





## Technology in the classroom vital to MHS's instruction process

Thanks to technology, Mendota High School has been successful in providing both remote and in-person education to its students during the last 12 months despite restrictions and closures caused by COVID-19.

Looking back over the past year, MHS English teacher David Ross said many teachers and administrators were left scrambling when schools were abruptly closed in 2020 due to the pandemic. "It is hard to believe that many students have not been in a classroom since last March. No one could have seen that coming – but it happened," he said. "Overall, I am very proud of what we have done at Mendota High School, and I believe the last two semesters have been a huge success considering the circumstances."

Ross believes much of that success was dependent on the technology already in place at MHS. "First off, without being 1:1 (all students are issued a school Chromebook), I do not believe a lot of that success would have been possible," he said of the program that began at MHS almost five years ago. "Although we could have never predicted what happened last March, it certainly allowed us to handle the situation more effectively. With a heavy lean on Google Classroom, Zoom (and now Google Meet), ScreenCastify, Dochub, Turnitin, Scanning Apps, and more, I was able to keep my classes running very similarly to a typical year in terms of pacing and instruction. Many of the programs and apps that I have been using are free and provided as addons in our Google Education

accounts."

Ross pointed out that technology has its limita-

tions, however. He was not able to field questions and interact with students in the same way that he would in person. "However, I was still able to have class lectures, discussions, post assignments, create video tutorials, and continue to bore students with talk of Greek Mythology and Julius Caesar," he joked.

Jason Artman, Social Science teacher, has been using Checkology, a product of the News Literacy Project. "It's an online platform through which students complete lessons on how the media and social media work," he explained. "We tie it to in-person lessons and examples from pop culture and media."

His students are also compiling history portfolios through a combination of Google Docs and Google Forms. "Students also really liked the interactive lessons I did with iCivics, a free site promoting civic education that was founded with the cooperation of former U.S. Supreme Court Justice Sandra Day O'Connor," Artman added.

Brock Zinke, Instructional Coach/Social Studies and Driver Education teacher, has relied on technology for both his driver education and psychology classes.

"During the pandemic, I have utilized Google Sites, Google Classroom, Flipgrid, and Zoom/Google Meets," Zinke said, explaining that Google Sites is an application that allows users to create

their own website. "I created one a few years ago for my driver education courses but updated and revamped it this year and also created one for my psychology course. It is a great tool that allows me to project my class information to students and their parents and all they need is the shareable link."

Zinke said Google Sites also pairs well with Google Classroom, which is something he has relied on heavily over the past few years but especially this year. He explained that Google Classroom is essentially a student's classwork/testing hub where they go to turn in assignments. "Google Sites provides the class materials to them, and Google Classroom is where they go to complete their work."

Another piece of technology Zinke utilized this year is Flipgrid. "Flipgrid allows me to create a topic or prompt and the students then create a video as their response," he said. "There are unique filters students can use to personalize their videos. Students create videos for other social apps like TikTok or Snapchat, so Flipgrid ties directly into this model."

Finally, Zoomand Google Meets have allowed Zinke to connect with his students when they were not allowed to be at school for in-person instruction. These video conferencing tools allow users to see each other's faces and communicate through conversation or instant messaging and they

also provide teachers the ability to share their screen so students can see exactly what information is given during a presentation.

"All of these tools have played a role in helping students learn throughout a pandemic," Zinke noted. "I am grateful for them and thankful for the willingness to use these tools from students and their families."

Most recently, MHS Principal Denise Aughenbaugh announced that Mendota High School now has its own custom app. Students, parents

and the community can search for the MHS app in the app store through Apple or Google Play. The MHS app links all of the high school social media and website links and information into one place.


The custom school app allows users to access information from websites, social media, broadcasts (You Tube or games), and important calendar events. Parents can receive "push" alerts for important notifications with the InTouch notification service. It has a web link library so the mobile app can be an

important hub for district information. The MHS logo identifies the high school as a custom layout.

"We hope everyone checks out the Mendota High School App for news stories, events calendar, Parent Connect, student apps, activity feed, cafeteria menu, EZ SchoolPay, MHS Facebook, MHS Twitter, MHS You Tube streamed events, departments, directory, district calendar, Guidance Office, documents, Booster Club, and daily announcements," Aughenbaugh said.

removed, and the necessary underground work took place. The new asphalt roadway and concrete sidewalks were completed later in the summer.

Decorative benches and trash cans were added in September, and decorative light poles were put in place in

The former Campbell's

building on Illinois Avenue in downtown Mendota was razed in March. The city of Mendota, which owns the property, will offer the lot for sale.

The city also purchased property at 704 Illinois Ave., the former Meyers Furniture building, in the amount of \$23,000. The city hopes to attract a business tenant for the building.

A series of bid openings were held in October for the South East Mendota Sanitary Sewer Systems Improvements program. Bids were awarded for the Seventh Avenue Pump Station, the S&L Pump Station Demolition and the Front Street Gravity Sewer, the Seventh Avenue Force Main Replacement project the Cherry Street Gravity Sewer Extension project.

In an ongoing effort to improve security, three new security cameras were put up in the downtown area and two were added to Strouss Park.

### Despite setbacks, city forges on with accomplishments in 2020

The year 2020 was an unusual one indeed for the City of Mendota and the entire world with the COVID-19 pandemic sweeping the globe. While significant restrictions were imposed to try to curb the spread of the disease, many things were able to be accomplished in Mendota during the year.

#### **CITY COUNCIL**

Bill Hunt, who served the Fourth Ward since 2009, resigned from his seat on the council effective Feb. 29. He was replaced on the council by Vicki Johnson in March.

#### COVID-19

Mendota joined the rest of the state when Governor JB Pritzker's "Stay at Home Executive Order" went into effect on March 21 as the COVID-19 pandemic began to take hold. The order prohibited activities such as visiting the homes of friends and holding gatherings of any size, and closed all non-essential establishments, including most retail, recreation and entertainment businesses.

In April, Mayor David Boelk announced that due to the current health situation. the Mendota swimming pool would not be open this summer. In May, Mayor Boelk said that although the Mendota Area Chamber of Commerce was holding off until July to make a final decision, the 2020 Mendota Sweet Corn Festival "will not take place as we know it."

The pandemic continued to rage and in August, the City Council declared a Local State of Emergency and passed ordinances in regard to that state of emergency and the wearing of face coverings. This was in response to a five-fold increase in the number of COVID-19 confirmed cases in Mendota within the last four weeks.

Then in November, the City Council adopted another State of Emergency Declaration in the ongoing battle with the spread of COVID-19. As of Oct. 28, the LaSalle County positivity rate was approximately 6.3 percent, whereas the Mendota rate was at more than 12.2 percent.

#### GAS PLANT

Heavy machinery was moved in for the cleanup of what was an old gas plant located at the southeast corner of Ninth Avenue and Fifth Street in Mendota in February. Nicor Gas and ComEd are partnering to clean up the area under the oversight of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency. Cleanup of the property began in November 2019 and the targeted conclusion is the fall of 2021. A temporary fabric enclosure was installed over the area in early April to help minimize dust and potential odors during the majority of the cleanup.


At the end of October, the next phase of work began. That included preparing the new area for excavation by driving the final phase of earth retention metal sheeting into the ground. After the earth retention work was completed, a crane was brought onsite to move the temporary fabric enclosure, in three sections, to its next and last position. After relocation, the next phase of work under the enclosure began and is expected to be completed in spring 2021. Then the enclosure will be removed and the project will move to the excavation of soil on city property in a section of Ninth Avenue and the creek next to the former


