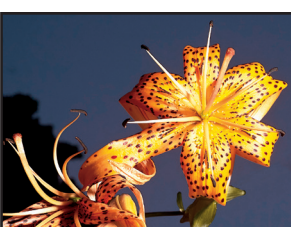

Harper recommends school boards comply with governor's mask mandate

Rochelle schools previously planned mask optional approach

ROCHELLE — Jason Harper, superintendent of the Rochelle Elementary and Rochelle Township High School districts, said Friday that he will recommend that the school boards comply with Gov. JB Pritzker's Aug. 4 universal mask mandate for K-12 schools for the upcoming school year.

The districts previously planned a mask optional approach to begin this fall. Harper said Pritzker's mask mandate eliminated the authority of school boards to adopt mask op-

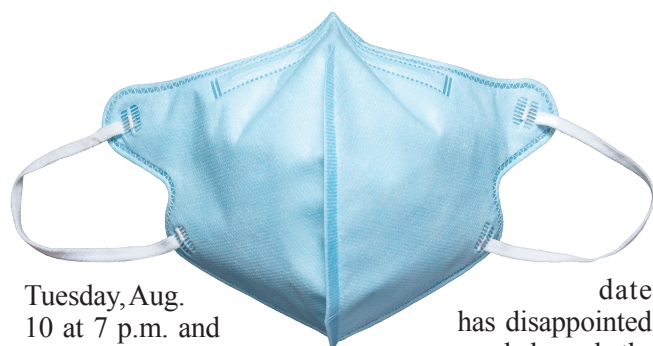
tional plans.

"At this point, the Rochelle Schools remain focused on creating the best conditions for every child to learn and teachers to teach as we return from the pandemic," Harper said in an email. "Using last year as a guide, we will have strategies in place to help our students and staff work through the school day while in a face covering."

Harper said beyond the health concerns inherent to educating students during the pandemic, a choice to not adhere to the governor's masking mandate would put the district at "significant risk."

"Specifically, the district would experience risks associated with increased liability, loss of insurance coverage, loss of recognition as a public school and loss of school funding," Harper said. "Based on all of this, I cannot recommend our schools ignore this mandate."

Both of last month's school board meetings saw parents and community members fill meeting rooms and voice their opinions against the idea of requiring masks in schools. The Rochelle Elementary School District Board of Education will meet on



Tuesday, Aug. 10 at 7 p.m. and the Rochelle Township High School Board of Education will meet on Monday, Aug. 16 at 5:30 p.m.

"I understand that the issue of masking has been an emotional issue since the start of the pandemic," Harper said. "The news of the governor's mask man-

date has disappointed some and pleased others. We never know what is to come as the pandemic changes, so going forward we continue to adjust to changing conditions and mandates as quickly as possible. We appreciate our community's ongoing support in getting our students back into our classrooms."

Home market shortage

'It's just been insane this year. It really has'

ROCHELLE — RE/MAX Associate Jennie McLaughlin recently put a duplex home on the market. It sold four hours later.

A shortage of homes locally and nationally has had local realtors working around the clock in recent months. Rochelle homes are selling in days instead of months for at or just below asking price.

Local realtors like McLaughlin say there are multiple reasons for the shift in the market. Interest rates are low. New homes are being built less often due to increased building material prices brought on by COVID-19. That same pandemic has homeowners looking for a change of scenery after spending so much time at home.

"Everybody was at home thinking about what they wanted to do and thought, 'Maybe I need a bigger house,'" McLaughlin said. "The main difference is the lack of inventory. It's really hard. Sometimes whenever you go to show a house there ends up being sometimes six offers. The other day I had seven offers. You have to make your highest and best offer. Otherwise, you don't have a chance."

Weichert Realtors Broker Cathie Dame has sold four homes this year



on the same day as they were put on the market. She used to tell clients to lower their price if their house went two months without an offer. Now she gives the same advice after 10 days without an offer.

Dame has had her real estate license for 35 years. She's online at least once every hour checking to see if an available home has come up. She's called past clients to see if they want to sell. And most don't want to, because they'd have to find something else of their own for the new higher prices.

"Buyers are just anxious to find a house," Dame said. "I probably have five buyers right now and we can't find a thing. There's just nothing out there that they want that fits their needs. It's just been insane this year. It really has."

John Bearrows of Bearrows Real Estate & Auction Co. said the biggest comment he hears from prospective buyers is the lack of available

homes. When he does find a house to sell, he finds some discouraged buyers that have been knocked out of home deals several times.

He advises people who want to buy to "hang in there" and stick with someone they can trust and hope they can find them a house.

Bearrows said the market shift has been seen for the past several months. Things like homes and cars that are purchased with disposable income are all in a shortage right now due to "everyone" coming out of the pandemic looking to buy after an abnormal year.

"I think we've seen a peak in this or we're at a peak," Bearrows said. "I think we could see another 3-4 months of active market. Should the interest rates change, that could affect it. 3-5 percent now is really tolerable. I paid nine percent for my first house. We haven't seen bad rates for a while."

Creston sewer rates increase

Water meter equipment
expenditure approved

ROCHELLE — Sewer rates have increased in Creston and will for the next five years after a recent decision by the Rochelle City Council to fund recent and future improvements to its water reclamation plant that amount \$14 million.

Creston and Hillcrest both utilize Rochelle's water treatment plant and are under contract with Rochelle Municipal Utilities and are bound to pay recent rate increases that also impact Rochelle residents.

HOMES: Pandemic doesn't keep market down

McLaughlin said she was worried when the pandemic started that there wouldn't be demand for homes. She thought the market would be in trouble, but was pleasantly surprised when she found the demand was still there.

She believes sellers are "happy and smiling" because their prices are up. Buyers feel hurried by the competitive market.

"You just have to make sure everyone is ready," McLaughlin said. "If you get a good

seller, their house has to be ready. The buyer wants to get the best for their money when they know they're going to be paying higher. I've had somebody bid \$10,000 over."

Despite the upped workload, Dame called the year "fun" and said she hopes the trend continues. She believes prices may stay where they are, but the speed of sales may slow down.

Dame believes Rochelle's market lags behind larger communities in other areas and can be predicted by what happens elsewhere.

"Right now, you just don't know," Dame said. "Everything is different since COVID-19 hit. We've got a new president and new administration, there's a lot of different factors playing out. But you always look at other places before Rochelle. Rochelle, even in 2008 when everything crashed, it didn't hit us until later. Watch what's going on everywhere else. I've looked, and they're still crazy busy."

Bearrows, who also serves as Rochelle's Mayor, said the city needs more homes built

to combat the home shortage and improve its economy.

He said the city is working with groups looking to build affordable homes in the \$170,000-200,000 range when lumber prices come down. He believes the Rochelle area has "plenty" of more expensive homes.

"We need some working class homes that somebody can buy brand new for those prices," Bearrows said. "I think that's doable. But we have to get the lumber prices back in line. I'd like to see another development project in Rochelle. We need homes. We don't have any duplexes to speak of. I want an area with a whole street of them."

Despite the upped workload, Cathie Dame called the year "fun" and said she hopes the trend continues. She believes prices may stay where they are, but the speed of sales may slow down.



McLaughlin voiced the importance of buyers and sellers being prepared if they plan to get into the market.

"Sellers just have to be ready to move," McLaughlin said. "I think if they have everything in order and ready to go,

they should expect to find a new place to live because their house is going to sell. Just have your house prepared. The buyer, you have to be ready with your bank and everything you want."

Dame believes now is the time to buy or sell a home, despite there not being much available out there. Her advice to keep watching the market online or find an agent to do it for you. Buyers should contact their lender and be prepared before approaching the purchase of a home.


Like McLaughlin, Dame thought the real estate market was going to slow down when COVID-19 hit.

"And it did the total opposite. I knew there was COVID-19, but my business didn't know there was COVID-19."

"Every time I think it's starting to slow down, it picks right back up again."

Rural Dementia Caregiver Project hosting free caregiver workshop

SAN FRANCISCO, Calif. — Do you take care of someone with memory loss and live in a rural area? Have recent months left you stressed and isolated?

The University of California, San Francisco is offering a free online workshop to help rural caregivers. The project is funded by the National Institutes of Health.

The workshop includes training on how to reduce stress, manage the difficult behaviors of your friend or family member with memory loss and plan for the future. You will also get support from other caregivers and trained staff.

Because it is online, the workshop is accessible to caregivers whenever they want it, day or night, accessed on computer, tablet or smartphone.

Caregivers are eligible if they live in a rural area, care for someone with memory loss, have internet access and provide care for at least 10 hours per week. Those who participate will be asked to complete four surveys on their caregiving experiences and will receive up to \$80 in cash.

CRESTON: Expenditure approved for village water meter equipment

RMU Utilities Superintendent Adam Lanning attended Tuesday's Creston Village Board meeting to explain the increases. He said after the work done in the next couple of years to the sewer plant, it should be in "very good" shape for the next 20-30 years. Creston's last sewer rate increase was five years ago.

"We feel it's prudent for everybody to pay their fair share in our infrastructure and not put that burden on future generations," Lanning said. "The cost impact to Creston for 2022 will be a 5.5 percent increase, 2023 a 5.3 percent increase, 2024 five percent and 2025 2.2 percent. The next few years we're looking at some pretty hefty investments. After that, we anticipate a steady decline and expect just to see simple cost of living increases."

Lanning said the rate increases "happened quickly" and took effect Aug. 1. RMU and the city recently did a rate study and found the new rates had to be implemented by then or else they'd have to

wait a year. The rate study was done thoroughly, Lanning said.

Creston is only billed by RMU for improvements to the sewer plant it uses. It does not pay for things like sewer lining within Rochelle.

"It's cheaper than having our own plant," Creston Village Trustee Curt Ward said.

Creston Village President Tom Byro said Creston is billed by RMU as one entity and then divides that cost up among residents. Byro said the village plans to do some adjusting on its sewer bills after the increases by Rochelle and RMU.

Water meter equipment

The village board approved a \$9,795 expenditure for water meter reading equipment by a vote of 4-0. Trustees Wayne Williams, Mark Hibshman and Steve Katzman were absent from the meeting.

The equipment includes a new handheld device to read water meters and an annual \$1,950 a year service contract between the village and the company

that provides the handheld and a radio frequency.

Booster Days

The board unanimously approved a \$2,500 donation to the Creston Booster Club for its fireworks celebration at Creston Booster Days, which is planned to take place Aug. 27-29.

Liquor license

The board briefly discussed and tabled the idea of allowing a liquor license for Headon's Fine Meats. Hibshman, who owns Headon's, was absent from the meeting and Village Attorney Dave Tess said he's in need of more information about what Hibshman is looking for.

ARPA

Byro said the village is eligible for \$87,955,90 in American Rescue Plan Act funds, which is a COVID-19 relief program.

"I think it's a good deal and a no brainer," Byro said. "We need to find out what those monies can be used for. Fire hydrants, for example, we need a few. We'll see what happens. I'm all for going ahead with it."

Starting Aug. 4, the gallery will be transformed

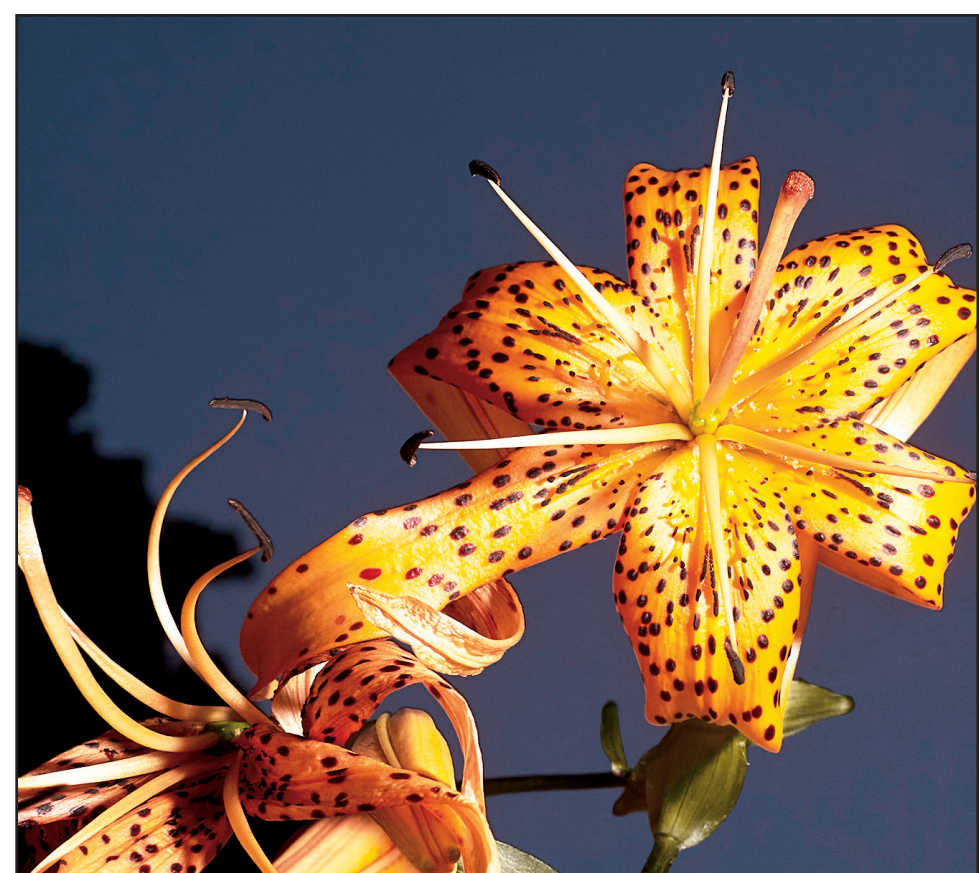
into the Encore! Fine Art Show with "Radical Botanicals" as its theme.

He enjoyed watching his favorite TV series and going out to eat; JMK was his favorite. He really enjoyed getting out to movies and listening to music. He and his dad would jam to music while getting ready, and he always looked forward to his grandpa’s slushy visits.

session of xanax (class 4 felony) and endangering the life and health of a child (class A misdemeanor).

Conti, 70, was charged with unlawful possession with intent to deliver crack cocaine (class 1 felony), unlawful possession with intent to deliver fentanyl (class 1 felony), unlawful possession of crack cocaine (class 4 felony), unlawful possession of fentanyl (class 4 felony), unlawful possession of xanax (class 4 felony), permitting unlawful use of building (class 4 felony) and unlawful possession of a firearm without a FOID Card (class A misdemeanor).

The investigation is still ongoing with additional charges pending.

The Holy Spirit: Can You Hear Him Now?

AS born-again believers in Jesus Christ, we serve a triune God—Father, Son and Holy Spirit. In Genesis 1:26 (AMP) God says, “Let Us (Father, Son, Holy Spirit) make man in Our image....” This verse reveals God as the Trinity, and we need to worship and have relationship with each Person of the Godhead.

It seems more common to hear people talk about God and Jesus, but the Holy Spirit does not get enough of our attention. It’s important to understand that He is a person who has a personality, a will, knowledge, a mind, and He thinks and knows things. For example, 1 Corinthians 2:11 (AMP) tells us that “no one knows the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God.”

In John 16:7 we learn some of the facets of His personality and how we need Him to work in our lives. In this verse Jesus says, “...If I do not go away, the Helper (Comforter, Advocate, Intercessor—Counselor, Strengtheners, Standby) will not come to you; but if I go, I will send Him (the Holy Spirit) to you [to be in close fellowship with you]” (AMP).

This scripture teaches that He is our... Counselor—Always go to God first for counsel and let Him speak to you His way, through the people or things He chooses.

Advocate—He pleads our case when we’re in trouble.

Intercessor—He prays for us and through us when we don’t know how to pray on our own.

Standby—He stands by us, ready to act on our behalf when we need something.

Strengtheners—He gives us God’s grace, which is His power and ability to do whatever we need to do in every situation.

He’s all these things and so much more! God is literally everything we need, and as we fellowship with the Holy Spirit, we can have “the mind of Christ [to be guided by His thoughts and purposes]” (1 Corinthians 2:16 AMP).

Learn the Sound of His Voice

The Holy Spirit is the only One who fully knows the mind of God, so when we pray for God to give us wisdom or the knowledge we need, it’s important

for us to realize the Spirit is in us (1 Corinthians 2:12; 6:19). And He communicates to us what He hears God say. John 16:13 (AMP) explains that He is “the Spirit of Truth” and He guides us into the Truth. “For He will not speak on His own initiative, but He will speak whatever He hears [from the Father....]”

One way we learn how to hear the Holy Spirit is by understanding that He has emotions and He can be grieved. Ephesians 4:30 (AMP) says, “Do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God....” Because He lives in us, when He feels grieved, we will feel it too.

Ephesians 4:29-31 (AMP) lists some behaviors that cause Him to be grieved: unwholesome (foul, profane, worthless, vulgar) speech, bitterness, wrath, anger, and clamor (perpetual animosity, resentment, strife, faultfinding), slander, every kind of malice (all spitefulness, verbal abuse, malevolence).

When we choose to think and speak in ways that go against His nature, we will feel conviction, and the best thing

we can do is confess our sin and repent immediately.

James 3:8 teaches that no one can “tame the human tongue” and sometimes we make mistakes and say wrong things. But we can learn from our mistakes; we can pray and ask God to help us only say things that are right and pleasing to Him.

I know it’s easy to be insensitive and say the wrong things sometimes. The other day I was wearing a blouse that didn’t fit me right, and I said to someone “This thing is way too big for me but it would probably fit you.” Afterward, I couldn’t believe I had said it!

We need to pray for God to help us hear His voice, giving us wisdom and direction in the thoughts we choose to think about and the words we speak. As our Counselor, He wants to guide us in everything we do, and we can learn how to hear His voice.

Listen for the still, small voice of the Holy Spirit speaking to your heart. You can hear it as you wait quietly in His presence, while you’re studying His Word, in the midst of your circumstances, and even through nature. God is talking to you!

Approaching homelessness with kindness

SOMETIMES hearts rather than policies need to be changed.

A good case in point is how we as a society address homelessness.

Mark Kessler, an owner of Recycled Records in Springfield, has said he and his brother, Gary, are selling their business in part because panhandlers are driving potential customers away from their store.

“Let’s say you are a 60-year-old woman, if a panhandler comes up to your car, you may be too frightened to get out and shop,” he said.

Kessler said he would like to see the Springfield police roust panhandlers out from the area near his shop.

“Why do people panhandle? Because they are too lazy to work,” he said. “You can’t convince me, that with as many job openings that there are now that these people can’t find a job if they want one.”

During the decades I’ve been a journalist, I’ve spent a lot of time talking to homeless folks. At one point in 1988, I went and lived on the streets with them just so I could share with readers the challenges they face.

My observation: Many end up panhandling to feed an addiction. Also, because of addiction or mental illnesses, some have become unemployable and use panhandling to survive.

Now, please note the homeless folks I’m talking about aren’t the ones sleeping on the sofas of friends or residing in a temporary shelter because of a missed rent check.

I’m talking about those sleeping on sidewalks.

It’s important to remember that not all homeless people panhandle. And not all panhandlers are homeless. But there is a pretty big overlap between the two.

Interestingly enough there is a business a little over a block from Kessler’s record store that is taking a radically different approach.

Café Moxo is showing the downtrodden hospitality.

“I believe in the Golden Rule: treat others the way you would like to be treated,” said Brandon Hughes, who manages the Springfield restaurant.

On many mornings, the café is full of business people, politicians, lobbyists and community power brokers eating breakfast, sipping coffee and opining on the problems of the world. And often sitting among them is an older woman talking to herself. She always has a hot cup of coffee and warm meal in front of her.

“She pays us when she can. When she can’t, we make sure she has something to eat,” Hughes said.

This approach of radical hospitality reflects the philosophy of the restaurant’s owner, Mark Forinash. During the pandemic, the restaurant partnered with

Springfield businesses and gave away thousands of sack lunches to those in need.

“At the end of the day, we are all people and we all deserve to be treated with dignity and respect,” Hughes said.

And there is the rub. In the American caste system, the homeless have become our untouchables.

They are the ones many folks want out of sight and out of mind.

I’ve fallen into that trap myself. Last winter, I was in the Springfield public library researching used car prices. (I’m too cheap to buy a Kelly Blue Book.) A man wearing a bathrobe kept coming over to the reference desk and asking questions while I stood there. The reference librarian was patient and humane.

But I became a bit annoyed and thought: Why is he getting more attention from this librarian than me?

As soon as that thought crossed my mind, I knew I needed to check my middle-class privilege at the door. After all, I don’t have any more right to use a public amenity -- whether it’s a public library, a sidewalk or a street -- than the fellow wandering about the bookshelves in his bathrobe.

And, hey, I’ve devoted my life to free speech and free expression. Every week I get letters from those who like what I write -- and those who don’t. If all speech were popular, it wouldn’t need to be protected.

So, if someone wants to use a public sidewalk to ask for money, who am I to say they can’t? Or for that matter what standing does a local government have to prohibit such a thing? After all, panhandlers have the same First Amendment rights as anyone else in society.

We shouldn’t punish someone for being homeless.

That said, the New York Times reported Monday that the nation’s most populous city has undertaken an aggressive campaign to push homeless people off the streets of Manhattan so tourists will feel more welcome.

In other cities, including Springfield, city officials have pondered doing something similar.

But here is a better approach: kindness.

I’ve noticed that Café Moxo is changing customers’ attitudes. It’s not uncommon for a business person or other professional to buy a meal for a needy person they see on the street.

When approached by a panhandler, I’ll say, “I won’t give you money. But I will buy you a meal.”

Is that response always embraced? No. But kindness never hurts. And when I do buy someone a meal, where do I go?

I go to Café Moxo. After all, why not help a business that is helping others?

Rochelle Police host National Night Out

‘We’re able to explain to people why we do what we do’

ROCHELLE — The Rochelle Police Department hosted its National Night Out event on Tuesday night at Atwood Park.

The event featured police and fire demonstrations, a helicopter landing, a ballet folklorico presentation, games, giveaways, music and free hot dogs. Similar events are celebrated by local police departments all across the country on the first Tuesday in August.

Attendees watched the fire department use some of its life-saving tools on a car and the police department did both a taser and K9 demonstration. Rochelle Police Chief Eric Higby said the night gives officers the chance to interact with people outside of the scope in which they normally would.

“We’re dressed differently, it gives people an opportunity to look at our equipment and do things like see the dog take a bite,” Higby said. “A lot of times people ask us questions one-on-one and we’re able to answer them. Because we’re not on a call, we don’t have a call waiting. It just gives us an opportunity to talk to people in a different environment.”

Tuesday’s event was the department’s fourth year participating. Last year’s National Night Out was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Higby said “a lot” of prep goes into National Night Out for his department and donations are received from community businesses and organizations.



Officer Ryan Beery and K-9 Axel were on hand at National Night Out to meet those in attendance.

“I think the paper plates and the condiments are about all we’ve paid for down here,” Higby said. “We appreciated the companies who have helped out and donated.”

Higby called the turnout for the event “awesome” and said it felt great to see local residents come out and support law enforcement.

Events like Tuesday are “vitally important” for outreach in the community, Higby said. People are able to ask questions and get them answered in a non-pressurized environment.

“Out here, there’s no time pressure,” Higby said. “It’s a unique environment out here. I hope they learn that we’re approachable and you can trust us and talk to us. That’s the one thing we see a lot especially with children. That’s why we do some of the children’s events out here like the coloring contest. We

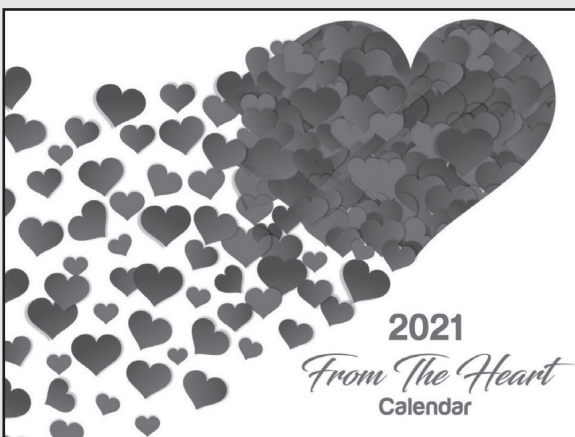
want the children to be comfortable and grow up trusting officers so when they’re adults, they can talk to us about their problems.”

The event also featured booths and tents with local organizations meeting with residents.

“We appreciate that it’s a true community event,” Higby said. “It’s not the police department out here. There’s lots of other entities here.”

ROCHELLE — Rochelle Junior Tackle President Derek Johnson was encouraged to see strong participation numbers when practices kicked off for the upcoming fall season this year. 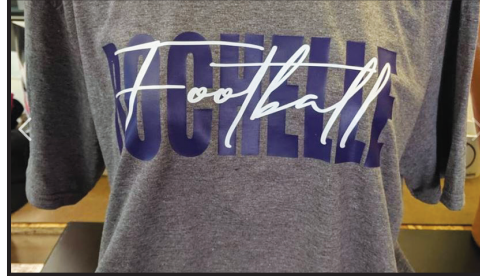

Flag football players return for 2021 season

Preschoolers through fourth-graders begin season on Tuesday, Aug. 11

ROCHELLE — For many young athletes in the Hub City, building the foundational skills and excitement for the sport of football takes place long before players suit up for tackle football at the elementary and middle-school levels. While preschoolers through fourth-graders may be too young for the pads and helmets of tackle football, Rochelle Junior

Tackle's flag football program allows those kids to enjoy the game while learning the importance of teamwork.

Roughly 175 players have signed up to participate in the RJT flag football program this fall. After not having the 2020 season because of the COVID-19 pandemic, RJT Flag Coordinator Johnny Gonzales said both players and coaches are excited to be back playing football once again.

"The kids are excited

to be playing sports again and we're happy for the parents who can watch their kids play sports again," Gonzales said. "There's a sense of normalcy and it feels right to see a lot of happy faces out there. I think we're going to have a normal season and I don't see us facing many issues at the moment. We're going to take everything one day at a time and we'll make any adjustments when they're needed. I feel like we can get a full season

in this year."

The RJT flag football program features three leagues including the Arena League for preschoolers and kindergartners, the Jungle League for first and second-graders as well as the NFL League for third and fourth-graders. Arena League and Jungle League games will take place Tuesday evenings at Helms Park beginning Aug. 10, while NFL League games are scheduled for Wednesday evenings beginning Aug.

11. Games will span over a period of eight weeks.

"We're always looking to grow our numbers," Gonzales said. "The main thing for us when we talk with our coaches is that we want the kids to have fun and enjoy themselves. I think the kids who start flag football at a young age enjoy it more with each year they come back. We have our end-of-the-season tournament for the NFL League so our older kids have a more competitive tournament

to look forward to before they begin playing tackle football."

The Arena League and Jungle League will each feature six teams, while the NFL League will field eight teams this fall. The flag football program's final games and celebration will take place on Sept. 28 and 29, with the RJT banquet scheduled for Oct. 14. Gonzales and fellow RJT Flag Coordinator Dan Escatel have been working hard to prepare for the upcoming season.

HOLLYWOOD — Director **Franco Nero**, “Lancelot” in “Camelot” (1967), was certain that his wife, **Vanessa Redgrave**, would star with him in his film “The Man Who Drew God.” But when **Kevin Spacey** was signed to play a “cameo” in the film, she abruptly pulled out, claiming to never have committed to the film. Producer **Louis Nero** (Franco’s son) then found someone who he considered a good replacement.

No doubt **Faye Dunaway** is a great actress. She starred in such classics as “Bonnie & Clyde” (1967), “Chinatown” (1974), her Oscar-winning performance in “Network” (1976) and the cult classic “Mommie Dearest” (1981), in which she played **Joan Crawford**. But two of her past three films, “The Bye Bye Man” and “The Case for Christ,” both released in 2019, lost money, and the third, “Inconceivable,” was a bomb despite co-stars **Nicolas Cage** and **Gina Gershon**.

Even worse, in July 2019, she was Broadway-bound in “Tea for Five,” a one-woman show based on the **Katharine Hepburn** book, but she was apparently so abusive to crew members, allegedly slapping them and throwing things at them, that she was fired for “creating a dangerous environment in which no one was allowed to wear white lest it distract her,” according to a New York Post report.

In “The Man Who Drew God,” Dunaway, now 80, plays a braille teacher whose friend is the blind protagonist, played by **Franco Nero**. The film wrapped with no eruptions from the set reported, but there’s still the full publicity campaign ahead, and Faye hasn’t always gotten along with the bombastic foreign press corp.

Being a success doesn’t guarantee all will go well. Author **Stephen King** has written 63 novels and has an estimated net worth of \$400 million, yet he admitted in an upcoming biography that during the ‘80s he spent most of

his time binging on drugs and alcohol, saying “One snort and cocaine owned my body and soul.” King has admitted though that writing did help him escape the terrors of his mind.

But being famous makes one a target. On June 29 he wrote on Twitter, “Paying cash for gas is inconvenient, but what’s REALLY inconvenient is having someone who’s stolen your credit card info buying a diamond for his girlfriend and a new sound system for himself!”

The 1955 film adaption of the hit Broadway musical “Guys & Dolls” will be remade and directed by Oscar-winner **Bill Condon** (“Chicago”). The rights held by 20th Century Fox lapsed because when Disney bought Fox, it fired everyone and TriStar grabbed the rights. Now the search is on to find a modern-day **Marlon Brando** and **Frank Sinatra**. **Channing Tatum** and **Joseph Gordon-Levitt** are the front runners, but Brando or Sinatra? NOT!

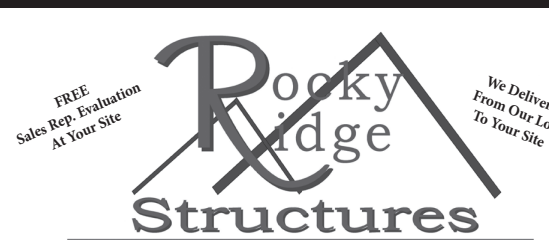

Rochelle falls 13-11 to LaSalle, scores 8 runs in final inning

ROCHELLE — The Rochelle Little League 14U Baseball All-Stars saw their run to the Illinois Little League Junior League State Championship tournament end on their home field Friday night, falling 13-11 to LaSalle in a second round matchup. Rochelle lost to Chicago East Side 19-9 in the first round Wednesday night. Rochelle recorded its first two runs of the game in the bottom of the third inning on RBI singles by Frankie Pelan and Ryan Senne that brought the game to a 4-2 deficit.
