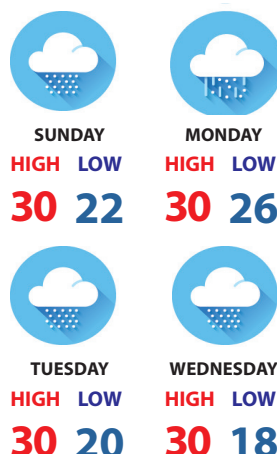

Sheriff concerned about reform bill

VanVickle says criminal justice legislation
now on governor's desk needs work

OREGON — Ogle County Sheriff Brian VanVickle has concerns about the Criminal Justice Reform bill that has been passed by the Illinois House and Senate and is currently awaiting signature from Gov. JB Pritzker.

VanVickle, who testified before the House and Senate before HB 3653 was passed on Jan. 13, said he is not opposed to modernization in law enforcement, but this bill needs work.

"It's clear to anyone who reads the bill that law enforcement was not involved in drawing up the bill's final provisions," he said.

The bill does a number of things, including ending cash bail for non-violent offenders state-wide, prohibiting chokeholds and requiring all police officers in the state to wear body cameras.

Providing this equipment is up to local departments.

"This legislation places numerous mandates on police agencies with no funding source for local communities," VanVickle said.

"Because of this it will reduce the amount of funding available for actual on-the-street police protection and/or cause the raising of local taxes."

He said the bill also allows the public to file anonymous complaints against any officer without having to swear that those complaints are true, and those com-

plaints remain in the officer's file.

"The careers of good police officers can be ruined by anyone willing to anonymously submit lies," he said.

State Rep. Andrew Chesney (R-Freeport) took to the floor of the House to speak out against a bill which he said, "jeopardizes community safety."

"Where I come from, Northwest Illinois, we back the badge," Chesney said. "This bill is flawed public policy which gives more rights to criminals over law enforcement. I stand with our law enforcement, not because it is convenient, but rather because they keep my family and my district

safe."

On Facebook, VanVickle said organizations have been meeting to address concerns regarding criminal justice.

"We continue to be open to talks but unfortunately, the way in which this bill was released without any warning or review during a lame-duck session does not allow for the coalition to accurately or properly provide dialog in the remaining two days. As I stated previously we are not opposed to modernization but let's get it right the first time. This bill certainly does not do that."

It is not known if, or when, Pritzker will sign the bill into law.

Former city employee charged with wire fraud

ROCKFORD — A former resident and employee of the City of Rochelle was charged with fraudulently obtaining at least \$150,000 from a non-profit business association, according to a criminal charge filed Thursday by the U.S. Attorney's Office in Rockford.

The information charges Scott Koteski, 58, of Rochelle, with one count of wire fraud.

According to a criminal information filed in federal court in Rockford, Koteski was an employee of the City of Rochelle and was selected by the city to sit on the board of directors of a non-profit business association that provided broadband internet technology to smaller municipalities in northern Illinois. Starting in 2011, Koteski was selected as the treasurer of that association. As treasurer, Koteski handled the invoicing and billing of the member municipalities, and as of February 2012 had signatory authority on the association's bank account.

According to the information, from September 2012 through April 2018, Koteski is alleged to have fraudulently obtained at least \$150,000 from the association, which he used for his own benefit without the association's knowledge or consent. Koteski wrote numerous checks to himself from the association's bank account, which he deposited into his personal bank account for his personal benefit. Koteski allegedly concealed his acts by writing false information on the memo line to make it appear the checks were for reimbursement of personal monies Koteski spent for the association when, in fact, Koteski was not entitled to reimbursement.

According to the criminal information, in 2018, Koteski allegedly made online payments from the association's bank account



to a credit card company to pay for balances on his personal credit card, and to an online loan financing company to pay for balances on Koteski's loan.

Wire fraud carries a maximum sentence of 20 years' imprisonment, a term of supervised release of up to three years following imprisonment, and a fine of up to \$250,000, or twice the gross gain or gross loss resulting from that offense, whichever is greater. If convicted, the court must impose a reasonable sentence under federal sentencing statutes and the advisory United States Sentencing Guidelines.

Koteski will be arraigned on a date yet to be determined in U.S. District Court in Rockford.

"We are disappointed in the news involving the allegations against former employee Mr. Koteski. Out of the respect of the judicial process and Koteski's rights, the city has no further comment at this time," said Rochelle City Manager Jeff Fiegenschuh.

The charge was announced by John R. Lausch, Jr., United States Attorney for the Northern District of Illinois, and Emmerson Buie, Jr., Special Agent-in-Charge of the Chicago Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The Illinois State Police assisted in the investigation.

The public is reminded that an information is not evidence of guilt. The defendant is presumed innocent and entitled to a fair trial at which the government has the burden of proving guilt beyond a reasonable doubt.

County in Tier 1 as vaccination numbers grow

OREGON — There is finally some positive news when it comes to COVID-19 in Ogle County, Public Health Administrator Kyle Auman told the County Board at its Jan. 19 meeting.

Auman said that the positivity rate for the virus in the county is at about 5.7 percent, and the county has moved to Tier 1. That means restaurants can open for some inside dining. He said the county could soon see

even more relaxed rules.

"Very exciting for not only Ogle County, but for our region," he said.

He also told the board that hospital bed availability is better than it has been in a long time.

Auman said that the county has been administering the vaccine. He said more than 2,200 Ogle County residents have gotten the vaccine, and that 464 have gotten both doses. He said the county has almost completed Phase 1A of the vaccine plan, which includes healthcare personnel and long-term

care facility residents.

"Vaccine availability is still the thing holding us back," he said.

Auman said the county will soon be moving to Phase 1B, which will see law enforcement, firefighters and other front-line workers as well as high-risk adults and seniors vaccinated. He said that phase will include about 22,000 people and will take "several months."

Auman said the about 4,000 have pre-registered on the online portal the county has set up on its website for the vaccine.

There will be a Mac Sport Utility Wagon filled with white wine, and a Mac Sport Utility Wagon

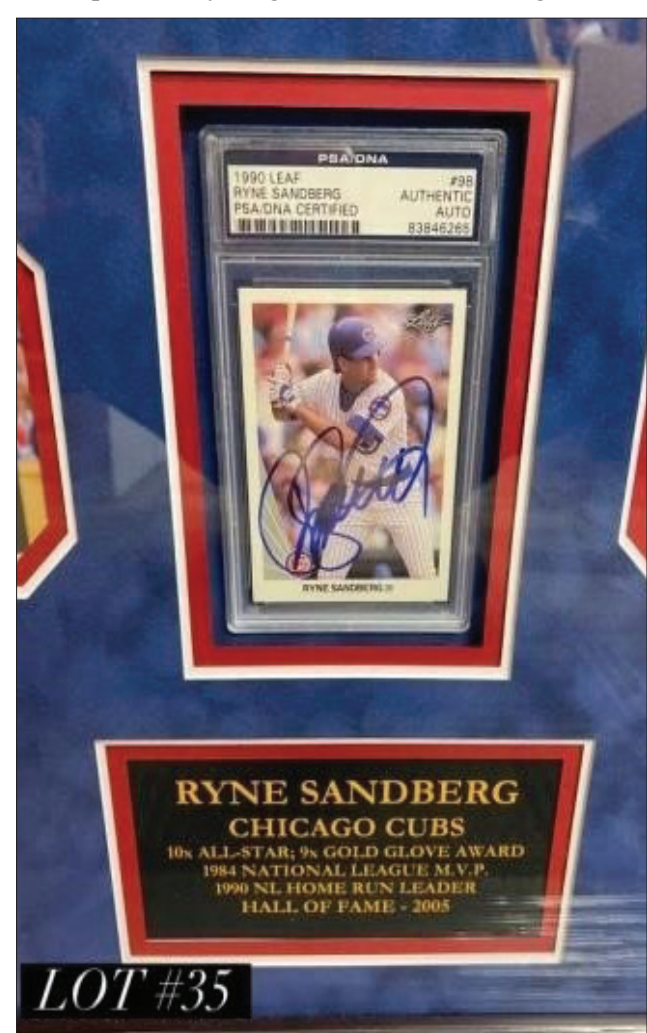

GOP lawmakers raise concerns about 'decoupling' bill

SPRINGFIELD—A bill endorsed by Gov. JB Pritzker that would eliminate expanded federal tax deductions for businesses created under the CARES Act, failed to pass in the lame duck session.

While Pritzker has said he's confident it will come up for a vote in the upcoming regular session, Republican lawmakers are raising concerns about the impact the bill would have on small business owners, potentially affecting 440,000 taxpayers statewide.

Some Republicans, who have called the bill a "tax hike," are also questioning whether there is enough time to pass substantial changes to the tax code, with tax season only a few weeks away.

A spokesperson for the Department of Revenue, in an email, said it's "optimal" to pass decoupling legislation before the start of the tax filing season because taxpayers have not yet filed returns.

"The 2020 tax filing season will not open until February 12, but the opening of the season does not preclude passage of legislation after that date," DOR spokesperson Terry Horstman wrote.

Rep. Steve Reick, R-Harvard, said the clock is running out for the Legislature to pass this bill, especially since the state Senate on Thursday canceled its planned session beginning Jan. 26.

The House is scheduled to meet the week of Feb. 2, and both the House and Senate are set to meet the week of Feb. 9.

"We're looking at the middle to end of February before any of this can be laid to rest," Reick said Friday during a Zoom news conference.

The proposed bill would "decouple" Illinois' tax law from the federal tax amendments included in the CARES Act that expanded income deductions business owners can claim as net operating losses, carryback losses or excess business losses. That legislative action would keep the state tax code consistent with previous years.

Pritzker initially estimated that the bill would preserve \$500 million in state revenue, but that figure increased to \$1

billion by the time it came up for a vote on the floor of the House of Representatives in the early morning of Jan. 13.

According to Horstman, the broad decoupling estimate "stems from the fact that IDOR cannot determine exactly what taxpayers who have Net Operating Losses or Excess Business Losses might do."

He said the department's Research Division compiled the estimates on revenue impacts, "and ran numbers based on tax laws in place at the time and what actions taxpayers might take when filing their tax returns."

Pritzker and Democratic lawmakers who supported the measure argue it is needed to prevent state revenues from shrinking by more than \$500 million during the current fiscal year, thereby increasing the state's \$3.9 billion budget deficit.

In responding to a question during his news conference

Friday, Pritzker said decoupling is "a fairly standard movement," and described the CARES Act tax provisions as a massive tax decrease for some of the largest businesses.

"Now what (former President Donald Trump and Congressional Republicans) also did was affect state revenues across the United States, which is why 26 states are decoupling and an additional nine states already were automatically decoupled, but other states that don't have an income tax were not affected by decoupling," Pritzker said.

He accused Republicans in the Legislature of failing to propose a plan to balance the budget.

"And now, they're proposing blowing perhaps a half-a-billion-dollar hole in next year's budget," Pritzker said.

Reick said the General Assembly can find ways to reduce the deficit by cutting spending, rather than increasing taxes on small businesses that are already hurting because of the COVID-19 pandemic.

"I think we if we looked at every department, we could find areas to cut," Reick said, adding that he's still interested in the data from Pritzker's request in September 2020 when he asked his agency heads to each reduce spending by 5 percent.

Rep. Mike Marron, R-Fithian, said he opposes raising taxes until the Legislature can curtail spending.

"And when you obligate yourself to spend more money while you're already facing a very large deficit, I don't think anybody is demonstrating any appetite for fiscal responsibility at this point," Marron said during the news conference. "I'm not even willing to discuss tax increases until somebody actually acts like they want to approach the budget with some kind of constraint."

During the news conference, Reick, Marron and Rep. Mike Murphy, R-Springfield, also criticized the governor and the Department of Revenue for not bringing the bill forward immediately after the CARES Act made those changes to the federal tax provisions in March.

A Department of Revenue spokesperson did not respond to a question about when the department became aware of expanded federal deductions passed in the CARES Act, and the need for decoupling.

Free permits are required in advance for this recycling event. The permits may be obtained by calling 815-732-4020 or email solidwaste@oglecounty.org with your name, street address, and town.

This recycling event is for Ogle County residents only and proof of residency is required in addition to the free permit. The permit is good for the event in which you sign up for, and allows a resident to bring in a maximum of seven large or bulky items for recycling. Limit one permit per residence per month.

This recycling event may be cancelled or suspended due to the pandemic,

inclement weather, or staffing issues at the discretion of the Ogle County Solid Waste Management Department.

Items accepted at these recycling events include all residential televisions, computer monitors, computers, computer hardware and cables, printers, FAX machines, desktop copiers, VCR/DVD players, satellite and cable boxes, video gaming equipment, remote controls (remove batteries), cell

phones, tablets, laptop computers, radios, stereo equipment (no large wooden speakers), shredders, digital clocks, calculators, adding machines, phones and phone systems, rechargeable batteries, printer toner cartridges, CFI bulbs, extension cords, and holiday light strands. Contact the OCSWMD prior to Jan. 27 to obtain a free permit for this residential electronics recycling event.

Plan ahead for prolonged power outages

SPRINGFIELD—Winter can bring beautiful days for taking brisk walks, admiring the fresh snowfall, or creating snow angels. Winter's fury can also produce icy roads, sub-zero wind chills, and power outages.

"Unfortunately, heavy snow and accumulating ice can easily bring tree limbs down on power lines, cutting off power to homes and businesses," says Erin Hol-

linshead, executive director of Safe Electricity. "Even melting ice can be a problem because it can cause power lines to sag from the added weight."

"Planning for future outages brought on by severe winter conditions can make riding out a prolonged power outage safer and a little more comfortable," Hollinshead advises.

How long it takes for your power to be restored depends on several factors: the extent of the storm's destruction, the number of outages in your area, and when it becomes safe for utility personnel to get to the affected areas.

Take steps to help keep your family safe and comfortable during a winter storm long before one is forecast. A good way to start is to put an emergency kit together. Safe Electricity suggests starting with these items:

Water: Stock up on bot-

tled water for consumption. FEMA recommends storing at least one gallon per person, per day.

Food: Have at least enough food, including non-perishable packaged or canned foods, juices, special foods for infants or the elderly, and snack foods, for three to seven days.

Utensils: Without electricity, be sure you have a manual can opener, paper plates, and plastic utensils.

Layers and added warmth: Gather blankets, pillows, and warm clothing items.

Medicine and other items: Locate a first aid kit, medicine, prescription drugs, and any essential medical equipment.

A charged cell phone: Most people are used to having their phones with them, but also have a portable, fully-charged power pack on hand.

Also gather: Toiletries, hygiene items, and moist towelettes.

Flashlight and extra batteries.

Battery-operated radio or a NOAA weather radio.

List of emergency telephone numbers, including your local utilities.

Toys, books, and games.

Pet food and other pet-care items.

Supplies for alternate heating methods, such as a fireplace or wood-burning stove.

In advance of a storm, have the power company or a tree-trimming professional remove limbs that could fall on power lines if they become covered in ice or snow. Only certified line clearance tree trimming professionals are authorized and allowed to trim trees

near power lines.

"Insulate your home by installing storm windows or plastic covering on windows and caulk any cracks in your home," Hollinshead says. "Finally, make sure the heating system is in proper working order."

Other safety tips include: Use caution when using a portable generator.

Never use a portable generator indoors, in a garage, or near windows or doors because they omit deadly carbon monoxide.

Never plug a portable generator into a wall outlet. Doing so can create deadly backfeed, which occurs when electricity travels from the generator back through the power lines.

Monitor the temperature in your home. Infants and elderly people are more susceptible to the cold.

Avoid going outside. Downed power lines could be submerged in snow and ice, making them difficult to identify. Consider all downed and hanging lines energized and deadly.

Along with causing outages, wintery conditions can create hiccups in power delivery that include blinking lights or ebbs and flows in the amount of power that comes into your home. Although blinking lights can be a symptom of other problems such as loose wiring connections or overloaded circuits, they can also be caused by extreme weather conditions. When this happens, protect your circuits and appliances by switching off lights and unplugging devices.

it or the text for you to read. If you have not experienced it, I strongly urge you to do so.

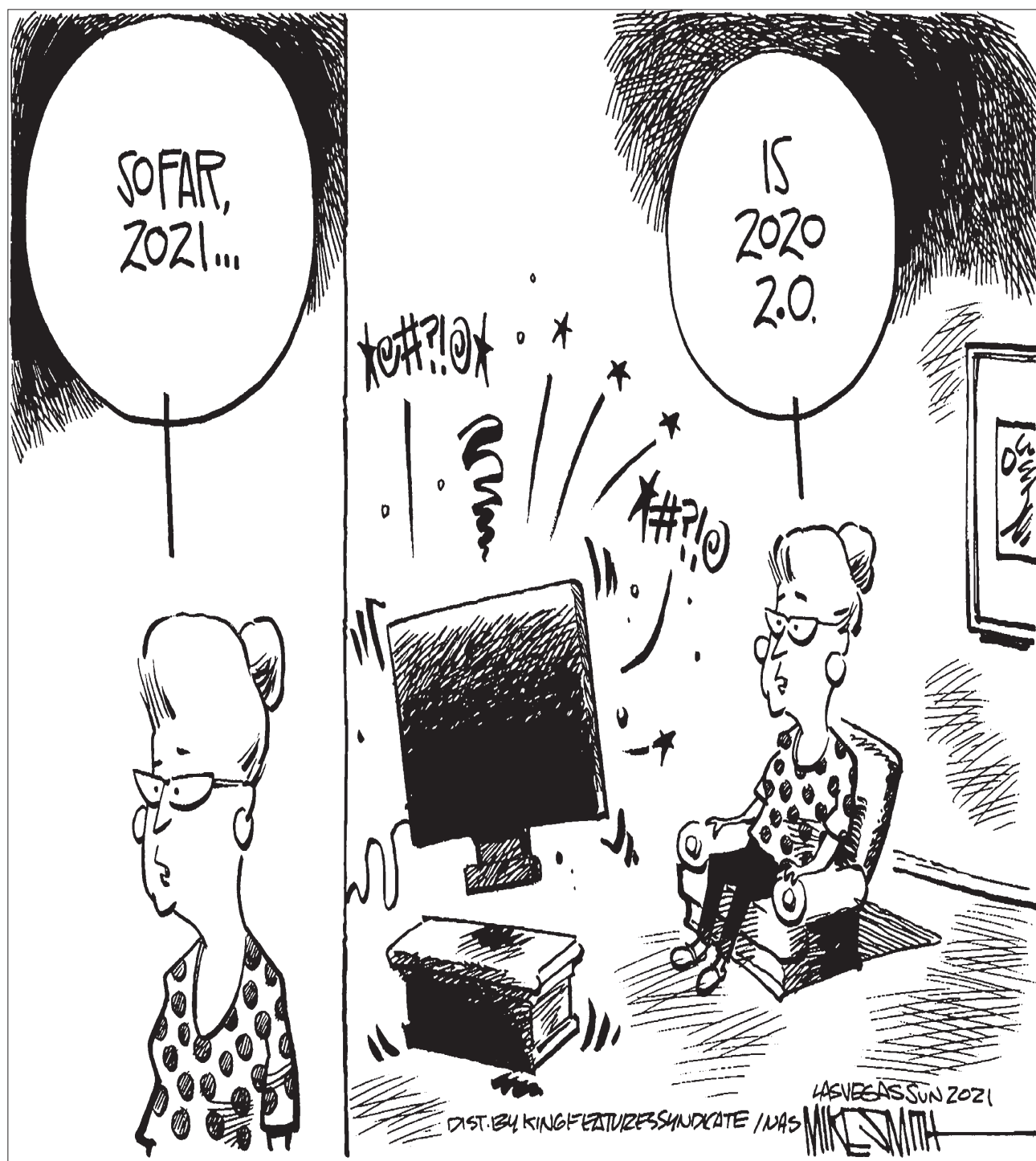

Taking care of mental wellness during challenging times

DIXON — The Coronavirus pandemic has presented a myriad of challenges in our lives and our experiences have all been different with at least one notable exception - We all have seen negative impacts to our mental wellness. At one time or another we all may have seen an increase in feelings of stress, anxiety, fear, sadness, and isolation. For some this has led to not only a deterioration of our mental wellness but also an acceleration in the use of alcohol and other drugs.

According to the Mayo Clinic, "Surveys show a major increase in the number of U.S. adults who report symptoms of stress, anxiety, and depression during the pandemic, compared with surveys before the pandemic. Some people have increased their use of alcohol or drugs, thinking that can help them cope with their fears about the pandemic. In reality, using these substances can worsen anxiety and depression."

According to Psychology today, "People with pre-existing mental illnesses have seen their psychological symptoms worsen during isolation, with some turning to substance use as a way to cope. Those already abusing substances have become increasingly dependent on them. Some individuals are struggling with both mental illness and substance addiction, which makes isolation even more difficult." This is a common occurrence for people to have both a mental illness and a substance use disorder.

"During the pandemic if you have experienced trouble concentrating on typical tasks, noticed changes in your appetite, had body aches and pains, had difficulty sleeping, experienced a struggle to face routine chores, or seen an increase in the amount and frequency of your consumption of alcohol or other substance use, you may need to seek treatment," says Patrick Phelan, Sinnissippi Centers President/CEO. "When these signs and symptoms

last for several days in a row, make you miserable, and cause problems in your daily life so that you find it hard to carry out normal responsibilities, it's time to ask for help".

What can you do? "If you or someone you know is experiencing significant symptoms of a mental illness or substance use disorder, it important to seek appropriate treatment with a behavioral healthcare provider, like Sinnissippi Centers," adds Phelan. "We have been providing our full range of behavioral healthcare services during the pandemic for all ages including treatment for treatment to support mental health, substance use concerns, and any other behavioral health concern."

"One thing that allowed us to continue serving individuals without interruption was the use of telehealth platforms like phone and video conferencing," adds Phelan, "Sinnissippi Centers, like all other healthcare providers, never 'shut down'. We continue to rely primarily on tele-health to provide services with just a handful of in-person appointments. In fact, we have heard from several Sinnissippi clinicians that a number of their clients have been more active in their services because they don't have the barriers that traditional, office-based services can present. We have also seen a number of clients improve in the management of symptoms during this time despite all of the challenges they have faced," adds Phelan.

"While Sinnissippi Centers is always here if you need behavioral healthcare, if you aren't in need of services of a mental health or substance use treatment professional, we still want to emphasize that it's vitally important for everyone to utilize healthy coping strategies to enable us to deal with such a major event like this global pandemic," says Phelan. "The best way to cope is to take control of returning

as much 'normalcy' to your life as possible by keeping your regular routine, avoiding distractions, keeping busy, focusing on the positive, and leaning more heavily on your spiritual life or belief system for support. Additionally, making sure you keep doing activities you enjoy and connecting with other as much as you can are key."

"Other effective strategies are to limit the time you are watching, reading, or listening to news stories including on social media. Hearing about the pandemic repeatedly can heighten your anxiety and stress and impact your mental wellness. Even limiting your computer or mobile device screen time can help you to relax especially near bedtime."

Another way is to take care of your physical health which increases your mental wellness, so doing things like stretching, exercising, meditating, eating healthy, getting adequate sleep, and avoiding excessive alcohol or drug use are key ways to keep your mind and body fit during this time.

Local resources include the B-CALM line available for a positive spin on how to deal with the stress you are experiencing. You will chat with someone who is trained in coping and self-care. Call 888-33B-CALM or (888) 332-2256, sponsored as a free service in partnership with the CGH Health Foundation and Sinnissippi Centers. It is an important resource for those who might require just a little help that can be handled in a phone call or two.

Sinnissippi Centers is a behavioral healthcare agency serving Carroll, Lee, Ogle and Whiteside Counties and provides substance abuse screening and treatment services.

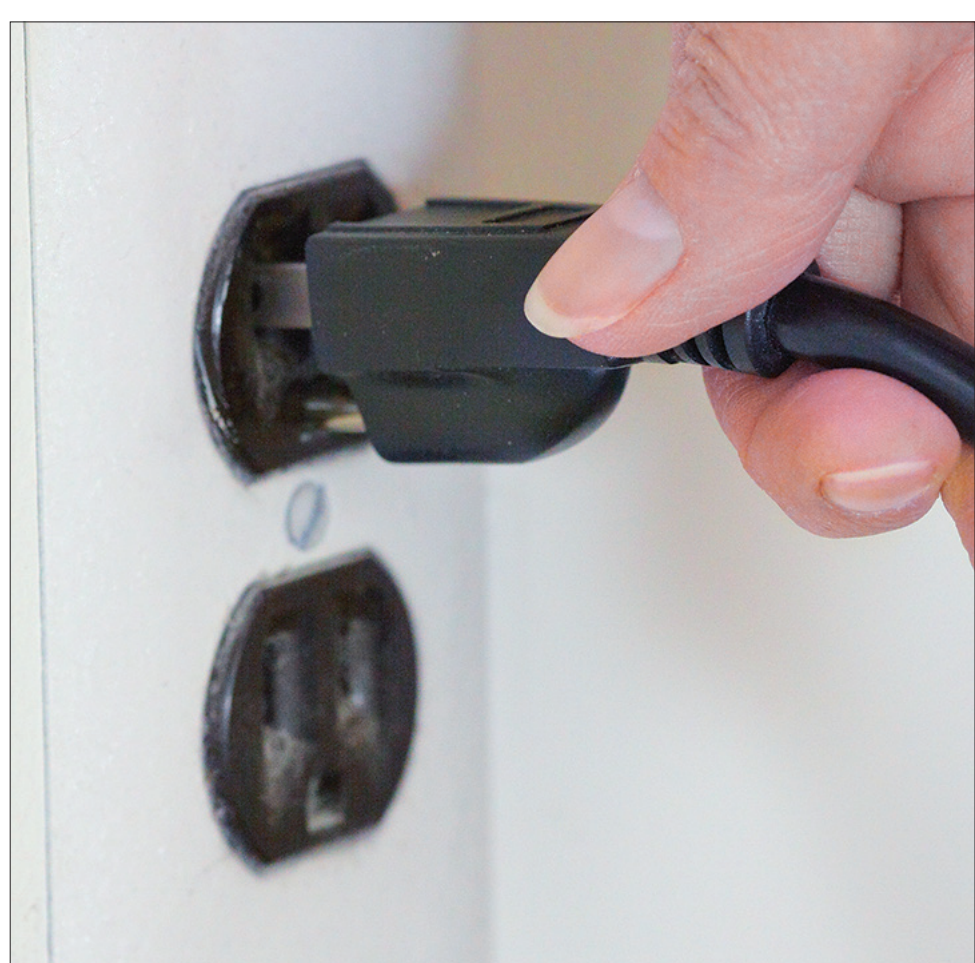
WINTER SURVIVAL

The threat posed by ice dams

COLD, snowy weather can present various issues for homeowners to contend with. One such problem, ice dams, can cause damage to walls, ceilings and other areas. The University of Minnesota Extension says that an ice dam is a ridge of ice that forms at the edge of the roof and prevents melting snow from draining properly. A complex combination of heat loss from a home, snow cover and outside temperatures can lead the formation of ice dams. An ice dam will be fed by melting snow above it and cause a backup at the edge of the roof. Dams can cause gutters to tear off and loosen shingles and may lead to water backing up and pouring into the home, advises This Old House. Ice dams also can contribute to soggy insulation, making the insulation lose its protective R-value and becoming a magnet for mold and mildew. Homeowners can do a number of things to temporarily prevent the formation of ice dams. Heated cables clipped to the roof's edge in a zig-zag pattern can help prevent dams that lift shingles. Pushing snow off the roof can help. Laying an ice melt product in gutters to help melt the ice that forms also can prevent ice dams. More permanent solutions involve keeping the entire roof the same temperature as the eaves by increasing ventilation, adding insulation and properly sealing air leaks that can warm the underside of the roof. This may involve calling in a professional contractor. Such an investment is well worth it, as it can prevent much more costly damage down the line.

How to safely handle a prolonged power outage

ACCIDENTS and storms can disrupt the electricity that powers everything in homes and businesses. A short-term loss of power can be a nuisance, but extended power outages can cause damage and may even be dangerous. Widespread power outages are often anticipated during or after severe storms, which can disable entire power grids. Because damaged power lines and infrastructure must be carefully assessed after severe storms, it may take anywhere from hours to several days before power is fully restored. The Food and Drug Administration says that food spoilage is one of the hazards of long-term power outages. If a storm is imminent, you can be proactive by freezing the contents of the



refrigerator when possible so that items can stay at safe temperatures longer, advises the FDA. Food can remain safe for up to two hours at refrigerator temperature before it starts to spoil. Grouping food together in the freezer also can help it stay colder longer. Having extra ice on hand or freezing containers of water also can provide a chilling effect, as well as serve as a water supply if faucet water is unavailable — which can be a concern for those with well-pumped water. Your barbecue can turn out to be your best friend during power outages. Many stoves, even gas ones, will not light because of electric ignitions. A gas

camping stove or barbecue can serve as the primary place to cook food until power is restored. Always have a secondary propane tank on hand. Keep plenty of bottled water on hand, especially if your water supply is well-fed and requires an electric pump to activate flow. Stock up on blankets and warm clothing. Power outages during the winter can be especially challenging because of the lack of heat in a home. Family members can huddle together in small rooms to conserve heat. People with wood-burning stoves can use them to keep warm. Fireplaces tend to be more show than ambient heat providers,

but they can still serve as a heat source in a pinch. If you have a generator, run it safely. The Consumer Product Safety Commission says generators should be operated as far away from the house as possible to avoid deadly carbon monoxide fumes. Also, use appropriately-gauged, outdoor-rated extension cords to power up generators. It is also important to stay put and avoid the road after a storm that causes a power outage. Wires may be down, traffic lights may not work and dangerous debris may be littering the roads. Hunkering down is the best approach until power is restored.

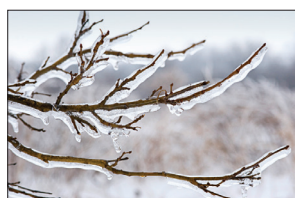

Protect your home (and more) from winter's freeze

FREEZING temperatures may be good for ice skating or building snowmen, but sub-freezing temperatures can be dangerous for the average person and his or her home. Cold weather often leaves people scurrying to do whatever is necessary to safeguard themselves from the big chill. But it's important homeowners also protect their homes in cold weather.

Service HVAC systems
It's important to ensure that heating systems are working properly prior to the cold-weather season. It may only take hours for the interior of a home to reach dangerously low temperatures without adequate heat. Homeowners should schedule annual check-ups of furnaces and hot water heaters. Inspect the heat exchanger for cracks, install a clean air filter and make sure all thermostats are working properly.



Plumbing

Plumbing and pipes may be vulnerable to cold weather. Frozen pipes may burst and cause substantial damage to a home, potentially causing flooding and structural damage. Homeowners should disconnect and drain garden hoses before winter arrives. Water to outdoor hose bibs should be turned off, though the valves on these outdoor faucets should be left open to drain. Also, outdoor faucets can be covered with insulating foam covers. The Red Cross says pipes that freeze most frequently include pipes in unheated areas, such as basements, attics, garages, and crawl spaces. Close vents to the outside in areas like attics and basements to limit the amount of cold air that gets indoors. Think about insulating unheated areas, as well as using pipe sleeves, heat tape or wraps on exposed pipes. By opening kitchen and bathroom cabinet doors, homeowners can allow warm air from a home to reach pipes under the sink. During extreme freezes, keep cold water dripping from a sink to prevent pipes from freezing.

Have fuel ready

Homeowners who heat their homes with oil, wood or coal should make sure they have plenty of fuel on hand in advance of winter. Shortages can occur, and it may take some time for new fuel to arrive in the midst of a cold snap. As a precaution, homeowners can rely on portable space heaters to fill in the heating gaps during freezing temperatures. Exercise extreme caution with these devices, turning them off when leaving the room and remembering to avoid overloading outlets.

Protect outside

Drain birdbaths, clean out downspouts and remove water from other items where water can freeze and cause damage. Inspect roofing prior to the snowy season, but stay off roofs during freezing weather. Remove snow shovels and other winter gear from storage and make sure the items are easily accessible during snowstorms. Winter's bite can be severe. Homeowners can protect themselves and their properties when the freeze sets in.

10 tips for winter safety

WINTER extends to March 20, 2021, in the Northern Hemisphere. Those three months can be both beautiful to behold and difficult to endure.

Winter has its share of safety hazards, and extra effort may be required to protect one's health and well-being when the chill creeps in. In recognition of that, the National Safety Council and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention offer these winter safety tips.

1. Winterize your home to keep interior temperatures comfortable and prevent weather-related damage. Winterizing includes insulating water lines that run along exterior walls, cleaning out gutters, installing weather stripping, and replenishing insulation.
 2. Exercise in cold temperatures can put many people at risk of heart attack — especially those who are typically inactive. If you must exercise in cold weather, remember to stretch beforehand. Take breaks when shoveling or ask for help.
 3. Check carbon monoxide alarms to see if they are working properly. Every year in the United States, more than 400 people die from and 50,000 are treated for carbon monoxide poisoning. Exhaust from improperly vented heating appliances can contribute to carbon monoxide sickness.
 4. Prepare a winter emergency kit and keep it in your car in case you are stranded in inclement weather. The kit can include food, water, blankets, first-aid supplies, flares, and booster cables, among other items.
 5. Wear appropriate clothing for the temperature and precipitation. Layers can be added or removed as needed.
 6. Sprinkle sand or cat litter on icy patches of walkways to improve traction. Sand or cat litter is easier on the environment than some chemical ice melt products.
 7. Consider a whole-house generator as an emergency backup if the power goes out in winter. Generators can keep the heat running and the refrigerator humming along until power is restored.
 8. Exercise caution with space heaters and other supplemental heating devices. Turn them off when you leave the room, and do not leave them on overnight while you are sleeping.
 9. Slow down when driving in the snow. Black ice patches can be difficult to see, and snow itself can reduce tire traction. Leave extra time to get where you need to be.
 10. Consider switching from gloves to mittens. With fingers touching each other inside mittens, they help generate more body heat than when they're inside gloves.
- These are just a few safety tips to heed during winter.

Reduce cold-weather fire risk

PLENTY of things heat up when the temperature drops, including the risk for fire hazards. Fireplaces, stoves, heating systems, candles, and even electric lights are used more often during the winter than any other time of year, so it makes sense that the risk of home fires increases when the mercury drops.

The U.S. Fire Administration says 905 people die in winter home fires each year. Cooking is the leading cause of all home fires and contributes to around \$2 billion in property loss each year. Understanding potential risks and exercising caution can help homeowners protect themselves, their families and their homes from fire.

Cooking

Home heating fires peak between the hours of 6 p.m. and 8 p.m., when many people are home preparing dinner. The following steps, courtesy of the American Red Cross, can improve safety in the kitchen and reduce the likelihood of a home fire.

Never leave cooking food unattended, as it can take just seconds for fires to ignite.

Keep anything that can catch fire away from the stove or other appliances that generate heat.

Clean regularly to prevent grease buildup.

Make sure appliances are turned off before leaving the room or going to bed.



Homeowners can reduce their risk for home fires in various ways.

Heating

The National Fire Protection Association warns that heating is the second leading cause of home fires, deaths and injuries in the United States. The NFPA offers these safety guidelines.

Install heating appliances according to manufacturers' instructions or have a professional do the installation.

Fuel-burning equipment needs to vent to the outside.

Never use an oven to heat a home.

Keep anything that can burn away from heating equipment, including portable space

heaters.

Clean and inspect heating appliances regularly.

Turn off portable heaters when leaving the room or going to bed.

Electric

The National Safety Council estimates that between 600 and 1,000 people die each year from electrocution.

Electricity also can contribute to home fires. The Energy Education Council offers these safety suggestions.

Never force plugs into outlets.

Check that cords are not frayed or cracked. Do not run cords under

carpets or place them in high-traffic areas.

Use extension cords only on a temporary basis.

Make sure light bulbs are the proper wattage for fixtures.

Install ground fault circuit interrupters in kitchens, baths, laundry rooms, and elsewhere, making sure to test them regularly.

Check periodically for loose wall receptacles and loose wires. Listen for popping or sizzling sounds behind walls.

Home fires are no joke and can be prevented with simple safety checks.

Governor launches Phase 1B of COVID-19 Vaccination Plan

CHICAGO—Building on the state's progress in administering the COVID-19 vaccine, Governor JB Pritzker announced the state will move into the early stages of Phase 1B of the COVID-19 Vaccine Administration Plan beginning on Monday, Jan. 25. While federal vaccine shipments to states remain limited, the state is aggressively building out provider capacity to ensure efficient distribution as soon as more vaccine becomes available.

Illinois remains committed to distributing the vaccine in an equitable, accessible way and as a part of Phase 1B, all residents over the age of 65 and frontline essential workers can receive the vaccine. Illinois will begin vaccinating eligible residents by appointment only.

As the state substantially completes Phase 1A, Illinois has surpassed its daily vaccination record multiple times, most recently vaccinating more than 44,000 people in a 24-hour period. The state has administered more than 60 percent of its vaccine allocation outside of Chicago and not including the federal Pharmacy Partnership Program, and substantially more once data lag in the reported administrations is accounted for.

"Illinois is build-

ing capacity so that as the vaccine supply increases, we will be ready," said Governor JB Pritzker. "As the nation awaits greater supplies and we ramp up vaccination sites, every Illinoisan can do their part to fight this pandemic with the tools we know to work — masking and distancing — and over the last 8 weeks we've all used those tools and made real progress. Enormous sacrifices are being made to achieve this progress, but those sacrifices are making a real difference."

"As more vaccine is allocated to Illinois, and more people are eligible to be vaccinated, we are starting to see the finish line coming into focus," said IDPH Director Dr. Ngozi Ezike. "I am cautiously optimistic with the trends we are seeing in Illinois, but I want to stress how important it is for us to continue our public health actions of wearing masks and avoiding large gatherings. Getting to the end of this pandemic will be about the choices we make. The choice to wear our mask, the choice to keep our distance, and the choice to get vaccinated."

Over 3.2 million Illinoisans are eligible for Phase 1B. Eligible residents will be able to receive a vaccine at one

of the Illinois National Guard (ILNG) assisted sites, at a site operated by a local health department, or at a partner pharmacy. Walgreens is now online in limited number of sites statewide. CVS and Jewel-Osco will be coming online early next week and additional pharmacies such as Hy-Vee, Mariano's, and Kroger will be joining later next week. Taken together, these pharmacy partners will provide hundreds of sites in every region of the state.

At this time, these sites will be available by appointment only. As the federal supply of vaccines increases and Illinois receives more vaccines, the state will launch walk-in locations and expand sites to additional providers like doctor's offices and urgent care clinics.

More information about those locations will be released in the coming weeks.

In addition, over 18 state and federal agencies, including the ILNG, the Illinois State Police, and the Illinois Emergency Management Agency personnel who could be assisting in COVID-19 response will be vaccinated at McCormick Place in Chicago and the Illinois State Police Academy in Springfield.

These sites are not open to the public at this time.

RTHS Bowling

Back on the lanes

Rochelle teams return to practice after two-month pause on athletics

ROCHELLE — Eric Widick has been head coach of the Lady Hub bowling team for only a few months, but his time running the program has been nothing short of unprecedented.

Widick and the Lady Hubs held their first practice of the 2020-21 season on Monday, Nov. 17. Two days later, Illinois Gov. J.B. Pritzker announced the state would enter Tier 3 COVID-19 mitigations on Friday, Nov. 20, which required the IHSA to temporarily pause all athletic activities. For roughly two months, T-Byrd Lanes was empty of high school competition.

That changed earlier this week, as Rochelle’s bowling teams returned to practice on Tuesday to resume their seasons. With Region 1 currently under Tier 1 mitigations, low-risk winter sports such as bowling can practice immediately, with seven practices required before competitions can begin. The IHSA will release a revised calendar for all sports

on Wednesday, Jan. 27.

“I was excited about the prospect of what we were working with,” Widick said. “We were starting to build a rapport with the girls before we shut down, but I had a chance to take those few months and develop a plan for what I need to do with the girls. I designed some drills that we’re going to start implementing, but it’s going to be a work in progress during the season. We may only have seven or eight days to work on things that take three or four weeks to improve.”

Under the revised IDPH All Sports Policy, high school bowling teams in regions under Tier 1 or Phase 4 mitigations can compete in state-level tournaments and matches, which could mean the resumption of a full state series including regional, sectional and state-sanctioned events. Bowling teams in regions under Tier 2 mitigations can practice and compete, but only with schools in the same conference or nonconference schools in the same healthcare region.

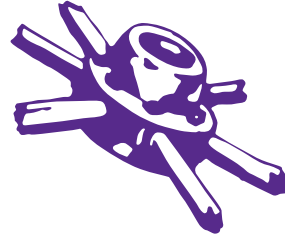

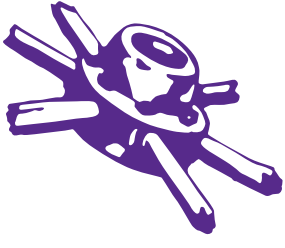

"I talked with the girls on Wednesday about how we're going to tweak some things with their deliver-

ies," Widick said. "Those tweaks may be reflected in some of their scores, but as the season moves along, we're going to get them there. I think our expectations will be a little lower in a sense that we only have so much time together and we won't have as many meets. But I'm seeing improvements in the few days we've been back and they're working well."
