

Ciaccio gives 'props' to uncle for sparking interest that leads to lifelong career, passion

AN American Airlines pilot with ties to Rochelle recently shared his love for aviation, his personal experiences from a lifetime of flying and his first-hand experience in how COVID-19 has changed the airline industry.

Mike Ciaccio was born in Rockford. He moved to Rochelle when he was in kindergarten and graduated from Rochelle Township High School in 1977. During high school, Ciaccio's uncle, Dale Meyers, took him on his first flight and he instantly fell in love.

"It was a flight from Rockford to Iowa and back and the second we began rolling down the runway, I knew that was what I wanted to do," Ciaccio said. "After the flight, I looked into get-

ting my pilot's license and I went right ahead and got it in Rockford."

After acquiring his pilot's license, Ciaccio worked as a flight instructor in Iowa until joining the United States Air Force in 1984. Ciaccio spent eight and a half years in the military, completing pilot training for T-37 and T-38 jets in Del Rio, Texas at Laughlin Air Force Base.

Once finishing pilot training, he stayed at the air force base as a pilot instructor for another three and a half years. Ciaccio's next assignment was flying C-141 cargo planes out of McGuire Air Force Base in New Jersey on cargo missions during the war, such as operation Desert Storm and Desert Shield.

"We would pick something up in the states and run it over to Riyadh or Saudi Arabia," Ciaccio said. "Taking all kinds of beams and bullets, we would be in and

out quick because we were a big target."

Ciaccio left the military in 1991 and got hired by Delta Airlines, but soon after being hired, the airlines cancelled all training courses, leaving him out of a job for about a year. During this time, he lived with his mother in Rochelle while his two children were able to spend more time with their cousins.

Finally, Ciaccio was hired by American Airlines based out of Dallas/Fort Worth International Airport in Texas, where he worked for 11 months before getting laid off due to the poor economy at the time. During his three-year lay off, Ciaccio worked for Midway Airlines out of Raleigh-Durham International Airport before being re-hired by American in 1996, where he has worked ever since.

## Departments battle fire in corn storage building

CRESTON — Several area fire departments responded to a fire at FS Grain in Creston Friday morning where they remained for more than five hours.

At 10:57 a.m. the Rochelle Fire Department was called to the business along Illinois Route 38 for flames coming from a fan in a corn storage building. Upon arrival, flames were visible from outside the structure.

There were 750,000 bushels of corn in the storage warehouse which holds 2 million bushels.

According to Rochelle Fire Chief Dave Sawlsville, the fire was brought under control by cutting holes in the roof of the building and using thermal imaging, to direct water to the hot spots.

Firefighters from Rochelle, Steward, Creston, Flagg-Center, Hillcrest, Malta, Lynn-Scot-Rock, Lee, Kirkland, DeKalb and Oregon were all on scene to assist.

No injuries were reported and the cause of the fire remains under investigation.

## FLY: Pandemic has changed state of airline industry

Recently, Ciaccio has seen first-hand the effects of COVID-19 on the airline industry. Since the coronavirus hit the United States and stay-at-home orders were put into effect throughout the country, the amount of people flying has declined dramatically.

"COVID-19 hammered us, in May and June we were probably flying around 30 percent of our flight as compared to last year," Ciaccio said. "In July, it has gone back up to 55 percent. While it will take a while, it is slowly starting to get better."

Due to the corona-

virus, many airlines including American Airlines have implemented new restrictions, guidelines and cleaning procedures to help keep everybody safe. For American Airlines, crew members get their temperature checked anytime they go through security and are required to wear facemasks at all time when dealing with the public.

American Airlines also has passengers board the plane in smaller groups and is attempting to leave half of the middle seats open on every flight. All crew members are also given personal bottles of hand sanitizer and are urged to use them frequently. In addition to these new regulations for the flight crew, the plane cleaning crew has increased its procedures as well.

"You used to leave the airplane for the night and when you got back in the morning it seemed like it was hardly even cleaned," Ciaccio said. "Now, they come in with the big masks and the sprayers, fog the whole plane and wipe down any surface people can touch."

Procedures vary between airlines and airports and these are just some of the procedures American Airlines has implemented in all major airports throughout the country.

While working for American Airlines, Ciaccio took on a new project of building his first airplane. Ciaccio and his uncle Meyer started building the

two-seater RU-7A airplane in 2011 and took it on its first flight in January 2018.

The two took a small break for about nine months when Ciaccio was switching houses, but finished the plane in just over six years of work, which was all done in Meyer's garage. The plane came as a kit for about \$40,000, has a total cost of about \$140,000 including the engine and can travel at a top speed of about 200 mph.

"When I started, I had no idea what I was doing," Ciaccio said. "Luckily Dale had already built an RV-9 before because I would not have been able to do it without him."

Currently, due to the decrease in flying, American Airlines has offered leave packages to many of its employees. Ciaccio accepted a three-month leave with benefits for a temporary pay decrease.

The airlines received \$25 billion to offer these options to its employees without furloughing any of them. But once the money runs out in September, nobody is sure of what will happen next. While the exact future is uncertain, Ciaccio is enjoying the time he currently has at home with his family in Dallas.

"We have five grandkids under 5 years old and they all live by us," Ciaccio said. "So, they have been hanging out at our house by the pool and it has actually been very relaxing."

## In-person dining is back

The Kitchen Table utilizing newly completed Rowe Pavilion to serve meals on Tuesday and Thursday nights

**ROCHELLE** – Local non-profit organization The Kitchen Table has resumed serving meals to diners in person as businesses across the country begin to re-open.

Pay-what-you-can café The Kitchen Table, located at 7034 S. Klondike Road in Rochelle, provides meals to those in need every Tuesday and Thursday from 4:30-6:30 p.m. Diners show up, are served a meal and then pay whatever they can afford, even if it is volunteering their time or nothing at all.

The Kitchen Table officially resumed serving meals to outdoor diners on Tuesday, June 2 and hopes to continue doing so. Since re-opening, The Kitchen Table has seen a great response from the community.

“Both nights this week we have been really busy, so it is a good thing that we could re-open,” said Carolyn Brown, Kitchen Table founder. “Both nights we served over 100 people through dine-in, delivery and pick-up.”

Every Friday during quarantine, The Kitchen Table has offered a free drive-up service for take and bake meal entrees. In addition to serving meals on Tuesdays and Thursdays,

The Kitchen Table plans to continue offering its take and bake service due to need in the community.

“The Friday take and bake program is going exceptionally well,” Brown said. “Last week we had over 500 meals and they were gone in an hour and 15 minutes.”

While The Kitchen Table cannot allow diners inside of the building to eat, it is utilizing its recent building expansion—the Rowe Pavilion—to accommodate as many diners as possible. The new structure has garage doors that open, classifying it as an outdoor dining space.

All tables have been measured and marked off to the proper 6-foot distance and can fit up to 24 diners safely. The Kitchen Table is also following CDC guidelines by wearing masks at all times, offering hand sanitizer and hand washing stations and even setting up a port-a-potty outside to keep diners from entering the building.

The Kitchen Table is also offering

its curbside pick-up and delivery services. Anybody using the curbside service must order ahead by calling The Kitchen Table at 815-561-9074 or online at <http://www.toasttab.com/the-kitchen-table-rochelle>. Once the individual has arrived, they call The Kitchen Table and a volunteer will bring the food out.

Next Tuesday, The Kitchen Table will be serving shredded brisket with mashed potatoes and green beans. Then, on Thursday it will be serving grilled BBQ chicken, potato salad and hopes to have a mixed green salad as well. The Kitchen Table is very happy to once again be serving diners in person and wants to give a big thank you to the community for its support during these tough times.

## Just believe...and live by faith

**F**AITH in God is an amazing gift. It starts the moment your heart says: I believe Jesus is God's Son and that He came to rescue me. That alone is an incredible truth. But I wonder how many Christians decide that's where their faith ends, when the truth is, there's so much more to believe for in this life!

One of the reasons this happens is because many Christians only focus on their weaknesses and mistakes, rather than focusing on who God is and what He's doing in and around them. But John 3:17 (NIV) tells us, "God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him."

Jesus is not only your Savior; He's your advocate. And He wants you to start believing God for much more than a trip to heaven.

The Bible says the just shall live by faith (Hebrews 10:38). In other words, faith is an attitude that can become your way of life—and there is no better way I can think of to live.

Faith replaces fear and worry with peace and joy. It purifies the heart, fills us with the Holy Spirit, brings blessing and hope, receives provision, produces all kinds of positive results, and quenches all the fiery darts of the enemy.

The Bible says that faith is a shield (Ephesians 6:16). So when the enemy starts to fire off darts of fear and insecurity, you can get behind your shield of faith and keep going forward with God.

But here's the thing: A shield won't do you any good unless it's lifted up. You need to raise up your shield by praying, saying, and doing things that line up with God's Word.

Second Peter 1:5 (AMPC) says to "employ every effort in exercising your faith to develop virtue (excellence, resolution, Christian energy)." If you will exercise your faith to become more like Christ Himself, the way you think will change. The things you say will change. You will begin to live with greater love and compassion. And it will become very natural for you to encourage others in their faith.

I encourage you to put your faith into action in a practical way. Make a habit of getting up in the morning and thanking God for what He's done in your life. Praise Him for what He's going to do. Release your faith for what you know you need from Him that day. And ask Him to prepare you for whatever challenges may come your way.

Something I've learned in my relationship with Christ is that you cannot change yourself. It's spending time with God that transforms you.

The apostle Paul prayed that the Holy Spirit would reveal Himself to the church in Ephesus in their "innermost being and personality"—that they would see who God had created them to be through Christ (Ephesians 3:16-17 AMPC).

God wants us to be firmly rooted in the love of Christ so we can take authority over our enemy. And He wants

us to be so stirred up in His love that we can't help but share it with others. I believe if every Christian were doing this today, it wouldn't take a lot of time for the entire world to hear and believe the good news of the Gospel.

Ultimately, it's not the things we do but our faith that pleases God. He wants us to have faith for incredible things. And when we look to the heroes of faith in Hebrews 11, we see how God was able to work in their lives because they believed. Hebrews 11:13 (AMP) says that they were "guided and sustained" by their faith. And their faith still inspires us today.

Noah prepared an ark to save his family. It took many years to build it, and he was mocked every single day because where he lived, it had never rained. The Bible says that by faith, Noah "became heir of the righteousness that is in keeping with faith" (Hebrews 11:7 NIV).

By faith, Abraham prepared to sacrifice his son Isaac, believing that God would raise him from the dead (vv. 17-19).

Rahab was a prostitute but she believed that God could use her in a mighty way. And because of her faith, she and her family were saved (v. 31).

What will your great story of faith be?

First John 5:4 (NIV) says, "Everyone born of God overcomes the world. This is the victory that has overcome the world, even our faith." When you choose to believe in God, amazing things can happen. So boldly ask God to reveal what His promises mean for you, and never stop believing until they are fulfilled.

## Kishwaukee College responds during the pandemic

THINGS at Kishwaukee College, as well as the rest of the world, have changed significantly in the last few months, but there has been cause for celebration as well.

We are proud of our 278 students who graduated in May. Though we did not have a traditional commencement ceremony, a virtual ceremony will be available in August and each of our graduates will be invited to walk in December.

Classes are being held exclusively online for the summer semester. We are committed to looking for creative and innovative ways to provide the best online education. All of us at Kishwaukee College continue to examine how to best serve and support our students in an online environment during this time.

A number of changes were implemented at the college in response to the pandemic, in addition to changing all instruction and support services to remote delivery. With the generous support of the Kishwaukee College Foundation, a summer and fall COVID-19 scholarship is available for students impacted by the pandemic, and funds were increased for students with emergency needs.

Federal CARES funding was distributed to eligible students enrolled in the spring semester. College tuition due dates were pushed back so students have more time to pay their tuition, and we eliminated the fees for the college tuition payment plan.

Students were able to borrow Chromebooks and computers through a drive-up program. Pass/Fail grades were implemented so students could complete their spring coursework without worrying about the impact of their grades on their College Grade Point Average (GPA).

As the State of Illinois is beginning to re-open, we too are planning for how we begin to bring some students, faculty and staff back to campus.

The current plan is to offer the majority of our classes online for Fall 2020. Some lab and CTE courses will be held on campus with enrollments in each section following CDC and Illinois Department of Public Health guidelines.

College enrollment for summer and fall have been effected by the pandemic, but we are hopeful that students interested in attending college in the fall will consider Kishwaukee College. We are a great local option, whether you are getting started on a college degree or wanting to prepare for a new career.

These are unprecedented times. Through all the quick changes, we remain committed to improving lives through quality, affordable education in our local communities.





## County accepting electronics for recycling June 26

**OREGON**—The Ogle County Solid Waste Management Department will be open and accepting residential electronics from Ogle County residents for recycling on Friday, June 26, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the County Annex Building at 909 Pines Road in Oregon.

### Guidelines

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and for the protection of workers and residents, the following guidelines have been put in place by the OCSWMD for the acceptance of residential electronic items:

All residents attending the event must stay in their vehicles at all times with the windows closed.

Residents are to show their acceptable Ogle County I.D. to county staff through vehicle window (drivers' license, voter registration card, or recent utility bill accepted).

Electronic items must be loaded into trunk, truck bed, trailer, or rear of a van or SUV, and easily accessible to county staff to remove. Limit of seven (7) bulky accepted items per vehicle; and box or tub loaded with smaller items is considered one bulky item.

Residents are advised to bring in only accepted items for recycling, please check the list below or visit the county website for a full list of accepted items.

Items must be removed from original packaging prior to arrival at the recycling event.

Microwave ovens are \$5 per unit. If you have a microwave oven to recycle please tape an envelope with payment to the outside of the device prior to arrival

at the event. Cash or check, payable to Ogle County Solid Waste Management Department, accepted. Exact payment only, no change will be available for larger denominations.

If a resident or their family member(s) are feeling ill it is advised that they stay at home and recycle their electronics at another future recycling event.

If electronic items have been in a residence with a positive COVID-19 individual, it is advised to not bring these items in for recycling until a future recycling event.

Accepted items include all televisions, computers, computer monitors, computer hardware and cables, printers, FAX machines, copiers, scanners, video gaming items, VCR/DVD players, cable and satellite boxes, cell phones, tablets, laptops, radios, stereo equipment (no wooden speakers), digital clocks, holiday light strands, extension cords, phone systems, calculators, shredders (no plastic tubs), rechargeable batteries, CFL bulbs, and printer ink cartridges. Microwave ovens accepted for \$5 per unit, limit seven (7) bulky items per vehicle.

Items not accepted include smoke detectors, coffee makers, toasters, bread makers, vacuum cleaners, fans, heaters, air conditioners or dehumidifiers, lamps, power tools, alkaline batteries, LED bulbs, exercise equipment, medical equipment of any kind, toys or drones, business or institutional electronic items, and any packaging from electronic items such as boxes, plastic wrapping, and Styrofoam.

## Jesse White launches driver's license/ID card preregistration application

**SPRINGFIELD** — Illinois Secretary of State Jesse White announced today that his office has launched an online driver's license and ID card preregistration application program to reduce the processing time of transactions at Driver Services facilities. It is a proactive approach that will save customers time during their facility visit.

Customers may go to [www.cyberdriveillinois.com](http://www.cyberdriveillinois.com) to access the preregistration application for driver's licenses and ID cards and input specific information regarding their upcoming transaction. As a result, once the customer visits a Driver Services facility, the clerk will not have to enter all of the data like a change of address or a change of height and weight into the electronic application form because the customer has already updated the information. This will improve the efficiency of these transactions.

"This is a forward-thinking program using technology to reduce wait times at the counter and speed up transactions at Driver Services facilities," said White. "The program is easy to use and can be



accessed on a computer, iPad or smartphone."

With preregistration, customers will be prompted to:

Choose a license type (REAL ID or standard driver's license/ID card);

Choose an application type (renewal or corrected);

Input designations (organ donor or veteran);

Choose any corrections to be made to the information on file (examples: address, date of birth, eye color, gender, hair color, height, name, Social Security number or weight);

Choose the type of required documentation and enter data from those documents (i.e., certified

birth certificate for a REAL ID);

Print receipt with barcode, which should be brought to the facility.

Customers using the preregistration application must still bring all of the required paperwork to the Driver Services facility for verification. In addition, they are encouraged to bring the printed preregistration receipt to the facility for the clerk to scan the barcode. However, if the customer does not bring in the receipt, the clerk can enter the customer's driver's license/ID card number to access the preregistration application information.

To qualify for the pre-

registration application process, a customer must have an Illinois driver's license/ID card that is not suspended, canceled or revoked and has not been expired for more than one year.

As a reminder, Driver Services facilities statewide are open to serve ONLY new drivers, customers with expired driver's licenses/ID cards and vehicle transactions through July 31. White also reiterated to the public that expiration dates for driver's licenses/ID cards and vehicle registration stickers have been extended until Oct. 1, 2020 so customers do not need to rush into a facility.

## Address insects before entertaining season

**B**ARBECUES in the backyard or cocktails on the patio provide some fun ways to enjoy the great outdoors from the comforts of home. While friends and family flock to such entertaining opportunities, some unwanted guests may want to crash the festivities.

It's impossible to ensure a completely bug-free outdoor environment, but there are steps homeowners can take to reduce the amount of pests who want to join the party.

Western Exterminator Supply suggests first identifying which kind of insect infiltrations are most common where you live. House flies, fruit flies, mosquitoes, wasps, and bees tend to be abundant in spring and summer. Ants, termites and other bugs also can be prevalent. These insects, however pesky they may seem, often can be kept away without the use of pesticides and other chemicals.

- Lure away pests. Many insects will be happy to snack on a treat and leave you alone. Put out a dish of sugar water or slices of fruit for insects that feed on sweets and nectar, or a slice of sandwich meat for wasps and yellow jackets. Place these items a fair distance from your gathering.

- Install fans. A patio ceiling fan can blow away mosquitoes and flies relatively easily. And you and your guests will likely enjoy a nice breeze on sultry days.

- Use mulch wisely. Mulch will add to curb appeal, but having it too close to the house, according to the National Pest Management Association, can present an ideal environment for roaches and ants to nest and

find their way into a home. As mulch decomposes, it generates heat and a cozy spot for pests, including mice. Keep mulch 12 inches away from the home's foundation and entertaining spaces, or use inorganic mulch.

- Keep patios clean. Sweep up and clean away any spilled foods and beverages promptly. Even a tiny nugget of food can attract ants and other insects.

- Use natural pest deterrents. Citronella oils can drive away some insects, as can garlic and rosemary. Lavender, eucalyptus, marigolds, and other pungent aromas will naturally keep mosquitoes and other flying insects at bay. Some people also have luck with mint-flavored mouthwash misted on patios and furniture.

- Address standing water. Mosquitoes and some other insects lay their eggs in standing water. Routinely drain areas where water collects, including gutters and downspouts

- Use light colors. According to HouseLogic, studies show that bugs see dark and bright colors more easily than light colors. Choose lighter shades of paint for outdoor areas and it may make these spaces less attractive to some bugs.

- Leave those spider webs. Many people yell "eek" at the sight of spiders and spider webs. But those arachnids and their sticky webs can do a fine job of capturing many unwanted insects. Resist the temptation to tear down webs and shoo spiders away.

Addressing insects means employing various natural strategies to make outdoor entertaining more pleasant.



## Bank employees help support area food pantries



# Finding his form

Flanagan overcomes knee injury through playing tennis for Hubs

WHEN Rochelle Township High School senior Sean Flanagan began his three-year tennis career with the Hubs, the right-handed netter had no choice but to start from the ground up. Flanagan went out for the team as a sophomore, and in addition to having almost no experience on the court, he was coming off a serious knee injury that required surgery. Despite unfavorable odds, Flanagan persevered and became both a leader and a key contributor for Rochelle, competing in both singles and doubles during his high school career.

“My favorite part about playing tennis for RTHS was starting from nothing my sophomore year and progressing on the court,”

Flanagan said. “I think my confidence improved the most. Tennis is a game of errors, so it’s really easy to get stuck in your head. But as I played more tennis, I became more comfortable with my shots and my strategy during matches.”

Flanagan began his varsity career in doubles before transitioning to singles as an upperclassman. Flanagan took over Rochelle’s No. 1 singles position as a junior, and without COVID-19 forcing the IHSA to cancel spring sports in 2020, Flanagan would’ve been the team’s leading returner in singles this spring. Flanagan, who also played golf for one season at RTHS, received Academic All-Conference honors from the Northern Illinois Big 12 in 2019.

“Playing tennis really taught me mental toughness,” Flanagan said. “It was really important not

to let my errors bother me and to focus on my next serve. One of my favorite memories was competing at regionals this past season. Everybody played really well and it was a great time.”

Flanagan said he plans to study biomedical engineering at The University of Iowa with the hopes of becoming a physician. He said his knee injury motivated him to take up tennis his sophomore year, and he said he’s since grown to love the sport.

“I didn’t play until my sophomore year because I was dealing with a football injury and subsequent surgery as a freshman,” Flanagan said. “I couldn’t play contact sports anymore, but I still wanted to compete, so I tried out for the tennis team. I’m so grateful for my experience because I love tennis now and it’s something I can play for many years.”

# Mental toughness keys Escobar’s resurgence

Senior grappler pushes past several obstacles throughout career

DIEGO Escobar nearly saw his senior season with the Rochelle Township High School wrestling program end abruptly when the Hubs battled against the Morris Redskins this past winter. Escobar had been winning the 160-pound bout, but after twisting his knee awkwardly near the end of the first period, Escobar was forced to withdraw from the match. The senior was out for several weeks, but he was fortunately able to return and finish his senior strong, earning a victory on Senior Night and claiming one win at the IHSA 2A Sycamore Regional. Escobar, who spent three years with the wrestling program, ended his senior season 10-9 overall.

“The RTHS wrestling team taught me about dedication and commitment,” Escobar said. “Wrestling was one of the most challenging things I did throughout my time in high school, but getting through those seasons taught me to never give up, no matter

how difficult things may seem. Wrestling taught me about how failure is necessary to win in the long run.”

Escobar competed with the junior varsity team over his freshman and sophomore seasons, taking a one-year break before returning to the program as a senior. Escobar, who also ran for the RTHS cross country and track teams, was with the Hubs when they brought home a fourth-place trophy from the IHSA 2A Dual State Championships during the 2017-18 season.

“My favorite memory was going to state for the dual team championships,” Escobar said. “There were a lot of memories and emotions throughout that weekend that I’ll never forget... What I enjoyed most about wrestling at RTHS was the bonds I developed with my teammates and coaches. It really felt like we were a family while we were together.”

Escobar, who intends to study criminal justice after high school, began wrestling in sixth grade at Rochelle Middle School. Despite being one of the

smaller and thinner kids on the team, Escobar continued with the sport, refusing to give up because of his inferior size. As Escobar grew older and stronger, he said his determination improved

mindset improved a lot at RTHS. My freshman season was a struggle because I wasn’t prepared mentally for the work I needed to do, but when my senior season came around, I gave the team

everything I had.”

## Saldana shows team spirit with Lady Hubs

ROCHELLE Township High School senior Angie Saldana had never run the 1600-meter relay throughout her career with the Lady Hubs. But when a teammate went down with an injury at the Northern Illinois Big 12 Conference Championships this past season, Saldana didn't hesitate to step up for her team and push herself as hard as she could. Saldana spent three years with the Lady Hub track and field program, and had the 2020 season not been canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic, she would have been one of Rochelle's top returning sprinters. Saldana shined during her junior season, helping Rochelle win the 800-meter relay at the Ogle County Championships and setting personal records in the 100-meter dash (13.96 seconds), the 200-meter dash (29.04 seconds) and the pole vault.

"I have so many memories from my time with the track team," Saldana said. "Being a member of the track program taught me

many things, but one important thing the program taught me was that, regardless of how tough something may be, you have to work for what you want. . . I enjoyed competing and becoming a leader on the team."

Saldana's freshman season was highlighted by a second-place finish in the 800-meter relay at DeKalb, where she raced alongside teammate Macey Ryan, who Saldana said became a role model for her later in her high school career. The two Lady Hubs also raced together in the 400-meter relay, helping Rochelle take fifth in the event at the Woodstock Invitational.

"Macey was an amazing runner and she kept running even when she was in pain," Saldana said. "That's something I learned from her. Coach [Alison] Vrana was also a role model for me. She always pushed me because she always wanted the best for me."

Saldana said she plans to attend Northern Illinois University after high school to major in middle level teaching and learning in hopes of becoming a middle school mathematics teacher. She also said she intends to minor in Spanish ESL.

## IHSA reveals Stage 1 Return to Play Guidelines

### Rochelle programs to continue with virtual workouts

**ROCHELLE**—As the state progresses through Phase 3 of the Restore Illinois reopening plan, IHSA officials gave student-athletes and coaches their first series of return-to-play guidelines this past Friday in order to safely reopen team facilities and resume activities.

Under the IHSA's Stage 1 Return to Play Guidelines, athletic programs received permission to resume voluntary strength and conditioning workouts, preferably outdoors, on June 6. While the guidelines are a small step in the state's return to normalcy, Rochelle Township High School athletic programs will be continuing with virtual workouts until the state reaches Phase 4 of the Restore Illinois plan, which will likely include the IHSA's second stage of athletic guidelines.

"There are a lot of restrictions still in place and it would be challenging for us to make the restrictions work," athletic director Richard Harvey said. "We're going to continue our virtual workouts and putting health and safety procedures in place. We'll be talking with our coaches to make sure they understand the guidelines and they understand what they

need to do."

The Stage 1 guidelines dictate that student-athletes are limited to three hours of participation per day. Additionally, sport-specific drills are not permitted and sport-specific equipment cannot be used. Free-weight exercises that require spotting cannot be conducted due to social distancing norms, and in addition to limiting gatherings to 10 people or fewer, sessions can only include weightlifting, running and exercises designed to promote physical fitness.

"Our coaches felt that we've been seeing good results and good participation from our virtual workouts," Harvey said. "Our kids have been working hard to check in with coaches and communicate with them. We've been seeing effective results with what we've been doing, and if we went ahead with having up to 10 kids in the weight room, we couldn't do any spotting and we'd have to run shifts, meaning we'd need almost nine hours to get all of the kids in."

School-sponsored camps, clinics and open gyms are prohibited in any sport during Stage 1. As the state moves toward Phase 4, however, Harvey said the IHSA's Stage 2 guidelines will likely follow the guidelines indicated in the

state's plan, which would include gatherings up to 50 people. During the IHSA's meeting with state athletic directors Monday afternoon, Harvey said IHSA officials used the word "normal" to describe what activities could look like in July.

"We're hoping that's the case and that's what we're preparing for," Harvey said. "I'm hoping we'll be as close to normal as we possible with our Hub Power program and the camps we normally run in July... I think we'll be close to normal, with some restrictions."

If the state can enter Phase 4 on its projected date of June 26, IHSA's Stage 2 guidelines could allow athletic programs to resume sport-specific workouts. Harvey said that programs which normally hold camps in June, including boys basketball and girls basketball, have expressed interest in hosting open gym sessions during the week. Harvey also said that tryouts for the RTHS cheerleading and dance programs could take place during the next phase of reopening.

"I've asked coaches to get back to me and let me know what their interests are," Harvey said. "We'll have to see if we can accommodate everybody, and there will be protocols

in place."

Harvey said the IHSA was scheduled to meet Wednesday and discuss details for Stage 2 and Stage 3 Return to Play Guidelines. Moreover, the IHSA will host its next board meeting on June 15, and athletic de-


partments could receive more information from the IHSA regarding the future of summer activities and fall sports for the 2020-21 school year at that time.

"They're sending out a survey that will include some of the proposals they're discussing, which

include swapping of seasons, shortening of seasons or keeping everything the same," Harvey said. "Nothing's off the table... I haven't seen a survey yet, but when I receive the survey, I'll be answering those questions to the best of my ability."


