Agencies given checks

ROCHELLE — The first presentation of checks to local not-for-profit groups from the From the Heart committee was held Friday afternoon.

“Each of the groups receiving money this year

are getting a check for \$7,000,” committeeman Dave Eckhardt said.

The groups receiving checks on Friday included the Rochelle Area Community Foundation – Kim Montgomery, HOPE of Ogle County – Ruth Carter, Foundation for Focus House – Jeni Hardin and

Brenda Mason, Hub City Senior Center – Connie Dougherty, and CASA – Trisha Morrow.

Money for each of the not-for-profit groups is raised annually through the Rochelle Rotary Club From the Heart event which was held at the beginning of February. Due

to COVID-19, this year’s event was held virtually, complete with an online auction. Annual Cash Calendar sales also contribute to the funding.

“This year we raised the most money that we have ever raised, allowing for each group to receive \$7,000,” Eckhardt empha-

sized. “We sold the more calendars this year than we ever have thanks in part to the City of Rochelle, economic development and the mayor.”

Previously, the most calendars sold in a year was 2,200. This year, Rotary Club members sold more than 3,000 calendars.

Board to vote on new attendance center plan

ROCHELLE — Rochelle School District 231 administrators are moving forward with a proposal to shut down May School after this school year. Board members discussed the proposal to move the district to an attendance center model during their monthly meeting Tuesday.

Superintendent Jason Harper said he and board members discussed com-

monly asked questions from parents and families regarding a transition from the current neighborhood model, which assigns students to elementary schools based on geographical location. Under the attendance center model, students would attend specific schools based on grade level.

Under the attendance center model, District 231 would assign preschoolers, kindergartners and first-graders to Lincoln School, second

and third-graders to Central School and fourth and fifth-graders to Tilton School. Rochelle Middle School will not be affected by the changes. During a presentation last month, Harper said District 231 would save roughly \$200,000 next school year and roughly \$300,000 in each of the following school years by closing May School.

Board members will vote on the proposal at next month’s meeting on Tuesday, April 13 at 7 p.m.

Hillcrest holds hearing to establish solar farm

HILLCREST — Hillcrest trustees held a public hearing Wednesday evening regarding the potential annexation of 228 acres of land off Twombly Road for the purpose of establishing a solar farm. Trustees will potentially vote on the solar farm proposal at next month’s meeting.

The proposal would involve a special use permit for the project. Additionally, Hillcrest would receive up to \$100,000 to upgrade existing solar panels located behind Village Hall. Trustees will discuss the proposal during next month’s meet-

ing on Wednesday, April 14 at 7 p.m.

Infrastructure

Trustees heard an update from Baxter & Woodman regarding potential water, sewer and roadway improvements to the village.

The village will receive \$7,000 in state funding for the planning of the project, which has been tabled for roughly the last 12 months due to COVID-19. Lastly, trustees announced that bids for seal coat work will be opened on Friday, April 9.

ROCKFORD — NW HomeStart and the Community Foundation of Northern Illinois (CFNIL) are accepting applications for the Neighborhood

Grants Program until 5 p.m. on Monday, April 5. This program is open to neighborhood-based groups and nonprofit organizations operating in Boone, Ogle, Stephenson, and Winnebago Counties.

The Neighborhood Grants Program funds neighborhood-focused and resident-led projects, including but not limited to beautification, crime prevention, surveys, clean ups, newsletters, organizing, reforestation, and resident-focused education. Waiting for the next phase to begin

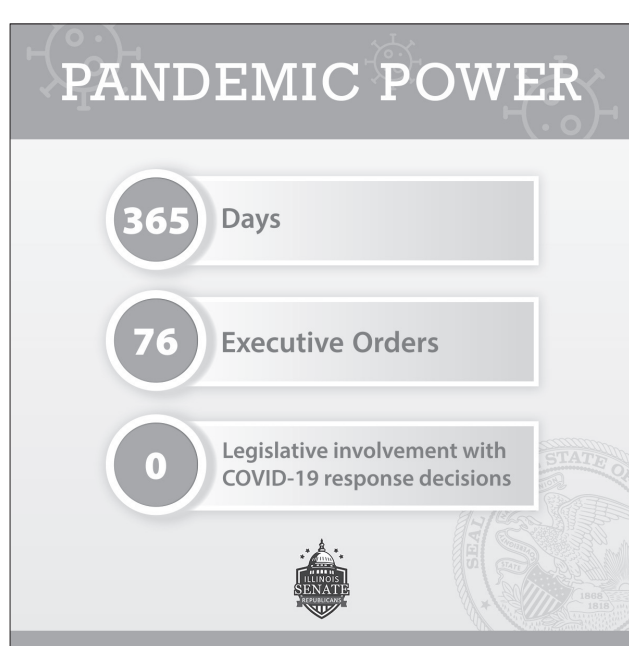
SPRINGFIELD—With vaccinations increasing and COVID-19 cases decreasing, Illinoisans are waiting for the next phase of reopening to begin, but the Governor hasn't released any details about moving forward. The Senate did return to Springfield during the week, but activity under the Capitol Dome isn't quite the same, according to State Sen. Brian Stewart (R-Freeport).

A year since first 'stay-at-home' order

It's been nearly a year since Gov. J.B. Pritzker issued his first "stay-at-home" order, without any input from the co-equal legislative branch. Senate Republicans have continually pushed for increased transparency from the Pritzker Administration, including access to data the Governor has used to make his decisions. The Senate Republican Caucus has also continued to ask the Governor to involve lawmakers in making decisions that involve nearly every aspect of Illinoisans' daily lives. Instead, Gov. Pritzker has chosen to operate unilaterally through 76 individual Executive Orders.

So far, the state's COVID-19 response efforts have been marked with controversy, inconsistent standards for different regions, a broken unemployment benefits system, and relatively poor performance for the vaccination program.

Under the Governor's Restore Illinois Plan, Illinois would not be allowed to resume normal operations until: "Either a vaccine is developed to prevent additional spread of COVID-19, a treatment option is readily available that ensures health care capacity is no longer a concern, or there are no new cases over



a sustained period."

With COVID-19 positivity rates continuing to decline, and vaccination numbers and hospital capacity continuing to rise, it appears those conditions have been met but the Governor still hasn't released any details on how the state can move forward to Phase 5.

Sen. Stewart is urging the Governor to work with lawmakers, healthcare and other stakeholders, and employers to develop a plan to ramp up the reopening process.

Back at the Capitol

The Senate resumed its work at the Capitol during the week. Committee meetings were held using a combination of virtual and in-person meetings. While a limited number of reporters were granted access, citizens and lobbyists were not allowed to attend.

Since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, face-to-face citizen-involved government has unfortunately been put on hold. The January "lame-duck" session was particularly controversial for its lack of transparency.

Senate Republicans continue to push for im-

proved transparency to restore what Illinois' favorite son Abraham Lincoln had in mind when he described a government "of the people, by the people, for the people." To help keep the public informed about legislative proposals that impact their lives, Senate Republicans suggest they watch Senate Committee meetings at <https://www.ilga.gov/senateaudvid.asp>.

A recent article from the Daily Line underscores the need for improvements in Illinois. In the article, reporter Joel Ebert noted, "According to the National Conference of State Legislatures, Illinois is one of just four states that don't provide easy access to archived floor and committee meetings. As other state legislatures have modernized their technological capabilities, Illinois maintains an outdated system that critics say limits the public's ability to engage with their government and fuels residents' distrust of the General Assembly."

To date, nearly 7,000 new proposals have been introduced that create new laws or change existing laws. The list of legislation introduced this year is available at <http://www.ilga.gov>.

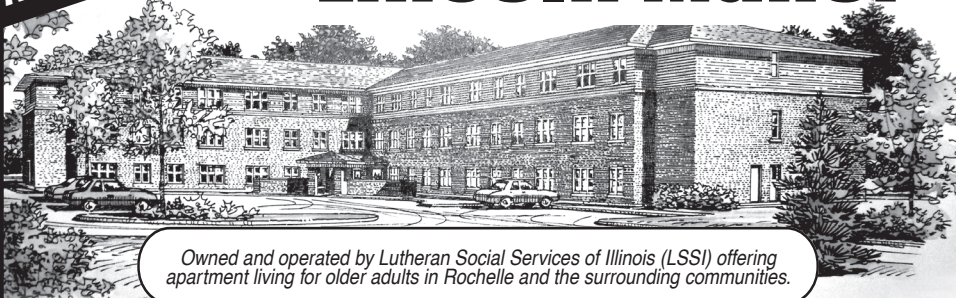

John Edward Niemeyer

LAKE OF THE OZARKS, Mo. — John Edward Niemeyer, 68, of Lake of the Ozarks, Missouri, passed away Feb. 8, 2021. He was born in Elmhurst to the late Arthur and Mary Niemeyer.

John was a graduate of York High School where he excelled at basketball, football and baseball. He continued his education and athletic career at Northern Illinois University, graduating in 1974. He would later be inducted into NIU's Hall of Fame.

After graduation John had a career as a PE teacher at Rochelle Township High School that spanned over 20 years. While at RTHS, he coached every sport they offered, but ultimately gave much of his time and love to the basketball program. Which, if you ever saw him at a game, you couldn't miss the coach looking first class in a suit. This did not go unnoticed by his three littlest, but biggest fans growing up in the front row. Before and after games no one rocked a track suit and pearly white tennies better than he did.

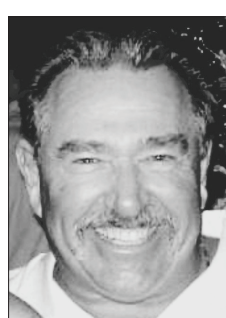
He would also spend time coaching golf, a sport he continued to enjoy and play up until his last days. His love of all sports and his competitive nature is something he passed on to his three daughters. They grew up learning the Super Bowl Shuffle, the curse of the Chicago Cubs, and

the greatness that is Michael Jordan. He enjoyed playing slow pitch softball with his friends, pick-up games of basketball with kids in the neighborhood, and hitting the highest pop flies you have even seen to his girls in their back yard.

Due to his athletic adventures, he developed hands we lovingly referred to as the claws. Any injury, whether it be a broken finger, toe, or road rash from sliding into home plate can be fixed with athletic tape, just ask the claws. Many nights were spent with dad, and one of us, with a leg up over the kitchen sink rinsing gravel out of our legs after a game. All injuries incurred growing up were treated immediately with a quick exam. This consisted of no blood, no bone, and a walk it off; a phrase that was said often, as over the years one of his graceful children would meet a patch of earth that tried to get them or a softball that didn't hit quite right. He tried making it to as many games as he could over the years, which was no small feat, considering he had three daughters who all played varying sports. He drove 16 hours round trip so one could make it to her all-star game while on vacation, another 16 hours round trip so he didn't miss senior night, he made it to as many school games, Little League games, All-Star games, and club games as

possible, all while coaching his own games and trying to figure out which kid was playing where. I am sure he wished picture and picture, which he swore was one of the best things ever invented, was available to watch all of us play at the same time. He would always have multiple games going, plus the radio, because he liked some of their announcers better. It was not unusual to find him watching the game in his chair with a bowl of popcorn and his tumbler of Diet Coke close by growing up.

He will also go down as the best gift giver of all time. It was not unheard of for him to drive into Chicago, across the border to Wisconsin, or the ends of the earth for that matter, to find the perfect gift or item for his girls. No item was too big or too small or too far away for him to find. Each time leaving us shocked he had managed to find it, although after all these years, we shouldn't have been.



Dad passed on his love for water sports, adventure, and amusement parks every summer on vacation. He loved taking his girls

to ski and tube around the lake, as well as riding any roller coaster, as long as it didn't go backwards or upside down.

He also passed on his love for food.

Mentally kicking himself any time his girls saw crab legs on the menu while on vacation, he knew what was coming, and we know he secretly enjoyed it, even if his wallet didn't. His cooking skills and love for Emeril will be missed by anyone who was lucky enough to have his Jesus gravy at Thanksgiving or see him kick it up a notch trying out his latest recipe.

He will always be remembered for his fabulous rendition of O, Canada by Pavarotti, jamming out to Frankie Valli, serenading us with Elvis, crooning along with Sinatra, sharing old Hitchcock movies, and his spot-on Jack Nicholson impressions. He saved his

Columbo impersonation for a quick laugh or if we needed some serious cheering up. He loved to laugh and make others laugh, and if you ever heard his laugh, you will never forget it. He introduced his daughters to Carlin and Pryor, loved watching old episodes of Carson, couldn't get enough of a National Lampoon's Vacation, but he always laughed hardest when he "left a message" for us. He taught his daughters to measure twice, cut once, the lawn mower does not need to be run at full speed to cut the grass, how to change a tire, a gentleman will always open the door for you, and that no one, not even Danny Zuko himself, rocked sideburns and Riddell shorts better than he did.

On Dec. 13, 2014, John married his loving wife, Vonnie. She survives him, along with his daughters, Dawn, Jeana and Erin Niemeyer; his brother, Dave Niemeyer; and his niece and nephew.

He will be deeply missed by those that knew him and loved him. He was an amazing coach, teammate, friend, husband,

and dad. He never met a stranger. It was a running joke that you couldn't go anywhere without running into someone he knew. Seriously, this wasn't just the grocery store or a quick run into town. Trips, vacations, restaurants, college, he always ran into someone he knew. We never tired of hearing stories about the Captain Coach, Niemo, or John, depending on how they knew him.

Growing up, he always quoted Lombardi in saying, "if you're early, you're on time...if you're on time, you're late...and if you're late, don't even bother showing up." As someone who always had perfect timing, he left us way too early, but he wanted to make sure he got there on time. For the man who always showed up, who left us with a lifetime of happy memories, for being our home, we love you.

John's family would like to thank the kind people at Hedges-Scott Funeral Home for their care at this difficult time.

Memorial Services are pending at this time until all family members can be in attendance.

EMBALMING PROCESS

The embalming process essentially involves replacing the blood and other bodily fluids with a preservative such as formaldehyde. Embalming is required by law only under certain circumstances, but families that intend to have a public viewing of the body usually choose to have it done, embalming preservative powers give them more leeway in scheduling a funeral. Embalmers are adept at restoring natural features that have been injured or to people who die after a long illness. They have a range of techniques to deal with various difficulties. They can replace missing hair, rebuild fractured features, or disguise the effects of



the drastic weight loss from a long, wasting illness. Before it is placed in the casket, the body is dressed and prepared for viewing. Hair is shampooed and set, and men get a shave. Families are sometimes encouraged to bring in a recent photograph of the deceased to help guide them.

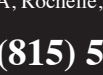
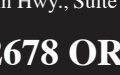

I have been using the walking track at The Rec Center. It is a nicely cushioned surface for my aging knees and hips.

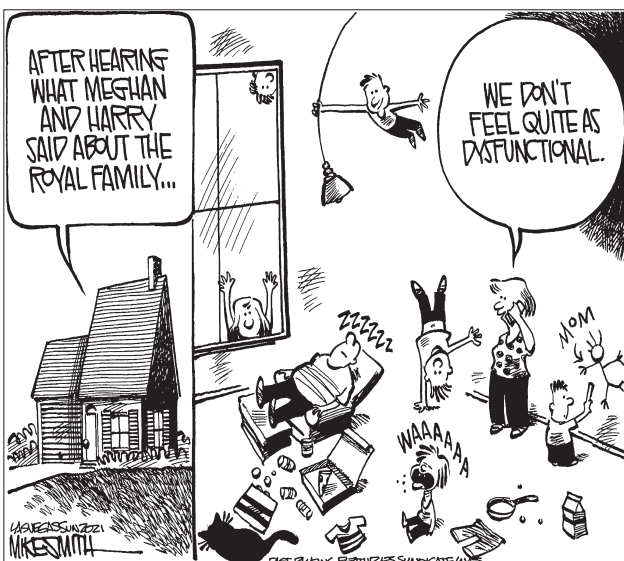
The place has been pretty busy, but I suspect with warmer weather there will be less ball teams practicing and fewer walkers, as they take to the outdoor recreation path.

I was a big fan of the rock group KISS back when I was in my early teens. I loved the over-the-top nature of the band. The bombastic music and visuals were perfect to attract the love and attention of teen boys.

Hey, we wanted to rock and roll all night and party every day, even though we really didn't party that much and had a set bedtime.

I remember that during that period my uncle from Arkansas came for a visit. He was a great guy and we all loved him. But he was a very religious, conservative guy. So when he launched into an anti-KISS diatribe, I was a bit surprised. To me, they were a living cartoon that played loud music. To him, they were Knight's in Satan's Service (some people really believed that is what KISS stood for) and that they should be banned because they were trying to warp young minds.

After getting over my

shock, I ultimately found it sad that my uncle could be that misinformed. I was also surprised he wanted to get the group banned.

That is what people these days are calling the "cancel culture." Let me tell you, this is not new, and it is not something the political left or the political right own. Everyone does it and always has.

I remember campaigns to cancel TV shows that certain groups found offensive. I remember in the 1980s, a group of Congressional wives had hearings on lyrics to songs they found offensive. This led to warning stickers on albums. Many artists complained of censorship.

Remember the Dixie Chicks? They were huge until they dared put down the policies of President George W. Bush. They were banned from country radio stations and their career was severely dam-

aged.

How about Colin Kaepernick? The former NFL quarterback decided to take a knee to protest the treatment of minorities in the country. This, in turn, had people accuse him of disrespecting veterans and the flag and it effectively ended his career.

These are all examples of this "cancel culture" we are hearing so much about right now. And why are we hearing so much about it? Because the Dr. Seuss Enterprises has decided to stop publishing six out of the roughly 60 books Dr. Seuss wrote and illustrated during his career because of racist and insensitive imagery.

To be clear, the company made the decision, and when I look at the material, I believe they are correct. But if you look at social media or certain 24-hour news channels, you would believe that people are out burning books and that we

are becoming Nazi Germany. We are not. All that is happening is that outdated and offensive depictions of some Americans will not be printed and sold in the future. If you find that offensive yourself, you might be in need of a little self-reflection.

Things change, people grow and cultural items that were once fine become offensive. That is called progress, folks. That has happened forever. Look at the Hays Commission and its effect on movies. It was all about censorship.

I find sloganeering sophomoric, to be frank. "Cancel culture" really means nothing. We change and cancel and morph constantly in this country. If you don't like it, that might mean you are out of step with the current culture, but that doesn't mean the current culture is wrong.

Change won't stop simply because it doesn't fit my world view or yours.

County issues reminder on burning waste

OREGON — As the snow melts and the winter yields to spring, many people will be spring cleaning and cleaning up their properties after the long winter.

The Ogle County Solid Waste Management Department reminds Ogle County residents that the open burning of most types of waste is illegal throughout Illinois. The open burning of garbage, demolition debris, old buildings, furniture, mattresses, tires, plastic, and other forms of municipal waste continue to be problematic for residents and the OCSWMD each spring.

Open burning of waste has been prohibited since the 1970s under the Illinois Environmental Protection Act and may be punishable through substantial fines.

Burning of solid waste leads to a variety of problems for area residents, including air pollution from

the smoke created, toxic burn piles after the fire, and the real possibility of the fire spreading beyond control. It can result in adverse impacts on your neighbors and your families’ health and safety, the local environment, and our local first responders.

The OCSWMD discourages all open burning of waste, including landscape waste. While the burning of landscape waste may be legal in parts of the county at certain times, the OCSWMD encourages other methods of management. Landscape waste, such as leaves, grass clippings, and branches and twigs can be either composted in a compost pile or mulched up and land applied onto your lawn. In certain municipalities landscape waste is collected by waste haulers so it can be transported to a regional compost site to be recycled

into fertile compost.

Residents who choose to burn landscape waste may only do so in unrestricted areas, with materials generated on the property. If you live in or near a municipality, check with their local open burning ordinances prior to any open burning. If you will be burning your landscape waste, the fire must not create nuisance air pollution for others, and may not obscure or interfere with modes of transportation, such as roads or rail lines. Be sure the fire does not smolder and create excess smoke, and that the fire cannot spread uncontrolled. The fire must be monitored at all times and a water source kept ready.

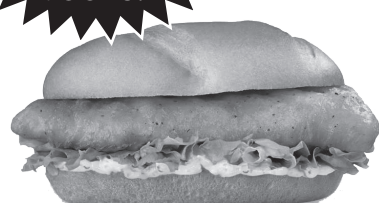

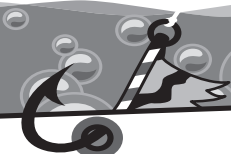

The secret to supernatural joy in your life

ALTHOUGH Jesus was "a man of suffering, and familiar with pain" (Isaiah 53:3 NIV), He possessed a deep joy beyond anything the world could offer. This was not easy to hear, but I had to face it before I could really "have and enjoy" the life Jesus came to give me. It was a life-changing revelation to realize that I couldn't really serve God and not serve people.

I've had good opportunities to practice being a servant. One time Dave hurt his back and he needed a lot of help for a while. He couldn't fully dress himself or bend over to put on his shoes and socks.

We treated his condition with ice and pain

medication, but he still couldn't function completely on his own, so I had to help him. In the morning I would hear him say, "Where is my helper?" I had become Dave's valet! (And he was enjoying it a bit too much.)

There are many ways we can serve God by helping others. When we're spending time in prayer each day, we should ask Him, "What can I do for You today, Lord? Who can I help today?" I've found that when I do this, He will put someone on my mind that I can encourage or reach out to in some way that day.

I may call them or send a text, letting them know how much I appreciate them. Or I may see a way I can help meet a need someone has. Living this way has greatly increased the joy of the Lord in my soul. I find that I'm the happiest I could be when I'm helping to make someone else's life better.

I want to encourage you to get your mind off of yourself and onto what you can do for others. See yourself as a servant of Jesus Christ, and spend more time thinking about how you can encourage someone or meet someone's need. As you do, you'll discover more of the joy Jesus wants to give you!

Senior Night revenge

Lady Hubs snap seven-game losing skid with 40-29 win over Morris

ROCHELLE — Senior Night was more than enough to motivate the Lady Hub varsity basketball team to snap its seven-game losing streak Wednesday evening, when Rochelle recognized its four senior players before tipping off an Interstate 8 rematch against the Morris Redskins.

Senior Sofia Lenkaitis fittingly led the Lady Hubs with 12 points, spearheading a second-half surge that allowed Rochelle to control the pace and ultimately win 40-29 over Morris, avenging a tough loss to the Redskins earlier this season. The Lady Hubs, who improved to 3-9 overall, dominated on defense once again, holding Morris under 30 points for the second straight time.

“It was very exciting,” Lenkaitis said. “We came out with a lot of intensity because it was Senior Night and we wanted to really play together. I’ve always enjoyed the family aspect of our team and that’s why I enjoy basketball so much. I thought our defense made the difference tonight.”

Burdin’s buzzer-beater lifts Hubs over Morris

Rochelle survives Redskins 54-51 on game-winning 3-point shot

MORRIS — With less than six seconds remaining in the Hub varsity basketball matchup against Morris on Wednesday, Rochelle was forced to improvise as the team looked for one final shot.

The Hubs attempted to run a set for junior Tanner Lager to score on an inside layup, but the Redskins successfully defended the play. Senior Garrett Burdin then inbounded the ball from the baseline to junior Noah Brown, who handed the ball back to Burdin as the clock nearly expired. Stepping back and firing from beyond the 3-point line, Burdin connected on the shot as the buzzer sounded, lifting Rochelle over Morris 54-51 and improving the team’s record to 7-6.

“We were trying to get something at the rim,” head coach Tim Thompson said. “We told the kids that if we didn’t score at the basket, we’d have to improvise. Garrett passed the ball to Noah and ran toward him

for a hand-off. Garrett caught the ball around the volleyball line and he ended up juking the defender and stepping back for the shot. As soon as he shot the ball, I heard him say, ‘game time,’ and I knew from looking at the shot that the ball was going in.”

The buzzer-beating triple from Burdin, who led Rochelle with 13 points on Wednesday, sealed a come-from-behind effort after Morris build a double-digit advantage during the third quarter. The Redskins caught fire from 3-point range early, knocking down five triples in the first quarter to take an 18-10 lead. But the Hubs locked in on defense as the game progressed, holding Morris to only five fourth-quarter points and tying the game with roughly 30 seconds left.

“We were a little weary after Tuesday night and Morris came out strong,” Thompson said. “They shot 65 percent from 3-point range in the first half and we knew they wouldn’t be able to maintain that. We tightened up our defense in the second half and we did enough to make things more difficult for them. We forced some big turnovers in the fourth quarter and grabbed some loose balls to tighten the game up. We did enough to get back in the game.”

Brown scored 10 points and led the Hubs with four steals in the win, while Burdin and junior Ryan Simmons each added three steals on the defensive end. Junior Zach Sanford chipped in seven points for the Hubs, who will play their season finale at Ottawa this weekend.

Ottawa outlasts Lady Hubs in conference finale

Pirates surge late to win 53-44 over Rochelle as shortened season concludes

ROCHELLE — The Lady Hub varsity basketball team fought as hard as it could into the final minutes Friday evening, when Rochelle battled to close out its unprecedented shortened season with a home victory against the Ottawa Pirates in the team's last conference game.

Rochelle and Ottawa remained tied after each of the first three quarters. Neither team extended its lead beyond five points until Pirate guard Brooke Waddell drained two straight 3-pointers to put Ottawa ahead 47-41 midway through the fourth quarter. Waddell's shooting surge was all the Pirates needed to hold off the Lady Hubs, winning 53-44 and handing Rochelle a loss in the team's final game. The Lady Hubs finished 3-10 in the Interstate 8 this season.

"It was definitely one of our best games of the season from start to finish," head coach Tony Rowan said. "We want to compete at the highest level and this was definitely a winnable game for us. The kids executed well, but we didn't knock down enough shots and Ottawa hit free throws to stretch its lead late in the game. Our communication was phenomenal tonight."

Although Waddell led the Pirates with 17 points on Friday, Rochelle held her to only one point in the opening quarter, where

junior Josie Lundquist made a series of aggressive drives to the basket for five Lady Hub points. Rochelle also succeeded early on in shutting down Pirate guard Ella Marvel, who finished with 15 points but had zero in the first quarter. Junior Zoey Tabor attacked the rim in the second quarter, drawing two fouls and making all four free throws.

"We knew where to switch on defense," Rowan said. "The kids were rotating perfectly and our help lines were great... We made sure we weren't giving up any layups and we made their guards step out and shoot from far beyond the 3-point line, which are tough shots to defend."

Both teams were tied 10-10 after the first quarter, but neither team managed to make a run before half-time, with the score showing 19-19 at the half. The Lady Hubs utilized a collective effort to stay with the Pirates in the third quarter, with seven Rochelle players scoring including senior Sofia Lenkaitis, who nailed a 3-pointer from the top of the arc for three of her nine points. However, both teams remained tied after the third quarter by a score of 34-34.

Foul issues plagued Ottawa in the first half, with the Pirates committing well over 10 fouls over the first two quarters. That theme was reversed in the second half, though, as Rochelle found itself down six points and over the seven-foul

limit with nearly three minutes remaining. Ottawa went only 6-for-11 from the free-throw line down the stretch, but the Lady Hubs were unable to come up

with enough makes to rally back. Tabor led Rochelle with 11 points Friday.

"We always talk about how we're a family," Rowan said. "We spent a lot

of time together and even though we didn't have the same type of bus trips and time together this season because of COVID-19, the kids embraced each other

and I'm really proud about that. We need to have more girls in the gym. We can't have only a few girls in the gym who are trying to improve."
