# Man killed in crash

BYRON – There was a fatal, multi-vehicle crash in the 5800 block of North Illinois Route 2 just after 1 p.m. on Monday, April25, according to the Ogle County Sheriff's Office.

A preliminary investigation revealed that a southbound vehicle driven by Dirk Miller, 55, of Mt. Morris, crossed the centerline and traveled into the northbound lane where it struck two oncoming vehicles. Miller was transported to Swedish American Hospital by Byron EMS where he was later pronounced dead.

The second vehicle, a 15-passenger school bus, was driven by Teresa Gabriel, 58, of Dixon. Gabriel was transported to KSB Hospital by Mt Morris EMS for minor injuries. A passenger of the school bus, Connie Sloter, 34, of Dixon, was transported to Swedish American Hospital by Byron EMS for minor injuries. Ajuvenile passenger in the school bus was uninjured and was released to a family member.

The driver of the third vehicle, Kiara Franklin, 22, of Rockford, was transported to Mercy Hospital by Oregon EMS for non-life threating injuries.

Stillman Valley EMS transported two juvenile passengers, also in the third vehicle to Mercy Hospital for observation.

Byron Fire/EMS, Byron Police, Oregon EMS, Stillman Valley EMS, Mt. Morris EMS and the Illinois Department of transportation assisted deputies at the scene. The accident remains under investigation.

## Rochelle man completes Boston Marathon goal

**ROCHELLE** – For the past five and a half years, Kurt Lodico of Rochelle has been running marathons in hopes of competing in and finishing the Boston Marathon.

He did just that recently. The marathon was his 14th over that time. His time was three hours, 53 minutes, finishing 16,216 out of the full 30,000 in the race and 950th out of the 1,700 in his age group of 55-59.

Lodico was in the second wave of

runners to start the race. Each wave has 7,500 racers in it. Runners represented every state and people from 122 different countries ran in the Boston Marathon, he said. Qualification is required to get in. About 500,000 people attended the event, which was run at its normal time in the spring for the first time since the COVID-19 pandemic began.

"It was awesome," Lodico said. "It was unbelievable. The huge billboards they put up and it's lighted and there's so many TV cameras.

## MARATHON: The culmination of a dream

"There's probably 200,000 people just at the finish line. They say some can't even hear their name when they cross the line because it's so loud. It's very exciting going down that last stretch. It's exhilarating."

Lodico qualified for the Boston Marathon two years ago, but the COVID-19 pandemic canceled it. It was canceled the next year as well. The event was rescheduled to October of last year, but Lodico opted not to compete, hoping for the full experience this spring.

"It was amazing," Lodico said. "It was very exciting. Everyone was talkative and excited and really looking forward to the marathon happening again."

During the past two springs, the Boston Marathon was run virtually, with runners around the country and world running the same amount of mileage and choosing their own routes. Lodico did take part in the event virtually both years.

Runners competing virtually uploaded their time and information to a website. Lodico called competing virtually "very different."

"When I did that, I did have a few friends to cheer me on," Lodico said. "Your adrenaline is higher in a real race. It's a lot better in an actual race. Dealing with COVID-19 canceling it and having to go virtual was hard. I hit the original qualifying time required, and then I had to requalify because it expired. It was tough."

Lodico's qualifying time to get into the Boston Marathon this year was three hours, 25 minutes. To qualify, he had to hit three hours, 35 minutes. When he ages up to an older age group with a higher qualifying time in a few years, Lodico said he'd like to run in the marathon again.

Running the race on Monday was not without its challenges for Lodico.

"There's a lot of rolling hills, some that are really steep," Lodico said. "At the beginning you feel good. But the hills were tough and they wore on me. I started to cramp up and I think it was from the hills. It was more challenging than I thought it would be."

Lodico said he's always been a runner. It keeps him in shape and makes him feel good when he's out there. Monday was the culmination of a dream for the Rochelle man.

"Finishing and getting to the line after five and a half years of working towards that goal, that was my favorite part," Lodico said.


# Clifford Gilbert, Sr.

## **Sharon Pleniewicz**





## **MOMENTS IN** TIME

- \* On May 18, 1783, the first United Empire Loyalists, known to American Patriots as Tories, arrive in what is now New Brunswick, Canada, to take refuge under the British crown. Loyalist refugees in western Quebec were given 200 acres apiece.
- \* On May 22, 1859, Sir Arthur Conan Doyle, creator of Sherlock Holmes, is born. His first Sherlock Holmes story, "A Study in Scarlet," was published in 1887. Doyle soon grew weary of his creation, killing off Holmes only to resuscitate him later due to popular demand.
- \*On May 20, 1862, President Abraham Lincoln signs the Homestead Act, which opens government-owned land to small family farmers. The act gave the head of a family 160 acres to try his hand at farming for five years. If the farmer then could prove the homestead successful, he paid an \$18 filing fee and received a deed to the land.
- \* On May 21, 1881, in Washington, D.C., humanitarians Clara Barton and Adolphus Solomons found the American National Red Cross, established to provide humanitarian aid to victims of wars and natural disasters.
- \* On May 17, 1943, the crew of the Memphis Belle, one of a group of American bombers based in Britain, becomes the first B-17 crew to complete 25 missions over Europe and return to the United States.
- \* On May 19, 1975, New York City's Chinatown is almost entirely shut down with shuttered stores displaying signs reading "Closed to Protest Police Brutality." The demonstration was a reaction to the New York Police Department's treatment of Peter Yew after he witnessed the police beating a Chinese teenager and attempted to intervene.
- \* On May 16, 1980, Los Angeles Lakers point guard Earvin "Magic" Johnson steps in for injured center Kareem Abdul-Jabbar and scores 42 points, leading the Lakers to a four games-to-two series win over the Philadelphia 76ers and the NBA championship.

Let's say in July, I were to pull into a service station to fill my pickup with fuel and I spend \$100. (I spent that much two weeks ago – the most I've paid in my life at a gas pump.) The legislature wants me to know life could be much worse. If they hadn't put off the tax increase, I could have paid \$100.40.

Feeling a little underwhelmed? Well, you ought to be.

In 2019, Gov. J.B. Pritzker and legislative Democrats doubled the state's gas tax, increasing it from 19 cents a gallon to 38 cents, and added an annual increase tied to inflation. It's that annual

increase for this year that may be suspended for six months, not the doubling of the state gas tax in 2019 or the inflationary increases that already have kicked in since then. Illinois not only taxes

gasoline by the gallon but it imposes a separate sales tax that taxes it by the dollar. The taxes paid per gallon are used in the basis to determine sales tax on the overall sale. We are taxing taxes. Josh Sharp, chief ex-

ecutive officer of the Illinois Fuel and Retail Association, said Illinois may be the only state that assesses its sales tax on top of the gas tax. Folks in some parts of Illinois are paying about 50 cents a gallon in state taxes

Add on the federal taxes and consumers are paying about 77 cents a gallon in taxes, he said.

That's shameful, particularly at a time when gasoline prices are at near record levels. Families across the state have suffered through two years of a pandemic and now are struggling against the highest inflation the nation has experienced in nearly 40 years.

If Gov. J.B. Pritzker signs the legislation, every gas pump in the state must have a 4-by-8-inch

sticker reading: "As of July 1, 2022, the State of Illinois has suspended the inflation adjustment to the motor fuel tax through Dec. 31, 2022. The price on this pump should reflect the suspension of the tax increase." If a gas station owner

does not comply, they would face a fine of \$500 for each day they are out of compliance. "We don't think the

government can compel a business or a private citizen or anyone for that matter to utter speech that they don't want to participate in, and, to us, this is a very political speech. It's right before an election. It's difficult to make the case that there is a public safety aspect to this. It's a political message. It's talking about a tax hike," Sharp said.

"This is just an effort to make retailers engage in free political advertising."

If the legislation is signed into law, Sharp said his organization plans to file a lawsuit to block its implementation on the grounds that it violates the free speech rights of his members.

So, where did this notion originate?

Well, it came from that incubator of really bad ideas known as the final

two days of legislative session. Rarely do lawmakers become smarter or braver when they can see the end of their work in sight.

The delay of the 2-cent-per-gallon tax hike moved its implementation from before the November election to less than two months after. No one, least of all Pritzker, wants to be blamed for \$4.50 gasoline. And in fairness, there

is little a governor of any state can do about fluctuating oil prices on the international commodity exchanges. The only thing they can really influence that affects the price of gasoline is how it's taxed. How much fuel should

be taxed is a valid public policy debate. But instead of making a tough call on reducing state revenue and bringing gas taxes down to be in line with other states, our lawmakers chose a flimsy fig leaf of a sticker to cover their culpability in making Illinois one of the most expensive places in the nation to fill up.

We deserve better.


