Back to class



Safety protocol, procedures released for elementary students

ROCHELLE – With the start of the school year quickly approaching, Rochelle Consolidated School District 231 has released the safety protocol and procedures for reopening its elementary buildings and Rochelle Middle School.

As the district moves forward with its plan of a hybrid, online and in-person learning plan, all students in grades K-12 will be assigned a technology device to aid in the remote learning process. The district will also continue to provide amenities such as transportation for students who qualify in accordance with the district's pandemic transportation policy as well as breakfast and to-go lunch options.

All students and staff will be screened upon entering the building with infrared thermometers and anybody who shows a temperature

over 99.5 will be asked to wait in a designated holding center for 15 minutes before rechecking his or her temperature. If the individual's temperature does not change the school nurse will check for other COVID-19 symptoms.

If any student demonstrates further symptoms during his or her morning screening or throughout the day, they will be isolated in a controlled environment and sent home. It is also very important to notify the school if a student will not be in attendance as well as complete the Rochelle schools' "students with COVID-19 symptoms" form.

Symptom tracking

The information gathered through the forms will be used for tracking students who present symptoms and to help determine the appropriate steps on how to proceed. All classes kindergarten through fifth grade will meet Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m.

to 12:30 p.m. and middle school classes will meet Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 12:43 p.m. While this is the current plan, the district warns that just like everything during the pandemic, it can change overnight.

"The district remains committed to providing as much in-person learning as possible while keeping our students and staff as safe as possible," Superintendent Jason Harper wrote in an email sent to parents. "But with so much uncertainty due to the spread of COVID-19, keep in mind that the district may have to go to all remote learning for a variety of reasons. The Rochelle schools highly encourage each family to start working on a plan now for supervision and daycare in the event the districts move to all remote learning. This scenario is highly likely and we may not have much lead time to communicate the shift."

Creston man pleads guilty to child pornography charges Tuesday

Sentencing set for December in U.S. District Court

ROCKFORD — A Creston man pleaded guilty Tuesday before U.S. District Judge Philip G. Reinhard to charges of transportation of child pornography via the Internet and possession of child pornography.

Eric Canchola, 27, of Creston, admitted in a written plea agreement that on March 21, 2018, he used a computer to send a video file over the Internet to another KIK chat application user. The image depicted a prepubescent female child engaged in sexually explicit conduct. Canchola also admitted that on



May 8, 2018, he possessed two Ipods, a desktop computer, and two portable hard drives that each contained more than 600 images of children engaged in sexually explicit conduct.

Canchola faces a mandatory minimum of 5 years and a maximum sentence of 20 years' imprisonment for transporting child pornography, and a maximum of 20 years' imprisonment for possession of child pornography, as well as a term of supervised release following imprisonment of at least 5 years and up to life, and a fine of up to

\$250,000.

The actual sentence will be determined by the United States District Court, guided by the sentencing guidelines. Sentencing for Canchola is set for Dec. 11 at 9 a.m.

The guilty plea was announced by John R. Lausch, Jr., United States Attorney for the Northern District of Illinois, and Emmerson Buie, Jr., Special Agent-in-Charge of the Chicago 2 Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

The Ogle County Sheriff's Office assisted in the investigation.

The government is represented by Assistant U.S. Attorney Michael D. Love.

Curb, gutter improvements to continue through week of Aug. 17

ROCHELLE — The City has identified approximately 350 feet of deficient concrete gutter on the east side of the 600 block of North Sixth Street.

Concrete curb and gutter will be removed and replaced on the east side of the street starting at Sixth Avenue continuing north for approximately 350 feet to Seventh Avenue.

Construction is anticipated through the week of Aug. 17. Work will begin at 7 a.m. and will finish

around 3 p.m. weekdays. Anyone within the active work zone limits who parks cars in the driveway at night, please be sure to move it prior to the 7 a.m. start time. Parking will be only available on the west side of the street once construction has begun.

Work will include the removal and replacement of concrete curb and gutter and the installation of a stormwater inlet and drainage pipe.

At the conclusion of this project, the city will

restore all adjacent pavement and lawns as needed. Disturbed lawns will be repaired with topsoil and seed.

Advance warning, detour and other temporary traffic control devices will be posted near the affected area. Please use caution while traveling in this area and pay special attention to the advanced warning signage, road closed signage and other temporary traffic control devices within or in advance of the work zone.

While students and staff are inside the building, they will also be implementing many safety requirements and procedures. All students and staff will be required to wear facial coverings unless a medical condition dictates otherwise. Cloth and paper face coverings are permitted as well as plastic face shields for those who have medical concerns or are in the dual language program.

Anybody who chooses to wear a face shield must also maintain 6 feet of social distancing throughout the day. Students and staff will also have access to multiple hand

sanitizing and washing stations within their classroom and throughout the building.

Before students or staff re-enter the classroom, they will have the opportunity to wash or sanitize their hands. Weather permitting, students will also be given the opportunity to have outdoor breathers throughout the day.

Each grade level will have a designated time and location and will

remain socially distanced but will be permitted to remove facial covering at this time. Students will be required to put facial coverings back on before re-entering the building.

"In general, the classroom procedures and safety protocols will be the same across the district," Harper said. "Each school will have the same plan with minor exceptions due to building layout, staff and resources."

Guidelines discussed for middle school reopening

ROCHELLE – While the safety protocol and requirements are generally the same for all buildings in Rochelle Consolidated School District 231, Rochelle Middle School will have certain procedures that apply just to its building to ensure help ensure things run smooth and safely when reopening.

In order to help the flow of students and maintain proper distancing throughout the day, Rochelle Middle School has made changes to its regular school day schedule. The first students to arrive to school are students who will be receiving breakfast and they will arrive between 8 to 8:20 a.m.

Students that are dropped off by parents or guardians will enter through their own door that leads into the cafeteria and students who are dropped off by the bus will enter through a separate door and go to the cafeteria. Then, between 8 to 8:25 a.m. all other students will arrive to school and those being dropped off, arriving by bus and then those biking or walking will enter through their own sets of doors.

All students entering the building will also go through a screening process and once passed, go straight to their classroom through a designated hallway and stairs. Masks will be re-



quired as well as maintaining proper social distancing on their way to class.

Class schedule

All students will have an eight-period schedule, alternating days of the week. Each day, students will attend four classes and will attend the four other classes on the next day. Then on Friday, students will attend all eight classes with shortened periods.

"Essentially, half of our in-person students will have odd hour classes on Monday and half will have even hour classes on Monday, then it will rotate throughout the week," Rochelle Middle School Principal Jordan Young wrote in an email sent out to parents.

All students will remain in their first-hour classroom throughout the entire day and teachers will switch rooms to come to them. The school developed this model to allow to keep the safety of students and staff in the forefront and allow

students to attend school all five days of the week.

All students will be finished with school by 12:43 p.m. and will be let out in different groups to help maintain proper social distance. Students either walking or biking home will be dismissed at 12:30 p.m. followed by students getting rides, who will be dismissed at 12:35 p.m.

The last group of students to leave the building are those riding the bus, who will be let out at 12:43. The school knows this entire situation has and can change at any moment and thankful for the support from the parents.

"Allow me to thank you for your patience and understanding as we plan for the start of school," Young wrote. "As always, as we plan for this unique return to school we may need to amend or change some things to make it work better and we will communicate any of those changes with you."

Man accused in fatal fire appears in court via video

Duane Meyer accused of killing ex-wife, son in 2016 fire

OREGON — After months of no new court dates due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Byron man accused of killing his ex-wife and son in 2016 was back in court via video on Aug. 6.

Duane Meyer appeared on a video screen in the courtroom from the Ogle County Jail. His attorney, Christopher Derango, agreed to Assistant State's Attorney's Robert Schuman's request for more time to consider analysis from a cellphone expert and other data.

Judge John Roe set the next pre-trial status hearing for Monday, Sept. 21 at 2:30 p.m. at the Ogle County Courthouse.

Meyer is accused of setting the Oct. 19, 2016 fire in Byron that killed his ex-wife Maggie Meyer and 3-year-old son Amos Meyer.

He was charged on Oct. 9, 2019 with four counts of first-degree homicide, two counts of aggravated arson and one count of concealment of a homicidal death. He is currently being held in the Ogle County Jail on a \$10 million bond.

Meyer last appeared in court — in person — at a hearing on March 4.

Man charged with DUI after motorcycle crash on Aug. 3

On Aug. 3 at 9:17 p.m., deputies responded to Illinois Route 64 and Grandview for a single motorcycle crash. During the investigation, it was learned that Chad Chojnacki-Puffer, 25, of Sycamore, was traveling east on his 2014 Harley-Davidson when he failed to negotiate a curve causing him to lose control of the motorcycle and enter the south ditch. He sustained minor injuries and was transported to KSB Hospital by Oregon Fire. Chojnacki-Puffer was subsequently charged with driving under the influence of alcohol. He was released at KSB on an I-Bond and will appear in court on Sept. 9 at 9 a.m.

Deputies were assisted on scene by Oregon Fire. The crash remains under investigation.

On Aug. 3 at approximately 4:54 p.m., deputies responded to Illinois Route 64 east of Oregon for a report of a driver traveling in the center of the roadway. Deputies located the vehicle at Illinois Route 64 and German Church. After a short investigation, deputies arrested Bambi L. Blanco, 53, of Davis Junction, for driving under the influence of alcohol. Blanco was transported to the Ogle County Jail and held in lieu of bond.

On Aug. 4 at approximately 9:30 p.m., deputies conducted a traffic stop in

the 400 block of East Third Street in Leaf River. After an investigation, deputies arrested Jessica Davis, 30, of German Valley, for possession of a controlled substance and driving under the influence of alcohol. Davis was also issued a citation for improper lane usage. Davis was transported to the Ogle County Jail where she was released to correctional staff and held in lieu of bond.

On Aug. 5 the Ogle County Sheriff deputies arrested Juan Garcia, 43, of Rochelle, for no valid driver's license. Garcia was arrested by Ogle County Sheriff deputies on Illinois Route 251 near Bethel Road after being stopped

for speeding. Garcia was released on a I-bond and will appear in court at a later date.

On Aug. 5, the Ogle County Sheriff deputies arrested Kila Berry, 27, of Rockford, for driving while unlicensed. Berry was arrested by Ogle County Sheriff deputies on Illinois Route 251 near Hemstock Road after being stopped for speeding. Berry was released on an I-Bond and will appear in court at a later date.

Police investigating reports of stolen, burglarized vehicles

ROCHELLE — Multiple vehicles were reported stolen or broken into late Thursday night in Rochelle.

The Rochelle Police Department received reports of three vehicles broken into with items stolen or out of place due to intent to steal valuables. During the same night, two vehicles, a Kia and an unknown model pickup truck were reported stolen.

The Kia was recovered in Rockford and the Ogle County Sheriff's Department had a pursuit with the pickup on Interstate 39, but was unable to recover the vehicle. All of the incidents occurred around the same time and the vehicles were in the same proximity, so police believe they were all related incidents.

"Some of the victims said they knew their vehicles were okay at 9 p.m. and when they went out at 3 or 4 a.m. for work, they found them burglarized or missing," Rochelle Police

Chief Eric Higby said. "They were all within the Joanne Lane area and if you get a one block stretch with several incidents, it is most likely the same people doing it."

There are currently no suspects, but the police station has recovered surveillance video from multiple homes that were targeted that it will be reviewing. A small amount of cash and a purse were taken from one of the burglarized vehicles and a small amount of cash and some sunglasses were taken from another.

Nothing was taken from the third burglarized vehicle, but the door was left open and items were moved out of place. All of the stolen and burglarized vehicles were left unlocked during the night, so the Rochelle Police Department is reminding the community to lock their vehicles at night.

"If residents keep their vehicles locked, that goes a long way towards preventing this," Higby said. "Also, take the keys and valuables out of it so they are less likely to break in and cannot just drive off with the vehicle."

Bonnell challenged those present as he paraphrased a former President of the United States, "Ask not what your village can do for you. Ask what you can do for your village."



Curb and gutter work to begin in 1200 block of Westview Drive

ROCHELLE — The City of Rochelle has identified approximately 650 feet of deficient concrete gutter on the west side of the 1200 block of Westview Drive.

Concrete gutter will be removed and replaced on the west side of the street starting at 1261 Westview Drive continuing north for approximately 650 feet to 1207 Westview Drive.

Construction is anticipated to

begin Monday, Aug. 10 extending through the week of Aug. 17. Work will begin at 7 a.m. and will finish around 3 p.m. weekdays. If you are within the active work zone limits and park your car in the driveway at night, please be sure to move it prior to the 7 a.m. start time. Parking will be only available on the east side of the street once construction has begun.

Work will include the removal of

concrete gutter and replacement of a concrete curb and gutter combination. Due to the installation of a larger curb and gutter combination and narrow parkways, driveway approaches within this area will be removed and replaced as well.

At the conclusion of the curb and gutter work, the city will restore all adjacent pavement and lawns as needed. Disturbed lawns will be repaired with topsoil and seed.

13 Illinois counties at warning level for Coronavirus Disease

SPRINGFIELD — The Illinois Department of Public Health Friday reported 13 counties in Illinois are considered to be at a warning level for novel coronavirus disease (COVID-19). A county enters a warning level when two or more COVID-19 risk indicators that measure the amount of COVID-19 increase.

Thirteen counties are currently reported at a warning level — Cass, Coles, Grundy, Iroquois, Jackson, Monroe, Perry, Saline, St. Clair, Tazewell, Union, Williamson, Winnebago.

These counties saw cases or outbreaks associated with businesses, long-term care facilities, large social gatherings, and out of state travel. There have been several instances of multiple cases among family members in the same, large household. Students returning to universities and colleges are also driving the recent increase in cases in several communities. Many students are not wearing face coverings or social distancing and are gathering in large groups and at bars.

Several counties are taking swift action and implementing mitigation measures to help slow spread of the virus. Examples include working with university administrations for student education and contact tracing, working with

county boards of health, and cancelling events and festivals.

IDPH uses numerous indicators when determining if a county is experiencing stable COVID-19 activity, or if there are warning signs of increased COVID-19 risk in the county.

New cases per 100,000 people. If there are more than 50 new cases per 100,000 people in the county, this triggers a warning; Number of deaths. This metric indicates a warning when the weekly number of deaths increases more than 20 percent for two consecutive weeks; Weekly test positivity. This metric indicates a warning when the 7-day test positivity rate rises above 8 percent; ICU availability. If there are fewer than 20 percent of intensive care units available in the region, this triggers a warning; Weekly emergency department visits. This metric indicates a warning when the weekly percent of COVID-19-like-illness emergency department visits increase by more than 20 percent for two consecutive weeks; Weekly hospital admissions. A warning is triggered when the weekly number of hospital admissions for COVID-19-like-illness increases by more than 20 percent for two consecutive weeks; Tests performed. This metric is used to provide context and indicate if more testing is needed in the county; Clusters. This metric looks at the percent of COVID-19 cases associated with clusters or outbreaks and is used to understand large increase in cases.

Your pain has a purpose

HAVE you ever been hurt by someone? Have you been used, lied about, abused, cheated or deceived? Have you ever done a lot for someone and then, when you needed them, they didn't have any time for you?

Everyone experiences mistreatment of some kind, and forgiveness is not easy. But I've learned through personal experience that if you refuse to forgive, you are in for a miserable life.

For many years I hated my dad because he sexually abused me throughout my childhood. But all that did was make me bitter and hard to get along with. It didn't change him, and it certainly didn't do me any good.

When they were in their old age, God spoke to my heart and told me He wanted me to move them close to where my husband, Dave, and I lived and take care of them until they died. At first, I resisted this idea because there was nothing in me that wanted to see them, much less spend money on them and meet their needs.

I told Dave what I was thinking, and he said if God was telling me to do this,

we should do it. It wasn't what I wanted to hear, but he was right, so we moved them into a house near us and took care of them until they died.

It wasn't easy...but I can honestly say now that it is one of the greatest decisions I've ever made. God honored my obedience and gave me the grace to do the right thing, and before he passed away, my dad asked me to forgive him and he accepted Christ as his Savior.

The reward of forgiveness far outweighed the pain I had gone through for so many years.

The story of Joseph in Genesis chapters 37-50 is also an amazing example of what God can do in our lives when we choose to forgive. When he was 17 years old, his 11 brothers sold him to slave traders because they were jealous of him and hated him.

Joseph was taken to Egypt and bought by Potiphar, an officer of Pharaoh and captain of the guard. God gave him favor and Potiphar made Joseph overseer of his whole household (Genesis 39:5).

But when Potiphar's wife became angry because Joseph wouldn't go to bed with her, she lied, claiming he had tried to rape her, and Joseph was thrown in prison.

Genesis 39:21 (NIV) says, "The Lord was with [Joseph]; he showed him kindness and granted him favor in the eyes of the prison warden." Joseph was put in charge of all the prisoners because the Lord was with him and gave him success in whatever he did.

Eventually, God gave Joseph favor with Pharaoh, and he was promoted to a position second in command to Pharaoh only, ruling over the land of Egypt. Several years later, his brothers came to Egypt for food because of a terrible famine, and this was his chance to take revenge on them. But Joseph wasn't at all interested in vengeance.

When he revealed his identity to his brothers and saw that they were afraid he would harm them, Joseph told them, "You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good to accomplish what is now being done, the saving of many lives" (Gen.

50:20 NIV).

Joseph is a powerful example of how we can mature in our faith and character when we go through hard times. He chose to maintain his integrity with God no matter what it cost him personally, and the reward was far greater than the pain he had endured. As a result, he was able to fulfill God's plan for his life and help many people who would have died from famine.

God has a plan and a purpose for your life, too. No matter how badly you've been hurt, I want to encourage you to trust God's love for you and His ability to bring healing to your soul. Refuse to live an angry, bitter life because of the way someone has mistreated you, and instead, pray for them and love them, doing good to them as you have an opportunity to do so (Matt. 5:43-45).

Let God use your pain to develop the fruit of the Spirit in your soul (Galatians 5:22-23) and make you everything He has created you to be. As you do, others will see the love and goodness of God through your life and be drawn to Him.

U.S. doesn't do too well in recent survey

ONE thing I have done a lot of during this pandemic – besides eat, obviously – is read. I am always reading at least one book. I also read a couple of online magazines faithfully. I also daily read news from the Washington Post, New York Times, Wall Street Journal and even check out Forbes.

I sometimes read some interesting things, like a piece that was recently on the Forbes site. It was about the 35 best and worst places in the world to raise a family.

Now, any piece like this is going to look at certain data to reach a conclusion, and we can all argue over what the best data is to reach a certain conclusion. That is noted before I even start to read a piece like this.

But this one was pretty interesting, and the authors – after considering 30 statistics from international sources – landed on six. Those six were safety, happiness, cost, health, education and time.

Of the 35 countries on the list, Iceland came in at No. 1. Why is it the best place to raise a family? Well, it is the safest country in the world, and it ranks high when it comes to cost. It is also a world leader in human rights.

Not bad, Iceland. The rest of the Top 5 includes Norway, Sweden, Finland and Luxembourg.

At the bottom of the list is our neighbor to the south, Mexico. Poor Mexico, a country that is the most dangerous in the world, worst when it comes to health and education, and rates very low on the happiness scale.

In Mexico's defense, I think they have the best food in the world.

I am sure you are wondering where the U.S. ranked. I was too and as I eyed the list, I was surprised how low I had to go to find our country. In fact, it was just above Mexico at No. 34.

Yes, 34. OK, sure, this is just one study based on certain data, but 34? It is not a good showing. But when you look at the reasons why, it does ring true to a certain extent.

We have more homicides than any country other than Mexico. Our country also scores very low when it comes to human rights. That makes me pretty sad, but all we have to do is read the headlines.

Cost is also a big problem, with the U.S. placing last. One big thing that hurts us in that area is the cost of childcare. Anyone with kids knows this to be true. I remember when my kids got old enough to go to school and leave childcare. It was like getting the biggest raise ever.

In the U.S., parents with an average household income pay nearly 32 percent of their income on childcare. In Scandinavian countries, the same household

pays 4 percent to 10 percent. Huge difference.

Healthcare is also a problem. Did you know that American mothers are twice as likely to die in childbirth than mothers in Canada?

Time? We ranked poorly there too. We work longer hours with less vacation time. And no other country in the study gave zero paid maternity leave or zero paid vacation time.

Finally, we ranked low on the happiness scale. Mental illness rates here are high, as are suicide rates.

This one study does not paint a pretty picture but take it any way you want. I see a country that struggles daily and needs a lot of work. We also need better leaders with a goal of helping and lifting all Americans.

Ultimately, I do have hope. We are Americans, after all.

Rock River Valley Blood Center joins national call for plasma donors

ROCKFORD – The Rock River Valley Blood Center joins national leaders and America's Blood Centers in asking more individuals who have recovered from COVID-19 to donate plasma to help others affected by the virus.

The White House made an urgent plea for convalescent plasma during today's presidential press briefing. To be eligible to donate convalescent plasma, individuals must meet all regular blood donor requirements (be in general good health and weigh at least 110 pounds), be completely symptom-free for at least 14 days, and have a laboratory-confirmed test for COVID-19.

America's Blood Centers is the

national trade association for independent community blood centers. RRVBC and other members are responsible for nearly 60 percent of the nation's blood supply and have been at the forefront of convalescent plasma collections in the U.S. during the past four months (responsible for nearly 80 percent of convalescent plasma collection so far). To date, independent community blood centers (non-American Red Cross) have distributed more than 100,000 units of convalescent plasma to patients in need.

"There is an ongoing need for plasma and blood donations, as the COVID-19 pandemic continues to cause cancellations of mobile blood

drives and restrict access to places like schools and businesses," said Heidi Ognibene, director of operations for the Rock River Valley Blood Center. The Rock River Valley Blood Center has collected 106 units of convalescent plasma so far and is actively seeking recovered COVID-19 patients who had a positive nasal swab test and would be willing to donate. Those interested should call 815-965-8751 or visit rrvbc.org.

There is also a need for convalescent plasma donors to keep giving. These individuals can donate plasma every 28 days, which is more frequent than whole blood (every 56 days).

Illinois State Police announce further reduction in state forensic backlog

SPRINGFIELD—The release of the 2020 DNA Accountability Report this week documented a continued reduction in the Biology/DNA forensic backlog.

The continuing backlog reduction has been accomplished through a cooperative effort between Governor JB Pritzker's administration, the Illinois State Police (ISP) Division of Forensic Services (DFS), legislators, stakeholders in the criminal justice system, forensic science community and victim advocacy groups. (FY) 2020 submissions for Biology analysis are up by 9 percent from FY 2019, the FY 2020 Biology backlog is down by 30 percent from FY 2019. The Biology Section completed 47 percent more assignments in FY2020 than in FY2019. In an effort to ensure this forward progress continues, the ISP hired eight Biology Forensic Scientist Trainees. The trainees began training in March 2020 and have an anticipated release from the trainee program in early 2022. "With the Forensic Science Task Force rec-

ommendations, the ISP is making good on its promises to support victims through transformational change and hard work. I am so proud of our forensic scientists bringing closure to crime victims across the state," ISP Director Brendan F. Kelly said.

"This monumental effort started with a vision rooted in justice. Governor JB Pritzker's administration and the legislature have been committed to shoring up this increasingly important pillar of the overall justice system, and the work done by the front-line scientists of the Illinois State Police," Kelly continued, "But now is not the time to become complacent so we will continue to pursue

further reductions in the backlog."

Under DFS's guidance, implementation of the Task Force's recommendations to further reduce forensic testing backlogs has seen success. The below is a graphic representation of the progress in the implementation of those recommendations and a timeline with which changes to the ISP DFS are being made.

The mission of the ISP DFS is to deliver complete, accurate, and timely crime scene evidence collection and forensic analysis to every law enforcement agency within the state. With six laboratories and nearly 500 forensic services personnel, DFS completed more than 70,000 forensic assignments last year.





Shuffling the schedule

RTHS programs adjusting to new 2020-21 IHSA athletic calendar

ROCHELLE — The 2020-21 IHSA athletic calendar will have a much different look this coming school year, and Rochelle Township High School teams are making adjustments as some teams prepare to compete this fall and others are forced to wait until next spring or later.

The IHSA Board of Directors approved a four-season athletic schedule this past Wednesday that will begin with fall sports (boys and girls cross country, boys and girls golf, girls tennis and girls swimming and diving) on Aug. 10. The decision immediately followed Illinois Gov. J.B. Pritzker’s new guidelines for sports, which defined each of the four IHSA fall sports as low-risk sports.

Under the new state guidelines, sports are divided into three categories (low-risk, medium-risk and high-risk) and are allowed to compete at four levels. Low-risk sports can compete at Level 3, which includes confer-

ence meets, conference tournaments and state tournaments.

“I’m happy that our kids will have an opportunity to compete in the sports we’ll have this fall and participate in athletics this year,” RTHS athletic director Richard Harvey said. “We’re moving forward with what the IHSA has given us and we’re going to make the best of it.”

Fall sports will run from Aug. 10 through Oct. 24, with the winter sports season scheduled to begin Nov. 13 and end Feb. 13, 2021. RTHS programs slated to compete in the winter include wrestling, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls bowling, cheerleading and dance. Only bowling is defined as a low-risk sport, however, whereas basketball is considered medium-risk and cheerleading, dance and wrestling are considered high-risk sports by the state.

Medium-risk sports can only compete at Level 2 of the state guidelines, which permit team scrimmages with parental consent for minors and no competitive play. High-risk sports are

stuck at Level 1 of the state guidelines, which permit no-contact practices and training only. The state has not provided a timetable for how sports can progress through the four-level system.

“I’m hoping we can get to a point where we can conduct all of our winter sports,” Harvey said. “If we can’t start winter sports on time, they will be delayed, and if we can’t start after the delay,

the IHSA will attempt to move them. If they can’t be moved, they’ll have to be canceled.”

Perhaps the most notable change in the 2020-21 IHSA athletic calendar is the decision to move

traditional fall sports like football, boys soccer and girls volleyball to the spring season, which begins Feb. 15, 2021 and ends May 1, 2021.

Hub center Nantz ready to lead offensive line

Rising junior started all nine varsity games during 2019 season

SIZE mismatches and minimal varsity experience didn’t hold Rochelle Township High School center Brodie Nantz back from giving maximum effort on every play and becoming a leader on the offensive line this past season. After starting all nine games at the center position in 2019, Nantz will return as a rising junior next season looking to guide the Hubs back to the playoffs.

“I felt like I competed the best I could,” Nantz said. “Being only a sophomore, some of the opponents I faced were bigger and stronger than I was, but I believe I still competed with them. For next season, I’m working to be an All-Conference player, help our team win the conference and make a strong run in the playoffs. In order to get there, I’ll need to be in the weight room every day to get stronger, and I’ll need to study film to be prepared for our opponents.”

The Hubs finished the season with only eight seniors on their varsity roster, but that small number created opportunities for sophomore and junior players, including Nantz, to step up and prove they could compete at a higher level. Despite a 4-5 record in 2019, the Hubs persevered through several injuries to key players, and with a larger group of upperclassmen set to take the field next season, Nantz and his Rochelle teammates are ready to make a run.

“We were a very young team last season,” Nantz said. “We are a more experienced team this year and we have a lot of good leaders. Last year’s seniors were good role models who I feel helped this year’s team become more experienced and confident. We suffered a lot of injuries last year, but the next man always stepped up and played as if he was a starter all season. This year, I think we can get better at never giving up and staying together.”

The only sophomore to start on the offensive line

last season, Nantz overcame a significant leap from the freshman level to the varsity level. As he prepares for his second varsity go-

around, Nantz said his goals are to build up his leadership abilities and be a resource for his teammates.


“It was a big jump for

"We had our ups and downs throughout the season, but I thought we did the best we could," Lenkaitis said. "We have a lot of dedicated players on our team. I believe



Rochelle's Most Valuable Player and an Academic All-Conference honoree this past season, Lenkaitis will be an integral part of a varsity roster that will be looking to make significant strides after recording only 11 victories over the past two seasons. The IHSA approved an additional 20 contact days for winter, spring and summer programs to use in the fall from Sept. 7 through Oct. 31. Soccer and volleyball are listed as medium-risk sports, while football is considered a high-risk sport.

"The postponement is a reality of the climate we're currently living through and adjustments need to be made in the best interest of all kids in all sports," head football coach Kyle Kissack said. "We will continue to build workouts for our kids and hold them to the standard we always have. I'm so impressed with our group and how they've embraced the challenges in front of them. Our summer workouts were marked with great participation and attitudes."

"I'm happy that we will still be able to have a season," head volleyball coach Molly Sly said. "I'm

going to miss the first few days of practice where school hasn't started and all we have is volleyball. It's special to see the excitement the girls have in starting a new season and a new school year. It's always a great to start the school year and the athletic seasons. We still plan to hold open-gym workouts and scrimmages in December or possibly sooner if we are able."

Summer

Another significant move by the IHSA is the creation of a summer season spanning from May 3, 2021 through June 26, 2021. Sports such as baseball (low-risk), softball (low-risk), boys and girls track and field (low-risk), boys tennis (low-risk) and girls soccer (medium-risk) will be played during the summer, which spans only eight weeks and is the shortest of the four seasons.

"We're definitely going to have to do more

work in the offseason to prepare for a shorter season," head girls track coach Alison Vrana said. "We won't have an indoor season to prepare and I'm worried that a shortened competitive schedule will have a domino effect on the preparation of our athletes, particularly in technical events like jumps and throws. I'm also disappointed that track and field only gets eight weeks to compete... It's unfair."

"I think the IHSA did the best it could with the circumstances," head baseball coach Jarrod Reynolds said. "Hopefully the kids will be able to participate in all the sports they normally play. I hope there aren't any conflicts with travel baseball, and I think we will be OK here locally. The weather should be nicer from a baseball perspective, so that should be a plus for us."

With Rochelle schools and many schools around

the state moving toward hybrid learning models, combining in-person learning with remote learning, the IHSA ruled that remote learning wouldn't prevent student-athletes from competing in sports this coming school year. The IHSA also ruled that decisions regarding state tournaments will be made on a sport-by-sport basis. No decisions on activities such as bass fishing, chess, debate, drama and group interpretation, individual events, journalism, music and scholastic bowl have been made.

RTHS student-athletes seeking to participate in athletics this coming school year must sign a waiver or have a parent or guardian sign a waiver and have the waiver submitted to a coach or the athletic department. 2020 season canceled due to pandemic

Program optimistic for Fall 2021 season

ROCHELLE — There won't be youth football played in the Hub City this fall after Rochelle Junior Tackle board members announced the cancellation of the 2020 season on the organization's Facebook page Sunday evening.

The decision comes after the Illinois High School Association approved its modified 2020-21 athletic schedule, which moved football to the spring season beginning Feb. 15, 2021, during its board meeting this past Wednesday. Rochelle Junior Tackle board members cited the shared facilities with many high school programs in the area as a factor in the decision to cancel.

"The Big 14 Conference met this evening to discuss the IHSA's change in sports scheduling and the impact on our season," Rochelle Junior Tackle wrote on its Facebook page. "After discussion and voting, we will not be moving our schedule to the spring and our 2020 season is officially canceled. While we know this is not the outcome many

had hoped for, the spring season scheduling wouldn't have been ideal and some of our conference teams share facilities with their local high school programs who will need to try to keep their fields in the best shape they can for their season."

The cancellation will impact all Rochelle Junior Tackle programs including tackle football, flag football, cheerleading and dance. Board members wrote Sunday that Rochelle Junior Tackle will be processing refunds for all registered participants. Board members are optimistic that regularly scheduled activities will resume in the fall of 2021.

Illinois Gov. J.B. Pritzker released guidelines for youth sports earlier this month, with football categorized as a high-risk sport. Under the new state guidelines, high-risk sports such as football can only conduct no-contact practices. Prior to the publication of the new state guidelines, Rochelle Junior Tackle had planned to align its season with the IHSA football season.




