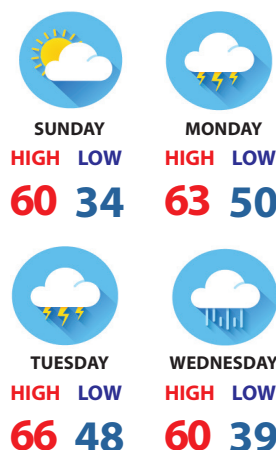

Plant testing complete

All Rochelle Foods employees tested for COVID-19 Thursday and Friday

ROCHELLE — Testing for COVID-19 of Rochelle Foods employees and other staff that work in the facility concluded Friday. A total of 792 employees were tested Thursday and Friday.

There were already several people that had the testing prior to the two-day testing event.

Testing of Rochelle Foods employees began on site at the plant on Thursday morning.

Ogle County Health Department Administrator Kyle Auman said Thursday that he anticipates an increase in positive cases in Ogle County as a result of the testing.

"This drive through testing event was planned and implemented in less than 48 hours. The success of this event was possible with the help from partnerships with Tom Richter, Ogle County Emergency Manager; Brian VanVickle, Ogle County Sheriff; Rochelle Fire Department; profes-

sionals at the Emergency Operations Center; Rochelle Community Hospital; KSB Hospital and Rochelle Foods," Auman said Thursday.

The hospitals and health department joined forces to provide the COVID-19 testing of employees after the food processing operation was

ordered to cease production by the health department late last week.

Tents were set up in the parking lot at Rochelle Foods on Wednesday to accommodate for employee testing Thursday and Friday.

"Rochelle Community Hospital is proud to partner with Ogle County

Public Health and our partners at KSB Hospital to help investigate a substantial COVID-19 outbreak," Jim Carle, Rochelle Community Hospital's Chief Ancillary Officer said. "The cooperation among all involved has been nothing short of excellent. All of the planning and preparation has paid great dividends."

On Friday, April 17, the health department notified Rochelle Foods and parent company Hormel Foods that the company had 48 hours to close the plant due to the number of positive COVID-19 cases associated with employees at the facility.

RCH to receive part of \$5.5 million funding

ROCHELLE — On Wednesday, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services through the Health Resources and Services Administration awarded \$5,564,922 to Illinois to combat the COVID-19 pandemic in rural communities. Specifically, this funding was awarded to the Illinois Department of Public Health as an investment to support small rural hospitals in Illinois.

"Today's funding gives rural hospitals in Illinois critical support to build up their capacity for fighting COVID-19 in their communities," said HHS Secretary Alex Azar. "This funding, secured by President Trump from Congress, will build on historic efforts by the Trump Administration to help all Americans in Illinois access the care they need during the pandemic."

Part of that funding will be distributed locally to Rochelle Community Hospital.

"This funding is the result of a grant that assists rural hospitals such as Rochelle Community Hospital and since we qualified we should be receiving approximately \$84,000," RCH CEO Gregg Olson

Pritzker extends stay-at-home order

Modifications to include reopening of golf courses, requirement that face covers be worn in public

ROCHELLE — Illinois Gov. JB Pritzker announced during his daily COVID-19 briefing Thursday afternoon that he will sign an executive order to extend the current stay-at-home order through Saturday, May 30. The current order is scheduled to expire on April 30.

Pritzker said the new stay-at-home order will have modifications including a requirement that all residents must wear masks when entering the public. Additionally, essential businesses and manufacturers must provide masks or face covering for workers who cannot abide by social distancing guidelines. Pritzker said that elective surgeries will be allowed, with some restrictions, and retail stores will be allowed to reopen with pick-up and online services only.

Pritzker said the state will implement a step-by-step process of reopening state parks beginning May 1. Moreover, golf courses will be allowed to reopen under the modified stay-at-home order, and outdoor activities including fishing and boating with two-or-fewer people will be allowed.

Greenhouses, nurseries and garden centers will be allowed to reopen as essential businesses under the modified stay-at-home order. The Illinois Department of Public Health reported 1,826 new cases Thursday, increasing the state's total to 36,934 cases.

"The numbers present us with only one choice," Pritzker said. "We are in possibly the most difficult part of this journey. I know how badly we want our

normal lives back... This is the part where we have to dig in, and we have to understand that the sacrifices that we've made as a state are working. We have to keep going a little while longer to finish the journey."

Pritzker said the state's stay-at-home has resulted in a lower-but-later peak for coronavirus cases, which had originally been projected for mid-April but has been pushed back to mid-May. Since August 2019, Pritzker said the state has increased its bed count to over 3,100 and its ventilator count to over 3,200. Moreover, 5,000 out-of-state and former medical professionals have applied for licenses to enter the battle against COVID-19.

"If we let up now, we wouldn't have anywhere near the hospital capacity we need," Pritzker said. "The projections are clear. If we lifted the stay-at-home, we would see our deaths per day shoot into the thousands by the end of May. That would last well into the summer. Our hospitals would be full, and very sick people would have nowhere to go."

RCH: Funding will come from Small Rural Hospital Improvement Program

HRSA's Federal Office of Rural Health Policy received \$150 million through the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act to assist hospitals across the nation, funded through the Small Rural Hospital Improvement Program, respond to this public health emergency.

The CARES Act provides hospitals maximum flexibility in how they respond to COVID-19 within their communities, including the provision of testing and laboratory services as well as the purchase of personal protective equipment to minimize COVID-19 exposure.

"There's been a great deal of cross-training that has taken place in preparation for a possible surge in COVID-19 patients," Olson explained. "Some of our staff members have voluntarily taken some time off, some have taken low census and it is the combination of all these changes that has helped our situation. RCH staff are really doing a great job adapting to the pandemic as best we can. We have a lot of area partners, especially the Ogle

Each hospital across the nation is combating COVID-19 differently.

"As the nation combats COVID-19, hospitals, particularly in rural communities, play an integral role in care delivery and are on the frontlines of this battle," said HRSA Administrator Tom Engels. "Timely access to this funding enables them to expand their ability to continue to provide care while adapting to the unique challenges posed by this pandemic."

Each hospital is also seeing a different influx of patients and levels of care, not

just in treating the virus, that monies received from the grant will be beneficial in helping recoup lost revenues on the hospital's day-to-day operations.

"With limited access to the hospital for the protection of our patients, staff and visitors, and suspension of non-essential services and programs for now, as per Governor Pritzker's executive order, the result has been a 50 percent business loss overall. There are areas that are experiencing high volumes, such as the laboratory, in relation to COVID-19 testing," Olson said.

RCH's portion of funding will come from the Small Rural Hospital Improvement Program grant category.

HOPE hosting virtual CincoK

Rock River Valley Blood Center to collect plasma from recovered patients

ROCKFORD — The Rock River Valley Blood Center (RRVBC) is ready to collect plasma from recovered COVID-19 patients, joining other blood centers nationwide in an effort to help care for individuals affected by the virus.

Convalescent plasma is collected from recovered patients and administered to people currently diagnosed with COVID-19. Donors must have proof of a positive nasal swab test for COVID-19 and be 28 days out from their last symptoms. They also must meet the requirements to donate blood.

While there is no proven treatment for COVID-19, it is possible that convalescent plasma collected from recovered COVID-19 patients contains antibodies to SARS-CoV-2 (the virus that causes COVID-19) and might provide passive immunity for some COVID-19 patients.

RRVBC is actively seeking recovered COVID-19 patients who had a positive nasal swab test and would be willing to be a donor. Those interested should call 815-965-8751 or visit rrvbc.org.

As of April 17, 24 total cases — 19 of the 41 positive cases in Ogle County, three in Whiteside County and two in Winnebago County at that time — were attributed to Rochelle Foods employees.

According to Ogle County Health Department officials several attempts to assist in the control of the outbreak were made, including: Recommendations for additional testing, additional steps for employee monitoring, recommendations for additional sanitation processes, isolation of positive cases, and quarantine of close contacts and household contacts, but to no avail, and the mandatory closure order was issued.

The plant did comply with the closure within the ordered 48 hours.

“We continue to take every step we can to ensure the health and safety of our team members and our communities. Over the next two days, we are collaborating with the county and local hospitals working to test our team members as we work toward reopening our facility on May 4,” Rochelle Foods plant manager Bill Rice said in a released statement Thursday.

in order to return to work on the projected May 4 re-opening date.

“It was important for us to quickly test all Rochelle Food employees for COVID-19 to allow the company to identify their workforce that is safe to return back to work in an expeditious manner. In addition, this effort will also help our surrounding counties in controlling further spread of this COVID-19 infection outbreak,” Dr. Pratip Nag of KSB Hospital said.

“Food production is in the definition of essential business. Protecting the workforce and getting this plant up and running as soon as possible were our top priorities. KSB’s prior experience in drive thru testing helped address potential process errors involved in mass testing,” Aaqil Khan of KSB Hospital said.

Employee testing was started early Wednesday morning and split between two tents.

“This scale hasn’t been seen before and operationalizing in less than 48 hours made planning a challenge. Our teams started registering patients at 2 a.m. [Wednesday] and our lab team was putting in orders at 4 a.m. Onsite we split the process across two tents. The teams at the first tent quickly identified patients, provided lab

documents and educated the individuals on safety precautions after they were tested. The second tent had multiple 2-person collection teams allowing us to safely collect and handle the specimen,” Khan explained. “With three car lanes of testing, we were able to respond to varying volumes of traffic and test over 600 individuals in less than eight hours. We laid out a framework for mass testing and the partnership between the key players made it happen.”

Each employee tested was given clear instructions on quarantine, staying home and sanitization procedures. Tested employees were also instructed to continue to monitor symptoms such as fever, cough, shortness of breath and loss of taste or smell. Individuals will remain quarantined until testing results start coming in over the next few days.

County health departments in the region will work with Rochelle Foods staff on an individual basis regarding test results.

Rochelle Foods confirmed that employees will continue to be employed, paid and receive health benefits throughout the closure of the plant.

“The Ogle County Health Department will continue to work with Rochelle Foods to get the facility up and running again,” Auman said Friday. “We would like to thank everyone involved in making it possible to test this many individuals in such a short time.”

Health department officials also said all employees asked to test complied.

As of Friday afternoon, the Ogle County Health Department was reporting 78 positive cases of COVID-19 in the county.

Kishwaukee College EMT and paramedic program relaunches this fall

MALTA — Kishwaukee College’s emergency medical services program, which includes emergency medical technician and paramedic training, is relaunching this fall.

The program is made available through coordination with Northwestern Medicine Kishwaukee Hospital EMS System. It is accredited through the Committee on Accreditation of Educational Programs. No application is required for entry into the EMT program. Applications for the paramedic program are accepted now through May 8 at 4 p.m.

EMTs and paramedics respond to emergency situations, perform various medical services and assist with transportation of patients to medical facilities. Training can help prepare someone to work in ambulance services, emergency rooms, urgent care facilities, fire departments, law enforcement or other rescue services. The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reports the median annual wage for EMTs and paramedics as \$35,400 in May 2019.

Kish’s EMT certificate program takes one semester to complete and prepares students for certification as an EMT. Students are trained in many critical skills such as CPR, giving patients oxygen and administering glucose to diabetics. EMTs can perform many medical services which do not require breaking skin such as starting an intravenous line or administering injections. No application for EMT training is required.

Both a degree and certificate option are available for paramedic at the College. Coursework includes anatomy and physiology, cardiology, medications, medical procedures and more. Certified paramedics can administer medications, provide advanced airway management, resuscitate patients and support patients with significant problems such as heart attacks or trauma. The next paramedic cohort begins Fall 2020. Applications are being accepted now through May 8, 2020.

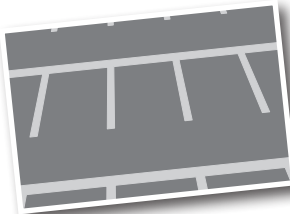

Universities and colleges will be impacted by Covid-19. Enrollments will certainly be affected as students and families struggle to find funds for college.

Why Congress needs to support your local news sources in this crisis

DURING this coronavirus pandemic, access to accurate and trustworthy information in your community is as critical to life under quarantine and as sought after as hand sanitizer and face masks.

Your local newspaper provides the news and information unique to your community. Where are the testing sites and who's eligible, which businesses are open, what is the local online unemployment benefit application process, and much more. But your access to local news and information is gravely threatened by the economic carnage COVID-19 has wrought.

While local newspapers continue to field reporters and bring news and advice from public health authorities in print and online — at considerable cost — their revenues have all but disappeared as the businesses that were their most important advertisers were shuttered. That's why America's Newspapers and other organizations representing local news providers are asking Congress to take urgent

action to ensure you don't lose your vital sources of timely and trustworthy information.

First, we're asking that Congress expand and clarify the Payroll Protection Program to ensure it covers all local newspapers and news broadcasters. While some of these outlets may be owned by large organizations, they must survive on their own. It's only fair that they should be included in any expansion of the program. These loans will keep the newspaper employees — your neighbors — on their payrolls and help get the news to you in print as well as online. We appreciate the bipartisan letter of April 19th from U.S. Senators Maria Cantwell (D-WA), John Kennedy (R-LA), Amy Klobuchar (D-MN) and John Boozman (R-AR) that requested waiving the Small Business Administration's (SBA) affiliation rule to allow local media outlets to access funding, pointing to the critical role these outlets play in keeping communities healthy and informed.

Second, we are asking that the Trump Administration direct current federal government advertising funds to local news and media outlets. These public service and informative ads could be similar to the ones running right now about the U.S. Census. They could carry critical government information about data from the CDC, access to small business loans, medical resources for families and other important topics. We're asking for a commitment that would be spent in an equitable manner across all local news providers.

We also believe that there should be an immediate relief package that is based on total newsroom employees. Some local news organizations won't survive without some type of immediate grant or infusion that is tied to the organization's employees who directly work in the newsroom.

This is not a demand for an industry bailout by local news providers. Instead, these measures recognize that local news publishers are

on the information front line of the coronavirus pandemic, providing a public service vital to keeping our communities safe, secure and sustained during this unprecedented public health crisis.

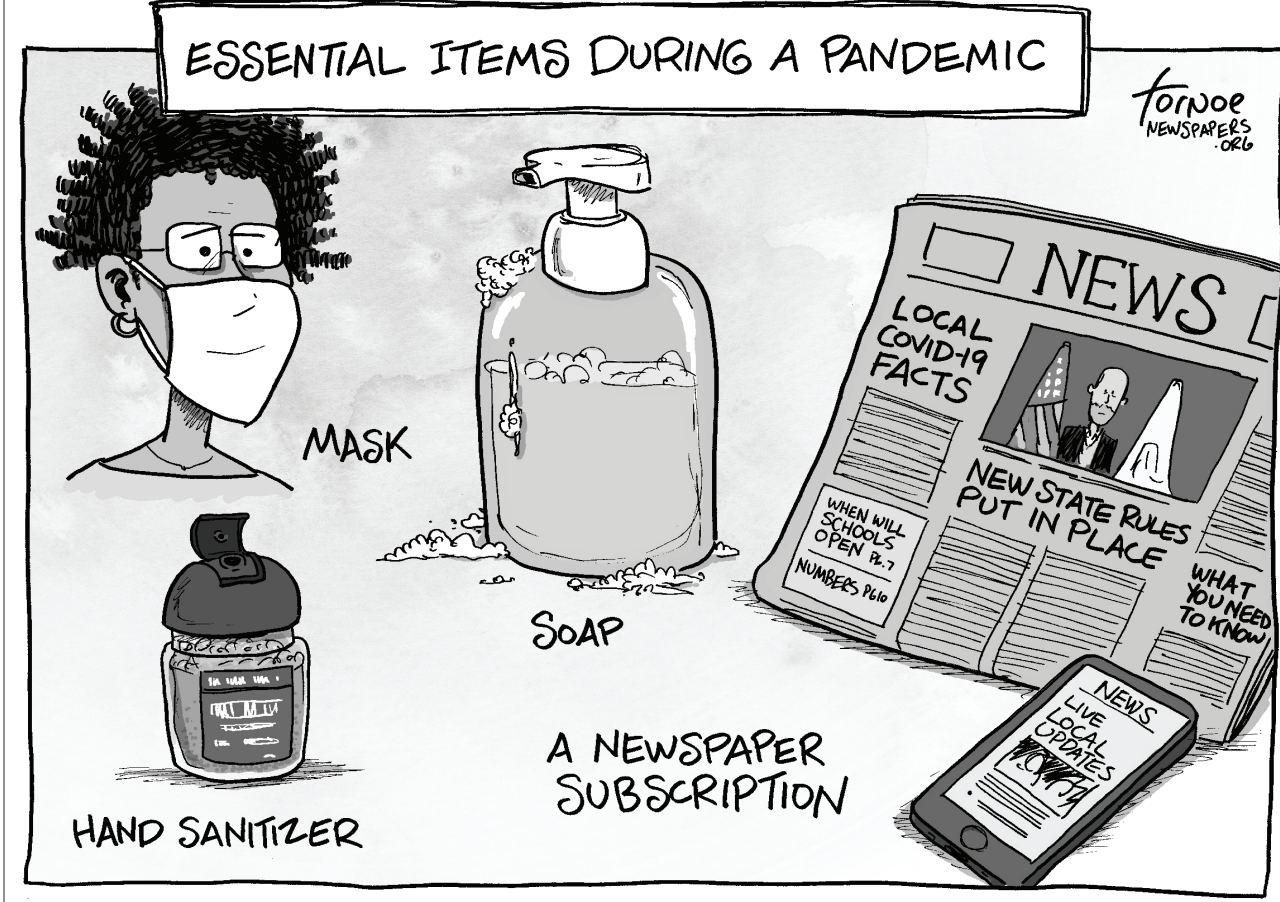
Please contact the offices of your senators and representatives in the U.S. Congress and tell them you support expanding the Payroll Protection Program to include your local news source and that the federal government should use your local newspapers or news broadcaster to convey important information through public service ads. And finally, let them know that a grant based on newsroom employees is critical at this time. Visit www.usa.gov/elected-officials for their contact information.

Take this easy action to ensure that your access to local information doesn't become another victim to the COVID-19 pandemic. Thank you and may you and your family remain safe and informed during this difficult time.

Ogle County final multiplier announced

SPRINGFIELD — Ogle County has been issued a final property assessment equalization factor of 1.0000, according to David Harris, director of the Illinois Department of Revenue.

The property assessment equalization factor, often called the "multiplier," is the method used to achieve uniform property assessments among counties, as required by law. This equalization is particularly important because some of the state's 6,600 local taxing districts overlap into two or more counties (e.g. school districts, junior college districts, fire protection districts). If there were no equalization among counties, substantial inequities among taxpayers with comparable properties would result.

Under a law passed in 1975, property in Illinois should be assessed at one-third of its market value. Farm property is assessed differently, with farm homesites and dwellings subject to regular assessing and equalization procedures, but with farmland assessed at one-third of its agriculture economic value. Farmland is not subject to the state equalization factor.

Assessments in Ogle County are at 32.99 percent of market value, based on sales of properties in 2016, 2017, and 2018.

The equalization factor currently being assigned is for 2019 taxes, payable in 2020. Last year's equalization factor for the county was 1.0000.

The final assessment equalization factor was issued after a public hearing on the tentative factor. The tentative factor issued in January 2020 was 1.0000.

The equalization factor is determined annually for each county by comparing the price of individual properties sold over the past three years to the assessed value placed on those properties by the county supervisor of assessments/county assessor.

If this three-year average level of assessment is one-third of the market value, the equalization factor will be one. If the average level of assessment is greater than one-third of market value, the equalization factor will be less than one. And if the average level of assessment is less than one-third of market value, the equalization factor will be greater than one.

A change in the equalization factor does not mean total property tax bills will increase or decrease. Tax bills are determined by local taxing bodies when they request money each year to provide services to local citizens. If the amount requested by local taxing districts is not greater than the amount received in the previous year, then total property taxes will not increase even if assessments increase.

The assessed value of an individual property determines what portion of the tax burden a specific taxpayer will assume. That individual's portion of tax responsibility is not changed by the multiplier.

Headon hitting new marks at Carroll University

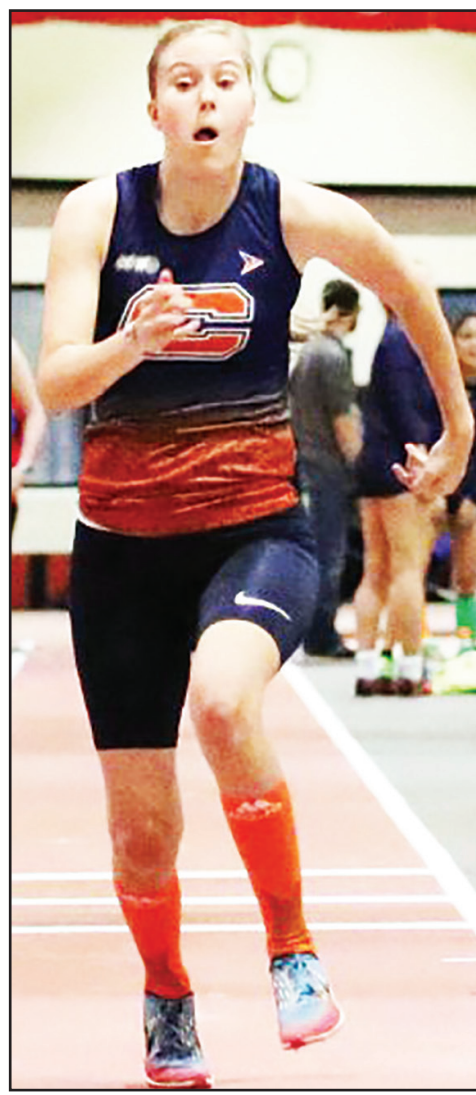
Although her freshman season was cut short because of the coronavirus, it's safe to say that former Rochelle Township High School student-athlete and U.S. Paralympian Aubrey Headon had more than enough fun with the Carroll University women's track and field program.

After setting world records throughout her high school career, Headon took her talents north to Waukesha, Wisconsin, where she competed in both the 60-meter dash and the long jump with the Pioneers this indoor season. She recorded her fastest sprint of the season during the North Central College Invitational in February, clocking in at 11.36 seconds. Her longest leap took place at the Monmouth Midwest Indoor Invitational in January, where she hit 9 feet 5 1/2 inches.

"My first season with Carroll was a lot of fun," Headon said. "I enjoyed the 60-meter dash the most because I improved my time in almost every meet... I feel that I improved the most in the 60-meter dash and I wish I could have seen how those improvements translated to the 100-meter dash, an event I want to continue getting better in, during the outdoor season."

Headon ran into some former Rochelle classmates throughout her first collegiate season including track and field standout Mason DeLille, who competes for Carthage College. The two reunited in late January at the Tadd Metzger Invitational, where Headon set her season-best mark in the 55-meter dash at 10.71 seconds. Headon said that one of her favorite freshman moments was unofficially setting the new long jump record for her classification.

Unfortunately, Headon will need to wait until her sophomore campaign to hit the outdoors with her Carroll teammates. Moreover, Headon's summer season, which would have included an attempt to make the U.S. Paralympic team for the Tokyo Olympics, will have to wait

until next year. However, Headon said she remains motivated and optimistic for the future.

"It was nice to see some other Rochelle athletes at our meets," said Headon, who's studying exercise science. "I want to thank my coaches Shawn Thielitz, Rob Bennett and Taylor Wilch. I also want to thank my high school coach, Vic Worthington, for his continued support of me."

Coronavirus Stimulus Guide

How the \$2 trillion CARES Act will assist local residents, businesses



The CARES Act

- \$250 billion to make unemployment insurance available to more categories of workers and to extend the duration of benefits to 39 weeks from the 26 weeks typical in most states. It would also provide an extra \$600 a week for four months.

- \$301 billion in direct payments to households.

- \$349 billion in loans to small businesses, with the amount spent on payroll, rent or utilities converting into grants that don't have to be repaid.

- \$500 billion for loans, loan guarantees or other aid to businesses, states and municipalities—including the possibility that the government will take direct equity stakes in distressed companies. Of the total, \$29 billion is set aside for cargo and passenger airlines, and \$17 billion is for businesses deemed critical to national security, such as Boeing. The remaining \$454 billion would go to backstop losses in lending facilities established or expanded by the Federal Reserve.

- \$32 billion in grants to cover wages at passenger air carriers, cargo air carriers and contractors.

- \$150 billion in direct aid to states, distributed according to population size. A municipality could apply to receive aid directly, reducing the amount available to the rest of the state.

- \$221 billion in a variety of tax benefits for businesses, including allowing businesses to defer payroll taxes, which finance Medicare and Social Security, for the rest of the year. It would also temporarily allow businesses to claim deductions using today's losses against past profits to claim quick refunds for cash infusions.

- \$340 billion in supplemental spending, which includes \$117 billion for hospitals and veterans' care. It also includes \$25 billion mostly for public transit to make up for revenue lost because of dwindling ridership.

Households and Workers

Individual checks

The CARES Act provides for direct payments of \$1,200 to adults and \$500 per child to American households, structured as tax refunds to allow the Internal Revenue Service to distribute the funds quickly.

There is no provision for future direct payments in the event the economic disruption lasts into the later spring. The direct grants are phased out for upper income brackets, starting with \$75,000 of

individual income.

The grants aren't available at all, for example, for individuals without children making more than \$99,000 and married couples without children making more than \$198,000.

Unemployed workers

The CARES Act would extend the duration of jobless benefits to 39 weeks from 26 available in most states, and includes a \$600-a-week increase for the first four months, with the bonus payment avail-

able through July 31.

These benefits would be extended to contract workers, freelancers and other nontraditional workers, who lack benefits in some states. The aim is to replace lost wages as completely as possible.

Freelancers

The CARES Act expands some benefits and grants to independent contractors, such as Uber drivers and freelance film editors, that normally go only to employees or small businesses. For example, it extends unemployment benefits to self-employed

workers, including independent contractors, freelancers and other nontraditional workers who are unemployed, partially unemployed or unable to work because of COVID-19.

It includes a \$600-a-week increase on top of current levels of unemployment benefits for four months. Independent contractors also can apply for the \$10 billion set aside for emergency EIDL—economic injury disaster loan—funds, which are normally available only to a narrower category of small businesses.

Personal Financing and Taxes

Bankruptcy

According to the CARES Act, the law ensures that people who file for bankruptcy don't have to use stimulus checks to repay past debt, and it extends the time that bankrupt people have to repay a portion of their debt as a condition to getting a fresh start. The current repayment time limit is five years; the bill extends the repayment time frame to seven years.

bearance of up to 360 days to borrowers who say they have been harmed by the coronavirus outbreak. Servicers are prohibited from initiating foreclosure and processing foreclosure-related evictions for 60 days beginning March 18. Owners of multifamily properties can request a forbearance of up to 90 days, during which tenants cannot be evicted for nonpayment of rent or other fees.

Credit reports

Under the CARES Act, consumers who fall behind on their debt payments won't necessarily take a hit on their credit reports. The bill requires lenders that allow struggling consumers to defer or skip loan payments to report the borrowers as current on their payments, even if they are not. Most consumers who were behind on their debts before the coronavirus crisis will continue to be reported as delinquent.

Mortgages

The CARES Act requires companies that service federally backed mortgages to grant a for-

Retirement

According to the CARES Act, the law temporarily loosens the rules on hardship distributions from retirement accounts, giving people affected by the crisis access to up to \$100,000 of their retirement savings without a 10 percent penalty. The law doubles the amount 401(k) participants can take in loans from an account for the next six months to the lower of \$100,000 or 100 percent of the account balance. (IRAs do not permit loans.)

For retirees, the law suspends for 2020 the mandatory distributions the government requires most

to take from tax-deferred 401(k)s and individual retirement accounts starting at either age 70½ or age 72.

Student loans

Per the CARES Act, the law would allow most Americans with federal student loans to suspend their monthly payments through Sept. 30, 2020, without any interest accruing. It would also enable employers to make tax-exempt contribu-

tions toward their workers' student-loan payments.

Taxes

Under the CARES Act, people who don't itemize their deductions would be able to claim up to \$300 for charitable contributions. Businesses get the ability to apply losses from 2018, 2019 or 2020 to past years' profits and claim refunds. Restaurants and retailers would benefit from the

fixing of a mistake in the 2017 tax law that curbed their depreciation deductions on renovations.

Employers would be able to defer paying their share of 2020 payroll taxes. They could then make half of those payments in 2021 and the other half in 2022. In addition, the bill creates a new tax credit for retaining employees that's aimed at companies that are too large to benefit from the

small-business assistance elsewhere in the bill.

Those employers would be able to get a tax credit equal to 50 percent of payroll. That is limited to \$10,000 per employee per quarter, and for employers with more than 100 employees, it is available only to those companies and nonprofits that had their businesses limited or closed by government actions.

Businesses and Industries

Airlines

Under the CARES Act, for passenger airlines, the bill includes \$25 billion in direct funding for worker salaries and benefits, as well as up to \$25 billion in loans and loan guarantees. The bill hews to what airlines had been asking for. Carriers had lobbied aggressively for direct grants rather than just loans, warning that without an immediate infusion of cash, they would have to make sharp job cuts.

The bill also includes \$3 billion in assistance to keep paying contract workers that provide airline catering, baggage loading, ticketing and check-in, and other services at airports. Cargo airlines will be eligible to receive \$4 billion in loans and guarantees, and \$4 billion in payroll assistance.

In exchange for the payroll grants, carriers must agree not to furlough, lay off or cut pay for employees until Sept. 30. Assistance also hinges on companies agreeing not to buy back shares or pay dividends, and to limits on executive compensation.

The package also allows the Transportation Department to direct airlines to maintain specific flights based on their schedules on March 1, before carriers had instituted the deepest cuts to their flying. This would include services to rural communities and to support delivery of health-care-related cargo.

Banks

The CARES Act delays implementation of a new accounting rule that would have required banks to sock away reserves for any estimated loan losses all at once, instead of spreading them out over the life of the loan. The Act gives the office of the comptroller of the currency the authority to allow banks to make loans that would typically trip up size restrictions. Smaller community banks with less than \$10 billion in assets get more lending flexibility through a higher maximum leverage ratio and more wiggle room if they exceed it. Banks will also get more leeway on how they account for troubled consumer loans,



allowing them to work with struggling borrowers who have fallen behind on their payments.

Energy

The CARES Act contains no major provisions to specifically aid the U.S. energy industry. Beleaguered U.S. oil producers had sought a range of remedies, including preferential tax treatment, direct subsidies and a \$3 billion purchase of oil by the federal government for the Strategic Petroleum Reserve. The renewable energy industry had sought extensions to tax provisions that would have helped wind-and-solar developers secure valuable tax credits even if there were construction delays.

Farmers

The CARES Act directs more than \$48 billion to agriculture and nutrition programs, helping cushion the blow for producers reeling from the latest in a string of hits to the U.S. farm economy, as prices sank for corn, soybeans, wheat and cattle. The law designates \$14 billion to replenish the Commodity Credit Corp., a Depression-era program designed to stabilize farm

incomes, and \$9.5 billion to support producers of specialty crops, livestock and dairy, as well as those who supply farmers markets, restaurants and schools.

Health industry

The CARES Act adds \$27 billion to an emergency fund that could give a boost to dozens of projects by pharmaceutical companies and academic groups developing drugs and vaccines against coronavirus. The emergency fund received a smaller amount of funding under a coronavirus response act signed earlier in March. There is no COVID-19 vaccine, but dozens are in development. The package allows the government to take steps to ensure that products developed with the emergency funding will be "affordable in the commercial market," but that these steps shouldn't delay development of the products.

The bill also includes provisions to increase reporting of potential shortages from drug manufacturers and companies that make active pharmaceutical ingredients, which are the building

blocks of prescription drugs. Many of these raw materials are produced overseas and drawn more attention during the virus outbreak. Companies that make respirators and other medical devices would be required to report to the federal government potential supply chain interruptions.

Hotels

The hotel industry last week asked the White House for a \$150 billion financial-aid package, targeted specifically for hospitality companies. What it got instead from the CARES Act is a patchwork of loans, grants and tax help, much of it through the \$350 billion in loans and grants for small businesses. The majority of U.S. hoteliers qualify as businesses with fewer than 500 employees, making less than \$35 million in annual revenue.

The lodging industry even scored a victory in getting language in the Senate bill that defined each individual hotel as its own business. Hotel owners with several properties had been concerned that they would not qualify as a small business because taken together, all their properties would have

pushed them over the current Small Business Administration's definition.

The federal boost in unemployment insurance will help the many hotel employees who have been furloughed across the U.S. Larger hotel companies can apply for loans through the Treasury Department's economic stabilization fund. But few in the lodging industry expect travel to bounce back by late spring, or even soon after.

Postal Service

Under the CARES Act, the financially strained U.S. Postal Service is getting a \$10 billion Treasury loan to help the mail carrier during the pandemic. That should be welcome news for Amazon.com Inc., United Parcel Service Inc. and, to a lesser extent, FedEx Corp., which rely on postal workers for last-mile delivery in certain places.

The Postal Service is only allowed by law to raise its net debt by \$3 billion a year, so the bill loosens that restriction. But it does come with some strings attached. Mainly, the Postal Service can only use the financing for operating expenses and not to pay down outstanding debt. The bill also requires

the Postal Service to prioritize medical shipments and allows temporary delivery points to protect workers and recipients of mail.

Private equity

According to the CARES Act, private-equity firms will likely find it a challenge to get access to stimulus funds. Based on available details of the stimulus package, private-equity-owned businesses wouldn't be explicitly barred from receiving assistance. But government lending requirements could prevent them from unlocking the aid, say lawyers, lobbyists and regulatory experts.

Railroads

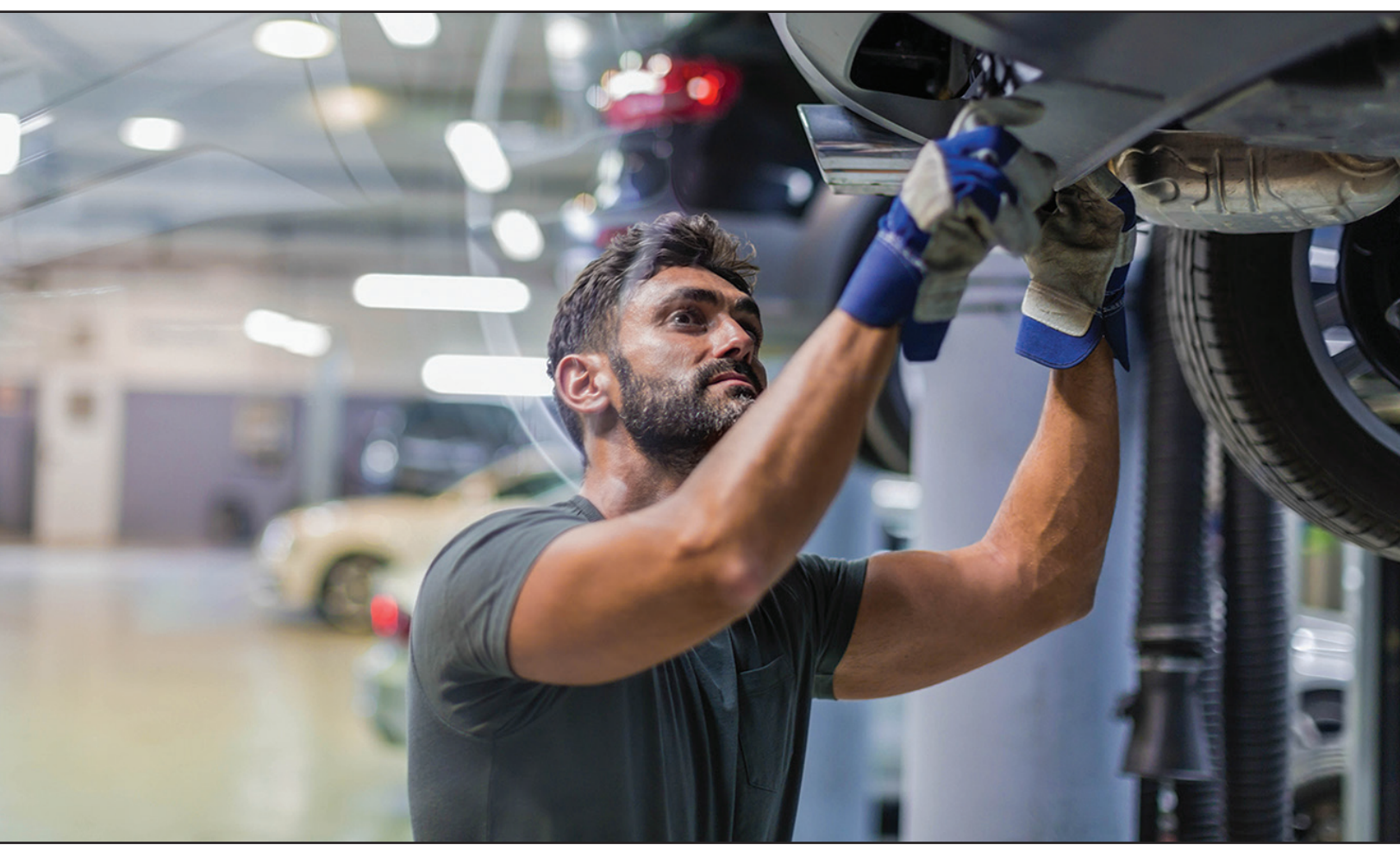
Per the CARES Act, national passenger railroad Amtrak secured about \$1 billion to cover revenue losses related to the coronavirus. The railroad industry won enhanced unemployment benefits that account for its workers not being covered under traditional state-run unemployment programs. Railroad workers instead receive unemployment benefits under a program administered by the Railroad Retirement Board.

The bill removes a seven-day waiting period to collect unemployment and provides \$50 million to cover the benefits tied to that waiver. It also provides \$425 million to double biweekly unemployment payments to \$1,200 through July.

Small

businesses

The CARES Act would allow businesses and nonprofits with up to 500 workers in a single location to apply through qualifying banks for loans backed by the Small Business Administration. The loans would convert into grants that don't have to be repaid for amounts spent on items such as payroll, rent or utilities, with the grants reduced when workers are laid off. The loans would be capped at \$10 million and cover wages up to \$100,000 a year.
