ROCHELLE – While many schools were not in session last Monday for Martin Luther King Jr. Day, Rochelle Township High School remained in session because it believes the best way to honor his legacy and teachings is by understanding, hearing and implementing his idea that all people deserve to be respected, honored and validated to realize their potential.

To do this, RTHS collected spare change and supplies during its second period classes so that they could be donated to those in need. The collection was set up not only Monday, but throughout the entire week.

In the daily announcements from Jan. 20, RTHS states that the school believes his words reflect what the school does for the community in many ways.

Maintaining momentum

Revved Up Rochelle holds meeting to
discuss community projects

ROCHELLE—Revved Up Rochelle held a Maintaining the Momentum meeting Wednesday night to discuss each of the group's progress, challenges and next steps. The meeting was held at Hicks Hall, located in the basement of the Rochelle United Methodist Church from 6 to 8 p.m., and included dinner from Ralfie's BBQ.

Since the last Revved Up meeting held on Oct. 8, each of the six groups have come together, created an action plan to accomplish their goals and put it into action. The main goal of the meeting was for all of the groups to get together in the same room and share with each other their progress, challenges and what they have planned next.

Each of the six groups works to improve a certain area of the community. They are split up into retail and dining, child care and recreation, a thriving business sector, festivals and events, arts and culture and housing.

The groups first wrote down their project progress, next steps, challenges and needs, new members and an upcoming meeting date. Once each group had its information written down, a representative from each group stood up

and shared his or her findings with the room.

Some areas the retail and dining group is focusing its efforts on are curb appeal and providing a good customer experience. The retail and dining group has also created both a list and a map of all the vacant properties within the community.

"How many times have you eaten at a restaurant because you said, that looks like a good place to eat, before you even know what the food looks like," said Tricia Herrera, member of the retail and dining group.

While there has been a lot of progress from the groups, one reoccurring challenge they have all faced is generating more community involvement. A suggestion from Linda Lee Blaine, the program leader, to help increase partici-

tion is to be more direct when asking for residents to attend their meetings.

"Instead of sending out broad press releases and meeting announcements, try personally asking individuals to attend the meetings," said Blaine. "Nine out of 10 people volunteered because they were directly asked."

The groups shared many different ideas for improving the community such as cash mobs, where individuals meet on a certain day and time and spend money at one specific business to help support that business. Other ideas included a monthly email newsletter from the city, painting a new mural under the overpass and installing public art in one of the community parks.

Optimism, calls for ethics reforms highlight Pritzker policy address

Republicans decry lack of 'fair maps' mention

SPRINGFIELD – Gov. JB Pritzker struck a tone of optimism and accomplishment in his annual State of the State Address on Wednesday, declaring "the old patronage system needs to die" as he outlined his policy goals for 2020.

"Those who would shout doom and gloom might be loud – using social media bots and paid hacks to advance their false notions – but they are not many," Pritzker said in his speech to members of the House and Senate on the floor of the House. "You see, we're wresting the public conversation in Illinois back from people concerned with one thing and one thing only — predicting total disaster, spending hundreds of millions of dollars promoting it, and then doing everything in

their power to make it happen."

The governor laid out broad policy goals in the speech, emphasizing a need for ethics reform in the wake of an ongoing federal investigation which resulted in a guilty plea on bribery and tax fraud charges from former Democratic state Sen. Martin Sandoval on Tuesday.

"And now we have to work together to confront a scourge that has been plaguing our political system for far too long. We must root out the purveyors of greed and corruption — in both parties — whose presence infects the bloodstream of government," he said.

Pritzker spoke of revolving-door prohibitions and lobbying bans for sitting lawmakers. He also emphasized pension reform and reforming the criminal justice system by phasing out cash bail among other legislative action.

He urged clean energy reforms, but said,

"the old ways of negotiating energy legislation are over. It's time to put consumers and climate first. I'm not going to sign an energy bill written by the utility companies."

Pritzker said it's time to empower local governments to consolidate some of the 7,000 government units in the state, and he emphasized "job creation, education and job training programs, child care and pre-school, and a focus on building essential tools of success such as high-speed Internet in all corners of our state."

But for Republicans watching the speech there was a major omission: a commitment to a proposal they call "fair maps," which would take the power of drawing legislative districts out of the hands of lawmakers and give it to an independent commission.

"I've never seen this state so divided against Chicago as what I see it now and I, as I talk to people, the biggest reason for that is the Democrats have given themselves so much power and such a supermajority by gerrymandering maps," Senate Minority Leader Bill Brady, a Republican from Bloomington, said. "The rest of the people in the state feel neglected."

He said partisan-drawn legislative maps "leads to the corruption that we have" by allowing corrupt elected officials to remain in power by tipping the electoral scales in their favor.

While Brady called Pritzker's address a "good speech"—one that was often threaded with bipartisan applause—he and fellow Republicans said they wanted to see a greater focus on growing jobs.

"I think the speech was well written, and the bipartisan applause was much about the storytelling," he said.

Pritzker devoted much of his speech to celebrating accomplishments from

2019 — passage of a balanced budget; a \$45 billion capital improvements bill; legalization of recreational marijuana; and criminal justice reforms that mean people will no longer have their driver's licenses suspended or revoked for unpaid parking tickets or fines.

But he said more needs to be done in the coming year, especially in promoting racial diversity and social equity.

"Bit by bit, inch by inch, I am working hard to reverse the harm that has been done to people and communities that have been left behind over many generations by government policies and elected officials who were content to simply ignore them," Pritzker said.

Those remarks received high praise from members of the Illinois Legislative Black Caucus. But they also said they intend to make sure Pritzker follows through on the commitment, especially in the distribution of jobs created through the capital plan.

"There are no other communities in the state of Illinois that have been ignored like the black communities," Rep. La Shawn K. Ford, a

Chicago Democrat, said during a black caucus news conference after Pritzker's speech. "So we are grateful that we voted for almost a \$50 billion capital bill to rebuild Illinois. ... That means that this caucus will stand strong to work with the governor's administration and urge our constituents to urge the governor to rebuild our black communities."

While the policy agenda that Pritzker laid out focused mainly on positive-sounding initiatives, the issue of ethics reform was foremost

on the minds of most lawmakers, Republicans and Democrats.

Their concerns were heightened this week after Sandoval's guilty plea. And they are sure to be a focus of attention next Tuesday, Feb. 4, when former Rep. Luis Arroyo, a Chicago Democrat, is scheduled to be arraigned on federal bribery charges.

"On Jan. 9, I was sworn in as a state representative and that afternoon I was called a corrupt politician," freshman Rep. Maurice

West, a Rockford Democrat, said during the black caucus news conference. "And though I could get mad about that, I couldn't because of the history of how things have been operating in our state."

Veteran state Sen. Dale Righter, a Mattoon Republican who has announced he won't seek re-election this year, said he was disappointed in how little Pritzker spoke about the need for ethics reform.

"The governor who is the leader of a party that is drowning in corruption devoted four paragraphs of an 80-paragraph speech to corruption," Righter said in an interview. "He spent twice as much time talking about the flags outside the Thompson Center than he did about corruption within his own party. He missed a huge opportunity here."

House Republican Leader Jim Durkin, of Western Springs, said in a separate news conference that there is broad bipartisan support for ethics reform. But he argued that the roadblock to passing such reforms is House Speaker Michael Madigan.

"I would just say it's up to him," Durkin said in a news conference. "He's the one who has the agenda. He's the one who calls the bills on whether or not they're going to be placed in a committee or for a vote. So he needs to know that we're willing to move forward."

Madigan, the Chicago Democrat who has been speaker for all but two years since 1983, said, "for the first time in a long time, we come into a legislative session with the opportunity to build on success."

"While we have seen major steps forward, we have also seen the good work of the many honest members of this Legislature be overshadowed too often by the wrongdoing of individuals who have sought to put themselves first," Madigan said. "It's clear that we must take significant steps within the coming weeks to restore confidence in state government. But let's be clear: bad actors will always try to game the system and break the law. We must commit to sending the clearest sign the game is over and every step will be taken to prosecute."

Please, don't laugh if you see me acting like a kid. I am doing it for my mental health. And with the news the way it is, you may want to join me.

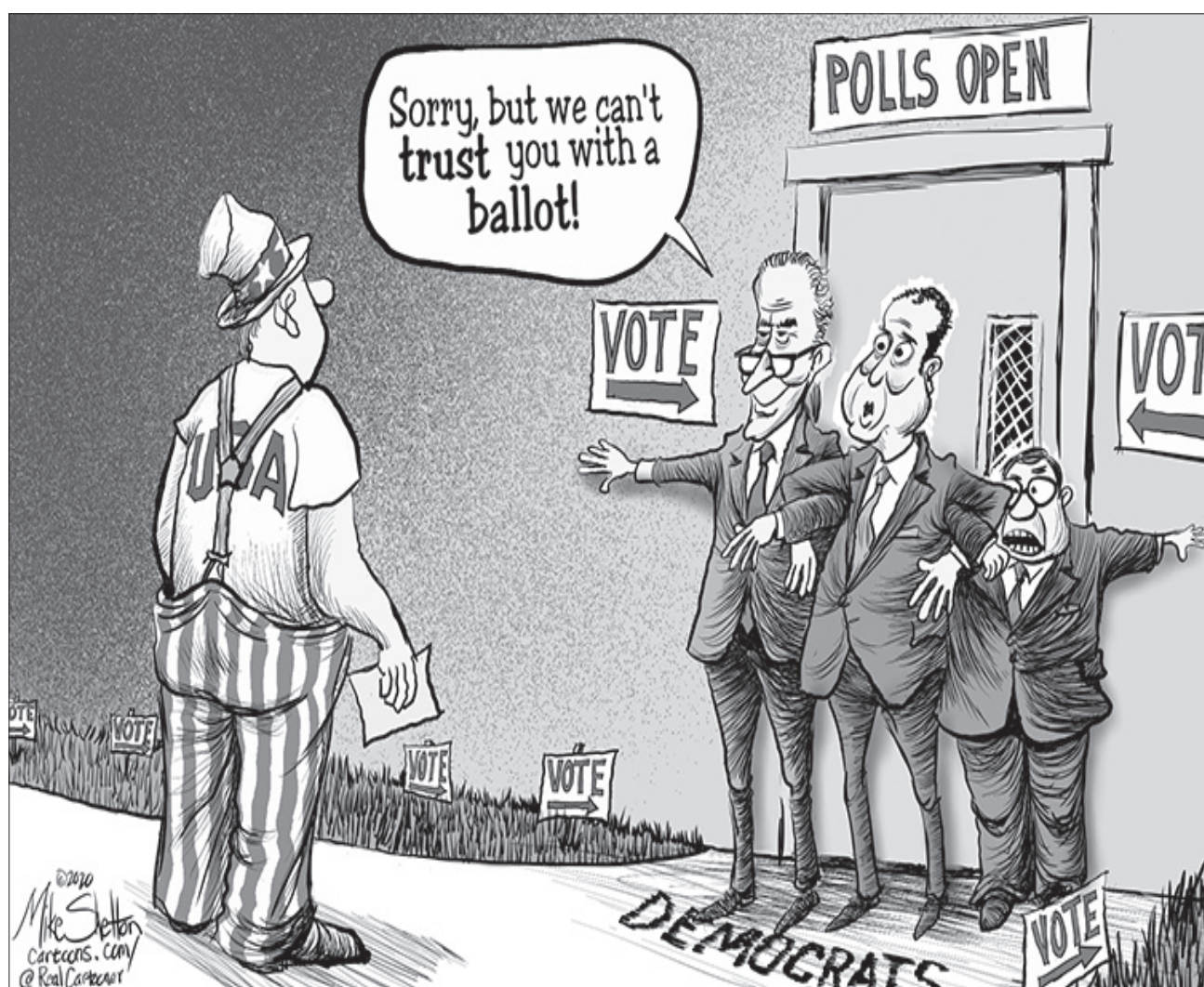

State fines Oregon nursing home

OREGON — An Oregon nursing home was fined by the Illinois Department of Public Health for two violations.

Oregon Living & Rehab Center was cited for two "A" violations of the Nursing Home Care Act. An "A" violation pertains to a condition in which there is a substantial probability that death or serious mental or physical harm will result, or has resulted.

The IDPH on Tuesday announced that the 2019 Fourth Quarterly Report of Nursing Home Violators is now posted on IDPH's website.

Oregon Living & Rehab Center, a

104-bed skilled care facility located at 811 S. 10th St. in Oregon, was fined \$50,000 for two "A" violations for failure to ensure the safety of a resident during personal care, supervise residents with a history of falls, and administer medication correctly.

The first fine was for nurses breaking a patient's arm while helping her put on a shirt. A different patient broke a hip during a fall while alone.

The other fine was for not providing proper blood thinners at the time they were needed. That ended up sending a resident to the hospital, according to state documents.

Schwanert stepped up for the Lady Hubs in the second game, throwing a match-best 207 and tilting the scale in Rochelle’s favor as the girls topped Ottawa 758-740. Michaela Boaz recorded 166 and Lewis added 152 on the Ottawa side.

“We’ve definitely been picking up more spares and I’ve seen a lot more consistency there,” Johanning said. “The meet was close and we only won by a small amount, so the more spares we can pick up, the more likely we are to pick up the win.”

Lewis shot 181 in the third game to end the evening with a match-leading 509 series. Tuesday marked the second time Rochelle has beaten Ottawa this season.

Rochelle dominates Princeton on Senior Night

Senior grapplers, managers recognized before 62-12 victory over Tigers

ROCHELLE — The Rochelle wrestling team celebrated its seven seniors with one of the program’s best performances of the season Thursday evening, when the Hubs battled the Princeton Tigers on Senior Night for the team’s final dual meet of the regular season.

Rochelle won 12 of the 14 varsity bouts in the match, with eight of the victories coming

by either fall or forfeit. All seven seniors (Gavin Ansteth, Zack Capes, Keegan Davis-Carter, Diego Escobar, Bryan Garza, Zeke Horn and Hezekiah Jefferson) recorded wins for the Hubs, who blew out the Tigers by a score of 62-12 and improved to 18-4 overall. Rochelle will compete in the IHSA 2A Sycamore Regional on Saturday, Feb. 8 beginning at 9 a.m.

“I told the kids that it would be an exciting atmosphere tonight,” head

coach Alphonso Vruno said. “We had a really nice crowd tonight and the kids treated the match like it was a big deal. They wrestled like every point mattered, and I thought the kids wrestled hard tonight.”

Junior Ivan Pineda (17-16) scored first for the Hubs, defeating Steven Benavidez with a first-period pin during the 106-pound bout. 113-pounder Josey Weber and 132-pounder Grant Thompson (19-17) earned forfeits, and Davis-

Carter (26-8) extended Rochelle’s lead with a dominant 24-9 technical fall over 138-pounder Carson Etheridge that included 11 takedowns.

Sophomore Ethan Tool-ey (21-17) started strong before holding out to earn a 7-4 decision against 145-pounder Braden Boyles. Princeton forfeited the 152-pound bout for Horn (21-18), and Escobar (9-7) followed by scoring a near fall in the third period to defeat Jimmy Kurth 8-5 in the 160-pound bout.

Garza (25-12) and Harvey (35-2) put the Hubs ahead 47-12 with pins against 170-pounder Jesse Wright and 182-pounder Drew Harp, respectively.

Three seniors wrestled the final three bouts for Rochelle including Jefferson, who went into overtime and outlasted 195-pounder Isaiah Franklin with a 9-7 sudden victory. Ansteth (22-9) won by fall over Matt Cihocki in the 220-pound matchup, and Capes (18-15) sealed the Rochelle victory with a

big-time throw to pin Cole Reynolds in the 285-pound bout.

“We’re looking to rest up before going into next week,” Vruno said. “We’re going to work hard next week and we know the competition at the regional will be tough. We can’t control that, but we can control how we prepare, and that’s the mindset I’ve been pushing to the kids. They’re excited about next week and they’re excited about hosting the sectional here.”

Belmonte signs with Kishwaukee College

ROCHELLE senior Viviana Belmonte was nervous about trying out for the Lady Hub soccer program two years ago. Fast forward to this winter, and Belmonte will not only be gearing up for her third season with the varsity team, but she'll be continuing both her athletic and her academic careers after graduating high school in the spring.

Belmonte signed her National Letter of Intent to play soccer with the Kishwaukee College Lady Kougars earlier this week. The senior goalkeeper has started for the Lady Hubs in each of her last two seasons, recording 212 saves her sophomore year and 205 saves her junior year. Belmonte said she plans to study esthetics while playing soccer for the Lady Kougars.

"When I tried out for the soccer team my sophomore year, I had never played keeper before," Belmonte said. "My coach believed in me and I ended up loving the position. I used to be really scared, but now I don't think about it a lot. I just go out there and play... I loved to do make-up when I was younger, and when I found out we had an esthetics program at the high school, I took the course my junior year, and I realized this year that esthetics is what I want to go into."

Hubs bounce back with win over Rock Falls

Burdin drains seven 3-pointers as Rochelle beats Rockets 59-49

ROCHELLE — Senior guard Landan Martin didn't appreciate how the Rock Falls defense was sagging off him when the Rochelle Hubs took the floor for their nonconference basketball contest against the Rockets on Tuesday.

Rock Falls opened the game in man-to-man defense instead of the team's traditional 1-3-1 zone, and Martin took advantage by scoring 10 of his 16 points in the first quarter. The senior's strong start helped Rochelle take down the Rockets 59-49 and improve to 12-10 overall. The Hubs have won eight of their last nine games.

"I felt that they didn't honor my ability to shoot," Martin said. "I was able to get into a rhythm... We thought they'd come out in their 1-3-1 like they did

last year, but they came out in man-to-man... I think we can win a lot of games down the stretch."

The Hubs established their perimeter shooting right away, converting four 3-pointers in the opening quarter to offset the damage Rock Falls forward Jeriah George did down low. George scored 10 of his 13 points in the first half, with the bulk of those points coming on offensive rebounds and putbacks. Rochelle entered the second quarter with a narrow 16-15 lead.

"We've been chewed out about our offensive rebounding and how we let other teams get so many rebounds," Martin said. "Coach [Tim] Thompson let us know about it at halftime and we were able to kick into high gear and stop [George] from getting on the boards."

Pirate 6-footer scores 27 points as Rochelle falls 50-37

ROCHELLE — The Ottawa girls basketball team drained three straight 3-pointers and closed the first quarter on a 9-0 run when Rochelle faced the Pirates at home Friday evening. The brief scoring spurt proved big enough to doom the Lady Hubs as the purple and white searched for their first Interstate 8 Conference victory of the season.

Ottawa guard Brooke Waddell sunk two of the late first-quarter triples, pushing the Pirates ahead 14-6 entering the second quarter. Waddell converted a team-high four 3-pointers in the game, and Ottawa built off its early advantage, maintaining it throughout the night to defeat Rochelle 50-37 and drop the Lady Hubs to 3-23 overall and 0-11 in conference play.

"Any momentum a team can build is huge, especially when that team's playing a conference game on the road," head coach Tony Rowan said. "Those consecutive 3-pointers were huge for their confidence and their offense. They moved the ball well during that sequence."

The Lady Hubs held Ottawa forward Regan O'Fallon to 13 points when Rochelle faced the Pirates earlier this season. O'Fallon was far more difficult to contain this time around, as the 6-footer used her superior size to draw multiple fouls and put her team in the bonus midway through the second quarter. Junior Sam House kept Rochelle in the mix, however, scoring seven of her nine points in the first half and keeping Ottawa within seven points at halftime, 22-15.

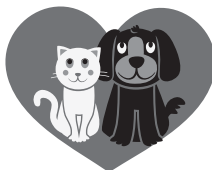

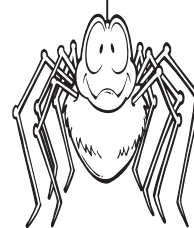

The Pirates ran most of their offense through O'Fallon in the first half, and that theme continued in the second half, where the Ottawa senior scored 16 of her game-high 27 points. The Pirates led by as many as 13 points before sophomore Josie Lundquist nailed a 3-pointer and Sofia Lenkaitis added a layup to help the Lady Hubs close the third quarter on a 5-0 run.

"A lot of [O'Fallon's] points came on free throws and offensive rebounds," Rowan said. "She did a tremendous job of getting after the basketball. We gave up a lot of defensive box-outs on her, and she was able to get her hands on the ball, get fouled and go to the line."

Leading 33-25 entering the fourth quarter, Ottawa managed to keep its 8-to-10-point cushion intact throughout the final minutes. The Pirates shut down Rochelle's perimeter scoring attack, holding the Lady Hubs to only three made 3-pointers in the game.

Lundquist led Rochelle with 10 points in the game, while Lenkaitis and House each finished with nine points. The Lady Hubs will face Morris on the road Tuesday, Feb. 4 at 7 p.m.

"They take pride in their defense and rotating as fast as they can," Rowan said. "They've used the same defensive system since they were in

We were able to penetrate their defense and get the ball in the middle so we could kick the ball out wide.
