Dougherty retiring after 20 years as senior center director

ROCHELLE — The Hub City Senior Center prom started shortly after Director Connie Dougherty did.

"We have pictures displayed all over of the people who were named king and queen," Dougherty said. "It's just been so much fun and rewarding and everyone loves it so much."

Memories of the prom stand out most for Dougherty when she reflects on her time as director. She'll be retiring at the end of this month after 20 years.

Dougherty said she won't miss the paper and office work that's required by the job. What made the decision to retire tough was the people. That's what she'll miss most. Unfortunately as part of the job, she's already had to learn how to do that.

"Because these people become family," Dougherty said. "Over these 20 years I've lost so many of them and they've left big holes in my heart. In that way it's been difficult, but it's also been so rewarding because to be able to help people and to love on them

Habitat project underway

ROCHELLE — Felix and Tanya Vega and their five children will have to move just two blocks into their new home in Rochelle.

The Vegas are the recipients of Habitat for Humanity of Ogle County's latest home at 122 S. 9th St. The home is nearing completion and the family will be moving in following a June 6 open house event. Despite a year of COVID-19-related challenges, Habitat moved forward with the project.

The nonprofit was unable to host its fundraiser dinner which usually funds the initial costs of a build. Donation numbers fell. Building material prices are currently high. Habitat Executive Director Vanessa White-Broome said the build did come in over budget, but work pressed on and a couple grants helped the nonprofit.

"It was a challenging year for nonprofits with COVID-19 but we went ahead and secured the permit last June and actually started the first nail in August," White-Broome said.

Crash results in critical injuries

Incident occurred at Illinois Route 251 and Bethel Road

ROCHELLE — One driver suffered critical injuries in a Thursday morning accident north of Rochelle, an Ogle County Sheriff's press release said.

At approximately 6:48 a.m. deputies along with the Rochelle and Hillcrest Fire

Departments responded to the report of a two-vehicle accident with injuries at the intersection of Illinois 251 and Bethel Road.

A white Chrysler van, driven by Ronald Hamilton, 72, of Rockford, was driving westbound on Bethel Road approaching the intersection of Illinois Route 251. A blue Sat-

urn passenger car, driven by Paula Groves, 49, of Rockford, was driving southbound on Illinois Route 251 approaching the intersection of Bethel Road.

Hamilton failed to stop at the stop sign on Illinois Route 251 and struck Groves' car on the driver side. Both vehicles trav-

eled off the west side of the roadway and came to rest in the front yard of a private residence.

Hamilton was extricated and transported to Rochelle Community Hospital by Rochelle Ambulance for treatment of serious injuries. Groves was extricated and transported to Rochelle Community Hospital by

Rochelle Ambulance for treatment of critical injuries.

Groves was subsequently flown to St. Anthony's Hospital in Rockford by Life Flight for additional medical treatment.

Hamilton was cited for disobeying a stop sign and the accident remains under investigation.

Montgomery reflects on time with foundation

ROCHELLE — Kim Montgomery's fondest memory of her time as executive director of the Rochelle Area Community Foundation doesn't even involve giving to a nonprofit, which is what the organization does.

After a tornado hit town in 2015, Montgomery knew people would be looking to make donations to those in need. She decided the RACF should step up, despite its policy of giving to nonprofit organizations and not individuals.

"We took in \$500,000 in donations," Montgomery said. "We had to disperse it. We were told we could give directly to individuals with some rules. Over two years we got nearly 100 percent of it distributed. That was made the most impact on me and the community. It's incredible how generous people are when there's someone in need."

Montgomery decided to retire last month after 12 years with the RACF. She decided it was time to spend more time with her family.

"It was hard," Montgomery said of retiring. "I loved my job. I love everything it stands for. It was a great job for sure. I met great people and worked with nonprofits. That made leaving hard."

Montgomery's son, David, suffered a spinal

cord injury in 2001. She became an advocate after that and was introduced to the world of nonprofits. Later on, when the RACF job came open, her skill-set and being a lifelong Rochelle resident made for a fit.

After its inception, RACF quickly grew to be able to sustain a paid staff member and to fund grants. Upon her retirement from her part-time executive director, Montgomery said she recommended the RACF board replace her with someone full-time.

"They deserve more," Montgomery said. "We just have a lot of people make donations and have the means to establish our funds."

"It was a pretty quick build with all of the challenges we had. We've had a lot of people from Rochelle that have been involved and some from surround-

ing communities."

The house is four bedrooms and the build came in around \$100,000. The Vega family put in work building the new home, which is part of Habitat's "sweat equity" policy

where families help during construction.

The family painted and learned how to do flooring. There's yard work still left to do.

Habitat prides itself on its policy of "hands up,

not a hand-out." Those that receive homes make mortgage payments to Habitat. They stay engaged throughout the mortgage and provide counseling on how to pay for and maintain a home.

Those that apply for Habitat homes are usually unable to receive a loan due to credit issues.

The Vega family has been living with relatives. "We looked at their current situation in person,"

White-Broome said. "It was just cramped conditions. 'Now the family will have their furnishings and privacy for their kids and a normal environment. A place where a family can thrive.'"

"When I left, I think we had 18-20 funds started by individuals in the community. This year they'll distribute \$100,000 into the community. That's a big number. Rochelle is very fortunate to have a good group of nonprofits."

Montgomery is unsure

where the situation of her replacement stands. She said she'll miss working with donors and the board along with nonprofits and community leaders. She'll miss watching the RACF grow, but she'll still be involved as a donor herself.

Montgomery has a fund in honor of her

father, Jim Walker, who passed away in 2007. She saw value in honoring someone valuable to the community.

"Sometimes when you give money, you don't know where it's going or if it will end up with those who need it," Montgomery said. "That isn't a problem here."

EMBALMING PROCESS

The embalming process essentially involves replacing the blood and other bodily fluids with a preservative such as formaldehyde. Embalming is required by law only under certain circumstances, but families that intend to have a public viewing of the body usually choose to have it done, embalming preservative powers give them more leeway in scheduling a funeral. Embalmers are adept at restoring natural features that have been injured or to people who die after a long illness. They have a range of techniques to deal with various difficulties. They can replace missing hair, rebuild fractured features, or disguise the effects of



the drastic weight loss from a long, wasting illness. Before it is placed in the casket, the body is dressed and prepared for viewing. Hair is shampooed and set, and men get a shave. Families are sometimes encouraged to bring in a recent photograph of the deceased to help guide them.

Prime working-age Illinoisans leading exodus, not students

GOV. J.B. Pritzker inaccurately identified students leaving for college as the reason for Illinois' population decline. Illinoisans between the ages of 26 and 54 made up 64.5 percent of the net decline in population from 2017-2018, the most recent year of available data.

Who's leading the Illinois Exodus? Official 2020 Census numbers confirmed that Illinois for the first time in 200 years lost population in the decennial U.S. Census count.

On April 26, the day Census numbers came out, Gov. J.B. Pritzker claimed he had "looked very closely" at the data and identified the root of the problem: Illinois' population losses are due to college students leaving to attend college out of state.

The problem is, that's dead wrong. Domestic out-migration—people leaving Illinois for other U.S. states—is the primary reason for Illinois' population loss.

But that domestic migration is being driven by prime working-age adults, not college students. Illinoisans between the ages of 26 and 54—and their dependents—made up 64.5 percent of the net decline in population from 2017-2018, the most recent year of available data.

While Illinois is losing residents of college age, these residents are the smallest age group leaving the state. In fact, those under the age of 26 only made up 6.6 percent of the net decline in the population.

The two primary reasons these Illinoisans are choosing to leave the state are for better housing and employment opportunities, both of which have been hindered by poor public policy in Illinois. Nearly half of Illinoisans have thought about moving away, and they said taxes were their No. 1 reason.

Higher taxes harm the economy by decreasing disposable income and by

discouraging businesses from investing and hiring more. Falling demand for goods and services reduces the expected profit to a business from creating additional jobs, resulting in fewer job openings for workers.

Higher taxes also mean that households save and invest less, resulting in permanently lower before-tax incomes. Economic research also reveals strong

housing demand is often linked to robust employment growth. The evidence suggests taxes are an important reason for Illinois' exodus because they reduce the availability of desirable job and housing options.

The National Center for Education Statistics also provides data on college students that confirm these results. Their statistics show that during the 2018-2019 school year, 20,198 more Illinois students attended out-of-state colleges than Illinois universities received from other states. However, it should be noted that many of these students are likely to still be considered residents of Illinois when it comes to IRS or Census Bureau data. Furthermore, Illinois has the second-highest number of in-state students as a share of the student population in the Midwest, meaning that Illinois actually has a greater concentration of in-state students at its universities than most other states.

When trying to solve a problem, the first order of business is properly diagnosing what's going wrong. Illinois' population loss can only be reversed by policy solutions that grow the economy and make homeownership more affordable—making it more desirable for young professionals and families to plant roots here.

"There was no visible fire upon arrival," Prewett said. "There was dense smoke coming out of a stack. We opened a hopper and found fire and extinguished it. We entered the building and did further cooling. It's part of their processing where corn is ground down and moved across the facility. The fire was in a hammermill and dust collector."

Prewett believes the cause of the fire, which was called in at 10:55 a.m., was mechanical. He could not speak to the amount of damage done but said the plant would experience longer delays. CHS Ethanol was in a scheduled shutdown when the fire occurred.

Responding departments along with Rochelle Fire included Hillcrest, Steward, Creston, Flagg Center and Lynn Scott

Rock mutual aid ambulance.

"We weren't sure what part of the facility was on fire," Prewett said. We've been called for dryer fires out there but never for this. Initially we called in mutual aid because we were unsure. It could've involved ethanol or something more volatile. We didn't have to elevate it any further. Any time it's something industrial we're careful."

OCHD: Ogle County currently hot spot for COVID-19 cases

County has highest test positivity rate in region

ROCHELLE—Ogle County has been identified as a "hot spot" for COVID-19 in the state, Ogle County Health Department Public Administrator Kyle Auman said in a news release Thursday.

Ogle County currently has the highest test positivity seven-day rolling average for the region at 8.4 percent. It also has the second highest number of new cases per 100,000 in the region at 245.

OCHD contact tracers have been working diligently to ensure that all cases are contacted, traced and investigated appropriately, Auman said. It is currently exceeding contact tracing metrics for communicating with new cases and close contacts.

Gov. JB Pritzker said earlier this week COVID-19 restrictions will loosen May 14 and a full reopening is planned for June 11.

"Residents are becoming even less cooperative over the last few months," Auman said. "We are frequently dealing with hostile cases with people using very negative language towards us. Positive cases are flat out telling us that they refuse to isolate. Some of these cases have been identified to be out in public while COVID positive actively spreading COVID-19. We need everyone's help to get these numbers down especially since the Governor has announced that we will be moving to the Bridge Phase next week."

Auman said the OCHD is still seeing cases in schools and school-related activities. Those situations typically have many people involved in the investigation with greater community impact and require a larger

number of resources to contact trace due to the number of close contact associated with them.

The OCHD is still monitoring variant strains of the virus. A total of 41 variant cases have been seen in Ogle County.

"We are keeping a close eye on variants coming out of India as they are seeing unique strains and India death rates climb," Auman said. "One variant strain from India has been identified in Illinois."

Ogle County is 30.62 percent fully-vaccinated. The OCHD and its vaccination partners in the county have seen a "drastic" decrease in demand for vaccinations, Auman said.

"Most of our clinics are not making it to half full," Auman said. "Our nurses have been to local schools to vaccinate 16-18-year-olds who want to be vaccinated and we will complete second doses with Pfizer next week."

The OCHD will be hosting a Johnson & Johnson clinic at 907 Pines Road in Oregon on May 12 and a May 20 Moderna and Johnson & Johnson clinic at 123 N. 2nd St. in Oregon. Registration is required and the link can be found on the OCHD's website and Facebook page.

Auman said regional hospital partners are still seeing increased COVID-19 activity.

"The Illinois Department of Public Health has reported that the age range of hospitalized patients has shifted from 65 and up to younger age groups," Auman said. "There could be a couple of different reasons for this shift; one being high vaccine uptake in the 65+ population."

Ogle County has had a total of 81 deaths and 6,047 cases since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic.

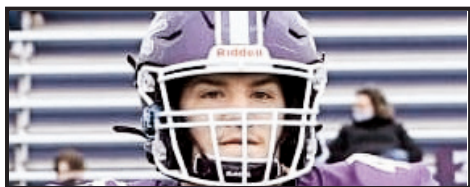

Rochelle sweeps Sandwich-Byron meet, begins season with 5-1 record

ROCHELLE — Locked in a tough battle with the Sandwich Indians, Rochelle senior Noah Messer entered the ring looking to score a crucial victory for the Hub varsity wrestling team Thursday evening, when Rochelle hosted a three-team meet that featured the Byron Tigers.

With the Hubs trailing Sandwich 27-23, Messer faced off against Kaiden Gustafson in the 220-pound bout. In a must-win situation, Messer took the early lead, scoring on an escape and a takedown before pinning Gustafson near the end of the second period to secure six Rochelle points. Sophomore Jaden Cook then received a forfeit at 285 pounds, sealing a 35-27 win for the Hubs, who then defeated Byron 53-29 to end the night 5-1 overall and 2-0 in conference.

“We’re wrestling really well and we have a lot of kids who are getting stron-

ger and better,” Messer said. “I feel like I’ve started off the season really well. I feel that I’m a lot better this year than I was last year. We have a chance to be really good and even though we don’t have a lot of numbers, we’re able to move some people around and score some points for the team.”

Freshman Riley Damask (106 pounds) and senior Ivan Pineda (113 pounds) took forfeits to open the dual before Sandwich scored 15 unanswered points with two pins and a decision. Senior Grant Thompson gave Rochelle the lead once again in the 138-pound bout, dominating Sandwich’s Sy Smith with four takedowns and three near-falls in a 19-2 technical fall win.

A key victory came in the 152-pound matchup, where Hub junior Caleb Nadig outlasted Indian grappler Aidan Linden with an 8-6 sudden victory in overtime.

Alfano shines as Hubs beat Plano

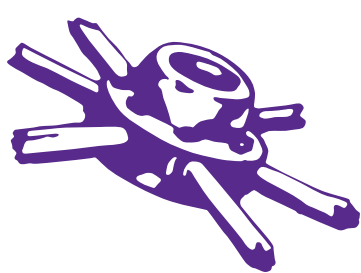

Three Hubs earn Interstate 8 First Team recognition

THE Rochelle Hub varsity football team saw three players receive All-Conference First Team honors from the Interstate 8 this season. Seniors Ethan Albers, Noah Messer and Ben Harvey all took home First-Team recognition for their achievements on the gridiron this spring.

Six Hubs earned All-Conference Honorable Mentions including seniors Crue Larsen, Gabe Neece, Grant Thompson, junior Braden Alfano and sophomores Garrett Gensler and Jaden Cook. Rochelle finished 2-4 in the Interstate 8 this season with wins over Sandwich and Ottawa.

Albers finished with 23 total tackles, one tackle-for-loss, one fumble recovery and one interception this season. The two-time Interstate 8 First-Team honoree will be continuing his academics and his football career as a two-way lineman at Wartburg College next year.

"I feel very honored to receive All-Conference and it shows that if you work hard, you will be rewarded," Albers said. "I felt that I did good in applying more pressure to the quarterback and correcting small mistakes on both sides. I feel that I improved the most on the defensive side."

Messer recorded 19 total tackles, including three tackles-for-loss, while adding one sack on the defensive line. A two-way starter who also played right guard, Messer brought home All-Conference First Team honors this year after being named an Honorable Mention last year.

"I felt very honored to be nominated for this award," Messer said. "I was very proud that my hard work in the offseason drastically improved my performance on the field. I felt that I hit harder on both sides of the ball and I was much more aggressive. My defense has improved the most since last season and I was much more successful than I had been in past seasons."

Harvey led all Rochelle running backs with 442 yards and four touchdowns. In addition, Harvey played inside linebacker on defense, totaling a team-leading 42 tackles including six tackles-for-loss. Harvey will be continuing his academics and athletics at WashU-St. Louis next year.

"I thought I improved the most in finding and hitting the holes harder at the running back position," Harvey said. "I switched to fullback this year so that was important for me. I improved on falling forward and running through as opposed to around people. I thought I was a better leader this year than I was in the past and I thought I was more vocal this year."

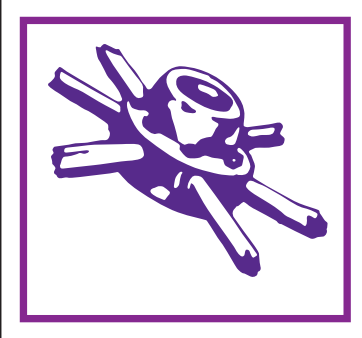

Rochelle athletes take on Sycamore, Morris

Hubs take second, Lady Hubs finish third in three-team meet

SYCAMORE — The Rochelle Lady Hub track and field team took third in its Interstate 8 Conference meet against Morris and Sycamore on Tuesday. Sycamore finished first with 75.5 points, while Morris placed second with 54.5 and Rochelle landed in third with 38. The Lady Hubs (1-5) will face Sandwich and Seneca on the road next Tuesday, May 11 at 4:30 p.m.

Senior Afi Gati continued her strong start to the season, winning the shot put with a mark of 9.7 meters before taking second in the discus with a distance of 25.85 meters. Senior Kiya Porter finished second in the shot put with a heave of 8.64 meters, while junior Teagan Meyers won the triple jump (9.01 meters) and placed second in the high jump (1.25 meters).

Meyers also finished third in both the 200-meter dash (28.91 seconds) and the 400-meter dash (1:06.07).

Junior Sara Johnson won the 800-meter run with a time of 2:54.18 before setting a new personal record in the 1600-meter run, taking seventh in 6:20.73. Sophomore Yuelma Ortiz also set a personal-best time in the meet, placing second in the 3200-meter run with a time of 13:41.97. Junior Liberty Hayes took fifth in

Junior Zach Sanford shined in the throwing events, winning the discus with a personal-best throw of 36.09 meters before taking third in the shot put with a mark of 12.71 meters. Senior Trevor Goodwin won the triple jump with a leap of 12.88 meters, while junior Ryan Simmons stepped up in the field as well, winning the high jump with a clearance

of 1.54 meters and finishing second in the long jump with a leap of 5.44 meters, both personal records.

Junior Michael Ramsey led Rochelle in the sprints, placing fourth in the 100-meter dash with a personal-best time of 12.04 seconds before finishing seventh in the 200-meter dash with a time of 25.44 seconds. Freshman Caleb Wyssbrod raced well in the 400-meter dash, taking fifth with a time of 59.52

Burdin scored on a passed ball before Buskohl brought home junior Eric Briseno with an RBI double to right-center. With the Hubs leading 5-1, Alfano pulled an RBI single to right and then scored on Kirk's RBI single two at-bats later.

Sycamore

Andy Buskohl had a confident start on the pitcher's

mound, but his bat made the most noise Wednesday evening, when the Rochelle Hub varsity baseball team hosted the Sycamore Spartans for the first of the team's two-game Interstate 8 Conference series.

Buskohl shut the Sycamore offense down over the first four innings, holding the Spartans scoreless before conceding two runs in the top of the fifth inning. Looking for their fourth consecutive win, the Hubs rallied for three runs in the bottom of the sixth inning, with junior Nate Burdin and Buskohl each hitting homers to ultimately lift Rochelle over Sycamore 3-2. The Hubs improved to 4-2 overall with the win.

"Sycamore came in as the No. 2 seed in the conference, so it felt great to knock them off," Buskohl said. "My changeup was working really well. I fell into some trouble in the fifth inning, but I was able to help myself out at the plate. It was a pretty fun team win

tonight and our chemistry has grown. We'll be playing with a lot of confidence over these next few games."

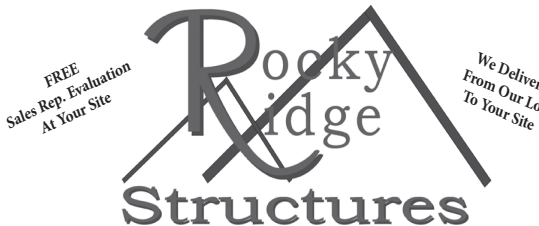

With Rochelle leading 9-1 over the Plano Reapers in the bottom of the fifth inning, Lady Hub senior Sawyer McGee stepped into the batter's box with two runners on base and an opportunity to seal the varsity softball team's second Interstate 8 Conference win.

Already with a double and one RBI under her belt, McGee took advantage of a slow fastball over the middle, crushing a two-run double down the left-field that cleared the bases and clinched an 11-1 victory for the Lady Hubs. Rochelle improved to 4-4 overall with the victory.

"I wanted to make contact so we could move the runners around," McGee said. "I think we've been playing great and it feels good to be out here. We didn't play as well as we could've on Wednesday and I was happy to see us come back strong and bring out a lot of energy."

After two scoreless frames to open the conference matchup, Rochelle

broke the game wide open with an offensive explosion in the bottom of the third inning, scoring seven runs to take a 7-0 lead. Freshman Ella Alfano broke the scoreless tie with a two-run single past the Plano shortstop before junior Jordin Dickey brought Alfano home on an RBI triple to center field.

McGee's first double of the day put the Lady Hubs ahead 4-0 soon after. RBI doubles from sophomore Addie Friestad and senior Kendal Ansteth made it 6-0 before sophomore Morgan Smardo slapped an RBI single from the top of the Lady Hub batting order to score Ansteth.

Leading 8-1 after four innings, Rochelle iced the victory with a three-run fifth inning. Senior Bella Lodico earned the win on the mound, striking out six batters and allowing one run.

"I think we have a great group this year," McGee said. "We're doing really well right now and when we bring energy and confidence to the dugout, that transfers over to the game."
