Polo man facing murder charge

Oregon man fatally shot Thursday night in Rochelle

ROCHELLE — Rochelle police are charging three individuals in a homicide that occurred Thursday evening in Rochelle.

At 9:11 p.m. on Oct. 29, officers were called for a possible shooting in the 1100 block of First

Avenue.

Upon arrival, officers located the victim, Devin S. Bailey, 37, of Oregon, suffering from an apparent gunshot wound. He was transported to Rochelle Community

Hospital where he was pronounced deceased.

The Rochelle Police Department and the Illinois State Police Crime Scene Unit are conducting an investigation. Rochelle police were assisted on scene by the Rochelle Fire Department and Ogle County Sheriff's Office.

Charged in the incident are Cody Neuschwanger, 24, Polo, for first-degree murder and mob action, and two 17-year-old juveniles, also of Polo, for

mob action.

Neuschwanger was transported to Ogle County Jail. The juveniles were released to their parents.

Bond was set at \$500,000 for Neuschwanger by an Ogle County Court judge Friday afternoon. He remains in Ogle County Jail.



Child care center closing indefinitely

ROCHELLE — Parents and staff of the Kishwaukee Family YMCA Child Care Center in Rochelle will be looking for new avenues for daycare services and employment following the announcement that the center was closing indefinitely, effective Wednesday, Oct. 28.

In a meeting with staff members Wednesday, administration announced it will be indefinitely suspending care services effective Oct. 28. The Kishwaukee Family YMCA Board of Directors made the decision at a recent meeting.

"The country, state and local area has been dramatically impacted by COVID-19. That is true for the YMCA Child Care Center since the pandemic hit. We saw increased staffing and supply costs in order to meet Illinois Department of Children & Family Services reopening requirements along with decreased enrollment

numbers due to parents uncomfortable placing their child in the center due to possible exposure to COVID-19," Kishwaukee Family YMCA CEO Mark Spiegelhoff said. "All these factors led to a significant negative financial impact on child care center operations. The sizable monthly operating losses were simply not sustainable for the YMCA to continue in this mode during the pandemic."

Center director Evaine Stahr confirmed the indefinite closure Thursday morning.

"This decision did not come lightly, knowing the impact it will have on the working families of Rochelle that need center-based care," Spiegelhoff said. "No future date to eventually reopen is being considered at this time."

The center was serving 29 children, excluding children of employees, when the decision was made.

Many casting vote early

Polling places open 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. Election Day

ROCHELLE — Rochelle and Creston voters from the Flagg and Dement precincts had the opportunity to cast their ballots early at the Flagg Township office building this week.

The office building (303 W. State Route 38 in Rochelle) was open for early voting Wednesday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. and Saturday from 9 a.m. to noon. The Ogle County Courthouse (105 S. 5th St. in Oregon) will be open for early voters from all precincts on Monday, Nov. 2 from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Election Day voting will be held on Tuesday, Nov. 3.

Disciplinary action expected

School administration investigates following racially motivated video involving students

ROCHELLE — A viral video that surfaced on social media earlier this week will result in an investigation and disciplinary actions from Rochelle Township High School administrators.

Rochelle Superintendent of Schools Jason Harper issued a letter to students, parents and the community late Wednesday evening in response to the video, which was shared on social media earlier this week. Harper wrote in the letter that school administrators are investigating the incident and that disciplinary consequences

will be levied after the investigation concludes.

"The RTHS administration is aware of a viral video created by current RTHS students in which unacceptable racial slurs were used," Harper wrote.

Quilting group supports Lutheran World Relief

Franklin Grove have been busy making quilts this year, which is the 60th year they have provided the quilts for Lutheran World Relief.

The total quilts made this year is 188, and 138 of those are being sent to LWR at the end of October.

Along with the quilts, 46 personal care kits and 40 school kits, will be shipped.

The number of quilts made this year are a few less due to the time of the Coronavirus shelter-in-place last spring. However, the group persevered and most of them continued sewing while at home during that time.

local charitable organizations, such as PADS and a women's shelter. When they learn of a family in need, a quilt, or two will be sent to them.

Other quilts are purchased by individuals for a monetary donation, and that money goes to local missions or to purchasing necessary supplies for making the quilts.

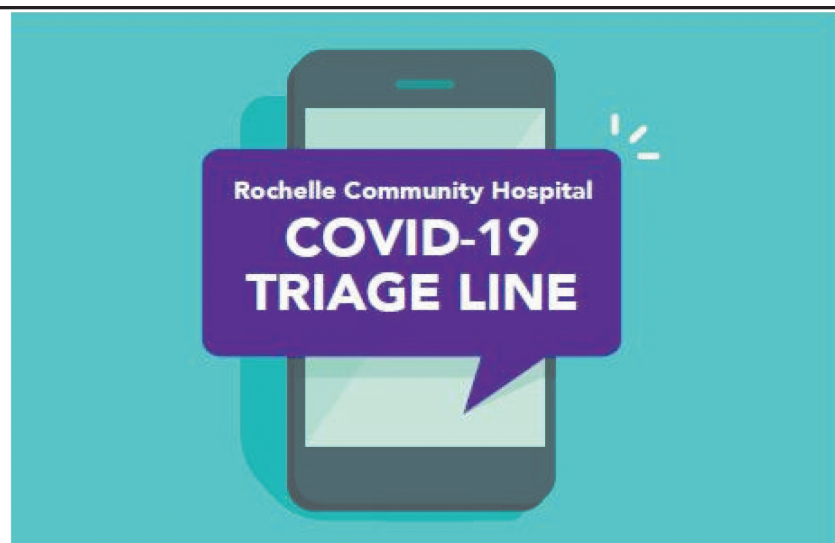

Pritzker administration, IBHE award GEER grants

Northern Illinois University among nine grant recipients

SPRINGFIELD — The Illinois Board of Higher Education is awarding grants to nine colleges and universities which will target equity in recruitment and retention. The \$3 million in funding comes from the Governor’s Emergency Education Relief (GEER) Fund for use in FY 2021.

“As part of our laser focus on equity, IBHE, in conjunction with Gov. JB Pritzker’s Office, will use these dollars to support students with the greatest need,” said Ginger Ostro, executive director, IBHE. “Each of the institutions is demonstrating evidence-based efforts to recruit and retain first-generation, low-income, underrepresented, and rural students. The bottom line is that we want these students to stay the course.”

The institutions will support the students’ progress toward

degree completion by closing digital equity gaps, providing targeted, academic, and social/emotional supports through peer mentoring and other innovative efforts. This includes equipment checkout efforts, enhanced financial and career literacy programs, intensive language instruction, childcare assistance, increased campus food pantry supplies, and telehealth.

Three steps for a smart ‘fall back’

CHICAGO — On Sunday, Nov. 1, Daylight Saving Time ends, and we set our clocks back an hour. Take advantage of extra sleep then take a few simple steps to ensure you, your family and your home stay safe into the colder months ahead.

Ready your home and verify your insurance coverages adequately protect your property. Keep out the cold with insulation, caulking, and weather stripping and learn how to keep pipes from freezing. Review your insurance policies and talk to your agent to ensure your property is fully covered for the hazards in your area.

Update your family’s emergency plan. Make sure each family member knows how they will receive emergency alerts and warnings and how to stay in touch with each other if something happens and you’re not together. Check with the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and make any necessary updates to your plan due to COVID-19, to include having masks (for everyone over 2 years old) and disinfectants if needed.

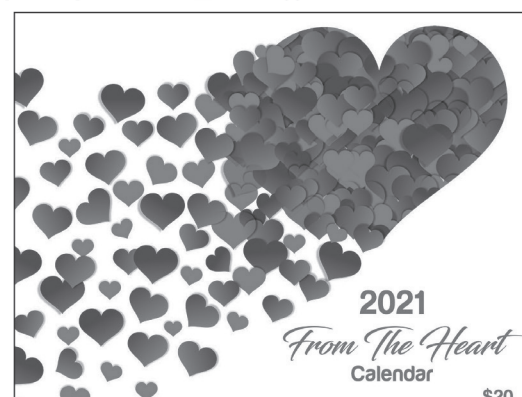

Restaurants push back as 10th region placed under mitigations

Pritzker: 'All I can say is that I am going to fight this virus'

SPRINGFIELD – Illinois restaurant owners are asking Gov. JB Pritzker to rethink the state's efforts to control the spread of COVID-19 as yet another medical region was placed under enhanced mitigation measures on Friday.

"We want to collaborate with the state of Illinois on a different path, one that addresses the alarming surges we are seeing while protecting the livelihood of industry workers and restaurant owners-operators across Illinois," Sam Toia, president and CEO of the Illinois Restaurant Association, said during a news conference in Chicago.

Toia said he and other industry officials hope to meet with Pritzker next week to discuss alternative mitigation measures. In the meantime, he said, the restaurant association is teaming up with the National Restaurant Law Center in Washington, D.C., to file amicus briefs in several pending lawsuits challenging the administration's executive orders.

"These are prudent actions we can take now to support favorable rulings in lawsuits that are underway," Toia said. "There will be more. It is important for the courts to hear about our rights and how we've been harmed as an industry."

Pritzker, however, gave no indication Friday that he was willing to back away from his mitigation strategy.

"Every day, we now see these numbers going through the roof," he said during his daily COVID-19 briefing in

Chicago. "And so the idea that we're going to make the locations that are amplifying the number of cases and the spread, the transmission of this virus, that we're going to open those even more at this point makes no sense."

The news conference came on the same day the Illinois Department of Public Health announced that Region 6 in east-central Illinois would be placed under enhanced mitigation measures, including the closing of bars and restaurants to indoor service, effective Monday, Nov. 2.

Pritzker has pointed to contact tracing data which shows bars and restaurant as the second-most identified location that people had visited 14 days prior to their COVID-19 diagnosis in 69 counties. The most identified location was "other," which includes weddings, private gatherings, parties and others.

Bars and restaurants went through several weeks of mandatory closure during the state's initial stay-at-home order in the early phase of the pandemic. They were allowed to reopen for outdoor service on May 29 when the state entered Phase 3 of the reopening plan, and later were allowed to open for limited indoor service starting June 26 when the state entered Phase 4.

At that time, based on the number of daily new cases and the rate of viral spread, it appeared that the COVID-19 pandemic was tapering off in Illinois. But since late August, cases have begun surging again and regions across the state have been placed back under resurgence mitigation measures.

"The RTHS administration continues to investigate the situation and will take appropriate action to address the posting of the video and student disciplinary consequences to follow... RTHS strives to provide a safe and respectful learning environment for all students and staff members. RTHS does not condone the language used or any content in this post. Racial harassment, prejudice, intolerance and hate are unacceptable in any form. RTHS is proud of our diversity and we believe that all our students should

feel safe and welcome in our schools...

After hearing from students, parents and the RTHS community voices about the RTHS culture and systemic societal issues, RTHS realizes we must be a leader in this change process. Before we lead, we must listen to our students. We understand that actions speak louder than words."

RTHS has welcomed students at all grade levels to participate in open discussions regarding racism, bigotry, hate and the overall learning environment at RTHS in recent days. The discussions took place in the RTHS commons and

all established COVID-19 procedures were followed. Based on student feedback, Harper wrote that the school will begin a long-term plan.

"We spent much of this week communicating with students, parents and the community," Harper wrote in an e-mail Friday afternoon. "We set up a 'Day of Listening' for our students on Thursday and Friday. Our students expressed how hate and intolerance have impacted them. We will continue to collaborate with students and other stakeholders as we determine our next action steps."

The key to peacefully trusting God

PEACE is one of the most precious gifts God has promised His children. I know, because for many years my life was not peaceful, and I was miserable. So, to now have this peace and live in God's rest is a treasure to me. And it is a gift that He wants all of us to have.

A trusting attitude and a patient attitude go hand in hand—when you trust God, you're able to be more patient. And, when you let go and learn to trust God, it releases joy in your life. The truth is patience is not just about waiting for something...it's about how you wait, or your attitude while waiting.

The key to it all is humility. Philippians 2:5 (AMPC) says, "Let this same attitude and purpose and [humble] mind be in you which was in Christ Jesus: [Let Him be your example in humility]."

Humility may well be one of the most difficult characteristics of the fruit of the Spirit to be cultivated in us—and to maintain. And without humility, it's not likely that you will put your complete trust in God.

I have learned from personal experience that putting trust in God means there will be some unanswered questions. That was a hard lesson for me because I naturally want to understand everything...to know what's going on so I can feel like I'm in control.

It's just human nature to try and figure things out. So, when we're in the midst of a situation, we usually try to reason our way through it. We generally want to know "Why, God, why?" or "When, God, when?" We want to know the outcome now. Our pride just has a hard time with not knowing, because not knowing means we're not in control. But humility submits to what God is doing. This is where we must make a decision.

Deciding to trust God releases us from feeling like we have to have all the answers. Proverbs 3:5-6 (NIV) says, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight." The truth is we are just not smart enough to run our own lives...but God is.

And the good news is He will not promise us something and then leave us on our own to make it happen. His Word tells us that "no [one] who believes in Him [who adheres to, relies on, and trusts in Him] will [ever] be put to shame or be disappointed" (Romans 10:11).

Here's something else I've discovered: God won't give us the ability to solve our own problems. He's got that covered. But He does give us the capacity to help someone else solve theirs. So, while we are putting our trust in Him to work in our situation, the best

thing we can do is focus on being a blessing to others.

As I mentioned earlier, another essential part of trusting God is having patience. It is very important to realize this, because even when a decision is made to trust God, it doesn't mean that things will just fall into place right away. We may have to wait—and wait longer than we think we should have to—on some things.

It's important to understand that while we're waiting, having a negative, impatient attitude will not make God hurry. The Israelites spent 40 years in the wilderness on what could have been an 11-day journey, mainly because of their attitude. When things were not going like they wanted, they began to murmur and complain and ultimately, they sinned against God, simply because they got impatient and stopped trusting Him.

A good question to ask yourself is, Will I continue to trust and obey God when I'm not getting what I want? Will you exercise patience while you wait on Him to work things out for you?

I encourage you to remember Proverbs 3:5-6. Make a conscious decision to put your trust in God...to entrust yourself and everything in your life to Him. Then you will free yourself to focus on loving and being a blessing to others, while you are peaceful and confident that God is working on your behalf.

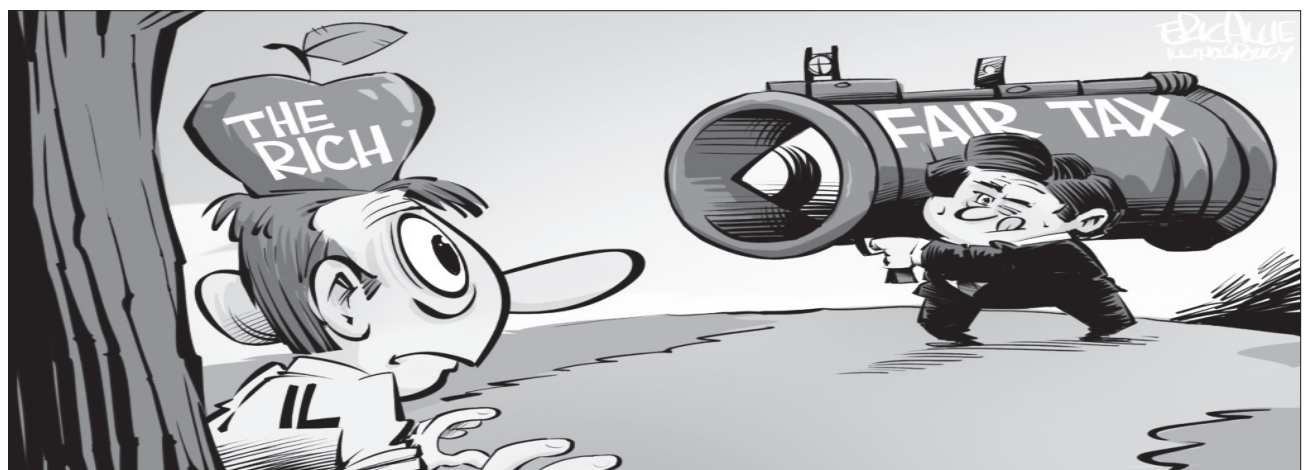
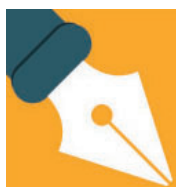

Rake? No, I'll just let the wind handle this

AS my front yard fills with leaves this time of year, it always makes me think back to "fall" when I was growing up in Arizona.

Raking, pool cover. Done.

That is not the case for me anymore. Oh, no. One of the things I loved about the house we bought in Rockford was all of the trees on the property. They are everywhere and they are quite beautiful – well, until they die and fall and I have to use my poor/verging on dangerous chainsaw skills to cut them up.

The trees offer wonderful shade in the summer. But in the fall, they create enough work for an army of landscapers. Sadly, there is only me, and I am not exactly Mr. Work Around the House.

But I have to do something about the 10 billion or so leaves that fall on our property every year. So, I have a five-point plan:

1. Complain about all of those leaves, repeatedly and loudly for days on end.
2. Talk about buying a new rake and getting serious about it. This year I will rake up 600 giant piles of leaves and bag them all! I promise!
3. Get out my old rake and make a half-hearted attempt to tame the leaves, before giving up in disgust. Then I grab my blower and shoot the leaves around the yard before realizing this, too, is useless.
4. I let the wind do much of the work for me, giving my neighbor's

hate for me a chance to grow.

5. I finally get out my riding lawnmower and mulch all of the leaves, screaming with glee as I get covered with leaf dust while my wife stares out the window at me shaking her head.

You would think by now that I would just skip to No. 5, but no. I am currently between step 2 and step 3.

Finally, I have to switch out the screens for our storm windows. And to be honest, I do this one without much complaint. It is easy to do, and I have found that my incredibly patient wife will lose it if I complain daily about the leaves and then start complaining about the windows.

In short, I am now at an age that I know when the shut up. About the windows, but those leaves? Forget about it.

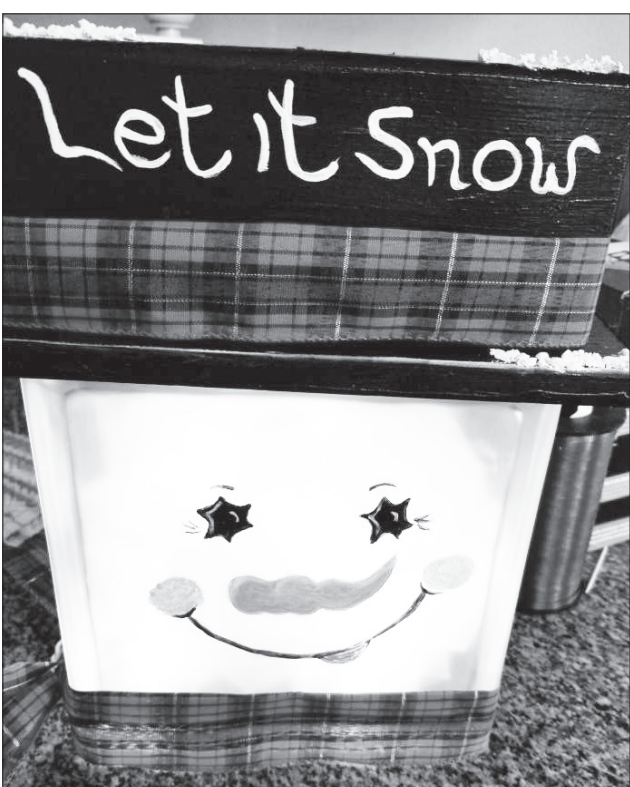

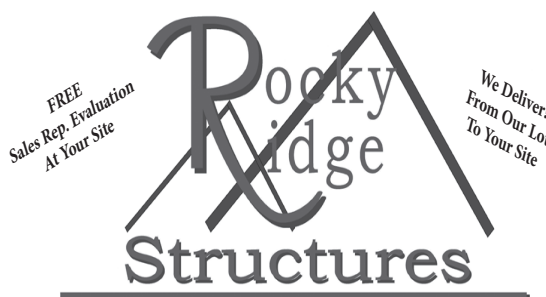

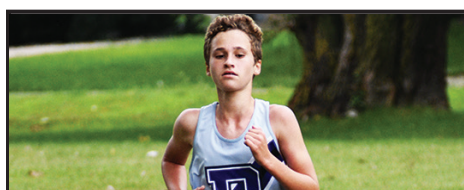

RTHS Volleyball

Bump, set, spike

Lady Hub players sharpening skills during fall contact days

ROCHELLE — Lady Hub volleyball coach Molly Sly was in disbelief when she learned her program would need to wait until the spring season to compete. That disappointment hasn't held the Rochelle team back from using as much time as it's been allowed over the summer and fall to practice and prepare for when the 2020-21 season eventually tips off next February.

Under normal circumstances, Rochelle volleyball players would be gearing up for their regional tournament around this time. Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, however, Lady Hub players are currently utilizing the team's 20 fall contact days extended from the IHSA. The contact days have allowed players and coaches to meet for practices, skills drills and open workouts.

"I haven't been able to shake the weirdness of the fall season without volleyball," Sly said. "But we had about 35 girls show up for our first open gym and it was really exciting to see them all. I've missed the competitiveness of the kids and the excitement in their faces... We also have

a Google classroom where we keep in touch and share workouts with the kids."

The COVID-19 pandemic forced the Lady Hub volleyball program to cancel its normal summer youth and high school skills camps in addition to its typical summer league matches. Another

adjustment has been practicing and scrimmaging with masks on, as volleyball has been deemed a medium-risk sport by the IDPH. Under IDPH and IHSA guidelines, volleyball teams can conduct intrasquad scrimmages only and players must wear masks while indoors.

"I haven't had to tell one player to put her mask on," Sly said. "I really don't think masks are going to be much of an issue for volleyball... The girls have been staying very busy during the fall season. We had eight players go out for the tennis team which was awesome and we had one

player go out for the golf team. The girls have held themselves accountable and that's made my job as the head coach a lot easier. I know a lot of them are still doing club volleyball as well."

The 2020-21 spring sports season is currently scheduled to begin on Feb.

13, 2021. Volleyball, football and boys soccer are among the three sports normally conducted in the fall that have been postponed due to the pandemic. The Lady Hubs will be coming off a historic 21-win season where they reached the IHSA 3A Regional Finals for the second straight year.

RTHS Baseball

Hubs taking reps to stay prepared for season

Returning players working on hitting, throwing drills

ROCHELLE — When the Rochelle Hub baseball team finally takes the field to start the 2020-21 season, players and coaches will be nearly two years removed from their last varsity game. After seeing the 2019-20 season cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic, players have been practicing over the summer and fall to stay ready for when baseball returns next summer.

The Rochelle baseball team is one of several athletic programs at the high school that have been using their 20 fall contact days allotted by the IHSA to bring players and coaches together for in-person workouts. Head coach Jarrod Reynolds said players

have been practicing hitting, fielding and throwing over the last two months to stay sharp as athletics shift indoors.

"It's been nice to get out and do some baseball activities," Reynolds said. "We're focusing on the basics right now as far as improving our arm strength and our hitting. We've really encouraged the kids to stay active a few times a week and we feel that consistency over a long period of time will make a difference. It can be as minimal as picking up a baseball and throwing it. The biggest thing with our kids will be keeping their arms in shape and practicing their hitting."

With traditional fall sports like football, boys soccer and girls volleyball being postponed until

the spring, baseball and other traditional spring sports have been pushed back to an unconventional summer season beginning April 19, 2021. There will be several new faces when the Hub varsity team takes the field, as many of the freshmen and sophomores from the 2018-19 season are now upperclassmen who will be competing for various starting positions around the diamond.

"We're going to see what we'll be allowed to do over the winter," Reynolds said. "We really emphasize that our kids get into the weight room and get stronger... Any sort of throwing our kids can do will help also, whether it's at home or during travel baseball practices. We'll be in good shape as a program if we can continue to develop big, strong kids with good arms."

Dual-team meets bring out competitive spirit

ROCHELLE — The COVID-19 pandemic brought several changes to the cross country racing format this season. While the Hubs and Lady Hubs normally compete in medium and large-scale meets with multiple schools, Rochelle's harriers ran the bulk of their meets in a dual-team format that saw Hub and Lady Hub runners go head-to-head against other teams.

The revised scheduling format was a good change of pace for the Rochelle cross country program, and head coach Mark Zilis said he hopes to see more dual-team meets in the future. Both teams recently concluded their respective seasons in the IHSA 2A Belvidere Regionals.

"I think the dual-team format worked out great," Zilis said. "I thought our kids were a lot more competitive and it makes me think that we should do more dual-team meets in the future. It was easy for us to see how we would finish during dual meets and we learned quickly that it would be tough to win if we didn't place our runners in the first, second or third positions. I'd like to see the majority of our meets be dual meets in the future, with a few larger meets mixed in."

The Hubs went 5-7 overall while finishing seventh in the Interstate 8 Conference meet and 10th in the Belvidere regional meet. Aiden Seldal, who led Rochelle to a victory over Oregon with a first-place performance, will be the lone senior set to

depart from the program. Rochelle's fresh-soph boys, which include David Wanner, Parker Lenkaitis and Alex Burke, took third in the conference this fall. Juniors Josue Huerta and Luke Orlikowski are also eligible to return.

"We had a lot of turnover from last year because we lost a lot of seniors, but we added a large number of freshmen and sophomores," Zilis said. "I think the boys steadily improved throughout the season, especially considering that we didn't have to train as much as we normally would during the summer because of the COVID crisis. We started the season in decent shape, we improved throughout the season and I think almost every runner set new personal records."

The Lady Hubs finished 2-8 overall, placing eighth in both the Interstate 8 Conference meet and the Belvidere regional meet. Junior Sara Johnson, who will represent Rochelle in the IHSA 2A Lake Villa (Lakes) Sectional this weekend, will return as the team's top varsity runner in 2021. Sophomores Yuelma Ortiz, Karina Lopez and Ahtziri Zepeda also stepped up this fall.

"We had a few standouts on the girls side this fall in Sara and Yuelma," Zilis said. "I thought Karina ran really well toward the end of the season and Ahtziri was running really well before suffering an injury that affected her progress. They performed at a decent level, but I think we need more girls to come out for the team in the future for us to really build our program up."

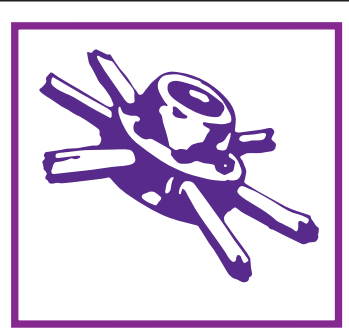

Contact days helping Rochelle teams stay strong

Coaches working through event-specific drills with student-athletes

ROCHELLE — Dale Bergeson wasn't expecting his first season as head coach of the Rochelle Hub track and field program to begin in the middle of a global pandemic. Despite a challenging adjustment, Bergeson and Lady Hub coach Alison Vrana have utilized the program's fall contact days over the last two months to meet with student-athletes and organize individual workouts.

Not many teams have lost more opportunities to compete than the track and field programs, which saw their spring seasons canceled and any chances to participate with the Rochelle Area Track Club over the summer taken away because of the COVID-19 pandemic. However, both teams have been able to work out at the RTHS track and field facility over the last two months. That's courtesy of the 20 fall contact days allotted to track and field programs by the IHSA.

"We've been doing mostly event-specific workouts, particularly in the field events," Bergeson said. "We've also been working with our hurdlers and our jumpers. Our runners have been staying in shape with workouts we've been giving them... We've never had practices here during the offseason, but given that our season

ended in March, we didn't want to have 13 months of no contact with our kids. We've seen our kids every week for the last eight weeks and we've been able to work with them and give them things to do on their days off."

With winter sports scheduled to begin Nov. 16, no decisions have been made regarding whether or not track and field programs will have an indoor season for the 2020-21 school year. Track and field is considered a low-risk sport by the IDPH, meaning athletes can participate in conference meets and COVID-regional nonconference meets only. Track and field was one of several traditional spring sports pushed to the summer season, which starts on April 19, 2021.

"We've been working with many of the student-athletes competing in events where there are a lot of techniques involved," Vrana said. "We're helping the kids make up for the time they lost when our spring season was canceled. We have a lot of high jumpers, long jumpers, triple jumpers and throwers coming back, so we want them to be ready for the upcoming season. We had encouraged kids to run over the summer and we lent out equipment to the kids so they can still work out on their own... These practices have been great for bringing the kids together."

Board votes to play basketball

Practices begin Nov. 16

THE Illinois High School Association (IHSA) Board of Directors met for a special board meeting on Wednesday, Oct. 28, 2020, where the board provided the latest information on the IHSA's winter sports season. The board voted to move the sport of wrestling from the winter season to the summer season, which will run from April 19 to June 26, 2021.

The board approved the IHSA's winter sport guidance for all low-risk sports, which include boys swimming and diving, cheerleading, dance, boys and girls bowling and girls gymnastics. These sports will be conducted from Nov. 16, 2020 to Feb. 13, 2021. The mitigating guidance for each sport will be posted on the IHSA's COVID-19 Resource page on Oct. 29. The IHSA board will review spectator and group gatherings for all winter sports at a future meeting in November.

In addition, the board took action to follow the guidance of the IHSA Sport Medicine Advisory

Committee (SMAC) and will allow boys and girls basketball to begin practices, per IHSA Return to Activities 2.0, on Nov. 16. Contests can begin on Nov. 30 within an Illinois COVID region or within a conference. As a part of the mitigation plan, masks will be worn by all players, coaches and officials during play.

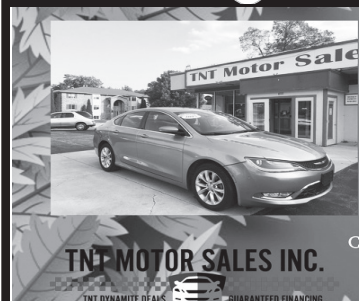

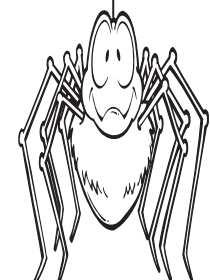

Signs that your gutters are in need of repair

Boys and girls basketball teams will follow team limitations allowing a maximum of 31 games. It will become a local school decision to determine if a school will allow their basketball teams to participate following the guidelines developed by the SMAC.

The board released the following statement regarding the basketball action:

"The Illinois High School Association Board of Directors made the decision today to continue with the IHSA basketball season as scheduled in 2020-21. In August, the board slated basketball to take place from November to February based on the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) assigning a medium risk level to the sport. The IHSA Sports Medicine Advisory Committee (SMAC) offered additional mitigations, such as masks during play

and social distancing on benches, that the SMAC believed would allow basketball to be played safely.

The high school basketball season was potentially put on hold on Oct. 27, when Gov. Pritzker announced that IDPH had changed basketball's risk level from medium risk to high risk.

After diligent discussion, the board has made the decision today to follow the recommendation of the IHSA SMAC as it relates to basketball. The board remains considerate of rising COVID-19 cases in Illinois and understands the importance of adhering to safety guidelines for the good of all citizens. However, the board has not been presented any causal evidence that rising COVID-19 cases make basketball more dangerous to play by the IDPH or any other health organization nationally or internationally. On the contrary, the IHSA has been looking to

bordering states who have sponsored both medium risk and high risk sports in the fall that have noted a low incident rate of COVID-19 spread.

Instead, we will require all IHSA basketball teams to adhere to those SMAC mitigations, and allow local school officials to make decisions related to participation.

Mounting challenges, from increased mental health issues among our students to a shrinking calendar that limits our ability to move sport seasons this

school year, were instrumental in this decision to move forward with basketball as scheduled. We see our students regularly leaving the state to play sports, or covertly continuing to play locally. Students can be better protected in the high school setting, and the board remains steadfast that playing under IHSA rules and SMAC mitigation is the safest way to conduct athletics at this juncture.

Illinois is a large and diverse state, and the IHSA membership is reflective

of that. We understand that this decision will impact each high school and district differently. Some schools who remain in remote learning may not be able to start winter sports on time, and we feel for those in that situation. However, we have also learned that we cannot continue to look down the road to a season that may never come.

Contact days for our teams this fall have been an incredible boon to our students' well-being. We fear for the mental health of students who attempt to

traverse a long winter with no athletic outlet available. So much about dealing with this virus has been learned in the past eight months, and this decision will grant the membership the opportunity to apply that knowledge during their basketball season.

Each member of the IHSA board volunteered for this position because they are passionate about high school sports and activities, and the positive impact they have on our students' physical and mental health."
