The festival promises to have something for the entire family. 

Lee County 4-H Fair & Junior Show returns

AMBOY – It's the end of July in Lee County.

This means one thing – it's time for the Lee County Fair and 4-H Show.

It's a great throwback to the old-fashioned county fairs. Youth come and display their talents whether it be showing livestock, small animals, or general projects in visual arts, robotics, gardening, flower arranging, or community service and citizenship, just to name a few of the categories.

The fair runs from Thursday, July 27 to Sunday, July 30 at the Lee County 4-H Fairgrounds located at 1196 Franklin Road, just north of Amboy. Gates open at noon on Thursday as judging for general projects and livestock start immediately. The Starlight Dance Studio out of Amboy will perform, Bingo will be played, the Garden Tractor, Tractor and Truck Pull will roar at 7 p.m. on the track.

Friday's fun begins with gates

opening at 7 a.m.

The judges return for the swine show, creative arts, creative stem, poultry, and the dairy show. The Midway opens at 1 p.m., as does the petting zoo. Pony rides will open at 4 p.m. A pie sale will be held in the auditorium from 4 - 7 p.m. Magic by Cory Show will be held at 4 p.m. in the auditorium. Whoop Your Axe throwing will be from 4 - 8 p.m., on the Midway. Lee County Pork Producers will host a pork chop dinner from 5-7 p.m., on the patio. Quality meats and baked goods auction will be held at 6 p.m. in the auditorium.

The Lee County Fair and Illini State Pullers Tractor & Truck Pull is at 6:30 p.m., and the kid favorite Pin Dodgeball, where the goal is to hit bowling pins instead of opponents, will be in the show barn at 8 p.m.

The Junior Show also encompasses youth that comes from surrounding counties. They have participants show their projects from counties such as Winnebago, Stevenson, Whiteside, Carol, Bureau, La Salle, DeKalb, and Ogle.



Country star Byrd featured at '23 Boone County Fair

BELVIDERE – It all started in March of 1963 when the Boone County Pomona Grange members decided to keep the Boone County Fair alive and purchased 80 acres of bare farmland on Route 76 one mile north of Belvidere.

This leap of faith by area Grange members 60 years ago kept the Boone County Fair going and growing. Sixty years later, the fair has expanded to 183 acres with many buildings, barns, stages, a 2000-seat grandstand, paved roadways, modern restrooms, dining hall, permanent food stands, gazebos, half-mile dirt track, extensive lighting and sound, 200 permanent benches along with a year-round administration building and grounds maintenance shop. It's a great venue for a wide variety of activities from mid-April to Nov. 1 including the biggest of them all – the Boone County Fair, voted the number one festival/fair in the Rock River Valley for 2021 and 2022 in the 'What Rocks' Community Choice Awards.

The Boone County Fair is the largest county fair in the state of Illinois, averaging 213,000 fair-goers attending each of the last five fairs. This year should be no exception with six big days of too much fun being planned for Aug. 8-13.

This year's grandstand show features country great Tracy Byrd on Saturday, Aug. 12. Opening for Byrd will be the regional band from Champaign, the highly entertaining 'Feudin' Hillbillys.'




