City officials provide daycare update

'It's definitely something we spend a lot of time on'

ROCHELLE — City officials are still endeavoring to help get a daycare facility back in town after Kishwaukee Family YMCA Child Care Center at 1010 N. 15th St. closed last year, Rochelle City Manager Jeff Fiegenschuh said.

Early in the summer, Rochelle Mayor John Bearrows said track was being laid to open a daycare run by an outside operator at the recently-closed May School with the help of the elementary school district, but Fiegenschuh said last month that that option may be off the table.

Recent talks have involved the city helping to create a 501c3 nonprofit due to high costs of starting a for profit daycare, Fiegenschuh said.

"It's a huge issue for our employers in the community and more importantly for people in our community who have kids," Fiegenschuh said. "And the closure of that daycare center directly impacted some of our

employees, so I know first hand its impact. We're working hard to try to find a solution."

Fiegenschuh said last

week that he believes it is the city's job to help find a way to solve the daycare problem. But he does not want the city running the

daycare.

"And we've been at the forefront," Fiegenschuh said. "It's been a frustrating process because every

time we think we have a solution, there's another roadblock."

RTHS begins weekly testing of unvaccinated staff

District 212 Superintendent Harper: 'It went off without a hitch'

ROCHELLE — At Monday's Rochelle Township High School district board meeting Superintendent Jason Harper said that Monday was the first day of testing unvaccinated staff on-site with guidance from Gov. JB Pritzker's mandate that was made in August. Harper said at last week's elementary district board meeting that between both districts there are 85-90 staff members that are not two weeks out from their second vaccine shot that will require weekly testing. The districts have entered into a program with Sauk Valley Community College that sees staff members take saliva tests on site and receive the results later in the day.

Harper said the districts originally planned on using rapid tests they had on hand for the staff testing, but were told that those were not allowed by health

officials. "There's been a lot of stops and starts in this process collaborating and working with how we're going to implement this mandate," Harper said. "Working with the Ogle County Health Department, trying to follow guidance and legalities and things of that nature. Today it went off without a hitch. No issues there. This is how we'll proceed for the immediate future until we get more clarification on using rapid tests."

During his school reopening report, Harper said he didn't have anything new for the board pertaining to things like masks in schools that have been discussed since July. During the public comment portion, a few community members did speak out against the mask mandate and asked for the school board to push back against it.

Board President Tom Huddleston addressed those that spoke after pub-

lic comment closed. "You're not unheard," Huddleston said. "We hear you. We have to make decisions on behalf

of the whole district. It's a very difficult time and obviously everybody is trying to adapt to the rules which is difficult to do as

well. As a general rule, we pretty much need to follow what the state mandates are. And we're doing that at this time. It doesn't mean

it's going to happen forever and I think we're on the tail end of this."

Park board approves Spring Lake expenditures

Executive director Ohlinger reflects on Grand Celebration at The REC

ROCHELLE — The Flagg-Rochelle Community Park District board unanimously approved two expenditures for Spring Lake Pool at its Monday meeting.

The first expenditure was replacement pumps and a control panel for Spring Lake's lift station, which is the original from 1980. This year, staff had issues with the lift station being able to keep up while trying to backwash. The control panel will be moved outside next to the lift station where it can be seen better. The board accepted a bid from Anderson Plumbing for the work in the amount of \$21,641. The project will be done in the spring.

The board also approved \$17,750 to Nova Painting & Decorating for resurfacing of the water slide. As part of the bid, work will also be done on the rock climbing wall at the pool.

Superintendent of Parks and Facilities Austin Stolte said that the pool's heater will need to be replaced due to a small fire that happened towards the end of the season. The park district is looking at replacing

it with 2-3 smaller heaters so it wouldn't be without a heater completely during future issues.

Stolte also said the park district recently received information on how to properly winterize the new splash pad and will be looking at a water softener and filter to protect the concrete on the splash pad from the effects of iron in the city's water.

Executive Director Jackee Ohlinger said Spring Lake overperformed this year financially and attributed that to the hot summer.

"Overall, we're looking at a \$30,000 loss," Ohlinger said. "We've always known it's not a moneymaker for us, but it is a huge benefit to the community and we budgeted for a \$70,000 loss, which is usually about where we see it. I'm very happy with where we are at that facility."

Ohlinger also said the use of the Spring Lake Marina and park shelters were up from last year by 53 percent, which she attributed to people wanting to gather outdoors due to the pandemic.

Lake Sule

The board voted unanimously to change its rules at Lake Sule to no longer

read that only motors under 10 horsepower are allowed. Now, the ordinance simply reads that it's a no wake zone. The move was made because not many motors under 10 horsepower are made anymore and no wake reduces shoreline wave action. Lake Sule is around 60 acres.

The REC

Ohlinger said the recent Grand Celebration at The REC was a positive experience for the park district and

it plans to do other events like that in the future.

The park district is also working to finalize an agreement with the Comfort Inn hotel for its guests to use the facility. The closure of Hickory Grove next door to the facility left the hotel without a pool on site.

Recreation Supervisor Scott Stevenstalked during his report about the park district taking on the Rochelle Youth Basketball Association this fall and winter. Girls will start in

October and boys will start in January. The league will be renamed The REC Basketball League.

"We want to make it our own and carry the same traditions," Stevens said. "I see it being a very productive thing and people being happy with it. It's a good thing we're able to bring that into The REC this year."

Helms Field

Stolte said the park district is looking at replacing

the roof on the locker rooms and bathroom at Helms Field. He said it's in "dire need" of repair and is leaking. Rochelle Junior Tackle uses those buildings for storage.

Ohlinger said the cost of the project has been quoted in the past at \$50,000 and would likely be higher now. The track at Helms Field is also on the park district's capital projects list.

The next park board meeting will take place on Monday, Oct. 18.



Howard E. Rand





RYBA passes the torch

FOR many years Rochelle has been home to a variety of positive groups and programs that support the development of our children. In any place you look there are people willing to share their passion, effort and time in order to create a positive experience for the youth of the community.

One shining example of this type of selfless giving has been Rochelle Youth Basketball Association (RYBA). If you have had a child grow up in the Rochelle community, the chances are that you have had some experience with this program during your time here.

RYBA has been a staple of the youth sports community since it was established by Gene Kessen in 1978. Gene dedicated well over 30 years of coaching and aimed to create a positive environment for youth to refine the skills that they would utilize as they grew into adults.

If you have had any experience with RYBA in last 25 years, it is also likely that you have met Henry Bunger along the way. Henry has been involved with RYBA since 1995 and running the operations since 1998. It would not be uncommon to find Henry outside of Central School at 5 a.m. after a snowfall the night before so that the children could enjoy another week of learning to play the game of basketball.

"The RYBA program is about getting kids playing the game at an early age," Bunger said.

RYBA has succeeded in its tenure to not only produce improvement in physical skill sets but also to serve as the bedrock for youth to grow socially amongst their peers and coaches.

There have traditionally been two age groups of players that move through RYBA's system. The third and fourth grade league is focused on establishing a love for the sport and an understanding of the fundamentals. The fifth and sixth grade league "was still

more of the competitive side as well", Bunger said.

Beginning this year with the Rochelle Park District, RYBA will take on a new name. REC Basketball will continue this well-established tradition with the same passion and effort that RYBA's past leaders have invested into this league to make it what it has become.

With the addition of The REC to the Rochelle community, Rochelle Park District will be able to provide a centralized location for practices and games that take place under the supervision of dedicated coaches and administrators.

Players will have one team practice a week as well as one combined practice that includes all players and coaches in their respective age group. The focus of combined practices will be to provide players with a well-rounded experience with a variety of coaches and teaching methods. During individual practices, youth will become acquainted with team play and gain a more personal bond with their specific teammates and coach.

League administrators work directly with the coaching staff of Rochelle Middle School and Rochelle Township High School in order to produce a foundation that allows our young athletes to transition seamlessly to the next level.

Girls' REC Basketball League will begin in a few short weeks with the first practice being on Oct. 14 and the first game on Oct. 23. The girls' league will continue on until the middle of December with games every Saturday morning. The Boys' REC Basketball League will begin shortly after the first of the year and continue through early March.

Who is 'James Doe'?

SO who is "James Doe?"

That's the pseudonym assigned to a man who accused former U.S. Speaker of the House Dennis Hastert of sexual assault. The man alleges that when he was in school decades ago, Hastert, then a wrestling coach, molested him.

More than 30 years later, in 2010, when Hastert was raking in the dough as a lobbyist, Doe threatened to publicly expose the abuse he says he suffered unless Hastert paid him hush money.

The two men reached a verbal agreement that the former politician would dish out \$3.5 million in exchange for Doe's silence.

I can empathize with Doe's pain. When I was 12, a man sexually assaulted me on my family's farm. More than 40 years later, I still bear psychological scars. And I have some familiarity with the deep-seated rage Doe must feel.

I'm glad James Doe was financially compensated for some of the pain Hastert inflicted on him.

But is shaking someone down for hush money ever an honorable action?

He agreed to stay quiet about a man who was once second in line to the presidency. The paid silence is troubling. Hast-

ert made cash payments to Doe amounting to \$1.7 million.

Each cash withdrawal was beneath the \$10,000 threshold that banks are required to report to the federal government. Nonetheless, the feds found out, learned it was hush money and discovered at least three other victims of Hastert's besides Doe.

The statute of limitations for the sex crimes had long since passed. But prosecutors were able to charge the once powerful politician with a financial crime related to how he structured the bank withdrawals.

Hastert admitted to "mistreating" Doe and three others and pleaded guilty to the financial wrongdoing. A federal judge sentenced him to 15 months in prison.

But now Doe is suing Hastert for \$1.8 million - the outstanding balance in hush money that the Illinois Republican agreed to pay the man in 2010. The case was supposed to go to trial September 20. But a tentative, confidential settlement has been reached.

Kendall County Chief Judge Robert Pilmer ruled if the case went to trial,

Doe would be stripped of his pseudonym and publicly identified. This may have created an incentive for reaching a settlement ahead of time.

That settlement came as a surprise. I was planning to travel to Yorkville to watch the beginning of the trial and learn the identity of the accuser.

I wanted to get a sense for his motivations and, to be honest, who he is as a human being. Is he a good person or a bad one?

"I don't think we should think of him as either a good guy or a bad guy," Carrie Ward, CEO of the Illinois Coalition Against Sexual Assault, said. "He's a sexual assault survivor trying to come to terms the best way he knows how."

Ward added it is often harder for male victims to come forward because society is less likely to believe them.

"People think a man should have been able to fight someone off and that they really can't be victimized. But, of course, that isn't true," she said.

But one of Hastert's victims, Scott Cross, did come forward three years ago and spoke publicly about being victimized by his wrestling coach. He's

the brother of former Illinois House GOP Leader Tom Cross.

Tom Cross, unaware of his brother's experience with Hastert, became a protégé of the future U.S. Speaker of the House.

Scott Cross has successfully lobbied the Illinois General Assembly to eliminate the statute of limitations for sexual abuse cases.

NBC News at the time reported him saying that he's tormented that he didn't speak out against Hastert earlier. "The guilt kills me, that I could have perhaps saved other victims," he said.

But his work to get the law changed has served as some consolation, he said.

"I just hope this gives an outlet for other victims to feel like they should come forward no matter how long they have waited," he said at the time. "I just felt it was the right thing to do."

Cross is not receiving money from his former coach while Doe is. That's hardly fair.

Then again, Cross used his experience to change the law and protect others. Perhaps, his compensation is the satisfaction of knowing he did the right thing.

Ever hear of a spotted lantern fly? Natives to Asia, they have appeared in the United States, as far west as Indiana.

They are pretty, but harmful to oaks and other native trees. Several agencies are recommending killing the bugs on sight to prevent their spread.







“When I found out that all of them were in small towns, I was kind of excited about that,” Amadeus said. “I was excited to go to a small town. When I was having breakfast at Sunrise, I knew I was in a small town when a group of older guys got up and said, ‘See you tomorrow.’ I like that small town feel.”

Amadeus believes The Kitchen Table is “a really great idea.” He said it shows when somebody cares enough to give back to their community. When cooks want to do an internship with Chef Amadeus, the first thing he tells them is that they have to do volunteer work.

He said he admired the way The Kitchen Table prepares its food and said

it cooks for people like they’re a part of a family.

“I think every community needs a place like this,” Amadeus said. “This place, they’re feeding the community. Tonight is taco night. Most people take Taco Tuesday for granted. Taco Tuesday here means something totally different. Here, it means, ‘I get to eat something.’ They’re eating

because they need to.”

Being a professional chef has taken the Jacksonville, Florida native to Haiti, The Bahamas and Puerto Rico as a guest chef. He’s worked on cruises. He loves his “culinary road trips” in the states to cities in the south and Florida.

“I get to collaborate with other chefs,” Amadeus said. “My thing is,

I like to travel, cook and play golf. If I can get the trifecta, I’m good. How many people can say they played golf in Haiti?”

At Friday’s fundraiser, Chef Amadeus served cowboy pork chops with his own line of spices along with roasted veggies, a baked potato and a dinner roll.

“Sometimes it’s not the money, it’s the journey,”

Amadeus said. “I tell cooks I’d rather build passion cooks than paycheck cooks. Paycheck cooks come in and do just enough not to get fired. A passion cook will show up early and come to work all the time because they don’t know what they’re going to miss.”



Homecoming

RTHS Principal Chris Lewis said that the homecoming dance will be held outside this year to allow students to go without masks. He said “99 percent” of schools around the area are doing the same to allow students to have as normal a night as possible.

“You can enjoy an experience that’s somewhat normal,” Lewis said. “It’s a really cool setup. The student council has put a lot of time into this. We rented a tent in case it rains. It will be in that grass area between the two parking lots. I think the kids are excited. The theme is ‘Under the Stars.’ This is what everybody in the area is doing to accommodate

homecoming.

The homecoming pep rally will also be held outdoors on the football field rather than inside due to COVID-19.

Job fair

Harper gave a report to the board on the job fair held last week in conjunction with the City of Rochelle, Kishwaukee College and local businesses at RTHS. Usually the school puts on its own job fair in the spring.

“I think it was a really solid event considering some of the mitigation strategies and some of the impacting variables and factors happening in our community and everywhere,” Harper said. “I think it timed up well for businesses to have the opportunity to reach the public. It was well publicized. I don’t know what will come of this event in the spring. We may do it

again then on a smaller or larger scale.”

Employment

The board unanimously approved the hiring of nine employees including Vanessa Guzman as a health office aide COVID-19 testing lead.

Also hired were Marisol Belmonte (paraprofessional/office assistant as needed), Mark Bratko (special events custodian), Reed Dalen (custodian/maintenance), Brandon Kantz (FLEX program part-time), Dennis Mensching (bus driver), Dale Lawhorn (volunteer marching band), Phil Orlikowski (volunteer marching band) and Jillian Thompson (volunteer marching band color guard).

Buses

The board unanimously approved an item that will allow the district to let bids

to lease nine school buses, which include six 77-passenger buses, one 59+2 wheelchair bus, one 38+2 midsize wheelchair bus and one 18+1 mini bus. It also will let bids to lease five activity Hub buses. Bid recommendations will be brought before the board for review and approval.

“Every three years we have a large lease and purchasing overhaul,” Harper said. “That’s the time we’re at right now. Right now our hope is to get these bids out early. Typically we go out to bid in December, January or February. We’ve been told by vendors to get on this earlier in the cycle so we don’t get behind any supply chain issues.”

Sub rates

The board unanimously approved raising the daily pay rate for substitute teachers from \$85 to \$105.

The move puts the district inline with the approaching \$15 per hour minimum wage requirement and other districts in the area.

“We’re trying to get more competitive, not

only with other starting wages in our community, but also with what other school districts are paying,” Harper said. “We feel like it puts us in the right competitive space.”

“It wasn’t our daycare center. And as far as I know, the city has never given money to the daycare center. It was always self-sufficient through grants and community donations. Maybe the city helped establish it way back in the day, but we weren’t subsidizing it on an annual basis.”

There are a lot of costs involved with getting a building and getting a daycare center up and running, Fiegenschuh said. After looking at the books from some daycare centers, he said they don’t often make a lot of money and that daycares are more services than profit centers.

Getting a daycare center back in town is something that city staff “spends a lot of time on,” Fiegenschuh said.

“When that place closed, Mayor Bearrows had it right on his radar and he

said we have to find a way to get it back open,” Fiegenschuh said. “And I can’t speak for the entire council, but I think it would say the same thing, we need that in our community. We just don’t want to run it.”

Fiegenschuh said right now there is “a ton of” money available through federal COVID-19 funds available to help daycares which could create “even more opportunity.”

“But again, we have to find somebody to run the thing,” Fiegenschuh said. “That’s been difficult. That’s why you want to make sure you’re very diligent and you do it the right way and you don’t set something up that’s destined to fail. Because that doesn’t serve anybody.”

The need for the daycare reaches further than Rochelle residents and those that live out of town and work here would use it, Fiegenschuh said. Based on what he’s seen, he believes

a daycare would fill up “pretty quickly.”

The city manager’s biggest concern with a future daycare facility in town is the possibility of another state budget

impasse that could tie up funds that reimburse places like daycare centers that are providing social services. That happened from 2015-2017.

The continued efforts to

get a facility back in town may require a fundraising effort, Fiegenschuh said.

“There are a lot of people who want it and need it,” Fiegenschuh said. “And if we needed to do a fund-

raiser, I would hope some of those people would be right there helping us go out and raise funds for it. Because it’s going to be a community effort to get this thing done.”



Hubs moving forward

Kissack evaluates progress as varsity team reaches halfway point of season

ROCHELLE — Friday evening will look a lot different for the Rochelle Hub varsity football team. With news coming down Thursday afternoon that Harvard would have to forfeit its Interstate 8/Kishwaukee River Conference Blue Division matchup with the Hubs due to a COVID-19 situation, Rochelle will receive a forfeit victory rather than take the field against the Hornets. The disappointing news arrived as the Hubs effectively reached the halfway point of the 2021 season. Now 3-2 overall and 2-1 in the conference after the forfeit from Harvard, head coach Kyle Kissack and the Hubs will look to capitalize on their remaining time this week in order to prepare for a home matchup next Friday against Marengo, who also has three wins so far.

"It's a bad deal for Rochelle and it's a bad deal for Harvard," Kissack said. "It's unfortunate but it's the environment that we're living in right now. These instances can

come up out of nowhere and I think this will be a good learning experience for our kids in that we have to ensure we're taking care of our business, staying healthy and being thoughtful of the situations we're putting ourselves in. We have to continue to protect ourselves, especially because we're transitioning into Homecoming Week and there will be a lot of activities happening in town."

Rochelle arrives at the halfway mark of the season boasting a scoring average of 32.3 points per game on 315 total yards per game. The Hubs are outpacing their opponents 84-59 in first downs earned while totaling only five punts and four turnovers on offense. Junior Garrett Gensler has shined for the Hubs offensively, rushing for 413 yards and seven touchdowns while averaging 7.4 yards per carry. Senior Josh Lloyd has thrown for 120 yards and two touchdowns.

Lady Hubs take marathon match over L-P

Rochelle outlasts Cavaliers in three sets for 22-25, 30-28, 25-15 victory

ROCHELLE — The Rochelle Lady Hub varsity volleyball team overcame a sluggish start against LaSalle-Peru on Tuesday, fighting back from a first-set deficit and outlasting the Cavaliers in a marathon second set before finishing the third set strong to score a 22-25, 30-28, 25-15 win. Junior Isela Vasquez totaled a season-high 26 assists for the Lady Hubs, who improved to 9-9.

Despite entering with a 3-10 record, LaSalle-Peru controlled the match early in the first set, taking advantage of several serve-receive errors from Rochelle to take a 9-2 lead. The Lady Hubs shifted some players around, with junior middle hitter Payton Hale moving to the back row to fortify the defense. Rochelle fought within two points of L-P, with senior Sylvia Hasz providing power on the serve and junior Addie Friestad scoring multiple kills on the outside.

"We definitely struggled last week and we started slow during the first set," Hasz said. "But we proved that we wanted to win and

we didn't stop fighting. I thought we became much stronger mentally as the match went on. Serve receives are more of a mental game and I thought we were much more focused and we kept more balls up as the match went on."

After holding off the Lady Hubs in the first set, LaSalle-Peru surged ahead in the second set, capitalizing on multiple service errors from Rochelle to build up a 15-10 advantage. Looking to avoid a fifth consecutive loss, the Lady Hubs leaned on their two strongest hitters in Hasz and Friestad, who delivered a series of kills to bring Rochelle within one point and eventually tie the set after a Cavalier timeout. Hasz and Friestad combined for 19 kills in the victory.

"We definitely started passing the ball better," Hasz said. "Our passes were all over the place when the match started and we weren't very consistent, but I thought our passing improved and we were able to run our offense more effectively as the match went on."

Lady Hubs finish fourth, Hubs take fifth

BYRON — Several runners on the Rochelle Hub and Lady Hub cross country teams took home medals from the Byron Invitational on Wednesday. Two Lady Hub athletes

and five Hub athletes earned medals at the meet.

The Lady Hubs finished fourth out of seven schools with 116 points. Senior Sara Johnson and junior Yuelma Ortiz recorded top-10 medalist performances, with John-

son clocking in at 19:59 for sixth place overall and Ortiz taking eighth place with a time of 20:29.

The Hubs placed fifth out of seven schools with 112 points behind junior David Wanner (17:48) and sophomore Parker Lenkaitis (18:15), who

“We’ve met with our seniors and talked about the peaks and valleys of our season thus far,” Kissack said. “We’ve talked about developing more consistency. I think we’ve played really well for stretches, but there are other times where we haven’t played as well as we’re capable of... We have a great rotation of backs right now and I think the ball can go to any of those four kids back there. That’s been a very bright spot for us and we’ve been able to move the ball effectively, which has allowed us to utilize some different formations and try new things.”

Juniors Trey Taft and Landon DeLille have combined for 452 rushing yards and six touchdowns, with Taft averaging 6.7 yards per carry and DeLille recording 6 yards per carry. Junior Cody Stover-Cullum has 134 rushing yards, three touchdowns and a 5.2 yards-per-carry average. Senior Tanner Lager has been Rochelle’s top wide receiver, catching seven

passes for 65 yards.

Defensively, Rochelle has allowed an average of 23.8 points and 244 total yards per game. Junior Jaden Cook has emerged as a key playmaker on the defensive line, leading the Hubs with two sacks. Gensler and Taft are Rochelle’s leading tacklers with 18 and 17 tackles, respectively. The Hubs will hit the road after hosting Marengo, taking on Kaneland and Plano on Oct. 8 and Oct. 15 before closing out the season with Senior Night against Sandwich on Oct. 22.

“I think we’ve had some tough matchups and we’re young at some key positions,” Kissack said. “Those kids will get better every week. Our inside six kids have played really well up to this point and those kids get a lot of work during the week against our offense and our scout team. We need to get better on the back end because we’re going to see some teams over the next few weeks that like to throw the ball around. We have some growing to do for sure.”
