Starbucks coming to Rochelle

Construction on new location near Walgreens underway

ROCHELLE — Rochelle city officials held a groundbreaking ceremony Friday and announced that Starbucks will be building and opening a location in town on Illinois Route 251 next to Walgreens.

The location will feature a 2,000 square foot store with indoor and outdoor seating and a drive-thru. It is planned to open in spring 2022. It will employ about 25-30 people and it has created 75-80 construction jobs. The city first began speaking with Starbucks in January, City Community Development Director Michelle Pease said.

"This is quite an exciting announcement," Mayor John Bearrows said. "Starbucks is a major nationwide chain. Many months ago when we started talking about this, I spoke with Michelle and we talked about what could happen. I thought if we could land a Starbucks, that could be amazing in Rochelle. And

now we know it's not only in Rochelle, but it's the only one in Ogle County."

City staff regularly reach out to national corporations that could fit the demographics in Rochelle and have been working

with Location Finders International, a suburban Chicago commercial real estate firm, since early 2021.

City Manager Jeff Fiegenschuh said he's excited to add to that specific area

in town.

"The REC Center, Starbucks and the future Hickory Grove redevelopment are three projects in this area that add to the quality of life in our community," Fiegenschuh said.

Fiegenschuh believes the addition shows that Rochelle has the buying power to support a nationally recognized brand like Starbucks.

Country Jam returning in 2022

Event will be held at Rochelle Municipal Airport

ROCHELLE — Summer Country Jam will return to Rochelle in 2022, Rochelle Chamber of Commerce Executive Director Tricia Herrera said.

The event previously took place at Rochelle Municipal Airport for five years up until 2017. It was not held in the two years after that. Herrera said the board wanted to hold the event last year before the COVID-19 pandemic came into play.

"It is coming back in 2022," Herrera said. "We've already started planning it. Planning is very preliminary right now. The chamber board has already voted on it and approved it. The community wants it back. The community has asked about doing it again. It was great for five years."

Herrera said years were taken off from the event to regroup and evaluate. The chamber has had changes in directors and

board members in recent years. She said the City of Rochelle remains "very supportive" of the event.

Summer Country Jam will take place at the Rochelle Municipal Airport again in 2022.

"We have preliminary approval for it," Herrera said. "It's such a unique venue. We wouldn't want

it anywhere else."

Herrera said the chamber is currently looking at talent and putting a budget together. She said the chamber can't do the event without sponsors and asked those interested to contact her if they'd like to get involved with sponsorship.

The event has brought

country music stars to town in the past including Chase Rice, Kellie Pickler, Russell Dickerson and CAM.

"It was one of the chamber's largest fundraisers," Herrera said. "It helped us keep helping members. It's a great community event and the talent we've gotten in the past was amazing."

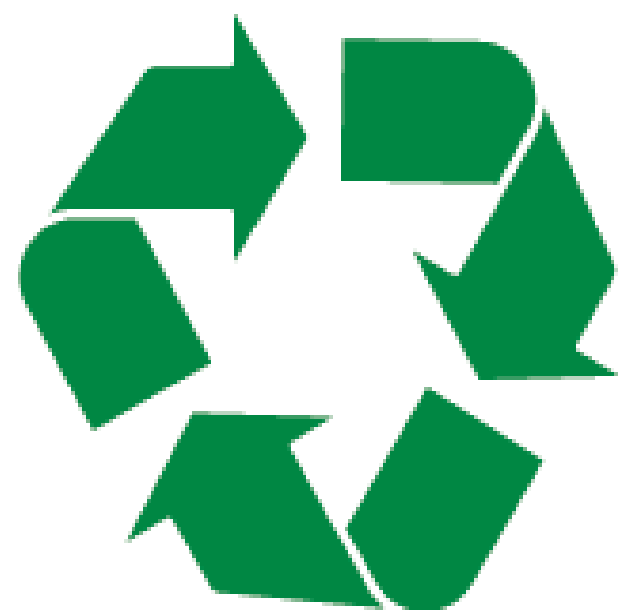

Waste reduction and recycling grants available

OREGON—The final round of waste reduction/recycling grants for 2021 available from the Ogle County Solid Waste Management Department is coming up in September. The grants are for businesses, schools, churches or non-profit groups wanting to establish or improve waste reduction and recycling programs and services. The grants are up to \$2,000, and funds are limited, so they will be awarded on a competitive basis in amounts from \$100-2,000. Applicants must provide a minimum 20 percent match of the total project cost. The deadline for submittal of applications for this last round of grants is 4 p.m. Wednesday, Sept. 1.

The application for the grants is simple and flexible. Businesses could use grant funds to help purchase waste reduction and recycling materials and equipment such as collection bins, carts, balers and storage containers.

Equipment needed to switch from disposable packaging to reusable packaging for products and supplies could also be considered. Businesses are encouraged to consider projects to reduce food waste or implement food waste recycling programs.

Waste hauling companies could use grant funds

to improve the quantity and quality of materials collected in their curbside recycling collection programs. This could be done through promotional efforts, instructional stickers for carts and bins, direct mail and other educational efforts.

Schools may seek funds to restart recycling programs for students and staff or for special projects that will further a student’s understanding of how to reduce the amount of trash sent to the landfill. The requests may be for materials and equipment, such as recycling bins/carts, videos, books, worm (vermicomposting) bins, composters, or other waste reduction or recycling equipment.

Municipalities seeking to improve commercial, curbside or multifamily recycling programs are encouraged to apply. Grant applications for equipment and materials needed to improve electronics recycling options in Ogle County will also be considered.

These are just examples, and applicants are encouraged to find innovative ways to reduce waste and increase what is recycled. The grants may not be used to pay for ongoing expenses such as staffing, collection and hauling costs. Priority will be given to new applicants.

Delta variant has been identified in Ogle County

OREGON – The positivity rate for COVID-19 in Ogle County has increased from 2.9 percent a month ago to 6.3 percent now. In a written report to the Ogle County Board at its Aug. 17 meeting, Kyle Auman, Ogle County's public health administrator, also said the Delta Variant of COVID has now been identified in the county.

The regional positivity rate is up to 6.4 percent. It was at 2.4 percent last month.

Auman said there has been an upward trend in cases since July. He added that this department is concerned that the start of the school year will bring more cases.

"Since the beginning of the Pandemic schools have been named as the top location of exposure and it seems like this will hold true for the upcoming school year," he wrote.

The Health Department had 30 new cases on Aug. 16, which Auman said was the highest number of single day new cases since the last local peak of the pandemic.

Currently, the county has 55 people in quarantine and 61 in isolation. Auman said new cases are coming

in every day.

As for vaccinations, the county has administered 46,678 does, with 22,942 being fully vaccinated. That is about 45 percent of the county's population. Auman said his department is planning to go back into schools to conduct more vaccination clinics.

The Health Department is also offering vaccines Tuesday, Wednesday and

Nye recognized by Ogle County Board

OREGON – It is clear that Marguerite Nye, known as Maggie, made an impact on Ogle County.

She served on the Ogle County Board from 1982-92 and from 2008-18 and is believed to be the first elected woman to have served on the board. She was a champion for many, giving her time to the CASA Board, Village of Progress Board, Focus House and many others.

At its July meeting, the Ogle County Board honored the memory of Nye, who died in December 2019, with a photograph and plaque that will hang in the Ogle County Courthouse.

At the meeting were Nye's husband, Phil; daughter Maggie Conboy of Denver, Colo.; son Mose of Park Ridge; and close

friend Tim Knoerzer and his daughter Cassidy, of Calion, N.J.

"I met Maggie through her brother, Kevin Glynn, who was my roommate at Northwestern and she came to Rochelle after we were married in 1964," Phil said. "Maggie grew up Irish on Chicago's south side and was as Irish as 'Paddy's pig.' She was up to her ears in politics and loved to campaign and follow local and state politics. She ran and was elected to the Ogle Board after she was rejected for a vacancy the previous year by an appointment for a vacancy. She ran first on the ticket in 1982, and served a little over 20 years holding numerous chairmanships and appointments."

According to the resolution adopted by the board, during her time of service with the county, she served as chair of the

Juvenile and Probation Committee, chair of the Health Education and Welfare Committee and chair of the Courthouse Restoration Committee.

"She was truly a Renaissance gal whose interests ran from oil painting, taking tap dancing lessons in her 70s and practicing on the garage floor, working with Serenity Hospice, playing the piano, serving on local community Boards such as Village of Progress, Hope, Shining Star, Drug Advisory, and CASA, dancing at every opportunity and world travel," Phil said.

Maggie was employed for many years as a hospice worker at Serenity Hospice and Home.

She died after battling multiple myeloma for more than 17 years.

"I never heard her make a single complaint about her illness during the entire time," Phil said.

While spending his entire life in Rochelle, he grew up helping several farmers and other people doing odd jobs. After 37 years, he retired from working at Del Monte Foods.

Although he retired, he still owned Furman’s Tree Service, which he continued to run well into his 70s. Curt enjoyed the outdoors, raising registered quarter and paint horses and going on trail rides with his family and friends.

His favorite pastimes were following his grandsons in whatever they were involved in, tinkering in the shop and watching old

cowboy movies. He loved spending time with family and special lifelong friends, many of those friends became his chosen family.

In addition to his wife, Becky, he was preceded in death by two daughters, Cynthia and Christine; brother, Keith Furman; sisters, Rita Meling and Joyce Gittleson and brothers-in-law, Mahlon Meling, Wayne Friestad, Herb Clark, and Norm Gittleson.

Curt is survived by his daughter, Sherrilyn (Kurt) Simmons; three grandsons, Trent and Ryan Simmons and Curtis Caulder; one great-grandson, Jaydon Caulder; son-in-law, Scott Caulder; brothers, Loren (Ruth) Furman, Wayne (Connie) Furman and Wendell Furman; sisters, Carol Friestad, Doris (Wayne) Hardy and Kay Clark and many nieces, nephews, cousins and dear friends.

10 a.m. until noon on Saturday, Aug. 28 at the Unger-Horner Funeral Home, 400 N. 6th St. in Rochelle.

Justine Harwood Laquer

ROCHELLE – “Little pitchers” would warn the adults when the family stories were inappropriate for younger ears, disappointing Justine as she listened eagerly. Thus began a lifetime of interest in family history and genealogical research for Emily Justine Harwood Laquer, born at Lincoln, Nebraska in 1927, eldest daughter of Floyd Clayton Harwood and his wife, Emily Virginia Ross.

As a genealogist, Mrs. Laquer identified seven lines back to the Mayflower, and found that her parents were distant cousins, sharing Francis Cooke as their common Mayflower ancestor, about 10 generations earlier. By the time that Mrs. Laquer retired, she had generated over 500 typed pages of detailed family history, and in the process published six articles in major genealogical publications. She told her children “No way could I tell you all about them, but sometimes I have the nightmare that they are all coming to dinner at once.”

Mrs. Laquer was a member of the New Mexico Mayflower Society and served many years as their historian. She descended through her father from Francis Cooke, William Bradford and Richard Warren, and through her mother from Francis Cooke, Stephen Hopkins and Edward Doty twice.

She was also a member of the Daughters of the

American Revolution (DAR) for over 50 years serving as registrar and chaplain of the Valle Grande NM Chapter and as chaplain of the Rochelle Chapter. She descends from several Revolutionary War patriots: Moses Chapline (maternal, 1754-1812), James Caldwell (m, 1724-1804), Luke Drury (m, 1737-1811), Zachariah Sprigg (m, 1751-1829), Joshua Turner (m, 1757-~1820), John Hathorn (paternal, 1749-1825), Jacobus Post Sr. (p, 1726-1798) and Jacobus Post Jr (p, 1754-1812).

She was a member of the 1st Presbyterian Church of Rochelle.

As an infant, Justine’s family soon left Nebraska for the east coast where her father was a classics instructor at Taft School and then Lawrenceville School. Justine graduated from Westover School in 1945, and then attended Bryn Mawr College. There she met the love of her life, Henry Louis Laquer, at a New Year’s Eve party. They were married Nov. 1, 1947, and moved west to Los Alamos, New Mexico, to the delight of her mother, who since she had been born in Wyoming and raised in Omaha exclaimed “You’re going west!” There Justine and Henry spent many happy years together, raising a family, building a house in Pueblo style, skiing and hiking (she climbed



peaks greater than 14,000 feet elevation, her last at age 53, and many more than most of her children who by then were off to college). She moved to Rochelle, Illinois in 2011.

Justine, the last of her and her husband’s generations of siblings, died in hospice care near Oregon. She was predeceased by her husband Henry of almost 63 years in 2010, her daughter Emily K. (Bernhard, 1995) and her sisters Edith Mason (Bailey, 1980) and Clara Smith (David, 1985).

She is survived by her sons, Frederic of Omaha, Nebraska, Turner ofocatello, Idaho, daughter Lydia Roberts (Charles) of Rochelle, son-in-law Bernhard Laquer (nee Hoffmann) of Nuremberg, Germany, brother-in-law David Smith of Millersville, Maryland, six grandchildren, five great-grandchildren and many nieces and nephews.

Labor Day

The One Who is Everything You Need

THE Bible repeatedly tells us that God is our helper. The question is, do we really trust God to help us? It's easy to say that we trust Him, but when it comes to practically applying this truth—to leaning on the Holy Spirit to help us in every area of our lives—we often struggle to do it.

As born-again believers in Jesus Christ, the Holy Spirit—God's Spirit—lives in our spirit. In John 16:7, Jesus said that the Holy Spirit is our "Helper (Comforter, Advocate, Intercessor — Counselor, Strengthen, Standby)" and that He wants "to be in close fellowship" with us (AMP).

It's so important for us to know that we can have a close, intimate relationship with the Holy Spirit... that He will communicate with us. I went to church

for many years and had no idea that I could overcome my problems and live with real peace and joy because the Holy Spirit lived in my spirit. It was life-changing for me when I got the revelation that He wanted to lead me in God's will for my life and He would enable me to do everything I needed to do.

The truth is if we really believe God is our helper and He's willing to help us no matter what situation we're in, then we have no reason to worry or get overwhelmed.

I'll let you in on another secret: You need to ask God for help because the Holy Spirit is not the type to barge into your life and take over. Has anyone ever tried to push their opinions or their agenda on you? They may or may not know what they're talking about, and they may not even be really

interested in helping you do what needs to be done, but they sure have a lot to say about what you're doing wrong.

That's not what the Holy Spirit does. He knows the answer to every problem, and He will even help you get through each one. But He won't give you His advice unless you ask for it. In other words, the humble get the help.

Jesus said in John 15:5 (NIV), "Apart from me you can do nothing." And that's so true. But did you know He's not holding out on you? God actually likes it when we ask for His help. And He not only wants to help us with our big problems, He also wants to help us with the little things in life. That's wonderful news because sometimes we allow the

little things to get us frustrated and upset. It's good for us to pray often, "Help, Lord. Help me."

In the Psalms, we frequently see King David going to God for help. For example, Psalm 40:13 (NIV) says, "Be pleased to save me, Lord; come quickly, Lord, to help me."

Notice that David was not only bold enough to ask God for help, but he was also confident that God would answer his prayers. In Psalm 43:5 (AMP), David says, "Why, my soul, are you downcast? Why so disturbed within me? Put your hope in God, for I will yet praise him, my Savior and my God."

You and I have so many opportunities to feel sad or discouraged and have a bad attitude, but God

wants us to stay strong in Him, like David did. Those who do will eventually come out on top, because there's no way the enemy can hold you back if you will trust God and keep your hope in Him.

It's comforting to know God will help you get through the hard times of life. His grace and strength will sustain you while you're waiting for your breakthrough. Isaiah 41:10 says He "will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand" (NIV).

Even when you're tempted to think, "It's not going to do me any good to pray after the way I've acted, don't let that stop you from asking for God's help. Because when you go to the Father in prayer, you don't go in your name—you go in the name of Jesus."

Hebrews 4:16 (NIV) says we can "approach God's throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need." And Psalm 23:3 says, "He refreshes my soul. He guides me along the right paths for his name's sake" (emphasis added).

When you're hurting, in trouble, or waiting for answers in your life, you need to believe that your Helper, the Holy Spirit, is with you and He wants to help you. Stay in close fellowship with Him and ask Him for the help you need. No matter what the circumstances may look like, believe He's working on your behalf. He is your Comforter, Counselor, Helper, Advocate, Intercessor, Strengthen, Standby—He's everything you need—and He's just waiting for you to ask.

Forty years ago? Feels like yesterday

I realized last week that 40 years ago, I started Air Force basic training in San Antonio, Texas. Forty years. Wow. Now, many things that happened 40 years ago I can't remember at all. I can't even tell you what I had for dinner last Thursday. But I can still close my eyes and see the young faces of a group of guys I was only around for a couple of months when I was a teenager.

There was Bushy, a dude from Idaho. He hated the Texas heat. I thought Idaho must be in New England. Yes, I was that dumb.

There was Anderson, who at 27 was the oldest guy there by about six years. He was from California, and just seemed impossibly old to me. I had been 18 for a few months by that time – basically a baby.

There was Duncan, a hilarious guy from San Francisco. We had a lot of great times cracking each other up and helping each other

through the tough times. And Joey, a kid from North Carolina who had the face of a 10-year-old and a heart of gold. One of the nicest guys I have ever met. I wonder how his life turned out?

We are all men in our late 50s now – well, except for Anderson. He would be 67. And our drill sergeant, Sgt. Lloyd would be 65. Yes, he was younger than Anderson but looked pretty much ageless. He could have been 25 or 55, I couldn't tell. I spent almost no time looking him in the face. That was something to be avoided.

A lot of years have gone by since that late summer in Texas. Marriages, kids, college, career, a lot of music played and a lot of tears and smiles. But there are those formative things in your life that are never far from your memory.

Basic training was one of those for me. I had been

away from home before, but never for that long. I had a wonderful life in Yuma, Ariz., as a kid. Great parents, wonderful friends, a job delivering pizzas at the best place for a teenager to work in town. I had a great girlfriend too.

But instead of college I opted to join the military (I went to college later). Honestly, I am still not sure why I walked into that recruiters office in April 1981 and talked to him about signing up. But I am glad I did.

Being in the military does not define who I am as a person. I know a lot of people who hold onto their years in the service as the greatest time in their lives. That might have been 40 years ago, but they still walk around talking about it.

That is not who I am. I honestly get a little embarrassed when people thank me for my service. I am proud that I did serve, but

I am certainly no hero. A hero does something heroic like saving lives. I worked nearly 40 12-hour shifts in a row when I was stationed on Guam, but that is hardly heroic. It was just tiring.

But my military service clearly had an effect on my life. I am always on time for things because of it. Being there when you are supposed to be there means a lot to me. I am also always weary of people who hug the flag but never seemed to serve anything but themselves. That seems to be most politicians these days.

I am not saying I am better than anyone else because I served. That is certainly not true. But I am a better version of myself because I did. I was a kid with no real direction and no real plan. Four years later I was more certain of who I was as a person, was more confident and knew there was something out there for me – I just had to go and get it.

There were no development dollars spent by the city to attract Starbucks to Rochelle, Fiegenschuh said.

"They didn't ask for any either," Fiegenschuh said. "They are in the enterprise zone like the rest of the town. They will get a 50 percent tax abatement over six years and a sales tax rebate on construction materials. But anybody who builds in the enterprise zone qualifies for that. Otherwise there were no city dollars or any incentives to entice them here."

Pease thanked the city council and staff for their work on bringing Starbucks to town. The project was under wraps in recent months and was codenamed "Project Siren" in an ode to the coffee company's logo.

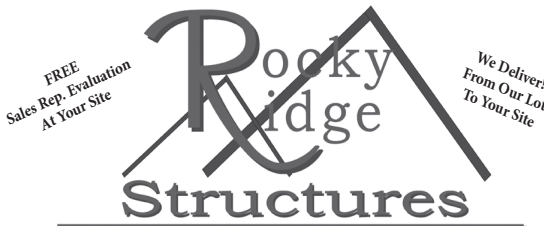

ST. PAUL: Principal Hall discusses COVID-19 challenges

“We’ve been successful throughout this pandemic,” Hall said. “Our teachers have gone above and beyond and made it their business to be the best they can be for the children. Our second strength would be the families that attend St. Paul. Their willingness to be flexible and work within what we’re doing and do the best they can. By nature of our size, communication is really strong.”

Before March 13, 2020 when schools closed, Hall told teachers to prepare for kids not to be in the building. Kids were sent home with learning materials and the school closed in-person for the remainder of that school year.

Going into the 2020-2021 school year, Hall knew more learning needed to be done electronically and teachers took extra training on their own time to be prepared.

“Going into the 2020-2021 school year, the preparations we had to make to accommodate being here all day, we had to do a lot to be ready to meet the challenge and all the mandates,” Hall said. “The costs were high. The reason we were able to do that was the generosity of not only the families but people who support St. Paul from afar. People that saw we needed help and helped out.”

Due to being a private school, St. Paul doesn’t get much money from the state, Hall said. Last year it got around \$1,000 total. “But that doesn’t mean it doesn’t have to follow state rules related and unrelated to the pandemic.”

From the beginning of the COVID-19, whenever the state would make a mandate, St. Paul followed it. The school is currently adhering to Gov. JB Pritzker’s mask mandate after originally deciding on a mask optional approach.

“It’s misunderstood by some people that we’re a private school and they think we can do whatever we want,” Hall said. “That’s not true. Regardless of if we have any state support, we also have other people like insurance carriers that expect us to follow the rules. We put ourselves out on a limb if we don’t. Our bottom line here is to keep our kids safe.”

Hall said that even when the school announces controversial decisions like following the mask mandate, he still receives emails and communications of support from families. He knows there are a lot of parents that don’t want their children wearing masks in school, and he’s grateful for their understanding.

“And our kids cooperate,” Hall said. “We have such good kids here. Because they come from good families. We have the support of the people that come here and their willingness to work within what we’re doing in a supportive and non-combative way.”

St. Paul has about 140 students right now, preschool through eighth grade. Hall said “just a couple” families moved their children into St. Paul from Rochelle’s elementary district after seeing the differences in what it was doing last year such as being in school all day in-person.

Hall said “a lot” of fam-

ilies inquired, but generally the number enrolled was the same as any other year. He did get a lot of phone calls later in the year, but at that point it was too late for enrollment.

“I do believe the fact that we were in school all day has given our kids an advantage, that’s common sense,” Hall said. “But we did have a ton of remote students who were in our classes with us via Google Classroom. We didn’t just give them assignments. We’re proud of how involved they were.”

Hall praised the support that’s been given to him by administrators in Rochelle’s school districts such as District 231 and

212 Superintendent Jason Harper, District 231 Assistant Superintendent Tony Doyle and Rochelle Township High School Principal Chris Lewis.

“I like to stay in line with what they’re doing,” Hall said. “I’m extremely happy and proud and impressed by the support we get. They embrace us as part of the community.”

Hall believes the pandemic has taught his students lessons in life of being resourceful, creative and patient. He believes living through COVID-19 will make them stronger in the long run.

But, he’s also noticed how students have missed out. They didn’t get to

participate in things like athletics, field trips and a Christmas program.

“It breaks my heart that those kids had to miss out on those things,” Hall said. “It changed the climate of the school because during basketball season there’s an energy in the building. Same with the Christmas program. That energy you can’t manufacture. But I’m so proud of our kids for being resilient. Our hope is that our group can experience those things this year.”

St. Paul’s faith-based education has helped it through the pandemic.

“We’re a Christian school,” Hall said. “We walk by faith here. That

doesn’t mean we’re not responsible. We have a lot of faith in the lord to put us in a position to succeed. When we come up against these kinds of things, that’s an important part of what we do and believe here. God is part of the whole process.”

Hall can’t say that there haven’t been challenges in the past 17 months.

“It’s been the biggest challenge in my 36 years of being a Lutheran educator,” Hall said. “It’s been the hardest time. But looking ahead from March 2020 to now, it’s been much easier than I thought it would be because of the cooperation of staff and families.”

Prusator retiring after 31 years at Focus House

‘It’s been continual learning and growth’

ROCHELLE — One of Janice Prusator’s fondest memories of her time at Focus House is doing the dishes.

“For a while we’d do chores with the kids,” Prusator said. “One was doing dishes after lunch. I loved to do dishes. I would wash and another student would rinse or dry. That was a neat time. Any time we had the opportunity to work side-by-side. It’s fun to work with the students.”

Prusator will be retiring at the end of this school year after 31 years as a teacher at Focus House. She’s spent that time working with at-risk students and watching them and the facility and program grow. She’s grown over that time, too.

“For me it’s been continual learning and growth,” Prusator said. “Just the nature of Focus House, it’s constant change. There’s always something new. Teaching here, every semester I teach something new. If I were to give you a list of all the subjects I’ve taught it’d be in the 20s. Everything from English to wood shop to chemistry. You name it, I’ve taught it. Every semester I have

to learn along with them, which is great. I love it.”

Prusator’s position as head teacher also involves evaluating what each student needs and fulfilling those needs according to school requirements.

A lot of the classes are set up for students to learn at their own pace.

“One of the priorities is getting them back to feeling successful in the classroom and enjoying learning,” Prusator said. “That’s the biggest goal. Feel safe and comfortable and look to love learning more.”

Being a teacher was never Prusator’s intention earlier in her life. She majored in psychology and worked in sales after college. She left that job after deciding to get married. She had always been curious about and enjoyed studying behavior disorders with at-risk youth.

She decided to go back to school and get her master’s degree in special education with that area targeted. She didn’t know Focus House existed at that time.

“I taught in a few schools,” Prusator said. “An opening came up at the high school and I applied for it. Mr. Creason said he thought he might have the right place for me. He introduced me to

Focus House where they were looking for a teacher and the rest was history.”

Prusator believes she stayed at Focus House because she loves the people she works with. She said she’s been blessed by “incredible” mentors and friends over the years.

“I’ve learned and grown so much with and because of them,” Prusator said. “It’s just always something new every year. Like going to a new job. And I just love this group of kids.”

When Prusator started at Focus House, there were animals on site including a German shepherd, cats, sheep, goats and peacocks. She started the year the gym was being built in 1991. She spent her first day laying tile in one of the locker rooms alongside students.

She’s worked in every building at Focus House and even had a classroom in the farm house.

She went on trips to Springfield with students about 30 times. Those trips were a highlight of her teaching career. One summer they took a trip to Washington D.C.

“I have so many wonderful memories of introducing the students to new experiences,” Prusator said. “The first time they stayed at a hotel

or went to a really fancy restaurant. We used to take them camping and into Chicago.”

Prusator believes the importance of Focus House has changed a little bit over the years for students, but one thing has always been common.

“This is a place where students can feel safe learning about themselves and their capabilities and learning how to have pos-

itive relationships with people from different ages and backgrounds,” Prusator said. “And just being totally accepted for who they are, where they are.”

Prusator’s decision to retire was made a few years ago with the intention of spending more time with her husband, Todd, who retired in recent years as superintendent of the Rochelle Elementary School District.

Her final year seemed to come up sooner than she expected.

“Even at the end of last year, the thought of only having one year left kind of scared me,” Prusator said. “I thought I wasn’t ready to go yet. But I think it’ll be time. It’s going to be tough. Just looking around my room, there are so many memories. It’s hard to imagine my life without Focus House.”

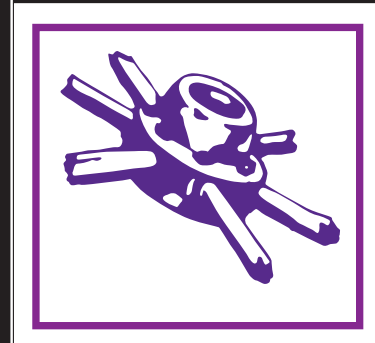

Hubs finish 12th at L-P Cavalier Invitational

Ohlinger records first-ever eagle, medals in third with 3-over-par 75

LASALLE — Less than 24 hours after shooting an even-par 36 with three birdies in a home match against the Sandwich Indians, Rochelle's Griffin Ohlinger one-upped himself with three birdies and his first-ever eagle during LaSalle-Pe-ru's Cavalier Invitational at Senica's Oak Ridge.

A 310-yard drive off the tee box left Ohlinger in prime position to reach the green in two shots. Ohlinger pulled the 7-iron from his bag, launching the ball roughly 170 yards on his second shot and placing the ball nearly 12 feet from the flag.

Calm and confident after carding a birdie on the previous hole, Ohlinger stepped up to the ball with his putter in hand, stroking the ball into the hole for the first eagle of his career. The rare scoring feat helped elevate Ohlinger to a third-place medal finish and Rochelle's top score

in the 18-hole tournament with a 3-over-par 75.

"I crushed my drive right down the fairway and hit a nice 7-iron onto the green," Ohlinger said. "We had three meets this week and I thought I played better in each meet. It felt great to be out there again, especially since I didn't play much over the summer. . . I know I have to step up this year and I want to be there for my teammates. I want them to know what I think when they hit their shots and I want to help them with their swings."

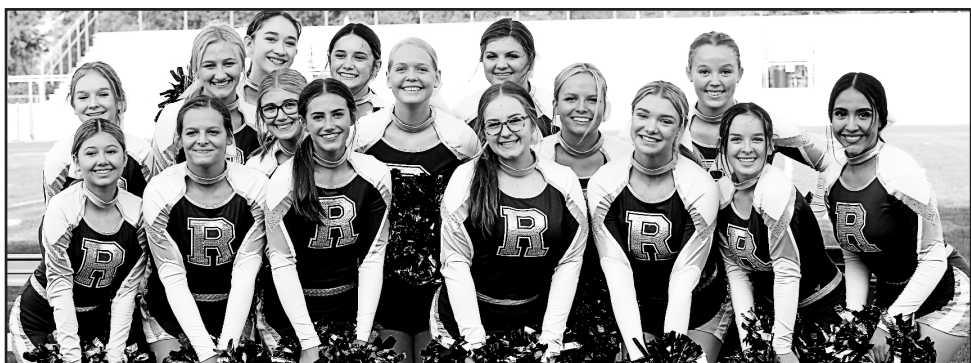
Twelve teams competed in the Cavalier Invitational on Thursday, with Rochelle scoring 397 to finish in 12th place. Junior Damen Harrington recorded 101 for the Hubs, while junior Wade Smith and senior Rowan Williams rounded out the varsity lineup with 104 and 117.

Rochelle will return to the course with a home match against Morris at Fairways Golf Course on Wednesday, Aug. 25 at 4 p.m.

Hammock impressed with Huskies' intensity

Two-hour practice in full pads yields highlights on both sides of the ball

DEKALB — “That was the most intense practice in my three years here.”

That was Northern Illinois University head coach Thomas Hammock’s assessment after putting his Huskies through their first practice in full pads this preseason for more than two hours Wednesday night inside a hot and humid Chessick Practice Center.

“What I saw was two competitive sides of the ball get after it for two hours plus, and that was impressive to see,” Hammock continued. “(Tuesday) the offense won. We’ll see how the grades come out today, but the defense came back with a chip on their shoulder and a fire to knock the offense back. I was impressed and I’m not impressed very easily.”

Hammock and his coaching staff may have to give out multiple yellow “juice” jerseys — usually given to the one player who brings the most energy to practice — when the Huskies return to the practice field Friday after Thursday’s off day. The Huskie defense was physical in both individual situations, whether it was defensive line versus offensive line, linebackers versus running backs and tight ends or defensive backs versus wide receivers. Meanwhile the offense displayed both its physicality in the inside run game and speed to the outside and downfield. The intensity carried over

to the team periods as a delighted Hammock watched both sides make plays.

“Defensively, I think the line is really stout,” he said. “You saw guys like James Ester and Ray Thomas getting after it on the pass rush. Demond Taylor is a guy that’s playing very physical right now. Our linebackers — like Lance Deveaux — are playing downhill. Devin Lafayette is playing at a high level; Eric Rogers was making plays out there. There are a lot of guys and we’ve got some young guys [newcomers] stepping up as well.”

While the defense was flying around, the offense made its share of plays with Rocky Lombardi and Ethan Hampton taking the majority of the reps at quarterback with the first

and second team units, respectively. Clint Ratkovich, Jay Ducker, Miles Joiner and Tyrice Richie were just a few of the skill players who turned short gains into touchdowns on the night.

“We have playmakers, there are no ifs, ands or buts about that,” Hammock said. “We have receivers, we have backs — we can go nine deep in the backfield. We have an opportunity to really have a deep, physical and explosive backfield. We have a tight end who is dynamic, who can be very explosive in the run game and who can take it to the house in the passing game. That [talent] gives us an edge, it gives us an opportunity to be the type of offense we want to be.”

NIU returns to the

practice field Friday morning and will hold its first extensive scrimmage on Saturday. Practices are open to the public and fans in attendance are asked to remain in the West Stands and not to post any photos or videos of practice. NIU opens the season at Georgia Tech on Sept. 4 before welcoming fans back to the stands at full capacity in Huskie Stadium beginning with the home opener versus Wyoming on Sept. 11. Kickoff for the game is at 12:30 p.m. (CT) and the game will honor First Responders and Health Care Heroes, while also serving as a Welcome Back Fans celebration.

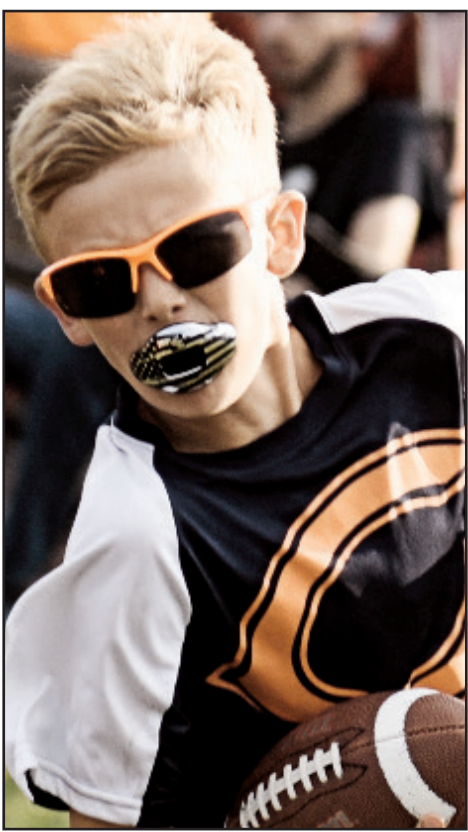
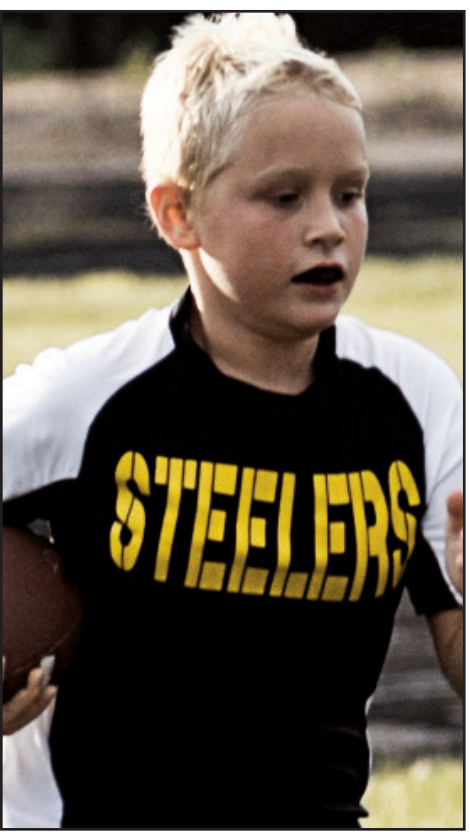
