St. Margaret's Health in Peru (formerly Illinois Valley Community Hospital) terminated its emergency room physician coverage and all health services.

According to a press release, the service was terminated because the current provider of physicians terminated their contract effective at 7 a.m. Saturday, Jan. 28 and St. Margaret's could not find, nor financially support, a new ER provider.

It was also mentioned there wasn't enough staff to operate St. Margaret's in Spring Valley and Peru.

"Closings are extremely unfortunate, and they vary by location. Illinois Valley and Spring Valley are a different scenario when you have two hospitals five miles apart," Marx said. "It doesn't scare us at KSB, but it catches your attention, in terms of, making sure that you're making those adjustments that are necessary in order to meet the new way that patients are looking for care. We're a good 25 miles, or more than that, to the next hospital from us with the exception of Sterling, but they have their own population base.

"We're looking at it to see what we need to do to adjust or to try and compensate for the post-pandemic changes, but still fulfill our mission of providing health services to Lee County and south-

ern Ogle County. To that end, the best solution is to make sure that we're being responsive to our local community's needs and encouraging the folks who've relied on us in the past to continue to choose us going forward."

Saint Paul hasn't had any alarms of closing or significant changes.

Trompeter added Mendota has partnered with St. Margaret's before and is helping where it can.

"We have seen some increase in clients with the closing, but even prior to the closing, we've always worked together with St. Margaret's Health, and previously when it was IVCH," Trompeter said. "During Covid, if there was a shortage of beds or if they didn't have staffing, we worked with them and were able to help them. The other things that we may see, that we've already prepared for, is an increase of emergency department or prompt care visits with St. Margaret's closing. We're already ready to accommodate that.

"We are very transparent. We have metrics that we share with our leaders and mission partners on a monthly basis, if not more in weekly huddles. We always update the Community Council with where we are at and what we're doing.

"No, I haven't seen anyone worried

about us closing. No one is worried in our community, from us, or from any of our mission partners or Community Council members. We have to be transparent with that because we wouldn't want anyone shocked. We have to work together and collaborate with everyone involved."

In response to St. Margaret's closing its Peru location, State Representative Brad Fritts (R-Dixon) released this statement about the closing and the state of rural health care.

"The news of St. Margaret's Hospital closing took me and many others by surprise. It is my understanding that the state has been a more than fair partner in the process to keep this rural facility open. Therefore, this sudden closure is very disappointing.

"I strongly urge the administration at St. Margaret's to re-evaluate their decision to close this facility, leaving many out of a job and many more without care. The impacts of this closure, especially of the obstetric facilities, will negatively impact women and growing families from numerous communities in the area.

"Nowhere, and especially not in Illinois, should women have to drive over an hour to ensure they can safely give birth in a hospital."

LeFevre wrote the book, while her former co-worker at Woodhaven Lakes in Sublette, Elayne Holloway, drew the illustrations for the children's book. It was published on Black Friday Weekend during the 2022 harvest season.

The first-time author has read her story at the Winifred Knox Memorial Library in Franklin Grove. Now, LeFevre wants to read to children at the Amboy library because that's the library she grew up in.

"I didn't know I was going to be doing any of this. My interest sparked and I just went with it. So far, everyone has supported me very well," LeFevre said. "I'm going to just keep rolling with it and see where it takes me."

Emily Goff, the Amboy library's director, is happy to have LeFevre.

In fact, the library hopes it's a success so LeFevre and other local authors can make something like Feb. 18's event more frequent rather than a first-time or one-time occurrence.

"She contacted us, and she said she was a local author and that she wanted to have a meet and greet with us," Goff said. "This will be the first time we've had a local author come to our library and read their book. It's very cool. We're very excited to have her. We usually do school-aged craft events, but this is something different and we're excited.

"We would most definitely have other local authors come to the library. We've had other local authors send us their book, but this is the first time that someone is coming for a meet and greet. I think Andrea LeFevre will be a good draw because she is from here, wrote a children's book, and is going to read to children."
