Always 'Hub Strong'

HISTORY has recorded the 2015 Rochelle/Fairdale tornado as an extremely violent and long-lived tornado that tore through the communities near Rochelle and Fairdale throughout the evening hours of April 9, 2015.

Part of a larger severe weather event that impacted the Central United States, the tornado first touched down in Lee County at 6:39 p.m., it progressed through the counties of Ogle, DeKalb, and Boone before finally dissipating at 7:20 p.m. CDT.

Along the tornado's 30.14 mile path, numerous structures were heavily damaged or destroyed, especially in the small town of Fairdale where two fatalities and 11 injuries were recorded. A few well-constructed homes were swept completely away, indicative of peak winds near 200 mph, the upper bounds of an EF-4 tornado. In the aftermath of the event, hundreds of citizens assisted in cleanup and recovery efforts.

Everyone counts

Residents reminded Census still ongoing

ROCHELLE – With the current COVID-19 situation being so hectic, filling out a United States Census form may not be the first thing on many people's minds, but it is something that needs to be done.

Amid the stay-at-home order, emptying of grocery store shelves and restaurants closing their dining rooms, the United States is taking its census count. While filling out a census form may not seem important during these tough times, it makes a large impact. Every person not counted is a loss of \$1,800 in federal and state funding, annually, for the next 10 years.

As of April 7, 46.7 percent of the national population has filled out its census and the state of Illinois is at 50.8 percent. Locally, Ogle County is ahead of both the national and state percentage at 57 percent. Ogle County is broken up into three "tracks" including the northwest side, east side and southwest side.

The northwest track has had 62.5 percent respond and the other two tracks are noticeably behind at 47.7 percent and 44.7 percent. The city attributes this to those tracks having a large concentration of hard-to-count areas and is hopeful those percentages will increase when census takers begin going door-to-door.

While city officials are happy with how the responses are going, they know there is still much more to be done.

"All things considered I am pretty happy with how things are going," said Sue Messer, assistant to the city manager/city clerk. "But when you compare it to where the 2010 numbers ended up, we have a long way to go."

Due to the COVID-19 situation, the entire 2020 United States Census schedule has been delayed two weeks. On April 8, paper questionnaires began mailing out to those who have not responded and Census takers are scheduled to go door-to-door between May 28 and Aug. 14.

There is currently no talk of any future postponements due to COVID-19, but this is a situation that changes every day. The people in charge of the census are constantly monitoring the situation and city officials know the delay could be extended any moment.

"The census group is watching the virus, the stay at home orders and all of those things," said Messer. "At this point, there has been no talk of any future postponement, but I am sure they are weighing how to move forward."

For anybody who needs help filling out a census online, the city is offering help over the phone by calling city hall at 815-562-6161.

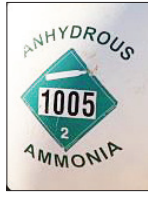
Ammonia tank tips over in field

ROCHELLE — The Rochelle Fire Department, along with Creston and Flagg Center, responded to an anhydrous ammonia tank that had tipped over Friday afternoon near the bike path and Kyte Creek.

The 1,000 gallon anhydrous ammonia tank tipped west of Walmart and south of Flagg Road. According to reports, no ammonia leaked into the field.

The tank, carrying approximately 800 gallons of anhydrous ammonia, was turned upright by a wrecker truck and placed on a flatbed trailer. It was then taken to Conserv FS in Malta.

The incident took place at approximately 12:30 p.m. Friday. No injuries were reported.

Elizabeth Villarreal is set to graduate this May from Oregon High School.

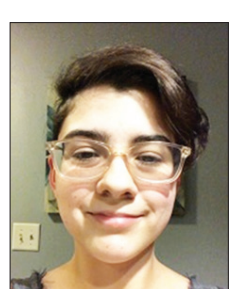
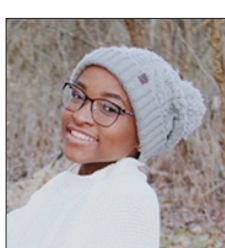
She is part of the National Honor Society, Senior of Distinction and involved in marching band, golf, bowling plus poetry slam.

County discourages open burning due to ongoing pandemic

OGLE COUNTY — The Ogle County Solid Waste Management Department (OCSWMD) discourages all open burning at this time due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The open burning of landscape waste and ground vegetation is particularly risky at this time due to the nuisance smoke conditions produced by open burning and the possibility of uncontrolled fire spread.

Since the COVID-19 virus is a respiratory virus, nuisance smoke conditions can cause breathing issues and make pre-existing conditions, such as asthma, worse. Nuisance smoke conditions may also make the impact of the virus worse on afflicted residents and can lengthen the time we are all dealing with this situation. In addition, when fires are uncontrolled and first responders are required, this places those per-

sonnel in close contact during the response and can spread out emergency personnel and resources unnecessarily.

The OCSWMD encourages county residents to forgo open burning at this time, and encourages other means of dealing with landscape waste, such as mulching thatch and dead leaves with a mower, using a home compost pile for grass, leaves, and twigs, or having your waste hauler take it away if that service is offered in your area.

These efforts should help to flatten the curve and help everyone put the COVID-19 pandemic behind us. Crisis hotline available 24 hours a day

NEARLY one in five women will experience sexual assault or rape within her lifetime. In the USA, one out of 71 men has experienced rape or attempted rape. Ninety-three percent of child victims know their abuser. Our mission at Rockford Sexual Assault Counseling is to reduce these numbers through essential services.

The Ogle County office, located in Oregon, provides much needed services to the communities in Ogle County. In fiscal year 2019 (July 2018 through June 2019) the Ogle County office provided 106 individuals with counseling services and in the current fiscal year, RSAC is on track to increase those numbers. RSAC staff also reached 7,217 kids through prevention education programs such as Erin's Law in FY 2019.

Sexual violence does not discriminate. In these times of isolation, we expect the need for our services to increase. Ogle County is still providing essential services such as information, referral, legal advocacy, medical advocacy and counseling. All services are being scheduled and done by phone. New client intakes and referrals are still being completed. The 24-Hour crisis hotline is still available.

TORNADO: Community rallies for those in need

One of the hardest hit neighborhoods in Rochelle was that of Ogle County Sheriff Brian Van Vickle who, like several, lost his home to the powerful storm. And just like any other time when people are in need, residents came together to help those who needed help the most.

"My most vivid memory of April 9 isn't actually from the 9th but Friday the 10th when family, friends and complete strangers come to help us," Van Vickle said. "My family has lived in this community for generations and it is a great place to live day in and day out. But in the wake of that evening it was much more then supporting a school fundraiser or buying Girl Scout cookies. It truly showed who we are and what we stand for. I am proud of the day after."

Another family directly effected in that same neighborhood was Emily and John Whitaker.

"April 9th, 2015 was the most traumatic day of my life. It didn't start out that way. It started out a day just like any other," Emily Whitaker said. "I remember reading some Facebook posts about how the weather was supposed to be unpredictable that day. There was a chance of severe weather. Maybe a tornado."

At the time, Whitaker was questioning humanity; however, in the aftermath of April 9 her perspective changed. "One thing that had already been destroyed by that day was my faith

in humanity. Honestly, I had been feeling very ... alone, and adrift. I didn't see a lot of "good" left in people all the time. Sometimes you see the worst in people, and it's really hard to see the good anymore, when you see so much bad all the time. But then... All of you. It was all of you," she said in a Facebook post just this past April 9 when recalling the tornado.

For the Hintzsche family of Lindenwood, the events following the April 9, 2015 tornado have changed their perspective on life as well.

"[That experience taught us] that there are really good people in this world. The kindness shown to our family was something we will never forget," Lauren Hintzsche said. "We are seeing the same thing today during the pandemic. There is genuine kindness in the world. Sometimes it takes a life changing event to bring it to the forefront. We have developed a 'life is short... buy the tickets mentality.' We also realize how important philanthropy is as we were the recipient of others' generosity."

Many that were impacted directly by the

tornado moved forward with the same mentality.

"Like many people I knew almost everyone effected by the storm. While we were directly impacted so were many other people yet the community unselfishly gave back," Van Vickle said. "That is one thing that stands out even the little things matter. So I have tried to do that for others moving forward. Making the biggest impact even with the smallest of things."


"Our gratefulness to all of you is unending. You restored our faith in humanity, and gave us the strength to persevere even on days when we did not think we had the strength. Thank you all, from the

bottom of our hearts," Whitaker said.

Van Vickle also took away information from the event that benefits the rest of the county as well.

"I have gleaned a very unique perspective being personally effected while continuing to serve the citizens of Ogle County. This firsthand knowledge has pushed me to not only continue gaining knowledge based on national best practices but sharing this information when others need it most," he said.

Emergency rules filed to extend expiration dates for driver's license, IDs and vehicle registrations

SPRINGFIELD — Illinois Secretary of State Jesse White announced today his office filed emergency rules extending expiration dates for driver's licenses, identification (ID) cards, vehicle registrations and other transactions and document filings for at least 90 days after Driver Services facilities reopen. The previous extension was for 30 days.

"Extending expiration dates by at least 90 days after Driver Services facilities reopen is the right thing to do," said White. "It will ensure driver's licenses, ID cards and vehicle registrations remain valid during this pandemic and will help alleviate the rush of

customers visiting facilities once they reopen."

Following Governor Pritzker's Stay-at-Home order, White closed Driver Services facilities to the public through April 30. While facilities are closed to the public, White is encouraging residents to go to www.cyberdriveillinois.com to take advantage of many online services — such as renewing vehicle registration stickers — from the comfort of their own home. People who conduct online transactions will further help to reduce the number of face-to-face transactions that will occur at Driver Services facilities once they reopen.

Some of these online services

include:

- renewing a vehicle registration;
- applying for a vehicle title and registration;
- obtaining a duplicate driver's license or ID card;
- obtaining a driving record abstract;
- renewing a standard driver's license with the Safe Driver Renewal program.

"My commitment is to do everything we can to help protect the health and safety of our residents, while still providing services to the people of Illinois," said White. "This will, and must, continue to be the guiding principle of our decision making."

Man arrested for violating protection order

On April 5, Ogle County Sheriff's deputies investigated a violation of an order of protection. Pursuant to the investigation deputies arrested Jeremy Guentert, 38, of Byron, for violation of an order of protection. Guentert was transported to the Ogle County Jail where he was held in lieu of bond.

On April 6 at approximately 12:30 p.m., Ogle County Sheriff's deputies responded to the intersection of Illinois Route 64 and Maple Grove Road. This was in response to a check welfare request by a passing motorist reporting a vehicle parked at that location with front end damage and a female in the driver's seat. Upon arrival and after an investigation, the driver of the vehicle, Destiny R. Whipkey, 24, of Davis Junction, was arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol. Whipkey was transported to the Ogle County Jail where she posted bond on

her charges and was released. Whipkey is due to appear in Ogle County court at a later date.

April 9

On April 9 at approximately 2:02 p.m., deputies responded to and address on East Valley View Drive, in reference to a citizen complaint. After a brief investigation, deputies placed Taunya Hollis-Jared, 48, of Rockford, under arrest for disorderly conduct, two outstanding Ogle County traffic warrants, and theft under \$500 for a separate incident which occurred on Feb. 2 at the same residence. Hollis-Jared was transported to the Ogle County Jail where she was held in lieu of bond.

On April 9 at approximately 8:00 a.m., deputies responded to a theft at 1382 N. Illinois Route 2. After investigation, deputies placed Jesse Maberry, 76, of Oregon, under arrest for theft under \$500. Maberry was released on an I-bond and will appear in court at a later date.

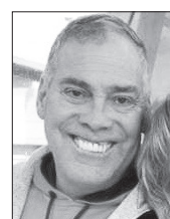

Finding faith during Easter celebrations

FOR many Christians, modern Easter celebrations would not be complete without bonnets, bunnies and colored eggs. As fun as those components can be, Christianity is at the heart of Easter, which is the most important date on the Christian religious calendar. Easter Sunday marks the culmination of events that shaped the beliefs and teachings of an entire faith.

Easter marks the Resurrection of Jesus Christ, which Christians believe occurred within days of his crucifixion and burial. The New Testament indicates that the Resurrection of Jesus is one of the chief tenets of the Christian faith and established Jesus as the Son of God. Easter is an example that God will righteously judge the world by sacrificing His son for the sins of others. And any person who chooses to follow Jesus receives everlasting life thanks to Christ's Resurrection.

Easter is linked to the Jewish celebration of Passover due to its proximity on the calendar and the fact that Jesus was Jewish. The Bible states that Jesus participated in the Passover meal during The Last Supper. At The Last Supper, Jesus identified the matzo (bread) and wine as his body and blood, soon to be sacrificed and shed. Christians believe The Last Supper marked the



first transubstantiation, or the turning of bread and wine into the actual substance of Christ's body and blood. This also was the first celebration of the Eucharist and Holy Mass that would become another core component of the Christian faith.

Easter is a time of great celebration that is

preceded by Lent, a weeklong period of reflection, prayer and repentance. The days immediately prior to Easter are commonly referred to as Holy Week. This encompasses Palm Sunday and lasts through Holy Thursday (the day of The Last Supper), Good Friday (when Jesus was crucified and placed in the tomb), and Holy Saturday (the 40-hour-long vigil that the followers of Jesus Christ held after his death and burial).

On Easter Sunday, four women, including Mary Magdalene, went to Christ's tomb to anoint his body with spices and oils. They found the tomb was empty and were met with an angel who told them that Jesus had been raised from the dead. A biblical account in John 20:14-16 indicates that Mary Magdalene was the first to speak with the risen Jesus. She mistakes Jesus for a gardener and says to him, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away." Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to him, "Rabboni!" In regard to his apostles, Simon Peter was the first to see the risen Christ.

Easter is a time of joy and celebration, and a great opportunity for Christians to immerse themselves in their faith.

The outpouring of community support and help during those first hours and days was heartwarming. It's the kind of spirit that makes Rochelle, Rochelle. It's also a spirit that does not disappear even to this day, through this new disaster.

Around 3,000 meals a week are served to youngsters through the school system. On certain days parents can get a multi-day pack of food for their youngsters and family.

Most lunches are distributed on a drive thru basis, eliminating personal contact, which helps stem the spread of this disease.

People are stepping up to help the elderly shop, make sure youngsters get fed, families have food, and perform dozens of other small, but vital, tasks in our community.

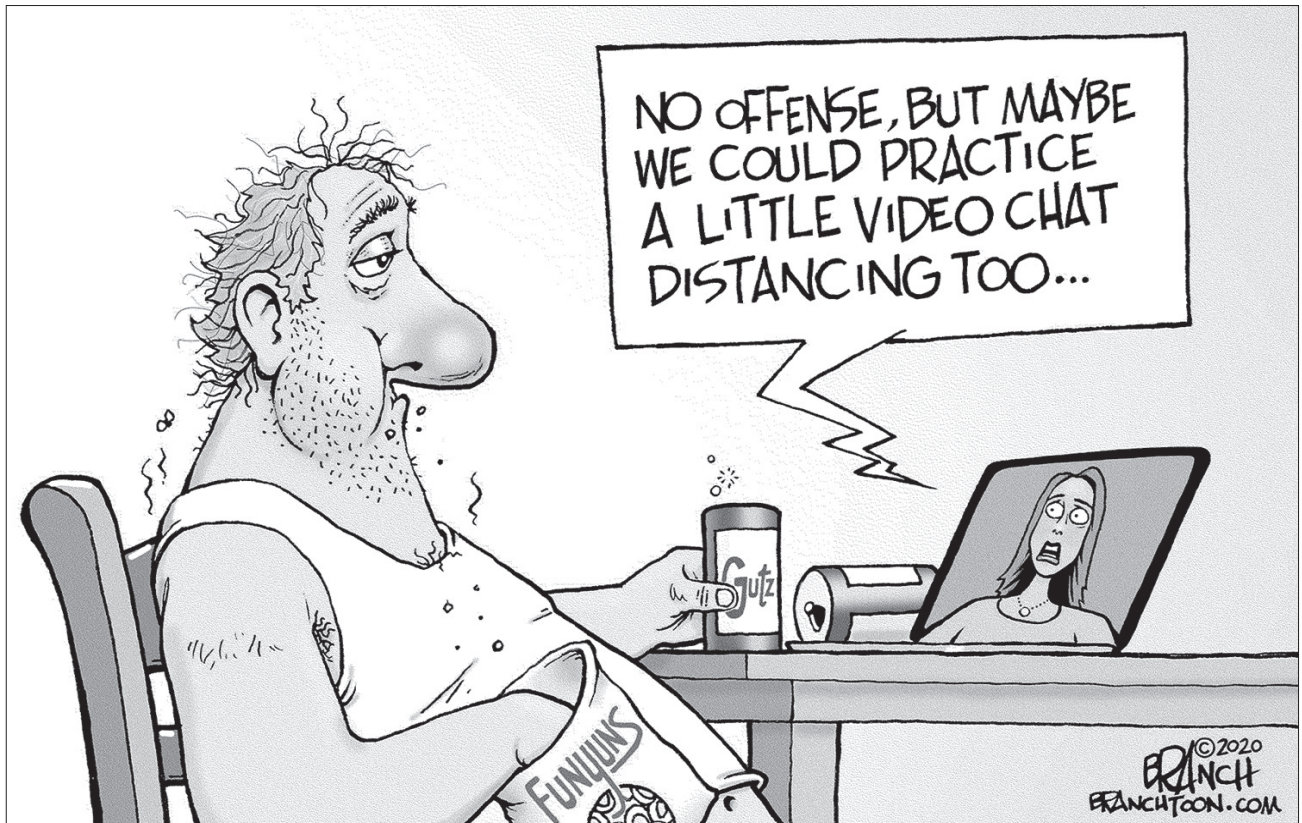
We will get through this. It will not be easy. But we will come out of this stronger and smarter, as a community and as a country.

Illinois needs federal help for recovery, but bailout unlikely

GOV. J.B. Pritzker made it clear this week that he's counting on the federal government to help the state financially, not just to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic, but to assist with the state's economic recovery.

Pritzker said the recent federal CARES Act was a start, adding that Illinois still needs more. He's right, of course. Illinois has been staving off a financial crisis for decades. State lawmakers failed to put away any money during an 11-year bull run after the Great Recession. They also failed to pass balanced budgets, leading to structural deficits year after year. They also failed to properly fund the state's unemployment insurance fund.

Pritzker wants the federal government to loan the state cash to keep its unemployment fund solvent as unemployment

surges in response to both the coronavirus and the state-ordered shutdown of nonessential businesses under the governor's stay-at-home order.

But that's not all. He's hoping for a lot more from the federal government.

"This is unprecedented," Pritzker said Monday. "Even compared to 2008-2009, the revenue shortfall, the things that we're having to do to address this is creating a gap that I don't think anyone could have anticipated. So we are looking very hard at what we need to do to get the revenues and expenditures in line with one another."

Very few things are without precedent. While no could have predicted this particular pandemic would hit Illinois in 2020, credit-rating agencies and financial watchdogs have been telling the state's

elected officials for decades that Illinois needed to get its finances in order, build up a rainy day fund and properly fund essential services. Illinois lawmakers didn't listen.

"I think a lot of it is going to depend upon the federal government," the governor said. "There's just no one else who can step in to help our state finances the way that our federal government can. ... The truth is we are going to need more, every state is going to need more because every state's revenues have cratered."

Yes, every state will need help. But Illinois will need more help because it was in such poor financial shape before the COVID-19 pandemic.

Once the public health crisis subsides, the governor will have more time to focus on a recovery plan. But I

wouldn't count on the U.S. Congress to fix all of the state's financial problems. Pritzker has already learned that federal dollars often come with strings attached.

More importantly, I don't think Illinois has the political might or goodwill to persuade elected officials from other states to bail out its decades of financial mismanagement.

The federal government should help. And Illinois needs more help. But will it get everything Pritzker wants? Probably not.

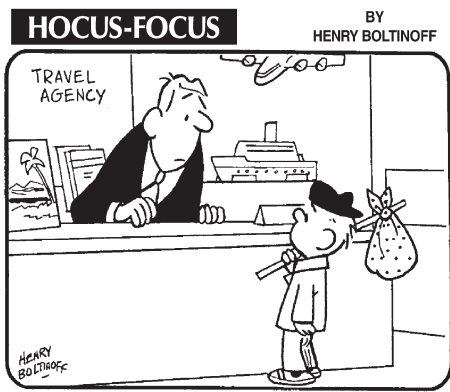
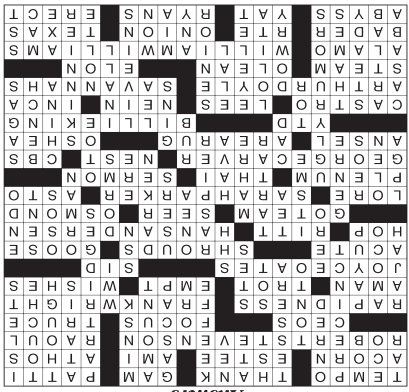

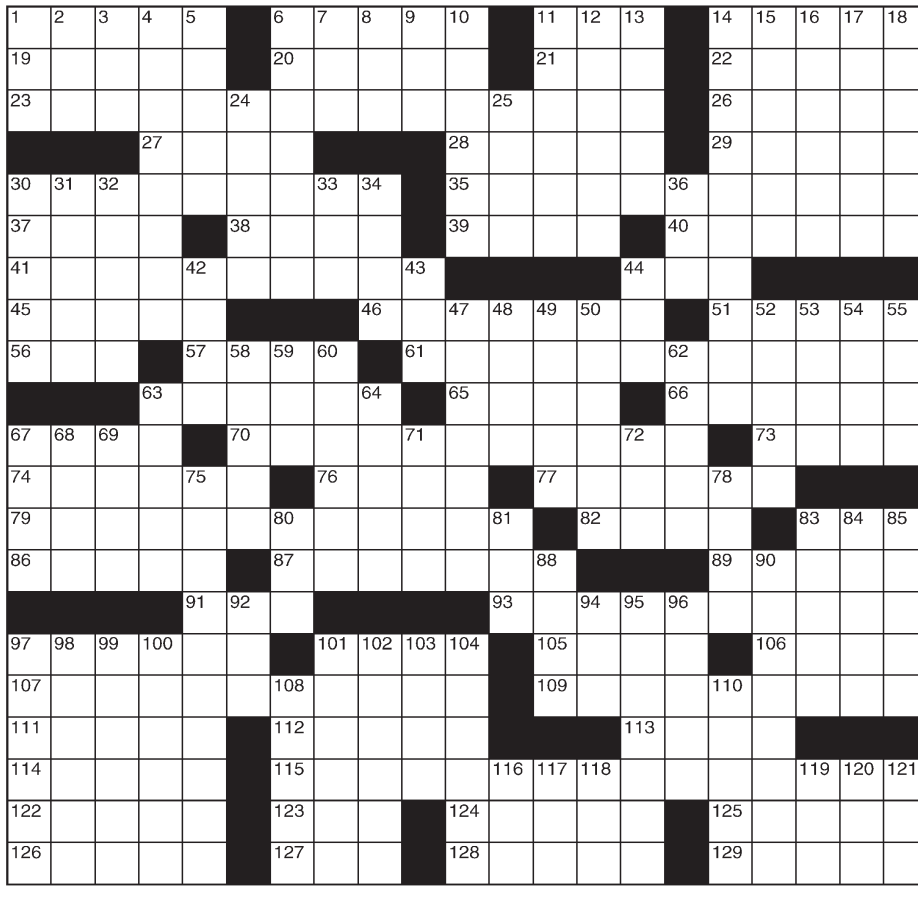

Ukulele Station site growing

Oregon Music Garage will go north of existing business

No one can ever accuse John Lindhorst of not thinking big. Sure, the Oregon business he owns – Ukulele Station America – is housed in a 208 square foot building. But that successful little shop is about to get a bigger neighbor. Lindhorst said the plan now is to break ground by early May on the Oregon Music Garage, which will be built just north of the Ukulele Station America building at 10th Street and Illinois Route 64.

“My goal is to have the shop open by fall,” Lindhorst said. The Oregon Music Garage will be a 2,000 square foot space housed in a unique building that Lindhorst said is not really a barn or a shed, but will be a post frame building with some upgrades. It will also have garage doors on one end and be, “very industrial and cool looking.” Lindhorst said it will be built about 30 feet north of Ukulele Station America and will extend along Mix Street. There will be parking, a patio and maybe even a firepit. But Lindhorst wants

to be clear on one thing: Ukulele Station America will stay put. “I want people to realize, Ukulele station America and the little stone building will continue as is,” he said of the popular business, opened in the summer of 2015. The idea behind the Oregon Music Garage is to offer instruments other than ukuleles. Ukulele Station America will still be a space full of ukuleles and some lessons and meetings could still be held there. But the Music Ga-

rage will house acoustic guitars, banjos, mandolins, dulcimers, world percussion and other “folky” stuff, Lindhorst said. And yes, there will also be ukuleles there. “I may have a few electric guitars,” he said. The space will include an entryway, two handicap accessi-

ble restrooms, a second level private office, a workroom for inventory and a large showroom. Lindhorst said he hopes to have a stage area in the showroom, possibly

something that can be moved. “Once it’s built, I’ll be able to figure it out more,” he said. Brands that will be available in the new store include Fender, Gretsch, Deering and Gold Tone banjos and mandolins. “I’m not trying to be the guitar store, the banjo store,” Lindhorst said, adding that he wants to attract people who are looking for something special. With a possible performance space, people might wonder if Lindhorst is bringing back the live music he used to have in the 80s when he had the Washington Street Mercantile and Coffee House at 221 Washington St. “Maybe a little,” he

said. But there is still a lot that has to happen between now and then on a project Lindhorst said was a big one for him. “This is the biggest financial project I have ever undertaken,” he said, adding that the people at Union Savings Bank in Mount Morris, where he got his loan, were great about making this dream come true. Once the Oregon Music Garage is up and running, he said he might also start doing Internet sales, something he has thus far avoided. He said he is trying to find a way to make buying an instrument from him more personal. “It’s not a pair of socks,” he said.

Illinois State Police director files emergency rules regarding FOID, Concealed Carry renewals

SPRINGFIELD – The Illinois State Police filed emergency rules this week to address renewals of Firearm Owner Identification and Concealed Carry Licenses during the COVID-19 epidemic. These rules are designed to provide FOID card holders and CCL relief from the renewal requirements during the effects of COVID-19 pandemic.

Changes

These rule changes are as follows: FOID card holders, who submit their renewal application will remain valid during the duration of the state’s disaster proclamation and for a period of 12 months following the termination of the disaster, even if their renewal application is/was not submitted prior to expiration. CCL licensees, who submit their renewal application, will remain valid during the duration of the state’s disaster proclamation and for a period of 12 months following its termination, even if their CCL renewal application was not submitted prior to expiration.

CCL licensees will not be required to immediately submit proof of three-hour training with their CCL renewal application. CCL licensees will need to submit proof of their three-hour renewal training within 12 months following the termination of the state’s disaster proclamation in order to maintain the validity of their CCL license. ISP will continue to enforce both FOID and CCL prohibitors. FOID card holders who receive revocation notices shall return their FOID and Firearm Disposition Record form to the Illinois State Police. CCL holders who receive revocation notices shall return their CCL license to the Illinois State Police. These new rules are effective immediately.

Seven things to consider when buying a shed

Invest in quality materials. Spending a little more and using quality materials can ensure it lasts long enough to be cost-effective. The right materials will be resistant to splitting, cracking, decay, and insect damage.

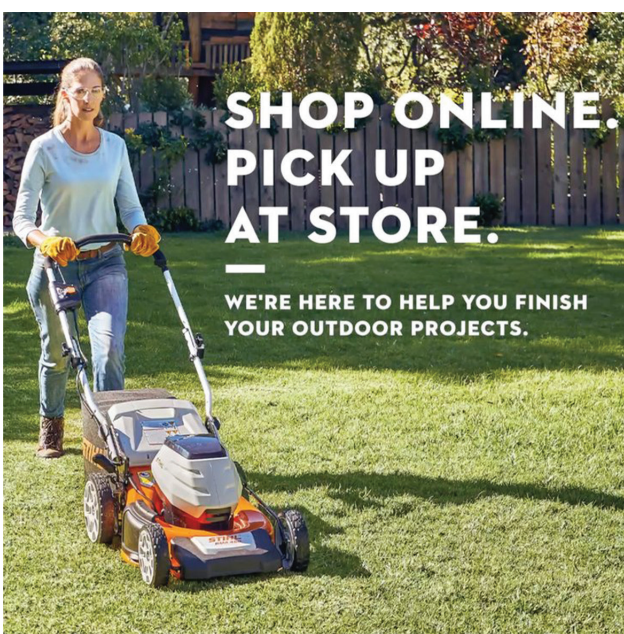
Prepare the site well. A proper foundation for the shed is almost as important as the shed itself. You cannot just drop the shed on the lawn and leave it, as the shed can sink or structural issues may arise if it is placed on a weak base.



Blend into the environment. Surround the shed with shrubs or plants so that it blends into the yard and complements the space.

Deck out the interior. Use every storage tool at your disposal to maximize floor, wall and even rafter space for storage. Plan where items will be kept and customize the storage options around those locations.

The dangers of mowing too low

SPRING marks the return of many things. Trees and flowers begin to bloom again in spring, while warmer temperatures are welcomed back with open arms. Grass also begins to grow again in the spring. That means it's not too long before homeowners have

to dust off their lawn mowers and get to work. Those who don't necessarily enjoy mowing the lawn may be tempted to cut their grass very low, as doing so can mean longer intervals between mowing sessions. However, mowing grass too low can have a very adverse effect on a lawn.



Cutting too low can injure the grass. Cutting grass too low can injure the grass, creating what's essentially a domino effect of problems to come. Injured grass will focus on its recovery efforts, thereby making it vulnerable to other issues.

Cutting too low promotes weed growth. Injured grass is vulnerable to invaders, including weeds and insects. Weeds and insects can attack grass as it recovers from injury, and before homeowners know it, their lawns are overcome with a host of problems.

Cutting too low allows crabgrass to thrive. Crabgrass needs ample sunlight to grow. By cutting grass too low, homeowners may

unknowingly be promoting crabgrass growth. Crabgrass is unsightly and can rob surrounding grass of the moisture it needs to grow. So lawns cut too low may not only lose their lush appeal thanks to the unattractive appearance of crabgrass, but also because areas surrounding the crabgrass patches might turn brown due to lack of water.

Cutting too low can stress the grass. Cutting too low also makes lawns vulnerable to summer heat. Without blades tall enough to block some of the summer sun, grass can quickly succumb to summer heat, leading to dried out, discolored lawns.

Plants are vulnerable to ozone, too

HUMAN beings are not the only living organisms vulnerable to ground level ozone. According to the Environmental Protection Agency, ground level ozone occurs as a result of chemical reactions between pollutants, such as those produced by cars, power plants and refineries, and sunlight. Humans exposed to ground level ozone may be vulnerable to respiratory problems, such as shortness of breath and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, or COPD. But plants are vulnerable to ground level ozone, too.

When sufficient ozone enters the leaves of a sensitive plant, it can slow the plant's growth and increase its risk of disease and damage resulting from insects and make it more vulnerable to injury caused by severe weather. Ground level ozone also can reduce photosynthesis, the process in which plants convert sunlight to energy so they can survive and grow. Black cherry, quaking aspen, tulip poplar, and white pine are just some of the trees that are sensitive and potentially vulnerable to ozone exposure.

When plants suffer because of ozone exposure, the result produces a ripple effect that impacts the entire ecosystem, adversely affecting species diversity, habitat quality and water and nutrient cycles.

Simple ways to prevent dog-related lawn damage

DOGS love spending time outdoors. Dog owners with yards know that dogs benefit greatly from some exercise in the backyard. While that time might be great for dogs, it can take its toll on lawns.

Dog urine and feces can adversely affect the look and health of a lush green lawn. Nitrogen is essential to healthy soil, but only at certain levels. When those levels are exceeded, the result can be lawn damage. According to The Spruce Pets, an advisory site that offers practical tips and training advices to pet owners, this is what happens when pets frequently urinate on grass. Urine is naturally high in nitrogen, so when pets urinate on lawns, the grass might turn yellow or brown due to the excess nitrogen content. Nitrogen also is present in lawn fertilizers, further exacerbating the problem for pet owners who fertilize their lawns.

In addition to urine damage, dogs can trample frosted grass, contributing to problems that may not become evident until spring, and get into areas like gardens where they wreak additional havoc.

Pet owners who want to let their dogs run free in the yard but don't want damaged grass may be tempted to put their pooches in diapers or confine them to crates when letting them outside. But such an approach isn't necessary. In fact, some simple strategies can be highly effective at

preventing dog-related lawn damage.

Speak with a landscaper about planting new grass. Certain types of grass, such as Bermuda grass, can withstand dog damage better than others. Local climate will dictate which types of grass are likely to thrive in a given area, so speak with a professional landscaper about the viability of planting new grass.

Install fencing. Pet owners with expansive yards can install fencing that allows dogs to spend time exercising outdoors without granting them access to the entire property. Large dogs will need more room than small ones, but try to build fenced-in areas that allow dogs to run freely and get the exercise they need to stay healthy.

Work with a dog trainer. Dog trainers might be able to work with dogs so they only urinate in certain areas of the yard, greatly reducing the damage they can cause to a lawn. Trainers also might help curb digging and clawing behaviors that can damage lawns as well as gardens.

Consider hardscaping. Hardscaping might be most effective for pet owners with small properties. Hardscaping does not include grass and can add visual appeal to a property while saving pet owners the headaches of dealing with dog-related lawn damage.

Dogs need time outdoors, and homeowners can take various steps to protect their lawns from dog-related damage.

Did you know?

WHEN planning spring landscapes, homeowners should always group plants with similar water needs together. According to the U.S. Department of Energy, grouping plants with similar water needs together helps to conserve water, which can be an especially useful strategy if or when drought restrictions go into effect in summer.

Homeowners also can embrace additional strategies to landscape with water conservation in mind. For

example, aerating soil helps to improve water flow to plants' roots and reduces water runoff, helping to ensure that plants get all of the water they need while reducing the likelihood that homeowners will have to use excessive amounts of water to keep plants healthy.

In addition, using low-water-using types of grass can help homeowners who live in areas prone to drought conserve water while still maintaining lush, green lawns.

Rochelle Wrestling Club

Building the future

Youth program growing next generation of Hub grapplers

ROCHELLE — The Rochelle Township High School wrestling program has qualified at least two competitors for the IHSA State Championships in each of the last four seasons. Six different individuals have represented the Hubs in Champaign during that span, with three of them (Alex Harvey, Eddie Villalobos and Ben Harvey) bringing home medals and top-5 finishes.

Other than wearing purple and white, what else do Rochelle’s recent state qualifiers have in common? Five of them, including the three state medalists as well as qualifiers Gavin Ansteth and Ehren Metzger, started wrestling long before high school, competing with the Rochelle Wrestling Club, which has blossomed into one of the Hub City’s premier feeder programs.

The Rochelle Wrestling Club recently capped off a successful 2019-20

season, qualifying six individuals for the IKWF State Championships and taking home two Senior Division trophies during the postseason. The Junior Hubs recorded 78 first-place finishes across five divisions this season while advancing 19 individuals to the IKWF Sectional in Rochelle.

“Our kids competed very well throughout the year and we saw improvements every weekend,” club president Derek Johnson and head coach Joe Tourdot said. “Wrestling is a tough sport, both physically and mentally, so dedication and improvement are all we ask from our kids. . . . We do our best to teach our kids the basics so they can go out and be competitive every weekend.”

Over 80 athletes registered with the Rochelle Wrestling Club this season, and the club has doubled its number of volunteer coaches. The club has doubled in size over the last seven years, and the

club has formed a stronger connection with the RTHS wrestling program, which had coaches attend at least one practice a week this season to work with the young kids.

“The reason for the growth and success is due to the countless hours that our parents contribute by taking kids to and from practice and traveling to

tournaments every weekend,” Johnson and Tourdot said. “We have doubled the number of volunteer coaches, and that allows us to get more one-on-one time with groups to teach new moves and correct mistakes.”

2019 marked a historic moment for the Rochelle Wrestling Club, as middle-schooler Kaiden Morris

became the first IKWF state champion in program history. Morris was one of six state qualifiers (Tommy Tourdot, Xavier Villalobos, Erich Metzger, Lauro Cabral and Roman Villalobos) this season, and with dozens of champions battling and improving at the lower levels, the future of wrestling in the Hub City looks brighter than ever before.

“We’d like to see them compete through high school and hopefully see some wrestle in college,” Johnson and Tourdot said. “We believe the more successful our club is, the better our high school team will be. The real reward is seeing the success in our high school program and knowing all the hours we put in were worth it.”

Quinonez commits to Mount Mercy University

Rochelle senior track standout Gyvanziel Quinonez has been striving to compete at the collegiate level for the last five years. While his final season with the Hubs has been cut short due to the coronavirus pandemic, Quinonez has found his future home, where he'll not only be able to continue his track career, but his soccer career as well.

Quinonez has committed to playing soccer and running track at Mount Mercy University in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, where he plans to study biological sciences in order to pursue a career in sports medicine. Quinonez said he was motivated to choose Mount Mercy after forming an immediate connection with assistant track and field coach Tad Hulst.

"Coach Hulst was very influential in my decision," Quinonez said. "He not only made sure that my schooling would be affordable, but he helped make the whole process of connecting with the coaching staff and the other athletes easy for me... Seeing his display of kindness was when I knew that Mount Mercy would be the right community for me. I'm looking forward to the new training, competition and people who will push me to higher limits."

Quinonez emerged as one of Rochelle's top middle-distance runners during his

sophomore season, and he's since developed into a consistent contributor in the 800-meter run, where he's nearly qualified for the IHSA State Championships each of the last two seasons. Quinonez has also excelled in the 1600-meter relay, the 3200-meter relay and the 3200-meter run. He holds a personal record of 1:57.77 in the 800, 4:44.84 in the 1600 and 10:43.14 in the 3200.

"Gyvanziel is a talented athlete with untapped potential," Rochelle head boys track coach John Dobbs said. "When Gyvanziel sets goals for himself and applies himself to achieve those goals, he's very successful in reaching those goals. I wish him the best of luck in his future endeavors."

In addition to spending four years with the RTHS track and field program, Quinonez totaled four seasons with the RTHS soccer program and three seasons as a starting varsity defender. His efforts helped the Hubs set multiple school records in 2018, finishing 20-1-1 overall with both a Northern Illinois Big 12 Championship and an IHSA 2A Regional Championship.

"I think Gyvanziel's work ethic is awesome," Rochelle head boys soccer coach Brad Male said. "He dedicates himself really well and he puts his mind into everything he does. He's always trying his best and I think that's where I've seen him progress the most."

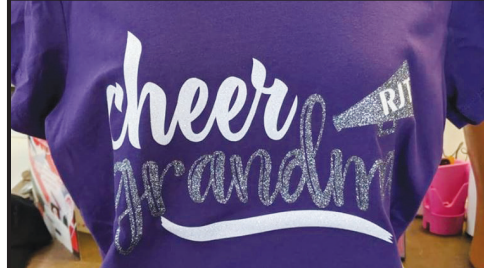

2020 spring soccer season canceled due to COVID-19

ROCHELLE — The Rochelle regional branch of the American Youth Soccer Organization (AYSO) has cancelled the 2020 spring season in an effort to prevent the spread of the coronavirus pandemic. Regional commissioner

Ben Thorne published a letter on the Rochelle regional branch's Facebook page Thursday evening. In the letter, Thorne writes that the national AYSO branch, which has postponed all spring soccer activities until further no-

tice, is working on a way to streamline refunds for families who had signed children up to play this spring.

"It is with a saddened heart and much deliberation that we have decided to cancel spring soccer

season due to the threat of the COVID-19 virus," Thorne wrote. "We have been reviewing information from our federal, state & local governments, CDC, as well as AYSO National and no one can agree on when a return to

'normal' will be. There is no definitive answer... This is not a decision that we came to lightly. Our hard-working volunteers put a lot of effort into forming teams and finding coaches to make spring season a go. As well as knowing that the

kids were looking forward to a fun season of soccer. Ultimately though we take the threat of COVID-19 virus seriously and the health of our soccer families, players, volunteers and community is our number one priority."

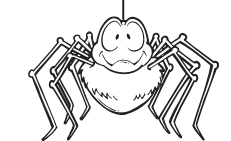

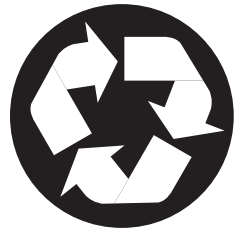

How the \$2 trillion CARES Act will assist local residents, businesses



The CARES Act

- \$250 billion to make unemployment insurance available to more categories of workers and to extend the duration of benefits to 39 weeks from the 26 weeks typical in most states. It would also provide an extra \$600 a week for four months.
- \$301 billion in direct payments to households.
- \$349 billion in loans to small businesses, with the amount spent on payroll, rent or utilities converting into grants that don't have to be repaid.
- \$500 billion for loans, loan guarantees or other aid to businesses, states and municipalities—including the possibility that the government will take direct equity stakes in distressed companies. Of the total, \$29 billion is set aside for cargo and passenger airlines, and \$17 billion is for businesses deemed critical to national security, such as Boeing. The remaining \$454 billion would go to backstop losses in lending facilities established or expanded by the Federal Reserve.
- \$32 billion in grants to cover wages at passenger air carriers, cargo air carriers and contractors.
- \$150 billion in direct aid to states, distributed according to population size. A municipality could apply to receive aid directly, reducing the amount available to the rest of the state.
- \$221 billion in a variety of tax benefits for businesses, including allowing businesses to defer payroll taxes, which finance Medicare and Social Security, for the rest of the year. It would also temporarily allow businesses to claim deductions using today's losses against past profits to claim quick refunds for cash infusions.
- \$340 billion in supplemental spending, which includes \$117 billion for hospitals and veterans' care. It also includes \$25 billion mostly for public transit to make up for revenue lost because of dwindling ridership.

Households and Workers

Individual checks

The CARES Act provides for direct payments of \$1,200 to adults and \$500 per child to American households, structured as tax refunds to allow the Internal Revenue Service to distribute the funds quickly.

There is no provision for future direct payments in the event the economic disruption lasts into the later spring. The direct grants are phased out for upper income brackets, starting with \$75,000 of

individual income.

The grants aren't available at all, for example, for individuals without children making more than \$99,000 and married couples without children making more than \$198,000.

Unemployed workers

The CARES Act would extend the duration of jobless benefits to 39 weeks from 26 available in most states, and includes a \$600-a-week increase for the first four months, with the bonus payment avail-

able through July 31.

These benefits would be extended to contract workers, freelancers and other nontraditional workers, who lack benefits in some states. The aim is to replace lost wages as completely as possible.

Freelancers

The CARES Act expands some benefits and grants to independent contractors, such as Uber drivers and freelance film editors, that normally go only to employees or small businesses. For example, it extends unemployment benefits to self-employed

workers, including independent contractors, freelancers and other nontraditional workers who are unemployed, partially unemployed or unable to work because of COVID-19.

It includes a \$600-a-week increase on top of current levels of unemployment benefits for four months. Independent contractors also can apply for the \$10 billion set aside for emergency EIDL—economic injury disaster loan—funds, which are normally available only to a narrower category of small businesses.

Personal Financing and Taxes

Bankruptcy

According to the CARES Act, the law ensures that people who file for bankruptcy don't have to use stimulus checks to repay past debt, and it extends the time that bankrupt people have to repay a portion of their debt as a condition to getting a fresh start. The current repayment time limit is five years; the bill extends the repayment time frame to seven years.

bearance of up to 360 days to borrowers who say they have been harmed by the coronavirus outbreak. Servicers are prohibited from initiating foreclosure and processing foreclosure-related evictions for 60 days beginning March 18. Owners of multifamily properties can request a forbearance of up to 90 days, during which tenants cannot be evicted for nonpayment of rent or other fees.

Retirement

According to the CARES Act, the law temporarily loosens the rules on hardship distributions from retirement accounts, giving people affected by the crisis access to up to \$100,000 of their retirement savings without a 10 percent penalty. The law doubles the amount 401(k) participants can take in loans from an account for the next six months to the lower of \$100,000 or 100 percent of the account balance. (IRAs don't permit loans.)

For retirees, the law suspends for 2020 the mandatory distributions the government requires most



to take from tax-deferred 401(k)s and individual retirement accounts starting at either age 70½ or age 72.

Student loans

Per the CARES Act, the law would allow most Americans with federal student loans to suspend their monthly payments through Sept. 30, 2020, without any interest accruing. It would also enable employers to make tax-exempt contribu-

tions toward their workers' student-loan payments.

Taxes

Under the CARES Act, people who don't itemize their deductions would be able to claim up to \$300 for charitable contributions. Businesses get the ability to apply losses from 2018, 2019 or 2020 to past years' profits and claim refunds. Restaurants and retailers would benefit from the

fixing of a mistake in the 2017 tax law that curbed their depreciation deductions on renovations.

Employers would be able to defer paying their share of 2020 payroll taxes. They could then make half of those payments in 2021 and the other half in 2022. In addition, the bill creates a new tax credit for retaining employees that's aimed at companies that are too large to benefit from the

small-business assistance elsewhere in the bill.

Those employers would be able to get a tax credit equal to 50 percent of payroll. That is limited to \$10,000 per employee per quarter, and for employers with more than 100 employees, it is available only to those companies and nonprofits that had their businesses limited or closed by government actions.

Businesses and Industries

Airlines

Under the CARES Act, for passenger airlines, the bill includes \$25 billion in direct funding for worker salaries and benefits, as well as up to \$25 billion in loans and loan guarantees. The bill hews to what airlines had been asking for. Carriers had lobbied aggressively for direct grants rather than just loans, warning that without an immediate infusion of cash, they would have to make sharp job cuts.

The bill also includes \$3 billion in assistance to keep paying contract workers that provide airline catering, baggage loading, ticketing and check-in, and other services at airports. Cargo airlines will be eligible to receive \$4 billion in loans and guarantees, and \$4 billion in payroll assistance.

In exchange for the payroll grants, carriers must agree not to furlough, lay off or cut pay for employees until Sept. 30. Assistance also hinges on companies agreeing not to buy back shares or pay dividends, and to limits on executive compensation.

The package also allows the Transportation Department to direct airlines to maintain specific flights based on their schedules on March 1, before carriers had instituted the deepest cuts to their flying. This would include services to rural communities and to support delivery of health-care-related cargo.

Banks

The CARES Act delays implementation of a new accounting rule that would have required banks to sock away reserves for any estimated loan losses all at once, instead of spreading them out over the life of the loan. The Act gives the office of the comptroller of the currency the authority to allow banks to make loans that would typically trip up size restrictions. Smaller community banks with less than \$10 billion in assets get more lending flexibility through a higher maximum leverage ratio and more wiggle room if they exceed it. Banks will also get more leeway on how they account for troubled consumer loans,



allowing them to work with struggling borrowers who have fallen behind on their payments.

Energy

The CARES Act contains no major provisions to specifically aid the U.S. energy industry. Beleaguered U.S. oil producers had sought a range of remedies, including preferential tax treatment, direct subsidies and a \$3 billion purchase of oil by the federal government for the Strategic Petroleum Reserve. The renewable energy industry had sought extensions to tax provisions that would have helped wind and solar developers secure valuable tax credits even if there were construction delays.

Farmers

The CARES Act directs more than \$48 billion to agriculture and nutrition programs, helping cushion the blow for producers reeling from the latest in a string of hits to the U.S. farm economy, as prices sank for corn, soybeans, wheat and cattle. The law designates \$14 billion to replenish the Commodity Credit Corp., a Depression-era program designed to stabilize farm

incomes, and \$9.5 billion to support producers of specialty crops, livestock and dairy, as well as those who supply farmers markets, restaurants and schools.

Health industry

The CARES Act adds \$27 billion to an emergency fund that could give a boost to dozens of projects by pharmaceutical companies and academic groups developing drugs and vaccines against coronavirus. The emergency fund received a smaller amount of funding under a coronavirus response act signed earlier in March. There is no COVID-19 vaccine, but dozens are in development. The package allows the government to take steps to ensure that products developed with the emergency funding will be "affordable in the commercial market," but that these steps shouldn't delay development of the products.

The bill also includes provisions to increase reporting of potential shortages from drug manufacturers and companies that make active pharmaceutical ingredients, which are the building

blocks of prescription drugs. Many of these raw materials are produced overseas and drawn more attention during the virus outbreak. Companies that make respirators and other medical devices would be required to report to the federal government potential supply chain interruptions.

Hotels

The hotel industry last week asked the White House for a \$150 billion financial-aid package, targeted specifically for hospitality companies. What it got instead from the CARES Act is a patchwork of loans, grants and tax help, much of it through the \$350 billion in loans and grants for small businesses. The majority of U.S. hoteliers qualify as businesses with fewer than 500 employees, making less than \$35 million in annual revenue.

The lodging industry even scored a victory in getting language in the Senate bill that defined each individual hotel as its own business. Hotel owners with several properties had been concerned that they would not qualify as a small business because taken together, all their properties would have

pushed them over the current Small Business Administration's definition.

The federal boost in unemployment insurance will help the many hotel employees who have been furloughed across the U.S. Larger hotel companies can apply for loans through the Treasury Department's economic stabilization fund. But few in the lodging industry expect travel to bounce back by late spring, or even soon after.

Postal Service

Under the CARES Act, the financially strained U.S. Postal Service is getting a \$10 billion Treasury loan to help the mail carrier during the pandemic. That should be welcome news for Amazon.com Inc., United Parcel Service Inc. and, to a lesser extent, FedEx Corp., which rely on postal workers for last-mile delivery in certain places.

The Postal Service is only allowed by law to raise its net debt by \$3 billion a year, so the bill loosens that restriction. But it does come with some strings attached. Mainly, the Postal Service can only use the financing for operating expenses and not to pay down outstanding debt. The bill also requires

the Postal Service to prioritize medical shipments and allows temporary delivery points to protect workers and recipients of mail.

Private equity

According to the CARES Act, private-equity firms will likely find it a challenge to get access to stimulus funds. Based on available details of the stimulus package, private-equity-owned businesses wouldn't be explicitly barred from receiving assistance. But government lending requirements could prevent them from unlocking the aid, say lawyers, lobbyists and regulatory experts.

Railroads

Per the CARES Act, national passenger railroad Amtrak secured about \$1 billion to cover revenue losses related to the coronavirus. The railroad industry won enhanced unemployment benefits that account for its workers not being covered under traditional state-run unemployment programs. Railroad workers instead receive unemployment benefits under a program administered by the Railroad Retirement Board.

The bill removes a seven-day waiting period to collect unemployment and provides \$50 million to cover the benefits tied to that waiver. It also provides \$425 million to double biweekly unemployment payments to \$1,200 through July.

Small

businesses

The CARES Act would allow businesses and nonprofits with up to 500 workers in a single location to apply through qualifying banks for loans backed by the Small Business Administration. The loans would convert into grants that don't have to be repaid for amounts spent on items such as payroll, rent or utilities, with the grants reduced when workers are laid off. The loans would be capped at \$10 million and cover wages up to \$100,000 a year.
