ZBA says ‘no’ again on permit

Vote results in duplication of 2019 outcome; It could be April before county board takes up the issue

CLINTON — In a repeat of the March 2019 vote, the Zoning Board of Appeals on Feb. 6 voted 5-1 to not recommend a special use application for the Alta Farms II wind energy project. The vote came after a lengthy series of public hearings that repeated some information from the 2019 hearings and added new information as well.

John Griffin was the lone vote in favor of passage, as he was in 2019, saying he believed Tradewind’s second application for the permit was complete. Griffin laced some of his prepared comments with sarcasm as he described how he felt Tradewind had met the requirements of the county’s wind energy ordinance.

The five other members of the board, however, strongly disagreed with Griffin, with varying degrees of indignation at Griffin and at Tradewind officials.

ZBA member David Waters felt Tradewind officials had not done what was necessary to submit a complete application. He felt Tradewind had not invited county officials into the loop with regard to developing a decommissioning plan for the project.

Landfill working toward ISO 14001 rating

Clinton Landfill also addressing methane odor concerns

CLINTON — Owners of Area Disposal plan to step up the game for Clinton Landfill by achieving ISO 14001 status this year, Chris Coulter told the county’s land use committee Monday.

ISO (International Standards Organization) 14001 is a set of rules and standards created to help companies reduce industrial waste and environmental damage. It’s a framework for better environmental management, but it is not required.

Coulter, whose family

owns Area Disposal and Peoria Disposal Company, said Clinton Landfill is likely to be the first landfill in Illinois to achieve the rating. The rating will require increased documentation of all the landfill’s operations and practices, he said.

“We have undergone Stage 1 and Stage 2 audits,” Coulter said, in relation to the rating. “Based on the audit, we should receive our ISO 14001 certification by the end of March.

Increased volume

Coulter also said Clinton Landfill for the first time

took in a record 400,000 tons of waste in 2019. He said he expected that trend to continue, possibly reaching as much as 410,000 tons in 2020.

Coulter said one reason for the increased volume was the closure of a landfill in McLean County. Another reason was waste sludge Clinton Landfill accepted after a wet 2019 made its use as an agricultural application not feasible.

“That material had to go somewhere, so it ended up coming to Clinton Landfill,” Coulter said.

A byproduct of the sludge was the production

of additional methane gas at the landfill. The landfill generates electricity by using the methane.

“We believe that sludge has actually generated gas faster,” Coulter said. “So, we have had some odor complaints in the past couple of weeks. We also could smell it as well.”

To address the issue, they are moving up their schedule to install wells that will capture the additional methane.

“We believe we are going to get that done in the next two weeks,” Coulter said.

Work is scheduled to begin on the wells next week.

Illinois can now test for coronavirus in-state, cutting down wait times

U.S. risk remains low; two Illinoisans who tested positive are released

SPRINGFIELD – The Illinois Department of Public Health now has the ability to test for the 2019 novel coronavirus in-state, meaning shorter wait times for test results for people showing symptoms of the virus and meeting certain criteria.

IDPH said in a news release Tuesday that

Illinois is the first state to be able to do the testing without shipping specimens out of state, and results are typically available within 24 hours.

“The ability to do this testing will mean we will be able to detect any new cases of novel coronavirus earlier and prevent any possible spread,” IDPH Assistant Director Evonda Thomas-Smith said in the news release. “We understand there is concern about this new virus, which is why having test results back quickly can help reduce some of those concerns.”

In particular, DeWitt County stands to collect nearly \$900,000 more in Motor Fuel Tax (MFT) money a year. MFT funds pay for annual maintenance, resurfacing, bridge repair and other road projects in the county. In addition, the state has nearly \$32 million earmarked for state road work in DeWitt County over the next five years. The extra money is the result of the recent 2019 capital bill passed by the Illinois General Assembly. “Everybody thinks the money is going to Chicago, etcetera, etcetera,” Rose said Tuesday. “That is not only not true, it is stunning the amount of money downstate Illinois is getting out of this capital bill.”

Rose said the state was phasing out the sales tax on gasoline, something he said was a good idea for several reasons. “First, as the price of gas goes up, it assesses a percentage of the underlying price, so you get gouged by the state as the price goes up,” Rose said.

He said two other bad aspects of the gas tax was the fact that the money goes into the state’s general fund, so it can be spent on anything other than roads. And, he said the governor and state legislature have complete control over its distribution.

On the other hand, MFT

money is assessed per gallon of gasoline sold, so it does not increase as the price per gallon increases. “Off the top, a huge chunk is guaranteed to come back to counties, townships and municipalities,” he said. “And, per the Illinois Constitution, every penny has to be spent on transportation.”

Rose said, from a policy perspective, “motor fuel tax is way better than sales tax.”

“If we had done this 25 years ago, the roads would never have gotten in the bad shape they are now.”

Rose estimated DeWitt County would receive an additional \$175,328 per year under the program, the City of Clinton, an

additional \$124,419 per year.

DeWitt County townships stand to receive an estimated total of \$500,766 additional funds per year.

Other county communities would receive the following estimated additional MFT funds per year: Farmer City, \$36,861; Kenney, \$5,614; Wapella, \$9,609; Waynesville, \$7,474; Weldon, \$7,388.

The Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) also has slated about \$31.9 million for 16 state road projects in DeWitt County from 2020-2025.

Waters also felt Tradewind had not provided critical information about decommissioning. His interpretation of the ordinance included an understanding that a full decommissioning plan was required with the special use permit application.

“You’ve bypassed us, wanting to take it to the county (board),” Waters told Tradewind representatives. “I’m just a little bit upset you guys wouldn’t give that to us.”

Tradewind released a statement shortly after the ZBA vote:

“We appreciate the time and dedication the Zoning Board of Appeals committed to the Alta Farms II application over several weeks of hearings. We remain confident in the application, which clearly meets or exceeds all of DeWitt County’s ordinance requirements and details a first-rate wind farm that will be an asset to the entire community. We look forward to the next step in the approval process and to bringing this project and its many community benefits to fruition.”

It could be April before the full county board debates the ZBA vote and votes itself on whether to approve or deny Tradewind’s special use permit. It likely will be several weeks before transcripts of the 17 hearings will be available for board members to examine.

Local Boy Scout projects help the community

CLINTON — How often do you visit Weldon Springs State Park? Have you ever noticed updates to the park?

Did you know that a lot of the projects at the park are completed by local BSA Boy Scout Troop 1142?

There are seven ranks a Scout can achieve, with the highest being Eagle. Achieving the Eagle rank is no easy task. It requires the scout to demonstrate scout spirit by living the scout oath and law.

They must earn a total of 21 merit badges, including First Aid, Citizenship in the Community, Citizenship in the Nation, Citizenship in the World, Communication, Cooking, Personal Fitness, Emergency Preparedness or Lifesaving, Environmental Science or Sustainability, Personal Management, Swimming or Hiking or Cycling, Camping and Family Life.

The scout must serve in a roll of responsibility within the troop.

For many years, Troop 1142 has been completing its Eagle projects at the Weldon Springs State Park. The scouts have rebuilt a stairway, put in culverts and rehabbed trails, roofed the amphitheater near the campground, worked on fencing and erosion control, rebuilt an amphitheater stage and benches, laid out a compass course to be used with the interpreter center, rebuilt horseshoe pits, rebuilt the handicap accessible picnic deck near the spillway and more.

In addition to all the Eagle projects, the troop

has led the efforts with the assistance of Cub Scout Pack 4142 and Venture Crew 2142 in completing other projects throughout the park.

They have on numerous occasions cleaned at Veteran’s Point. They wash the granite stones as well as pick up brush in the area to ease in mowing. They have also done trash pickup, ran the annual fishing derby, and picked up brush throughout the park.

The biggest project they have undertaken was the opening of the Black Locust group camp. Black Locust had been shuttered by the state for nearly two decades due to budget cuts.

With the supervision of former Boy Scout Troop 1142 Scoutmaster, Don Husted, current Scoutmaster Ron Armstrong, and site superintendent, Charlie Montgomery, the scouts are slowly making Black Locust a usable group camping site.

The scouts have spent countless hours at the park in hopes of opening the camp for public use. They have re-roofed and repaired the pavilion, graveled the area under and around the pavilion, and have done significant cleanup of the area including tree and brush removal. The area is slowing becoming usable again.

They have held flag retirement ceremonies at the camp with local veterans, as well as hosting a Boy Scout Spring Camporee there in 2018.

Thanks to a generous donor and fundraising efforts by the scouts, having a restroom that meets state specs and

matches others in the park is now an achievable goal.

After the restroom project is completed, the scouts’ next project is to have power run to lights above the restrooms, as well as to the pavilion.

The scouts also will work on other projects at the group camp to improve the site. Opening a shuttered group camp is a major undertaking. It takes lots of time and resources. Boy Scout Troop 1142 is partnering with the Weldon Springs Foundation for fundraising efforts.

1983 - A 6-year-old boy became the first person to receive a heart and liver transplants in the same operation.

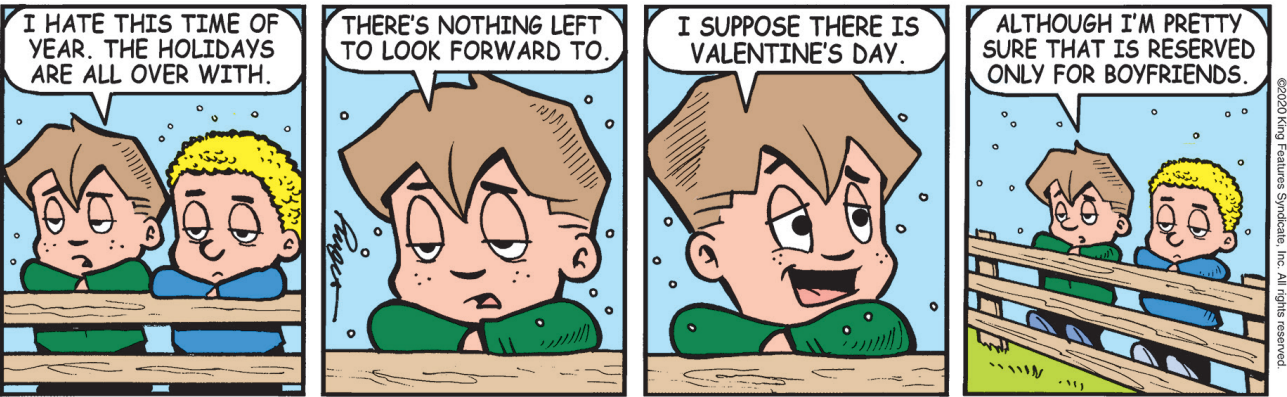
1989 - Iran's Ayatollah Khomeini called on Muslims to kill Salman Rushdie because of his novel "The Satanic Verses."

Using wine in cooking

Welcome to my little corner of culinary delights. When thinking of using wine in cooking, one often thinks of French cooking; and rightly so. But one must know which wines work best with certain foods. There are all sorts of flavors and degrees of sweetness with wines. There are also certain preliminary preparations in their use. In cooking with wine, one is not after the alcohol. One is after the special flavor wine contains. In cooking, the alcohol is boiled off. Cooking with wine is well worth knowing; so be patient with me.

When using wine in cooking, one needs to know how to reduce it. In some cases, one is able to simply pour wine in with the food or soup being cooked. The serious use of wine in cooking generally requires one to reduce it first. If a dish requires a long simmering or baking process, then the wine is best added at the beginning. If a sauce is being made, or if the wine is to be used in a watery concoction, it needs to be reduced. Also, reduction helps to intensify the flavor and give that syrupy or viscous consistency. Keep in mind that certain wines can be damaged from too much heat. Wine for some things is added in a cold dish requiring no cooking.

Most recipes will suggest which wines to use. Even with that, you still need to understand certain needs and know particulars to what you wish to achieve. For example, I had a recipe instructing me to only use white wine. I was

fortunate enough to know in this particular recipe, I desired a domestic brut Champagne. If you like creating your own recipes as I do, you most certainly need to know what wines go best with which recipes. Knowing this is not as difficult as it might seem.

First get use to how certain wines basically taste. Write out your evaluation and notes about them. Keep this for your records. Do not try and learn this all in one evening. You might find it difficult to find your way to the door. You need not be concerned over subtle differences in taste over wine being used in cooking. The full bodied robust red wines, such as Zinfandel, Merlot, Cabernet Sauvignon and pinot Noir, all taste similar and their subtle differences will not be apparent in cooking. If a California Red is chosen, it has a blend of Zinfandel, Merlot and Cabernet Sauvignon. I find that Beaujolais is noticeably different within that family of red wines. As I said, they all taste similar to me; not the same, but similar.

Next try tasting an Italian red wine such as Chianti and you will notice a distinctly different taste. Try a Greek red wine and it will taste different from all the others. It is these major differences that one is after in cooking with wine.

While the World Health Organization has declared the coronavirus a global health emergency, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention says the risk to the U.S. public at large “remains low at this time.”

The CDC began shipping test kits to select qualified U.S. and international laboratories last week, and IDPH is working to bring testing online in its Springfield and Carbondale labs.

In Illinois, two people have tested positive for novel coronavirus. The first was a woman who had recently traveled to Wuhan, China, which is at the center of the outbreak. The second was her husband, who contracted the virus after close contact with her.

Authorities said at the time the transmission of the virus from wife to husband was “not totally unexpected.”

Both patients were released from the hospital to home isolation last week “under the guidance of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the Illinois Department of Public Health,” according to the Chicago Sun-Times.

Another 44 tests for the virus in Illinois residents have come back negative, according to IDPH. Another three tests of “persons under investigation” are pending.

The IDPH said the test is intended for use with upper and lower respiratory specimens collected from people who meet certain criteria, which include having traveled to China

and other exposure history, as well as symptoms such as fever and shortness of breath.

Authorities believe symptoms appear between two and 14 days after exposure, and there is not a significant risk of a person transmitting the virus before they develop symptoms.

Coronavirus is a large family of viruses, with some causing illness in people, and others circulating among animals, according to IDPH. The virus is named for the crown-like spikes on its surface. Human coronaviruses are “common throughout the world” and usually cause mild to moderate illness in people, according to IDPH.

The concern over the recent outbreak of the 2019

novel coronavirus comes from the fact that it is a new, unrecognized strain. Previous novel coronavirus strains – such as the ones that caused MERS, or Middle East Respiratory Syndrome, and SARS, or severe acute respiratory syndrome – evolved from animal strains and have been associated with more severe respiratory illness, according to IDPH.

As of Tuesday, 13 people in the U.S. had tested positive for the 2019 novel coronavirus.

According to a WHO situation report dated Tuesday, Feb. 11, there were 43,103 confirmed cases of the virus. All but 395 of them were in China, where 1,017 deaths have occurred, according to the

report. Only one death has occurred outside of China.

While the CDC has said confirmation of “limited person-to-person spread” of the virus in Asia “raises the level of concern about this virus,” the federal agency “continues to believe” the risk to the American public at large “remains low at this time.”

Then came the varsity onslaught.

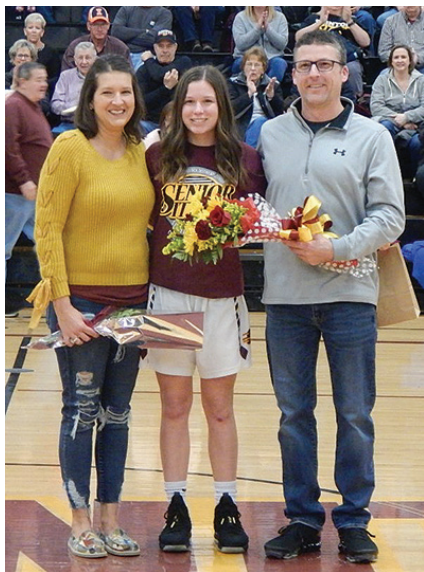
