Trustees replacing generator system

HILLCREST — Village trustees voted to approve the replacement of the current generator powering the water system during the October board meeting Wednesday evening.

The new generator will cost \$180,000 and the village has \$75,000 in grant funding it could use to help cover the cost of the project. The generator will provide power for the village water system as well as village hall in

the event of an emergency outage. Village trustees were undecided on whether or not to add village hall to the generator's load, which upped the project cost from \$140,000 to \$180,000, during the previous board meeting in September.

The village board also approved a motion to begin the application process for an Illinois EPA Grant that could provide up to \$5 million in funding for the village's future infrastructural improvements. The meeting concluded with an approved

motion to pass a \$55,707 tax levy.

The village still plans to recognize Rochelle Municipal Utilities for its work in the Hillcrest community over the past several months. The next schedule meeting is Wednesday, Nov. 11.

City of Rochelle begins leaf vacuuming Monday

ROCHELLE—The City of Rochelle will begin providing leaf vacuuming services for residents on Monday, Oct. 19.

The vacuuming service will end Dec. 1 or upon an accumulating snowfall, whichever occurs first.

During this period, other landscape waste (grass, plants, weeds and leaves) may continue to be placed in paper landscape bags or standard garbage containers marked with an "X," (maximum size 32 gallons weighing under 50 pounds), and set at the curb by 5 a.m. for pick-up weekly on your regular garbage day.

Leaf collection will begin at 7 a.m. and will end by 3 p.m., Monday through Friday based on need and weather. The leaf vacuum, towed behind a dump truck, forces the leaves from the parkway into the truck bed. During peak season two leaf vacuums will be operated.

The following rules shall be followed:

Please rake leaves into a pile or row up to the curb, or edge of the road if you do not have a curb. To ensure all leaves are collected, piles and rows shall not exceed 5-feet in width. Do not place leaves on the street as they will clog storm water inlets and could cause flooding.

Please do not place leaves behind obstacles such as trees, poles, hedges, etc.

Please do not park vehicles within 30 feet of a leaf pile or row.

Please do not mix trash, yard waste such as limbs, weeds, grass or any other material with the leaves. Yard waste or other materials mixed with leaves can cause safety concerns and equipment malfunction. For these reasons, these piles will not be accepted.

What to know about the graduated tax amendment

Amendment language, proposed rates and arguments for and against

SPRINGFIELD — One of the major questions Illinois voters will answer on Nov. 3 will be on the

ballot statewide — whether to amend the state's constitution to allow for a graduated rate income tax.

Strictly speaking, the amendment removes a provision from the Illinois Constitution that requires any income tax to be levied

at a flat rate on any level of income — the current rate is 4.95 percent. Passage of the amendment would allow lawmakers to apply different tax rates on varying levels of income. Of the 42 states that have an income tax, 32 and

Washington, D.C., have a graduated rate structure, while Illinois is one of nine that impose a flat tax.

While the amendment itself does not set any tax rates, legislation already passed by lawmakers and signed by the governor would take effect in January if the amendment passes. The rates created by that legislation would apply to six tax brackets, ranging from 4.75 percent on income up to \$10,000 to 7.99 percent on all income for individual filers making more than \$750,000.

Here's a look the amendment, the accompanying rate legislation, some of the arguments being made and who is funding the advertising campaigns for and against it.

The amendment

Specifically, Article 9, Section 3 of the Illinois Constitution would be amended if the ballot question passes. The new language would read:

"The General Assembly shall provide by law for the rate or rates of any tax on or measured by income imposed by the State. In any such tax imposed upon corporations the highest rate shall not exceed the highest rate imposed on individuals by more than a ratio of 8 to 5."

That would replace the current language, which states:

"A tax on or measured

by income shall be at a non-graduated rate. At any one time there may be no more than one such tax imposed by the State for State purposes on individuals and one such tax so imposed on corporations. In any such tax imposed upon corporations the rate shall not exceed the rate imposed on individuals by more than a ratio of 8 to 5."

On the ballot, voters will see the question worded as follows:

"The proposed amendment grants the State authority to impose higher income tax rates on higher income levels, which is how the federal government and a majority of other states do it. The amendment would remove the portion of the Revenue Article of the Illinois Constitution that is sometimes referred to as the 'flat tax,' that requires all taxes on income to be at the same rate. The amendment does not itself change tax rates. It gives the State the ability to impose higher tax rates on those with higher income levels and lower income tax rates on those with middle or lower income levels. You are asked to decide whether the proposed amendment should become a part of the Illinois Constitution."

They'll be able to vote "yes" or "no," and the amendment has two paths to passage. If it receives 60 percent of the vote from those voting on the question, it passes. But if it fails to reach the 60 percent threshold for those voting on the question but still musters "yes" votes from more than half of those voting in the election, it would still pass.

The rate structure

The proposal to put the amendment question on the ballot was approved with support from only Democrats, as was Senate Bill 687, the accompanying legislation to set graduated rates beginning in January 2021, should the amendment pass. Again, the current rate is 4.95 percent on any taxable income.

The new rate structure would create six tax brackets, with rates applying to margins of taxable income instead of every penny of an earner's income, except for those in the top bracket. The rates would be:

4.75 percent on single or joint filers' first \$10,000 of taxable income

4.9 percent on single or joint filers' income from over \$10,000 to \$100,000

4.95 percent on single or joint filers' income from over \$100,000 to \$250,000

7.75 percent on a single filer's income from over \$250,000 to \$350,000 and joint filers' from over \$250,000 to \$500,000

7.85 percent on a single filer's income from over \$350,000 to \$750,000 and joint filers' from over \$350,000 to \$1 million

Once a single filer exceeds \$750,000 or joint filers exceed \$1 million, the top rate of 7.99 percent will apply at a flat rate to every penny of income. For all other earners, the previous brackets apply. Those rates effectively

mean anyone earning \$250,000 or less will pay the same or lower income tax rates under the graduated structure, while those earning above that amount would pay higher rates.

The measure also raises the corporate tax rate to 7.99 percent from 7 percent and does not change the Corporate Property Replacement tax of 1.5 to 2.5 percent which already exists in current law.

It also raises the property tax credit from 5 percent to 6 percent, and creates a \$100 per-child tax credit for joint filers earning less than \$60,000 annually and single filers earning less than \$40,000 annually. The tax credit would decrease by \$5 per child for every \$2,000 of income a filer has above those amounts.

In estimates released before the COVID-19 pandemic, the governor's office said the graduated tax is expected to bring in about \$1.2 billion for the current fiscal year as it would be in place for only part of it, and \$3.4 billion once it is in place for a full year.

Neither the amendment nor the accompanying legislation would change the level of authority lawmakers have to raise tax rates. A simple majority vote from both chambers in the General Assembly and a signature from the governor is all that is needed to raise rates currently, and that would remain the case with the passage of the amendment.

The fiscal picture

For proponents of the measure, the amendment and the rates approved are all about raising more revenue without increasing rates on middle-income earners or making drastic budget cuts to state services, education and public safety.

Pritzker frequently notes he inherited a state government "hollowed out" by budget cuts from previous administrations and a two-year state budget impasse during which the state spent roughly \$5 billion more than it took in each year, driving a backlog of unpaid bills up to \$16 billion.

Pritzker has estimated the budget shortfall for the current fiscal year at \$6.2 billion, as the COVID-19 pandemic has blown a hole in state finances. Without the graduated tax, which would be in effect for only half of the fiscal year, the shortfall could reach \$7.4 billion, he said in April.

To fill that gap, the governor has left open the option of borrowing billions from the federal government and has lobbied for greater aid to states in another federal stimulus package.

But even before the pandemic, Pritzker pegged Illinois' structural, year-after-year budget deficit at \$3.2 billion, and he has framed the graduated tax debate as a choice between 15 percent across-the-board cuts to state government, a 20 percent flat tax hike or passage of the graduated rates.

RATE: Opponents argue graduated tax would add to tax burden

On Sept. 24, Lt. Gov. Juliana Stratton said lawmakers “will be forced to consider raising income taxes on all Illinois residents by at least 20 percent, regardless of their level of income” if the graduated income tax fails. That would push the current tax rate to about 6 percent, and would require a simple majority vote in a Legislature dominated by Democrats with or without the passage of the amendment.

But opponents argue that without spending reforms, particularly to unfunded state pension obligations which exceed \$137 billion, voters should not consider sending the state more revenue. They also note both graduated tax measures are devoid of any meaningful immediate property tax reforms. Property taxes are levied and collected locally, not by the state, and they fund such things as schools, local governments, fire departments and libraries.

Those in favor of the amendment argue the added revenue could make it easier to fully fund the evidence-based funding formula for K-12 schools, which — years down the line, they say — could alleviate property tax pressures by shifting funding responsibility from local taxes to the state.

But opponents are skeptical of what the added revenues would be used for, as the amendment and accompanying

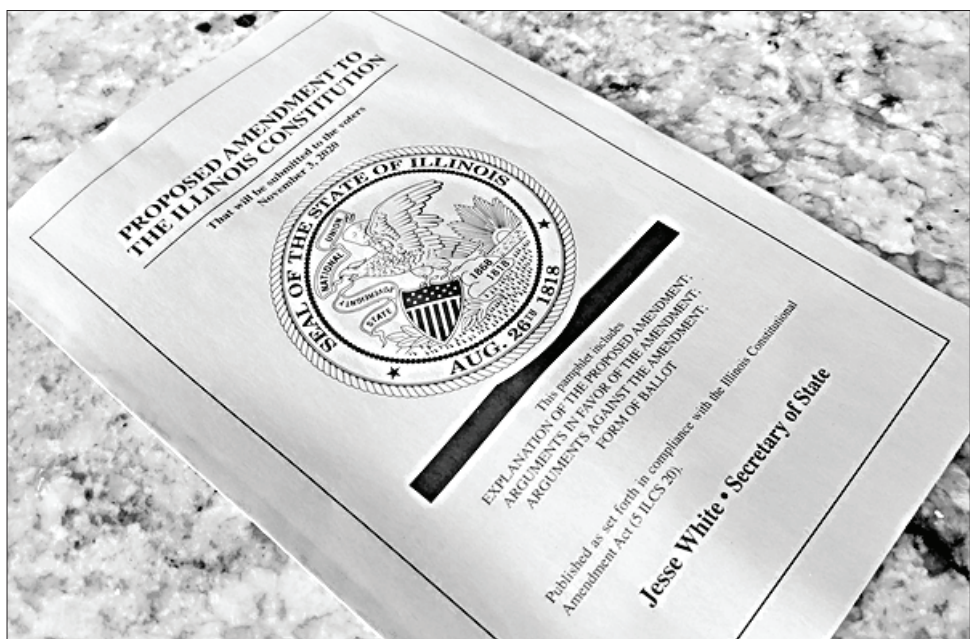
legislation contain no guarantees and the state’s pension burden continues to increase.

Opponents also point out that Illinois’ combined total tax burden — including state and local sales taxes, income taxes, property taxes and others — is the highest in the country, according to the personal finance website Wallethub. The graduated tax would only add to that, they say, claiming that it might drive high-earning residents from the state. Pritzker has said it is middle-income earners who have thus far been more likely to leave the state because, he says, the tax burden is “unfairly” distributed.

Proponents of the amendment, including Pritzker, cite a breakdown which shows the bottom 20 percent of Illinois earners pay 14.4 percent of their total income to state and local taxes, while the top 1 percent of earners pay 7.4 percent of their income in taxes. That’s according to a report by the left-leaning Washington D.C.-based Institute on Taxation and Economic Policy.

Other arguments

Opposition, led in large part by the Illinois Chamber of Commerce, has centered on what the tax would do to businesses and what lawmakers might do in the future if voters give them the opportunity to levy taxes on portions of the electorate

at any one time, rather than on every taxpayer at once.

They also point out the added revenues would not cover state budget deficits amid the pandemic and would require further tax hikes in the future, which could mean adjusting the brackets to raise rates on middle-income earners.

The idea, according to much of the advertising against the amendment, is that giving Springfield politicians the authority to raise taxes on just a small group of taxpayers at any one time makes it easier politically to raise taxes, even though the simple majority vote threshold remains unchanged.

Opposition groups also point to June comments from Treasurer Michael Frerichs, a Democrat who has no

role in setting tax rates, who said it was “worth a discussion” to consider taxing retirement income on certain brackets.

While the graduated tax would make it possible to implement taxes on high-earning retirees without taxing all retirees, Pritzker has said he and Democrats in the General Assembly oppose taxing any retirement income, and the idea remains widely unpopular in Illinois — one of 12 states that do not tax retirement income. Of those 12, nine do not levy income taxes at all.

The senior advocacy group AARP held a news conference earlier this month noting added revenue from the graduated tax could make lawmakers less likely to tax retirement income in order to fill budget gaps. But opponents continue

to point to Frerichs’ comments, although the treasurer has since said he does not support a retirement tax.

While those against the measure say the increase to the corporate tax rate will hit job creators hard at a time when the pandemic is already making it difficult to remain afloat, proponents note that businesses structured as pass-through entities — such as S corporations, sole proprietors and others who claim business income on personal taxes — will see taxes decrease if they earn less than \$250,000 annually in taxable income.

Opponents also take issue with the amendment’s removal of language which states “there may be no more than one such tax imposed by the State for State purposes on individuals and one

such tax so imposed on corporations,” claiming the removal of the language allows for tax bills such as “education surcharges” or other such fees on top of the regular income tax.

Those in favor of the bill, however, say the prohibition on levying multiple income taxes was simply a companion to the requirement for a single flat tax rate. The framers’ inclusion of the language, proponents say, was aimed at stopping lawmakers from creating a multi-tiered tax structure through a series of limited flat taxes on different levels of income. Allowing for a graduated tax renders the language moot, they argue.

The funding

The omnipresent TV and social media advertising regarding the amendment has largely been funded thus far by two billionaires whose combined donations top \$100 million.

The first is Gov. JB Pritzker, who has donated \$56.5 million of his personal fortune to the Vote Yes for Fairness ballot initiative committee.

The other is Kenneth Griffin — Illinois’ wealthiest person, founder of the hedge fund Citadel and former major donor to former Republican Gov. Bruce Rauner — who has donated \$46.75 million to the Coalition to Stop the Proposed Tax Hike Amendment, a business-tied group led by the Illinois Chamber of Commerce.



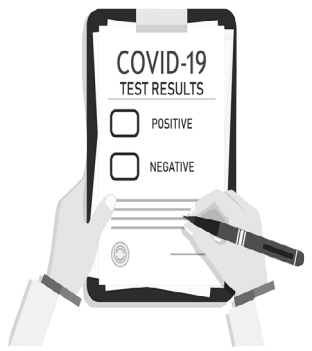

Embracing freedom over fear

FEAR is an enemy that torments the soul and seeks to steal our life. Conquering it is not something that we do in one day; it's something we conquer one day at a time with God's help.

Fear can show up unexpectedly. One of our goals should be to recognize it so we can deal with it right away.

I remember a time when I was waking up at about 2 or 3 in the morning and then having difficulty going back to sleep. After two nights of that, I found myself going to bed with a vague sort of fear that it would happen again, and it did until God reminded me that I could pray and resist Satan, the source of all fear. According to God's Word, the sleep of the righteous should be sweet (Proverbs 3:24). So I prayed immediately and went back to sleep and have not had any problems since then.

Being free from fear doesn't mean that we will never experience fear or be confronted by it. It means that we are committed to not allowing it to rule our lives, and when necessary we will do what we need to do, even if we have to "do it afraid."

Each time you feel fear and decide to do it afraid, you will experience a new freedom and become more determined to end your days of slavery to fear. That doesn't mean you won't still need to confront your fears, but it does mean that you will be more and more resolved to

keep confronting them.

Galatians 5:1 (NIV) says, "It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery." This scripture is very clear that even though we have been completely liberated from a yoke of bondage, we will need at times to "stand firm," and not allow ourselves to be entrapped by it again.

Satan is very shrewd and he doesn't give up easily. I guess we can say that he never completely gives up the hope of drawing us back into bondage. We must live watchfully, ready to recognize and immediately confront the things that steal our liberty in Christ.

The Bible says that the righteous man falls seven times and gets up again (Proverbs 24:16). I love that scripture and I'm greatly encouraged by it. Even the most righteous person fails to do everything he knows to do all the time, but he is committed to not giving up. So when you have a weak moment, that doesn't mean you have lost your victory.

But if we give up, even God can't help us because we receive His help through faith, not through hopelessness. We need to stay positive, hopeful and filled with faith, and when we do, we can overcome anything with God's help. I often say that anyone can succeed if they refuse to give up.

Some fears are more deeply rooted in us than other

ones are, and we need to be more aggressive against them. Mine is the fear of making people angry. My father was always angry, and I never really knew if I had done something to make him that way or not. I would like to be able to say that after all of these years of teaching others, I no longer have to deal with this fear, but that's not the case. However, the good news is, now I recognize it and deal with it, so I still have the victory.

Being able to recognize the lies, deceptions and strategies of the devil is so important. We should always be ready to resist him at the onset of his attacks. Because the longer we let a fear remain, the more difficult it is to get rid of it. So make a decision to be a person of action, and remember that in Christ, you have what it takes to win.

The Word of God says that we are more than conquerors through Christ who loves us (Romans 8:37). God has given us everything we will ever need to overcome our fears through Christ...every spiritual blessing (Ephesians 1:3)...and His power and authority to overcome the power of the enemy (Luke 10:19). We have what it takes, but we must be active and never give up.

I want to encourage you to be patient with yourself. Possessing the full freedom that is yours in Christ is a journey. And it's important to enjoy your progress instead of merely looking at how far you have to go. Today is a new day, and every day you can be one step closer to conquering your fears.

is also doing very well.

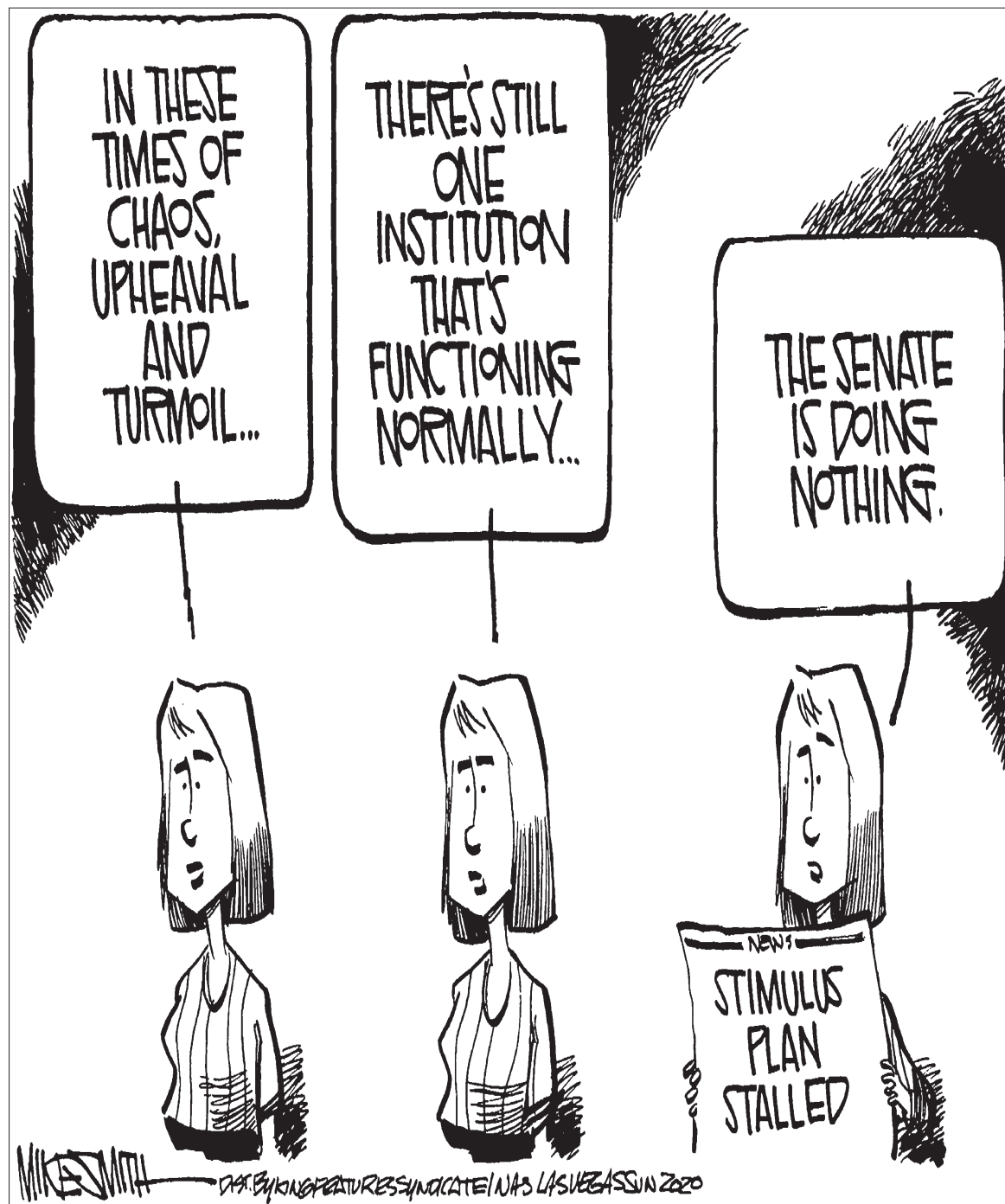

proper Lane Usage, and Failure to Reduce Speed to Avoid an Accident.

The Ogle County Sheriff's Office assisted at the scene and performed accident reconstruction duties.

This traffic crash remains under investigation. The Oregon Police Department continues to consult with the Ogle County State's Attorney regarding potential additional charges.

Lady Hub doubles teams start strong at IHSA 1A Rochelle Sectional

ROCHELLE — The only way that Lady Hub tennis players Jordin Dickey and MeLisa Young could reach the third round of the IHSA 1A Rochelle Sectional on Friday was to defeat two doubles players from Freeport who bested them in match play earlier in the week.

Rochelle and Freeport faced each other on Tuesday, with Pretzel netters Amiah Mlsek and Reese Coon topping Dickey and Young in two sets. The two doubles combos squared off once again Friday afternoon in the second round of the sectional tournament, but it was Mlsek and Coon who were on the defensive, as Dickey and Young claimed the first set to take the lead.

The Lady Hubs fell behind late in the second set, trailing 5-4 before a crucial break point tipped the scales briefly in Rochelle's favor. The set ultimately

went to a tiebreaker point, with Dickey and Young finishing strong to win the point and the match 6-4, 7-6(2).

"We really wanted to beat the Freeport girls because we lost to them on Tuesday," Young said. "Our intentions were to go out and play our hardest and that's what we did. We knew we had to hit the ball where they weren't and keep our intensity up. It was a tough match, but it's only going to get tougher so we have to come back and continue to do our best."

Dickey and Young are one of two Lady Hub doubles pairs who are still alive in the sectional tournament. The two juniors opened their side of the bracket with a first-round victory over Newman Central Catholic's Brynlee Hermeyer and Maddy Verdick (6-4, 6-3), overcoming a nearly two-hour-long rain delay late in the second set of their match.

Seniors setting example for returning players

Ohlinger, Harrington among underclassmen ready to step up next season

ROCHELLE — Head coach Glen Mehrings wasn't sure what to expect from his players when the Rochelle Township High School golf program teed off the 2020 season in August. While the COVID-19 pandemic limited practice opportunities during the spring and summer, the Hubs pushed through the unprecedented circumstances and posted a six-win season along the way.

Rochelle finished 6-6 overall and 2-5 in the Interstate 8 Conference this fall. It was the second straight season the Hubs recorded six victories, and although Rochelle will be graduating three varsity seniors, there are several returning players who could step up for the Hubs in 2021.

"It's hard for the kids to develop great physical habits when we only have a seven-week season," Mehrings said. "The kids tried really hard to develop their swing mechanics and their mental framework for how to attack the course, negotiate tough shots and stay calm

under pressure. There are so many variables that go into becoming a better golfer, and our kids had to negotiate through a lot of stressful situations this year. The kids followed the example set by our seniors and they never panicked throughout the season. It was a great group of kids."

Among Rochelle's graduating seniors will be Megan Thiravong, who departs as the most accomplished player in school history. Thiravong finished her career as a four-time conference, regional and sectional medalist as well as a three-time IHSA State Championship qualifier. The Lady Hub standout was Rochelle's first-ever female conference champion and as a freshman, she became the program's first female player to qualify for state in over two decades.

"Megan set an example for the other kids," Mehrings said. "She was always willing to help out the other players and she's easily the most decorated golfer I've had in my 28 years here. She would have been a four-time state qualifier this year, and she improved her

scores at the state meet each year. It was a pleasure to see her develop over her four years with the program."

Seniors Reese Kirk and newcomer Dominic Williams are also set to depart after holding down two of the team's top four varsity spots in 2020. Sophomore Griffin Ohlinger, who

earned an All-Conference Honorable Mention this season, headlines a trio of underclassmen that could see varsity action next year. Sophomores Damen Harrington and Wade Smith, as well as juniors Brett Ferguson and Levi Lawhorn, could see their roles increase in 2021.

"Good things will happen when our players put in the time to improve, and it was really nice to see a new player like Dominic do that because the younger players see that," Mehrings

said. "Reese is a player who really loves golf and wants to practice and compete every day. He has a competitive, fun personality and he helped set an example for our team over the last four years... Reese was a great athlete with a lot of raw talent who wanted to get better each year."

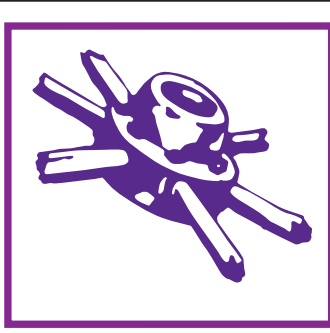

NIU Football

Huskie defense has share of youth, experience

Unit bringing physical mentality and energy

DEKALB — Fall was definitely in the air as the Northern Illinois University football team took to the practice field for the 11th time this preseason camp Wednesday morning.

With temps in the mid-40s, the Huskies worked out for an hour and 40 minutes in full pads in what marked the midpoint of this unconventional camp. Each side of the ball had their moments during practice and there has been plenty of give and take. “It’s been very competitive on both sides of the ball,” said NIU head coach Thomas Hammock.

“I couldn’t be more pleased where we’re at with this team. The things they’re showing, especially the second year in the program. I know what it looked like last year, and it looks a lot different [this year]. We have to continue to stack days, continue to do the things necessary to keep im-

proving as a football team, but I’m very excited about the progress right now. We grade every practice. I have a grading system I brought with me from Baltimore and it grades different things at practice. The whole goal is to make practice as competitive as possible. We had a stretch where the defense won two days in a row, then the offense came back and dominated. What I explained to the team is there should be some give and take on both sides of the ball if you have a good team.”

Freshman wide receiver Trayvon Rudolph had a good day Wednesday. Rudolph was given a one-on-one rep early in practice. Unbeknownst to him or the coaching staff, Hammock had a scholarship available for Rudolph, who made the catch and earned a scholarship to NIU. He validated his coach’s faith making a pair

of incredible catches during the team periods.

The defense had its moments during practice as well. Linebacker Jordan Cole stepped in front of an Andrew Haidet pass in the flat for a pick six and newcomer Eddie Jackson made an incredible interception off Ross Bowers at the boundary, grabbing the ball in midair and coming down with his feet in bounds.

Associate head coach/defensive coordinator/safeties coach Derrick Jackson is happy with what his charges have done in camp so far, given that the last few weeks have been the first time he’s been able to work with them as a unit this year.

“The challenge that we’re having is installing a defense with over 50 percent of the guys haven’t been on this campus until the sum-

mer,” Jackson said. “It being kind of a non-traditional year, all the hands-on things that would’ve benefitted the young guys, you’re teaching guys over video, a playbook, etc. and not be physically in front of them. You don’t get that look in their eyes or they don’t get the mental reps. This last week and a half have been the first time to actually see them play football to assess where they are.”

NIU’s defensive unit is a mix of youth and experience, and sometimes you get that in one player, like linebacker Nick Rattin. The defensive side of the ball was hit hard with injuries last season, losing linebackers Lance Deveau Jr. before the season and Kyle Pugh in week two. As a result, guys like Rattin were put out on the field earlier than anticipated.

Both Pugh and Deveau Jr. are back, as is safety Dillon Thomas, who saw a lot of action late in the season as injuries mounted and players shifted positions. Weston Kramer provides a veteran presence for the Huskies up front.

“If you asked, how would you want to build a defense, we’d say you obviously need someone up front to lead, you need someone in the middle at the second level to lead and you’d need someone at the backend to be able to communicate,” Jackson said. “We have a communicator, with experience, at all three levels of our defense. They’re all really good guys with working with our younger guys.”

Hammock is impressed with what’s he’s seen from the unit through the first two weeks of camp.

“They’re physical and they’re not afraid to mix it up,” Hammock said of the

Huskie defense. “When you have a physical mentality and approach, you’re trying to get to the ball with bad intentions. These guys are fun to coach. They bring a lot of energy. They bring a lot of urgency.”

The Huskies, who open the six-game regular season schedule on Wednesday, Nov. 4 when they play host to Buffalo, return to the practice field Friday. Game times and television for the 2020 season will be announced at a later date.
