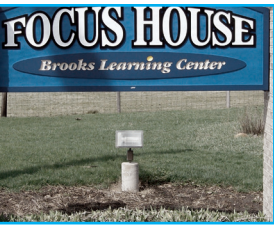

Reaching the finish

Lodico completes Boston Marathon

ROCHELLE — For the past five and a half years, Kurt Lodico of Rochelle has been running marathons in hopes of competing in and finishing the Boston Marathon.

He did just that on Monday. The marathon was his 14th over that time. His time was three hours, 53 minutes, finishing 16,216 out of the full 30,000 in the race and 950th out of

the 1,700 in his age group of 55-59.

Lodico was in the second wave of runners to start the race. Each wave has 7,500 racers in it. Runners represented every state and people from 122 different countries ran in the Boston Marathon, he said. Qualification is required to get in. About 500,000 people attended the event, which was run at its normal time in the spring for the first time since the COVID-19 pandemic began.

“It was awesome,” Lodico said. “It was unbelievable. The huge billboards they put up and it’s lighted and there’s so many TV cameras. There’s probably 200,000 people just at the finish line. They say some can’t even hear their name when they cross the line because it’s so loud. It’s very exciting going down that last stretch. It’s exhilarating.”

Flagg Road and 20th Street intersection improvements planned

ROCHELLE — In February, the City of Rochelle city council and the Ogle County Board approved an intergovernmental agreement to start engineering and evaluation work to improve the intersection of Flagg Road and 20th Street.

City Engineer Sam Tesreau said last week that he’s been in discussions with the county’s engineer about the selection process for consultants to do the engineering and evaluation. Motor fuel tax funding will be utilized for the project, so the city and county will have to go through the Illinois Department of Transportation with development of its engineering agreement, as IDOT administers those funds. Tesreau said an engineering agreement will come before the city council in the next 30-60 days.

Tesreau said the eventual improvement plans are still in preliminary phases, but he anticipates there will be additional dedicated right-hand turn lanes off Flagg Road onto 20th Street. There will also be pavement widening of the entire intersection and new permanent signals with



mast arms, controllers and photo detection. There will also be additional turn lanes on 20th Street and pavement widening in that area of the intersection. The county owns and maintains Flagg Road and the city owns and maintains 20th Street.

“There is no timeline on the work at the moment,” Tesreau said. “I would say the project will probably be in excess of \$1.1 million, not necessarily split between the county and the city. It will be cost equal to the benefits each entity receives.”

In 2009 when the assisted living development occurred in the area along with the new addition of Lincoln School, the developer was required to put in certain improvements at the intersections along with the widening of 20th Street on the north side of Flagg Road and the temporary signals that are still there today.

No structural damage after home fire

Rochelle Fire Department estimates about \$40,000 in damage

ROCHELLE — No injuries or structural damage resulted from a Tuesday afternoon fire at a home on South First Street in town, Rochelle Fire Department Firefighter/Paramedic Tyler Carls said.

Rochelle Fire was dispatched at 3:58 p.m. for a smoke-filled residence at 640 S. First St. Tuesday and Chief Dave Sawlsville arrived on scene to find smoke and fire showing from the home. Rochelle Fire’s engine arrived on scene and extinguished the fire and was joined later by its ladder, ambulance and an engine from each department of the Ogle-Lee Fire Protection District (Hillcrest, Flagg Center, Creston and Steward) to make sure there were no victims or extensions of the fire inside, Carls said.

Carls said he didn’t believe there were any occupants in the home when the fire started and

the residents may have arrived home to find the fire and smoke. Rochelle Fire estimates \$40,000 worth of damage was done to the

home and consisted of its contents along with cosmetic damage. The residents will be displaced from the home for some time and the

Red Cross was contacted to help them with a place to stay, Carls said.

Fire personnel were on scene for just under 90

minutes, Carls said. The cause of the fire is listed as under investigation and a fire investigator was on scene Tuesday.

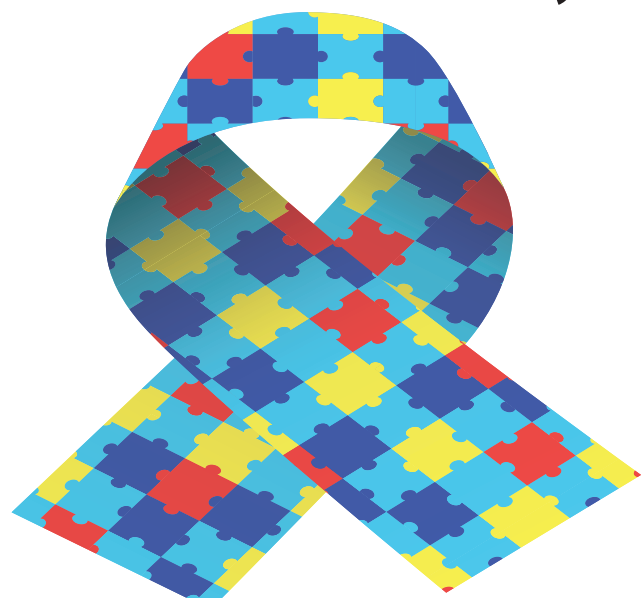
Autism awareness, Rochelle style

ROCHELLE — My family moved to Rochelle in 2005 when my twin sons were one and a half years old. As new parents, we had a lot to learn. When we found out our sons both had autism, we had even more to learn. Thankfully, there have been many people in our community who have taken the time and patience to get to know us and our kids. April is Autism Awareness month. This year, I wanted to share about some special people in our community who have, through their kindness, made a difference to our family.

One of the biggest difficulties people with autism have is that they get overwhelmed with too many things to think about at once (who doesn’t?). Ms. Dhana Hansen, one of our kids’ first pre-school teachers, helped us learn to use the phrase, “First, then.” Such as, “First I will put on my coat, then I will get on the bus.” This simple phrase helped us to help our kids focus and made transitions easier.

People with autism often do best with a positive and consistent support structure. We cannot say enough about the many people in the school system that have supported our kids. Certainly, Edna Miller is an all-star. She is an aide at the high school who goes out of her way to help kids with disabilities. She even volunteered her time as a helper so our kids could participate on the bowling team, where she



cheers everyone on!

Everyone feels like they need to belong. This is especially true for people with autism, who often struggle with talking and connecting to people. They need safe places and groups to be a part of. Our kids found that place at T-Byrd Lanes in Rochelle. Dan at T-Byrd Lanes has always welcomed our family. At T-Byrds, our kids have been able to improve their bowling skills in an encouraging environment and be part of the T-Byrd Lanes youth bowling league and the Rochelle Township High School bowling team.

People with autism often have one main focus at a time. It can be helpful to explore those special interests. This past week, we went to the library and Ms. Sarah spent extra time helping us look for books and Mr. Juan patiently helped us find favorite CDs. Our family has been welcomed and embraced at the library since our children went to story time with Ms. Connie many years ago. It’s these special

touches that make me glad to live in a small town like Rochelle where lifelong relationships can grow.

The Rochelle Park District has been a supportive place for our kids to grow and play. Through their partnership with Kishwaukee Special Recreation Association, our kids spent many evenings enjoying games, crafts, and karaoke. Ben Ward worked for KSRA and became a mentor to our boys. While playing basketball or board games, they would also learn skills such as taking turns and focusing on others.

Some days living with autism can be difficult. There are times when we get overwhelmed or communication difficulties get the best of us. Note everyone has patience and respect for those who are different. Living in a community where people with autism are embraced makes all of us better. Our family would like to thank those people who have made such a positive difference and encourage all of us to strive to do the same.

Math intervention program presented Tuesday

‘The ultimate goal is to get as many kids on track to graduate as possible’

ROCHELLE — At its Tuesday meeting, the Rochelle Township High School Board of Education heard a presentation on the school’s Math Intervention program that has been in use this school year.

The presentation was made by Assistant Principal David Perrin and Mathematics Teacher Ryne Vrana. The remedial program is aimed at kids that are “particularly at risk” coming out of the COVID-19 pandemic specifically in the school’s three main math courses: Algebra I, Geometry and Algebra II.

Vrana does not teach any courses at the school and his day is dedicated to helping students that need assistance with math work. He has an open-door policy all day long and has had 3,500 unique tutoring sessions with students this year.

“In the mornings I get a report and a list of kids that

are deficient in the math classes they’re taking,” Vrana said. “From that list I get a list of their study halls they’re in. And I’m able to pull the kids from their study halls if they’ve got math or homework to do or tests or quizzes to prepare for or retake. I can see their grades throughout the weeks and track them that way. I also have tutors that do it for silver service hours. This is available every single period.”

The program is known as Infinity Math. Perrin said last year the school knew there would be deficiencies with kids that wouldn’t be traditionally at-risk due to the pandemic. Kids that were in the building in the pandemic model last year had math every other day. Perrin said 25 percent of students opted out of in-person learning and were fully remote last year.

“In fall of 2019 our average GPA in Algebra I was 2.97, a solid B average,” Perrin said. “In Geometry it was 2.74 and

Algebra II was 2.43. Then the pandemic hit and we lost ground in all of these classes, so we knew we had to do something. We talked to Mr. Vrana at this time last year and he was the logical person to go to. He has a calm, approachable demeanor and he’s also taught all three of these courses. He knows how to help them.”

Perrin said a survey given to students in the program said 85 percent of them felt like they had a better understanding after just one visit and 95 percent said they’d recommend it to a friend. The school has noticed a “moderate association” between GPA increasing and number of visits for students after looking at the first quarter and semester of school this year.

“The more times kids visit, the better the probability of their GPA going up in math,” Perrin said. “From 2019 to the pandemic to 2021, we are catching up.”

Superintendent Jason

Harper said the intervention program was implemented for math because the subject is so unique and that the school has a separate G-Force program with a similar setup for other subjects.

“Kids need to pass three years of math to graduate high school, so that’s why these three classes are the big ones for us,” Principal Chris Lewis said. “The ultimate goal is to get as many kids on track to graduate as possible. To get our on-track data back to where it was pre-pandemic.”

Hiring expo

On May 6, RTHS will host a hiring expo for its students as well as the greater community in a partnership with Kishwaukee College and the City of Rochelle, Harper said. The event will be similar to the one that was held in the fall.

“It went well,” Harper said. “So there was a request from local employers and more interest in doing

one again in the spring, which is typically when we have done it. Instead of it falling in March on our school improvement day, it will be May 6.”

Employment

The board unanimously approved employment changes including the resignations of Laura Chivavini (paraprofessional), Alison Vrana (Interact advisor) and Christian Frieden (english teacher and assistant speech coach), the hiring of Justin Otte as

a science teacher for next year and the retirements of Bob Cartwright (maintenance first shift, effective June 30) and Sherri Smith (transportation director, effective Dec. 31).

IHSA

The board unanimously approved the renewal of RTHS’s membership with the Illinois High School Association for the 2022-23 school year. Each year the board must renew its membership to participate in IHSA tournaments.

Lodico qualified for the Boston Marathon two years ago, but the COVID-19 pandemic canceled it. It was canceled the next year as well. The event was rescheduled to October of last year, but Lodico opted not to compete, hoping for the full experience this spring.

“It was amazing,” Lodico said. “It was very

exciting. Everyone was talkative and excited and really looking forward to the marathon happening again.”

During the past two springs, the Boston Marathon was run virtually, with runners around the country and world running the same amount of mileage and choosing their own routes. Lodico did take part in the event virtually both years.

Runners competing virtually uploaded their time and information to a website. Lodico called competing virtually “very different.”

“When I did that, I did have a few friends to cheer me on,” Lodico said. “Your adrenaline is higher in a real race. It’s a lot better in an actual race. Dealing with COVID-19 canceling it and having to go virtual

was hard. I hit the original qualifying time required, and then I had to requalify because it expired. It was tough.”

Lodico’s qualifying time to get into the Boston Marathon this year was three hours, 25 minutes. To qualify, he had to hit three hours, 35 minutes. When he ages up to an older age group with a higher qualifying time in a few years,

Lodico said he’d like to run in the marathon again.

Running the race on Monday was not without its challenges for Lodico.

“There’s a lot of rolling hills, some that are really steep,” Lodico said. “At the beginning you feel good. But the hills were tough and they wore on me. I started to cramp up and I think it was from the hills. It was more challenging than I

thought it would be.”

Lodico said he’s always been a runner. It keeps him in shape and makes him feel good when he’s out there. Monday was the culmination of a dream for the Rochelle man.

“Finishing and getting to the line after five and a half years of working towards that goal, that was my favorite part,” Lodico said.

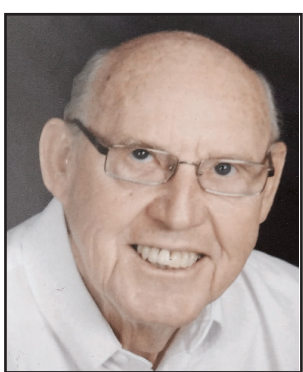
Toby Larson

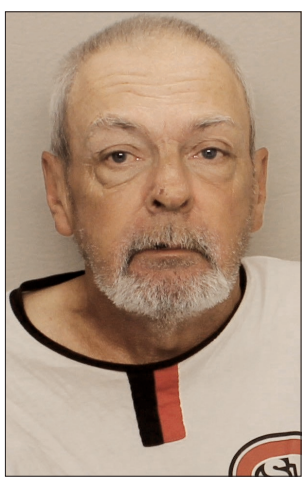

Rochelle man sentenced to federal prison for bank robbery

ROCKFORD — A Rochelle man was sentenced April 19 before U.S. District Judge Iain D. Johnston for bank robbery. Rodney Beese, 64, pled guilty on Dec. 6, 2021, to the bank robbery of the Central Bank Illinois located in Rochelle.

Beese was sentenced to 46 months in federal prison and ordered to serve three years of supervised release following imprisonment.

According to the written plea agreement, Beese admitted that on

July 6, 2021, he entered Central Bank Illinois, located at 340 May Mart

Dr. in Rochelle. Beese approached the teller counter and presented a note to the teller demanding \$20's, \$50's, and \$100's from the drawer.

Beese received \$100 of United States Currency from the teller, and then left the bank.

The sentencing was announced by John R. Lausch, Jr., United States attorney for the Northern District of Illinois; Emmerson Buie, Jr., special agent-in-charge of the Chicago Field Office of Federal Bureau of Investigation.

The government was represented by Assistant U.S. Attorney Robert S. Ladd.

“That project was built and it’s served us up until now,” Tesreau said. “But obviously traffic has increased over those years and we’re almost 13 years down the road now. There’s well over 4,500 vehicles a day on Flagg Road, probably closer to 5,000 per day. So, it’s time to take a look at warrants. And naturally with that kind of vehicular traffic, you’ll see some congestion or the level of service of operation at the intersection go down. There have been backups that we’re aware of during peak times on 20th Street, so there’s a need for additional widening there and dedicated turn lanes.”

The city does get complaints about the intersection and how long the lights pointed at 20th Street can take to change, Tesreau

said. The way the current signals are set up typically result in the main road (Flagg Road) to get more green light time to more efficiently move traffic. 20th Street was designed as the secondary road at the intersection.

Tesreau said those peak times he spoke of are high-traffic times involving the schools in the area with students and pickups. The improvements that are being looked at are driven by the existing conditions of the intersection and area, but the city’s comprehensive plan does show hopes for future growth along Flagg Road and towards and north and west corner of Rochelle.

“The improvements we would look at now will incorporate future traffic projections that may be generated from that growth,” Tesreau said.

A lesson learned from my dad

I think some men are very, very confused about what a “man” is or is supposed to be.

Last week, Tucker Carlson of Fox News, a person I have never watched in my life, made the news for a documentary on men, or the end of men and manhood. Or something like that, it was hard to follow while I was laughing.

Why laughing? Well as anyone who read the news about this last week knows, Carlson offered up some strange things that men should do, including to very private areas.

Yes, it was quite funny. But that is not what really got my attention. What got my attention is much of the nonsense talked about in this “documentary.” It seems filled with dudes wrestling and flipping tires and generally bro-ing out in a way that many men, such as myself, find laughable and obnoxious.

High gas prices and political silliness in Springfield

ILLINOIS politicians must think we are really a dumb bunch, they just passed legislation that requires every gas pump in the Land of Lincoln to bear a sticker telling us that the state could be screwing us over even worse at the gas pump.

Of course, they don’t phrase it that honestly. They are quite literally giving us their 2-cents’ worth. Illinois will still have the second-highest gasoline taxes in the nation – but, hey, our politicians are putting off a 2-cent-a-gallon tax hike scheduled for July 1 until Jan. 1, 2023.

Let’s say in July, I were to pull into a service station to fill my pickup with fuel and I spend \$100. (I spent that much two weeks ago – the most I’ve paid in my life at a gas pump.) The legislature wants me to know life could be much worse. If they hadn’t put off the tax increase, I could have paid \$100.40.

Feeling a little underwhelmed? Well, you ought to be.

In 2019, Gov. J.B. Pritzker and legislative Democrats doubled the state’s gas tax, increasing it from 19 cents a gallon to 38 cents, and added an annual increase tied to inflation. It’s that annual increase for this year that may be suspended for six months, not the doubling of the state gas tax in 2019 or the inflationary increases that already have kicked in since then.

Illinois not only taxes gasoline by the gallon but it imposes a separate sales tax that taxes it by the dollar. The taxes paid per gallon are used in the basis to determine sales tax on the

overall sale.

We are taxing taxes.

Josh Sharp, chief executive officer of the Illinois Fuel and Retail Association, said Illinois may be the only state that assesses its sales tax on top of the gas tax. Folks in some parts of Illinois are paying about 50 cents a gallon in state taxes alone.

Add on the federal taxes and consumers are paying about 77 cents a gallon in taxes, he said. That’s shameful, particularly at a time when gasoline prices are at near record levels. Families across the state have suffered through two years of a pandemic and now are struggling against the highest inflation the nation has experienced in nearly 40 years.

If Gov. J.B. Pritzker signs the legislation, every gas pump in the state must have a 4-by-8-inch sticker reading: “As of July 1, 2022, the State of Illinois has suspended the inflation adjustment to the motor fuel tax through Dec. 31, 2022. The price on this pump should reflect the suspension of the tax increase.” If a gas station owner does not comply, they would face a fine of \$500 for each day they are out of compliance.

If the legislation is signed into law, Sharp said his organization plans to file a lawsuit to block its implementation on the grounds that it violates the free speech rights of its members.

So, where did this notion originate?

Well, it came from that incubator of really bad ideas known as the final two days of legislative session. Rarely do lawmakers become smarter or braver when they can see the end of their work in sight.

The delay of the 2-cent-per-gallon tax hike moved its implementation from before the November election to less than two months after. No one, least of all Pritzker, wants to be blamed for \$4.50 gasoline.

And in fairness, there is little a governor of any state can do about fluctuating oil prices on the international commodity exchanges. The only thing they can really influence that affects the price of gasoline is how it’s taxed.

How much fuel should be taxed is a valid public policy debate. But instead of making a tough call on reducing state revenue and bringing gas taxes down to be in line with other states, our lawmakers chose a flimsy fig leaf of a sticker to cover their culpability in making Illinois one of the most expensive places in the nation to fill up. We deserve better.

Six ways to make your garden more successful

HOMEOWNERS enjoy gardening for many different reasons. In addition to adding beauty to a property, gardens can offset grocery costs by yielding tasty produce.

They also offer important habitats and food sources for both insects and animals.

While growing a vegetable or flower garden can turn into a rewarding hobby, or even a passion,

gardening also can be overwhelming — particularly when the results are less than stellar. Novice gardeners have scores of resources at their disposal, including the advice of gardeners who have made mistakes and learned from them. The following guidance can make home gardens that much more successful.

You may have visions of an expansive garden growing rows of crops or acres of flowers. But it is smart to start small and build on what you find successful, which includes plants that thrive in your lawn and garden.

This also is beneficial if you are unsure of vegetable yields. Several blooming plants producing bushels of crops can be

overwhelming, especially if you can't get to harvesting or cooking them in a timely fashion.

Plants need nutrient-rich soil to encourage extensive root systems and produce strong, hardy plants, according to the gardening resource GrowVeg. Nourish soil with organic matter, such as manure, compost, shredded leaves, and natural mulch. Add this organic matter in the off-season to give it enough time to be incorporated into the ground before spring. You can have your soil tested for pH and other characteristics that make it friendly or averse to plants at a local garden center.

Do you know how deeply to plant seeds and

how far apart to space plants? Are you aware of the sunlight needs of certain flowers or plants? If not, read the packaging and do your research so your plants have the best chance of not only sprouting, but also surviving. Many people prefer to start seedlings indoors in late winter and then transfer those plants outdoors when they are stronger and more established.

Watch the way the sunlight dances over areas of your landscape. Take note of which areas get the most sun and shade. This will help you plan what to plant and where to plant it. Vegetable gardens tend to need ample sunlight to bear pick-worthy produce. You can give plants a leg up by growing them

in optimal conditions.

Certain plants have been bred to thrive in your climate, including heat-tolerant plants for climates with sweltering summer sun. Consult with a local gardening center to figure out which plant zone you are in and which plants will do best within that zone.

Rainwater contains fewer contaminants and additives than tap water, which can benefit garden plants. Collect rainwater in rain barrels and use irrigation systems to deliver it to the garden.

Home gardens can yield many gifts, from flowers to fruit. Beginners can utilize some time-tested strategies to increase their chances of planting a successful garden.

How to prepare landscapes for new plants

NEW plants can add much to a landscape. Whether they're replacing plants that are no longer thriving or being added to supplement an existing landscape, new plants are an affordable way to give a home's exterior a whole new look.

Much consideration is given to which plants to add to a landscape. That's understandable, as homeowners want to choose plants that will thrive and won't compromise the health of surrounding plants and trees. Before planting or even choosing plants, it's important to plan for new additions to a landscape. Preparing the landscape can inform homeowners about which plants to purchase and can ensure they thrive after planting.

Document sunlight exposure. Plants have different needs, and one of the biggest differences between species is the amount of sunlight they need to thrive. According to Penn State Extension, plants characterized as "full sun" require six or more hours of sunlight per day, while those considered "partial sun" need between four and six hours of sunlight per day. Plants designated as "partial shade" need two to four hours of sun per day, while "shade" plants need less than two hours of sunlight a day. Documenting sunlight exposure in advance gives homeowners an idea of which plants should be planted and where they should be planted. Jot down these observations in a journal over several weeks and then choose plants that will

thrive in each area.

Test the soil. A soil pH test is a simple and quick way to determine the acidity of soil. Soil pH levels will indicate how likely a plant is to thrive in a given spot. High levels won't necessarily mean an area should be avoided, as some plants thrive in acidic soils. Additional soil tests can determine other characteristics, such as the nutrient levels of soil and the amount of organic matter it contains. Each of these variables can help homeowners make the right choices as they introduce new plants to their properties.

Consider local wildlife. If local wildlife makes its presence known on a property, homeowners may want to take proactive steps prior to planting anything new. A new fence might prevent animals like deer from getting in, but that likely won't do much to repel smaller animals like squirrels, rabbits or foxes. If wildlife is a concern, homeowners can seek advice at their local garden center about which plants certain animals are likely to ignore. Homeowners who want to attract wildlife can do the same in reverse, choosing plants wildlife will be drawn to. Homeowners who want to deter wildlife should erect fencing or other barriers prior to planting.

Clear space if necessary. Plants grow up and out, and cramped quarters can make it hard for new plants to thrive. Some may thrive but only at the expense of other plants. If necessary, clear space prior to planting to ensure plants have ample space to grow.

LAWN AND GARDEN

How to pick the right trees for your property

TREES benefit a landscape by serving both aesthetic and utilitarian functions. A home surrounded by healthy green trees can be a sight to behold, and those same trees can benefit surrounding plants and wildlife at the same time.

As appealing as trees are, not all trees and landscapes make for the perfect match. The Arbor Day Foundation notes the importance of planning when designing a landscape. Planning ensures the trees homeowners ultimately choose for their properties will grow well in the soil and moisture present in their yards. Careful consideration of a handful of variables can help homeowners determine which trees will make the best fit for their properties.

Height: Homeowners must consider the projected height of a tree before planting it. Avoid trees that will bump into anything when fully grown, as that can adversely affect surrounding greenery and pose a safety

hazard. The ADF's tree sizing guide can be accessed at <https://www.arborday.org/trees/rightTreeAndPlace/size.cfm> and serves as an invaluable resource for homeowners who want to plant new trees around their properties.

Canopy spread: Trees grow out as well as up, so it's important to consider their potential width at maturity as well. The ADF sizing guide can help homeowners get an idea of how wide a tree is likely to be at maturity. Trees that spread out quite a bit don't necessarily need to be avoided, but it's important that they're planted far enough apart so they don't adversely affect surrounding plants. In addition, wide trees that are planted too close together can make the landscape appear crowded, taking something away from its aesthetic appeal.

Growth rate: Growth rate is an important variable because it can affect how quickly homeowners will see changes in their land-



scapes. Homeowners who want to plant for privacy can consider trees with quick growth rates or purchase more mature trees that are already near full growth. Those who are not in need of instant transformation

can try trees with slower growth rates, which the ADF notes typically live longer than fast-growing species.

Requirements: Different trees require different amounts of sun and

moisture and different soil components to thrive. Homeowners can have their soil tested to determine which trees will thrive in it. Local garden centers can be a great resource for homeowners who want insight as

to which trees will thrive in their local climates.

Trees serve many functions on a property. Choosing the right trees for a landscape requires careful consideration of a host of variables.

Hubs bounce back

Rochelle recovers from 10-inning loss to split conference set with Sycamore

SYCAMORE—After conceding two home runs in an extra-inning continuation of Tuesday’s Interstate 8 Conference series opener against Sycamore on Thursday, Rochelle senior Nate Burdin had the chance to bounce back with a strong performance in the series finale.



The Hubs and Spartans completed nine innings at Rochelle on Tuesday before the contest was suspended due to darkness. Action resumed in the top of the 10th inning on Thursday, with Sycamore’s Tommy Townsend and Ethan Storm each belting solo homers to seal a 7-5 win.

Both teams immediately proceeded into the series finale, where Burdin took the mound once again and delivered a solid outing, throwing five innings and holding the Spartans to three hits and two earned runs. Burdin also reached base five times, finishing 3-for-4 with three singles, one walk and one RBI as Rochelle defeated Sycamore 12-6 to salvage a two-game series split.

“It felt great to win this game,” Burdin said. “Sycamore’s a great opponent and the Interstate 8 is a competitive conference. The boys came out and they had my back today. Our defense was great and our bats were rolling. I thought my changeup was really diving today and that was an important pitch for me since I was struggling to get my curveball over the plate. I really utilized that changeup and I was able to keep their hitters off balance. It’s a big confidence booster.”

Senior Andy Buskohl singled and scored on a passed ball to put the Hubs (3-6, 2-4 Interstate 8) ahead 1-0 in the top of the first inning. Buskohl went 2-for-4 with three RBIs for the Hubs in the win. The Spartans tied the game when Townsend reached and scored on two errors in the bottom of the first inning. A bunt single from Sycamore’s Ethan Steele scored Joey Puleo and gave the Spartans their first lead of the game, 2-1, in the bottom of the fourth inning.

Lady Hubs battle the elements against Kaneland

Rochelle takes road match over LaSalle-Peru after close loss at DeKalb

ROCHELLE—Heavy rain and gusty winds enveloped the Rochelle Township High School soccer field as the Lady Hub varsity team battled Kaneland in an Interstate 8 Conference matchup Wednesday evening.

The Knights gained the early advantage, scoring four first-half goals before adding another goal in the second half to seal a 5-0 victory over Rochelle. The Lady Hubs (4-7, 3-2 Interstate 8) will face Morris on the road Monday, April 25 at 4:30 p.m.

Kaneland took advantage of the tailwind in the first half, finding the net during the 11th and 17th minutes to take a 2-0 lead. The Knights continued to attack with goals in the 31st and 35th minutes to hold a 4-0 halftime lead. Kaneland’s final goal came during the 47th minute.

The Knights outshot Rochelle 21-1 and 15-1 in shots on goal. Sophomore Danica Ward totaled 10 saves for Rochelle.

LaSalle-Peru

Freshman Makayla Lara’s hat trick fueled the Rochelle Lady Hub varsity

soccer team on Monday, with the girls defeating LaSalle-Peru 3-1 in an Interstate 8 Conference match. The Lady Hubs (4-6, 3-1 Interstate 8) outpaced LaSalle-Peru 24-4 in total shots and 13-2 in shots on goal.

Rochelle finished the match with four corner kicks while the Cavaliers were held to zero corner kicks. The Lady Hubs went ahead 1-0 when Lara scored the first of her three goals during the 18th minute.

Lara followed with her second goal during the 28th minute before completing the hat trick with her third goal during the 31st minute. Rochelle led the Cavaliers 3-0 at halftime and held LaSalle-Peru scoreless for nearly the entire match before conceding a goal in the 76th minute.

Sophomore Danica Ward totaled one save for the Lady Hub defense. Lara finished with 12 shots and seven shots on goal, while junior Kyra Rimstidt compiled five shots and three shots on goal. Junior Mavi Avila took three shots and senior Madison Ost added three shots on goal.

DeKalb

The Rochelle Lady Hub varsity soccer team faced

DeKalb on the road in a blistery nonconference matchup this past Thursday evening. In a low-scoring affair, DeKalb netted the lone goal of the contest, scoring early in the second half to

defeat the Lady Hubs 1-0.

Both teams recorded nine shots in the match, with DeKalb totaling four shots on goal and Rochelle tallying two shots on goal. Sophomore Danica Ward

finished with three saves in the match for the Lady Hubs (3-6, 2-1 Interstate 8).

Rochelle outpaced DeKalb 4-3 in shots during the first half, but both teams went 40 minutes without

finding the net. With the score deadlocked at 0-0, DeKalb found its first goal of the match during the 49th minute. Despite five shots in the second half, Rochelle couldn’t score the equalizer.

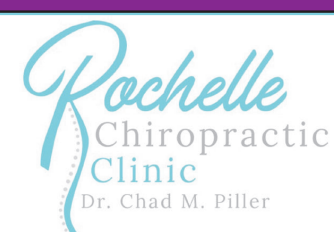
A left-handed hitter and versatile fielder,

Rochelle teams take on Sterling, Sandwich

Lady Hubs finish first, Hubs place second in three-team meet at RTHS

ROCHELLE — The Rochelle Hub and Lady Hub track and field teams hosted Sterling and Sandwich at the Douglas A. Creason Athletic Complex on Tuesday. The Lady Hub varsity team finished first with 66 points and the Hub varsity team took second place with 56 points.

Lady Hubs

Senior Sylvia Hasz finished second in the discus with a distance of 25.99 meters and third in the shot put with a distance of 9.52 meters. Senior Teagan Meyers won the high jump with a clearance of 1.50 meters and Meyers won the triple jump with a distance of 9.96 meters. Sophomore Alivia Henkel tied for first place in the pole vault with a clearance of 2.2 meters and sophomore Kennedy Adamski finished fourth in the long jump with a distance of 3.68 meters.

Hayes and Henkel finished second and third in the 100-meter dash with times of 13.57 seconds and 13.72 seconds.

Senior Sara Johnson placed second in the 800-meter run with a time of 2:45.51 and Ortiz took third with a time of 2:49.07. Rochelle's 800-meter relay team (Hayes, Neece, Jackson and Henkel) won with a time of 1:56.11 and Meyers won the 400-meter dash with a time of 1:03.61.

Henkel won the 300-meter hurdles with a time of 50.12 seconds and Ortiz won the 1600-meter run

with a time of 6:03.20. Meyers and Hayes finished first and third in the 200-meter dash with respective times of 28.06 seconds and 29.46 seconds. Rochelle's 1600-meter relay team (Johnson, Neece, Jackson and freshman Zoe White) placed third with a time of 4:59.40.

Juniors Hayden Inman and Ethan Bergeson finished first and second in the pole vault with clearances of 3.05 meters and 2.65 meters. Sophomore Nathan Sergeant won the triple jump with a distance of 11.39 meters and junior Trey Taft took third with a distance of 10.86 meters.

Rochelle's 3200-meter relay team (Abel Huerta, Wade Smith, Chris Hickey and Josue Huerta) won in 10:18.07 and Rochelle's 400-meter relay team (Ethan Wells, Landon DeLille, Ryan Simmons and Griffin Ohlinger) placed second in 46.97 seconds. Sophomore Alex Burke and senior Hayden Smith finished first and second in the 3200-meter run with times of 12:24.64 and 12:54.55. Bergeson took third place in the 110-meter hurdles with a time of 19.06 seconds.

DeLille finished fourth in the 100-meter dash with a time of 12.66 seconds and Rochelle's 800-meter relay team (Wells, DeLille, Luke Orlikowski and Ohlinger) placed second with a time of 1:38.93. Sophomore Caleb Wyssbrod took third in the 400-meter dash with a time of 57.70 seconds and Bergeson finished second in the 300-meter hurdles with a time of 48.23 seconds.

HOLLYWOOD — We thought it was unusual that **Bruce Willis** had seven films that went straight to video last year. Even stranger, nine more are going straight to video this year, starting with “Fortress: Sniper’s Eye” this month. Best guess is that Willis was diagnosed with aphasia two years ago. Aphasia robs you of the ability to communicate, speak, write and understand language, both verbal and written. It’s often caused by a stroke or head injury.

In our column last July, we wrote, “Willis must have hit the pandemic running.” At the time, he’d already had five films completed and was shooting four more simultaneously. We now realize he must have known his diagnosis. Since then, he’s completed eight more films going directly to video. Willis has had great hits like the “Moonlighting” TV series and the “Die Hard” movie franchise.

So, who knows, maybe I’ll be putting on spurs one day.” He then added, “I have a few in development right now!” Spielberg says he’ll never direct another musical, even though he’ll be producing, with **Oprah Winfrey** and **Quincy Jones**, the musical version of “The Color Purple,” the 1985 film he directed that made Oprah a movie star. They’ve already lined up **Taraji P. Henson** to play Shug Avery.

Lady Hubs fall to Sycamore

ROCHELLE — The Rochelle Lady Hub varsity softball team continues to seek its first win of the season after falling 17-3 against Sycamore in an Interstate 8 Conference matchup Tuesday.

The Spartans scored three runs on two singles and three walks in the top of the first inning. Sycamore extended its lead with four runs in both the second and third innings to surge ahead 11-0. Rochelle (0-5, 0-4 Interstate 8) scratched two runs in

the bottom of the third inning, where senior Jordin Dickey and sophomore Ella Alfano each crossed home plate for the Lady Hubs.

The Spartans continued to attack in the top of the fourth inning, plating four runs on three singles and one double to take a 15-2 lead. Junior Addie Friestad singled and scored on an error to earn one Rochelle run back in the bottom of the fourth inning. Sycamore closed out a decisive victory with two runs on one double and two singles in the top of the fifth inning.

Rochelle rallied for five runs in the top of the fifth inning to take command of the series finale. Junior Colton O'Rorke and senior Grant Messer each drew walks to open the frame before senior Eric Briseno reached on an error to load the bases for Burdin, who drove an RBI single to the center-field wall that evened the score at 2-2. Junior Garrett Gensler, who entered as a courtesy runner for the catcher Messer, then scored on a passed ball to give Rochelle the lead.

"I thought I was consistent with my load today and I was seeing the ball well," Burdin said. "I knew I had to help my boys out and I had a big responsibility hitting out of the No. 2 hole. We need to keep rolling and playing with confidence heading into our series with Sandwich."

The Hubs took a 5-2 lead after Buskohl sent a two-run double up the middle and through two Sycamore infielders who collided while attempting to make the play. Senior Owen Angell capped off the five-run rally with an RBI double on a deep drive to left-center field. Sycamore's Owen Piazza homered in the bottom of the fifth inning to earn one run back for the Spartans.

A sacrifice fly from Buskohl and a Sycamore error allowed two Rochelle runs to score in the top of the sixth inning. The Hubs sealed their win with a four-run effort in the top of the seventh inning. O'Rorke opened the frame with a single before scoring on Briseno's RBI double down the left-field line. After Rochelle loaded the bases, senior Braden Alfano cleared the bases

with a three-run double into the left-field corner. Alfano went 3-for-5 with three RBIs in the win.

"It's a big win for our team because we knew that Sycamore was undefeated in conference play before this game," Alfano said. "We played a really tight game against them on Tuesday and to come here and beat them by six runs is huge for us. I think we have a really good team this season. We came out slow to start the season, but I think we're capable of bouncing back."

Tuesday

Senior Andy Buskohl took the mound for the Hubs on Tuesday, throwing six innings and striking out four batters while holding Sycamore to one earned run on four hits. The Spartans took a 1-0 lead on Byron Blaise's solo home run in the top of the third inning. Rochelle answered in the bottom of the third inning, where senior Nate Burdin delivered an RBI single to tie the score.

Two Rochelle errors led to two Sycamore runs in the top of the fourth inning. The Spartans extended their lead in the top of the seventh inning, where first baseman Tommy Townsend sent a two-run single through the right side of the infield. Trailing 5-1, Rochelle rallied to score four runs in the bottom of the seventh inning. Junior Noah Lara brought one run home on an infield single before senior Braden Alfano belted a two-out, three-run double with the bases loaded.

Both teams went scoreless over the eighth and ninth innings before play was suspended due to darkness. Burdin and Lara each
