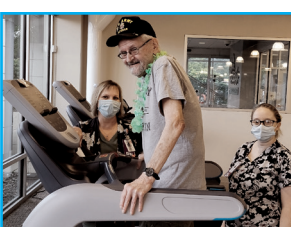

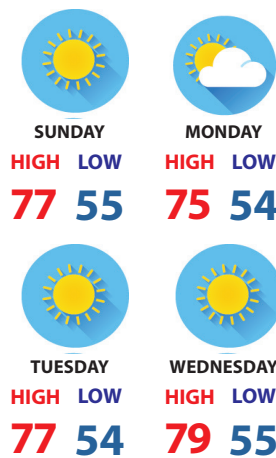

Decommission plans submitted

Byron nuclear plant currently set to close in September

BYRON — Exelon Generation, owner and operator of the Byron and Dresden nuclear energy facilities, filed Post Shutdown Decommissioning Activity Reports (PSDARs) on July 28 with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, detailing long-term site restoration plans for both stations after they shut down this fall.

The filings are among the final steps in retiring the plants, which face revenue shortfalls in the hundreds of millions of dollars due to low energy prices and market policies that give fossil fuel plants an unfair competitive advantage. Absent a legislative solution, these same market inequities will force the company to close its Braidwood and LaSalle nuclear facilities sometime in the next few years.

“It’s disappointing Exelon is being forced to complete the regulatory procedures for deactivating the Byron and Dresden stations,” said Erin Folk, executive director of the Oregon Park District and part of FAIR-COM (Fair Assessment

Information Resource Committee). “Closing the Byron and Dresden stations will be devastat-

ing to our communities, residents, taxing bodies and our economy. The next 30 days are crucial. We

need legislators from both parties to reconvene and work together to pass an energy bill that includes

the continued operation of Illinois’ nuclear fleet.”

RCH partners with park district

‘What the REC is all about aligns with our wellness approach’

ROCHELLE — The board of trustees at Rochelle Community Hospital announced a new partnership with the Flagg-Rochelle Community Park District in support of the new REC Center this week.

RCH committed \$400,000 to a 20-year marketing sponsorship at The REC, which will be paid out to the park district over a period of seven years. The hospital will be the sole and exclusive healthcare provider advertising at The REC.

“RCH always strives to improve the health of our community and this partnership with the REC Center will support healthier lives throughout Rochelle,” a press release said.

RCH CEO Gregg Olson said after the development of The REC, the hospital thought it made sense to partner with the facility and park district.

“We obviously take care

of the sick and injured, but we feel we have a role in the community to provide wellness opportunities,” Olson said. “What the REC is all about aligns with our wellness approach. We felt strongly about being a partner.”

Olson said initially the partnership is only a marketing sponsorship. There will be signage with information on services the hospital offers. What may come later is a relationship

with hospital programming at The REC, Olson said.

“We’re talking to them about certain programs at that location,” Olson said. “It’s a possibility. There’s rules we have to abide by with hospital licensure and billing. It gets complicated. For example, aquatic therapy, that might be an opportunity to pursue. I think everything is on the table.”

Olson said the marketing sponsorship will yield

an awareness campaign for the hospital and its services. He’s excited about the opportunity and said “a lot of” other companies have opted to advertise at The REC.

Any time you can get your name out there in front of an audience, it’s a good thing to do,” Olson said. “And educating people on different services we offer here. A lot of times people don’t know all that we do. It’s making folks aware.”

Olson believes The REC offers “an awful lot” to the community and believes it will be a magnet for Rochelle and the area.

“Bringing different things like tournaments and an array of services to town,” Olson said. “It’s all related to wellness and driving towards a healthier community. We think they’ll be incredibly successful. We should all be proud of what they’ve done.”

Syngenta Seeds breaks ground on new facility

Construction on research and development center to be completed next fall

ROCHELLE — Syngenta Seeds broke ground on a research and development innovation center earlier this summer on Illinois 38 between Creston and Malta, a press release said.

Farmers and local officials participated in the ceremony and formally kicked off construction of the facility that will be 88-acres and nearly 100,000 square feet. The project was announced in August 2020 and will

serve as the home base for Syngenta Seeds' U.S. research and development.

"Located in the heart of the U.S. Corn Belt, the center will strengthen Syngenta's connections and collaborations with farmers," a Syngenta press release said. "The DeKalb County location, about one hour west of Syngenta's global and North America Seeds headquarters in Downers Grove, will also facilitate collaborations with the broader agriculture industry."

According to Syngen-

ta's site, its ambition is to help safely feed the world and take care of the planet and improve the sustainability, quality and safety of agriculture. It employs 28,000 people in more than 90 countries.

The facility will "supplement" the work of Syngenta's over 5,000 R&D employees. Construction is expected to be completed by fall 2022 and open by the end of 2022.

Syngenta said the site was selected for its location, soil type and accessibility, and will provide

facilities for large-scale events and engagement with growers on corn and soybean technology and innovation.

"This new site will enable us to accelerate our innovation in Seeds R&D while strengthening our focus on delivering new capabilities through investments in breeding and digital technologies," Trevor Hohls, Syngenta global head of seeds development, said in a press release. "This is a strong statement of our commitment to innovation and

providing our scientists with the resources to bring the best products and technologies to solve the key problems that growers face."

The facility will also spotlight how Syngenta is transforming product development through on-farm collaboration with growers, a press release said.

"I'm really excited about this strategic investment and how it will bring us even closer to the center of the US seeds market, as well as providing access to

world-leading agriculture and digital talent in the Midwest," Justin Wolfe, Syngenta regional director of seeds North America, said in a press release. "We're committed to US farmers, and this site will allow us to collaborate even more with our customers."

Syngenta also has a global innovation center in Research Triangle Park, North Carolina and the company opened a new \$30 million Trait Conversion Accelerator in Nampa, Idaho in recent years.

CHILDREN WILL BE CHILDREN

When families gather after a death, one characteristic seems to hold true: however somber the adults may be, young children, after a while, cannot resist the urge to scamper around, play and, in general, act like children.

That's because they are children, and their reactions to grief don't match those of adults. That doesn't mean children don't feel grief or know that something sad or final or tragic has occurred. Children are highly attuned to the emotions of the people around them, but they grieve in their own way, and it's important that adults recognize a child's need for honesty, love, and reassurance when death occurs.

Sometimes adult's



preoccupation with grief prevents them from seeing that a child's reaction to death is just as deep as theirs - even though it may be expressed differently, depending on the child's age and stage of emotional development.

In June, The Illinois Senate failed to come up with a Clean Energy Bill, with environmentalists and labor leaders far apart on the negotiations.

With just weeks to go before the first of the plants permanently closes, policymakers continue working on legislation that would preserve all four of the plants as part of a comprehensive plan to maintain and grow clean-energy jobs, keep energy bills affordable and achieve net-zero emissions by 2050.

Exelon Generation announced on Aug. 27, 2020 that it intends to retire its Byron Generating Station and Dresden Generating Station in fall 2021.

Byron will close in Sept. 2021. That would mean not only the loss of about 700

jobs, but it will also mean the loss of millions of dollars in taxes locally.

Paul Dempsey, communications manager of the Byron station, said that the station's 2017 tax bill was more than \$38 million. The taxes went to a variety of taxing bodies, including the Byron School District, Ogle County and the Byron Museum and Library District.

Gov. JB Pritzker has called for legislation that includes nearly \$700 million in subsidies over five years for the nuclear plants.

With the PSDARs complete, Exelon Generation is now preparing to issue job reduction notifications to employees impacted by the plant shutdowns. Staffing at the plants will fall from nearly 1,500 employees when the plant retirements were announced last August, to just 30-40 employ-

ees over the next 10 years.

With just weeks to go before the first of the plants permanently closes, policymakers continue working on legislation that would preserve all four of the plants as part of a comprehensive plan to maintain and grow clean-energy jobs, keep energy bills affordable and achieve net-zero emissions by 2050.

The Chicago-area plants support 28,000 direct and indirect jobs and contribute \$3.5 billion annually to Illinois' economy.

Closing the two plants will have the immediate environmental impact equivalent to putting 4.4 million additional cars on the road, emitting carbon and other harmful sources of air pollution.

field, we have no choice but to take these final steps in preparation for shutting down the plants," Exelon Generation Chief Nuclear Officer Dave Rhoades said. "We will never stop fighting for policies to preserve Illinois' nuclear fleet, knowing that the minute these plants close our customers will experience dirtier air and higher energy costs. But with time running out, we must plan for the future and do everything we can to prepare our employees and the communities they serve for what lies ahead."

As part of the decommissioning process, Exelon

Generation has up to 60 years to restore Byron and Dresden, which includes transporting the stations' used fuel to long-term storage, decontaminating and removing plant components and razing the remaining buildings.

PJM, the regional grid operator, has confirmed that both plants can retire without putting overall grid reliability at risk. However, the massive loss of in-state clean generation means Illinois will have to rely more on fossil energy located in environmental justice communities and in surrounding states to

meet the needs of Illinois homes and businesses. Increased production from fossil plants will increase carbon and other harmful emissions and force Illinois consumers to support jobs in other states through their energy bills.

The PSDAR filing with the NRC is one of the few remaining regulatory milestones required before closing the plants. Byron is scheduled to shut down in September and Dresden in November.

Shop local

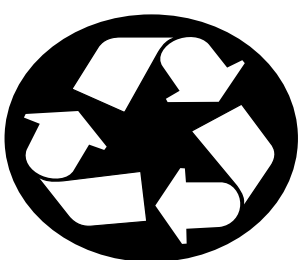

Romantic relationships between reporters and sources

I read an obituary in the New York Times last week that dealt with an issue newspapers and other media outlets haven't yet fully come to terms with: romantic relationships between reporters and sources.

The Times had this to say: "Laura Foreman, a reporter for The Philadelphia Inquirer in the 1970s, was surely not the first journalist to become romantically involved with a source. But she was among the first to have that romance, with a powerful politician, blow up into a public scandal."

By the time the affair was disclosed — and The Inquirer learned that the politician had given her more than \$20,000 worth of gifts, including jewelry, furniture and a fur coat and helped her buy a 1964 Morgan sports car — she was working in the Washington bureau of The New York Times.

The Times fired her — for her conduct at her previous employer.

And her journalism career came to an end at the ripe age of 34.

Longtime Times editor Abe Rosenthal said of the matter he didn't care if his reporters were having sex with elephants — as long as they weren't covering the circus.

In my 33 years in journalism, I've seen this scenario play out a lot of different ways. Ok, not the elephant sex — but reporters dating sources.

I don't have an easy answer. But I can tell you it's a subject that makes a lot of people in the business uncomfortable.

"You really can't tell somebody they can't have a relationship — everyone has a right to a private life," Gary Sawyer, an assistant professor of journalism at Iowa State University said.

His view was echoed by Jill Geisler, an expert in newsroom management at Loyola University in Chicago.

"When this comes up, you have to move the reporter off of their beat," she said. "What you hope is that you have a transparent enough organization that the reporter will willingly

come forward and have a clear-eyed perception of what this could mean for the news organization."

Shortly after I left the Las Vegas Sun in 1999, one of the best reporters I've ever worked with was fired after the editor received an anonymous letter claiming she was romantically involved with a source. (I don't believe the assertion, but the editor fired her claiming even an appearance of impropriety needed to be dealt with.)

I can't help but wonder if a male reporter — or a senior member of management — would be held to that nebulous standard.

On the other hand, many years ago when I was a reporter in Iowa the person covering courts pursued, dated, married — and divorced — a prosecutor. And she covered his trials through each step of the relationship.

If I were a defendant on trial, I doubt that I'd be reassured that the watchdog was sleeping with the opposition.

"I think it's fair to tell a reporter who is dating a member of the county board that she won't be covering county board meetings," said Charles Wheeler III, an emeritus journalism professor at the University of Illinois-Springfield.

But longtime journalist and state government observer Mike Lawrence added with smaller news staffs it is more difficult today for reporters to recuse themselves from areas where they may have a potential conflict of interest.

Beginning in 1993, Springfield Associated Press Bureau Chief Terry Mutchler had a five-year same-sex romantic relationship with state Sen. Penny Severns, a rising star within the Democratic Party. Within six weeks of meeting, they were living together.

"What I did was unethical because it was a conflict of interest and it violated the trust readers place in those who report the news," she said. "In a perfect world, I should have disclosed the relationship to my superiors — but I couldn't," Mutchler said during a telephone interview on

Monday.

She said part of the risk of being open about the conflict of interest with her superiors at the AP was that she would have been "outing" Severns and she feared her organization's leadership may have felt compelled to report it as news.

"In Central Illinois, during that era, it would have really hurt her politically. And it certainly would have hurt my journalism career as well," she said.

After Severns died of breast cancer, Mutchler was referred to as a "family member" in news stories about the senator's death. The news stories were written by fellow state-house reporter, which would indicate the romance was not as stealth as Mutchler and Severns thought.

That, of course, begs the question: Why was the relationship alluded to in news stories postmortem but not before? After all, if it was newsworthy after someone died wasn't it even more relevant when both parties were alive and the conflict of interest was immediate?

Mutchler said at times she pulled some punches when covering her partner.

"Sometimes I would write something that would really irritate Penny. Other times, I would try to cast her in a better light," she said.

For example, when other journalists reported that Severns was "convalescing," Mutchler reported that she was "alert and answering questions."

Lawrence said disclosure is the key. He said it's important for readers or viewers to be aware of potential conflicts. And for this reason, news organizations must strive for transparency.

Wheeler added, "At the end of the day, an editor has to look at a journalist's work and see if they are being fair. Because people have work lives and private lives and some individuals are able to successfully separate the two."

RMU begins cross connection survey

ROCHELLE—The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) requires that all water systems in the State of Illinois have an effective cross connection control program. Cross connections within the public water supply are a serious concern, as they can allow contaminants or pollutants to enter the public water system through what is called “backflow.” Backflow occurs when a drop in water pressure causes your water to flow in the opposite direction.

This can allow contaminated or polluted water to flow back into your drinking water. Given IEPA regulations and the dangers that exist from unprotected cross connections, it is necessary to establish and maintain an effective cross connection control program to protect both the integrity of the City of Rochelle’s water supply as well as protect the water

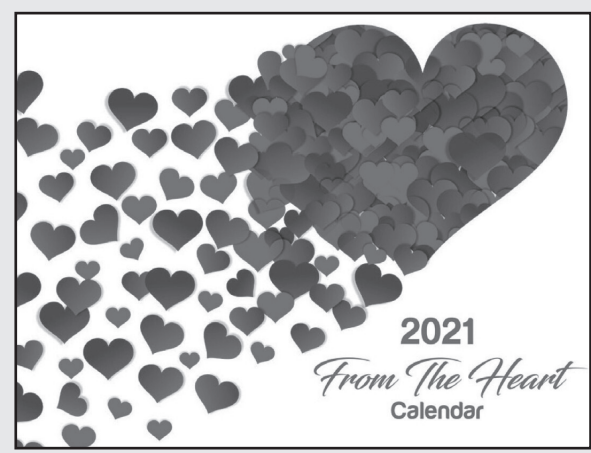

customers.

One necessary component in this program is a survey of the water system to determine where cross connections exist. A survey is being included with all of the Rochelle Municipal Utilities December utility bills. RMU is requesting customers complete and submit the survey to RMU.

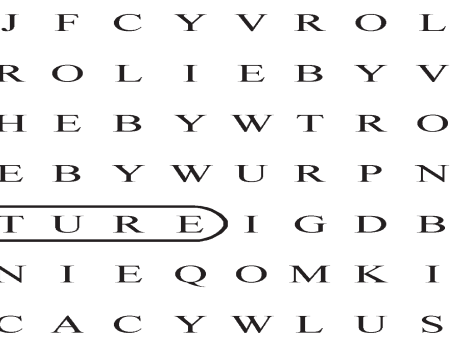

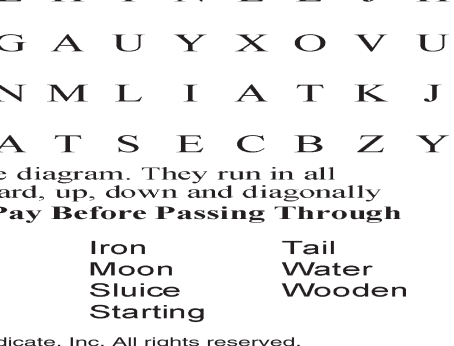

Auman: 'We're trending in the wrong direction'

Schools without masks could be 'a perfect storm for a bad situation.'

ROCHELLE—Ogle County had eight new COVID-19 cases on Tuesday, July 27, the most it's seen in a single day over the last "several months," Ogle County Health Department Public Administrator Kyle Auman said.

The county was recently placed in the category of substantial community transmission by the CDC. More than half of the state is in substantial or high transmission. Ogle County saw a small increase in COVID-19 activity last week and Auman said another increase was seen this week.

"We're trending in the wrong direction," Auman said. "Locally and in the state. The CDC suggests masks for all individuals when out in public when you're in that substantial transmission category. It's a little concerning. Especially with as well as we were doing. We're trying to communicate that all preventative measures should be taken to curb this."

The county sent out a press release Thursday "strongly recom-

mending" everyone, regardless of vaccination status, wear a mask while indoors of areas of substantial or high COVID-19 transmission and recommended public places and employers require universal indoor masking.

The recommendation was based on increasing cases of 51 per 100,000, and an increasing positivity rate of 4.26 percent and declining ICU availability in the region.

"The pandemic is not over and we must continue to be vigilant in our individual behaviors and our collective behaviors as a community," the press release said.

Ogle County residents as a whole are just over 40 percent fully-vaccinated. Auman said other than vaccinations, the county has to use all the mitigations at its disposal to curb spread. That includes masking, which he called a "challenging and contentious" issue.

The OCHD is "certainly concerned" about the Delta variant locally, Auman said. He said while it may not be prevalent in the county, things "aren't looking good" in other states with the variant that is said to

spread quicker.

"Demographics are changing to a younger population being hospitalized," Auman said. "It's unvaccinated people. The strength of that variant is causing hospitalizations. There's also been a lot of hospital activity locally recently."

Auman said the vaccination percentage in Ogle County is changing "ever so slowly." Appointments are still being offered three days a week at the OCHD and people can get vaccinated at Rochelle Community Hospital, KSB Hospital in Dixon, at Walmart and at pharmacies.

The OCHD is doing about 10-20 vaccinations three days a week, Auman said. The health department is still endeavoring to get vaccination messaging out.

"We're not seeing a large turnout currently," Auman said. "We need this to slow things down."

Auman believes there are still Ogle County residents on the fence about getting the COVID-19 vaccine. For the most part, he believes everyone who wants the vaccine has already received it.

Ogle County does have one of the highest youth vaccine rates in the state and is in the top 20 of all Illinois counties.

"We're making plans to go back into schools and do more vaccine clinics," Auman said. "That will help with the upcoming school year. We're waiting for vaccines to be approved for ages 6 and up and we hope that happens sometime this winter."

The OCHD is working with county schools to understand CDC and Illinois Department of Public Health COVID-19 guidance and providing its own. He said the three are "very closely aligned" and are recommending the same measures like masking, social distancing and staying home if sick.

Auman expressed concern about schools like Rochelle opting for optional or recommended masking for the upcoming school year.

"We understand that view, but schools doing that aren't necessarily following guidance," Auman said. "I think we'll see large rates of transmission if those things aren't followed. If masks are optional, there could be repercussions. High numbers of cases, potential hospitalizations and severe illness."

The uptick in county cases has Auman concerned with a return to school looming. He said the uptick was "earlier than expected."

Schools were the number one source of transmission of COVID-19 locally and statewide last year, Auman said.

"And that was with mitigations in place and not all of the kids in school," Auman said. "If we put them all back in without mitigations, it's a perfect storm for a bad situation."

School district superintendents have the "ultimate authority" when it comes to masking and mitigations in schools, Auman said. The OCHD can only make recommendations. If there were to be an outbreak, the OCHD would step in and work with the schools.

As far as a maskless return to school this fall, Auman said "we'll see what happens."

"I think they're in a tough spot," Auman said. "I don't know if I'd say they're flat out going against guidance, but they're trying to balance the thoughts of parents,

kids and guidance. We only have one chance to get this right."

Auman said for the county as a whole, he doesn't want to see masks required in public again by the governor's office. That isn't the direction he wants the county and state trending in. But, he said it could be a possibility. It depends on how residents react to recent COVID-19 upticks and developments.

He has some concern about whether another mask mandate would be adhered to by the public.

"I think everyone is kind of burnt out by COVID-19, our health department included," Auman said. "We're worked around the clock for the last 18 months. We understand people are frustrated."

"Unfortunately, those people that don't want to do anything to prevent the spread will be the ones that drive the outcome of the pandemic."

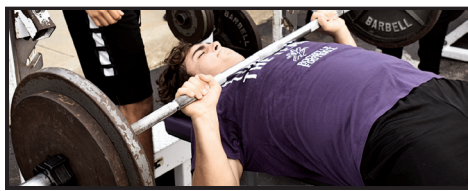

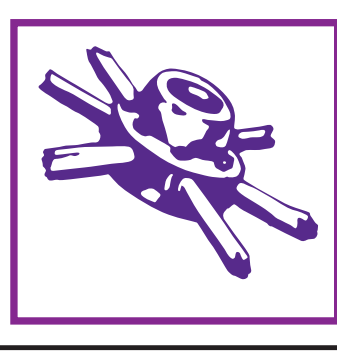

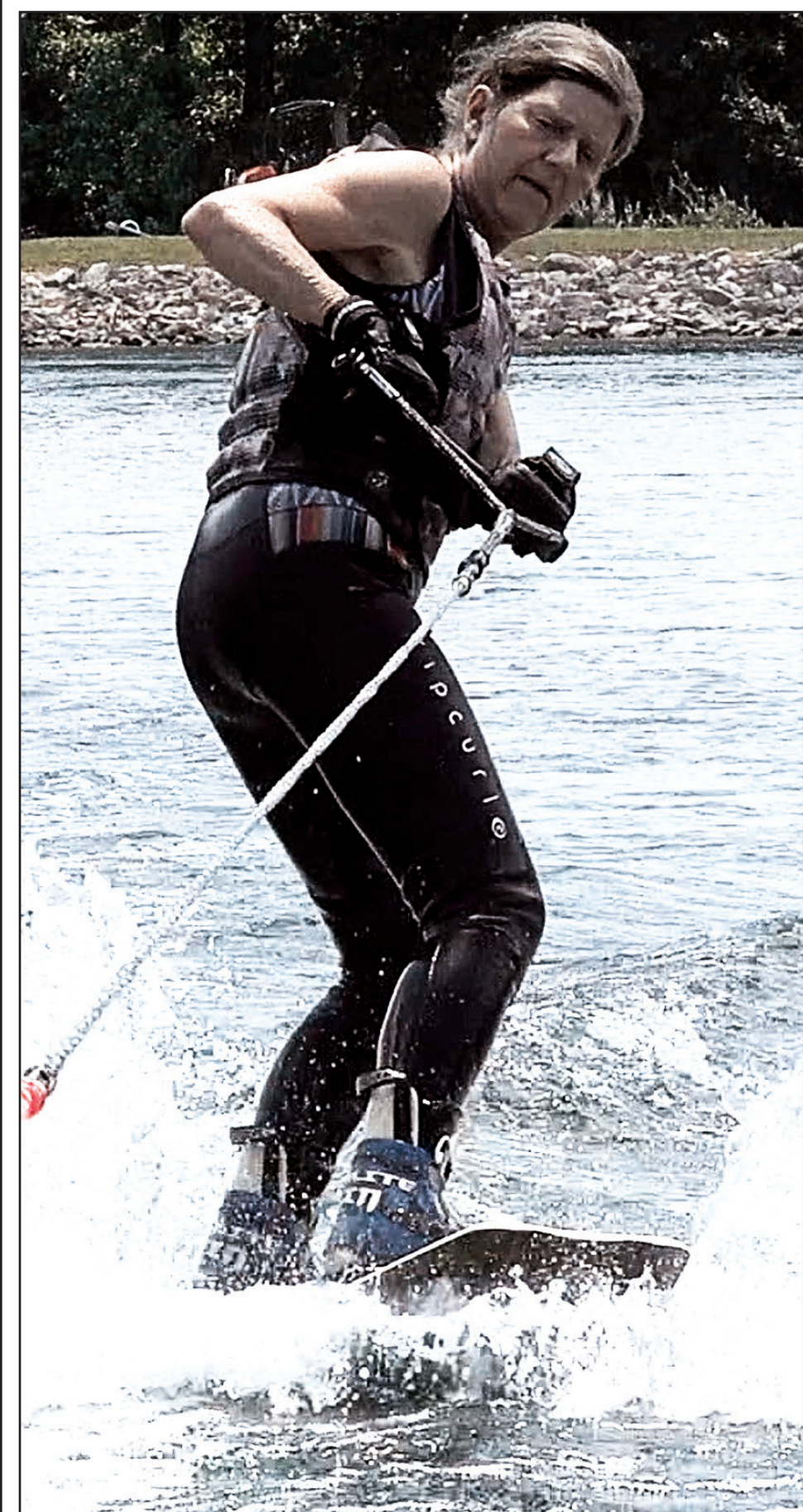

HOLLYWOOD — James Franco’s reputation for working tirelessly on many projects was well-known. But that all halted in 2017, when two female students, in an acting class he taught, accused him of coercing them to perform explicit sex scenes on camera. A court awarded them and class-action members who filed against Franco \$2,235,000. The two actresses divided \$1,341,000, and a fund was started for the other class-action members.

While Franco paid, he hasn’t formally admitted that anything inappropriate happened. “The Long Home,” produced, directed and starring Franco, with Josh Hutcherson, Timothy Hutton, Courtney Love, Ashton Kutcher and Josh Harnett, has sat in limbo since 2017, presumably waiting for this verdict. 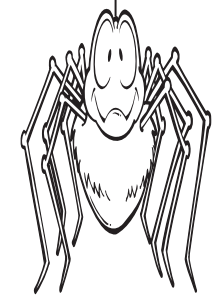
