New baseball coach inherits young and hungry team

MENDOTA – Robert Nunn takes over the head coaching duties of the Mendota varsity baseball team after Aaron Sester held down the post for 10 years.

Nunn is no stranger to the program, having served as an assistant coach the past several seasons, and he believes that familiarity with the players gives him a leg up.

“That allows the team to deal with the growing pains that are connected with a coach meeting a team for the first time as the head coach,” said Nunn. “Many of the players know how I communicate information and what the expectations are from them.

“It has allowed the older players a chance to demonstrate their leadership skills in getting the underclassmen on board and on task. Having experience with the gentlemen also allows us to evaluate our strengths and weaknesses from previous years and tailor practices to grow and build from previous success and pitfalls.”

Nunn said one of the challenges of taking over as head coach will be the changes that are being implemented in the program to progress the team toward the vision where the program needs to go.

“These changes can take some players time to adjust and learn new ways, but the gentlemen have done a fantastic job at adapting to everything thrown at them,” noted Nunn. “We have a group of men who are hungry to learn and

willing to try new things to be successful in what they are doing.”

While the Trojan roster boasts 16 players, only three of them are seniors. However, some of the non-seniors have varsity experience, which is a bonus to the first-year head coach.

“We are going to be a young team this year, but luckily many of our young players have already seen time at the varsity level,” explained Nunn. “We also have a few seniors who have been seeing varsity time since their freshman year, which gives them a lot of experience that they can bring to the other players in the program.”

The three senior squad members are Emilio Perez, Ted Landgraf and Andy Rivera.

Offensively, Nunn said the Trojans are going to be aggressive on the base paths and utilize their speed to hopefully put pressure on the defense.

“Landgraf is a lefty outfielder who has a combination of speed and power that will make him an offensive threat and will be able to turn singles into extra bases,” said Nunn. “Perez is an outfielder who is a disciplined hitter that knows how to battle for his pitch in order to put himself in the most opportune position to do damage at the plate.”

A bulk of the roster is comprised of juniors. They include Krew Bond, Juan Delao, Drake Dennis, Carlos Escatel, Landon Kreiser, Braden McPheeters,

Dominik Stamberger, Ryne Strouss and Jasiel Watson.

“Bond is a shortstop who shows a high-level approach at the plate as well as power and bat speed that allows him to hit with power to all parts of the field,” stated Nunn. Bond is entering his third year of varsity competition.

“From top to bottom, we have a lineup that can perform roles to find ways on base, then all players show an ability to attack defenses on the base paths to extend into extra bases.”

Sophomores on the team are Justin Randolph, Izaiah Nanez and Cale Strouss, while freshman Braiden Freeman rounds out the roster.

Another important part of a baseball team is its pitching staff and Nunn is excited about the quantity and quality of hurlers he can run out to the mound. He explained that the entire staff returns from last season as well as a combination of other players to add extra support.

The pitching staff consists of Landgraf, Bond, Delao, Dennis, Escatel, Kreiser, Stamberger, Nanez, Randolph and Freeman.

“In my time here at Mendota, this is the strongest pitching staff we have had,” Nunn noted. “We plan on attacking teams with first-pitch strikes. We are going to force teams to put the ball in play, then rely on our defense to make the plays behind us. If we can do this, we will keep our pitch count down and put us in situations

where we are competitive in all games.

“In high school baseball, a pitching staff that can limit teams’ offense by not giving free passes, limiting extra bases and is working ahead in the count tend to find themselves in a good position to be winning the game.”

Mendota enters its first season in the Three Rivers Conference and Nunn said he is looking forward to building some school rivalries.

“When it comes to who we play, we always want to be playing the best teams we possibly can,” said Nunn.

Playing time will be plentiful for softball team members

MENDOTA – If you’re a member of the 2022 Mendota varsity softball team, getting playing time shouldn’t be a problem. With only 12 girls on the roster, head coach Joel Perez won’t have a lot of options for strategic moves.

“Numbers seem to be down all over – us included with only 12 players on the varsity roster,” said Perez. “It is a little concerning because if I need to take anyone from the freshman-sophomore roster, they will be low in numbers too, so hopefully we can all stay healthy.”

Four of Mendota’s varsity players are seniors, with Paige Manning heading the group, having played on the varsity level her first three years.

“Manning is one of our leaders on both sides,” stated Perez. “She has been pitching for us for three years and has been in the middle of our line-up, also. We are looking for her to have another big year.

The other seniors are Zoe Finley, Bailey Baird and Taylor Kelly.

Perez said Finley is a returning outfielder who also has plenty of varsity experience and he will be expecting some big things from her in her final season.

Perez added that Baird missed most of last season and he is hoping she can fill one of the outfield spots. Kelly returns to the softball diamond after not

playing since her freshman year, and Perez noted she will be battling for one of the infield positions.

Junior team members are Emma Schultz, Katie Jenner, Zoe Hanson and Gracie Zinke.

Perez said that Schultz played some outfield and catcher last year and will take on the same roles this year. Jenner had a solid campaign as a sophomore and is being counted on to contribute in a big way, added Perez.

Hanson and Zinke were both utility players last season. Hanson is vying for a spot in the infield, while Zinke can play infield and outfield.

Rounding out the roster are sophomores Ryleigh Sondgeroth and Madelyn Becker. Both played on the varsity level as freshmen. Perez said Sondgeroth can play all over the diamond, including in the circle, while Becker will try to land playing time in the outfield.

Perez said Manning, who will pitch at the University of Dubuque next year, will get a bulk of the pitching time for the Lady Trojans. Others who will be called upon in the circle are Sondgeroth, Baird and freshman Ava Eddy.

Offensively, Perez feels like the Lady Trojans are capable of putting a lot of runs on the board with the success some of the girls have had in the past. “All the girls are working hard in practice and hopefully it carries over to the field,”

"This group provides us with much needed experience and leadership," said Myers of his core group. "Stewart, Delao and Garcia along with four others on the team played year-long travel soccer so them gaining that experience and extra time playing/learning the game is going to help us out this season.

"Tolentino provides us with a four-

year starter who is very knowledgeable about the game, knows how to score and set others up to score along with being a great leader. Stewart will lead our defense from the sweeper position as someone we can rely on every game to help us out in the back."

In addition to the veteran players, Myers is looking for midfielder Bianca Valdez, striker Noemi Valencia and striker Crystal Garcia to help the team significantly along with a few upperclassmen who did not go out last year due to COVID who also should help the team out.

"The girls put in time this summer at practices along with seven of our girls playing club soccer, which should help this season," said Myers.


Myers expects early on his team's lack of playing time since last season for most of his team could be a weakness and expects that the team chemistry will be a work in progress.

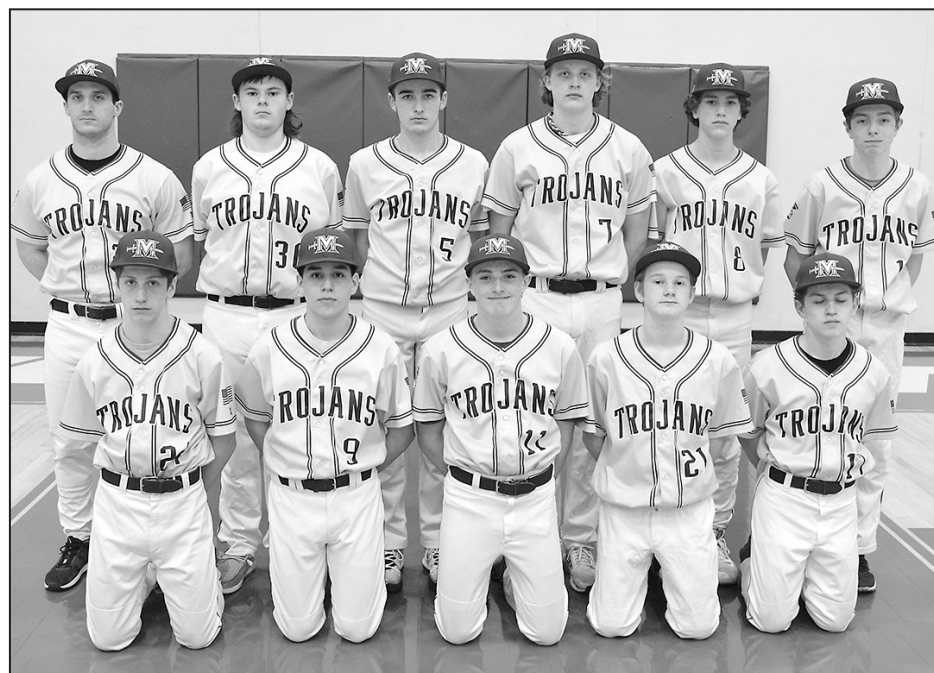
LeRette didn’t have players who are slotted into specific positions but believes that his team will have as much fun as possible.
