COVID-19 case confirmed at Tilton School

ROCHELLE — Rochelle School District 231 and the Ogle County Health Department released a joint statement Friday evening after it was discovered that an individual in one of Tilton School's second-grade classrooms has been diagnosed with COVID-19.

The individual, who is asymptomatic, was last in school on Thursday, Aug. 27, according to the joint

statement released by Superintendent Jason Harper and Ogle County Health Department Administrator Kyle Auman. Students in the classroom with the infected individual will be temporarily moved to remote learning for a required 14-day quarantine. The school district and health department have begun contacting parents regarding the situation.

"The district has been

closely monitoring the health and safety of our students and staff," Harper and Auman wrote in the statement. "[Friday] evening, we became aware that an individual in Mrs. Mairs' second-grade in-person classroom at Tilton School has been diagnosed with COVID-19... The Ogle County Health Department will be calling each household [Friday] night and

throughout the weekend for contact tracing purposes and to determine the appropriate next medical steps. Considering the positive diagnosis of COVID-19, all areas of the building and/or classrooms potentially impacted are being cleaned and disinfected in accordance with recommendations from the CDC and IDPH over the weekend. For all other students attending Tilton

Elementary School and the other Rochelle schools, there is no indication of a larger spread of COVID-19. The district continues to work with the Ogle County Health Department to determine the best course of action for all students. As of now, plans for all students not in Mrs. Mairs' second-grade in-person class at Tilton School to attend school as normal on Monday, Aug. 31."

Rochelle police investigating burglaries

Similar incidents occurring throughout area

ROCHELLE — Rochelle police are investigating reports of two local businesses broken into early Tuesday morning. There are currently no suspects, but the incident remains under investigation.

At approximately 2:33 a.m., Rochelle Tobacco N Liquor, located in the Rochelle Commons, was broken into. At approximately 2:39 a.m., Shell Gas Station, located on Lake Lida Lane, was also broken into. Burglars gained access to both of the businesses by smashing the glass front doors.

Alcohol, cash and cigarettes were stolen from Rochelle Tobacco N Liquor and currently, only cigarettes are known to have been stolen from

Shell. But the police expect more items could be reported when more information is known. Similar burglaries occurred in other surrounding areas on the same night, leading Rochelle police to believe they are all related.

"Sterling, Dixon and Sugar Grove had the same thing happen to some of their businesses last night as well, so we think that they are all by the same individuals," Rochelle Police Chief Eric Higby said. "It looks like they probably went to towns along Interstate 88."

After a few days of investigation, no more suspect information is known at the time but it has come to light that upwards of 30 communities have had similar incidents. It is still unknown if all of some of the recently discovered incidents are connected.

Fire damages local home

No injuries reported at scene

ROCHELLE — The Rochelle Fire Department and Ogle-Lee Fire Protection District were called to a fire Thursday evening that caused an estimated \$50,000 in damage. No injuries were reported at the scene, and the cause of the blaze is under investigation.

The fire occurred at a two-bedroom, ranch-style home located at 1213 1st Ave. in Rochelle. The Rochelle Fire Department arrived on the scene around 6:30 p.m. before calling for additional help from the Ogle-Lee Fire Protection District. Firefighters were on the scene for roughly four hours on Thursday before returning Friday

morning to put out smoldering insulation.

"We received a call of a structure fire between the house and the garage," Fire Chief Dave Sawlsville said. "There's a small breezeway between the house and the garage, and the fire was burning the outside of both the house and the garage. The owner was home at the time, but was unaware of the fire until a neighbor came over and said that the house was on fire."

Two structures were on fire when firefighters arrived, leading the Rochelle Fire Department to call for three additional fire engines from the Ogle-Lee Fire Protection District. Fires ran up to the attic of both

the garage and the house, forcing firefighters to cut holes into the roofing of both structures for ventilation. Firefighters returned around 6:30 a.m. Friday morning to address remaining hot spots caused by the blown-in insulation in the attic of the house.

"The house isn't livable at this time," Sawlsville said. "The homeowners are being taken care of by the Red Cross. I don't know exactly how the fire started at this time. We're narrowing down some possibilities. It looks like the fire started on the outside, which eliminates some possibilities. We need to talk with the owners a few more times."

Exelon to retire Byron station

BYRON — Exelon Generation announced on Aug. 27 that it intends to retire its Byron Generating Station and Dresden Generating Station in fall 2021, resulting in the loss of four nuclear generation units that together supply clean, zero-emissions energy to more than four million homes and businesses in northern Illinois.

Byron will close in September 2021, and Dresden, located in Morris, will close in November 2021.

"While these announcements are regrettable, we must make tough deci-

sions now to minimize financial losses," Byron Generating Station Communications Manager Paul Dempsey said. "The state has aggressive clean energy goals. Carbon-free, reliable nuclear power should be a part of that for many years to come."

Dresden is licensed to operate for another decade and Byron for another 20 years. Together, they employ more than 1,500 full-time employees and 2,000 supplemental workers during refueling outages, most from local union halls. The plants pay

nearly \$63 million in taxes annually to support local schools, fire, police and other services. The two plants supply 30 percent of Illinois' carbon-free energy and are essential to meeting the state's goal to achieve 100 percent clean energy.

"Although we know in our heads that shutting down the uneconomic Illinois plants is necessary to preserve even more jobs elsewhere, our hearts ache today for the thousands of talented women and men that have served Illinois families for more than a

generation and will lose their jobs because of poorly conceived energy policies," said Exelon President and Chief Executive Officer Christopher Crane. "But we are only about a year away from shutdown and we need to give our people, the host communities, and regula-

tors time to prepare."

"We recognize this comes as many of our communities are still recovering from the economic and public health impacts of the pandemic, and we will continue our dialogue with policymakers on ways to prevent these closures," said Crane. "To that end, we have opened our books to policymakers and will continue to do so for any lawmaker who wishes to judge the plants' profitability."

Living through a pandemic

‘Spanish Influenza: Nineteen Days in 1919’ details family’s struggle to survive

ROCHELLE — A woman with deep family ties to Rochelle and northern Illinois recently wrote a book sharing her family’s experiences living in Mendota during the Spanish Flu of 1919.

The book, *Spanish Influenza: Nineteen Days in 1919*, written by Denise D’Angelo Jones, is a real-life account of an 11-person family and its daily struggle of survival during the Spanish Flu. The book documents 19 days through the eyes of the family’s 19-year-old caregiver, Jones’ great aunt Hilda Dorothea Zapf.

Zapf lived in Mendota from 1899-1994 and went to school through fourth grade before becoming the household caregiver, looking after the nine children. From 1911-1989, Zapf kept very detailed, handwritten diaries recounting all of her life events, including many entries on the Spanish Flu written just

hours after they occurred.

“She was very detailed with her writing, even to the point that she would write down dialogue from the doctor or nurse as well as the family’s temperatures and disease progression,” Jones said. “I have even had people tell me after reading the book that they felt as if they went back in time and were in the room with my aunt Hilda.”

Jones was very close with Zapf when she was young and Zapf was still alive. When Jones was 6 years old, she became pen pals with Zapf until she passed away in the ‘90s, writing letters every couple of weeks under the one condition that the other wrote back.

Jones and Zapf became very close over the years, and when Zapf passed away, she left her diaries to Jones’ mother, Shirley Conner Baxter. In 2010, Jones received a box in the mail sent from her mother filled with volumes of Zapf’s diaries.

Jones lived with her

mother for five years until she passed away in 2019. During the last year of her mother’s life, Jones read through all of Zapf’s diaries with her, and when she did, Jones felt the need to share her family’s stories with the rest of the world.

“My mother was bed-ridden the last year of her life and she found great comfort in having me read my aunt Hilda’s diaries to her,” Jones said. “Ironically, the stories she took the most interest in were the ones about the Spanish Flu, and at this time, we all had no idea COVID-19 was going to hit the following year. After reading through them and seeing how detailed they were, I just thought to myself that I have to share these with people.”

One of her mother’s lifelong wishes was to compile Zapf’s diaries into a book. As a way to fulfill her mother’s dream and share hope and inspiration for life after the current pandemic, Jones began writing her book. Jones

started writing the book at the end of March, sent the final manuscript to her editor in June and did rewrites and edits throughout June and July.

released on July 23, her mother’s birthday. While Jones was completely consumed by the Spanish Flu and Zapf’s diaries, the entire experience was very rewarding.

“I have been living 100 years in the past for the last six months and it got to the point where my husband had to make sure that I was eating,” Jones said. “Now

that my aunt is gone and I am reading through her diaries, she almost comes back to me, like she is in the room with me. It has also been incredibly comforting during the grieving process of missing my mother and it almost felt like she was there with me too, helping me write this book.”

“We agree with Governor Pritzker that policy reform is urgently needed to address the climate crisis

and advance Illinois’ clean energy economy, and we support the objectives of the Governor’s recent energy principles,” added Crane. “That’s separate from to-

day’s announcement to retire these two zero-carbon nuclear plants, which was not a decision made lightly and is one that has been in the works for some time.”

Rep. Adam Kinzinger, who represents the district where both plants are located, was quick to release a statement.

“Today’s announcement

to close both the Byron and Dresden power plants is a gut-punch to the people of Illinois, especially to the counties that surround these generating stations. Hundreds of people will now be out of jobs and our efforts to produce clean, affordable, safe nuclear energy will be crushed,” Kinzinger said. “As a nation, we cannot reach our climate goals without nuclear energy. In Congress, I’ve long fought for nuclear and am doing everything I can at the federal level to save our nuclear fleet. But we need state support. me time.”

Despite being among the most efficient and reliable units in the nation’s nuclear fleet, Dresden and Byron face revenue shortfalls in the hundreds of millions of dollars because of declining energy prices and market rules that allow fossil fuel plants to underbid clean resources in the PJM capacity auction, even though there is broad public support for sustaining and expanding clean energy resources to address the climate crisis. The plants’ economic challenges are further exacerbated by a recent FERC ruling that undermines longstanding state clean energy programs and gives an additional competitive advantage to polluting energy sources in the auction. As a result of these market rules, Exelon Generation’s LaSalle and Braidwood nuclear stations in Illinois, each of which house two nuclear units and together employ more than 1,500 skilled workers, are also at high risk for premature closure.

Studies have shown that when nuclear plants close, plants that burn fossil fuels operate much more often, increasing harmful carbon and air pollution, especially in disadvantaged communities. In January 2019, Illinois committed to reducing greenhouse gas emissions consistent with the targets set in the Paris climate agreement. While the state is currently at roughly 85 percent progress towards

the 2025 goal, if the four economically challenged nuclear plants (Dresden, Byron, Braidwood and LaSalle) prematurely retire, Illinois will drop to only 20 percent of the way toward the goal. Electric sector emissions in Illinois will increase by 70 percent.

Despite these consequences, Exelon Generation must act now to prevent further shortfalls and give its employees, contractors and community partners time to prepare for the loss of jobs and tens of millions of dollars in taxes, donations and local purchasing. The notification also is necessary to give PJM enough time to conduct an analysis confirming that retiring Byron and Dresden will not cause a shortage of generating capacity in northern Illinois during times of peak demand.

In the days and weeks ahead, Exelon Generation will file a deactivation notice with PJM and inform key stakeholders and regulatory agencies of the retirements. In addition, the company will:

Make official shutdown notifications to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission within 30 days;

Terminate capital investment projects required for long term operation of Dresden and Byron; and

Scale back the refueling outages scheduled for this fall at Dresden and Byron. The move will result in spending reductions of \$50 million and the elimination of up to 1,400 of the more than 2,000 mostly union jobs typically associated with the two refueling outages.

While retirement preparations are underway, employees will continue to operate the plants at world-class levels of safety and operational excellence until they are decommissioned. Exelon Generation will work to place affected plant employees at other Exelon facilities or help them transition to positions outside the company, wherever possible.

Welch to push for contracting diversity legislation in veto session

SPRINGFIELD — State Rep. Emanuel “Chris” Welch said Thursday that he will demand passage of legislation in the upcoming fall veto session to give minority- and women-owned businesses a larger share of the estimated \$20 billion in state purchasing and contracting dollars allotted annually.

“I am demanding that veto session takes place as scheduled, because the Black agenda cannot wait,” Welch, a Hillside Democrat, said during a video news conference. “The Black agenda, which will be rolled out in the coming days, is going to demand equity and inclusion and in several areas.”

Welch was referring to a package of legislation expected to be put forward by the Illinois Legislative Black Caucus. Ahead of that announcement, however, the Maywood Democrat said he will push for passage of House Bill 5824. It would improve

contracting opportunities for minority- and women-owned and operated businesses, he said.

“This isn’t something new. It’s something that we’ve been consistently fighting for year after year after year,” Welch said. “And I think in this watershed moment that we are (at) in history, this is the time, now more than ever, that we should be given fair contracting opportunities.”

Among other things, the bill would give the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity the job of holding “matchmaking” workshops between minority- and women-owned vendors and large purchasing institutions that are already required to file supplier diversity reports. Those include higher education institutions, hospitals, casinos and racetracks, and insurance companies that manage the state’s Medicaid program. Currently, that responsibility rests with the Department of Central Management Services.

Welch said the bill also would clarify a current law that requires all businesses receiving

EDGE tax credits to file supplier diversity reports during the year in which they seek a tax credit, and it would require them to participate in matchmaking workshops. EDGE stands for Economic Development for a Growing Economy.

Further, the legislation would require all insurance companies with assets exceeding \$50 million that are licensed to do business in Illinois to file

supplier diversity reports and participate in the matchmaking workshops.

Illinois currently has a program, known as the Business Enterprise Program, aimed at helping minority- and women-owned businesses gain access to the state’s purchasing and contracting process. It also maintains a list of registered businesses that are at least 51-percent owned by minorities, women and

people with disabilities.

Illinois currently has a statute that sets a goal of awarding at least 20 percent of the total dollars of state contracts to businesses owned by minorities, women and people with disabilities, but Welch said many of the state’s largest purchasing institutions, including its higher education system and Medicaid program, have consistently failed to meet that target.

“I have spent the summer looking at data in all of these industries. And the data is abysmal, particularly in the managed care organization industry,” he said.

Although the bill would not mandate new hiring or contracting quotas, Welch said he believes the increased reporting requirements would “help shine a light on those disparities and the lack of opportunities being provided.”

“I also think this bill will provide opportunities to take away some of the excuses that are being used out there,” he added. “That’s why DCEO is very important in the matchmaking workshops and opportunities, because it’ll take away a lot of the excuses.”

Welch was joined by officials from the Federation of Women Contractors, the Chicago Minority Supplier Development Council and the Hispanic American Construction Industry Association, all of whom expressed their support for the bill.

The bill was introduced Monday, Aug. 24, and has not yet been assigned to a committee.

a variety of organizations on the diversity and importance of fungi.

Jones' book details the accounts of her 11 family members and their struggles surviving during the Spanish Flu. It talks about mask wearing, handwashing, sweeping the floors, sponging down sick family

members' bodies and nurses living in the home with the family. The book even describes visits from Dr. E.P. Cook Jr., the physician at the time.

The book also compares similarities and differences to today, local gossip from around the town and many

light hearted and funny experiences from Zapf and other family members. It also dives into the family's hope for the future, no matter how bad things looked at the time.

"Along with sharing my family's history with the world, I also hope this book reminds people that there is life after COVID-19," Jones said. "If you look back at history, we can see that there was life after the Spanish Flu. We had the

roaring '20s, a lot of good things happened after the flu in the '20s. When we are in the middle of something, it looks like it is the end of the world, but it really is not. Life will be even better because there will be innovations we can't even imagine."

Since the book's release, Jones has received many phone calls and emails from her readers with nothing but positive feedback. The one thing

she heard most from her audience was they wanted to know more about Zapf and her family.

"I really didn't know what to expect, I just knew I was completing something that was my mother's dream and something I wanted to do," Jones said. "But what surprised me the most was that people didn't want the book to end. One woman told me that she didn't even want to leave the house when she was reading."

Now that the book is finished and has received such a positive response, Jones is in the middle of writing her future books. One is a science fiction novel about a very religious Christian farmer from Wisconsin, who finds extra-terrestrial squatters on his land, that is set for release in October.

Jones' other book, which only needs a few final touches before being completed, is *The Lady with the Purple Hat*. The book is about dementia communication and is based off the experiences Jones went through with her mother when she had dementia. The final book Jones is working on is an extension of the Spanish Flu novel she recently finished.

While Jones continues working on her future books, she will also be achieving one of her lifelong dreams of living in England. Her husband recently got a job teaching

at Oxford University for six months, so they will be moving to England during that time. Recently, Jones' sister set up a desk at the original Mendota home where Zapf wrote her diaries, a home in which Jones would be content spending the rest of her life.

"My younger sister knows how much I love the closet where aunt Hilda did all of her writing, so she put a desk there, right where she sat," Jones said. "I would love to spend the rest of my life going back to Hilda's house and writing more and more books."

Get your mind set on what matters most

HAVE you ever wondered if something is holding you back from experiencing the promises of God in your life? I remember a time when I was hearing about all the promises of God but never actually experiencing them.

I heard about peace, but I didn't have any. I heard about joy, but I was unhappy all the time. I could see God's promises in His Word and I believed them, but something was missing. As I spent time studying God's Word, I came to realize that the root of my problem was found in the wrong mindsets I was living with.

The story of the Israelites is a good example of what a difference our mindset can make. In Exodus 13, we read about how God called them out of Egypt to possess the Promised Land. But what was supposed to be an 11-day journey ended up being a 40-year journey through the wilderness—all because they didn't know how to think right (see Deuteronomy 1).

One wrong mindset the Israelites had was, "Please make everything easy for me because I can't take it when things are too hard." When things got hard for them and they had to fight their enemies, instead of

turning to God, they started grumbling and complaining about their situation. They thought their enemies were the problem, but it was really their thinking.

So instead of moving forward and experiencing the good things God had planned for them, He had to take them the long, hard way through the wilderness in order to prepare them to possess the Promised Land.

Like the Israelites, sometimes we're not ready for all that God has planned for us, so we spend a little time in "the wilderness" growing up and learning how to trust Him. I know what this is like. There was a time when I had an "it's just too hard" attitude and mindset about things I needed to face.

When God spoke to my heart that I needed to completely forgive people who had hurt me, it seemed impossible to me. But realizing that He didn't expect me to do it in my own strength gave me the courage to take a step of faith and choose to forgive, trusting that God would change my heart and set me free from the misery of bitterness and unforgiveness.

It wasn't easy, but the peace and joy I now

have is so much better than living with the bitterness and resentment of unforgiveness. And I wouldn't be doing what I'm doing today if I hadn't obeyed God in this area of my life.

God sometimes has to bring us through hardship to test us, humble us and to see if we will keep His commandments in the wilderness. Deuteronomy 8:2 (NIV) says, "Remember how the Lord your God led you all the way in the wilderness these forty years, to humble and test you in order to know what was in your heart, whether or not you would keep his commands."

God wants to help us learn how to obey Him in the wilderness because if we don't keep His commandments when life is hard, then we won't keep them when everything is going our way. He wants us to be strong enough and mature enough to keep moving forward in His plan for our lives.

Instead of having the mindset that says, "It's just too hard," the truth is that with God's help, you can do whatever you need to do in life. Philippians 4:13 says, "I can do all this through him who gives me strength."

So, when the enemy starts to tell you that your circumstances are impossible, you'll never make it, and you should quit, you can be confident knowing this promise from God: I can do whatever I need to do through Christ who gives me strength. You can look to God for the strength you need to deal with whatever life throws at you.

Once we adopt a right mindset to replace a wrong one, we must be determined to keep our thoughts headed in that direction. Colossians 3:2 says to "set your minds and keep them set on what is above (the higher things), not on the things that are on the earth" (AMPC).

You do that by focusing on the promises of God in His Word, choosing to trust what He says more than what your circumstances look like, what others say or how you feel. The truth is God loves you, He has wonderful plans for your life and He wants you to experience all He has for you.

Instead of focusing on the hard things in your life, think about all that God has helped you through and all He has in store for you. Set your mind on Him and follow His lead through the wilderness to your Promised Land.

Treating every citizen equally

FIRST off, let me be clear.

I love this country. I love the ideals and the concepts our form of government has.

I love the idea that anyone can become anything they want to be. But I don't believe the concepts are applied to all citizens equally. I saw the pictures of black students sitting at lunch counters during the 50s and 60s. They were not treated as citizens should be treated.

I've read stories about the black children being escorted into a school by armed troops because their parents wanted them to have the same education as a white child had in their community.

I've watched the march in Selma, the Martin Luther King "I Have a Dream" speech and I keep asking myself, what is wrong with us?

Why do we have a country so racially divided? Why do people hate because of someone's color, or religion, or nationality?

Why do we have police shooting someone in the back seven times?

I don't have the answers. If I did, I would bottle a cure and give it away.

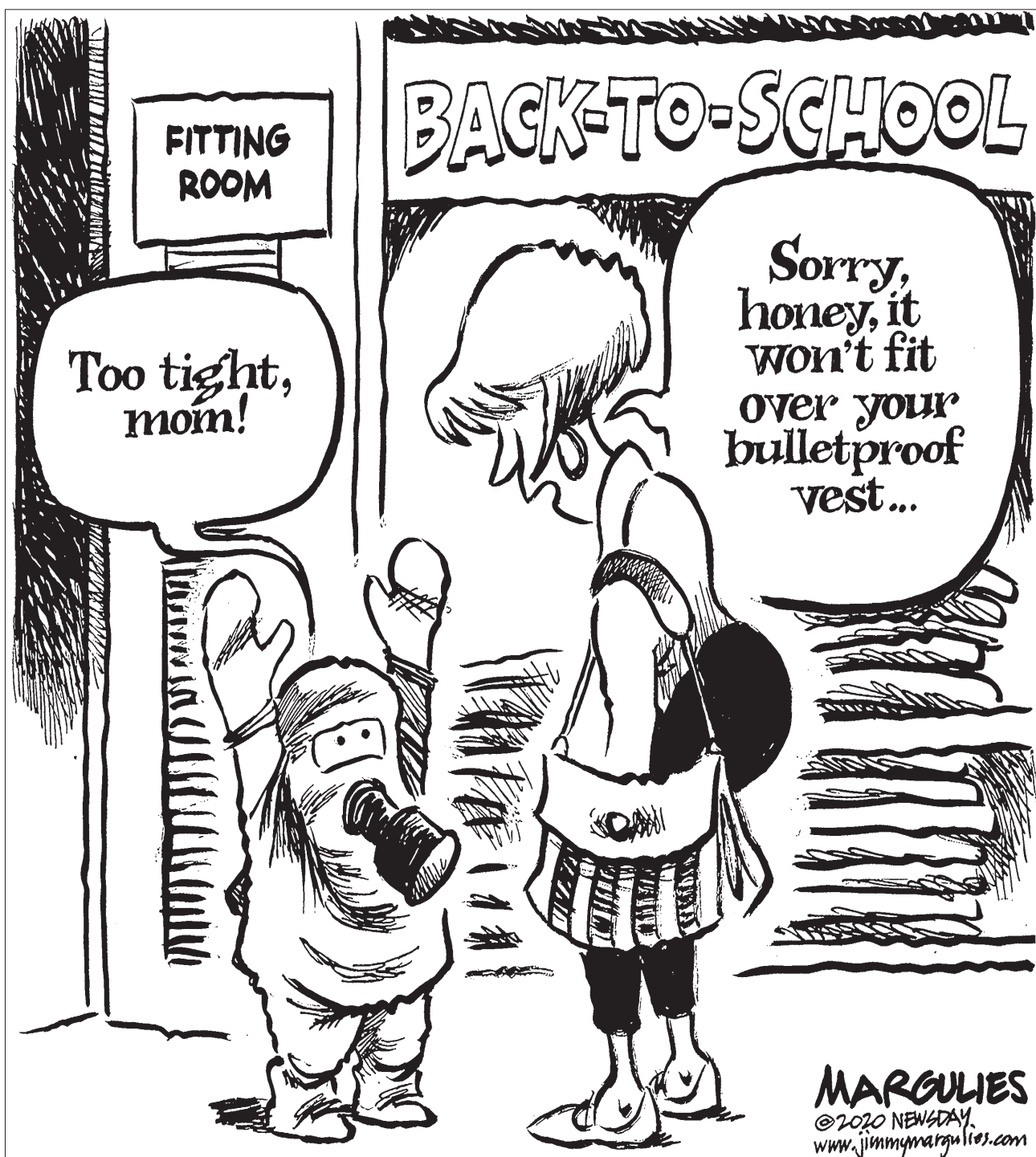
I know it seems trite, but the cure is in our hearts and in our minds. The hate can not continue.

Now before all of you math teachers jump on me – joining the English teachers who love to send letters pointing out every grammatical mistake – I am not anti-math. In fact, I love the beauty and precision of math.

My problem is that I am not good at it and never have been. I am the artsy type; numbers have never been my thing.

The same goes for conspiracy theories, which I have written about before. I find some of them to be mildly entertaining, but these days many are actually frightening in their absurdity. It is hard for me to understand how people can believe such

nonsense.

But all you have to do is take a look at social media and you see conspiracies of every stripe. Government control, bigfoot, secret societies running the world – they are out there, and they have more and more people who believe them. Sadly, too many people are easily led these days.

I have seen a local one recently that is a real head scratcher for me, because it involves math – well, statistics, really.

During COVID, cases are tracked per 100,000 people. Now, as most know this is common in science when tracking things. A sample size is needed, so you take a number. This way, as Kyle Auman, the head of the Ogle County Health Department explained, you can compare a jurisdiction with a million people accurately with one with 50,000 people.

I bring this up, because some people on that pesky social

media – and even in my email – have called the county's COVID-19 numbers fiction because how can you use the number 100,000 when there aren't even 100,000 people in the county?

Now, as a math illiterate dude, even I felt confident that I knew the answer. I reached out to experts to check and I was (shockingly, stunningly, unbelievably) correct.

Auman even sent me a chart which explained how these calculations are made and why. I will admit the math made me a little dizzy, but I could clearly follow it.

In short, using these numbers for statistical analysis is business as usual. It is not a government plot. It is not a media snow job. It is not "fake news."

It is just math. And I can tell you that the older I get, the more I appreciate the certainty of math. I understand to mathematicians, math is a wonderful

But it is incumbent on us to do the research, so we do understand before we make grand pronouncements about these things, isn't it? And if we don't, reach out to experts who do. We should all do our best during these difficult times to educate ourselves.

Now, no more math, OK?

Five ways to protect hearing every day

THE saying “you don’t know what you’ve got ‘til it’s gone” is never more true than in regard to hearing. It’s easy to take hearing for granted, but even momentary hearing loss can highlight how vital it is to protect hearing.

People rely on headphones or earbuds to listen to music, stream movies or participate in work-related meetings more than ever before. Having the volume too loud can contribute to hearing loss over time.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention says five in 10 young people listen to their music or other audio too loudly. Overall, 48 million people in the United States have trouble hearing in one or both of their ears. Johns Hopkins Medical Center reports approximately 15 percent of adults 18 years of age or older report some trouble hearing, and the risk of hearing problems increases with age.

Once it’s gone, hearing cannot be restored in many cases. To protect hearing and guard against future hearing loss, consider these recommendations.

Ask for a baseline hearing test. It’s easier to measure hearing loss if there is a baseline by which it can be mea-

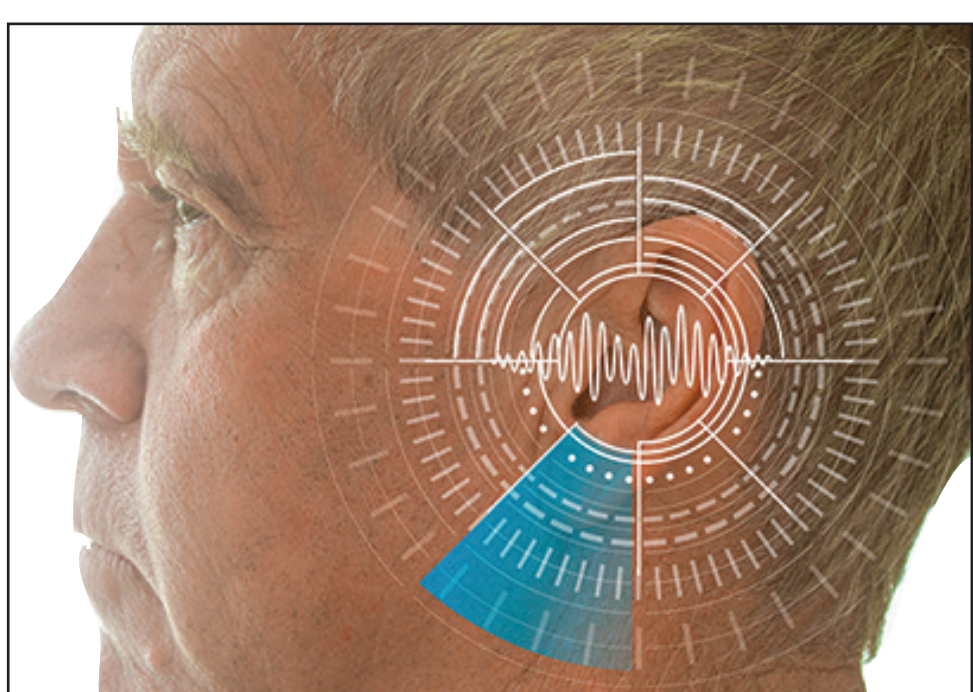
sured. During your annual physical, ask for a hearing test or a referral to an audiologist. This can set the course for monitoring progression of any future hearing loss.

Wear hearing protection. There are various types of hearing protection that can filter out certain levels of sound. Many earplugs, like the ones musicians wear or those worn when attending rock concerts, can reduce the sound by approximately 25 dB.

Custom fit ear plugs provide more noise reduction, in upwards of 35 to 40 dB. They are optimal for high-noise environments, such as when mowing lawns or operating machinery, according to the hearing loss resource Hearts for Hearing.

Turn down the volume. Experts recommend adhering to the 60/60 rule when enjoying audio through headphones. This suggestion is to listen with the headphones at no more than 60 percent volume for no more than 60 minutes a day. Earbuds fit directly next to the eardrum and can be harmful to your hearing. If possible, choose over-the-ear headphones instead.

Have custom molds made. Rather than turning up the volume, people



can have custom ear molds made for use with earphones, suggests Johns Hopkins. The custom ear molds will block outside noise, allowing for higher quality listening.

Keep your ears dry. Moisture in the ear can cause bacteria to grow and potentially lead to infections. Towel-dry ears gently after showering or

swimming.

Avoid the temptation to use cotton swabs to dry the ears. For the most part, ears are self-cleaning, and using a cotton swab can push wax and cause it to become compacted in the ear canal.

In addition to these tips, discussing hearing health with a doctor is a wise idea.

How to avoid drug interactions

HUNDREDS of millions of people across the globe rely on medications for their survival. In fact, the percentage of people using prescription medications may surprise people who work outside the health care industry.

According to the National Center for Health Statistics’ National Health and Nutrition Examination Survey 2015-16, nearly 46 percent of the population of the United States used prescription drugs in 2015-16. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention notes that prescription drug use is similar in Canada, where the Canadian Health Measures Survey found that roughly two-thirds of adults between the ages of 40 and 79 used at least one prescription drug in a 30-day period.

Prescription drugs may be vital to many people’s survival, but they also can prove deadly if mismanaged. That’s especially true for people taking more than one medication. Taking multiple medications each day may be necessary, but it’s equally necessary that people taking more than one medication every day take steps to avoid drug interactions.

Discuss all medications with each of your



doctors. Primary care physicians and specialists should be kept in the loop regarding which medications their patients are taking. Patients should never assume their doctors know every medication they’re taking. When prescribed a new medication, mention to your prescribing doctor what else you are taking. Include prescription medications but also over-the-counter, or OTC, drugs, supplements and even vitamins. Use a notes app on your smartphone to create a running list of your medications so you can easily access it during doctor’s ap-

pointments.

Read all labels. Prescription drugs and OTC medications list potential side effects in different ways. Each prescription medication comes with a lengthy list of potential side effects, while OTC labels cite potential side effects in the “Warnings” section on their labels. Familiarize yourself with all potential side effects of a given medication prior to taking it. Err on the side of caution and wait to speak with your physician before taking an OTC medication you’re unfamiliar with.

Order all prescriptions from the same pharmacy.

Ordering all prescriptions from the same pharmacy makes it easy to access all prescriptions. Pharmacists can look up all prescriptions and crosscheck interactions that may result from taking certain medications at the same time. This safety net can be useful and convenient.

Utilize online resources. The Drug Interactions checker at www.drugs.com/drug_interactions.html is a convenient way to learn about the potential interactions that can result when taking more than one medication or even mixing it with certain foods or beverages.

Drug interactions can be deadly, which only underscores the importance of being careful when taking more than one medication at a time.



Why the flu shot is so important

MILLIONS of people across the globe get flu shots each year. Flu shots protect people against influenza, but they might provide even greater benefits in 2020.

Attacking the pins

Rochelle shoots season-low score in conference win over Plano

ROCHELLE — Dominic Williams had been playing golf for a few years, but it wasn't until this fall that he had the opportunity to compete for the Rochelle Hubs. Williams has already found himself in the varsity lineup, and the senior stepped up in a big way when Rochelle tried for its first Interstate 8 Conference win of the season against the Plano Reapers on Wednesday.

Playing out of the No. 4 varsity spot, Williams carded his best nine-hole round of the season, shooting 45 and helping the Hubs to a 171-216 victory over Plano. It was the lowest team score of the fall for Rochelle (3-2, 1-2 Interstate 8), which had four players well under 50.

"I kept my head down and I focused on keeping a smooth stroke during my follow-through," Williams said. "I thought that helped me a lot today... I feel like my short game within 100 yards is really solid and I've been getting a lot of my chips on the green.

I'm looking to continue working on my putting and avoiding slices with my driver. I know I can always improve."

The Hubs were back at Fairways Golf Course in Rochelle on Wednesday, and senior Reese Kirk took advantage of the familiar territory, recording the best round of his high school career (38) and the lowest score of the match. Senior Megan Thiravong followed with 41 for the Hubs, while sophomore Griffin Ohlinger rounded out Rochelle's top varsity players with a 47.

"It was nerve-racking toward the end of the round," Kirk said. "I was hitting my driver down the fairway on each hole and my putting was near perfect. I had some tough shots from the middle of the fairway, but my chip-

ping was great today. It wasn't until the seventh hole that I realized I was even for the round. When I birdied to bounce back from a bogey, I knew I could do it."

Rochelle continues to trend in the right direction, lowering its conference average to 180.7 after two scores in the 180s against Ottawa and Kaneland this past week. With Kirk, Thiravong and Ohlinger consistently scoring well, the Hubs have been looking for a fourth player to emerge in the varsity lineup, and it appears that Williams may be that player.

"I've been having a great time," Williams said. "We have a good team with a lot of potential. If we can continue playing solid golf, I feel that we can have a really good season this year."

IHSA board approves modified postseason

Fall sports to conduct geographic regionals; \$100 entry fees required

BLOOMINGTON — The Illinois High School Association (IHSA) Board of Directors met virtually for their regularly scheduled board meeting on Monday, Aug. 24, 2020, where the Board approved a plan to conduct modified postseason state series tournaments in boys and girls golf, boys and girls cross country, girls swimming & diving, and girls tennis this fall.

The approved plan will allow for a single round of regional geographic competition to be conducted the week of Oct. 19-25, with the majority of the events expected to be held on Saturday, Oct. 24.

"The health and safety of the student-athletes, their coaches, and their school communities has been our priority from the start of the pandemic," said IHSA executive director Craig Anderson. "Throughout the spring and summer, we looked

for ways to reengage student-athletes with their peers and coaches, and our membership has shared countless positive experiences from that initial 'return to play' period. We have found similar value in being able to conduct fall sports, and believe the participants deserve a culminating experience if we can offer it safely."

The IHSA State Series tournaments will meet all Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) guidelines as it relates to COVID-19. The IHSA will be finalizing and releasing details for each fall state series tournament in the coming weeks, including dates, schedules, awards, structure, and additional safety precautions.

In conjunction with the modified fall state series, the Board also approved a \$100 state series entry fee for any school entering a team or individual in any of the

fall sports.

"The IHSA office is charged with the responsibility of being a good steward of the Association's finances," said Anderson. "The past few months have seen a significant reduction in the IHSA's income, given the cancellation of the IHSA Boys Basketball State Finals and the entire spring season. Financial challenges remain on the horizon in 2020-21 due to the limited number of sports currently classified as 'low risk' by the state, making the chances of conducting full state series tournaments unlikely at this time."

The IHSA By-laws allow the Board of Directors the discretion to implement entry fees into IHSA State Series tournaments. The IHSA last charged a tournament entry fee in 2004-05.

"An overwhelming number of school administrators supported the fees in recent surveys," said Anderson. "Not charging entry fees has been a point

of pride for the IHSA. We are humbled by the support of our member schools during this difficult time, and appreciative of their support."

The Board will continue to look at the postseason options by sport and season as the school year progresses, so they can accurately gauge the allowable IDPH options and

most current COVID-19 data.

"Interscholastic sports, like the IHSA and IESA, have rightfully followed stricter return to play guidance than non-school events since the start of the summer," said Anderson. "While we understand and appreciate the frustration felt by high school coaches due to the stricter guid-

ance, we also recognize the need for that added guidance, even though it may create more challenges for us. There is a responsibility that exists within the school setting to create a safer environment for the community as a whole, while non-school competitions are often conducted without any standardized safety protocols."

THERE were several talented senior players on a Rochelle Township High School volleyball team that set a new single-season wins record this past season. But it was a sophomore and first-year varsity player who emerged as not only an impact performer, but a pillar for the future.

"I want to be more of a leader next season," Hasz said. "I want to continue improving in all aspects of the game because I want to play in college... My club experience has definitely helped because I know I can go after every ball, and when we have good hitters, we don't have to worry about setters putting up perfect balls on each play. If we can put up good balls, the hitters will go and get them. I'd like to give 100 percent effort and work hard next year."

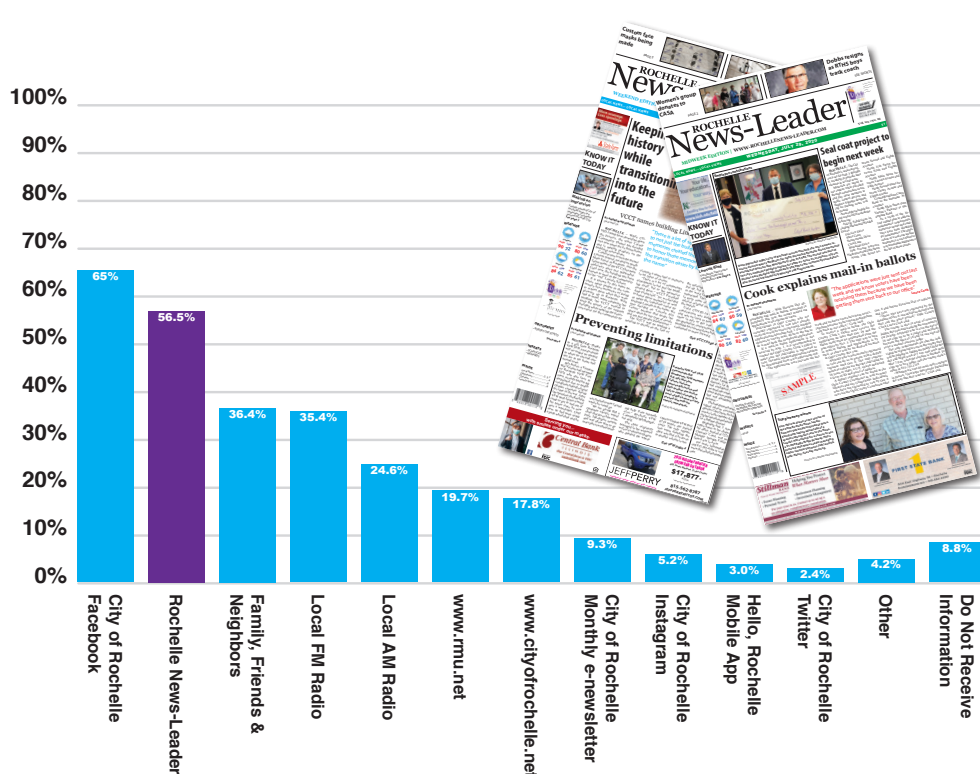

Federal investments come after state invests \$200 million in Quantum Exchange as part of Rebuild Illinois

CHICAGO — Governor JB Pritzker announced this week that Illinois was chosen to host two of the five new National Quantum Information Science Research Centers led by Argonne National Laboratory and Fermi National Accelerator Laboratory in affiliation with the University of Chicago. Each project is projected to received \$115 million in federal funding to support breakthroughs in quantum information and science.

As part of the state's historic Rebuild Illinois capital program, Gov. Pritzker made sure the state invested \$200 million in the Quantum Exchange to put Illinois at the forefront of creating jobs for the next century. The Quantum Exchange is hub for researchers, both academic and industrial, oriented around the goal of advancing efforts in the science and engineering of quantum information.

The announcement builds on the progress Illinois has made to create an ecosystem to support groundbreaking advances in science and innovation. In addition, the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign will receive federal funding for two research institutes focused on artificial intelligence. Seven AI institutes will receive federal funding in partnership with existing academic research groups. With the new investments, Illinois is the only state nationwide to receive funding for two hubs.
