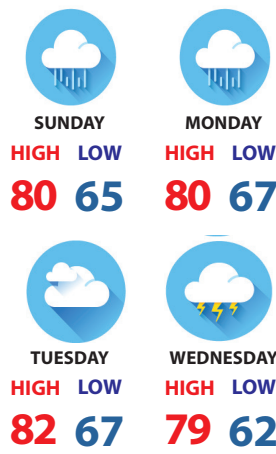

City working to facilitate daycare at May School

Operation would be run by outside director; city has been without daycare for months

ROCHELLE — Rochelle Mayor John Bearrows said this week that the city, with the help of Rochelle Township High School District #212, is endeavoring to utilize part of May School as a possible daycare facility.

The city has been without a daycare facility for months since Kishwaukee Family YMCA Child Care Center at 1010 N. 15th St. closed, while the school district made the decision this year to close May School due to declining enrollment.

Rochelle officials have made attempts to purchase YMCA property, but no agreements could be reached. Bearrows said the city has already

been in contact with a possible director if the May School operation comes to fruition and pointed out the city would not be buying May School as part of the proposed venture.

“We started many months ago when the daycare center closed,” Bearrows said. “We’ve made great progress. We have some financial commitments. We’re working with the school district to utilize the front part of May school to use as a daycare. It’s not ideal. We’ve jumped a lot of hurdles. We’re just trying to help financially. We’re doing the legwork.”

Bearrows said the city doesn’t want to be in the daycare business, but sees the need for it in town. He wants the rates to be

reasonable and said the potential director has said if the need is there, they would be willing to offer third shift care as well as during normal hours.

The director would hire employees and pay them. Bearrows said the city would try to assist with “carrying costs” and provide community development money.

“Because that’s what this is, community development,” Bearrows said. “The people who ask about bringing businesses here, daycare availability is one of their first questions. Not having a daycare is not acceptable. It’s a piece of the workforce issue that we’re dealing with and the rest of the country is dealing with.”

Bearrows said after negotiations with the YMCA

about the building fell through, he talked with School District Superintendent Jason Harper about May School as an option. Attempts to reach Harper for comment

about what would have to happen for the building to be utilized as a daycare were not successful by time of publication.

Fundraiser established for family of Rochelle man killed in accident

ROCHELLE — The family of a man who passed away after a motorcycle versus car accident in Sycamore Monday is raising money to pay for his funeral and medical expenses.

Broc Mohler, 30, of Rochelle suffered serious injuries and was transported to Kishwaukee Community Hospital where he was later pronounced deceased after an accident just before 9 a.m. on Bethany Road at Klein Road involving his Honda motorcycle and an SUV.

A Sycamore Police press release said Mohler was traveling eastbound on Bethany Road when it struck the SUV that was turning from Bethany Road onto Klein Road.

Mohler’s sister, Natasha, said Broc was the sole breadwinner of his family, and they’d just purchased their first

home a few months ago.

He leaves behind a wife and two young sons, his mother and stepdad, three sisters and “tons” of nephews and nieces, the GoFundMe page said.

RCH’s Jason Popp:

‘I don’t want to see even one more person lost’

Being a doctor during COVID-19: ‘More knowledge, less fear’

ROCHELLE — When describing what he’s learned from the COVID-19 pandemic, Rochelle Community Hospital Dr. Jason Popp called back on a mantra coined by former Chicago Cubs Manager Joe Maddon the year after the team’s world series win.

“The next year he said, ‘Now we just have to remember, don’t get comfortable. Be comfortable being uncomfortable,’” Popp said. “Hopefully that will help us.”

Popp believes one of the things everyone should learn from the pandemic is prepared-

ness, in or out of the healthcare field. There were many aspects of COVID-19 that shined a light on areas of unpreparedness, Popp said. He called it a “smack in the face” and thinks the country will be prepared for years until people start to forget what it was like.

“We had decades of no pandemic and people started to say, ‘It’s probably not going to happen here,’” Popp said. “Whereas realistically, you knew it had to. We grew a little bit comfortable. And it’s good to be reminded not to be too comfortable.”

Bearrows said the daycare could be open by October or November if the idea pans out. The licensing process for a daycare center is “extremely long,” Bearrows said, especially for facilities that care for infants and older, which the potential May School operation would.

There are things at May School that would have to be done to get it to fall within daycare regulations, Bearrows said. That’s on a long list of steps that the city is mid-way through on trying to bring a daycare back to town.

“It’s been tough,” Bearrows said. “Like pushing a log chain. But we hope to get it done.”

Part of the attempt to

get a daycare is due to workforce issues that are nationwide and local. Bearrows said there are currently 300 jobs open in town.

“Folks are still getting things like unemployment, but they can’t afford to go back to work without daycare,” Bearrows said. “It’s better financially for them

to stay home. But we have to get these jobs filled.”

The city is making other attempts to curb the workforce problem. It’s looking at a potential bus route to get people with transportation issues to and from work. A city-wide job fair is planned for late August.

“We plan to have ta-

bles, food and some light music,” Bearrows said. “We want to make it fun. We want people to have their next job and their future. There’s a lot available. We’re still in the planning phase. I believe it will happen. We will give folks every opportunity to see what our employers offer.”

“He was only 30 years old with his whole life ahead of him,” Natasha wrote on the GoFundMe page. “He was just blocks away from safely arriving at work on his motorcycle, when a car pulled out in front of him, leaving him unable to brake in time.”

The driver of the SUV, Fran Bomar, 69, Sycamore, and the other occupant of the SUV were uninjured. Bomar was cited for improper turn at an intersection and failure to yield while turning left.

POPP: Goal to get as many vaccinated as possible

Specializing in family medicine, Popp has spent the last 15 months treating and learning about COVID-19. He took to RCH's YouTube channel and made informational videos about the virus. He did part of a video with the Illinois Hospital Association for its Unity in Immunity campaign.

Popp made those videos because he believes they can be beneficial for people and their health. He likened it to someone with home repair skills making how-to videos for those that are less familiar.

"I figure, well it's my job to take the information I know and try to share that with other people," Popp said. "The most important thing is to try to present this information in a way that doesn't try to come down on people that are starting at a different point. If somebody is afraid of vaccines, I'm not going to be a person that is trying to make them feel bad. I just want to educate them."

Popp told his patients before the vaccine rollout that if they saw him getting the vaccine along with the people in his family whom he loves, that they'll know he thinks it's OK. And that's what happened.

One of Popp's chief missions currently at the hospital is trying to get as many people vaccinated as possible. He said the current COVID-19 climate is a "good starting point" to finally put the pandemic to bed. He wants to avoid a fall and winter spike like last year. The vaccine is key to that.

Fighting social media misinformation related to COVID-19 and the vaccine is something that he feels is a responsibility for himself, RCH and health organizations.

"What we try to do is educate people by showing them the studies and what backs it up," Popp said. "I'm hoping we can raise the vaccination amounts using good information. I know it's never going to be 100 percent. But the more we can do to protect people, the better."

Popp thinks the question of just how vaccinated the population needs to be is "complicated." Top health officials guess it might have to get to around 70-80 percent. There isn't much data to go on when using this type of vaccine to combat a virus like COVID-19, he said.

The vaccinated population has been "very lucky" so far with variants of COVID-19 not becoming resistant to it, Popp said. He's worried that could eventually happen and bring mitigations and guidelines back.

Right now, the Delta COVID-19 variant is a fear of health officials. That variant is currently making another wave in the United Kingdom and is becoming more present in the United States,

Popp said. Health officials believe the vaccine is effective against the Delta variant, but they fear for the unvaccinated.

In a way, advocating for the vaccine is Popp's way of trying to get less people into the hospital.

"Because if less people get sick, then less people come into the hospital," Popp said. "It sounds stupid, but we're trying not to have business. We don't want people in the emergency room with COVID-19. I don't want to see them on the medical floor with COVID-19. I wish it was done. I wish I never had to admit somebody with COVID-19 again. That would be great."

Popp enjoys being a small town physician at RCH because it creates challenges and allows him to try to elevate his capabilities while providing the best care he can for the population. Those with serious COVID-19 complications usually had needs that required them to be transferred from RCH to a larger facility.

Expertise

Part of RCH's expertise has been to realize when those needs go beyond what it can provide, Popp said. He believes RCH improved to and has stayed at a "cutting-edge" level in dealing with the pandemic.

"I did a lot of studying with this because I knew with this pandemic, the hospitals were going to fill up," Popp said. "My job was to try to elevate my knowledge of COVID-19 far beyond any of the infectious disease processes with the previous SARS viruses so that I could provide the best care for people. I think I did a pretty good job with that."

As far as expecting something like a pandemic to happen during his career, Popp said he never really thought twice about it. He recalls seeing the first SARS viruses in Asia and later in the Middle East. He said he realized the seriousness then, but pushed it to the back burner with it not yet making an appearance in the U.S.

Popp called the virus making it stateside a "surprise" and "scary."

"All you can do is the same thing you do if there's an emergency situation in the public, on the

medical floor, in the emergency room and you just approach things step-by-step," Popp said. "You have your training for it, and you rely on your training. You don't end up having anxiety get in the way, because this is what you're supposed to do. This is what you're trained to do."

The most vivid memory of the pandemic for Popp was uncertainty of how COVID-19 was transmitted. Early last year upon coming home from work, Popp would change clothes in his garage before going inside. He bought an ultraviolet C-band to kill germs. He didn't want to pass on COVID-19 to his family, including his young child.

"That was the scariest part for me," Popp said. "Then over time we started to learn that passage really didn't happen that much by touch. And then we learned more about passage through aerosolized particles and as we grow with our knowledge, you find that fear falls. That's the same with anything. More knowledge, less fear. That's what I'm hoping we can continue to do with COVID-19."

Popp said he's fortunate that he didn't have health issues that would've made him more susceptible to COVID-19. He also is at a lower-risk age. But, he said it was still scary. "A lot of faith" helped him work through it.

Those that have thanked the "front line" workers like Popp and the rest of the RCH staff are appreciated, Popp said. But he doesn't want the rest of the essential workers that were exposed to COVID-19 in the community while doing their jobs to go unnoticed.

And then there's the population that Popp doesn't want to see forgotten. The same population he doesn't want to see grow.

"I don't want to see even one more person lost," Popp said. "I know it's going to happen across the country. But for my own area, if we can do something to keep one more person from getting lost, that's what we're fighting for."

"And also, I would say to all of the people out there who have lost somebody, we have not forgotten those people. I remember every person that I knew that was lost to COVID-19 and that is why we continue to fight forward."

NOT ALWAYS BURIAL

In many parts of the world, burial is the most common form of final disposition - but it is not the only form. Many bodies are entombed, or placed in above-ground mausoleums. The procedures are similar to an earth burial, since the body is placed in a casket and is usually driven from the funeral ceremony in a procession. Entombment is the traditional form of final disposition in some areas. In New Orleans, for example, high water tables make ground burial impossible. Cremation is another form of final disposition that is gaining increasing acceptance in North America. However, this option is still not as popular here as in other parts of the world. The cremation

rate is roughly 15 percent in the U.S. and about 25 percent in Canada. By contrast, in European countries more than half of those who die are cremated. In some cultures, such as Japan, cremation is the most common form of final disposition.

Growing pains that produce amazing results

HAVE you ever hired a professional to prune a tree in your yard? Dave and I have someone to do that for us and there are times when he's cut the branches back so far that I've said to him, "There is nothing left. You have totally destroyed our tree!" But he told me, "You just watch and see." And sure enough, before long the tree was much better looking than it was before.

Just like trees need pruning from time to time to remove dead branches or areas where there is overgrowth, you and I need to be pruned or reshaped at different times in different areas of our lives. We may not enjoy the pruning process, but when it's over, we're much better off than we were before.

You see, God wants us to be at our very best—spiritually, emotionally and physically.

John 15:2 (AMP) says, "Every branch in Me that does not bear

fruit, He takes away; and every branch that continues to bear fruit, He [repeatedly] prunes, so that it will bear more fruit [even richer and finer fruit]."

It's good for us to stop and evaluate our lives sometimes and ask God to show us if there are things that need to be cut off because they are hindering our growth in our relationship with Him. Ask yourself: Am I dragging around "dead branches" in my life? Maybe it's a bad relationship, an old wound from your past, or a negative attitude that keeps you from enjoying life to the fullest.

It would be nice if we could see what God sees and say, "Yes, God. Let's get rid of that dead branch." But many times we're too afraid to give up what we know for something new that we just can't see or understand.

The truth is you can be miser-

able dragging those dead things around or you can go through the pain of letting God "prune" them away. Even though it's uncomfortable, the best thing you can do is let God prune you, because after the hard part is over, you will see some amazing results!

God doesn't want you to struggle all the time. He loves you so much that He will never give up on you.

As we allow Him to speak into our lives, He teaches and trains us to be kind and gentle, peaceful and patient, loving and forgiving like Him. But we cannot develop that "fruit" on our own.

John 15:4 (AMP) says, "Just as no branch can bear fruit by itself without remaining in the vine, neither can you [bear fruit, producing evidence of your faith] unless you remain in Me."

In other words, we need to spend time with God.

Reaching a milestone I never expected

PEOPLE used to get a job and stay there for life. Great pension, good benefits and the comfortable feeling of a familiar job.

That has changed over the years, of course. An actual pension is hard to find these days, as most companies offer a 401K retirement fund that you fill with your money. Yes, the good companies also offer a match, but that is also not as common as it was even a handful of years ago. Benefits are also not quite as good as they were at many companies, and the pay gap between the boss and workers has grown to Grand Canyon proportions.

Honestly, most people can't afford to stay in one job forever, unless you work for a great company or enjoy union benefits – something that is also disappearing.

I have never been a member of a union, and I have never worked for a company that offered a pension – well, the military did offer retirement, but I was not in long enough. The newspaper companies I have

worked for have ranged from great to horrible, but they have all offered me a chance to do a job I love, and for that I am thankful for them all.

Believe it or not, this month marks quite an anniversary for me, one that I find improbable and a little sad, honestly. As of right now, working for this newspaper marks my longest tenure at a job in my adult life.

Like I said, a little sad. Not sad because of the job, I love my job. But sad that I had to bounce around so much to reach career goals.

Journalism can be a very unstable job in recent years. Sure, I could have stayed at my hometown newspaper, where I worked from 1992-96. Like a lot of newspapers, that one has been sold multiple times since I left.

So, as I have worked at the Ogle County Life now for more than five years,

this is my longest tenure at a single paper. I worked at the paper in California for five years to the day. Here it has been five years and a couple of weeks.

Honestly, if I had not wanted to move up in my career, I wouldn't have moved. I could be a reporter or a copy editor in my hometown and still sitting at the same desk, I am sure. I might be comfortable, but I would never have lived in the places I have lived or experienced the things I have experienced.

My goal was to be the editor of a daily newspaper by the time I was 35. As I was in the military and didn't even start going to college until I was 24, I was behind at the start. But I worked hard and took some chances and by the time I was 35 was editor of a daily newspaper.

Before that happened, I was an intern at a paper, worked in sports and news at another in Arizona, worked in sports, news and as a copy editor at my hometown

paper and then served as city editor at a daily newspaper in Nebraska, a great newspaper with a publisher so horrible I have tried to block that time from my memory.

Finally, I went to a paper in Wisconsin as a city editor, and after the paper sold found myself in the big chair. Honestly, I wasn't that great at the job, but I had fulfilled my goal.

After that it was Minnesota for a few years, then to California, then to Illinois to work at corporate for a large company. That was also pretty soul crushing and kept me away from the things I love about journalism – telling people's stories and producing a product for them to enjoy.

So, I came to the Life in June of 2015 – my first time working at a weekly newspaper. I fell in love with Ogle County and, well, here I still am.

How long will this last? I have no idea. But one thing the last nearly 30 years has taught me is never say never.

Popular renovation projects during the pandemic

SPENDING so much time at home during the pandemic led many homeowners to spruce up their homes. According to HomeAdvisor's 2021 State of Home Spending report, spending on home improvements increased by an average of \$745 per household in 2020.

In the face of travel restrictions and social distancing guidelines, many homeowners pivoted in 2020 and spent money they initially intended to

use for vacations on home improvements. Interior painting: Just under 35 percent of participants reported taking on an interior painting project in 2020. Interior painting projects can be perfect for DIYers, but homeowners also can trust this task to skilled professionals.

Bathroom renovations: Real estate professionals routinely report how much prospective buyers love updated bathrooms, so it's no surprise that roughly

31 percent of homeowners who took part in the HomeAdvisor report indicated they renovated their bathrooms in 2020.

Flooring: Floors took on a lot of extra traffic during the pandemic, so it shouldn't be too surprising that flooring projects were popular in 2020. More than one-fourth of participants told HomeAdvisor their homes were updated with a new floor during the pandemic.

Landscaping: With nowhere else to go to

escape the daily grind in 2020, many homeowners took to their yards. Twenty-four percent of those homeowners reported making their backyard retreats more appealing by repairing or upgrading the landscaping outside their homes. In fact, the average homeowner reported completing 3.4 landscaping projects in 2020.

Kitchen: Another project that makes sense given the circumstances, kitchen renovations were the fifth most popular home

improvement project in 2020. Restaurant closures and social distancing guidelines led many people to dine in more often than they otherwise would, and just under 23 percent of homeowners reported renovating their kitchens in 2020.

As the world gradually emerges from the pandemic, many homeowners who caught the renovation bug while in quarantine also will be emerging with what feels like an entirely new home.

How to maintain hardwood floors

HARDWOOD floors have long been sought after by homebuyers. In its 2019 "Remodeling Impact Report," the National Association of Realtors® revealed that new wood flooring was the fourth most popular project to attract buyers.

Of course, hardwood floors aren't just for buyers. Homeowners who already have hardwood floors know just how impressive these floors can be, especially when they're well maintained. Maintaining wood floors is not necessarily as straightforward as it may seem, and homeowners may benefit from a tutorial on how to keep the floors under their feet looking good.

To polish or not to polish?

Polishing floors is an inexpensive way to keep them looking good. But the home improvement experts at BobVila.com note that not all floors can be polished, and determining which ones can depends on the finish. Floors with waterproof barriers such as urethane will benefit from routine polishing. However, floors with penetrating finishes like tung oil will need to be waxed rather than polished.

What finish is on the floor?

The Hardwood Distributor's Association

recommends a simple way for homeowners to determine which type of finish is on their hardwood floors. Homeowners are advised to rub a finger across the floor. If no smudge appears, then the floor is surface sealed. If a smudge is created, then the floor has been treated with a penetrating seal. The HDA also notes that recently installed wood floors are likely surface sealed.

How often should floors be polished or waxed?

Wood flooring professionals recommend polishing floors that can be polished once every few months. Waxing wood floors does not need to be done as frequently, and most can benefit from a fresh coat of wax every 12 to 18 months.

What can I do on a daily basis?

Some simple tricks and daily maintenance can help wood floors maintain their impressive look.

Utilize floor mats. The HDA notes that floor mats near entryways can reduce the time it takes to clean hardwood floors and reduce the wear and tear they endure. For example, tiny particles like dirt can scratch the floor and contribute to



the kind of minor damage that adds up to significant scarring over time. Floor mats near entryways ensures that most of that dirt never makes it to the wood floors.

Vacuum without a beater bar. Some vacuums contain beater bars, which are designed to pick up human hair, dog hair and

other things that conventional vacuums may not be able to pick up. The HDA advises vacuuming without the beater bar, as it can contribute to small scratches in the floor. Sweeping with a high-quality broom or microfiber cloth is another way to pick up dirt without damaging floors.

Use manufacturer-recommended cleaning products. Local home improvement stores sell a host of hardwood floor cleaning products, but the HDA notes that many flooring manufacturers now sell their own hardwood floor cleaners designed specifically for their floors. These products are likely

homeowners' best bets. Homeowners who can't find them can seek recommendations from a local flooring retailer.

Hardwood floors are attractive for many reasons. And they look even more stunning, and last much longer, when homeowners make an effort to maintain them.

Lady Hubs working through short offseason

Two-time All-Conference hitter Hasz headlines returning players

ROCHELLE — Replacing a four-year varsity starter won't be easy for the Rochelle Lady Hub varsity volleyball team next season. Combined with a condensed offseason, head coach Molly Sly and the Lady Hubs will face some challenges as the team looks to build on this season.

Rochelle finished 7-10 and 6-8 in the Interstate 8 Conference this season. The Lady Hubs saw three players receive All-Conference recognition including middle blocker Afi Gati (28 kills, 13 blocks) and four-year varsity setter Clare Green (347 assists), who ended her career with over 1,400 assists. Gati and Green are two of the seven seniors departing the program this year.

"I was excited that our seniors were able to compete this year," Sly said. "The girls showed they could bounce back when the other team took the momentum away or when they didn't score a key point during the match. We'll need to work with our setters over the offseason and we're losing our libero as well, so it will be interesting to see who earns that spot. We have some girls coming back in front row and I'm looking forward to seeing them grow."

Seniors Ellie Kinn (55 digs), Alexis Sanford (55 digs), Jesenia Solano (16

digs) and Morgan Haas (8 digs) will vacate varsity spots in the back row. Gati and senior Bella Lodico (18 kills) will depart from the front row, while Green's absence in the middle will create the biggest challenge for the Lady Hubs. Junior Sylvia Hasz led Rochelle with 239 kills and 98 digs this season, earning All-Conference First Team recognition for the second year in a row.

"When we started camp this offseason, we realized how great of an impact Clare had on our team and how big those shoes will be to fill," Sly said. "It will be interesting to see who steps up to take on

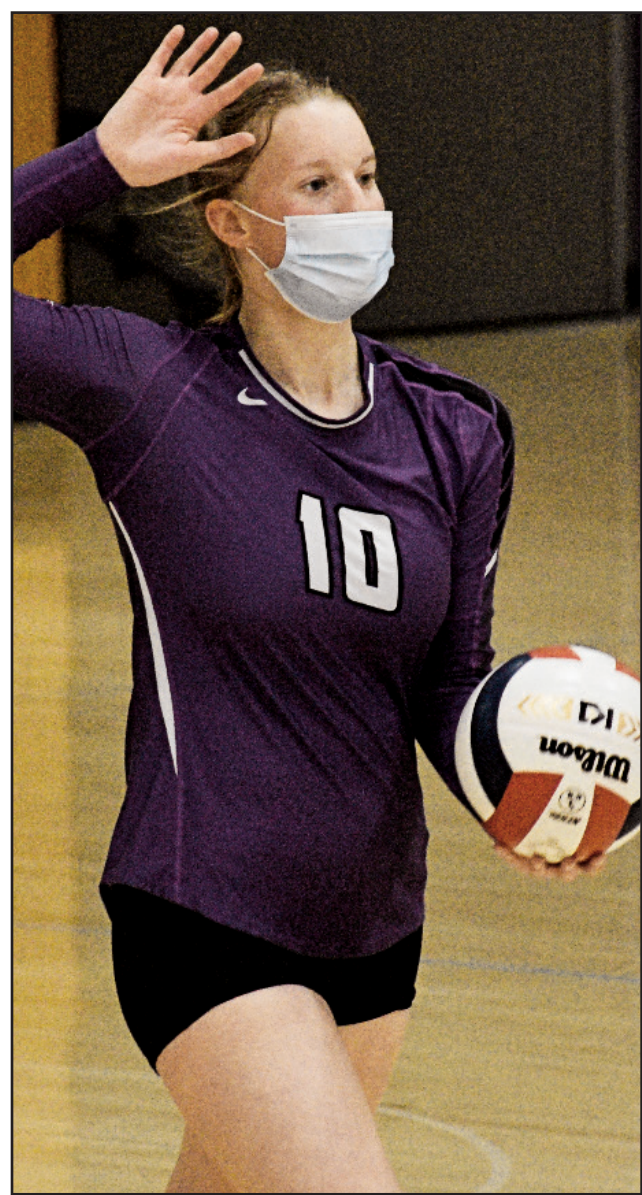

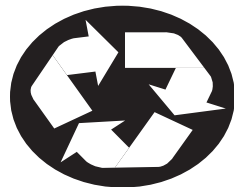
