Caulkins looks for ban on restricted software

DECATUR — Dan Caulkins, R-Decatur, announced he will file legislation that would make it a felony to purchase any software from a company, either directly or indirectly, that has been placed on the federal government's "entity list," a federal blacklist prohibiting said company from receiving American technologies.

In a statement released week, Caulkins this said any company that has been placed on the government's entity list has clearly crossed the line.

"The latest pertains to the Israeli spyware company NSO Caulkins said. Group," "It determined was their phone-hacking tools have been used by foreign governments maliciously target officials, government activists, journalists, academics and embassy workers around world."

This action follows the U.S. Department of Commerce announcing a new rule that will bar the sale of American hacking software and equipment to any entity overseas known to engage in hacking for malign purposes.

Known as the Wassenaar Rule, it aligns the U.S with 42 allies.

Caulkins said he believed this should also pertain to domestic use of such products and that passing this legislation would help stem the proliferation of digital tools used to spy on Americans.

CLINTON — Every house has a story, says Joey Long. And, with help from area residents, she is working to tell some of those stories.

Long, director of the C.H. Moore Homestead & DeWitt County Museum, began earlier this year collecting photos and information on houses all over DeWitt County. She plans to use the material in a presentation next spring, "Historical Houses of DeWitt County."

"Originally, the deadline was for mid-October," Long said.

Residents have emailed, mailed and dropped off photos and information for use in the exhibit.

"But, I kept getting such good stuff in, so now the deadline in Dec. 31."

"What I'm learning is every house has a story," Long said.


"Everyone who has brought something in about a house that is special to them, they have their reasons why this house is special."

mistakes. One evening, in my kitchen, I was skinning watermelon rinds so I could pickle them. found that a mandoline worked very well. The big problem with a mandoline is that one is not directing the blade as one does with knives. One is directing the food item toward and through the blade. There is no control of the blade. By getting into a hurry and not taking the necessary safety precautions, one can easily slice a large chunk of skin from one's fingers or thumbs. In my case, the wet surface of the watermelon caused my hands to slip into the blade shaving off a chunk of flesh from each thumb. With my wife's help, we applied pressure bandages. 

Ticket to Work (Ticket) is a program that supports career development for SSDI beneficiaries and SSI recipients who want to work and progress toward financial independence. The Ticket program is free and voluntary. Learn more about the Ticket to Work program at www. ssa.gov/work or call the Ticket to Work Help Line at 1-866-968-7842 or 1-866-833-2967 (TTY)

Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. ET.

In addition to the Ticket to Work program, the Plan for Achieving Self-Support (PASS) program also helps people with disabilities return to work. A PASS allows you to set aside resources and other income besides your SSI for a specified period. With a PASS you can pursue a work goal that will reduce or eliminate your need for SSI or SSDI benefits.

How does a PASS help someone return to work?

- We base SSI eligibility and payment amounts on income and resources (items of value that the person owns).
- PASS lets a person with a disability set aside money and items



they own to pay for items or services needed to achieve a specific work goal.

• The objective of the PASS is to help people with disabilities find employment that reduces or eliminates the need for SSI or SSDI benefits.

Social Security gets big benefits bump

The news is in. Our Social Security benefit for 2022 will increase by 5.9 percent, slightly less than the 6.1 percent estimate the government put out this summer. Still, that's much greater than the 1.3 percent increase we saw for 2021 and the 1.6 percent the year before.

The average monthly dollar increase will be \$92, making the average benefit \$1,657 per month for a single person. For a couple, a \$154 increase would come to \$2,753 per month.

The official mail on the cost-of-living adjustment will come out in December.

I've done my calculations for next year, and once again I shake my head. We've been notified already that I'll have a rent increase. Heating fuel is likely to go up 47 percent. We all know what has happened at the grocery store. Medicare Part B is sure to go up, maybe a \$10 per month increase.

There is one worrying note, and we need to think about how it will play out for us individually.

Style of government

This was an open vote on the floor of Congress. What then is the concern? The concern is that the vote was pure party politics, with the above exceptions noted. There was no real debate. Pelosi called the vote when she had the votes to pass bill. Great politics. Lousy government.

Our Constitution is based on the concept of debate. Even the minority is afforded the opportunity to be heard. Not with Speaker Pelosi. The Speaker had decreed and her minions fell in lock step to her wishes. What we are seeing is the precursor to a European style of government. Under the European model of parliamentary government Speaker Pelosi would in effect be the chief executive of our

government.

Our founding fathers developed a system of government with checks and balances. They had just survived a Revolution to rid themselves of a King and did not want a strong central government, save for international relations. They wanted debate with input from all factions. We are rapidly moving to a strong consolidated central government, with involvement limited from the constituency. It is something that should concern us all.

VA ends debt relief

The Department of Veterans Affairs called a cease-fire on collection of overpayments between April 2020 and September 2021 due to the COVID pandemic. Now that debt collection has started up again. The VA will not, however, actually make deductions from our benefits until January 2022. In addition, if you had unpaid medical co-payments before April 2020, they'll start collecting those again.

That must mean the COVID pandemic over, right? We're all doing well, grocery prices haven't soared, gas prices

are still low, rents haven't increased, we all have jobs or at least enough income if a spouse didn't lose a job ... right?

If the VA says you owe money, you'll receive a debt collection letter. In it will be options for debt relief. You might be offered extended repayment plans, compromises, waivers or temporary suspensions in payment. If you get a letter, address the situation immediately. Don't delay. There is a time limit to be considered for debt relief. For benefit debts, call 1-800-827-0648 or go online to ask.va.gov.

track your message all the way from submission to resolution and see all your past messages and responses. You can choose to get a reply back by email, phone or through the U.S. mail. If you have pharmacy co-payment or medical-care debt, call 1-866-400-1238.

and questions. Before make you any agreements about repayment, read and understand the fine print. A compromise means you'll pay less than the full amount, but it's due all at once within 30 days. A waiver means they'll forgive a portion of the debt.
