Nettles explains 1 percent tax for local schools

Superintendent talks about benefits of the proposed tax

CLINTON — Clinton Superintendent Curt Nettles is wondering if the third time may be the charm in getting the 1 percent sales tax for school facilities approved by voters.

DeWitt County voters have rejected the proposed tax twice, but Nettles told school board members at the March 15 meeting that he believes they may not fully understand its benefits to the district.

A 2007 state law allows voters to approve a sales tax to fund school facility

needs. The sales tax is 1 percent (or one cent on every dollar) spent on qualifying retail purchases. To date, 57 counties in Illinois have passed the tax to benefit their schools and communities, Nettles said.

The tax could provide \$870,000 annually to the district, Nettles estimated. The 1 percent facilities sales tax does not apply to cars, food, farm equipment, prescriptions and more and can only be used for school facility needs or improvements. It cannot be used for salaries.

Nettles said he was sharing the information so board members could consider if they want to add it to a future ballot.

Spring brings increased code enforcement

Officials plan more focus on unkempt properties

CLINTON — City Commissioner Ken Buchanan reminded residents on Monday

about how to handle their yard waste as the spring lawn season approaches. And police chief Ben Lowers said the city would increase its enforcement this year of unkempt properties.

The city officials offered the information during Monday's city council meeting. Buchanan said city workers would begin picking up brush

this week, and he said residents should bag their other yard waste, such as grass clippings, if they place them out for pick up.

Brush piles should be no larger than what could reasonably fit into the bed of a pickup truck. The city collects brush piles once a week. Buchanan said they would collect bags of yard waste once or twice a week.

Chief Lowers added the city would more vigorously enforce ordinances this season affecting poorly maintained properties.

"With the warmer weather of spring, it is a good opportunity to clean up yards," Lowers said. "I will tell you, our department does intend a ramp-up of code enforcement."

CLINTON — Clinton Rotary Club is helping host a World Autism Day commemoration at Rotary Park from 10 a.m.-noon

on Saturday, April 2.

Guest speaker will be Jeanne Kramer, director of the autism program at the University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign.

The event is intended to "promote World Autism Day and highlight the perspectives and achievements of people with autism in the local community," said local event organizer Kaelan Smith.

"This is an opportunity

to educate people," Smith said.

Smith hopes to encourage people to get past labeling others because they are different or they don't understand them.

When Smith was a student at Clinton High School and president of NHS, he visited Hope School, in Springfield, for people with disabilities. The trip was the beginning of his interest in helping

people be better informed about those with autism.

Autism Spectrum Disorders includes people with severe autism to people who are high-functioning, such as those with Asperger's syndrome.

"One of the big things is it (World Autism Day) is meant to spark a conversation," Smith said.

The public is encouraged to attend the April 2 event.

Remmert retiring from health department

CLINTON — Dr. Aaron Blakely, Chairman of the DeWitt/Piatt Board of Health, announced this week that long-serving Administrator, David M. Remmert, will retire at the end of May.

Remmert has served in his current role for nearly 17 years and has spent the past 31 years in continuous service in public health.

"Dave left an indelible mark on this agency and on our communities overall,"

Blakely said. "His experiences here ranged from bringing in millions of dollars of funding to deliver needed services to our communities including everything ranging from car seat programs for underserved new parents, to creating a new dental clinic serving thousands of Medicaid-eligible residents with nowhere to go for services."

Blakely said Remmert's administrative ability

helped him to reconstruct the agency's accounting system to allow for much better management information systems, to recreating a more competitive salary schedule.

"Probably his biggest task was working toward construction of a new office building in Clinton," Blakely said. "He was able to raise hundreds of thousands of dollars in funding to offset some of

the cost of the building.

Blakely acknowledged grants secured by Remmert to build the dental clinic, as well as to build a more energy efficient office.

Remmert "even received a federal earmark that he personally requested from our federal legislators, while on vacation in Washington, D.C., to make it all happen," Blakely said.

Farris announces candidacy for county board

CLINTON — Thomas L. Farris, 66, a Republican, of rural Clinton, has announced his bid to run for the Dewitt County Board in District C.

The Primary election is scheduled for June 28.

District C encompasses voting precincts Clintonia 7,8,9, Creek, and Texas Townships. Farris touts his over 40 years of leadership experience in the public and private sectors as a manager and supervisor to being a well-qualified candidate for the position of county board member.

He holds a master's degree in business management and has extensive experience with line item budgeting used by the county.

Farris said he feels he can serve the citizens of his district with good, common sense representation.

"Of course, people will ask, 'why are you running'," Farris said. "Being retired offers me the time and ability to connect with residents and get a pulse of their feelings on issues. I will vote to keep taxes as low

as possible and make sure decisions are beneficial to the citizens of Dewitt County."

"However, this county is agriculturally based and is a high producer in that regard," he said. Getting out of hot water

Welcome to my little corner of culinary delights. Boiling food in liquid is very common place. Potable water used in cooking is probably the most used cooking medium outside of oil. We poach and hard cook eggs in it. We make soups out of it. We boil vegetables in it for side dishes. Canning foods in a water bath is common. And the list goes on. Why so much in use?

Similar to an oven, the heat is distributed all around the food items. It also holds a constant temperature of 212°F. This makes the cooking process uniform, easily controlled and thus more predictable. Water is readily available and easy to discard. It is also safe in that it will not cause a fire as does oil. Aside from so many advantages, it has some drawbacks. In cooking, many take the easy way out thus diminishing the product quality. The above advantages appear commonplace. The disadvantages are not so obvious.

Whenever vegetables are boiled, much of the flavor is extracted and some vitamins destroyed or weakened. This is not as bad if the water is retained as a soup. If the vegetables are for the side dish, the water is poured off. Even if you are making a soup with the water, the flavor in the vegetable is still compromised. A truly exquisite soup starts out with the flavor in the water and in the food items as well. When one bites into the vegetable and/or meat, the full quality is apparent. It is a heavenly

delight. That is why stock is made for such purposes. But how then do we cook the vegetables and meat? Boiling should not be the answer.

I like to do stove top roasting of my vegetables prior to any other cooking application. But first you must clean and prepare the vegetables. Each type is to be cooked separately. I call this segregated cooking. It prevents each type of vegetable from getting over or under cooked. You have more control for maintaining that al dente state than you could from boiling. The flavor is also held in and is intensified. Have total and complete control over all processes. A chef's work must never be guesswork. In that way, there is less chance of failure. If you are going to do it, then do it right. Now it is time to learn the process.

Heat a small amount of clarified butter and pure olive oil in a large sauté pan on medium high flame. Add one type of vegetable only. Flip the pan to coat the vegetables and cook it. Your nose should detect the full aromatic bouquet and the level of scorching. A little scorching is good. Flip the vegetables to turn them. You should see dark spots on several of the vegetables. Oops, I ran out of space. We will begin from here in the next article.

Questions & Answers

General

Question:
How do I earn Social Security credits and how many do I need to qualify for benefits?

Answer:
We use your total yearly earnings to figure your Social Security credits. The amount needed for a credit in 2022 is \$1,510. You can earn a maximum of four credits for any year. The amount needed to earn one credit usually increases each year when average wages increase. You must earn a certain number of credits to qualify for Social Security benefits. The number of credits you need depends on your age when you apply and the type of benefit application. No one needs more than 40 credits for any Social Security benefit. Question:

Retirement

Question:
I have never worked but my spouse has. What will my benefits be?

Answer:
You can be entitled to as much as one-half of your spouse's benefit amount when you reach full retirement age. If you decide to receive Social Security retirement benefits before you reach full retirement age, the amount of your benefit is reduced. The amount of reduction depends on when you will reach full retirement age. For example, if your full retirement age is 66, you can get 35 percent of your spouse's unreduced benefit at age 62 (a permanent reduction); if your full retirement age is 67, you can get 32.5 percent of your spouse's unreduced benefit at age 62 (a permanent reduction).

The amount of your benefit increases if your entitlement begins at a later age, up to the maximum of 50 percent at full retirement age. However, if you are taking care of a child who is under age 16 or who gets Social Security disability benefits on your spouse's record, you get the full spouse's benefits, regardless of your age. Question:
I am nearing my full retirement age, but I plan to keep working after I apply for Social Security benefits. Will my benefits be reduced because of my income?

Answer:
No. If you start receiving benefits after you've reached your full retirement age, you can work while you receive Social Security and your current benefit will not be reduced because of the earned income. If you keep working, it could mean a higher benefit for you in the future. Higher benefits can be important to you later in life and increase the future benefit amounts your survivors could receive. If you begin receiving benefits before your full retirement age, your earnings could reduce your monthly benefit amount. After you reach full retirement age, we recalculate your benefit amount to leave out the months when we reduced or withheld benefits due to your excess earnings. Disability

Question:
I have been getting Social Security disability benefits for many years. I'm about to hit my full retirement age. What will happen to my disability benefits?

Answer:
When you reach "full retirement age," we will switch you from disability to retirement benefits. But you won't even notice the change because your benefit amount will stay the same. It's just that when you reach retirement age, we consider you to be a "retiree" and not a disability beneficiary. To learn more, visit www.ssa.gov.

Question:
Will my Social Security disability benefit increase if my condition gets worse or I develop additional health problems?

Answer:
No. We do not base your Social Security benefit amount on the severity of your disability. The amount you are paid is based on your average lifetime earnings before your disability began. If you go back to work after getting disability benefits, you may be able to get a higher benefit based on those earnings. In addition, we have incentives that allow you to work temporarily without losing your disability benefits. Supplemental Security Income

Question:
Is it true that a person can own a home and still be eligible for Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits?

Answer:
Yes. A person who owns a home and lives in that home can be eligible for SSI benefits. Although there is an asset limit for people to qualify for SSI, some things don't count toward that limit, such as a house, a vehicle, and some funds set aside for burial expenses. Question:
My 15-year-old sister has been blind since birth. I think she should apply for Supplemental Security Income (SSI), but my parents think because she's a minor, they're responsible for her and she won't qualify. Who is right?

Answer:
To qualify for SSI, an individual must meet certain income and resource limits. Since your sister is a minor, some of your parents' income and resources will determine whether your sister is eligible for SSI. Once your sister turns 18, their income and resources won't be considered when deciding her eligibility and payment amount. Tell your parents they can check with any Social Security office to see if your sister qualifies. To learn more, visit www.ssa.gov or call us at 1-800-772-1213 (TTY 1-800-325-0778).

Medicare

Question:
I didn't enroll in Medicare Part B back when my Part A started a few years ago. Can I enroll now?

Answer:
It depends. The general enrollment period for Medicare Part B, medical insurance, begins January 1 and runs through March 31. Keep in mind that although there is no monthly premium for Medicare Part A, there will be a premium for your Medicare Part B. In most cases, that premium goes up each 12-month period you were eligible for it and elected not to enroll. If you are covered by a group healthcare plan based on your employment or the employment of a spouse, you may qualify for a special enrollment. Special enrollments may be processed at any point during the year, but require proof of coverage. To find out more about Medicare, visit www.medicare.gov or www.ssa.gov/benefits/medicare/.

Al graduated from Mt. Vernon High School with the class of 1956 and attended SIU-C, where he met Carlene. He graduated in 1960 and continued his studies in chemistry at the University of Minnesota. He and Carlene married on July 9, 1961, at the First Baptist Church of Clinton. Upon completion of his master's degree, Al accepted a position with 3M in St. Paul, Minn., where he worked for four years before returning to live in Southern Illinois, working in new product research for Monsanto, in St. Louis, Mo.

While living in Collinsville, Ill. for 17 years, Al was active at First Baptist Church, serving as a camp counselor, director of the drama club, Sunday school teacher, choir member, and deacon.

In 1984 he was transferred to Springfield, Mass. as new product research manager, and in 1988 he returned to the Monsanto St. Louis campus, living this time in



Chesterfield, Mo. During his time with Monsanto, Al secured over 40 U. S. patents and many foreign patents for the company.

After retiring from Monsanto in 1991, Al and Carlene relocated to Clinton, where they opened C & A Country Gardens. Al worked for the USPS as a substitute rural carrier and taught evening chemistry classes at Richland Community College. Al continued his desire to learn and completed the Master Gardener classes and was a member of the Illinois Specialty Growers Association. He applied for and received two SBIR grants for the invention and development of a spray-on biodegradable foam mulch. He was granted two U. S. patents and one European patent for his invention.

He was a life-long St. Louis Cardinals baseball fan, and the Packers were his football favorites. In basketball, his loyalties were split between the Celtics and the L.A. Lakers.

Family gatherings and his faith were very important to Al. A Celebration of Life for family and friends will be held at 1 p.m. on May 21, 2022, at the Family Life Center at the Clinton First Christian Church, where Al was a member.

“If we do (propose the tax), we should be in it to win it,” said Nettles, adding previous rejections had been by only about 300 votes.

School board members also heard a presentation by Clinton High School foreign language teacher Joe Scanavino about the German American Partnership Program (GAPP) which allows high school juniors and seniors to partner with German students and their families. If approved by the board, Clinton students could visit Germany for more than two weeks and the German students would visit Clinton for nearly four weeks.

This fall will be the first year German is being offered in Clinton and currently there are 85 students signed up for German I.

Why German? Scanavino said people who understand business, automotive, health, and pharmacy—recognize a knowledge of German is important.

“In all those fields you see a lot of things coming out of Germany,” he said.

Scanavino said the cost to the district would be minimal as the students

stay with Clinton families.

In other business, the board:

Learned the high school’s Mental Health First Aid program has been presented to other area school boards and is now being considered for junior high students. “This district does not take mental health lightly at all,” said Nettles.

Received gratitude from Nettles for the board and community support he has received during the pandemic, adding other superintendents have faces threats and name calling. “I think you should know the CSBE has integrity.”

He recommended residents took the opportunity of warm weather to clean up brush, garbage, etc. from their properties.

“We have properties we have continually battled year after year after year,” he said. “We have done our part, and I think we have done a nice job of trying to work with folks to gain compliance.”

Lowers said his department would continue to do that,” but, there also comes a point with some, where we’ve given a warning, we’ve offered to help and given ample time.”

“The enforcement is not a popular thing,” said commissioner Dan Ballenger. “But, you have to think of your neighbor, so it’s important.”

Lowers said his officers hear from both sides of the issue, and sometimes people misunderstand what constitutes an ordinance violation.

“We can’t please everyone, and we don’t have a rule for every single situation,” Lowers said. “But, in terms of being a responsible property owner and taking care of those things, we do have this in place.”

Golfcarts

Lowers reported the city had registered about 30 golf carts locally for the

upcoming warm weather season.

“Last year, I think we registered in the ballpark of about 25, so it hasn’t skyrocketed by any means,” Lowers said. “We’ve gotten just one or two new ones so far this year.”

He said some people who bought carts when the city began allowing their use have since sold them.

Golf carts are not allowed on any state roadway. The county also does not permit their use on county roadways.

Lowers said the program had gone well since being instituted. The city is considering extending the operating hours for carts.

Supreme Court—President Biden nominated Ketanji Brown Jackson to the Supreme Court. She would be the first Black female to sit on that Court. Compounded drugs can be Rx for greed

The Department of Justice nabbed a doctor who was licensed in both Texas and Oklahoma for writing drug prescriptions in exchange for kickbacks. The drugs in question were compounded, which are expensive because they are either multiple drugs mixed together, pills made into liquid or drugs made without dyes in them.

In this case, the doctor ordered the drugs after a compounding company solicited him, and paid a hefty bribe, to write prescriptions that would be filled by that company's pharmacy. Footing the bill for these pricey drugs was Medicare, TRICARE, CHAMPVA and the

Federal Employees Compensation Act Program.

The doctor ran pain clinics in both states, which is a good place to hide specialty drugs. He pleaded guilty and could face paying back \$1.5 million. However, part of his plea deal is that he serves 36 months of supervised probation, with no jail time.

One hopes that the judge doesn't accept that plea. Compounded drugs are potentially dangerous, especially when the participants aren't thinking first of patient safety.

A couple years ago, the major players in another

compounding company were caught up in a deadly scheme that caused a nationwide meningitis outbreak, the biggest ever seen by a pharmaceutical drug. They cut corners, shipped in bulk without individual prescriptions, ignored patient safety, misbranded drugs, didn't await sterility test results, let mold and bacteria into their clean-room facility and created drugs with expired ingredients. Almost 800 patients across the country came down with a fungal infection

after getting injections of those drugs. Of those, over 100 patients have died.

They also tried, and failed, to hide their activities. They weren't too bright, apparently, shipping drugs to patients named Bud Weiser, Fat Albert, Samuel Adams and others.

All the participants received average prison sentences ... until a federal appeals court decided that the original judge was wrong. One by one the criminals are being resentenced with extra time added on.





Weather History

March 24
 2013: A major snowstorm struck central Illinois, producing several rounds of moderate to heavy snowfall accompanied by thunderstorms. Snowfall rates of 2 to 3 inches per hour were noted. A total of 10 to 18 inches fell in an area from Rushville to Danville, south to near I-70, with the heaviest totals in Logan, Sangamon, and Christian Counties. Several locations established their all-time 24-hour snowfall record, including Springfield (17.4 inches), Pana (13.8 inches), and Taylorville (17.7 inches). The snow depth of 16 inches at Springfield the next morning tied its all-time greatest depth.

March 25
 1978: A major ice storm affected a large portion of central Illinois over a two-day period. The storm, leaving several inches of ice, was described as one of the worst in many years. 24 counties were declared disaster areas. The thick ice combined with strong winds to down power lines, tree limbs, and TV antennas; small fires resulted from the broken power lines. Cleanup across the area lasted up to a week.
