End of the line

City completes \$7 million Rochelle Railroad expansion project

ROCHELLE—The City of Rochelle recently completed its three-part, \$7 million Rochelle Railroad expansion project.

The project consisted of building the new Rochelle Trans Loading Center, a four-track wide bridge with an adjacent detention pond, and expanding the old track to create new unit change interchange tracks. Construction on the project began in August 2018 and was expected to take nine months, but due to an excess amount of rain last spring and an early winter, the project took about two years.

The railroad system serves many industrial businesses and was in need of expansion since it had reached its capacity. The railroad is one of the main driving forces behind economic development in the community

and the city hopes the new expansion will attract even more businesses to Rochelle.

“The City of Rochelle railroad is an economic development engine,” economic development director Jason Anderson said. “It drives industrial development because of the many benefits of having easy access to two class one railroads. And what the city of Rochelle has uniquely done is being able to create its own railroad and from that, attract industry that creates jobs, tax base, and customers for RMU.”

When train cars are loaded at the Rochelle Trans Loading Center, they then connect to either the Union Pacific Railroad or the Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railroad to reach their final destination. Having access to two Class 1 railroads doubles the amount of business the city is able to serve.

Restarting Rochelle

Grants help businesses affected by COVID

ROCHELLE — Through its Restart Rochelle grant program, the City of Rochelle recently distributed approximately \$200,000 to local small businesses affected by the COVID-19 shutdown.

Each business applied for up to \$5,000 through the grant program. The funds could be used to pay rent, mortgage, insurance, utilities or anything to help make ends meet caused by the COVID-19 shutdown. Approximately \$160,000 of the funds came from community development dollars when the city sold its transmission lines and the other approximate \$40,000 came from enterprise zone funds.

Since not every business that applied asked for the full amount of \$5,000 the city was able to approve 41 business's requests through the program. The funds were donated to the busi-

nesses so they do not need to be paid back, the city just asks for a receipt as proof of what the funds were used toward.

“We hand delivered most of the checks and they were very well received by the businesses,” community development director Michelle Pease said. “One of the business owners was so grateful he was brought to tears, saying that this will help him get through the storm.”

COVID-19 closures and restrictions have placed a strain on many businesses both in Rochelle and around the country. The City of Rochelle is very thankful to have the resources to offer programs such as the Restart Rochelle grant program to its businesses.

“The city is just so blessed to be able to help out our small businesses,” Pease said. “We are so lucky to have the resources as well as a mayor and council that is so supportive.”

Auction underway

Online bidding open for Hickory Grove contents

ROCHELLE — As the City of Rochelle moves forward with its plan to demolish the Hickory Grove Banquet Hall paving the way for a new developer, Bearrow's Real Estate and Auction Company is auctioning off many of the buildings contents.

Due to COVID-19 restrictions, the auction is being held online from July 30 until Aug. 20 at 9 p.m. The auction can be reached by visiting www.bearrows.com and clicking on the Hibid link or by going directly to www.bearrows.hibid.com

Once on the website, individuals can look through multiple pages of items, bid on them and even keep track of specific items by putting them on a watch list. There are many different items for sale ranging from Rochelle memorabilia, banquet hall furniture, kitchen items and much more.

“There is everything from framed memorabilia of original buildings in Rochelle as well as memorabilia of John W. Tilton who was the original developer of the building,” Rochelle mayor and owner of Bearrows Auction Company John Bearrows said. “There are also many banquet and kitchen items such as tables, stackable chairs, grills and walk-in coolers and freezers. There is



truly something for everybody.”

The main goal of the auction is to clear out the inside of the building as well as raise funds for the future project. All of the funds raised through the auction will be put toward the demolition or other expenses related to the project.

The city is currently working on securing an Illinois Rebuild grant to help fund the project. If the city is able to secure the grant, demolition of the Hickory Grove building will begin next spring; if the grant is not secured, the demolition project will begin this fall.

“The goal is to get the building built and raised to provide a shovel ready site for a new developer to come into town,” Bearrows said. “Having a new business develop in town will also help bring new jobs with it.”

The online auction is live through Aug. 20.

“We just encourage local folks to participate in this auction to gain a piece or two of memorabilia as well as help fund the future development project,” Bearrows said.

LIHEAP heating assistance program available

ROCK FALLS — Tri-County Opportunities Council's Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) may be able to help with a one-time payment toward your utility bills.

LIHEAP will be available to all households.

There will be no priority periods. Households in need of energy assistance, especially those with disconnection notices, high past due balances and the general population that has been most likely affected by wage fluctuations due to COVID-19 are

encouraged to apply. In addition, propane customers are strongly encouraged to apply in August when fuel prices are at their lowest.

Open enrollment for the PIPP program began July 27. Applications will be taken on a first-come, first-serve basis until March 31, 2021 or until funds are exhausted.

To receive assistance a household must be within the income guidelines and provide the following information: copies of social security cards for every member in the household, 30-day income for every household member 18 years of age or older, a current complete gas and electric bill and Medicaid card for any household member that may receive one. Additional information may be requested at the time of application.

Walk-in applications will not be taken. Applications will be taken "in-person" by appointment only at all satellite offices or remotely through various means such as mail, fax, email, etc. The Rock Falls office is accepting appointments Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Contact the Rock Falls office at 815-625-7830 or 1-800-323-5434 to make an appointment or visit our website at www.tcohelps.org for locations and dates/times for LIHEAP applications at the agency's satellite offices.

LIHEAP applications will be taken through June 30, 2021 or until funds are exhausted. The gross income eligibility has increased to 200 percent of the federal poverty level, and for the 30 days prior to the application date cannot exceed the following: 1 person household, \$2,127; 2 person household, \$2,873; 3 person household, \$3,620; 4 person household, \$4,367; 5 person household, \$5,113; 6 person household, \$5,860.

Celebrating Norm Skare

ROCHELLE – The Flagg Township Museum held an event at Skare Park last weekend to celebrate Norm Skare's birthday month as well as recognize all that he did for the community during his lifetime.

The event took place on Sunday, July 26 from 1 to 3 p.m. at the homestead museum located at Skare Park in Rochelle.

The event included cake and ice cream, a short program on the history of Norm Skare and the park, as well the museum donating a handmade bat house to the park district.

"It was very hot out that day but we were very pleasantly surprised with the turnout from the community," Flagg Township museum director Jan Devore said. "Between 15 to 20 people showed up including Julie Hanson, who is the grandniece of Skare himself. She also brought along her scrapbook with many unseen pictures of the original farm and that was very cool to see."

Skare lived in Rochelle from July 22, 1904 until he passed away on April 22, 1988 and was

very influential during his time in the community. Skare owned land and would let all the local kids come onto it to play in the creek or run around the timber.

He was also known for

producing fresh honey and cider as well as conserving the natural beauty of the land. In July of 1972, Skare donated a portion of his land to the Rochelle park district which is now known as

Skare Park.

"He donated 38 acres of land joining the park district property," Devore said. "What that did was save the land from being sold and developed into housing or

businesses."

The museum is very happy to host events for the community once again and is planning a preview of the museum's history trunks event on Sunday, Aug. 2 and Aug.

30 at the museum. The museum is also recognizing the 19th amendment on Aug. 16 with a new exhibit on display and is encouraging community members to attend.

"The 19th amendment exhibit will be up before Aug. 16, but we are having a reception with refreshments on that day," Devore said. "We also spoke to the Daughters of the American Revolution and it is hoping to interest its members to attend the event at suffragettes taking to the streets."

Are guilt and shame stealing your joy in life?

ARE you bugged by a guilty conscience...carrying around baggage from a certain mistake or decision that produces feelings of regret or even self-loathing?

We've all said or done things that we wish we could take back. And while it's completely natural to grieve over a bad decision or mistake you have made, it is not God's plan for you to live with guilt and condemnation. Jesus came to set you free from that kind of life (see John 3:16-17; Romans 8:1).

As believers in Christ, God forgives our sins completely. Psalm 103:12 says, "As far as the east is from the west, so far does he remove our transgressions from us" (ESV). That's how amazing God's love is! And when you trust God's promise of forgiveness, any burden of guilt that you have will be lifted from your shoulders.

I had a terrible problem with guilt for many years of my life. I grew up in an angry, unstable, abusive atmosphere, which caused me to become a negative, angry, judgmental adult who didn't like myself or anybody else for that matter. As a result, I often behaved in ways that I regretted later, especially in

my relationships.

Through the years, guilt became so ingrained in me that I just didn't feel right if I didn't feel wrong. And I carried those negative feelings with me right into the early years of my ministry.

For example, whenever I went to God in prayer, I would automatically focus on two things—my problems and my mistakes.

I'll never forget the morning God spoke to my heart and said, "Joyce, are you going to spend time with Me today or are you going to keep focusing on your sins?" At that moment, I realized God wasn't mad at me; He loved me. And He was encouraging me to drop the dead weight of my guilt.

Many people struggle with guilt because they think God expects more of them than what they can deliver. Some people even think He expects perfection, but that couldn't be further from the truth.

God's Word says in Romans 3:23, "All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." The Bible also says that "where sin increased, grace abounded all the more"

(Romans 5:20). This verse isn't saying you should live a sloppy life and sin as much as you want; it means when you fall short of perfection in any area of your life, you will always have another chance to get back up, brush yourself off and try again with God's help.

The apostle Paul explains what God requires of us in Philippians 3:12-14, which says, "Not that I have already obtained [righteousness] or am already perfect, but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own.

Brothers, I do not consider that I have made it my own. But one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus."

God simply expects us to grow, and we can't do that if we're stuck in guilt. In Christ, we can forget about what lies behind us—the things we cannot change—and press on, doing our best in the present moment.

One thing that has helped me get over my guilt trips (which I used to take on a

daily basis) is realizing they are totally, completely useless, and they didn't help me behave any better. Actually, all they did was make me act worse.

The truth is the only way to make progress is to let go of what lies behind.

We will never be perfect in this life and God knows that. He is full of mercy and He doesn't want you to get up each day and worry about what you did yesterday or what you might do wrong today. God wants you to trust His love for you and receive His forgiveness so you can move forward, completely guilt free.

Jesus said, "...Ask, and you will receive, that your joy may be full" (John 16:24).

When you ask God for His forgiveness, don't just stop there. Take a moment and receive His forgiveness. Say out loud, "God, I receive Your forgiveness. Thank You for giving me a fresh start. Because of what You have done for me, I am filled with joy."

You don't have to waste any more time focusing on your mistakes and weaknesses. Spend time with God and learn from His Word. And remember, God loves you and He is always cheering you on to victory.

I was shopping around 4 p.m. on Wednesday, July 22 at Aldi in Rochelle.

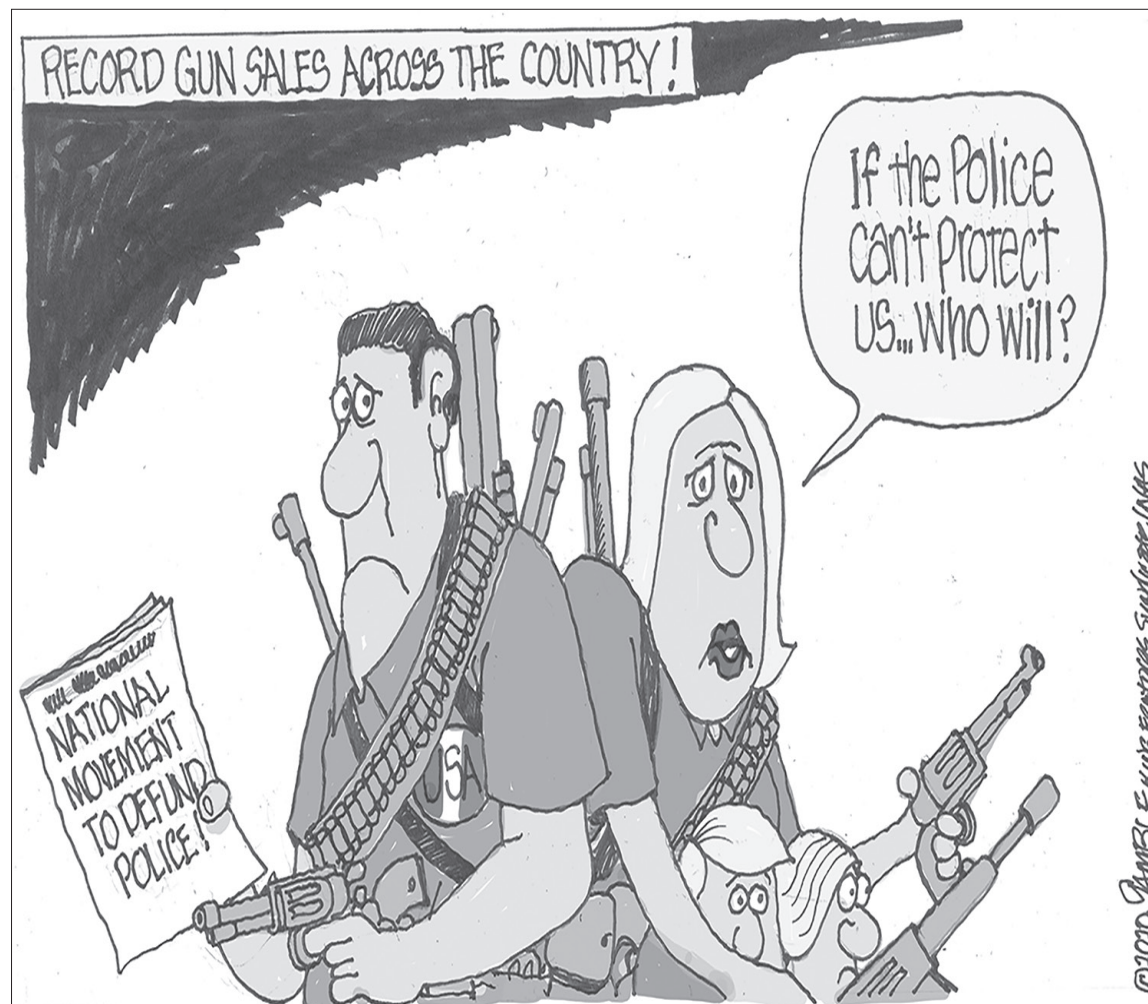
When I went to check out there were a couple of

Regional health department express concern as first county in region is at warning for COVID-19

OGLE COUNTY – For the first time since Illinois entered phase 4 of the Restore Illinois Plan, a county in the Northern Illinois Rockford Region is at the warning level for coronavirus disease (COVID-19). The Illinois Department of Public Health announced Jo Daviess County is considered to be at a warning level for COVID-19 Friday. This increase in community spread of COVID-19 is associated with travel to hotspots including neighboring Iowa and larger social gatherings.

The health departments in the Northern Illinois Rockford Region express concern that the spread of COVID-19 will continue to increase in communities

throughout the region and will require additional strategies to protect the public’s health. The public is urged to take steps to protect our communities and reduce the need to adhere to stricter guidance.

The public can do their part to protect their community by consistently taking the following actions:

WEAR A FACE MASK: Cover your mouth and nose with a cloth covering

WATCH YOUR DISTANCE: Keep at least 6 feet apart from others

WASH YOUR HANDS: Wash your hands regularly with soap and water for 20 seconds

The public can reduce the risk of becoming COVID-19 positive by leaving a place where guidelines are not being followed, people are not masking or social distancing, or the gathering is too large. Together, we can move beyond this pandemic.





Ogle 4-H livestock judging team participates in online state contest

OGLE COUNTY — The Illinois State 4-H Livestock Judging contest looked a little different this year as the Stock Pavilion sat idle. Meanwhile county teams and individuals participated from home using the livestockjudging.com website, which hosted this year's event. The format remained the same regarding Senior and Junior divisions, questions, and oral reasons that participants filmed themselves and uploaded to the platform. It was a first for many of us and I'm sure most of us will be eager to get back to evaluating live animals up close and face to face next year.

Two Ogle County 4-H members competed in the State 4-H Livestock Judging Contest held online this year.

The Junior Livestock Team included Kade Boatman and Kendall Boatman; By—Y-Badgers 4-H Club of Byron. Kade placed 8th overall in the contest and Kendall placed 16th overall.

The State 4-H Livestock Judging Contest is the premier event of education

and competition for youth involved in livestock evaluation programs. Senior participants will get a chance to try out for the State 4-H Team later in the summer. The Illinois State 4-H Livestock Judging Team will represent Illinois 4-H at the National 4-H Livestock Judging Contest at the North American International Livestock Exposition in Louisville, Kentucky, in November.

Livestock judging is more than just selecting what animal looks best in the ring. In livestock judging, youth must rank four animals from best to worst based on their physical traits, such as bone structure and mobility; their performance data, such as growth rate or calving ease; and their potential profitability. Their ranking is compared to the official placing to determine part of their score.

In addition, youth must remember specific characteristics of each animal presented and respond to random questions about each animal, such as which was the bolder-ribbed, stouter-made heifer.

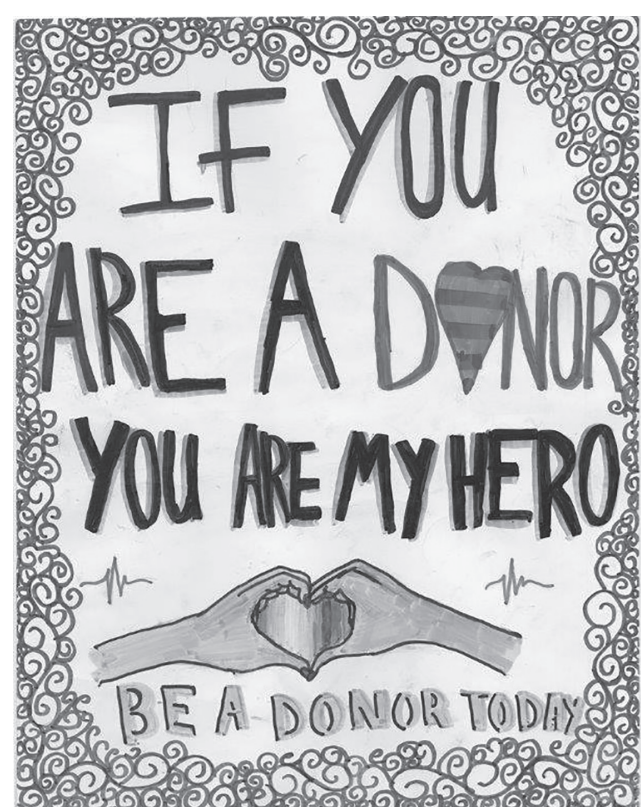
Jesse White honors organ/tissue donor poster contest winners

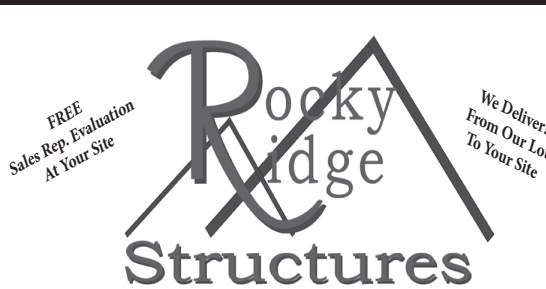

This also helps provide leverage to businesses who use the railroad over the railroad companies because it forces the railroads to place bids rather than choosing a set price. In addition to the railroads and loading center, Rochelle also has the resources businesses are looking for when choosing a new location. “When it comes to economic development, a community needs to have every utility that is needed for a business,” Anderson said. “You may have an abundance of water and that is great, but do you have the sewer treatment or enough power to support it. A community needs to have it all and Rochelle has all of the infrastructure in place to attract new businesses and industries.”

In addition to the Trans Loading Center, the city built a new four-track-wide bridge and extended the old railroad by laying three new tracks, each 3,300 linear feet in length. This extension provides the Rochelle Railroad with additional space that is currently used for storage, but will

eventually be utilized by new businesses.

These tracks were built with the end goal of extending the railroad to Elva Road in Steward and eventually looping it back around. When building the bridge and unit change interchange track, a 3,300-by-160-foot detention pond also had to be dug to prevent flooding. New drainage tiles also had to be placed under the farmers field next to the pond.

“Whenever we do a big industrial project like this, we always look at the impact it will have on the environment,” Anderson said. “When laying the tiles under the farmers field, they actually made the land more rich and valuable, so it

was a win-win situation for both of us.”

The City of Rochelle

is currently working on more economic development projects around

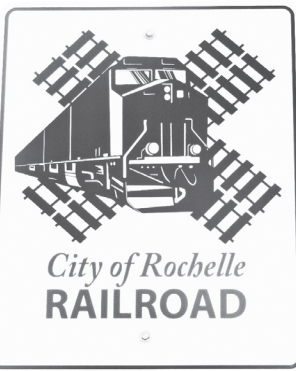
town and more details will be released in the coming future.

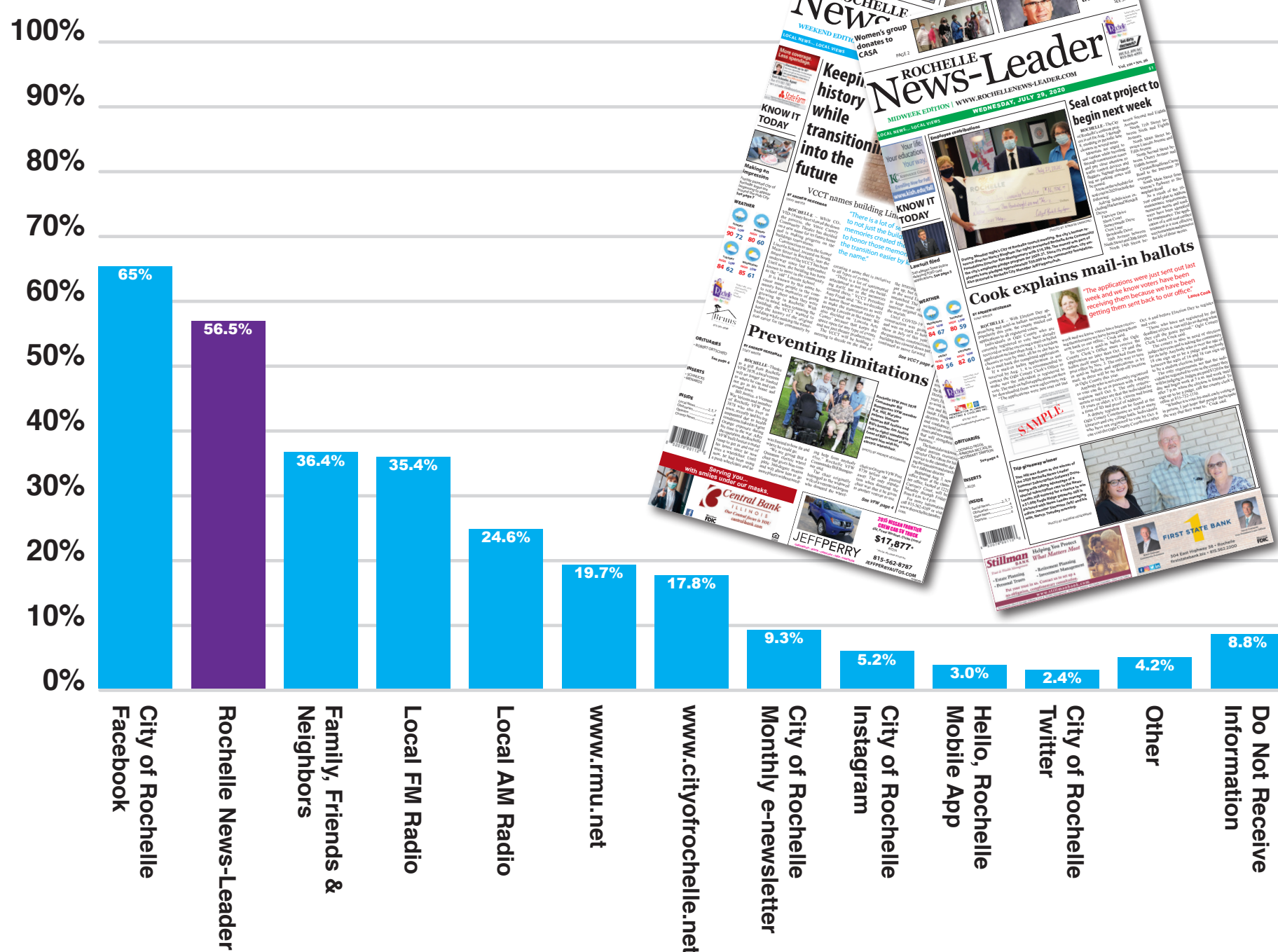

RTHS Cross Country

Pushing to the finish

Rising senior Seldal emerging as top runner for Hubs

AIDEN Seldal didn't lace up for the Rochelle Township High School cross country team until he was a sophomore, but he's made significant strides over his last two years with the Hubs. Now a rising senior, Seldal will return for his third cross country season this fall, and he'll be an early candidate to step up and fill a leadership role as Rochelle's top varsity runner.

A two-sport athlete who also competes with the track and field team, Seldal averaged times in the 20-to-21-minute range toward the beginning of his sophomore season in 2018. Those times improved dramatically as the fall progressed, however, with Seldal running a season-best 19:07.2 in the IHSA 2A Belvidere North Regional. Additionally, Seldal finished in the 19-minute range over three of his final four cross

country meets during his sophomore season.

Seldal continued to get stronger in 2019, finishing in the 19-minute range three times and entering the 18-minute threshold four times. For the second straight season, Seldal ran his best race in late October, setting a personal-best time of 18:07.6 at the IHSA 2A Sterling Regional.

"My junior year was my best year in cross country, even though it was only my second year on the team," Seldal said. "I thought I finished my races very well and I pushed myself much harder at the end

of each race. I think I can improve on setting a better pace during the middle of my races... My goal for my senior year is to break my personal record from last year. It will take a lot of running to get there, but I want to finish my senior year strong."

Seldal will be a key varsity runner returning from a 2019 roster that graduated several seniors including Santi Cordoba and Tucker Louis, who held personal records in the 17-minute range. The Hubs will look to build on strong team performances such as their second-place finish at the Byron Invite

and their fourth-place finish in the Genoa-Kingston Matt Walter Invite.

"I thought we had a great team last year," Seldal said. "Our team was mostly seniors, so we're losing a lot of our top runners, but we have a lot of potentially good runners coming back. I have a lot of hope that we can be just as good, if not better than we were last year. Our team has a very strong bond and we like to make jokes and have fun with each other during practice. I think we can improve on taking practices more seriously this year."

An Academic All-Conference honoree this past season, Warborg provided backcourt depth for a Rochelle squad that won 20 games and reached the IHSA 3A Regional Finals. While the Hubs fell a few points short of their regional title aspira-

tions, Warborg said and his teammates are laser-focused and ready to grind every day to bring home a regional championship next season.

"We were one of the toughest teams in the area as the season went along," Warborg said. "We came up one game short, but we made a great run and I'm proud of what we accomplished. It was an unforgettable season, and our goal is to make it back to the regional championship game next year. Losing the championship game really hurt, and we're using that loss as fuel for next season. We want to get back to that game and bring a regional championship home."

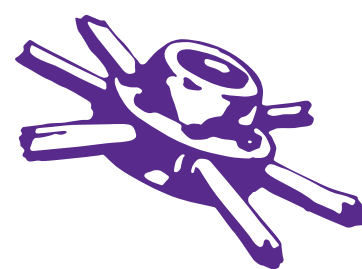

Larsen looking to expand role with Hubs

CRUE Larsen has spent countless hours watching film and building strength in the weight room to prepare for his senior season with the Rochelle football team. Although Larsen didn't see the field much in his first varsity season, the two-way player and special teams contributor is more motivated than ever to rise up and make a greater impact for the Hubs next season.

An Academic All-Conference honoree this past season, Larsen worked on special teams while filling a reserve role in both the offensive and defensive backfields. With a full varsity season under his belt, Larsen will return next season vying for starting reps at the safety position, where the Hubs are looking to replace graduating senior and All-Conference honoree Ethan Etes.

"I learned the defense and the coverages fairly well last season," Larsen said. "This season, I want to not only focus on learning my position, but the responsibilities of my teammates so I can ensure that everyone knows what they need to do on each play. I hope to be more of a leader on the defense, as the safety needs to be, and have everyone trust that I can make the right calls. I hope to be a crucial part of the team's success on the defensive side of the ball."

Larsen will also be competing for starting reps at the wingback position, one of three starting positions in the offensive backfield. The Hubs graduated four ball-carriers from their 2019 roster including All-Conference First-Team fullback Gavin Ansteth as well as Austin Greifenkamp, Keegan Davis-Carter and Nick Albers. Larsen said he's striving to improve his speed, agility, strength and blocking abilities in preparation for his senior season.

"I hope to be a crucial part of the team's success on the offensive side of the ball," Larsen said. "In order for me to be successful, I'm going to need to be extra focused during practice and I'll need to study film and plays on my own time to master my position on both sides of the ball. I hope to continue making great strides in the weight room to improve my abilities on the field."

The Hubs fielded one of its smallest senior classes in recent history this past

season, but that won't be the case this time around. After a 4-5 finish to their 2019 campaign, Larsen and his teammates are returning with more confidence and experience, and the Hubs will look to rally around a new senior class that has stuck together since Rochelle Junior Tackle in fifth grade.

"We performed well in some of our games last season, but there were other games where we made some major mistakes that cost us," Larsen said. "We fully expect to participate in the playoffs this year and I have confidence that we can make a run in the playoffs if everything falls into place... This year, we will be much more focused on preparing for our matchup each week and ensuring that each player knows his job and executes on offense and defense."

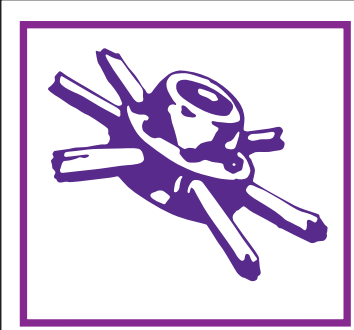

Illinois High School Association

Board of Directors approves modified 2020-21 schedule

Fall sports slated to begin Aug. 10

THE Illinois High School Association (IHSA) Board of Directors met for a special meeting on July 29, 2020, where the board announced its intended plans for the 2020-21 school year. The plan has been sent to the Illinois Department of Health (IDPH) for final approval. "This plan, like nearly every aspect of our current lives, remains fluid," said IHSA executive director Craig Anderson. "Changes may come, and if they do, we will be agile while putting safety and students first. It was important that we provide a framework today for our student-athletes, coaches, administrators, and officials to begin preparing for the 2020-21 school year." The COVID-19 pandemic led the board to propose unprecedented scheduling changes for the 2020-21 school year. They include playing all sports over the course of truncated fall, winter, spring and summer seasons. As a result, several team sports will shift to new seasons, including football, boys soccer, and girls volleyball moving from the fall to the spring.

"I applaud our Board of Directors for choosing a model that allows every student-athlete the opportunity for a modified season," said Anderson. "Based on our recent conversations, it is our expectation that today's plan meets all of

IDPH's safety guidelines and will be approved." IHSA boys and girls golf, girls tennis, cross country and girls swimming & diving will remain as fall sports, and can proceed to start on Aug. 10 as scheduled. Per Governor J.B. Pritzker's announcement on Wednesday, fall sports will begin with competition limited to conference opponents and other schools in the same general geographical area.

Schools will be provided more details in the coming week about the scheduling limits, and scheduling will continue to be assessed throughout each season. The condensed 2020-21 season dates will be as follows: Fall (Aug. 10 through Oct. 24), winter (Nov. 16 through Feb. 13), spring (Feb. 15 through May 1) and summer (May 3 through June 26).

"The Board believes this plan offers the most realistic chance for student-athletes to participate in interscholastic sports while balancing the challenges of a new academic setting and IDPH Guidelines," said Erie High School Principal and IHSA Board President Tim McConnell. "We are an education-based athletic association, and school has to come first. By delaying the majority of the team sports in the fall, it will allow our schools and students the chance to acclimate to what will be, for many, a totally



new educational experience. We will do our best to try to give every student-athlete the opportunity for a season this school year."

State Series

State Series tournament decisions will be made on a sport-by-sport basis as each season progresses, but providing postseason opportunities remains a priority of the Board. This could potentially include culminating State Series tournaments after regional or sectional rounds, or seeking other non-traditional means to conduct events.

"I understand that today's announcement will be met with mixed emotions," said Anderson. "Our staff and board have heard from thousands of people over the past few weeks with ideas, opinions, and proposals on how we should proceed. We respect and understand their passion, because we share in it. It is a great reminder that if we want high school sports to return to normal, we all need to do our part to help stop the spread of COVID-19."

The board also extended the current Phase 4 Return To Play Guidelines, which will allow sports slated to

be played in the winter, spring and summer seasons to allow an additional 20 days of contact for schools between Sept. 7 and Oct. 31 following IDPH Phase 4 Guidelines. The board also verified that IHSA by-laws do not prevent schools who are conducting remote learning from participating in IHSA sports and activities. Participation will remain a local school and district decision, regardless of the learning plan a high school is utilizing.

The Board discussed IHSA activities for the 2020-21 school year but did not take any action. The IHSA's activity offerings include bass fishing, chess, debate, drama and group interpretation, individual events, journalism, music and scholastic bowl.

"We believe we can still offer many of our activities via virtual contests," said Anderson. "The Board has asked our staff to investigate those possibilities, and we will report back soon on if and how each can be held."

Further details on items such as sport season and practice limitations will be released to IHSA schools following IDPH approval of the plan.

"Juney Barnett brings a vast amount of experience in sports performance at the highest levels of competition," said NIU associate athletic director for sports performance Zach Cahill. "His best quality is his ability to be a positive influence and mentor to all of our student-athletes at NIU. We're excited to have him on the NIU sports performance staff."

Barnett returns to DeKalb where he served as assistant director of sports performance starting in February 2019 before joining the Strength and Conditioning staff at Army West Point this past January. He has a wealth of National Football League experience as he was the Assistant Strength and Conditioning Coach for the Baltimore Ravens from 2012-19 at the same time NIU head football coach Thomas Hammock was the Ravens' running backs coach.

"We are very fortunate to add Juney to our staff with his credentials and level of expertise," Hammock said. "I have worked with him for the past six years and seen



firsthand his ability to motivate, develop and get the best out of players in the areas of strength and development. Our team will benefit greatly from his influence and I expect our team to become bigger, faster and stronger under his guidance."

Barnett also worked for the Ravens from 2003-05 when he also was the head strength and conditioning coach of the Rhein Fire in NFL Europe. He joined the Minnesota Vikings strength and conditioning staff in 2006 and spent six seasons there. His collegiate experience also includes stints at Drexel University and the University of Kansas.

"I'm thankful for the opportunity to truly grateful to work with such a great group of young men," said Barnett. "Our ultimate goal is not to just train our student-athletes to be successful on the field, but to be successful in life which includes building a better person each and every day to be ready for any obstacle the world may throw their way."

Brewing up a new business

Ogle County Brewery to open this fall in Oregon

RIGHT now, it is a dusty construction site.

But when completed, the building on the corner of Washington Street and IL Route 2 in Oregon will be home to the city's first microbrewery.

Joshua Skinner and Brian Wynn, owners of the new Ogle County Brewery, plan to open this fall.

"We really want to bring an authentic beer taste back to the craft brewing," said Skinner, who is from Byron.

The two friends have been wanting to find something "fun" to do together in their spare time. And as they both enjoy brewing beer, Wynn's suggestion of a brewery made sense. So, the two went to the Oregon City Council and Mayor Ken Williams to discuss constructing a new building for the brewery. Skinner said Williams suggested the building at 400 W. Washington

St.

"We walked in here ... and just kind of fell in love with the building," said Skinner, who owns a construction company in Florida and resurfacing companies in Illinois.

It was built in 1881 and is owned by Mark Gale and Kevin Wiegmann. Skinner said they struck a deal and got to work. He said they plan to keep as much of the history of the building as they can and will feature old photos of the property in the brewery when it is complete.

The roughly 3,600 feet upstairs will include all of the brewing equipment as well as a bar where patrons can order a variety of beers and other drinks. Skinner said there will be, "some version of food," but it has not yet been determined exactly what that will be.

There will be televisions for sports and table games also available upstairs, along with a separate room for gambling

machines.

Downstairs will be a gaming room with dart boards, arcade games and even bags, Skinner said. That space also has 12-foot ceilings.

But the core of the business, of course, will be the beer.

"We really want to bring an authentic beer taste back to the craft brewing," Skinner said.

That means keeping the focus on just that — taste.

"What we really want to do is just re-

ally good, authentic, Bavarian/German style beers," said Wynn, a financial professional who lives in Chana.

"We don't have to get fancy with all kinds of flavors," he said.

"We can do that; that's actually easy. That's

a good way to mask things. But we're just beer fans."

Skinner promised that their lager will be very special.

"We have a secret that we're not going to unveil until we open," he said. "The lagers we have here will be better than anywhere in the state."

Both stressed that the City of Oregon has been great to work with.

"They've been extraordinarily helpful and willing to help us with advice and helping us with a lot of the logistics of getting things done," Wynn said.

He added that they hope to bring a new clientele to Oregon, something that will benefit all of the other businesses in town.

"We love the direction the mayor and city council are taking the city, so we want to add to it," Skinner said. "We wanted to bring a business here that would attract people to come in. Not just come in, maybe stay."
