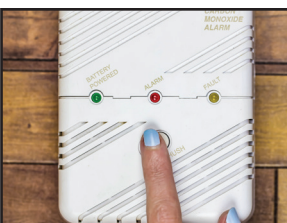

A virtual reception

Congressional art winners recognized despite
cancellation of in-person celebration

ROCHELLE — Last academic year, U.S. Rep. Adam Kinzinger chose Marlen Hueramo's drawing entitled "El Loro" for the 2020 Congressional Art Competition, a celebration of artistic discovery by the nation's high school students.

El Loro is currently on display in the U.S. Capitol; however, Hueramo will not get to see it exhibited there with the other winners' works as is generally part of the winning recipient's prize.

Like so many activities this year, The Congressional Institute cannot host the traditional in-person reception celebrating the winners.

"We know how much students and their families appreciate being able to see their artwork (hanging) in the Capitol," Kinzinger's aide, Leah Bohlmann, recently told Hueramo.

In place of the in-person experience, The Congressional Institute created a virtual reception featuring videos from the Congressional Co-Chairs, Rep. Warren Davidson and Del. Gregorio Sablan, as well as letters from U.S. House Speaker Nancy Pelosi and Minority Leader

Rochelle Foods provides money for local meals

ROCHELLE — A program implemented by Rochelle Foods is helping support local businesses and those in need.

Rochelle Foods recently provided \$5,000 each to the Rochelle Rescue Mission and Hope of Ogle County to purchase meals for their guests from local restaurants. The program helps support local restaurants, nonprofit organizations and those served by them.

"We know due to the coronavirus pandemic, local restaurant owners have had to deal with dining room closures and restrictions, and it has severely impacted their businesses, while more families right here in Rochelle and the surrounding communities are facing food insecurity," Rochelle Foods Plant Manager Bill Rice said. "Through our partnership with the Rochelle Rescue Mission, Hope of Ogle County and local restaurants, we will be

able to provide assistance to those in need while helping to support our local restaurants."

Local restaurants included in the program are Alfano's Pizzeria and Italian Restaurant, Butterfly Family Restaurant, El Senor De Los Tacos and Sunrise Restaurant; however, more restaurants may be added.

"Rochelle Foods is providing our clients meals they wouldn't normally be able to get and it helps our local restaurants financially," said Janie Kampf, Hope of Ogle County shelter coordinator. "It's such an amazing donation to our

organization that will help us provide warm meals this winter for months to come."

Alfano's posted on its Facebook page Friday about the program.

"Shout out to Rochelle Foods for donating (opening accounts) to help feed our homeless and less fortunate," the post read. "We at Alfano's are proud to be a small part as one of the restaurants participating. And by the way, So far over 500 of your employees have asked us to thank you for buying them each a large pizza any type they want. Helping your community, staff and local businesses."

Pritzker pressed over vaccine rollout numbers

SPRINGFIELD—Gov. JB Pritzker pushed back on criticisms of the state's COVID-19 vaccine rollout Thursday, Jan. 29, saying state officials are "doing everything we can" to ensure timely delivery of doses.

Illinois currently ranks 47th among all 50 states in vaccine distribution, with 4.8 percent of the state's 12.7 million residents having been vaccinated so far. The state has issued 829,488 total doses of the COVID-19 vaccine as of Thursday, with only 1.4 percent of the state's population having received both required doses.

Some state lawmakers have criticized the Pritzker administration for the slow delivery of the vaccine, especially at long-term care facilities that have been prioritized under the state's vaccine distribution plan.

The state reported Thursday that 131,284 doses have been issued at long-term care facilities out of 496,100 doses allocated, just 26 percent of the total allotted to them. Those vaccines are administered through a federal Pharmacy Partnership program with nationwide pharmacy chains Walgreens and CVS.

State senators from both parties asked for more transparency from the administration regarding the distribution of vaccines in a pair of letters to the governor's office this week. In a letter to the governor on Thursday, Senate Republicans said "Illinois has failed its residents."

"We are asking for you to provide a clear explanation to legislators and to the citizens of Illinois as to why Illinois is among the worst states in regard to getting vaccines out to those who need it most," the GOP Senators wrote in the letter. "With all due respect, blaming the previous President, the federal government and CVS/Walgreens simply will not suffice."

Pritzker said Thursday that he had spoken to leaders from Walgreens and CVS pharmacies, and said the companies plan to have the first round of vaccinations at assisted living and long-term care facilities complete by Feb. 15.

Pritzker said the state helped administer vaccinations at state veterans homes to ease the burden

on Walgreens and CVS, and has placed the blame for the state's lag in vaccinations on a slow delivery process from the federal government.

He said the federal government's requirement to keep a set number of vaccines in reserve for second doses has also contributed to the lag.

The governor's remarks come as the state recorded another single-day record for vaccinations, delivering 55,865 doses Wednesday.

Pritzker said he is hopeful the single-day numbers will continue to increase as the federal government authorizes increased production and the state works to build out its vaccination facilities.

In total, nearly 1.8 million vaccines have been delivered to the state so far. The state moved into Phase 1B of its vaccination plan on Monday, meaning an estimated 3.2 million additional residents are eligible to receive a vaccine, including people age 65 and older as well as non-healthcare frontline essential workers.

Update

The state's rolling COVID-19 positivity rate has continued on a steady decline over the past two weeks, standing at 4.4 percent Thursday, Jan. 29. That marked the 20th consecutive day that figure has decreased, and the lowest it has been since Oct. 13.

State public health officials reported 4,191 new and probable cases of COVID-19 on Thursday out of 100,119 administered tests.

The state has seen a total of 1.1 million cases of COVID-19 to date. Health officials reported 103 additional deaths Thursday, bringing the total number of deaths in the state to 19,067.

There was no movement in COVID-19 mitigations Thursday. Region 4 in the Metro East region near St. Louis was the only region to remain under stricter Tier 2 mitigations, which prohibits indoor service at bars and restaurants.

Regions 7 through 11, which include Chicago and surrounding suburban counties, remained under Tier 1 mitigations, which allow for some limited indoor dining and service.

The rest of the state has been returned to Phase 4 of the Restore Illinois plan with normal mitigation measures in place.

Waste reduction and recycling grants available

OGLE COUNTY — Waste Reduction/Recycling Grants for 2021 are available to Ogle County businesses, schools, churches and non-profit groups wanting to establish or improve on waste reduction and recycling programs and services.

The grants are up to \$2,000 and funds are limited so they will be awarded on a competitive basis in amounts from \$100 to \$2,000 in three rounds or until funds are depleted. Applicants must provide a minimum 20 percent match of the total project cost. The deadline for submittal of applications for the first round of grants is 4 p.m. Wednesday, March 3.

The application for the grants is simple and flexible. Businesses could use grant funds to help purchase waste reduction and recycling materials and equipment such as collection bins, carts, balers and storage containers. Equipment needed to switch from disposable packaging to reusable packaging for products and supplies could also be considered.

Businesses are encouraged to consider projects to reduce food waste or implement food waste recycling programs.

Waste hauling companies could use grant funds to improve the quantity and quality of materials collected in their curbside recycling collection programs. This could be done through promotional efforts, instructional stickers for carts and

bins, direct mail, and other educational efforts.

Schools may seek funds for special projects that will further a student's understanding of how to reduce the amount of trash sent to the landfill. The requests may be for materials and equipment, such as recycling bins/carts, videos, books, worm (vermicomposting) bins, composters, or other waste reduction or recycling equipment.

Municipalities seeking to improve commercial, curbside, or multifamily recycling programs are encouraged to apply. Grant applications for equipment and materials needed to improve electronics recycling options in Ogle County are also encouraged since most electronics have been banned from landfills since 2012.

These are just examples, and applicants are encouraged to find innovative ways to reduce waste and increase what is recycled. The grants may not be used to pay for ongoing expenses such as staffing, collection, and hauling costs. Priority will be given to new applicants.

All applications will be reviewed by the Ogle County Solid Waste Management Department and the Ogle County Board Solid Waste Committee.

County Soil and Water District to hold board of directors election on Feb. 9

OGLE COUNTY — The Ogle County Soil and Water Conservation District will hold its annual election for directors of the District Board on Feb. 9.

The election will take place at the Ogle County Farm Bureau, 421 W. Pines Road, Oregon. Voters must use the south entrance nearest the auditorium. COVID-19 protocol of wearing a mask and social distancing will be enforced.

Ballot voting will take

place between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. Anyone who owns or occupies land within Ogle County is eligible to vote.

There are five directors on the Soil and Water Conservation District Board. Directors serve two-year terms and must be owners or occupiers of land within Ogle County. This year two director positions are up for election.

The following candidates have been placed on the ballot to fill the two open positions: incumbent Marcia Heuer of Oregon,

incumbent Jon Pearson of Mount Morris and Paul Priester of Rochelle.

The other three director positions are currently held by Cade Bushnell of Stillman Valley, Cody Considine of Byron and Kayse Rushford of Oregon.

The Ogle County Soil and Water Conservation District is a not-for-profit local unit of government in Ogle County, formed in 1942, to help provide landowners technical and educational assistance in

applying conservation practices.

Today, the Ogle County SWCD has the responsibility to inform the public on the wise use of natural resources, addressing nutrient management, the application of conservation practices, wildlife habitat, forest uses, water quality, natural resource education, construction and zoning uses.

Carbon monoxide safety is key to staying safe and warm this winter

Illinois Fire Departments responded to nearly 11,000 carbon monoxide incidents in 2019

SPRINGFIELD — Cold winter winds continue to bring a chill to the state meaning many Illinoisans will be turning up their thermostats to stay warm for the rest of the winter season. The Office of the State Fire Marshal encourages residents to have their furnaces checked, change furnace filters and to make sure carbon monoxide (CO) and smoke detectors are functioning properly.

According to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), heating equipment is a leading cause of home fires in the United States. Local fire departments responded to an average of 52,050 fires involving heating equipment each year in 2012-16, accounting for 15 percent of all reported home fires during that time.

Annually, these fire lead to the loss of 490 civilians' lives, 1,400 civilian injuries and account for around \$1 billion in direct property damage. Half of home heating fires are reported during the months of December, January and February.

"Unlike smoke, carbon monoxide is a colorless and odorless gas only detectable by special devices and CO alarms. This means it's imperative that you have working CO alarms in your home to help keep you and your family safe. There



are numerous brands of CO alarms available at most retailers across the state, some that are a combination CO/Smoke alarm that can provide dual protection. These alarms, just like smoke alarms, need to be tested monthly to ensure they are working properly," said Illinois State Fire Marshal Matt Perez.

In 2019 according to National Fire Incident Reporting System (NFIRS), Illinois Fire Departments responded to over 23,000 calls about carbon monoxide in 2019 and were able

to determine a CO leak at nearly 11,000 of those locations.

Symptoms of CO poisoning are very similar to the flu and include headache, fatigue, shortness of breath, nausea and dizziness. Other signs of possible CO presence include condensation on walls and windows, house pets becoming sluggish and chronic odors from malfunctioning appliances.

If you suspect you may be experiencing these symptoms, smell natural gas leaking in your home, or if your CO alarm activates, if you can

evacuate the building, do so immediately. Only open windows on your way out if they are easily accessible. If someone is unable to leave the building, or is unconscious, open doors and windows to the outside in the area the person is located and stay as near to the open window or door as possible until first responders arrive. Close any doors that open to other areas of the building to isolate the room the person is in. Turn on any exhaust fans that may be present. Once you evacuate, then call 9-1-1 from outside your home or a neighbor's house.

Space heaters lead to countless fires due to improper use during the winter months. It's important to plug space heaters directly into wall outlets and not extension cords. Keep space heaters at least three feet from curtains, clothing, furniture or bedding. Purchase units with an automatic shutoff in case the unit tips over or you forget to shut it off.

Here are some tips to keep in mind when it comes to winter heating safety:

Have heating equipment and chimneys cleaned and inspected every year by a qualified professional; change furnace filters frequently.

Have a qualified professional install sta-

tionary space heating equipment, water heaters or central heating equipment according to the local codes and manufacturers' instructions.

Keep interior and exterior air vents clear of blockages or obstructions.

Keep anything that can burn at least three feet away from heating equipment, like a furnace, fireplace, wood stove, or portable space heater.

Make sure the fireplace has a sturdy screen to stop sparks from flying into the room. Ashes should be cool before being placed into a metal container. Keep the container a safe distance away from your home.

Create a three-foot "kid-free zone" around open fires and space heaters.

Test smoke and CO alarms at least once a month and be familiar with the sounds they make.

Never use an oven or range to heat your home.

Remember to turn off portable or space heaters when leaving the room or going to bed.

Install carbon monoxide and smoke detectors on each floor of your home and within 15 feet of each sleeping area.

CO detectors have a limited life span, check the manufacturer's instructions for information on replacement.

State Police release 2020 stats

STERLING — Illinois State Police District 1 Commander, Captain Matthew Hodgdon, has announced activity and enforcement figures for the calendar year 2020.

Troopers in District 1, which includes Carroll, Lee, Ogle and Whiteside counties, recorded 9,836 incidents during the year.

In addition, enforcement figures totaled 4,313 citations and 3,686 written warnings, including 2,529 speeding citations, 51 DUI arrests, 303 occupant restraint citations, 201 distracted driving citations, 48 move over (Scott's Law) citations, 1,015 written warnings for speeding, and 142 criminal arrests.

Troopers conducted 628 Motor Carrier Safety Inspections with 74 being placed out of service for safety violations. Additionally, troopers conducted 78 portable scale details, which resulted in 70 overweight citations and 86 overweight warnings being issued. District 1 handled 233 traffic crashes and assisted 1,253 motorists.

During the year, 3,084 citations were issued for "Fatal Four" violations. These violations are most associated with fatal traffic crashes and include Speeding, DUI, Failure to Wear a Seat Belt and Distracted Driving.

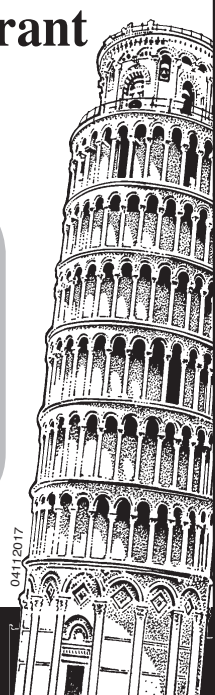

Decisions, decisions

ONE of the greatest gifts the Lord has given us is the power to choose. In fact, every day we are faced with literally hundreds of choices. The question is, are we making the right ones?

Think about your own life for a moment. When you have a decision to make, do you normally go with the flow, doing whatever feels right... or do you pray for wisdom and ask the Lord for insight?

I love Proverbs 3:5-6. It says, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight" (NIV).

If you are anything like me, you know how easy it is to lean "on your own understanding." However, just because something might sound good, feel good, and look like the right thing to do, it doesn't mean it's God's best for you or necessarily the right direction to take.

Let me give you an example. Early in my ministry, I had the idea to do a local TV talk show in St. Louis. We got a group of ladies together who were well educated in the Bible, and we rented some studio space at a local TV station to do the taping.

I was trying to do an interview show, but every time I asked a question, I'd answer it myself! I just couldn't quiet down long enough to let anybody else respond.

Obviously, this didn't work because it was my plan, not God's. In six months we received one piece of mail!

A few years later, the Lord directed us to go on TV and we didn't have a clue what we were doing. We rented a banquet room where the ceiling was too low and some of the tiles were caving in. We placed a podium on a stage, and for a backdrop we took this blue thing that looked like a shower curtain and strung it up on a pole behind me.

It looked ridiculous, but the very first day my program aired, we received 125 calls! That was the beginning of our television ministry, which continued to expand and now airs throughout two-thirds of the world.

Proverbs 3:7 says, "Do not be wise in your own eyes." I believe God is telling us, "Don't think you can run your life and do a good job without My help and direction."

Sure, we can come up with some good ideas on our own, but many times we settle

for good when God wants to give us great.

It seems many Christians struggle with making decisions because they're afraid they won't hear from God. However, the Lord longs to give us direction, and He desires to speak to us in so many ways...

First and foremost, He has given us His Word. The Bible tells us that God's Word is alive, active and powerful (see Hebrews 4:12). In fact, John 1:14 says this about Jesus, "The Word became flesh."

So, when we read and study the Bible, we're not just reading a good book; we are actually spending time with God Himself. And the Bible is our instruction book for life!

The Lord can also speak to us through our conscience, other people, and even the world around us. But one of the main ways the Lord will direct us is through peace. Colossians 3:15 says, "Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, since as members of one body you were called to peace."

This is saying that just as the umpire in a ball game decides if the ball or player is "in" or "out," similarly, peace is the umpire that decides if something in our

lives should be in or out.

There have been times when I have been invited to speak at a conference or special event, and I have really wanted to accept. However, I didn't have peace about doing it, so I decided to decline.

Now, I may not always know why I shouldn't go, but I have learned (sometimes the hard way) that God knows things I don't.

I encourage you to let the peace in your heart decide with finality every question that arises in your mind. If you are getting ready to make a major decision, ask the Lord for His guidance. Remember, when you acknowledge Him in all your ways, He will direct your path (Proverbs 3:6).

If you aren't used to praying about decisions, it may seem awkward at first. But the more you seek the Lord and ask for help, the easier it gets... and the more sensitive you will become to His presence and direction.

Don't settle for "good enough." God has a great plan for your future, and as you seek Him for guidance, He will be faithful to lead you in every single decision you make.

I may be in my 70s, but I still have a spirit of adventure. So, I would like to go to the International Space Station.

The Ogle County Health Department is moving into phase 1B of vaccinating for COVID. According to the OCHD this includes essential front line workers and those over age 65.

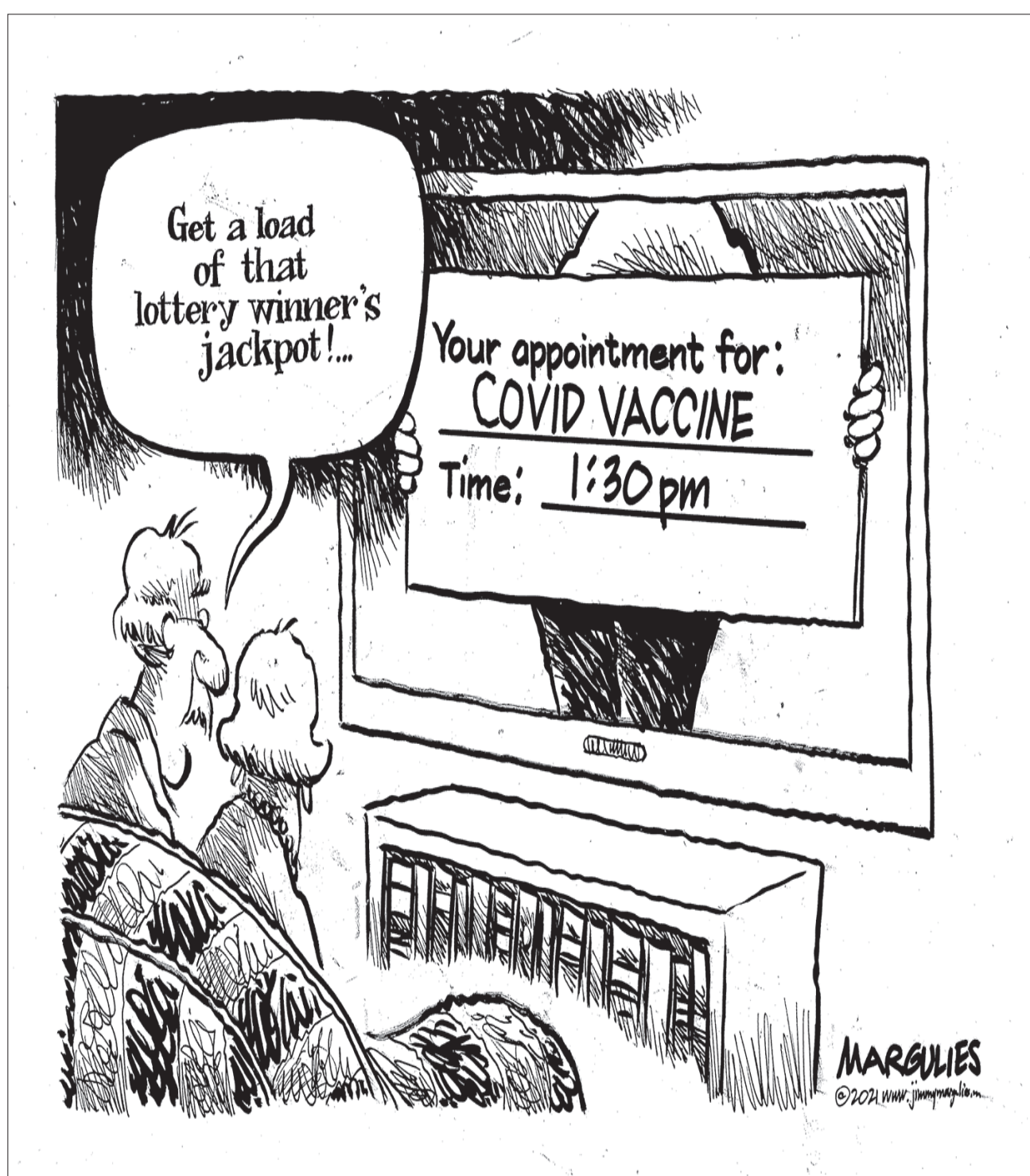
The department estimates approximately 22,000 who qualify in Ogle County. That's a lot of shots. They ask that people be patient.

Committed to Constitution first

POLITICIANS that people can look up to are pretty few and far between these days. My go to is always John McCain, the former U.S. senator from Arizona.

McCain was a great American and a good man. He always put his country before his party, which is the way things should be.

Well, recently another politician did the same thing, and he has gotten a mixture of praise and grief for it. I am talking about U.S. Rep. Adam Kinzinger, the Illinois Republican who represents our area.

When insurrectionists stormed the U.S. Capitol on Jan. 6, Kinzinger was there. He locked himself in his office and said he felt, "a real dark and evil sense coming over the place."

Anyone watching the horrific events on TV probably felt the same.

He also said he felt a "profound sadness" that day as events unfolded. That is also

something most of us felt. Shock, sadness, horror and concern for this great nation.

But Kinzinger is an elected official and he had the platform to speak out against these events, and he did. On social media that day, he referred to the event as a "coup." He also supported the impeachment of President Donald Trump for inciting the unrest.

I understand that some Republicans are not happy with Kinzinger because of this. I know that they think elected officials should stick with their party and their leaders no matter what. Kinzinger put his own professional future in jeopardy by being vocal in his opposition not only of the events of Jan. 6, but also the actions of President Trump.

But here is the thing that people seem to forget, no matter where they fall politically. Elected officials like Kinzinger swear

an oath to protect the Constitution, not a political party. As a veteran myself — like Kinzinger of the U.S. Air Force — I understand that our great nation is what he must protect, not politicians.

But we live in an age of raging partisanship, where politicians have to pass some litmus test to show how "pure" they are for the loudest voices in their party.

In my mind, Kinzinger passed the test that mattered when it came to the events of Jan. 6 and the aftermath. He chose country over party. He chose to do what he felt was the right thing. He did not apologize for it, and he did not ask for forgiveness. He did what he felt was his constitutional duty.

I also believe this is a constitutional question, not a political one. Again, Kinzinger's oath is to the nation and its constitution, not any single president or party. And he let that be his

guiding principle.

Now people can disagree with him, clearly. And they can also vote against him when the next election rolls around.

But I think if you look at his actions with political parties pushed to the side, he did exactly what he is charged with doing. Isn't that what we hope all of our elected officials will do?

Time will tell if this will help or hurt his political career. But doing the right thing, even when it means going against your party or its leadership, never hurt McCain. In fact, even though he was a staunch conservative, it never hurt him in an election in his home state as he won votes across the political spectrum.

The highest praise I can give any elected official is that his or her actions were McCain-like. Kinzinger has earned that praise.

New calendar revealed

Basketball season ends March 13, football season begins March 3

BLOOMINGTON — The IHSA Board of Directors met for a special board meeting on Jan. 27, where the Board provided an updated sports schedule and other guidance for the remainder of the 2020-21 school year.

“We understood the high level of anticipation surrounding today’s announcement, along with the scrutiny that will accompany it,” said IHSA Executive Director Craig Anderson. “Ultimately, the board adhered to its stated goals throughout the pandemic: Providing an opportunity for every IHSA student-athlete to compete safely this year and maximizing opportunities for traditional IHSA spring sports after they lost their entire season a year ago. I recognize that many schools and coaches could likely offer a tweak here or there that would have, in their opinion, made it ‘better’ for their school or sport. Our board faced an impossible task with a litany of factors. They were conscientious in considering every possibility and I believe their decisions today are a positive step for

the mental, emotional, and physical well-being of our students. We are excited to channel our energy into creating as many positive experiences for Illinois high school students as we can between now and the end of this extraordinary school year.”

Winter sports including boys and girls basketball, boys swimming and diving, dance, cheerleading, boys and girls bowling and girls gymnastics can start practices as soon as possible. Winter sports will begin immediately and run through March 13, with badminton running through April 3. Dance and cheerleading will have a virtual state series, while bowling, gymnastics, basketball, swimming and diving will have no state series. A state badminton series is to be determined.

Spring sports will include boys soccer (March 1 through April 17), girls volleyball (March 8 through April 24), boys gymnastics (March 15 through May 22), boys and girls water polo (March 15 through May 29) and football (March 3 through April 24 with first games

on March 19). Football teams must conduct 12 practices before their first games. No spring sports will have state series events.

Summer sports include wrestling (April 19 through June 12), baseball, softball, girls soccer, boys tennis, boys and girls track and field, boys and girls lacrosse and boys volleyball (April 5 through June 19). Wrestling will not have a state series, while the remaining summer sports are to be determined.

All sports that are out-of-season can conduct contact days through June 4.

Lady Hubs resume offseason contact days

Workouts held Wednesdays and Sundays at RTHS main gym

ROCHELLE—While Rochelle Township High School’s winter sports programs begin ramping up activities to prepare for the upcoming season, spring sports including the Lady Hub volleyball program are returning for offseason contact days to gear up for the warmer months.

After over two months removed from any athletic activities due to COVID-19 mitigations, Rochelle resumed its open-gym volleyball workouts for the first time since fall contact days expired in late October. The Lady Hubs will hold open gyms every Wednesday and Sunday from 7-8 p.m. to prepare for the upcoming season, which will run from March 8 through April 24.

“I’m more excited now than I was before because we have a definitive start date that won’t change,” head coach Molly Sly said. “We knew the start date of our season was up in the air for a while but I’m excited

that we have an exact date for our season because we can start preparing for that time and we can be ready to hit the ground running when that time arrives.”

Volleyball teams must hold seven practice days before beginning competitions, meaning Rochelle could begin matches as soon as March 15. Under the revised IDPH All Sports Policy, volleyball remains a medium-risk sport, meaning regions under Phase 4 mitigations can compete under Level 3 guidance, which permits conference and intraregional competition. Additionally, all players and non-participants must wear masks during practices and games.

“We’re scheduled to work out two days a week right now, but my hope is that we can start working out at least three days a week,” Sly said. “We’re considering these workouts as open gyms right now, but our plan will be to have true contact days as we move closer to the start of the season.”

"I feel I performed very well during my junior year," Solano said. "I feel that I did

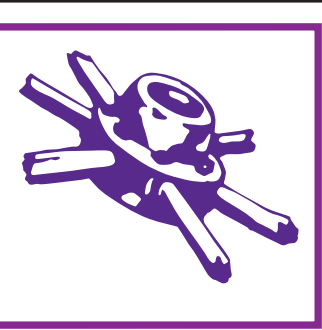

Contact days are limited to three days per week per sport with a maximum of six hours of contact per week with no interscholastic competition.

The board is considering state series competition for traditional IHSA spring sports only. Dance and cheerleading will be allowed to conduct virtual sectional and state final meets, as they will record their performances and submit them to be judged. “The board wants to do everything in their power to prevent spring sports from going two consecutive years with no postseason IHSA play,” said Anderson. “There are obviously no guarantees, as risk levels by sport and local region mitigation statuses will factor significantly. Postseason could mean being limited to a regional or sectional level of competition, but we have not ruled out the idea of playing a full state tournament in these traditional spring sports if possible. The overwhelming feedback we have heard from athletic directors and coaches was that returning to play in all sports should be the main goal.”

With the exception of football, which requires individuals to participate in practice on 12 different days, all sports will be required to hold practice on seven different days prior to holding a contest. Holding multiple practices on a date does not impact that timeline. If student-athletes transition from basketball or boys swimming & diving into football, they will need to participate in practice on 10 different days prior to their first contest. Winter

sport contests could begin as early as today, dependent on when a school’s region reached the appropriate mitigation status and when they began practices.

The IHSA Sports Medicine Advisory Committee (SMAC) issued a statement reminding all student-athletes, coaches, and schools on the importance of acclimatization.

“The IHSA SMAC reminds member schools that student-athletes may need additional conditioning in order to participate in a full schedule this season. In addition to season/practice requirements, care needs to be given to each student’s individual acclimation as they return to play. When building schedules, attention needs to be given to academic pressure, changes from in-person to remote learning, changes between tiers of mitigation, time spent traveling to events, appropriate time to practice/learn the sport between games, etc. to ensure the student experience truly enhances the academic day.”

Guidelines

IHSA guidelines require all student-athletes to participate in masks (with the exception of swimming & diving, gymnasts on an apparatus and outdoor events where social distancing can occur) and for all game personnel not participating in the contest to also wear masks and adhere to social distancing.

“We still have regions of the state that need to make strides in order to be able to play basketball this winter,” said Anderson. “That underscores the importance of our schools following all the mitigations and precautions. We need to maintain a positive

trajectory not only to get winter sports going, but to make sure we do not have any regions regress before spring and summer sports have their opportunity. We can all do our part by wearing a mask and socially distancing.”

The board also agreed to consider other participation opportunities for a given sport, like basketball, if the sport is unable to be played in a specific region.

“We have said from day one that if and when we were allowed to play again this year, the situation would be fluid,” said Anderson. “We don’t feel great about the notion of some schools falling behind based on their Region’s status, but also recognize that we are running

out of time and can’t afford to hold back the Regions that can play.”

In October, the board ruled that students who play sports (football, boys soccer, girls volleyball) that were displaced from their traditional season could participate on high school and non-school teams simultaneously. The board affirmed this position in Wednesday’s meeting with additional sports moving out of their traditional seasons, and also ruled that girls and boys basketball players will need to cease non-school team participation within seven days of their first high school game.

The IHSA Board of Directors issued the following statement on the

day’s events.

“Unprecedented circumstances create extraordinary decisions. The IHSA Board of Directors faced one of the most difficult decisions in the Association’s 100-plus year history today. Please know that we did so with great diligence, empathy, and understanding. There were an immense number of factors that went into today’s decisions. We knew there would be obstacles no matter what we decided. Whether those hurdles included overlapping seasons for multi-sport athletes, equity between sports, preseason acclimatization guidelines, the prioritization of spring sports, facility conflicts for schools, officiating,

and that is just naming a few. Please know that each potential roadblock was recognized and given consideration. The IHSA membership, like our state, is incredibly large and diverse. Each board member brought different concerns to the table that impacted their own school or region differently. There was never going to be a one-size-fits-all solution to playing 25 sports seasons in a little over four months. What did occur was collaboration and camaraderie. Each board member may not have been able to have all of their specific concerns addressed, but we worked together to produce a schedule and plan that we believe will work for our student-athletes.”

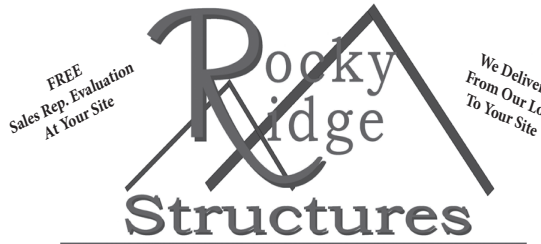

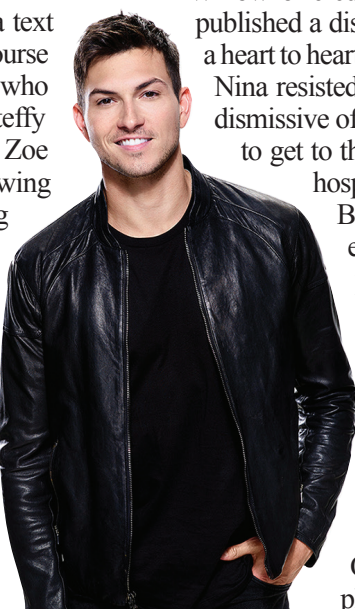

planned.

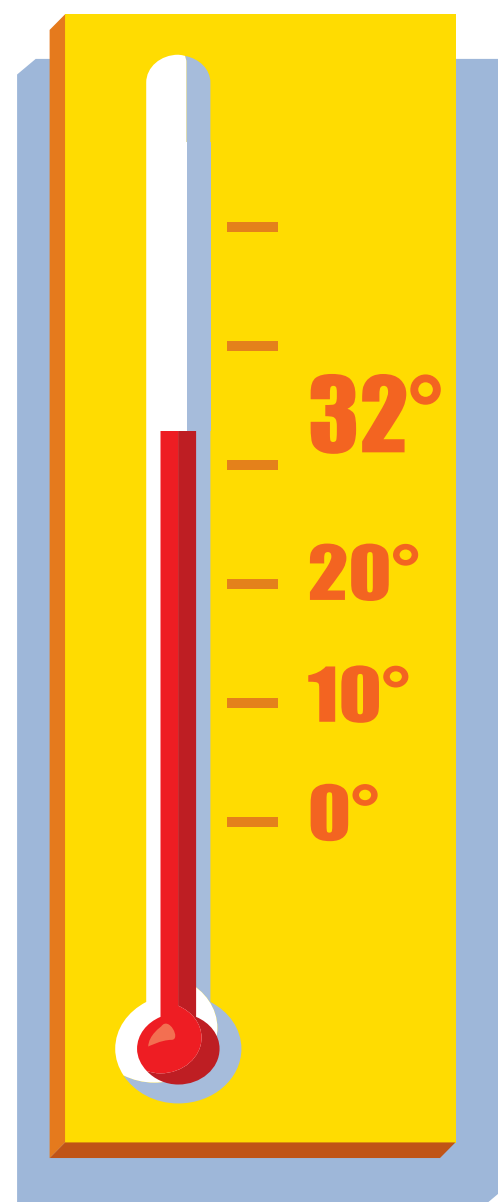
Women's and men's golf teams will compete in official matches in the spring semester as planned.

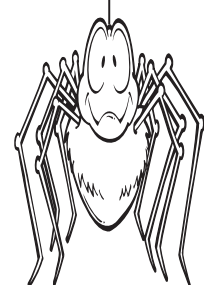
