and occupy those positions.

There are four seniors on the 15-player roster. Owen Aughenbaugh and Cale Strouss saw considerable playing time on the varsity team last year and will be counted on mightily to contribute to the team's success.

"Owen has made it to sectionals the previous two years and he is on the hunt to qualify for state this year," said Ross. "I know he will be going all in trying to make that happen."

The other seniors are Jace Baird and Haden Shakespeare

Evan McPheeters is the lone junior squad member and Ross is confident his ability will shine through this season.

"I expect Evan

(McPheeters) to find a home in the top six this year," noted Ross. "He has been playing a lot of golf this summer and working on his game."

Sophomores Brody Hart and Dane Doyle got some varsity playing time last year and Ross expects them to come back stronger with some experience under their belts. They are two of nine sophomores on the roster. The others are Brody Kaecker, Kooper Novak, Grady

Veteran team has Spikers setting their sights high

MENDOTA – The Mendota Spikers made it to double-digit wins last season, but just barely. That was with a team made up by a majority of underclass players. This year, a majority of those players are seniors, and that has the team setting its sights on much loftier heights.

Of the 16 players on the roster, 10 are seniors. Having been in the program for three years and gone through the rigors of varsity volleyball, they are ready to break out in 2023.

"We are working hard and we continue to grow each and every day we are in the gym, and together as a unit," said head coach Nicci Gibson. "We are a senior-led team with a great group of girls that want to win and compete in practice every day."

Heading the list of senior returnees is Reanna Brant at the middle hitter position. The six-footer earned firstteam all-conference honors and all-area honorable mention recognition last season. Senior Lilly Leifheit claimed second-team all-conference recognition and was also an all-area honorable mention player from the libero position in 2023, while senior Madelyn Becker started every game last year and set up the offense along with the graduated Katie Jenner.

Also returning out of the senior class are Grace Wasmer, who will occupy a middle hitter position, Ana Ramirez and Ryleigh Sondgeroth, who are senior leaders in the back row, and hitters Bria Frey, Kiara Johnson, Ava Jones and Emma Pierce.

"Our theme this year is leadership," said Gibson. "We are mainly senior-led with five of our six potential starters being seniors.

"Reanna Brant has been with me for four years now and Madelyn (Becker) and Lilly (Leifheit) had some practice and playing time with varsity their sophomore years.

"They are fun to have in the gym. They are competitive and great leaders, and examples for our culture and the Mendota High School volleyball program."

The rest of the squad is comprised of five juniors and one sophomore. The sophomore is Laylie Denault, who was a starter at outside hitter in her freshman season.

Gibson said Denault will continue in the role of outside hitter in her second season of high school volleyball. Juniors who will compete for playing time in middle and outside hitter positions include Kirby Bond, Ella Coss and Kennedy Knaff. Juniors Ella Martin (setter) and Ava Eddy (defensive specialist) complete the roster.

Gibson said she is confident the team will improve on its 10-win season of a year ago.

"Our goal is to have fun, learn something about life through the game of volleyball, and be competitive

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Youth in front, experience in back for Trojan soccer

MENDOTA – Nick Myers and Rey Arteaga haven't had to scratch their heads much in the offseason.

The Mendota boys' soccer team coaches knew they were losing key seniors to the squad that played for a sectional championship last season and won the Trojans' first sectional championship the year before.

Instead of debating on what should happen with the team next, they already knew the 2023 team's potential.

"I don't want to call this year a rebuilding year because I think we're still going to be very competitive and do well in the regular season, tournaments, and hopefully make a long playoff push," said head coach Myers. "But we're only returning four everyday starters from last season. We have some other guys that are returning that started for us off and on or they came off of the bench. With five seniors and six juniors, over 50 percent of our roster this year is going to be freshmen and sophomores. We're very young this year, but we're extremely talented.

"I think at the beginning of the season we may take a few lumps because we lack experience at the high school level. It'll be nice to get a couple close games in the beginning of the year to see how we handle it. My expectations are still very high.

"I told the boys at the

first day of practice, my goals have not changed. I still want to win 20 games. I still want to win the Three Rivers Conference. I still want to win regionals and see what happens when we get to sectionals. I think this team can do it. I just think it's going to be a maturity factor with this group."

Myers, who is starting his fifth year of his second term with the team and ninth overall, is packing the front with youth and the backfield with experience and leadership.

The offensive attack will be built around two sophomores, Sebastian Carlos and Johan Cortez, and two freshmen, Cesar Casas and Isaac Diaz.

Although Myers and Arteaga saw glimpses of what the two sophomore forwards could do, they're ready for a full season onslaught.

"They're going to be huge for us this year. Johan, as a freshman last year, produced 21 goals. In the beginning, he was inconsistent with his confidence being a freshman, he would start a few games and then he would come off of the bench because he wasn't playing very well," Myers said. "Toward the end of the year, he was a key piece for us. He scored in every big game that we had. Granted we lost 7-1 in the sectional championship to Ouincy Notre Dame, as a freshman, Johan scored the only goal for us.

"If I could put a label on the player of the offseason, I would put it on Sebastian.

His confidence going into his sophomore year is so much better than before. He didn't score very many goals last year. I think he had an issue with his confidence and him understanding that he is talented enough to play at this level. This year, over the summer, he's been scoring goals left and right. I'm expecting huge things out of him this season."

The four returning everyday starters and other upperclassmen will be found in the backfield playing defense.

Senior Izaiah Nanez will be at centerback, senior Kaleb Kleckner at outside back, senior Mauricio Martinez at center back, and junior David Casas will be the enforcer at defensive midfield.

Nanez, Kleckner, and Casas have been named the team's three captains.

Sophomore Mateo Goy will be in the net as goal-keeper.

MENDOTA - If you drove past Mendota High School at 5 p.m. Monday through Friday over the last two weeks, you saw a group of runners stretching their legs.

They're not just stretching for leisure runs, but to train as the MHS boys' and girls' cross country teams are pounding the course to get ready for the season.

The boys team has 10 runners with three of them having experience and success.

"We graduated a pair of seniors from a pretty successful team we had last year," coach Kevin Wohrley said. "We have Anthony Kelson back as a junior. As a sophomore, he had a very successful season and punched himself a ticket to the IHSA State Meet.

"Dagen Setchell is a runner possessed out there. He really pushed hard this summer and is taking leadership real serious with the team. Junior Travis Mumm is entering his third season with us. He brings a lot of experience after a good track season."

Setchell, a senior, has emerged as the team leader vocally and by display as he tallied up miles and dedicated himself to be a better runner.

Last season, Kelson finished 10th at the Class 1A Rock Falls Regional with a time of 16:42, 17th at the Oregon Sectional in 17:26, and ran a 17:15.09 for 119 out of 258 at state.

"Last year's state meet was less than ideal conditions at Detweiller Park (in Peoria). There were horizontal rains and it was frigid," Wohrley said. "He ran the best race he could in those conditions. No one ran that course with a bigger smile than Anthony Kelson. He loves the sport. He loves to run. He's a great spirit and I know state has to be set in his mind for this fall."

Junior Aidan Fisher, who is new to the team, rounds out the four varsity runners on the team, while the other six are underclassmen in sophomores Spencer Kain,

Harlan Gallagher, and Hector Gonzalez, and freshmen Dawson McPheeters, Liam Sheppard, and Ryder Woods.

"We have returning sophomores in Spencer and Harlan. They were both beginners last year. They did some good things and I think they're going to set some personal records early in the season," Wohrley said. "Hector Gonzalez comes to us from the track program. He ran distance for the track team, and I know he got in a lot of miles over the summer. We also have three incoming freshmen that show a lot of promise in Dawson, Liam,

and Ryder."

The girls' team has four runners, which is one more than last season.

Sophomore Anna Valdes returns and is joined by junior Payton Stavropoulos and sophomores Emily Banks and Peri Manning.

Although new to Mendota and Wohrley, Stavropoulous ran last year for DeKalb High School and Banks ran in Joliet.

Manning is new to cross country, but she is a softball player who Wohrley says has the competitive drive and fire to want to improve and help the team.



Randolph's favorite target last season was Braiden Freeman. He hauled in 32 passes for 651 yards in his sophomore campaign, and will no doubt be plenty busy gathering in aerials his junior year.

"Braiden had a positive season as a sophomore and is coming off of a very positive summer of workouts and camp," said Hill.

Hill said the receiver corps will be a well-rounded group, with Keegan Beetz, Aden Tillman, Rhett Watson, Keegen Stewart and Wyatt Ossman other players in the mix for playing time.

One area that will have a lack of varsity experience heading into the 2023 campaign is running back. A bulk of the load was carried by seniors last season, so a new group of players will have to step to the forefront when it comes to running the ball.

Hill said the coaches are looking at multiple players to fill the running back positions, including Stewart, Tillman, Ossman, Corbin Furar and Diego Sandoval.

Key to a successful running game comes from the guys up front, with Hill noting "the best positions on the field are the linemen." He said contributors on the offensive line will be Gabe Vallejo, Reese Lane, Joe Stewart, Logan Wujek, Nate Giberson and Angil Serrano. Vallejo and Serrano saw significant playing time last year as sophomores.

Just as the Trojan offense lit up the scoreboard in a majority of games the last two seasons, the opposition has done the same to the Mendota defense. Hill is hoping to shore up the defense in 2023.

Competing for defensive line positions will be Wujek, Vallejo, Joe Stewart, Serrano, Mike Thornhill and Xzavior Orozco. Hill said candidates for linebacker spots include Ossman, Furar and Sandoval, while the defensive backfield contenders are Freeman, Watson and Keegen Stewart at safety, and Tillman, Gavin Evans and Brandon Leadley at corner.

Hill noted that many of the players' commitment to the summer program has put the team in a place to build confidence leading up to the season-opener on Friday, Aug. 25 at Morrison.

"What we do with that opportunity is up to us," he said.


