Vaccines on the way

Health department receives first COVID-19 vaccine shipment

ROCHELLE — The Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine, which utilizes mRNA technology, has made its way into Ogle County and the City of Rochelle this week after the U.S. Food & Drug Administration issued an Emergency Use Authorization for the vaccine on Dec. 10.

Illinois will receive 109,000 doses of the Pfizer vaccine, which will be sent to 10 hospitals across the state that will serve as distribution centers for the vaccine. The Pfizer vaccine requires two doses, with the second vaccine dose taken 21 days after administering the first dose.

Public Health Administrator Kyle Auman updated the Ogle County Board on vaccine distribution plans during the regular board meeting Tuesday evening. Auman said that Ogle County will receive 355 doses of the vaccine in the initial shipment arriving this week. Auman also said that hospitals,

which will receive the vaccines first, will receive weekly shipments moving forward.

"We are set to receive the vaccine this week," Auman said. "It will probably be a couple of months before we get to vaccinating everyone. This will be a voluntary vaccine and

nobody will be forced to get the vaccine. There's a light at the end of the tunnel and things are looking up."

In Rochelle, Chief Ancillary Officer Jim Carle said the Pfizer vaccines arrived at Rochelle Community Hospital on Wednesday afternoon. Carle said RCH received 155 doses

of the vaccine, which will be administered at the hospital over the next three days. Carle said all 155 vaccines are spoken for and the number of vaccines was determined based on the number of EMS providers throughout Ogle County and the number employees at the hospital.

Illinois received its first shipments of the Pfizer vaccine Monday. Under Phase 1A of the IDPH COVID-19 Vaccination Planning Guide, healthcare personnel and long-term care facility residents will receive vaccines first.

Planets coming together

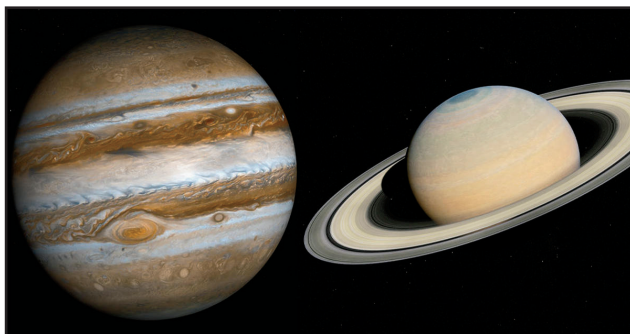
Jupiter and Saturn visible Monday

JUPITER and Saturn will merge in the night sky Monday, appearing closer to one another than they have since Galileo's time in the 17th century.

Astronomers say so-called conjunctions between the two largest planets in our solar system aren't particularly rare. Jupiter passes its neighbor Saturn in their respective laps around the sun every 20 years.

But the one coming up is especially close: Jupiter and Saturn will be just one-tenth of a degree apart from our perspective or about one-fifth the width of a full moon. They should be easily visible around the world a little after sunset, weather permitting.

Toss in the winter solstice in the Northern Hemisphere, the longest night of the year — and the summer solstice in the Southern Hemisphere — and this just-in-time-for-Christmas spectacle promises to be one of the greatest of Great



Conjunctions.

It will be the closest Jupiter-Saturn pairing since July 1623, when the two planets appeared a little nearer. This conjunction was almost impossible to see, however, because of its closeness to the sun.

Considerably closer and in plain view was the March 1226 conjunction of the two planets — when Genghis Khan was conquering Asia. Monday's conjunction will be the closest pairing that is visible since way back then.

Saturn and Jupiter have been drawing closer in the south-southwest sky for weeks. Jupiter — bigger and closer to Earth — is vastly brighter.

To see it, be ready shortly after sunset Monday, looking to the southwest fairly low on the horizon. Saturn will be the smaller, fainter blob at Jupiter's upperright. Binoculars will be needed to separate the two planets.

Despite appearances, Jupiter and Saturn will actually be more than 450 million miles (730 million kilometers) apart. Earth, meanwhile, will be 550 million miles (890 million kilometers) from Jupiter.

A telescope will not only capture Jupiter and Saturn in the same field of view, but even some of their brightest moons.

Their next super-close pairing: March 15, 2080.

Auman said that long-term care facilities in Ogle County will partner with Walgreens and CVS to administer vaccines to both residents and staff members.

Phases 1B and 1C could include frontline workers, high-risk adults and seniors ages 65 and older. Both phases, as well as later phases, will require additional guidance from the CDC and ACIP. Auman said the vaccinations of long-term care residents and staff will begin on Dec. 28.

Auman said the Ogle County Health Department will establish distribution points once the county has received adequate amounts

of the vaccine. The vaccine will be offered at no cost, although Auman said some facilities may charge administration fees billable to insurance. Auman said it may be a few months before the county can begin vaccinating the general public.

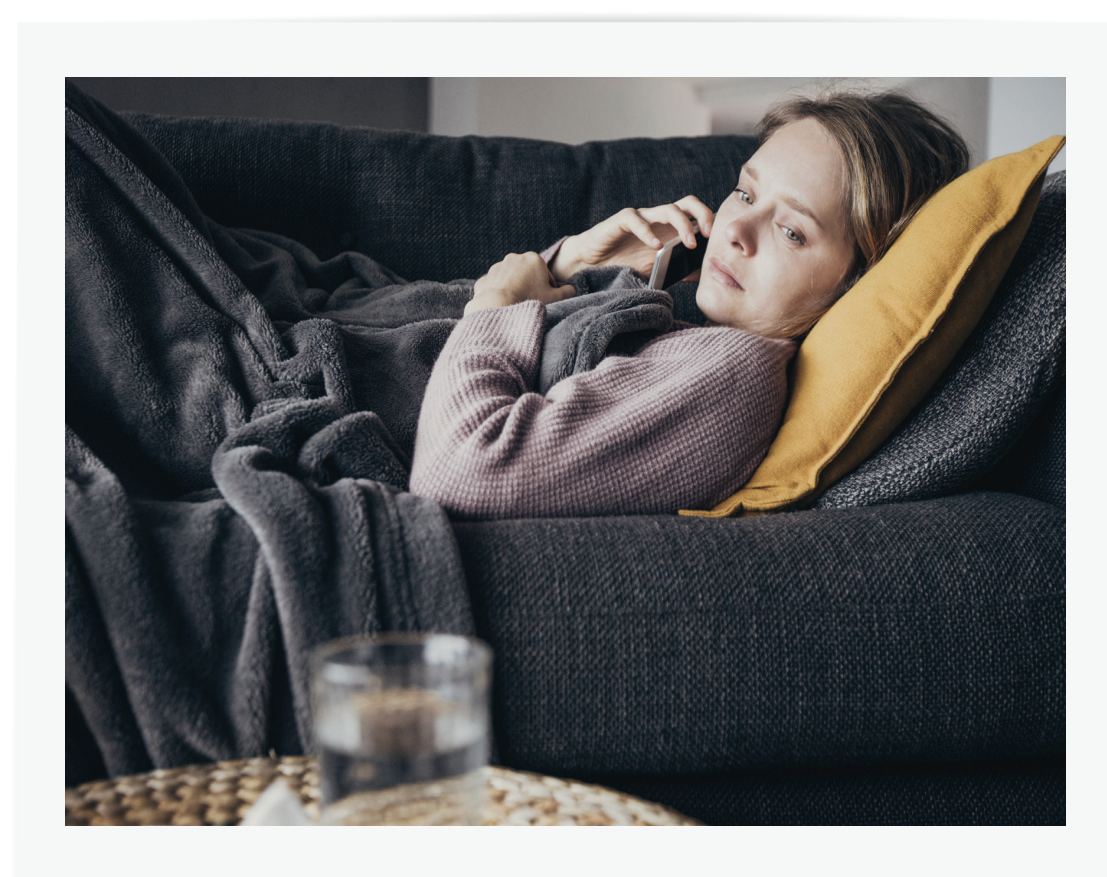
Pfizer and BioNTech are the first companies to have a COVID-19 vaccine approved. Moderna will have its vaccine data reviewed for FDA approval on Dec. 17. Johnson & Johnson, as well as AstraZeneca and Oxford University, are currently conducting late-phase trials. Pfizer's vaccine was found to be 95 percent effective, while Moderna's was 94 percent effective.

Illinois solicits donations for Computer Equity Network

Statewide program seeks to shrink digital divide for low-income families

SPRINGFIELD — The state is soliciting computers and related equipment from individuals and companies as part of a new program announced Wednesday that will distribute refurbished devices to low-income households.

The Computer Equity Network is a collaboration between the state, the non-profit PCs for People, municipal governments and private businesses. The program is tied to the ongoing Connect Illinois initiative based out of the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity that seeks to expand broadband access in the state.

Gov. JB Pritzker announced the program during his daily COVID-19 briefing on Wednesday. “One of the largest gaps made even more significant in this pandemic is the digital divide,” Pritzker said.

“How can your child learn from home if you don’t have internet access? How can you shop for groceries safely online if you don’t have a computer? Accessing the digital world has become essential for students, for small business owners, for patient-doctor communications, for job applications. Really there’s no realm in which connecting online hasn’t become ab-

solutely necessary in the modern era.”

DCEO estimates that out of 4.9 million Illinois households, more than 1.1 million currently lack computer access in their home.

According to DCEO Director Erin Guthrie, the Equity Network will host community hand-off events in all 102 Illinois counties to give away the upgraded devices to eligible families. The events will also feature on-site support from DCEO to provide digital literacy courses and options for accessing low-cost internet services.

What’s outside of the state’s hands, however, are the actual computers. “We know that sourcing hardware is a limiting factor in this work, we are here today to call on Illinois companies to help us meet this challenge,” Guthrie said. “We are counting on you to maximize the impact of this initiative; your donation is essential as we work to close the gap.”

Pritzker suggested that “in the spirit of this holiday season,” Illinois companies, when upgrading equipment, can donate their old technology to the Equity Network, where PCs For People will upgrade it and give it to a family in need.

“It’s all hands on deck. Employers large and small, and likewise governments large and small,” Matt Schmit, the state’s Office of Broadband Director, said in an interview.

Colleges and other institutions of higher education that are upgrading equipment and can donate their older computers will be likely donors. Counties, cities or even small towns are also encouraged to partner with local businesses to recycle equipment during an update cycle.

“It can be computers by the hundreds or just a couple here and there. It all makes a difference,” he said.

Companies and individuals who give computers to the program are eligible for tax reductions under applicable regulations for property donations to charitable organizations.

Philanthropic entities are also encouraged to

contribute. Current partners of the Equity Network include the Illinois COVID-19 Response Fund, the Jewish United Fund, the Girl Scouts of Southern Illinois, and the Urban League of Metropolitan St. Louis.

PCs for People CEO Casey Sorensen said the network has currently committed to providing 20,000 computers to low-income families during the non-profit’s first year operating in Illinois. Given the state’s number of households lacking computers is more than one million, significant investment in the program from public, private and philanthropic entities will be necessary to source enough computers to meet

the demand.

“It’s easy for many to take for granted access to a computer and internet, but the pandemic has shown us millions of kids cannot access education,” Sorensen said. “We have received the warm welcome from local corporations, and now with the governor’s call to action, we’re optimistic about announcing many new partnerships in the near future, that help us sustain supply to reach Illinois families.”

Illinois residents who are eligible for free computers must be below 200 percent of the federal poverty line or enrolled in income-based government assistance programs such as free or reduced school

lunch, Medicaid or SNAP.

Alongside the distribution events scheduled in every Illinois county, two statewide distribution centers, one in the Metro East area and one in Chicago, will be open for donations.

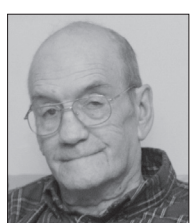

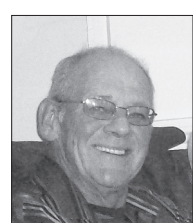

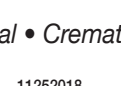

Discover how God sees you

IN today's society, insecurity and self-rejection have reached an all-time high. More than ever before, so many people simply don't like themselves.

Over the years, I have met countless people who believe God is angry with them because they haven't "arrived" at the place of perfection. As a result, they live in a state of perpetual frustration—continually rejecting themselves and feeling bad every time they make a mistake.

But Jesus didn't give His life for us to walk around feeling guilty and condemned. He wants us to feel good about ourselves and our relationship with Him. And it all starts with discovering our true identity in Christ.

For many years, I tried to please God with my works. It seemed as if I was

living on a performance treadmill—always trying to do something to feel good about myself and feel like I was in right standing with Him. In the process, I became weary, worn-out, and unhappy. I would think, Something is just not working.

I was right. No matter how much we love God and choose to do what's right, we will always be frustrated until we understand this life-changing truth:

"For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God" (Ephesians 2:8 NIV).

There is nothing we can do to earn our salvation or right standing with God; we have been made right with Him through our faith in Jesus Christ. A believer that is lacking this understanding is like a jumbo jet on the runway with no gasoline—

he has all the equipment but is going nowhere.

In His mercy, God allowed me to see that there was absolutely nothing I could do to make Him love me any more or less than He already did. All He wanted was for me to believe in Jesus, "the one he has sent" (John 6:29 NIV) and receive the righteousness He has provided.

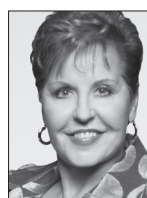
In order for us to experience true freedom and grow in our relationship with God, we must learn to accept ourselves right where we are and see ourselves the way God sees us. Second Corinthians 5:21

(NIV) says, "God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God."

This is the basis of self-acceptance—knowing that God accepts us through Jesus and sees us as totally righteous. This does not mean that we don't sin anymore or that we can dismiss it like it's no big deal. It simply means that God loves us even while we are in the process of becoming like Christ—before we have "arrived."

For example, when she was two years old, one of our granddaughters would throw fits when she didn't get her way. She'd throw herself on the ground and scream uncontrollably. Now, even though I disliked her behavior, I still loved her tremendously. I don't stop

loving my grandchildren or kick them out of the family because they do wrong things. I love them and work with them to develop the good character I know they need to succeed in life.

The same is true with God, our heavenly Father. He doesn't love our wrong behavior, but He certainly loves us. Romans 5:8 says that He proved His love for us by sending His Son "while we were still sinners." In other words, He didn't wait until we were righteous to send Jesus—He sent Jesus because we would never be righteous without Him.

Isaiah 61:10 (NIV) says, "I delight greatly in the Lord; my soul rejoices in my God. For he has clothed me with garments of salvation and arrayed me in a robe of his righteousness...."

What does this mean

for us? It means when we make mistakes, God literally has us covered with His robe of righteousness. So when the enemy comes against us with thoughts of guilt or condemnation, we can stand firm against his accusations. We can stand on God's Word and say...

"I am the righteousness of God in Christ. I am clothed in His righteousness—not mine. The Bible says that if I confess my sin, God is faithful to forgive me and cleanse me from all unrighteousness. I am loved!" (See 1 John 1:9)

God is on your side, and He wants you to feel good about yourself and the progress you are making. So don't spend your time frustrated because you haven't "arrived." God is not mad at you because you aren't perfect—He is only disappointed if you quit running the race.

IDVA officials say COVID-19 outbreak slowing at LaSalle Veterans' Home

Lawmakers press officials on delayed on-site visit, Pritzker's knowledge of outbreak

SPRINGFIELD — Infection control efforts at the LaSalle Veterans' Home have curbed the spread of the coronavirus since a deadly outbreak began at the facility last month, according to officials who testified Wednesday before a House committee investigating the matter.

That outbreak has caused at least 33 resident deaths, the latest of which was reported early last week.

The House committee on Wednesday heard testimony from Illinois Department of Veterans Affairs officials, including Director Linda Chapa LaVia, Chief of Staff Anthony Kolbeck, Illinois Department of Public Health medical consultant Dr. Avery Hart, and inter-

im LaSalle Administrator Anthony Vaughn.

Despite that progress in containing transmission, several lawmakers on the committee raised concerns to IDVA officials about the state's response from when the initial outbreak was reported on Nov. 1 to the first on-site visit by an official with the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs on Nov. 12.

The in-person subject matter hearing, which lasted about three hours, is the committee's first regarding the root cause of the outbreak at LaSalle. Committee chairwoman Rep. Stephanie Kifowit, D-Oswego, said she expects the committee will have additional hearings into the matter.

The state Senate Veterans Affairs Committee held its own remote subject matter hearing on Nov. 24.

Vaughn has been in charge of the home since

last week when former administrator Angela Mehlbrech was fired. Kolbeck said he couldn't comment on her firing because it was a personnel matter.

Kifowit said Illinois Department of Public Health officials declined to attend the hearing — aside from the consultant Hart — citing an ongoing internal investigation into the LaSalle outbreak.

There are currently 16 residents still positive for the virus out of the 93 total residents remaining at LaSalle, and one positive employee, according to an IDVA spokesperson.

More than a quarter of the facility's residents have died since the first resident tested positive on Nov. 1. By Nov. 7, test results showed 22 residents and seven staff were positive. By Nov. 8, 59 residents and 64 staff tested positive for COVID-19.

Kolbeck said the La-

Salle home administrator notified the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs of the outbreak on Nov. 2, and the LaSalle County Health Department notified IDPH "within the reporting system."

On Nov. 9, Kolbeck said, there was a virtual meeting between IDPH staff and veterans home administrators "as a general touch-base on the facilities," and there was additional correspondence that day between the LaSalle home administrator and USDVA.

Kolbeck said he also sent an email on Nov. 9 to IDPH, requesting an on-site visit "to explore potential opportunities for containment and control not otherwise identified." On Nov. 11, he said, IDPH had a phone conversation with the facility administrator and the infection control nurse.

The facility reported seven resident deaths on Nov. 11.

Pritzker

Rep. David Welter, R-Morris, asked Chapa LaVia whether she spoke to Gov. JB Pritzker about the deaths reported on Nov. 11 when she and Pritzker were together in Chicago for a Veterans Day event.

"We discussed it briefly. And, like I've said prior, (Pritzker) has been kept abreast of everything going on," she said, adding that Pritzker called her later on in the week for an update on the situation at LaSalle.

In response to questions about the immediate response from state and local agencies to the outbreak, Hart said the LaSalle County Health Department is the first line of defense.

"(Local department of public health officials) are the people who actually notify IDPH of the outbreak and send updates to IDPH, and I cannot

speak for the local health department. But I am aware that they provided extensive guidance to the LaSalle Veterans' Home in the very early days of the outbreak on a number of topics, including how to manage the cohorting of the residents, how to handle the PPE, etc. So there was an active intervention by the local health department in that very early phase," Hart said.

Hart said an IDPH team visited the home on Dec. 14 to review the infection control practices put in place since the onsite visits.

During the Nov. 12 visit, a USDVA official noted several deficiencies at the LaSalle home, including the use of wall mounted hand sanitizer containers that had a non-alcohol based product. The facility also used hand sanitizer dispensers containing an alcohol-based product, which has since replaced the sanitizer in the non-alcohol based wall mounts.

That site visit report also documented examples of staff failing to follow proper protocol for personal protective equipment. In one instance staff were observed eating with masks below their chins in the kitchen within six feet of one another.

Hart said at the Dec. 14 visit, staff at the LaSalle facility were found consistently in compliance with Centers for Disease Control and Prevention guidance regarding appropriate hand hygiene, PPE use and social distancing.

He said rapid antigen testing being conducted on home employees prior to every shift and all residents every day "has shown that transmission within the facility has been controlled."

"We're not seeing evidence of new transmission within the facility," Hart said.

Late last month, the IDVA announced the act-

ing inspector general from the Illinois Department of Human Services will conduct an independent investigation into the outbreak. Since then, three separate legislative committees have begun their own inquiries.

Illinois National Guard members were sent to the LaSalle facility last week, and National Guard members were also sent to assist with ongoing COVID-19 outbreaks at veterans homes in Quincy and Manteno on Monday.

As of Dec. 15, the Quincy Veterans' Home reported a total of three resident deaths related to COVID-19 illnesses and total of 70 residents have tested positive for COVID-19 since the beginning of the pandemic. The facility has reported that 37 residents have recovered.

Manteno Veterans' Home has reported 17 total resident deaths related to COVID-19 since the beginning of the pandemic, as of Dec. 15. The Manteno home reported 67 total residents have tested positive, and 46 have recovered.

Seven Army National Guard soldiers were sent to LaSalle, while four Air National Guard Airmen were sent to Quincy and three to Manteno.

The National Guard members are helping staff with COVID-19 administrative tasks, such as processing COVID-19 testing data and questionnaires for IDVA employees and entering the information into the medical database within 24 hours, an IDVA spokesperson said.

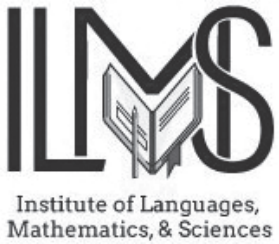

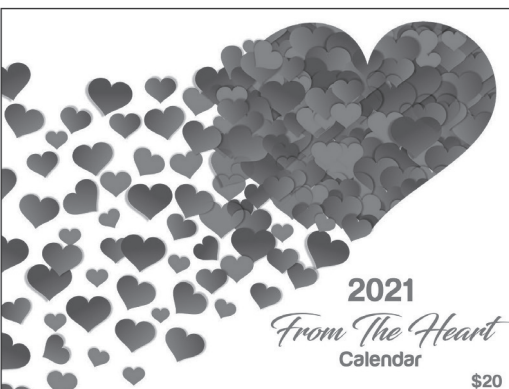

WINTER SURVIVAL

Shovel snow safely this winter

THE beauty of freshly fallen snow is undeniable. Such beauty compels millions of people across the globe to ski and snowboard each winter, while millions more enjoy simply looking out their windows at snow-covered landscapes.

If it was as convenient as it is beautiful, snow would likely be welcomed with open arms whenever the local weatherperson includes it in his or her forecast. But heavy snowfall can be inconvenient, making it difficult to travel and even creating more work for individuals

responsible for shoveling their driveways and walkways.

Shoveling snow can increase a person's risk for injury, and some may be surprised to learn just how frequently such injuries happen. The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission notes that, in 2018, more than 137,000 people needed medical assistance for injuries that happened while shoveling snow or using snowblowers.

Sprains and strains in the back and shoulders are the most common injuries when shoveling snow. But people also can suffer lacerations and injuries related to below-freezing temperatures when shoveling snow. The American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons recommends people keep these safety precautions in mind when shoveling snow this winter.

Stretch before shoveling. Just like you would do before exercising in a gym, stretch prior to picking up your snow shovel. Warm up your muscles with some

light exercise for 10 minutes to reduce your risk of sprains, strains and muscle tears.

Stay hydrated and take frequent breaks. The AAOS notes that snow shoveling and snow blowing are aerobic activities. Such activities require participants to be hydrated. In addition, taking frequent breaks can help prevent injuries.

Avoid shoveling snow if you're at risk for heart attack. Some people should avoid shoveling snow entirely. According to the Harvard Medical School, researchers correlated hospital admissions and deaths due to heart attack the day after it snowed in Canada between 1981 and 2014. Researchers found that the deeper the snow, the more men died of heart attacks. In fact, researchers found that there was a 34 percent increase in heart attack deaths the day after an eight-inch snowfall, and those rates increased when snowfall increased. Most deaths were men, but both men

and women who are at risk of heart attack should avoid shoveling snow, particularly after heavy snowfall. Adults who are unsure of their heart health should consult with their physicians prior to shoveling snow.

Use the right equipment. Ergonomic snow shovels can make shoveling less taxing, reducing your risk for sprains and strains. Spacing hands on the tool grip can increase leverage, making shoveling easier and less likely to lead to injury.

Pushing snow instead of lifting it. The AAOS recommends pushing rather than lifting snow when possible. If snow must be lifted, squat with your legs, knees bent and back straight.

When lifting, lift with your legs and do not bend at the waist. Scoop small amounts of snow at a time and walk to where you want to dump. The AAOS warns against holding shovels full of snow with arms outstretched as doing so puts too much weight on the spine. Snow should not be thrown over the shoulder, as such a technique requires a twisting motion that puts stress on the back. In addition, the AAOS notes that heavy wet snow should be removed in pieces and not all at once.

Anyone can get injured while shoveling snow. Such injuries are preventable when certain safety measures are taken.

Squaring off against Belvidere North on the road, Rochelle needed to win its final bout in order to claim the match. 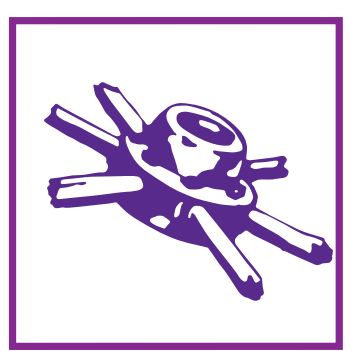

"I believe I performed well during my freshman year because I had experience running track and field in the past," Harding said. "I want to use those skills I've learned to do well in not only my freshman

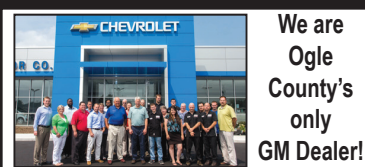
year, but other years as well. I thought I ran the relays well and performed well in the long jump. I want to get faster for the relays and go further in the long jump next season."

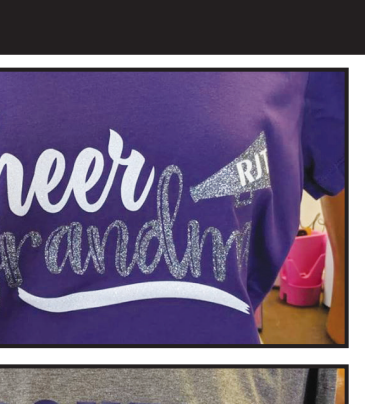

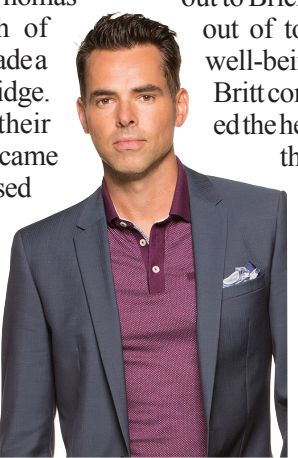

The senior from Chicago matched last season's touchdown tally with a team-best four. Richie recorded four 100-yard receiving games in 2020, becoming just the eighth

player in Huskie history to have four or more 100-yard games in a season and the first since Kenny Golladay in 2016.

Second on the team in receptions with 21 for 187 yards and a touchdown, Crawford averaged 30.5 yards per game receiving this year. Kramer tallied 17 tackles, including three for loss, in six starts at defensive tackle for the Huskies.

The nation's second-youngest team with 81 underclassmen, it's only fitting that almost half NIU's all-MAC selections were from those ranks.

NIU's leading tackler, Gandy made quite an impression in his first season with the Huskies. The sophomore who came to NIU via South Dakota State, tallied 41 tackles, seven pass break ups and an interception. Rudolph made the All-MAC Team as a kickoff return specialist.

The Huskie freshman surpassed the total kickoff return yards compiled by the Huskie team in 2019 with 151 yards on five returns in the season opener. Rudolph finished the year with 717 kickoff return yards and eight punt return yards and leads the nation in combined kick return yards (725) while ranking 10th in the country in all-purpose yards per game. He also added 232 yards receiving on 14 catches.

"Trayvon and Devin were two young men that came into the program with a desire to play and compete," he said. "They didn't have an offseason or a spring and to jump right into the season during the school year and play the way they did was phenomenal and speaks to their competitiveness."

"Jordan Gandy is another newcomer that came into the program and from the first day, he competed.

We saw something early, and he was the same guy every day, it's great to see his hard work pay off."

Lafayette, a freshman safety, tallied 36 stops, including a sack, and an interception to earn his place on the All-MAC squad. Pugh, who missed 10 games last season, returned to the field in 2020 and to the All-MAC team. A second-team selection 2018, Pugh was solid in five games totaling 36 tackles, three-and-a-half tackles for loss and one-and-a-half sacks.

Patton, who started all six games for NIU at center, garnered his first all-conference selection. The anchor on the Huskie offensive line, Patton made the move to center the final two games of 2019. He helped pave the way for Huskie offense that saw Harrison Waylee reach the 100-yard mark in each of the final two games of 2020



and Richie's four 100-yard receiving contests.

"These seniors—Crawford, Kramer, Patton, Pugh — played well this year and they gave us a chance," Hammock said. "They were surrounded by youth, and they were the guys that steadied the ship. They provided a

steadying presence for us as coaches that we could rely on. I'm happy for Daniel Crawford, he's a sixth-year guy who now has two degrees from NIU, he worked hard, bounced back from injuries and finished his career as a second team All-MAC performer."
