Surging prices spur talks of repealing Illinois' gasoline tax

☐ Drivers feeling big pain at the pump

SPRINGFIELD - As gasoline prices approach \$5 a gallon, some are calling for the repeal of Illinois' gas tax.

When Gov. J.B. Pritzker took office in January 2019. total state gas taxes totaled 31 cents. Now they are up to 63 cents. With 19 more cents tacked on from the federal government, Illinoisans are feeling the pain at the pump.

Pritzker said it is tough all over.

"It's not an Illinois-specific problem," the governor said. "This is literally every country in the world is experiencing this and every state in the United States.'

Illinoisans currently pay the second highest taxes on gas in the country, a number that doubled after Pritzker took office due to the bipartisan Rebuild Illinois multiyear capitol construction plan. That measure doubled the state's gas tax and included annual gas tax increases tied to inflation, among other tax and fee increases.



Pritzker has proposed freezing the annual gas tax increase this year, but it would only be a temporary move and the tax would still be more than double than just a few years ago.

State Rep. Blaine Wilhour, R-Beecher City, told The Center Square the state gasoline tax should be repealed entirely.

"That is one of the most regressive taxes that we have," Wilhour said. "It disproportionately burdens working-class folks and

Sen. Rezin urges bills preventing future health outbreaks get a proper hearing

☐ Rezin says government failed during COVID outbreak at LaSalle Home

SPRINGFIELD – Sen Sue Rezin, R-Morris, said she wants to ensure quicker and better responses in future cases of virus outbreaks at

She's reintroduced legislation to address shortcomings in the state's response to the outbreak, but on March 10 called for more help from lawmakers to advance the bills that remain in the Assignments Committee

"The residents of the Veterans' Home served and protected our nation when we needed it," Rezin said. "But when they needed us to serve and protect them, our state and our governor failed.'

The LaSalle home notified the Illinois Department of Veterans' Affairs on Nov. 1, 2020, of two veterans and two employees at the



COVID-19. Within a week, 60 veterans and 43 staff members had the corona-

A state watchdog report found multiple failures that contributed to 36 veterans' deaths during the outbreak.

The Illinois Department of Human Services' Office of the Inspector General's investigation determined that a lack of comprehensive, documented COVID-19 plans and policies, which included the absence of any standard operating procedures in the event of an outbreak played a significant factor in the LaSalle facility's inability to contain the virus.

Two weeks after the outbreak began, the Illinois Department of Public Health and the United States Department of Veterans Affairs visited the site to observe

infection control practices.

Rezin also called it a "failure" of his administration that Gov. JB Pritzker wasn't fully briefed on the outbreak until nine days after it began.

So Rezin is sponsoring Senate Bill 3170, which would require that a veterans home administrator provide written notification to IDPH and IDVA within 24 hours of learning of a second case of an infectious disease.

Another bill, SB1471, would require facilities licensed and operated by the state to conduct outbreak-related preparedness drills.

The Human Services' department's report found that the LaSalle home had not created a COVID-19 task force or committee for leadership and supervisors to establish responsibilities for managing and monitoring the virus. That, the report said, resulted in confusion among staff and led to tasks being left undone.

"The unstructured approach caused complications and cross-contamination of positive and negative veterans," the report said.

a labor of love but hard work getting set up. 'It takes us a full day from morning till night the day before to be ready to go," he explained.

Study: Illinois tax burden highest in the U.S.

SPRINGFIELD - Taxes in Illinois are the highest in the U.S., according to a new study, but experts add it depends on who you are and how much you earn.

A recent study by Money Geek found residents in the Land of Lincoln shoulder the highest tax burden among all 50 states, giving it an E grade.

Using as their base a married couple with one dependent, both bringing in the median national income of \$82,852, and who own a \$349,400 home, the study shows Illinois residents pay nearly \$14,000 in state taxes every year, or 16.8% of their income.

Carol Portman, president of the Taxpayers' Federation of Illinois, says because of the flat tax, the state tends not to perform well when looking at the middle class.

"Part of this is definitely attributable to that," she told the Illinois Radio Network. "If you look at someone making \$300,000 to \$400,000 a year, I'm guessing Illinois would not fare as poorly — those folks would do better." Illinois' flat tax is part of the state's constitution.

'Generally speaking, middle class folks pay more in Illinois than they would in another state because the states that have a graduated structure tend to really hammer the high-end folks who make more and provide a lower tax on the middle-income folks, but Illinoisans did not want that," Portman said.

But that's not the only contributing

Sales tax rates in the state are high, Portman points out, as are property

"Another area where Illinois tends to do poorly in especially – and this is not related to income, it's on the property tax side, which is a very localized tax, but when you look on average across the state or the median numbers, our taxes tend to be higher than in other states," she said.

The study also shows a -0.9% population growth, suggesting the two may be correlated.

"Taxes certainly matter when people are sitting down deciding where to live, where to invest, where to expand a plant or open a new facility, taxes are obviously part of that calculation,' Portman said.

Part of it is the actual number of how much people pay, but Portman said the perception of high taxes plays a big role in people's decisions to move as well. Illinois has the perception of being a high tax state, she said, and pointed out studies like these only add to that.

But taxes aren't the only consideration, she added

"If taxes were the main reason for where people lived, Alaska would be bursting at the seams," Portman said. "They have no state sales tax, no income tax, and their property taxes are low. So if you wanted to move exclusively for taxes, you would move to Alaska, and that is obviously not what is happening."

Alaska ranks third for lowest tax burden, according to the study, and median residents pay only \$4,507 annually in taxes.

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

Dyslexic students should be helped

The tears still flow.

I met Chip Gass for lunch at a Springfield diner March 4. I hadn't seen him for decades, but we have something in common that places us in a unique community: those with dyslexia.

I first met Chip 30 years ago when I was a young reporter in the Quad-Cities and he was a political operative helping people get elected to city councils and the Rock Island County Board.

When we met at the diner, he left his Mercedes sedan in the restaurant's parking lot. He has a salary north of \$100,000 and a title of "executive" within a state agency. But he is still haunted by his childhood struggles in school.

The Springfield man said as he munched on his horseshoe that teachers didn't appreciate his struggle. Tears raced down his face as he recalled being held back in the second grade and the toll it took on his

But no one in Rock Island schools diagnosed or sought to address his dyslexia. The story was much the same for me. When I was in the third grade, I encountered a cruel teacher who would pick me up like a rag doll and shake me when I struggled to recognize a word. Never once did she offer any individual attention or help – only threats and punishment.

If I made a mistake I'd expect to be shaken. It was a pretty rough way to deal with a 7-year-old. Her mantra was continuous: "You're just not trying."

My mother didn't buy into this nonsense. She could see how much I tried. So, she spent two hours a day reading with me all through the third grade. I would read one page of the library book and she'd read the next.

Then the teacher decided I would only be allowed to check out picture books from the school library. What a pedagogical gem she was. My mother then hauled me weekly to the public

library and within a year and a half, I was not only a proficient reader but in love with it. Today, I read three or four newspapers a day and a book a week.

Other teachers had to know what was going on in that classroom. But they did nothing. The principal was aware, but he did little to alleviate the situation.

My parents took me for an evaluation at the University of Iowa Hospitals and came back with a diagnosis: dyslexia. Still, the school district did nothing. Their reasoning? My IQ was too high to receive special help.

Although I was diagnosed in the third grade, the first time one of my teachers discussed with me whether I was dyslexic was my junior year of college. And the professor had a degree in journalism – not education. It's tempting to throw the same words back at teach-

ers that they once threw at me: "You're just not trying." But that would be unfair. Many do care but they

operate within systems that fail to equip them to recognize dyslexia or act upon it when they see it.

Anne Brewster is the director of the Children's Dyslexia Center in Springfield, a charitable endeavor of the Scottish Rite Masons. Historically, the center has offered its services at no cost to children.

Specially trained tutors at the center help words come alive for youngsters. Reading proficiency often

"You don't see the word dyslexia used that often in the school settings," Brewster said. "And I think that that might have to do with misconceptions and confusion around exactly what it is. And maybe it's because there is not a really clear diagnostic tool that says you're dyslexic or you're not dyslexic. I think sometimes people actually think it's just fake or made up or not real. Or they just think only rich people have dyslexia because a lot of people in schools don't get support for it. So, they seek private tutoring because it's not always acknowledged or addressed in schools as dyslexia.'

I'm left thinking of a family friend, Larry Chadwick. He was a brilliant optometrist in my hometown of Galesburg and a friend of my father's. He died last month at the age of 90.

In his obituary, I read these words: "His education began in a one-room elementary school where he excelled in math and did not learn to read. His unconventional mother took matters into her own hands and began to search for a school that could teach her brilliant son how to read. She found a reading expert at Roosevelt Military Academy who taught dyslexic students how to read before dyslexia was even understood or diagnosed. At age 13, Larry boarded a train from Detroit to Aledo, Ill., where he began the next

Larry learned to read, then excelled in school."

I'd never realized that Dr. Chadwick and I had the same condition. It makes me admire him all the more. But I can't help but wonder, "If they were success-

fully treating kids with dyslexia in the 1930s, why do so many youngsters fail to get the help they need today?"

Powell saw Shabbona go – 1896

Backtracks

(The following is from Jessica Nashold's Backtracks & Sidetracks column reprinted from March 20, 1996.)

In March 1896, a hundred years ago, William Powell moved his family to Mendota from Northville, where he had lived since October 1837. The Somonauk Review reported that as Powell was leaving, he chanced to witness Shabbona and his tribe of about 1,000 Indians as they broke camp and prepared to move to the West. Powell described it as "a great scene" as some of the Indians "partook freely of whiskey" and became a bit wild.

Powell's first home in Mendota was a house at the corner of First Avenue and Ninth Street, purchased from a man named Parsons.

At the Baptist church, its "imposing and graceful steeple" had become unsafe, and a Mr. Kiso was awarded a contract to take it down. Mr. Kiso was a former bridge builder for the Northern Pacific railroad, but in 1896 he was a Mendota resident.

The Sun said it took a day and a half to do the work. The first step was to saw off the top 25 feet of steeple and pull it to the ground with ropes.

It fell with a mighty crash, smashing it to splinters.

The second step required removal of another 57 feet, taking the spire down to its base. This left 75 feet standing.

It was lamented that the steeple had suffered this dismal fate.

It was one of the handsomest church spires in this part of the country.

Mrs. Sam (Martha) Fernberg was in charge of her husband's dry goods business while he was receiving treatment for a mental breakdown. A man in Earlyille asked the court to appoint a conservator for Mr. Fernberg and take the business out of Mrs. Fernberg's hands. She contested this action and after a thorough examination of the books, the judge ruled she was the "best suited" to be conservator.

The judge's opinion in this respect seems to meet with the approval of the majority of the community.

Mrs. Fernberg continued with the

business until 1910.

Editor Mark Ruggles of the Sun published a sketch of parks he hoped to see created and maintained - one between the Illinois Central tracks and Main Street, the other in the space between the IC and CB&Q tracks. In addition to trees and flower beds, he suggested that seats be provided.

The railroads published new timetables showing eight eastbound and seven westbound passenger trains on the CB&Q, four passenger trains northbound and four southbound on the Illinois Central. Passengers frequently had to transfer in Mendota from one line to the other.

Illinois Central painters took their brushes to the ceiling of a large awning that encircled the depot. They painted it light olive green. The Central believes in keeping

up their property, even in hard times. The IC also purchased 11 new Rogers

locomotives "of the latest pattern." In 1896, Illinois had 10,474 miles

of railway – more than any other state in the Union.

J.M. Momeny of Walnut and R.L. Russell of Ohio opened the Ohio Real Estate Co. with offices in Mendota and Ohio. The Walnut Motor spoke well of Mr. Momeny.

What Putin knew and the power it gave him

There are forgivable intellectual and policy errors, and then there's the self-delusion that has driven the West into its dependence on Vladimir Putin's oil and gas

Russia has long been a major supplier of energy to Europe. The depletion of European natural gas reserves has played a role in Russia's increased significance. Moscow has also benefited, though, from a deliberate choice by Europe to attempt a great leap forward into a green-energy future, especially in a Germany that turned its back on both nuclear and coal.

In taking this route, Europe made a holiday-from-history decision to forget the incredible power of oil, gas and coal -- the most reliable and efficient sources of energy the world has ever known -- and ignore the inevitable centrality of energy to geopolitics.

Greta Thunberg, the teenage climate activist who has been elevated into an oracle of all that is good and true, demanded nothing less.

No matter what you've heard, the world hasn't embraced fossil fuels out of hatred of the planet, rather because they are so incredibly useful. If they didn't already exist -- thanks to sunlight and plants that lived millions of years ago -- we would have to invent them and wouldn't be able to

Oil is a miracle fuel. Alex Epstein of the Center for Industrial Progress writes that it is "almost eerily engineered by natural processes, not just for cheapness, not just for reliability, not just for scalability, but also for another characteristic crucial to a functional civilization: portability." It powers cars, trucks and jets, without which the modern world as we know it wouldn't exist. Coal, too, Epstein notes, is affordable, abundant and easy

to extract and transport. There is a reason that developing nations invariably use it to power their economic advancement.

So, it's not surprising that fossil fuels are still the leading source of global electricity, with coal accounting for 36.7% and gas 23.5%. The total fossil fuel contribution, at 63.3%, is down only slightly from two decades ago.

In terms of overall energy, fossil fuels are an even larger

proportion, 84.3%.

For its part, green energy -- wind, solar and other renewables -- account for around 10% of global electricity, and even less of total energy.

Vladimir Putin knew this and understood the power it gave

him, even if European policymakers couldn't be bothered to think a tiny bit strategically. Did they not notice that coal was the mainstay of Britain's

rise to global power in the 19th century? Did they forget the role of oil in World War I and World

War II, let alone subsequent 20th-century history? Petroleum wasn't particularly useful prior to World War I

and, by the end of it, had become a pillar of national power. It fueled the motorized vehicles and airplanes that transformed warfare. British foreign minister Lord Curzon famously said at the war's conclusion that the Allies had "floated to victory upon a wave of oil."

In World War II, the Japanese attacked the United States in part for fear that the American de facto oil embargo would starve its war machine, and one reason the Nazis were defeated was that they ran out of fuel.

Of course, the strategic significance of the Middle East owed almost entirely to its vast oil reserves. The phrase "war for oil" is a cliche and usually a smear, but it is certainly true that no one has ever fought a war for wind.

In light of all of this, Europe still chose to subjugate itself to an anti-Western authoritarian and, even as Russian opera stars are getting canceled, it hasn't ceased purchases of Russian oil and gas. Some perspective is necessary. While climate change may

indeed prove a serious long-term challenge, it is not reducing parts of European cities to rubble or a threat to use a tactical nuclear weapon. If this horrifying episode hasn't scared the West straight

Driver's License, ID Card expiration dates extended to July 31, 2022; Secretary White encourages the public to conduct business online

SPRINGFIELD - Illinois Secretary of State Jesse White announced that expiration dates for driver's licenses, ID cards and learner's permits are being extended until July 31, 2022. The previous extension was set to end on March 31, 2022. As a result, expired driver's licenses, ID cards and learner's permits will remain valid until July 31, 2022, so customers do not need to rush into Driver Services facilities, especially during inclement weather. This extension does not apply to commercial driver's licenses (CDL) and CDL learner's permits.

White's office has expanded online renewals for expired driver's licenses and ID cards and continues to mail letters to eligible customers. The letter provides driver's license and ID card holders with a unique PIN needed to renew online instead of visiting a facility and waiting in line. Customers may call 217-785-1424 to confirm their eligibility for online renewal or to obtain their PIN.

Customers who must visit a facility include first-time driver's license or ID card applicants, first-time REAL ID applicants and drivers ages 75 and older who are required by state law to visit a facility when renewing their license.

White continues to encourage peo-

ple to conduct other business online at ilsos.gov. In addition to driver's license and ID card renewals for those who qualify, online services include obtaining a duplicate driver's license or ID card, ordering a driver record and purchasing license plate stickers.

White noted his office is also extending the expiration dates of Restricted Driving Permits (RDPs) to July 31, 2022 for those that expired on or after Dec. 1, 2021 through July 30, 2022.

As a reminder, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security has extended the federal REAL ID deadline to May 3, 2023.





Illinois spring trout fishing season opens April 2; Lake Mendota one of the statewide sites open season opens at 5 a.m. April 2. Anyone also can be purchased online. Find the

SPRINGFIELD – The 2022 Illinois spring trout fishing season will open April 2 at 57 ponds, lakes and streams throughout the state. An early opportunity at select trout

sites – the spring catch-and-release fishing season – will open March 19. No trout may be kept during the catchand-release fishing period, but anglers can keep trout after the opening of the regular season beginning April 2. The Illinois Catchable Trout Pro-

gram is funded by those who use the program through the sale of inland trout stamps. The Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) stocks more than 80,000 rainbow trout each year in bodies of water where trout fishing is permitted during the spring season. An additional 80,000 trout will be stocked for the fall trout fishing season, which begins in October.

For the 2022 spring trout season, no trout may be taken from any of the stocked sites from March 14 until the attempting to harvest trout before the legal harvest season opening will be issued citations.

All anglers, including those who intend to release fish caught before April 2, must have a fishing license and an inland trout stamp unless they are younger than 16, blind or disabled, or an Illinois resident on leave from active duty in the Armed Forces. The daily catch limit for each angler is five trout.

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We have two options: We can continue to be stressed-out until we fall apart, or we can learn how to receive the peace Christ gives in every circumstance, rather than letting stress get into us.

The Cure for Stress

For many years, I lived with constant stress. I was sexually abused by my father throughout my childhood. Then when I left home at the age of 18, I married the first man who came along because I was afraid no one else would want me, and that led to five years of misery. He ended up abandoning me.

By the time I was 23 and met Dave Meyer, I was a mess! I was worried, full of fear, insecure and had a poor self-image. So I tried to find value in what I did and became a workaholic.

Over time, I developed physical problems, like frequent headaches and backaches, and had problems in many of my relationships because I was unhappy and hard to get along with. I finally came to the place where I decided that I would not live that way any longer. Whatever it took, I was going to have God's peace and live a peaceful life!

James 1:21 says, "... With a humble spirit receive the word [of God] which is implanted [actually rooted in your heart], which is able to save your souls." Although I



was a Christian during this time of my life, I needed to "get saved" in my soul-my mind, will and emotions. I needed to renew my mind with the Word of God so I could know the Truth and be set free from the root issues of my stress.

Here's how it works: When we study God's Word—reading it, meditating on it, getting it deep down in our hearts-it changes the way we think. This causes us to change the way we talk, which changes our attitudes, and then our behavior changes. At this point, the things around us-our circumstances—can't control us anymore.

Get to the Root of Your Stress

Being set free from the pressure of stress begins with God's Word, but we also have to understand that if things are going to change in our lives, we will have to take responsibility to change them with God's help. So the first thing we need to do is pray and be willing to hear what He has to say about the real root of our problem.

If you're already doing your part, then be deter-

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mined to trust God to fix things. But if you're not walking in wisdom or you're doing things a certain way just because that's the way everybody else is doing it, then follow the direction He is speaking to your heart to make a change.

We must pray and obey! This means we make a commitment not to live based on the culture around us but by the leading of the Holy Spirit, who lives in us as born-again believers in Christ. Our mind-set should be: With God's help, I'm ready to make a change. Then as we do what He shows us to do (or what He shows us not to do), we'll be able to live in peace.

Pursue the peace Jesus is offering you today. It's not the kind the world gives—the kind you have as long as your circumstances are the way you want them to be. The peace Jesus gives makes you calm and undisturbed on the inside, in your soul, no matter what's going on around you.

Study other scriptures about peace, like Philippians 4:6-7, Colossians 3:15 and 1 Peter 3:11. Put your trust in God

completely and enjoy the life Jesus died to give you. Through Christ, you can learn how to manage the stress of this world, instead of letting stress manage you!

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

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
