
Something for everyone at 2021 Amboy Depot Days



Amboy Depot Museum remains historical treasure

AMBOY - The Amboy Depot Museum is located in a former depot and division headquarters of the Illinois Central Railroad located in downtown Amboy. The structure is an architecturally unique two-story building built of brick and cut Joliet limestone and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

The Depot was completely restored over many years (1976 – 2003) both inside and out and includes the original brick tarmac surrounding the depot and the grounds of the former rail-yard, which is now preserved as the Clint Conway city park. At that time, reconstruction was done on the distinctive chimney caps on the building's eight chimneys, fully restoring the building to its original exterior configuration. Within the museum are artifacts of both the history of Amboy, Lee County and the Illinois Central Railroad.

Unfortunately, over the last 10 years, this time treasured building has weathered some harsh winters and rains which has caused the necessary need of major reconstruction/preservation of the parapet (white limestone edge at top) and much needed tuck pointing of the bricks. The Depot Museum recently partnered with Starved Rock Country Community Foundation, who is a 501(c)3 organization, which will allow donors to make tax-deductible contributions.

The Depot Museum with the support of the City of Amboy is in the process of launching a Restoration Project Fund with donations being handled by SRCCF. More information will soon be available.



The museum complex also includes a freight house with additional artifacts, a fully restored one-room country schoolhouse, a retired steam engine and a caboose. Everyone is welcome to stop in and enjoy some local history at one of the best small-town depot museums to be found anywhere.

The Amboy Depot Museum and gift shop will be open to the public throughout Depot Days with extended hours. The Museum will be raffling a beautiful 79"X 79" handmade quilt by native, Becky Welty, on Sunday of Depot Days, with all proceeds going to the Renovation/Preservation Project.

Tickets are available now at Amboy City Hall, Amboy

Depot Museum and Amboy Thrift Store. The Depot Museum's regular hours are from 1-4 p.m., Sunday, and from 10 a.m. -4 p.m., Friday and Saturday. They are closed on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. The Depot closes for the season from Nov. 1 through March 31. However, they are encouraging visitors to connect them if they want a private tour during any closed times, even during the winter. Send a message using Facebook or their e-mail.





Three decades ago, Hank Gerdes a well respected resident, business owner and future Mayor of Amboy drove thru town on Depot Days weekend.

"The meager affair pretty much consisted of a few booths and three ponies going around in a circle giving children rides," Gerdes recalled. "I knew that we needed to do a better job for our town and the resi-

So Gerdes gathered a group of his friends, all automobile enthusiasts, and organized the first car show and 50/50 raffle.

"We had a goal of five years which we thought would be quite a feat," said Gerdes. "The two main things that have helped us stick around for 30 years is that we are very well organized and we have dedicated people who continually show up and do their job. It fits like a puzzle and it's always been that way."

The show has evolved into the largest, most successful, and best yearly celebration in a six county region. Over the years besides getting the chance to marvel at the impressive collection of cars, trucks, and motorcycles on the Sunday of Depot Days weekend, the fest has featured, free of charge, musical groups, television entertainers such as Dennis Gage, from 'My Classic Car, stars such as Butch Patrick, Eddie from the TV show The Munsters, and a 'Barney Fife' impersonator directing traffic and barking out orders.



"He would stop people on the street, write them tickets and just have everyone cracking up," said Gerdes.

"The car show is one of the highlights of my years performing as the 'Mayberry Deputy'," said David Browning. "It was so much fun to direct all those vehicles out after the show. Leaving took a long time."

There were 145 entries the first year (600 expected this year) which was unheard of at the time, and the 50/50 raffle, the brainchild of member Jeff Parker, guaranteed a \$1,500 purse, with \$750 going to one lucky winner.

"We knew back then that it wouldn't work unless we raffled off a big prize that no one had ever heard of before," explained Gerdes. "We were a little nervous knowing that we would have to make up the difference out of our pockets if we didn't raise the money but we made it," laughed Gerdes.

There has been no nervousness or anxiety since then as the pot has grown consistently every year, but it wasn't always easy.

"I remember myself and a friend walking up and down Main Street almost begging people to buy tickets to help us raise funds to renovate the Depot Museum which was initially the main objective of the committee" said Jeff Gerdes whose has been in charge of the 50/50 raffle since 1994.

Fast forward a few years and the split was over \$46,000, then \$74,000 in 2014, and total sales are expected to exceed \$300,000 this year.

"People start asking us three months in advance now when we will be selling tickets," added Jeff Gerdes. "It's just gone crazy."

The Depot Museum is just one of the many recipients of the charitable donations bestowed to the city.

"The history of Amboy sits in our Museum," said Linda Disney, Museum Chairman. "We are so grateful to the Car Show Committee for all of their yearly support. Without it, we couldn't sustain the building."

The recipe for success for the last 30 years has been that most of the committee members are still involved.

"We all have worked for a common goal and that is to raise money for the Museum, Library, Fire Department, food pantry, schools and Teen Turf," said Garth Dallam, whose been the car show committee chairman for the last 18 years. "We have no egos, everyone knows their role, we enjoy doing it, and it's a good feeling and something that we are proud of."

So much of the funds, well into the hundreds of thousands raised and donated have also benefited the citizens of Amboy by keeping taxes down and providing services that would otherwise be too costly to maintain.

This year, the Car Committee is being honored by the Amboy Lion's Club and has been named honorary Parade Marshals for their 30 years of selfless hard work, dedication and charitable contributions.

The members of the original car show committee include: Hank and Cindy Gerdes, Bill Gerdes, Jim Anderson, Donnie Pollard, Jim Ehman, Rick and Kathy Ketchum, Jeff Gerdes, Don Noble and Danny Ketchum.

"The committee has brought so much for so many and I feel in my heart that Depot Days wouldn't be where it is today without the efforts of this special group of volunteers," said Kathy Ketchum an original member who along with her late husband Rick co-chaired for 11 years. "To be recognized by our peers and friends makes it all worth it."

I asked Hank Gerdes if he will get the chance to savor the moment of being honored and acknowledging the crowd from the float.

"Sure, for a brief moment anyways," he said. "I will be thinking about the signs that need to go up on the highway and I'll probably jump off the float before we reach the end. It's a labor of love after all of these years for sure."

Annual Depot Dash reveals new name

AMBOY — The Depot Day Dash has changed its name. It is now known as the Sylvan Shuffle 5K Run/Walk in honor of a founding member and longtime president of the Amboy Education Foundation, Sylvan Leffelman.

Sylvan helped the AEF grow from an entity with just a few thousand dollars in private donations to a Non-profit agency that has allocated hundreds of thousands of dollars to the Amboy School District. Sylvan and his wife Virginia passed away this past year. This is just a small gesture to acknowledge a person/family that had given selflessly to this community for many years

This year's event will take place on Saturday, Aug. 28. Online registration can be accessed through the Amboy High School website or at RunSignup.com.

This is a 5K Run/Walk that starts on the

track at Amboy High School. It serpentines past the Elementary School, Junior High School through the Sports Park and concludes in front of the historic train depot. This is a USATF Certified Course. The course itself is relatively flat and allows for fast race times.

The Story Behind the Headline

The 50/50 drawing is the most exciting part of the Amboy Depot Days for many people. As part of the Depot Days celebration the car show started having a 50/50 drawing. In the early days, the ticket holder took home 50 percent of the drawing and the Amboy Depot was the recipient of the other cash. The Amboy Depot Museum is still a recipient of a cash donation, but the car show committee has had the opportunity to donate to many other community interests as well.

The drawing grew over the years and the recipient list has grown as well. Over the years, the lucky ticket holders have realized winnings of anywhere from \$8,400 in 2001 to \$149.333 in 2015. The 50/50 drawing grew at a rapid rate over the past few years. The winner in 2019 took home \$105,425.

This year, there will be 10 second place winners who will receive \$3,000 cash each.

But the real winners are the local organizations that benefit from a piece of the pot. Some of the previous recipients were Amboy, Sublette and Ashton fire departments, Amboy Depot Museum, local food pantries, Lee County Fair Association, Ashton Lions Club, Lee County Shop with a Cop, Buddy Bags, Lee County Ag in the Classroom, Dixon PADS Shelter, Amboy's Central School Library, Pankhurst Memorial Library, Amboy FFA Chapter, Amboy Lions Club, BWB & the A-Team, Lee County Veterans Assistance Committee, Lee County Emergency Management Agency, City of Amboy, Amboy American Legion, Lee County Historical Society, Franklin Grove Fundraisers, Teen Turf, Special Olympics, and Sublette

Each year organizations are able to submit a request for a donation from the committee to assist with their needs. The letter needs to be clear on what the funds are being sought for and the amount they are requesting.


