Ogle health officials distributing vaccines

High call volume hindering ability to schedule appointments

ROCHELLE — The Ogle County Health Department has begun vaccinating Ogle County residents who qualify under Phase 1A of the IDPH COVID-19 Vaccination Plan. The department will begin vaccinating residents included under Phase 1B in the coming weeks.

Illinois Gov. J.B. Pritzker announced Friday afternoon that the state will begin Phase 1B of the vaccination strategy on Jan. 25. According to a release from the Ogle County Health Department, first responders and frontline employees with the highest risk of exposure

to COVID-19 will be first to receive vaccinations during Phase 1B. The department said it plans to move quickly through these groups when Phase 1B begins over the next several weeks.

The Ogle County Health Department said a high call volume and a large number of emails regarding COVID-19 vaccinations has slowed its ability to schedule vaccination appointments. Residents are asked to visit www.health.oglecounty.org to preregister. The data collection from this link will be used to schedule appointments during the appropriate time

period of Phase 1B.

“We are asking that people don’t call or email the department to preregister at this time,” said Kyle Auman, public health administrator of the Ogle County Health Department. “We understand the large interest and everyone’s anticipation to be vaccinated but we need to focus on scheduling appointments and communicating with those who we are preparing to vaccinate. Please use the link we are providing, this will drastically improve our ability to respond.”

Chana man charged with distributing child pornography

STERLING — On Jan. 13, 2021, Illinois State Police Division of Criminal Investigation Zone 2 officials arrested Morgan A. Rains, a 41-year-old male of Chana, for four counts of distribution of child pornography. All are Class X felonies.

In late Nov. of 2020, ISP Investigators initiated an investigation after receiving information that Rains was allegedly engaged in distributing child pornography. A thorough investigation ensued in conjunction with the Illinois Attorney General’s Internet Crimes Against Children Unit, Ogle County Sheriff’s Office and ISP District 1 Patrol. A search warrant was executed on Jan. 13 at Rains’ residence. During the warrant execution, Investigators seized

evidence supporting an arrest for child pornography. Rains was formally charged with four counts of distributing child pornography (Class X felonies) by the Ogle County State’s Attorney. Rains is being lodged at the Ogle County Jail with no bond. The investigation is currently open and ongoing, no additional information is being released at this time.

Generator bids expected next month

HILLCREST — Hillcrest trustees will open bids for the \$180,000 water generator project early next month. Baxter & Woodman Engineering updated

trustees on the generator replacement project and grant funding for sewer work in the village during Wednesday’s board meeting.

Bids for the water generator project will be opened on Feb. 4. The new genera-

tor will replace the current generator and it will power both the village hall (in case of emergency) and the village water system. The project will be funded partially with \$75,000 in grant money from the state. Installation of the

new generator will begin this summer, according to Baxter & Woodman.

Hillcrest trustees announced that seal coat work on the north side of the village, including Windover Park, will take place this year. The village will use

\$44,000 in motor fuel tax revenue to fund the seal coat work. Trustees also said a public hearing will be held before the February board meeting regarding the annexation of property for a 228-acre solar farming project.

Closure will create economic loss

BYRON — The closure of the Byron and Dresden nuclear plants in fall 2021 will result in the loss of thousands of good-paying jobs for Illinois workers and significantly increase carbon emissions.

In response to Exelon’s announcement of the premature closure of two of Illinois’ six nuclear plants — Byron and Dresden, the Illinois AFL-CIO recently released an updated version of the Brattle Group’s Illinois Nuclear Impacts Report, which highlights the severe economic losses and environmental impacts Illinois’ and its local communities will face with the retirement of these plants.

The updated report — which breaks out the consumer and emissions impacts of the recently announced premature retirements of the Byron and Dresden nuclear power plants — found:

The Byron and Dresden plants alone prevent more than 20 million

metric tons of CO2 each year — like taking nearly 4.5 million cars off the road.

The shuttering of the Byron and Dresden plants, which are licensed to operate for another 10 years and another 20 years respectively, would cause Illinois consumers and businesses to pay \$313 million more annually for electricity, or \$3.1 billion more over a decade.

Exelon Generation announced on Aug. 27 that it intends to retire its Byron Generating Station and Dresden Generating Station in fall 2021. Byron will close in September 2021.

The two plants also boost Illinois’ economy, generate money for local communities and support thousands of family-sustaining jobs in their regions. The Byron and Dresden nuclear power plants employ more than 1,500 full-time employees and 2,000 supplemental workers during refueling

outages, most from local union halls.

“The Illinois AFL-CIO’s 900,000 Illinois members are essential workers who have persisted during the COVID-19 pandemic to continue to provide the crucial services Illinoisans depend on,”

said Tim Drea, Illinois AFL-CIO President. “The economic challenges facing industries that have put thousands of people to work in our state during this unprecedented time, including Illinois’ nuclear plants, have only added to the uncertainty.

“This new report shows what the Illinois AFL-CIO and countless other organizations have long known: nuclear plants are the backbone of communities throughout Illinois.”

Demmer takes oath for 102nd General Assembly

SPRINGFIELD—State Representative Tom Demmer, R-Dixon, was sworn in for a fifth term in the Illinois House of Representatives on Wednesday at a ceremony held at the Bank of Springfield Center.

"Today marks a pivotal fresh start for Illinois with the end of Mike Madigan's long reign as Speaker," said Demmer. "This is our opportunity to lead Illinois on a better path toward economic prosperity as we prepare to emerge from the pandemic. We face many challenges, but we have shown in the past that we are at our best when we set partisanship aside and work collaboratively."

Demmer pointed to several bills from the previous General Assembly that were approved with bipartisan support and are now law, and said, "We came together on several major issues to enact meaningful economic reforms to bring jobs and opportunity back to Illinois. I am hopeful that same spirit of cooperation can be used to address other pressing issues, such as protecting jobs at the Byron nuclear plant and the need for fair maps during this redistricting year."

The House of Representatives of the new 102nd General Assembly includes 73 Democrats and 45 Republicans. Following the swearing in, Representative Chris Welch of Hillside was elected Speaker of

the House and Representative Jim Durkin of Western Springs was re-elected House Minority Leader.

Representative Demmer also retains his post as Deputy Republican Leader. As the second-highest ranking Republican in the Illinois House of Representatives, Demmer has a key voice in setting the House Republican agenda for the next two years. He was elevated to the position of Deputy Leader in July of 2018 after previously serving as the House Republican Caucus Chair.

As the 118 members of the General Assembly begin their work, Demmer is finalizing a comprehensive 2021 legislative agenda that focuses on improving access and delivery of health care services, protects taxpayers and improves government operations. Residents of the 90th District can learn more about legislation sponsored by Demmer during the spring legislative session on his website at tomdemmer.org.

Paul Dempsey, communications manager of the Byron station, said that the station's 2017 tax bill was more than \$38 million. The taxes went to a variety of taxing bodies, including the Byron School District, Ogle County and the Byron Museum and Library District.

There are also the charitable donations giving by the station, which

Dempsey said amount to about \$250,000. Donations have gone to Rock River Center in Oregon, Pinecrest Community in Mount Morris, Hub City Senior Center and many others.

In August 2020, Exelon Generation also announced that the LaSalle and Braidwood nuclear stations in Illinois, that together employ more than 1,500 skilled workers, are also at high risk for premature closure.

According to the original 2019 report, the four Illinois nuclear plants (Byron, Braidwood, Dresden and LaSalle) that are not covered by the Future Energy Jobs Act of 2016 (FEJA) support local communities and will help the state recover from the pandemic by paying millions in state taxes annually, benefiting local schools, libraries, parks, and public works.

Account for over 28,000 in-state jobs

Contribute about \$3.5 billion annually to state gross domestic product (GDP)

Maintain an estimated \$149 million in annual Illinois state tax revenues, which adds up to \$1.3 billion over 10 years

Save consumers \$483 million on their electricity bills every year, which adds up to \$4.2 billion over 10 years

In 2019, at the request of the Illinois IBEW State Council and the Illinois

AFL-CIO, the Brattle Group released an initial report on how the loss of the four Illinois nuclear plants (Braidwood, Byron, Dresden, and LaSalle) that are not covered by FEJA would affect the state's economy and the environment.

In light of the recent announcement of Exelon's plans to retire the Byron and Dresden plants, the firm re-issued the report, combining the content of the 2019 report with

additional details focused specifically on the losses the state will incur as a result of losing just the Byron and Dresden plants.

Due to limited vaccines allotted, OCHD is required to take a slow and calculated approach when it comes to identifying populations to vaccinate and scheduling of appointments. There are no concerns that the health department will be able to vaccinate everyone, but the process is going to be deliberate to ensure that everyone receives their first and second dose of vaccine.

Illinois has received 995,000 doses of vaccine since federal shipments began last month. The state has administered 447,348 total doses includ-

ing 56,624 doses at long-term care facilities. Ogle County has administered 1,919 total doses, roughly 1 percent of the county population.

County Cases

Illinois has reported 1,059,324 total cases of COVID-19 since the pandemic began in early 2020. The state has conducted over 14.5 million COVID-19 tests and confirmed 18,049 deaths. Ogle County has conducted 41,765 tests and confirmed 4,554 total cases and 63 deaths. The seven-day rolling average positivity rate in Ogle County was 9.8 percent on Friday.

Tim spent most of his life in the heartland of Illinois, which he so loved. He attended Ashton schools and settled in the Rochelle area where he lived until 2011 when he

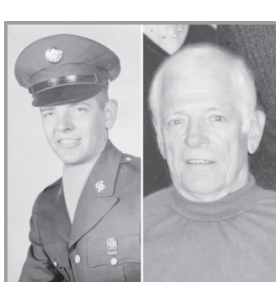
and Jill moved to Euleless, Texas, to be near their grandchildren.

IDPH confirms first Illinois case of UK COVID-19 variant

CHICAGO — The Chicago Department of Public Health (CDPH) and Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) today announced the first case in Illinois of the SARS-CoV-2 variant B.1.1.7 first identified in the United Kingdom. The case was identified by the Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine through sequencing analysis of a specimen from bio-banked samples of COVID-19 positive tests.

The new strain was first identified in the United States about two weeks ago in Colorado and has since been identified in several other states. Evidence suggests that this variant can spread more easily than most currently-circulating strains of COVID-19, but there is no evidence that the new strain affects the sensitivity of diagnostic tests or that it causes more severe illness or increased risk of death. In addition, data suggest current vaccines will be effective and safe in providing protection against the variant.

"This news isn't surprising and doesn't change our guidance around COVID-19. We must double down on the recommended safety strategies we know help stop the spread of this virus," said CDPH Commissioner Allison Arwady, M.D. "In order to protect Chicago, please continue to wear a mask, practice social distancing, wash your hands often, do not have outside guests in

your home, and get vaccinated when it is your turn."

CDPH, IDPH and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), in collaboration with various public health agencies, are closely monitoring this strain.

"When we learned of this and other COVID-19 variants, we increased our surveillance efforts by performing genomic sequence testing on an increased number of specimens," said IDPH Director Dr. Ngozi Ezike. "We will continue to collaborate with our academic partners, local health departments like CDPH, hospitals, and the CDC to monitor for additional cases."

A follow-up case investigation by CDPH found that the individual had travelled to the UK and the Middle East in the 14 days prior to the diagnosis. CDPH has worked to identify close contacts of the individual to reinforce the importance of adherence with quarantine and isolation measures.

CDPH is also working with the CDC and IDPH to contribute to national SARS-CoV-2 strain surveillance. Building regional capacity and coordination for this more advanced, specialized molecular laboratory public health work is a top priority for CDPH. Last year, prior to the detection of this variant, CDPH awarded \$3 million to lay the groundwork for a Regional Innovative Public Health Laboratory,

in partnership with Rush University Medical Center and working with laboratories and academic centers across the City, to increase public health surveillance of possible COVID-19 variants in the Chicago region.

"It is important to monitor the spread of virus variants," said Dr. Egon Ozer, an assistant professor of medicine in infectious diseases at Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine. "We expected this variant to show up eventually. We will continue to sequence and study these samples."

Data

Some data show a higher concentration of the virus in the respiratory tract for the UK variant that could be related to a higher infectivity and easier spread of the variant, but this needs to be confirmed, Ozer said. Some modeling and molecular data also seem to indicate the variant may attach more strongly to the receptor of the human cell, but this also remains under study. Importantly, no data suggests an increased severity of illness, and early studies have shown the vaccine is still effective against this variant.

Dr. Ozer, Dr. Judd Hultquist, Dr. Ramon Lorenzo Redondo and their team in the Northwestern Pathogen Genomics and Bioinformatics Group have been sequencing virus samples obtained from the Northwestern Medicine Diagnostics Molecular Biology Lab and other collaborating institutions. Their goal is to identify populations of SARS-CoV-2 viruses circulating in the city and see how they change over time in their ability to cause disease and spread. In December, the Northwest-

ern team sequenced 180 random residual samples from individuals who came to Northwestern clinics or other sites for COVID-19 testing or screening that would have otherwise been discarded.

The COVID-19 virus — also known as SARS-CoV-2 — like other viruses, constantly changes through mutation, and new variants of a virus are expected to occur over time. According to the CDC, this variant is estimated to have first emerged in the UK during September 2020. Other novel variants of SARS-CoV-2, which also might change the way the virus transmits or behaves, have been identified in South Africa, Nigeria, Brazil, Japan and the US. More novel strains are likely to be identified in the coming weeks and months.

As a pre-cautionary measure, the CDC earlier this week announced that all international passengers headed to the United States will first need to show proof of a negative coronavirus test, a policy which goes into effect on Jan. 26. The new policy requires all air passengers, regardless of vaccination status, to get a test for current infection within the three days before their flight to the United States departs, and to provide written documentation of their test results or proof of having recovered from Covid-19.

Everyday preventive actions by the public can help to slow the spread of all known COVID-19 variants, including wearing a mask, washing hands often, staying six feet away from others and avoiding crowds, avoiding non-essential travel and getting vaccinated when it is your turn.

I had to make an investment in my future by making more time to walk, and I feel so much better than I did before.

I want to encourage you to do what you can to establish a healthier lifestyle. Remember that the body you live in is where God has chosen to live. You are the home of God! Having this perspective can help you be more motivated to take better care of yourself.

Romans 12:1 says to “give your bodies to God because of all he has done for you. Let them be a liv-

ing and holy sacrifice—the kind he will find acceptable. This is truly the way to worship him.”

Do what you can to eliminate excessive stress from your life. We aren’t built to withstand continual pressure and stress.

God loves you and He created you with a plan and purpose to fulfill. You are valuable to Him and deserve to take care of yourself. Pray and ask God for wisdom about how you can establish a healthier lifestyle. Over time, you’ll reap the benefits of making an investment in yourself.

Reflecting on the last five years

MONDAY, Jan. 11 was my fifth anniversary as president of Kishwaukee College. When I arrived in 2016, little did I realize what would be ahead of us.

To recognize the day, I hosted a virtual town hall examining our past, present, and future. It was remarkable to have 148 faculty, staff, and board members participate in the discussion.

We have much to be proud of in looking back at the last five years. One of the most common themes participants shared during the town hall was "teamwork." We have broken down silos and have figured out how to work together. This does not mean we always agree — but we have figured out that even when we are not all on the same page on certain points, we are all at Kishwaukee College to serve our students.

Much of our work has focused on student success. 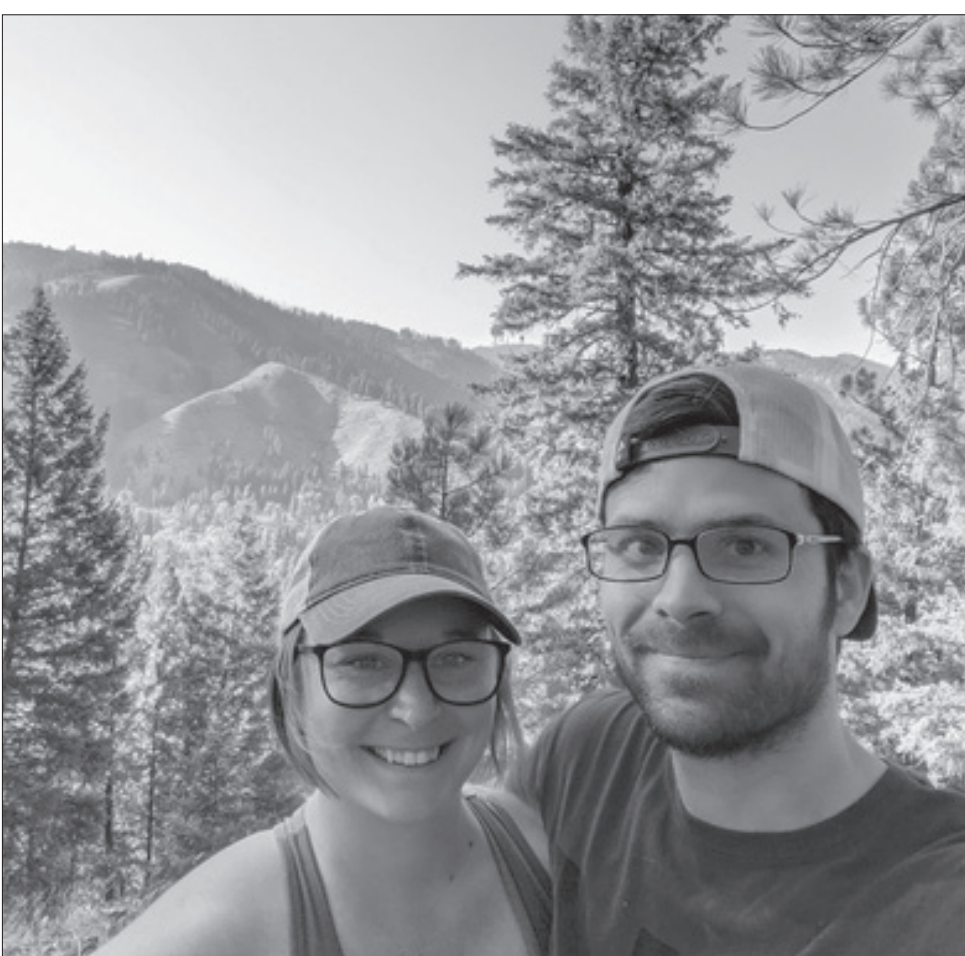
McKinley, Hine to be wed

New Illinois House Speaker Welch promises to 'possibly make a lot of changes' to House rules

FOR the first time in decades, there's a new speaker of the Illinois House and he's making history.

But he also comes in under a cloud of recently revealed allegations of abusive behavior from years ago, and a close connection to the former controversial House Speaker.

On the eve of Chris Welch's election to Illinois House speaker, replacing longtime House Speaker Michael Madigan, media reports highlighted allegations against Welch made by women.

After conducting his first session Wednesday as the new speaker, Welch told the media that reports of abusive behavior against women are behind him.

"People mature, they look back and would do

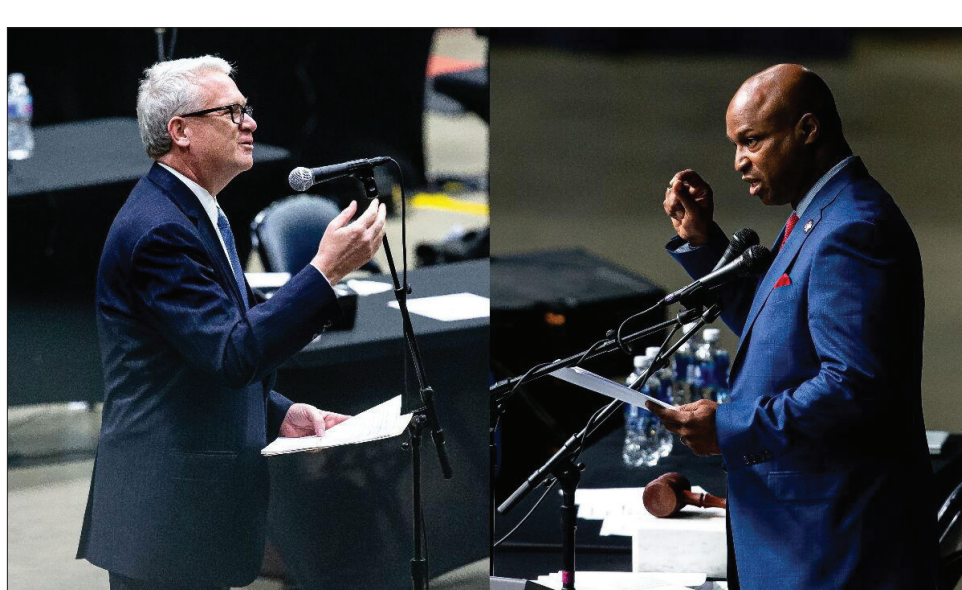
things differently and I think my life's work here in the legislature shows my respect for women," Welch said.

In recent years as speaker, Madigan had his office rocked with allegations of mistreatment of women both at the statehouse and within his political operations during the peak of the #MeToo movement.

Madigan, D-Chicago, had maintained despite the repeated reports of improper behavior in his office, he never fostered a culture of harassment.

There was also last year's revelations of the ComEd bribery scheme where Madigan associates allegedly received bribes in the form of contracts and do-nothing jobs with utility ComEd.

ComEd admitted to the bribes, saying the utility was trying to influence Madigan. Madigan

has not been charged and maintains he never knew of any attempt to influence his office.

Illinois House Minority Leader Jim Durkin, R-Western Springs, said one way for Welch to distinguish himself from the culture of Madigan,

who is now just a state Representative from Chicago, is to bring fairness to the House Rules, which Madigan has controlled for decades.

"We want to make sure that when [Republicans] have bills that they will a fighting chance for at least

a hearing and for an up or down vote," Durkin said. "That's all I ask for."

Welch said House rules will be among the first things he's open to addressing.

"Possibly make changes, possibly make a lot of changes," Welch said. "I

don't know what those changes are until I have these conversations that's going to take place pretty quickly."

Leading up to Welch's election to Speaker, Durkin had said Welch will be an extension of Madigan. Thursday, Durkin said he hopes to work with Welch to leave the past behind them.

Durkin also said he doesn't anticipate filing another petition to have the House investigate Madigan's involvement in the ComEd bribery scheme.

Welch chaired the House Special Investigating Committee last year where he and other Democrats blocked Republican motions to subpoena Madigan and others to testify about the scandal. Welch said they didn't want to interfere with an ongoing federal investigation.

State fire officials join in promoting IL OSHA 101 for fire departments

New training program to increase human trafficking awareness launched

CHICAGO – January 11 is Human Trafficking Awareness Day, and the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) is reminding the public that human trafficking is not something that only happens to people in other countries but occurs every day across Illinois to children whose average age is 14.

To coincide with Human Trafficking Awareness Day, the department launched a new online human trafficking training for DCFS and private agency partner staff.

The mandatory training encompasses key concepts and terminology; signs that a youth may be a victim of human trafficking or at risk of being trafficked; experiences of trafficked youth in foster care; and techniques child welfare professionals can use to support youth who have been trafficked.

"Illinois' children are not immune to the reality of human trafficking, and it's up to all of us to recognize the signs and call 911 and the DCFS hotline if you think a child may be in danger," said Illinois DCFS Acting Director Marc D. Smith. "By working in coordination, DCFS and our partners provide a safety net to rescue child human trafficking victims and help them heal."

In 2010, Illinois became one of the first states to pass comprehensive legislation to address the human trafficking of children under the age of 18.

Under the Illinois Safe Children Act, children who are coerced into human trafficking/prostitution are innocent and immune from criminal prosecution and are diverted to the child welfare system with DCFS instead of the criminal justice system. Illinois DCFS established a strong partnership with federal, local

and private agencies to prevent the human trafficking of children and support the children who have been trafficked and their families.

In Fiscal Year 2020, Illinois DCFS investigated 239 allegations of human trafficking of children – though experts believe the number of incidents that occurred during that time is higher.

Often, victims of human trafficking do not seek help because they are fearful, ashamed of their situation, distrust law enforcement or become dependent on the perpetrator.

DCFS partners with the FBI, the Cook County State's Attorney's Office, the Cook County Sheriff's Office, the Chicago Police Department and the Chicago Children's Advocacy Center to help locate missing or runaway youth who are at risk of falling victim to human trafficking and ensure appropriate services and housing are in place when a child victim is rescued.

When there is an allegation of child human trafficking, the child victim is referred to the local Children's Advocacy Center (CAC) where they are asked assessment questions only once by a trained professional in a safe environment. Medical and mental health professionals, law enforcement, prosecution and DCFS investigators observe, ensuring the child is not re-traumatized by recounting events multiple times.

The department partners with four agencies to provide support and services to youth who have been trafficked or are at risk of being trafficked. Chicago's ReClaim13 provides mentors and offers a congregate care setting for victims of sex trafficking between the ages of 10 and 17; Hoylton's HALO (Healing and Loving Oneself) program provides services and support to youth in

southern Illinois who have been victims of sex trafficking or are at risk of becoming victims; Selah Freedom provides prevention services to youth in care across the state and the Salvation Army's STOP-IT program provides advocacy and support services to referred youth.

Know the signs. A trafficked child might:

Have an adult control them by speaking for them.

Seem out of place given the time of day or night.

Look disheveled or dressed in clothes that they could not afford to buy.

Show signs of physical abuse such as bruising or red marks.

Not possess any form of identification.

Perform inappropriate work for their age and not be compensated.

Anyone who believes a child might be trafficked, or in danger of being trafficked, should immediately call 911 and the Child Abuse Hotline at 1-800-25-ABUSE (800-252-2873).

Herbs and spices that can promote healthy hearts

A nutritious diet is a key component of a healthy lifestyle. When paired with regular physical activity, a nutritious diet can help people dramatically reduce their risk for various diseases, including heart disease.

According to the World Health Organization, ischemic heart disease and stroke claim more lives each year than any other disease, annually accounting for roughly 15 percent of all deaths across the globe. Many deaths caused by heart disease can be prevented, and eating a healthy diet is a great preventive measure that anyone can take.

Though some people may associate healthy diets with bland foods that lack flavor, people can incorporate various heart-healthy herbs and spices into their favorite dishes to make them more nutritious and flavorful.

Garlic: Garlic has long since earned its place on the kitchen spice rack. However, botanically, garlic is neither an herb or a spice but a vegetable. Regardless of how it's classified, garlic is loaded with flavor and can be used to improve just about any recipe, all the while benefitting heart health.

The United States-based health services provider Mercy Health notes that garlic can help lower blood pressure and reduce bad cholesterol levels.

Cayenne pepper: Few ingredients may change a recipe as quickly as cayenne pepper. The addition of cayenne pepper can instantly make dishes more spicy. But cayenne pepper brings more than a little extra kick to the dinner table. Healthline



notes that various studies have shown that capsaicin, the active ingredient in cayenne pepper, can provide a host of health benefits. One such study published in the British Journal of Nutrition found that adding capsaicin to a high-carbohydrate breakfast significantly reduced hunger and the desire to eat before lunch. Eating less can help people more effectively control their body weight, which in turn reduces their risk for heart disease.

Turmeric: Garlic and even cayenne pepper may already be staples in many people's kitchens, but that's not necessarily so with turmeric. A yellow spice often used when preparing Indian foods, turmeric has anti-inflammatory properties thanks to curcumin, the part of turmeric responsible for giving it its yellow color. Experts acknowledge that turmeric needs to be studied more to definitively conclude its effects on heart health, but WebMD notes that one small study indicated that turmeric

can help ward off heart attacks in people who have had bypass surgery.

Coriander: A popular herb used across the globe, coriander is sometimes mistaken for cilantro. Though the two come from the same plant, cilantro refers to the leaves and stems of the coriander plant, while the coriander in recipes typically refers to the seeds of that plant. Mercy Health notes that coriander seeds may help reduce bad cholesterol and high blood pressure, both of which are significant risk factors for heart disease.

Heart-healthy herbs and spices can be added to various recipes, proving that nutritious meals need not be void of flavor.

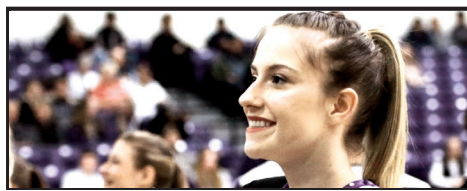

Tumbling highlights Hueramo's senior goals

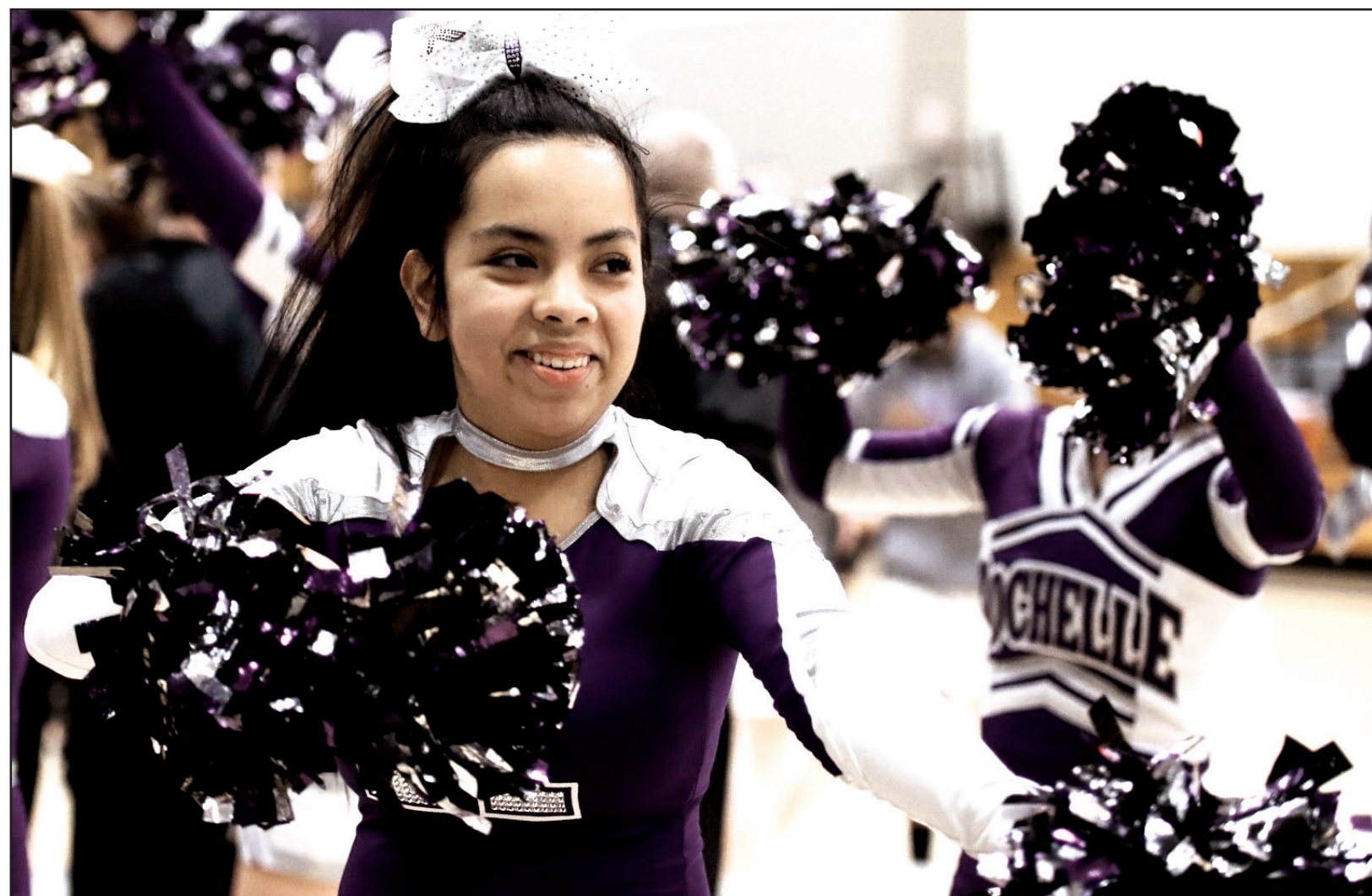
Varsity cheerleader enjoying family-like bond with teammates

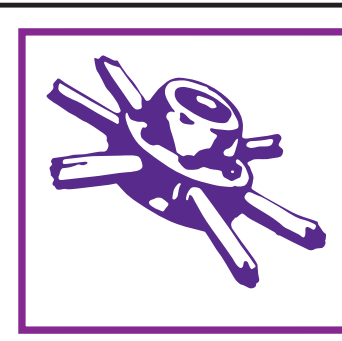

IHSA permits contact days to begin soon

Special meeting set for Jan. 27

THE IHSA Board of Directors met for its regularly scheduled meeting on Wednesday, Jan. 13, 2021, where the board announced that all IHSA sports not operating under an official IHSA season calendar may begin to conduct contact days as soon as they are allowable per Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) mitigations and local school guidance. Contact days normally exist within the IHSA as informal voluntary offseason workouts.

"The IHSA acknowledges the immense mental, emotional, and physical strain that a lack of contact with school programs is causing Illinois high school student-athletes," said IHSA Executive Director Craig Anderson. "It is our intention that these contact days provide sport-specific training under the leadership of high school coaches. This is an effort to provide a viable sports option to high school athletes given the growing number of student-athletes opting for higher risk opportunities within the state and across state lines."

Additionally, the board reviewed several options outlining a sports schedule framework for the remainder of the school year. The board directed the IHSA staff to take feedback from today's meeting, as well as any insight gained in the coming weeks, and bring forward viable scheduling options for a special board

meeting on Jan. 27, 2021. The board will provide an update following that meeting.

Once state leadership allows for low-risk winter sports (boys and girls bowling, cheerleading, dance, girls gymnastics, boys swimming and diving) to begin participation, those teams will be allowed to begin practice immediately and then continue their season through the season calendar established by the Board later this month.

The IHSA Board of Directors released a joint statement following today's meeting:

"We realize there is a desire for finality on a sports schedule for 2020-21, however, we did not believe it would be prudent to lock ourselves into a schedule at a time when IHSA schools are unable to conduct any sports. Per Gov. Pritzker, we have hope that low-risk sports may be permitted in certain regions of the state as early as this Friday (Jan. 15). With that in mind, February seems like a realistic timeline to have sports resume statewide. We expect that the events of the next two weeks will go a long way toward informing our opinion on which scheduling option we decide to proceed with. We recognize that if no sports have resumed by February, season lengths could be impacted in certain sports, and that we may need to take a longer look at the likelihood of true seasons being con-

ducted in high-risk sports this year. Our overall goal remains unchanged, as we hope to conduct all IHSA sports during the remainder of the school year calendar. Please know that we see and read many of the comments and messages from student-athletes, coaches, and parents, and that we are doing everything we can to try and bring IHSA sports back within the current parameters we are working in."

The IHSA successfully conducted seasons in golf, girls tennis, cross country and girls swimming and diving through sectional competitions this fall, but all IHSA sports have been paused since Nov. 20.

"We remain collaborative in our efforts with IDPH and the Governor's office," said Anderson. "We are trying to do our part to fight the pandemic, while simultaneously seeking safe participation opportunities for our student-athletes. We understand the real mental toll this pause in athletics is having on Illinois high school student-athletes. We believe that school-based athletic participation is better regulated, making it the safest participation option for our students, and more data continues to emerge supporting that stance. We will continue to share that information with state leadership in hopes that we can work together to provide participation opportunities for young people in our state."

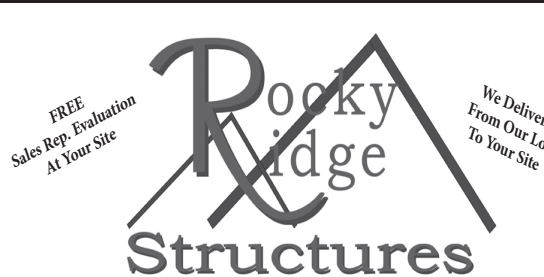

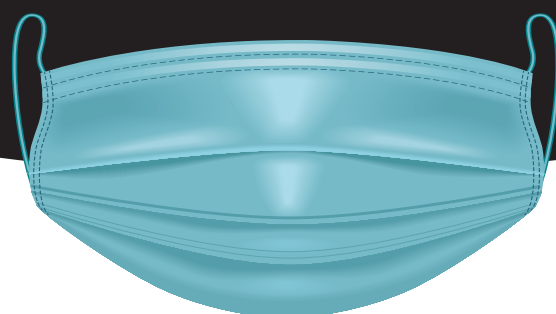

Interstate 8 Conference, Kishwaukee River Conference enter agreement for 2021-22 season

14 member schools to compete across two seven-team groups

ROCHELLE — The Interstate 8 Conference and Kishwaukee River Conference will come together for the 2021-22 IHSA football season. The 14-school conglomerate will be split into two groups, each containing seven schools based on enrollment and geographical location.

Group A will feature Harvard, Johnsburg, Marengo, Plano, Richmond-Burton, Rochelle and Sandwich. Group B will include Kane land, LaSalle-Peru, Morris, Ottawa, Sycamore, Woodstock and Woodstock North. Teams will play seven intraconference games during the 2021-22 season including six games within each group and one game against an opponent from the other group. The first two weeks of the nine-game season will be played against nonconference opponents.

“A couple of the athletic directors from the KRC and the Interstate 8 discussed combining in order to

help alleviate scheduling concerns because the KRC only has six schools,” RTHS athletic director Richard Harvey said. “The combination gives us two divisions with similar enrollment sizes and that will help some of the smaller schools be able to compete better.”

Principals from the Interstate 8 and Kishwaukee River Conferences voted on the measure Thursday. Although All-Conference athletes will be determined by the group each school plays in, Harvey said athletic directors are working through how conference champions will be determined. If the new union moves to recognize division champions, Harvey said the IHSA will still recognize division winners as conference champions, which earn automatic play-off bids.

“There was some discussion about incorporating dance and cheer championships into this format to alleviate some of the judging costs,” Harvey said. “Some of the smaller



sports like bowling were also discussed, but we're not proceeding with either of those options at this time.”

The new agreement will align Rochelle with familiar rivals like Plano and Sandwich as well as nonconference foes such as Johnsburg, who the Hubs have faced during both the regular season and postseason in recent years. Harvey said the agreement

will allow Rochelle to continue having a highly competitive schedule for the upcoming football

season.

“Richmond-Burton and Marengo have been to the semifinals recently,” Har-

vey said. “We're looking forward to that and we need to make sure we keep our competitive edge.”

Huskies add transfers Lombardi, Ratkovich

Quarterback, running back on campus as spring semester begins

DEKALB — Graduate transfers Rocky Lombardi and Clint Ratkovich have joined the Northern Illinois University football program, while a quartet of 2021 freshmen signees are also on campus for the 2021 spring semester, NIU head coach Thomas Hammock announced Wednesday.

Lombardi, a junior quarterback from Clive, Iowa (Valley HS), was a three-year letterwinner at Michigan State who started nine games for the Spartans over the last three seasons and led MSU to wins over No. 13 Michigan and No. 8 Northwestern in 2020. He threw for 1,090 yards on 84 completions in 2020

and totaled over 2,000 yards of total offense during his MSU career. He was named the Manning Award National Quarterback of the Week for his 2020 performance versus Michigan (Oct. 31) when he completed 17-of-32 passes for 323 yards and three touchdowns. He completed six passes of 50 or more yards in 2020, including a 75-yard touchdown pass versus Northwestern, when he also rushed for 65 yards on 10 carries.

"We're certainly excited about Rocky and what he brings to the quarterback room from a leadership perspective and from a competitive perspective,"

said Hammock, who also noted Lombardi's background as a prep wrestler in Iowa. "Playing in the Big Ten has given him a level of experience that is needed in our young quarterback room. We embrace competition on this team and he's looking forward to having the opportunity to compete beginning this spring."

Ratkovich was named to the All-Missouri Valley Football Conference first team in 2018 and 2019 where he made a name for himself as both a runner and a receiver out of the backfield. He caught

128 passes for 1,204 yards and 10 touchdowns for the Leathernecks, who did not compete this fall. On the ground, he averaged 4.4 yards per carry on 97 attempts during his career while playing in 35 games. The Crete-Monee High School product from Crete, Illinois, accumulated 1,866 yards at Western Illinois.



"Clint is an interesting chess piece to add to our offense," Hammock said. "He described himself as a 'superback' and I made a comparison to [current 49ers fullback] Kyle Juszczyk when we had him with

the [Baltimore] Ravens. He brings skills as a runner and as a receiver that will bring more versatility to our offense."

Lombardi and Ratkovich will enter NIU as juniors in 2021 and as graduate transfers are eligible to play immediately.

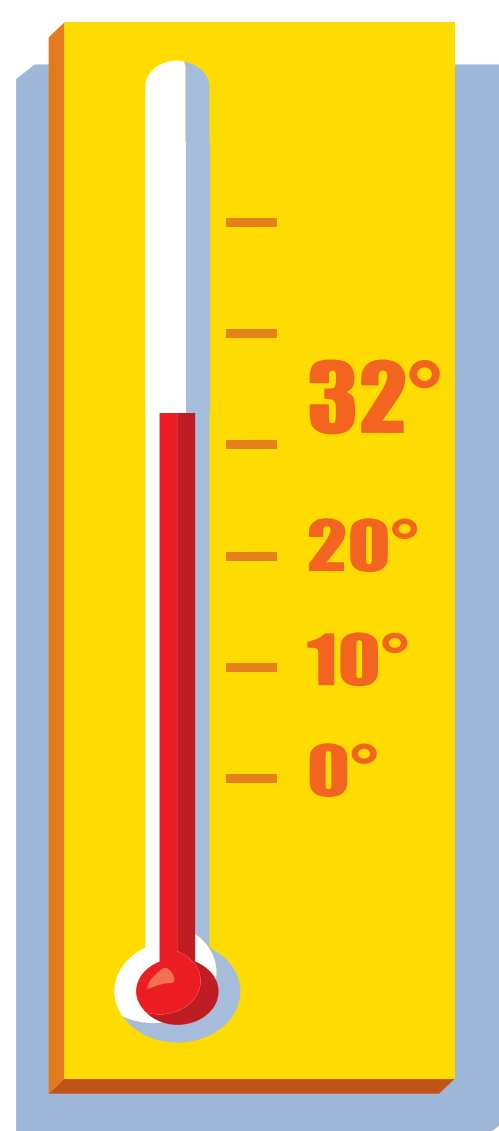
In addition to the two transfers, four freshmen signed in December are enrolled at NIU for the spring semester. Quarterback Ethan Hampton (Elburn/Aurora Christian HS), tight end Blake Kossin (Davisburg, Michigan/Clarkston HS), cornerback Cyrus McGarrell (Windsor, Ontario, Canada/Clearwater Academy International)

and offensive lineman Pete Nygra (North Indianapolis, Indiana/Brownsburg HS) will take part in conditioning and spring football this year.

"It's always good to have mid-year high school guys come in to get their first taste of college football," Hammock said. "We've had great success with mid-year guys having the opportunity to play. This group will be able to go through spring ball and also are in classes and we're happy to have them with us."

The Huskies will open 2021 spring football practices in March with specific dates and a complete spring roster available in February.
