Former player takes over duties as Trojan baseball coach

MENDOTA - For four years ending in 2013, Cody Zinke wore the white, purple and gold for the Mendota baseball team. A decade later, Zinke is back in a Trojan uniform, now as the head coach of the varsity Trojans.

Zinke is just in his second year on the MHS coaching staff, having served as the junior varsity coach last season, Robert Nunn, who took over last year as the head coach from long-time mentor Aaron Sester, has moved on to another school, which left a vacancy for the top job. With just a year in the program, Zinke was hesitant to throw his hat in the ring for the head coaching position.

“With only one year of coaching experience at the high school level, I did not feel that I was ready to take over the program,” stated Zinke. “But the more I thought about it, does anyone ever truly feel ready? I knew I wanted to be the varsity head coach at some point, so no time better than the present.

“Of course, there has been a learning curve and there will continue to be, but I’ve had people around me, such as Coach Sester, that have really helped prepare me and get me more comfortable in this role.”

The Trojan roster is rather smallish, with just 12 players on the team, but Zinke feels all 12 on the squad are going to be contributors in the 2023 season.

“I’d feel comfortable having any one of the guys on our roster up to bat in a

big moment or on the mound with the game on the line,” noted Zinke. “Even with just 12 guys, I think we’re plenty deep.”

Zinke feels the Trojan lineup will be balanced from top to bottom, reiterating his belief that he will have confidence in anyone on the roster to deliver a big hit when needed.

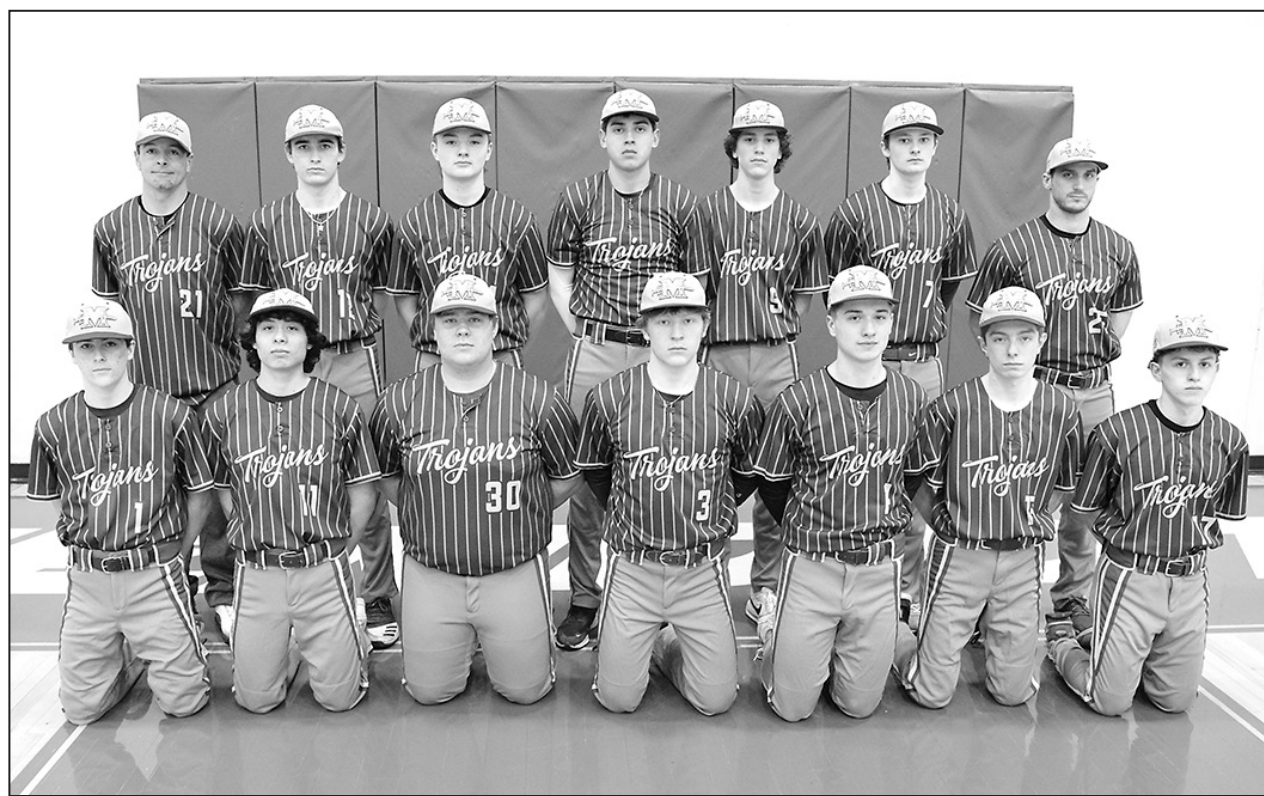
“I don’t think we’ll have a ton of sluggers, but I think every one of our guys is going to give us quality at-bats,” Zinke said.

The first-year coach said he is looking for big years out of junior Izaiah Nanez, who posted a .434 on-base percentage with 10 stolen bases a year ago, and also from senior Ryne Strouss, who had a .417 OBP last season and is one of those players who can play all over the diamond defensively. Zinke also thinks sophomore Braiden Freeman is going to play a big role in the offense after getting some varsity at-bats as a freshman.

One luxury Zinke will have is the ability to run out a plethora of players to the mound to eat up innings for the Trojans. All 12 rostermen have the ability to take the ball when called upon to pitch.

“Having that many guys that can throw isn’t very common at the high school level,” Zinke said. “At this level, in order to compete in every game, you have to have the pitching. And not just three or four guys, but eight, nine, 10 guys.”

Nanez threw the most in-

nings last year of the returning pitchers, having logged just shy of 40 innings on the hill. Senior Landon Kreiser threw 16 frames with a 3.50 earned run average in 2022.

“I expect Nanez to take a big step forward this year, and we’ll be looking for Kreiser to contribute again on the mound,” said Zinke.

He also noted that Freeman and junior Jace Baird are going to be counted on for significant innings this campaign.

Zinke knows the competition this season will be tough, but he feels the depth

in the pitching department and a varsity-experienced team will play a major role in the Trojans’ success.

“With the amount of pitchers we have, I think we’ll be able to compete with every team on our schedule,” he said.

“We only lost three seniors from last year, so with the amount of returners we have, plus a handful of newcomers that I think are ready to compete at the varsity level, I really think we might surprise some teams in our conference this year.”

One softball team, lots of promise for 2023 Lady Trojans

All classes on varsity squad

MENDOTA – There will be only one team for the 2023 Mendota softball season as there aren't enough players to field a freshman-sophomore unit. Thus, all players will be in uniform for varsity games.

"This year's team is made up of 16 girls, seniors down to freshmen, and although we may not have a lot of girls in the program this year, we do have a few that have varsity experience that we are going to count on for help with some of the other girls," said head coach Joel Perez.

"This group has gelled great with each other. We also have some competitive players. It should be a fun year."

There are four seniors on the roster with Katie Jenner, Emma Schultz and Zoe Hanson returning starters. The other senior is Gracie Zinke.

"Katie and Emma had a good season last year both on offense and defense," Perez noted. "It should be a great senior season for them as they keep being leaders both on our stat sheets and on the field."

Perez said Hanson played well on defense a year ago and he's hoping to see more offensive production from her this season. He added that Zinke is competing for a starting outfield spot and has been working hard in practice, which he hopes transfers to when the games begin.

The junior class consists of Ryleigh Sondgeroth, Madelyn Becker and Reanna Brant. Sondgeroth and Becker both have varsity experience, while Brant is returning to softball after not playing last season.

"Sondgeroth will be one of our pitchers and when she isn't pitching, she will be playing somewhere in the infield," said Perez. "She is also one of our team leaders."

"Becker has played the outfield the last two years and we're hoping to see her take charge and be one of our leading fielders this year. We're also expecting her to be one of our leaders on offense."

Perez added that Brant is showing a lot of potential with her hitting in preseason practice.

Sophomore team members include Lily Bokus, Ava Eddy, Kirby Bond, Lea Turner, Ella Coss and Claire Hanson. Bond and Eddy both saw varsity playing time in 2022, and Eddy will join Sondgeroth on the pitching staff.

Players on the squad from the freshman class are Sydney Tolley, Talia White and Peri Manning.

Perez said he sees the potential to have a very strong offensive club this season.

"I'm hoping to be able to put up some runs due to having five returning starters and two or three others that have plenty of at-bats from last year," stated Perez.

Roster size increases for boys' track team

MENDOTA - The numbers keep increasing for the Mendota High School boys' track team as 28 athletes comprise the 2023 version.

Last year there were no seniors on the squad, so inexperience was a factor. This season there are eight seniors on the roster, which is a welcome sight for head coach Keegan Hill.

"It is helpful to have experience when building team chemistry and the team as a whole," said Hill. "Older kids teaching the basics to freshmen helps everyone involved. Building confidence and setting the standards are easier for everyone involved."

Despite only being a sophomore, Hill said distance runner Anthony Kelson, along with junior Mason Koch (jumps/sprint) and senior Jordan Coney (shot/discus) are being counted on to provide consistency throughout the season.

"Those guys all have a chance to put their stamp on their respective groups," noted Hill. "Distance, jumpers and throwers have

leaders they can follow and learn from."

Another exciting aspect about the 2023 team is that the freshman class, with 12, has the most numbers on the roster.

"Numerous freshmen out will give us flexibility and lots of room for improvement throughout the year," Hill explained. "It's too early to tell who will stand out among the group. We hope they all improve every meet."

In the recent past, the Trojans have had trouble filling all of the events in a meet because of a small amount of people on the roster, but with 28 this year, Hill is hoping to fill more events.

"This is our biggest roster in some time and we will work to fill as many events as we can," he said. "Teaching the basics and building a positive experience is the backbone of what we do. If we succeed at that, it will be a positive spring season."

New coach, higher numbers for girls' track

MENDOTA – There is a new man in charge of the Mendota girls' track and field program this season.

However, Joe Hughes is not new to the program as he was an assistant for former coach Heath Raley the last two campaigns.

Hughes, a 2013 Newark High School graduate, is ready for the challenge.

"Being an assistant helped me out a lot to prepare me for this position because I was able to learn at all the meets," Hughes said. "Last year, Raley kind of knew he was leaving the program, so he was prepping me to be the next head coach. I luckily got a lot of practice and preparation under my belt. So far, this year has

been pretty smooth for the most part.

"The exciting thing is, we had five girls on the team last year and this year we have 13. It was hard to run relays with five. With 13 we are starting to gain some interest. This is a good group of girls we have for this season, which makes it exciting. Every single one of them are willing to try different events."

Hughes has already enjoyed the versatility of having 13 athletes as he has been able to mix and match events with each competitor and run relays in two indoor meets.

The group of five from last year returns four this season.

Alexis Finley is the lone senior and the team captain.

She will compete in the 800-meter and 1,600-meter runs where she set a personal record almost every meet last season. Hughes said she is returning with a chip on her shoulder as she wasn't able to compete in sectional because of an injury.

The lone junior is Grace Wasmer, who was the fastest sprinter and best long jumper a year ago. She fell just short of state in the long jump finishing right outside of the top nine at sectional. She's hungry to prove she belongs at the IHSA State Meet.

Dessia Komitas and Ashley Caracheo are the sophomores who built bonds with Finley and Wasmer last sea-

Confidence level high for 2023 MHS girls' soccer team

MENDOTA – Soccer has become popular in Mendota.

Thanks should partially go to the boys' soccer teams' success and some to a group of girls who simply want to be better soccer players.

The result, Mendota girls' soccer coach Nick Myers had 34 girls come out this spring for all levels, which he says is the most in a long time.

Myers is seeing areas of strength and weakness as he tries to strengthen the Lady Trojans as much as possible as they play four games the week of Monday, March 20.

"Last year we only had two wins, but we had five ties," said Myers. "In almost every one of those ties, we were winning but we gave up a goal in the last minute to make it a tie. We had numerous losses last year that happened in the last five minutes of the match.

"We were close. I don't think we were nearly as cohesive as a unit as we are this year, so hopefully those turn into

wins this year. They don't have a lot of soccer experience, but they are very coachable. They want to get better. They don't complain. It makes it enjoyable to go to practice, even when it's cold, because they are working hard."

The 24 varsity girls include five seniors, five juniors, six sophomores, and eight freshmen.

There are nine returners in seniors Naitzy Garcia, Flor DeLao, and Emily Stewart, junior Linnea Escatel, and sophomores Noemi Arteaga, Kaley Siemer, Crystal Garcia, Cassie Gonzalez, and Lauren Holland.

Not only do they have experience playing in the spring for Mendota High School, but Naitzy Garcia, DeLao, Stewart, Arteaga, Siemer, and Crystal Garcia play together year-round as they're on the same travel squad.

"Naitzy Garcia is back at goalkeeper. She earned a scholarship and is signed to play next year at Rock Valley Community College. She is a four-year player for us, her second in goal, and is a vocal captain of the team," Myers

said. "Flor DeLao and Emily Stewart are two returning center defenders and will be asked to control the defense."

Escatel, a junior who has started varsity since her freshman campaign, was a left back defender a season ago but has forced Myers to move her to attacking midfielder to use her creative offense that could help MHS correct one of its biggest woes from last year, scoring.

The strong group of sophomores will see Arteaga, Siemer, Crystal Garcia, and Gonzalez have starting roles, while Holland will come off of the bench with an equal minute log.

"These girls were very talented last year. Their problem was they lacked confidence. They didn't have any confidence at all," Myers said. "I think they were almost a little scared to do things. I don't know if they didn't want the older girls to yell at them or if they were a little unsure.


"Now, playing for a year, they have a lot more experience. You can see at practice, their confidence is a 1,000 times better than it was last year."

Hard work, determination keys for competitive tennis season

MENDOTA – Usually, the Mendota boys' tennis team would begin matches in the middle of March as the baseball and softball teams are starting their seasons and the boys' and girls' track and field teams are competing in their first events.

This year is different. "We start a little later this year. We kind of back-loaded our schedule because of weather, naturally, but also because the Mendota band and choir are going to Disney World during spring break," said head coach Shawn LeRette. "The band and the choir decimates my team. I have 18 kids out for tennis and I'll have four left when they leave because 14 are involved with those programs. We can't do anything during spring break, which is right after Easter this year."

This moves the tennis team's first match to April 3. But after Easter, the Trojans will play three or four matches a week until the IHSA postseason begins.

Until April, LeRette is getting in as many practices as he can with his four seniors, four juniors, six sophomores, and four freshmen.

"I don't have my lineup set yet; we're still early," LeRette said. "But I do have two returning seniors, Matt Miller and Clay Buffington, in the mix for singles. If they're not going to play singles, they'll be a doubles team."

The remaining two seniors are brand new players, Zach Giberson and Theron Stanford. They will be paired together for a doubles team.

Whoever is not playing No. 1 or No. 2 singles out of Miller, Buffington, and Lee will move to doubles to form possible pairings with juniors Landon Bauer—who represented Mendota High School at the IHSA Boys' Bowling State Tournament in February—Dagen Setchell or Trekker Klema.

"It's nice to have it balanced out. I had nine seniors last year, so I lost nine players for this year,"

LeRette said. "I knew I was only going to have Miller and Buffington returning, so at the end of last season I told them, 'We're going to need to recruit kids.' They did a real good job of recruiting kids.

"They recruited a couple more sophomores, the two seniors, and now we have four freshmen, which is great. If the six sophomores and four freshmen come back next year, which I hope they do, then you've got a core group. If you can get another four to six freshmen, then you're balancing it out. It's a nice flow and everyone is playing."

LeRette said everyone is picking up the game well or sharpening skills they had already developed.

Plus, they have more time to work on their game before the first match compared to previous seasons.

"The kids are really good. They're working hard," LeRette said. "We're not overly athletic, honestly, but if they keep working at it, we'll be competitive."
