City receives Christmas gift

Clinton sales tax revenue up for the year

CLINTON — The city is wrapping up the year on a positive note in the area of sales tax. Commissioner Tom Edmunds made the announcement during Monday's city council meeting.

"We kind of have a little bit of a Christmas gift on sale tax," Edmunds told the council. "Regular sales tax increased by about \$12,000 over what it was this time last year."

The city has reported steady increases in sales tax revenue over the past year after being hit by the 2018 closure of the Clinton Walmart store. Part of that void, however, was filled by the opening of Tractor Supply Company

Goodwill Industries. The two companies moved into the former Walmart location in 2019.

In September this year, Edmunds reported that the use tax the city receives from Internet retail sales also had increased by more than \$13,000.

business, In other Ken commissioner Buchanan reminded residents living along snow routes to be prepared to move their vehicles off city streets if the area receives two or more inches of snow any time during the winter.

"Fortunately, we don't have any snow yet," Buchanan said.

The request is to help city snow plow drivers' ability to access those streets to clear snow.

Bills would allow lawmakers to meet, vote remotely

SPRINGFIELD Two lawmakers have introduced legislation that would allow the General Assembly meet and vote remotely during a pandemic or other emergency that makes in-person meetings dangerous.

Rep. Ann Williams and Sen. Robert Martwick, both Chicago Democrats, filed the legislation Monday, saying inability current conduct business remotely has hindered lawmakers' ability to respond to the health crisis.

"In March, we had no idea a pandemic would sweep the globe, bringing life as we know it to a halt," Williams said in a news release. "While we were able to meet for a few days in May to conduct urgent business, we continue to face a crisis of epic proportions – both

on the public health front and in terms of our budget situation - that requires legislative attention."

"The governor emergency secure the health of Martwick our state," "However, Legislature's the responsibility to enact the long-term policies, in accordance with the needs of our unique and diverse constituencies, which will chart the path forward as we recover from this pandemic."

Business in the General Assembly halted in March, around the same time Gov. JB Pritzker declared disaster. statewide Lawmakers held a brief special session in May, mainly to pass a budget and a few other urgent pieces of legislation, but they canceled their usual fall veto session and have not conducted any official business since May 24.



During that special the Senate session, enacted a procedural rule that allows its committees to meet remotely, but only for informational meetings. They are not allowed to take recorded votes. The only committee that has taken official action since May has been the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules, which has held monthly

Springfield.

A bill that would have allowed lawmakers to meet and vote on legislation failed by a single vote in the House in May.

Under the proposed legislation, remote sessions and committee meetings would be allowed "in times of pestilence or an emergency

resulting from a domestic or foreign terrorist attack" if the speaker of the House and Senate president issue a joint proclamation. The bill also contains a provision requiring the meetings be accessible for the public to view.

The bill is House Bill 5868. As of Monday afternoon, the Senate version had not been assigned a bill number.

Working pie dough?

little corner culinary delights. In a past article, I taught how to successfully make pie dough and roll it out. But what good is that? It is of little good without also knowing how to properly conform it.

If you follow faithfully my instructions in making pie dough, it can be rolled out very thin; thin enough to see light through it. This can make a big difference. I totally dislike the thick over floured crust one gets with store bought pies. Its taste desires much and the bottoms are soggy like a baby's diaper. I will teach how to properly handle pie dough for best results.

Once you have the pie dough made, be sure it is kept refrigerated. Take only the amount you need to make a bottom crust and kept the rest refrigerated.

Using bread flour and a bread board, roll it out to a very thin disk. Now, here is the part most people forget to do. Lightly dust the top with flour and flip it over. Now let it rest. The resting period allows the tension in the gluten to relax and shrink. If this is not done but immediately fashioned to the pie pan and trimmed, the shrinking will pull the dough in. There will not be enough on the rim of the pan for a proper seal. After it has rested for about ten-minutes, it can be carefully fitted to the pie pan. Keep lifting the overhanging dough while patting the into the

corners of the pan. Once completed, trim off the excess dough for blind baking.

With pie dough, one must keep in mind the type of filling that goes into it. The type that is soupy, such as custard, squash, and lemon fillings, requires different methods from those that take the more solid fillings such as apple and rhubarb.

Soupy fillings require prebaked shells. The process is called Blind baking. Blind baking requires precautionary steps such as docking the bottom with a table fork. In other words, pricking the bottom to prevent bubbling and uneven baking of the bottom crust. Baste well with egg wash and bake for 12-minutes in a preheated oven at 450°F. In place of docking, weights can be used. Fit a sheet of foil over the dough and load it with either beans, rice, or smooth clean pebbles. Once completed, bake the shell for about eightminutes. Remove from the oven. Remove the weights and foil. Baste with egg wash, and bake it some more until browned. It is now ready for the filling and final baking according to the recipe for that filling. To prevent over browning prebaked shells while baking the pie, place pie pan inside another.

Pies taking solid fillings require no prebaked shells. Therefore, it is unnecessary to dock the dough or weigh it down. However, baste it with egg wash. Add the filling. Add a top crust, vent and baste it.





'Unbanked' veterans

They call them "the unbanked," people who don't use banks for any reason. At this point there are 250,000 veterans without bank accounts. Without one, they can receive their benefits only through a prepaid debit card or a paper check.

Last year, Department of Veterans Affairs established the Veterans Benefits Banking Program, and 25,000 veterans so far have signed up, mostly because of the convenience, safety and money-saving aspects.

Having a bank account can save you a trip to the convenience store to buy a money order ... as well as the fee to pay for it. Just sit at home and write a check at your leisure. Pop it in the mail and off it goes.

Once a bank knows you for a little while, you'll be in a better position to apply for a loan or a credit card.

Trump hoisted with his own petard

One of President Donald Trump's foremost achievements has been to erect a formidable obstacle to his own postelection legal challenges.

The federal judiciary, now seeded throughout Trump-nominated judges, has given the back of its hand to pro-Trump election litigation, with Trump judges issuing notably harsh opinions.

It's always been strange that Trump, who will never be mistaken for a rigorous constitutionalist and who personalizes everything, has elevated a couple of hundred judges who, by and large, are deeply committed to the Constitution and feel no particular personal loyalty

Hardly an institutionalist, Trump has buttressed the institution of the judiciary. Not one to honor norms, he's generally nominated sticklers for them to the

The paradox reached its height in the weeks after the election. Trump and his allies launched a battery of litigation asking for millions of votes to be thrown out or elections to be decertified, hoping to catch a break from a judge somewhere or from the U.S. Supreme Court. Trump himself put out a call for "courage" from a justice or justices.

Instead, the Trump team got nowhere, even with Trump-nominated jurists.

At a fraught time when

most Republican elected officials in Washington were keeping their heads down, Trump judges involved in post-election litigation issued their rulings without fear or favor. They have shown a commitment to facts, reason and the law, and great institutional selfconfidence.

Progressives portrayed Trump judges as rightwing hacks. Elizabeth Warren called Trump's "aggressively picks unqualified," while the editor of the left-wing website Talking Points Memo, Josh Marshall, tweeted: "The federal judiciary is corrupt. The Supreme Court is the most deeply corrupted."

With the president of the United States raging at our electoral system and desperately seeking assistance from the courts, the alleged partisanship and corruption of the Trump-influenced judiciary has been

nowhere in evidence. Trump nominated University of Pennsylvania law professor Stephanos Bibas to the 3rd U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals in 2017. The signature Trump litigation Pennsylvania landed in his lap, and Bibas wrote an unsparing opinion for a unanimous panel of the 3rd Circuit dismissing it.

Georgia, District Judge Steven D. Grimberg, nominated by Trump last year, denied a



request by Trump super fan Lin Wood to stop the certification of the results.

the Supreme Court denied a request to block certification of the Pennsylvania results in a curt, one-sentence order with no public dissents.

One of the main lines Democratic attack on Justice Amy Coney Barrett during her confirmation was that, as Illinois Sen. Dick Durbin said, she was "being sent on assignment to the Supreme Court by President Trump" in order to "be there if the president needs her on an election contest."


Where does Barrett go to

get her apology? Surely, the overtly transactional Trump would have been happy for her to have actually been his political tool on the court, along with his other two picks. But Barrett and her colleagues, trained and soaked in the law and profoundly cognizant of their institutional roles, are not susceptible to such influence. Neil Gorsuch is not Corey Lewandowski; Stephanos Bibas is not

Rudy Giuliani. Nothing underlines the merits of Trump judicial quite selections their willingness to deny him and his allies, as warranted.



OSF St. Joseph receives early COVID vaccines

BLOOMINGTON —
The room erupted in applause after the first COVID-19 vaccine was given to an OSF HealthCare St. Joseph Medical Center critical care advanced practice nurse in Bloomington, on Friday afternoon.

Wingting Wilking APPN

Kirstin Wilkins, APRN, APN Pulmonology, works with COVID-19 patients who often need to be put on respirators. Wilkins said she felt relief and hope when she heard she was going to get vaccinated much earlier than anticipated.

"We've been going through quite a bit these last nine months and I think there's a light at the end of the tunnel. I'm hopeful for the community, for my co-workers, my peers that this is the answer we've been looking for," Wilkins said.

OSF St. Joseph Medical Center President Lynn Fulton credits Sandy Salverson, vice president of pharmacy operations for OSF HealthCare, with moving quickly for state approval to transfer the vaccine after learning Knox County had extra doses.

She explained Pfizer sent an extra dose within vials, plus there were additional doses after all 1A tier health care and support personnel received their first shots in the western Illinois region this week. Initially, McLean County did not expect to receive vaccine for a couple weeks because it did not meet the state's deaths-per-capita criteria used to distribute the initial supply.

Fulton said it was an unexpected Christmas miracle for thrilled frontline Mission Partners (employees).

"Oh they were so excited. Some of them were even emotional to get the opportunity to get this vaccine. They really viewed it as a gift to be one of the first to receive it," she said.

For those who work with patients who require intensive monitoring and care, and who can remain in the Intensive Care Unit for weeks, it can be devastating to witness the loss. One woman who lost a husband and father recently returned to thank

caregivers. Fulton says that happens often.

"Those stories are so heartfelt but you think about what that does as people see others suffering from this and so to think that there's a vaccine coming – and it's going to be a while before everyone can get it – but to know that it's one the way really does give that piece of hope."

Wilkins said she was hit with a wave of relief when she heard she was going to get vaccinated much earlier than anticipated.

"We've been going through quite a bit these last nine months and I think there's a light at the end of the tunnel. I'm hopeful for the community, for my co-workers, my peers that this is the answer we've been looking for."

Critical Care Nurse Savanah Crull said people don't realize just how stressful it is having to put on so much personal protective equipment, which delays rushing in to help a patient who is taking a quick downward turn. Patients also have multiple issues which complicates care.

"Their lungs are failing, their kidneys are failing, they're bleeding and clotting at the same time so there's a lot going on with them and we have to be a lot more involved in their care which makes it very difficult to stay on top of them – as a person," she said.

Crull will post on social media about getting the vaccine to push others to do so when it's available.

"We need a 70 percent vaccination rate for this to work, for this to actually do anything so think about your neighbors, your family, your postal worker who is out there every day being exposed. We need this to end," she said.

Respiratory therapist Jeff Kayfish has a wife and a child at home, and he has feared for their health. He was excited to get his shot and had no concerns about the safety of the vaccine, despite it being developed in record time.

"I trust the process. I've been vaccinated against a lot of things after being in the military so this was just another vaccine you gotta get."





Former Illini Basketball assistant coach Jimmy Collins passes away

CHICAGO — The Fighting Illini basketball family is grieving the loss of revered, longtime assistant basketball coach Jimmy Collins, who passed away early Sunday morning, December 13, in Chicago. He was 74 years old.

Collins joined the Illinois coaching staff under Lou Henson in 1983 and was a popular assistant coach until Henson's retirement in 1996. He then became head coach at Illinois-Chicago and spent 14 years at the helm of the Flames program through 2010. During his tenure at UIC, Collins amassed more wins than any coach in program history, 218. He also led the Flames to four postseason appearances, including three NCAA Tournament trips.

During his 13 years in Champaign, Illinois posted a record of 279-129, made 10 NCAA Tournament appearances, won a Big Ten title in 1984, and advanced to the Final Four in 1989 as the Flyin' Illini won a then-school record 31 games. Collins helped recruit many of the outstanding players from that era and served many of them as a life-long friend and mentor.

A former first-round draft pick (11th overall) of the Chicago Bulls, Collins was a probation officer in Chicago prior to coming to Illinois under Henson to begin his long collegiate coaching career. He was a star guard at New Mexico State under Henson. where he earned his bachelor's degree in journalism in 1970. Collins averaged nearly 20 points over his three-year career, leading the Aggies to the NCAA Final Four in 1970. After college, he spent two years with the Bulls and finished his playing career with Carolina Cougars of the American Basketball Association.

A native of Syracuse, New York, Collins is survived by his beloved wife, Hettie, and four children: Erica, Kenny, Semaj and Brandi.

Endplays seldom come about by themselves. Declarer must usually do at least some preliminary preparation to develop the end position he seeks.

Consider the present case where West leads the king of clubs against four spades doubled, then shifts to the king of diamonds at trick two. Declarer wins with dummy's ace and sees that if the missing cards are badly stacked against him, he could lose a spade and two hearts in addition to the club already lost.

South has no control over the trump loser if the spades are divided 2-0, so he should focus on holding himself to one heart loser instead of two. In line with this, he ruffs a diamond at trick three, the first step in the elimination process that he hopes will produce the desired result. Without this diamond ruff, South would lose the contract.

He next plays the ace of trump, on which East shows out, and continues by ruffing a club, a diamond, a club and, finally, dummy's last diamond. Having eliminated all the clubs and diamonds from his own hand and dummy, South is ready for the coup de grace.

At this point, dummy has three hearts and two trumps, as does South, while West is down to three hearts, a club and the trump king. Declarer now puts West on lead with a trump. West wins the trick — the second for his side — but he is not happy. If he returns a club, he hands South a ruffand-discard and with it, the contract. And if he returns a heart instead, the outcome is exactly the same, since South then loses only one heart trick.

It pays to plan the play.
