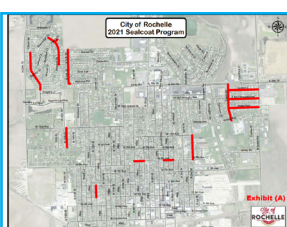

School board faces mask decision

Parents voice concerns during Tuesday's District 231 meeting

ROCHELLE — Nearly every chair inside the Lincoln Elementary School cafeteria was filled Tuesday evening, when several local parents voiced their opinions about whether or not students in Rochelle School District 231 should be required to wear masks in school.

The discussion took place during the monthly District 231 Board of Education meeting, where parents addressed Superintendent Jason Harper and board members about making masks optional for students this coming school year. The Illinois Department of Public Health recently adopted guidance from the CDC that states masks should be worn in schools by all individuals ages 2 and older who are not fully vaccinated against COVID-19. The CDC also recommends maintaining at least 3 feet of physical distance between students within classrooms.

"I'm representing a lo-

cal group here in Rochelle that includes around 250 like-minded individuals," said Jackie Ramsey, an instructional support teacher at Rochelle Middle School. "Our main goal is to urge optional masking during the fall that shouldn't be dependent upon vaccine eligibility... These are personal decisions that should be made by the parents."

District 231 did not take any action regarding mask policies for the upcoming school year. Harper said the board and school administrators are still awaiting additional guidance from IDPH and the Illinois State Board of Education before potentially making a decision next month.

"We've had a rollout from the state level that's been fumbled from the start," Harper said. "What we've been told from the IDPH and the Ogle County Health Department is that we're due to receive new guidance, hopefully this week. We're not taking any action tonight, but time is

at a premium right now because we need to get ready for school to start in about four weeks or so."

The adopted guidance includes screening, testing, ventilation, handwashing and respiratory etiquette, staying home

when sick and getting tested, contact tracing in combination with quarantine and isolation and cleaning and disinfection to keep schools safe. Additionally, the guidance emphasizes implementing layered prevention strate-

gies (masking, distancing, testing) to protect people who are not fully vaccinated, particularly children ages 12 and under.

District 231 will hold its next meeting at Lincoln School on Tuesday, Aug. 10 at 7 p.m.

Hillcrest board votes to sell police car

Trustees receive update on infrastructure projects

HILLCREST — Hillcrest trustees received an update on infrastructure projects during their monthly board meeting Wednesday evening. Trustees also approved an ordinance permitting the sale of the old police car and scheduled a special meeting on the new fiscal year budget.

Baxter & Woodman's Carl Fischer said the new village generator is scheduled to be shipped from its factory on Aug. 2 and Engel Electric Company has the equipment

to install the generator in a storage facility. Fischer said the village has received about \$36,000 from DCEO, which leaves about \$40,000 remaining in grant funding for the project. The new generator will power the village water system and serve as a backup power source for the village hall building.

Fischer also updated the village on its water, sewer and roadway improvement project. Fischer said Baxter & Woodman began design work on July 8 and the company plans

to submit the design work to the Illinois EPA on Oct. 6. Fischer said surveyors arrived in Hillcrest on July 12 to begin work and surveyors will return to the village during the week of July 26 to finish.

Fischer said Baxter & Woodman is still seeking grant funding to help fund the infrastructure projects. Fischer said Baxter & Woodman will advertise for bids on the Priority 1A water main improvement project and the shallow well construction project in October 2022. Should

the village qualify for bypass funding from the IEPA, Fischer said the schedule will be revised.

New president

Former Hillcrest Trustee and President Pro Tem Randy Salsbury was named acting president of the village board on Wednesday. Former Village President Jason Fore appointed Salsbury as president pro tem before resigning from the village board this past month. Salsbury, who will serve as acting president for the

remainder of Fore's term, resigned from his position as trustee, meaning the village board will now have a vacancy to fill by appointment.

Other items

Village trustees approved an ordinance allowing for the sale of the 2009 Dodge Charger that was once the village police car. Trustees also approved a date for a special meeting on the new fiscal year budget. The meeting will take place at on Wednesday, Aug. 25 at 6:30 p.m.

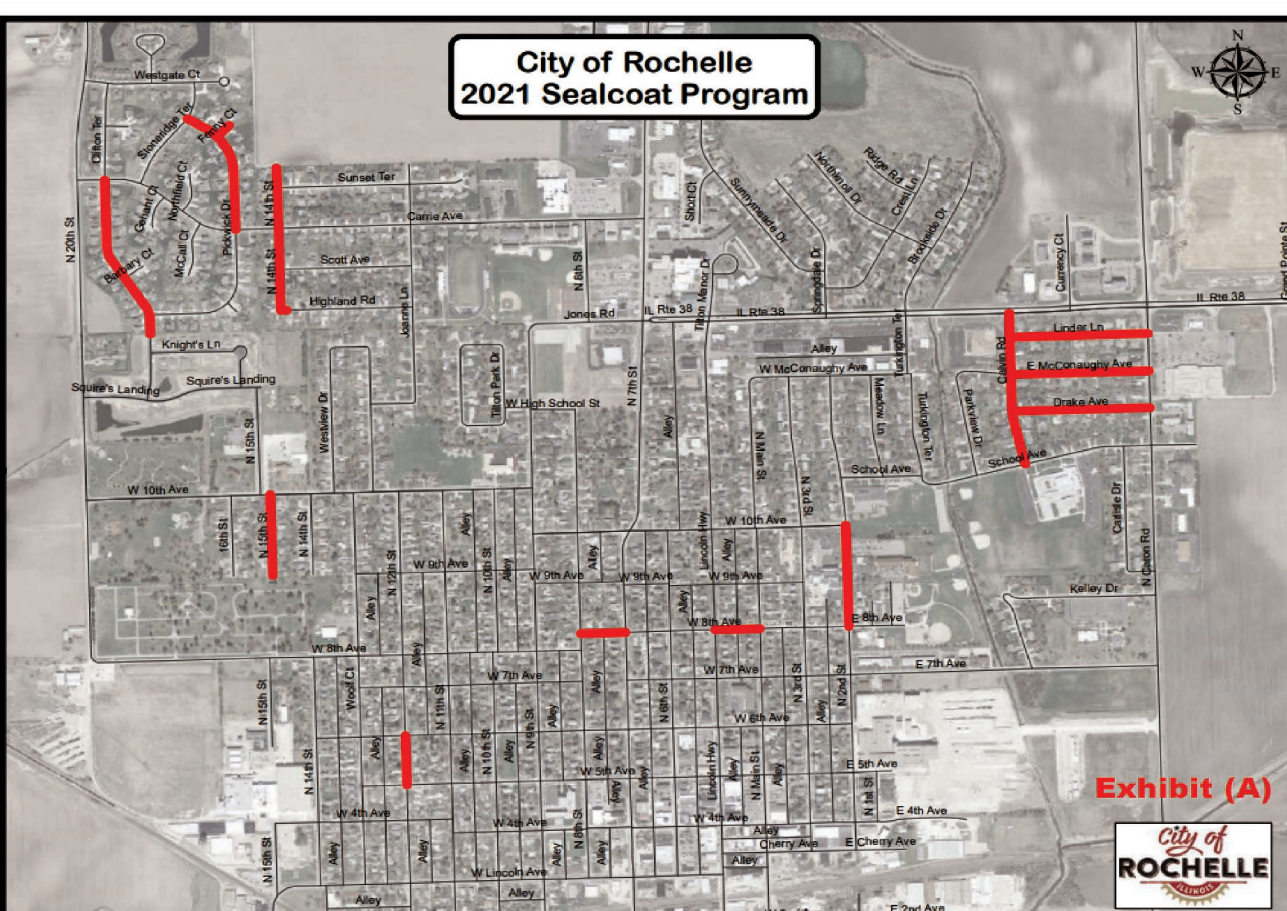

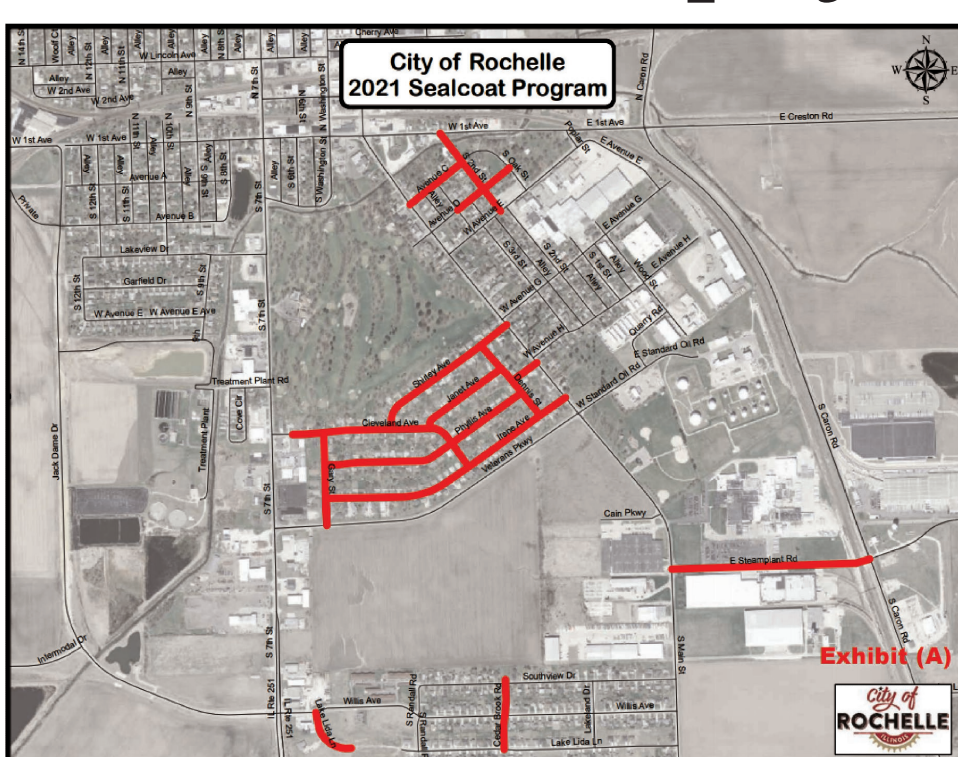

IDPH adopts CDC guidance for schools

SPRINGFIELD – The Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) is fully adopting the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) updated guidance for COVID-19 Prevention in K-12 Schools released Friday.

“Our goal is to protect the health of students, teachers, and staff so that in-person learning can resume as safely as possible,” IDPH Director Dr. Ngozi Ezike said in a press release. “The CDC is right: vaccination is the best preventive strategy. As school board members, parents, teachers

boards, parents, teachers and superintendents plan for a return to in-person learning in the fall, we strongly encourage those who are not vaccinated to continue to mask. IDPH is proud to fully adopt school guidance issued by CDC, which is based on the latest scientific information about COVID-19.”

The updated school guidance now aligns with guidance for fully-vaccinated people, which allows activities to resume for fully-vaccinated people without wearing a mask except where required by federal, state, and local rules and regulations.


Major elements of the updated guidance include: Masks should be worn indoors by all individuals (age 2 and older) who are not fully-vaccinated. The CDC recommends schools maintain at least three feet of physical distance between students within classrooms, combined with indoor mask wearing by people who are not fully-vaccinated, to reduce transmission risk.

and disinfection are also important layers of the plan to keep schools safe. Many schools serve children under the age of 12 who are not eligible for vaccination at this time. Therefore, this guidance emphasizes implementing layered prevention strategies (masking, distancing, testing) to protect people who are not fully-vaccinated.

Schools and communities should monitor community transmission of COVID-19, vaccination coverage, screening testing and outbreaks to guide decisions about on the level of layered prevention strategies being implemented, the press release said.

State Superintendent of Education Dr. Carmen I. Ayala issued the following declaration mandating in-person learning with limited exceptions:

Beginning with the 2021-22 school year, all schools must resume fully in-person learning for all student attendance days, provided that, pursuant to 105 ILCS 5/10-30 and 105 ILCS 5/34-18.66, remote instruction be made available for students who have not received a COVID-19 vaccine or who are not eligible for a COVID-19 vaccine, only while they are under



quarantine consistent with guidance or requirements from a local public health department or the Illinois Department of Public Health

“All our students deserve to return safely in-person to schools this fall,” Ayala said. “With vaccination rates continually rising and unprecedented federal funding to support safe in-person learning, and mitigations such as contact tracing and increased ventilation in place in schools, we are fully confident in the safety of in-person learning this fall. We look forward to a great school year and to the energy of Illinois’ young minds once again filling our school buildings.”

EMBALMING PROCESS

The embalming process essentially involves replacing the blood and other bodily fluids with a preservative such as formaldehyde. Embalming is required by law only under certain circumstances, but families that intend to have a public viewing of the body usually choose to have it done, embalming preservative powers give them more leeway in scheduling a funeral. Embalmers are adept at restoring natural features that have been injured or to people who die after a long illness. They have a range of techniques to deal with various difficulties. They can replace missing hair, rebuild fractured features, or disguise the effects of



the drastic weight loss from a long, wasting illness. Before it is placed in the casket, the body is dressed and prepared for viewing. Hair is shampooed and set, and men get a shave. Families are sometimes encouraged to bring in a recent photograph of the deceased to help guide them.

Salmonella outbreak linked to BrightFarms

ROCHELLE — The CDC and IDPH have linked a multi-state Salmonella outbreak to BrightFarms brand Sunny Crunch salad produced in Rochelle.

Any BrightFarms brand Sunny Crunch salad produced in Rochelle should not be eaten and should be thrown out, even if some of it was eaten and no one has gotten sick. Surfaces and containers that may have touched the contaminated products should be washed using hot and soapy water.

Salmonella symptoms usually appear 6-to-72

hours after being exposed to the bacteria which include: diarrhea, fever, abdominal cramps, headache, muscle aches, vomiting, chills, dehydration and nausea.

If you have developed symptoms of Salmonella after eating BrightFarms brand Sunny Crunch salad, please contact your health care provider or local health department. If you are exhibiting any of these symptoms and work in food service, health care, or child care do not report to work and contact your health care provider.

When we're going through a test, it's easy to forget we have a Savior who took on human form. He suffered the same trials and temptations that we face and He understands what you're going through

today.

While He doesn't promise to take away all of your problems, if you invite Him into your life, He will redeem them and do something good through them. In fact, God takes what the world would throw away and turns it into something beautiful. He promises to give us His "beauty instead of ashes... joy instead of mourning, and a garment of praise instead of a spirit of despair" (Isaiah 61:3 NIV)

A problem and an opportunity

IN 1850 Miles Braiden moved to Lane (Rochelle). Miles was successful in several business ventures but really made his mark in the 1870s. Miles entered the lumber and coal business and became a leader in the growth of Rochelle (Lane became Rochelle in 1865).

Miles also bought Stewarts quarry and stepped up the production of limestone for construction. Mr. Braiden also purchased the Budlong and Miller Brewery in 1867, razed the building, and harvested the limestone. The quarry expanded and became deeper.

Unfortunately the fresh water spring still existed and continually filled the quarry. This offered both a problem and an opportunity. Braiden seized on the opportunity.

In the summer he pumped out the water and mined the limestone for construction of basements. In the fall he let the quarry flood and harvested ice for home iceboxes. For the next fifty years life was good. In the 1920s cement blocks became the preferred method for building basement walls, limestone sales plummeted. Compressors for refrigeration became smaller and smaller, making indoor refrigerators a reality, ice sales plummeted.

By 1920 the quarry was allowed to fill with water and became a small lake. Mr. Braiden passed and the lake came under the control of Clara, his widow. "Lake Clara" became the unofficial swimming hole for the community. It was in 1924 that the City purchased the property from Clara for \$2,000. The press to create a swimming facility from an abandoned quarry began.

The citizens of Rochelle quickly erected a bath house, slide and diving platform on the east side of the lake toward the south end. The lake saw a name change. Lake Clara became Spring Lake. The first

life guard, Melchor Walters, was hired in 1928. 1928 also saw the construction of two fountains in the shallow portion of the lake. One was donated by D. W. Taylor and the other was donated by The American Legion. The fountains had three steps, a large light on top and sprayed water over the whole of the fountain.

In 1929 construction of the new lake boomed. The lake was drained and vast improvements were made. Concrete retaining walls were constructed on the

North, East, and West sides of the shallow portions of the lake. Fences were erected to separate the shallow areas from the deeper waters. Piers, diving boards, a three-story stucco bathhouse and a slide that ran all the way to the third floor of the bathhouse appeared. A large stairway was erected on the West side of the lake to welcome people to Spring Lake. A waterfall was added in 1935.

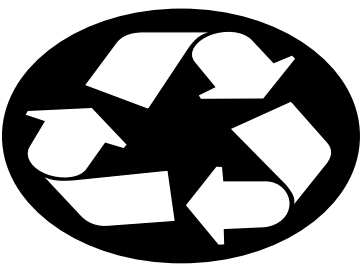
Once Spring Lake opened the crowds came, 300 people a day was the norm. In 1936 an estimated 2500 people attended Spring Lake on one day, so many that the police had to ask people to move their cars that were parked along 7th St. as they were blocking traffic. Through it's history Spring Lake has seen tragedy, eight people have lost their life at the lake. One was killed while harvesting limestone in 1866 when part of the wall collapsed on him. Seven have drowned, the youngest was four and the oldest sixty-six.

Almost everyone who grew up in the 1930s through the 1970s has a story about Spring Lake. Whether it's about the fish nibbling their toes or how cold the water was during swim lessons Spring Lake lives in their hearts.

Can we focus on climate change, which is already starting to devastate parts of this country and world? Can we focus on clean energy? An infrastructure plan? A living wage for people? Attacking the national debt? Those things actually matter.

Instead, the yelling and blame shifting continue unabated. We are watching the country come apart at the seams, and we are doing nothing about it.

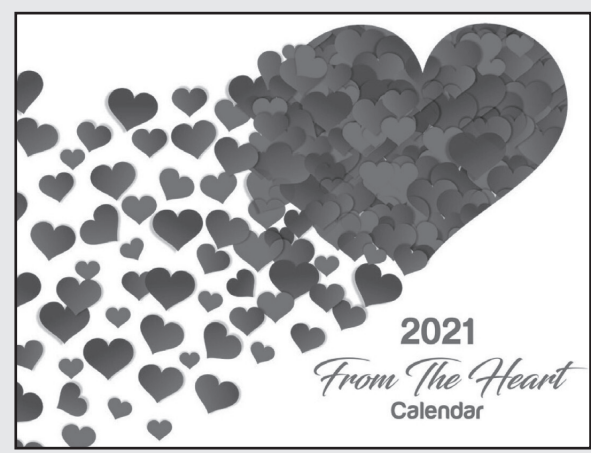

They are hoping to have a grand opening in the coming weeks, so watch for more information about that.

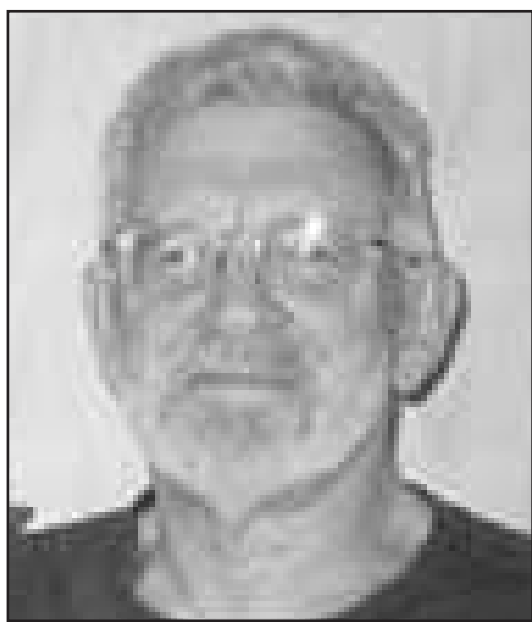

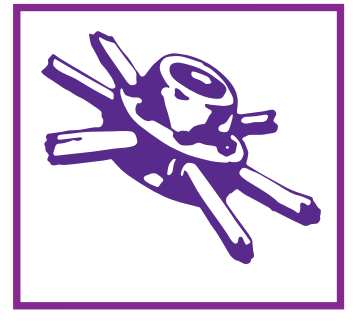

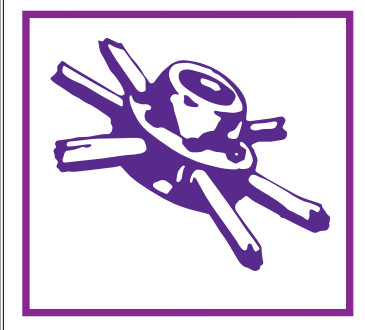

Rochelle takes down Freeport to reach District 19 Championship finals

ROCHELLE — A sixth-inning surge propelled the Rochelle Little League 12U Baseball All-Stars to a first-round victory over Rock Falls in the Illinois Little League District 19 Championship tournament. After five scoreless frames to start the matchup, Rochelle rallied for four runs in the top of the sixth inning before shutting Rock Falls down in the bottom half to win 4-0.

Andrew Huerta reached on an error in the top of the fourth inning, while Schweitzer and Tourdot both drew walks to load the bases. But a clutch strikeout from Rock Falls left three Rochelle runners on base. Eyster walked in the fifth inning before a strikeout ended the frame. Cunningham and Hall

began Rochelle's sixth-inning rally with back-to-back walks to put two runners on base. Tourdot walked to load the bases for Hunley, who delivered a two-RBI single to left field for Rochelle's first hit of the game. Cunningham and Hall scored to give Rochelle a 2-0 lead before Rochelle loaded the bases a second time on a single from Angel Argueta. Eyster drew a bases-loaded walk to put Rochelle up 3-0 before Hunley scored on a wild pitch.

Freeport

The Rochelle Little League 12U Baseball All-Stars recorded their second consecutive shut-out on Thursday to open the Illinois Little League District 19 Championship tournament. Rochelle cruised over Freeport 12-0 in the semifinals to clinch a spot in the finals.

Warren Schweitzer started on the mound for Rochelle, throwing one and two-thirds innings while striking out three batters and allowing only one hit. Andrew Eyster entered in relief, tossing two innings with five strikeouts and one hit allowed. Jonathan Andrist recorded the final out in the semifinal matchup, striking out one batter to seal the Rochelle victory.

Rochelle took the early lead, scoring three runs in the top of the first inning. Trenton Cunningham drilled a two-RBI single to left that scored Eyster and Johnny Chadwick, who each walked to start the frame. Cunningham then scored on an error to make it a 3-0 game.

An Ordinance authorizing the issuance of Electric Revenue Bonds of the City of Rochelle, Ogle and Lee Counties, Illinois, in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$18,000,000, or in lieu thereof, General Obligation Bonds (Electric System Alternate Revenue Source) in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$18,000,000 for the purpose of paying the costs of improving the electric system of the City.

Whereas, the City of Rochelle, Ogle and Lee Counties, Illinois (the "City"), is a duly organized and existing municipality incorporated and existing under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois, and is now operating under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended (the "Code"), and for many years has owned and operated a municipally-owned electric system (the "Electric System") pursuant to the provisions of Division 117 of Article 11 of the Code as set forth in Division 119 of Article 11 of the Code; and Whereas, the Council of the City (the "Council") has heretofore determined and does hereby determine that it is advisable, necessary and in the best interests of the public health, safety and welfare to improve the Electric System of the City, and including, in connection with said improvements, all land or rights in land, mechanical, electrical and other services necessary, useful or advisable to the improvements, and, incidental to such improvements, to pay bond discount, bond interest, bond reserve account funding, legal, financing, and administrative expense (all of which may be referred to as the "Project"), all in accordance with the plans and specifications and estimates of costs heretofore approved by the Council and now on file in the office of the City Clerk; and Whereas, the total estimated costs of the Project, as defined, will not exceed \$18,000,000, and there are insufficient funds on hand and lawfully available to pay such costs; and Whereas, it is necessary and for the best interests of the City that the Project be undertaken and, in order to finance the cost of the Project it will be necessary for the City to issue up to \$18,000,000 bonds payable from the revenues derived from the operation of the Electric System as authorized to be issued at this time pursuant to Division 119 of Article 11 of the Code (the "Revenue Bonds"), or in lieu thereof, up to \$18,000,000 alternate bonds (the "Alternate Bonds") being bonds

payable from the net revenues of the Electric System (the "Pledged Revenues") as authorized to be issued at this time pursuant to the Local Government Debt Reform Act of the State of Illinois, as amended (the "Act"); and Whereas, if the above-mentioned revenue source is insufficient to pay the Alternate Bonds, ad valorem property taxes upon all taxable property in the City without limitation as to rate or amount are authorized to be extended to pay the principal of and interest on the Alternate Bonds: Now Therefore It Is Hereby Ordained by the Council of the City of Rochelle, Ogle and Lee Counties, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. Incorporation of Preambles. The Council hereby finds that all of the recitals contained in the preambles to this ordinance are true, correct and complete and does incorporate them into this ordinance by this reference.

Section 2. Declaration of Intent. The Council hereby declares its intention to avail of the provisions of the Code and the Act and to issue Alternate Bonds in the aggregate amount of not to exceed \$18,000,000 for the purpose of paying the costs of the Project.

Section 3. Determination to Issue Bonds. It is necessary and in the best interests of the City to construct the Project for the public health, safety and welfare, in accordance with the estimate of costs as hereinabove described, and that for such purpose, there are hereby authorized to be issued and sold the Revenue Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$18,000,000.

Section 4. Publication. This Ordinance, together with a notice in the statutory form (the "Notice"), shall be published once within ten (10) days after passage hereof by the Council in the Rochelle NewsLeader, being a newspaper of general circulation in the City, and if not petition signed by 355 electors of the City (being equal to the greater of (i) 7.5% of the registered voters in the City or (ii) 200 of those registered voters or 15% of those registered voters, whichever is less) asking that the issuance of the Alternate Bonds be submitted to referendum is filed with the City Clerk within thirty (30) days after the date of the publication of this Ordinance and the Notice, then the Alternate Bonds shall be authorized to be issued.

Section 5. Additional Ordinances. If no petition with respect to the issue

of the Alternate Bonds and meeting the requirements of applicable law is filed during the petition period hereinabove referred to, then the Council may adopt additional ordinances or proceedings supplementing or amending this ordinance providing for the issuance and sale of the Alternate Bonds, and prescribing all the details of such Alternate Bonds, so long as the maximum aggregate principal amount of the Alternate Bonds as set forth in this ordinance is not exceeded, and there is no material change in the Project. Such additional ordinances or proceedings shall in all instances become effective in accordance with applicable law. This Ordinance, together with such additional ordinances or proceedings, shall constitute complete authority for the City to issue the Revenue Bonds, or, in lieu thereof, the Alternate Bonds, under applicable law.

Section 6. Reimbursement. None of the proceeds of the Revenue Bonds or the Alternate Bonds issued in lieu thereof will be used to pay, directly or indirectly, in whole or in part, for an expenditure that has been paid by the City prior to the date hereof except architectural or engineering costs incurred prior to commencement of the Project or expenditures for which an intent to reimburse it as properly declared under Treasury Regulations Section 1.103-18. This Ordinance is in itself a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulations Section 1.103-18 as to all costs of the Project paid within 60 days prior to the date hereof or on any date after the date hereof and prior to issuance of the Revenue Bonds or, in lieu thereof, the Alternate Bonds.

Section 7. Severability. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the other provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 8. Superseder and Effective Date. All ordinances, resolutions or orders, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are to the extent of such conflict hereby superseded, and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect forthwith upon its adoption and approval, as provided by law. 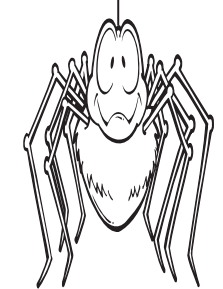
