# Celebrating Irish

**ROCHELLE** – For one day in the month of March, everyone in the City of Rochelle celebrates Irish heritage, whether they are Irish or not.

Lucky’s 5th Annual St. Paddy’s Day Parade and Irish Hooley will take place on March 14 from 11:30 a.m., to 4 p.m. The event will kick off with the parade at 11:30, which will head down Lincoln Highway through downtown, left on Cherry Avenue to Main Street and then

north on Main Street for a few blocks.

Once the parade has finished, attendees will head to the Chicagoland Skydiving Center for the Irish Hooley that includes many food vendors and activities. The Hooley is being held at the Skydiving Center Hangar to fit the growing event as well as save on costs.

“The hangar is indoors, heated and we don’t have to worry about renting a tent anymore,” said Nancy Bingham, coordinator for the event. “Each year for the last four years we have grown and gotten a bigger tent, and the costliest part of the event was the tent and

heating it.”

The Hooley will include activities such as Irish music performed by The Templetons, a performance from the Rochelle Performing Arts Academy, a Spud Derby, Irish crafts and more. The celebration will also feature corned beef and cabbage from The Kitchen Table, and food from Ralfie’s BBQ, Hicks BBQ, Flight Deck Bar and Grill, Black Pearl Coffee, McConnaughy’s Irish Pickles and Jen’s Artisan Bread.

# School leaders partner with NIU to identify, prepare, hire bilingual teachers

**J**ASON Harper, superintendent of schools in nearby Rochelle, knows that the diversity of his community is evolving.

Forty percent of the Hub City’s current population is Hispanic, a number that only will continue to rise in coming years.

Harper also understands that Rochelle schools must serve all of their students – and he is making sure they do so proactively.

“About four years ago, the elementary district in Rochelle made a decision to pursue and implement a dual-language program,” Harper says. “Students spend half of their day learning in English and half of their day learning in Spanish. Native Spanish speakers are learning,

maintaining and improving their native Spanish, and vice versa.”

Research indicates that students from homes where a language other than English is spoken will outperform their peers if they receive all or part of their instruction in dual languages, he says.

Conversely, he adds, schools that pull English Language Learners out of their regular classrooms to learn English with no native language support “are less likely to be

college- or career-ready. Ultimately, it becomes a huge equity issue.”

Further studies show numerous benefits of a dual-language education, he says, producing graduates who are bilingual, biliterate and bicultural. It’s an outcome Harper expects that he and his wife will pursue for their own children, who are still in preschool.

“We’re very excited about this. This is Year 3 in the elementary district, and we’re preparing to essentially add a second building so that two of our four schools offer these programs. Fifty percent of our families can opt in,” he says.

Dual-language classrooms in elementary schools eventually will scale up to the fifth-grade level as those children progress. In the fall of 2023, meanwhile, Rochelle Middle School will welcome its first

dual-language students.

“And with that, obviously, we need to find, recruit and employ bilingual teachers,” Harper says. “One of the best ways to fulfill the need our district has in terms of bilingual teaching candidates is to facilitate a grow-your-own program.”

That’s where Bryan Garcia Belmonte and Morelia Garcia enter the picture.

Both are licensure students in the NIU College of Education – Garcia Belmonte in special education and Garcia in elementary education – and both grew up in Rochelle.

Garcia Belmonte has known Harper for several years: when the the 2017 graduate of Rochelle Township High School self-identified as a future teacher, he called Harper “principal.”

## Lawmakers continue push for prescription drug price controls

New board would set upper payment limits on high-cost medicines

**SPRINGFIELD**—A group of Democratic lawmakers renewed their push Tuesday for a bill that would pave the way for price caps on many high-cost prescription drugs, a proposal that is likely to meet strong resistance from the pharmaceutical industry.

Rep. Will Guzzardi, of Chicago, and Sen. Andy Manar, of Bunker Hill, said the rising cost of prescription drugs has gotten out of control, putting the health of many Illinoisans at risk.

“This is a staggering problem and it’s happening across the country,” Guzzardi said during a news conference at the Capitol. “Drug manufacturers are making record profits quarter after quarter, year after year, while our families are struggling to afford the medications that they need.”

Guzzardi is the chief sponsor of House Bill 3493, a measure he introduced last year. It would establish a five-member Prescription Drug Affordability Board that would have authority to conduct cost reviews and set “upper payment limits” for any brand name drug with a wholesale price of \$30,000 or more for a one-year supply or a course of treatment, or for any drug for which the wholesale price jumps by \$3,000 or more in a single year.

Upper payment limits are commonly used in private insurance and state Medicaid programs, but they are typically negotiated individually

between the health plan and drug manufacturers. Guzzardi said his bill would establish uniform upper payment limits that would apply to all payers statewide.

That same authority would extend to “biosimilar drugs” — a biologic product that is highly similar to another drug already approved for sale — with a price that is less than 15 percent below the name brand price.

It would also have authority to regulate generic drug prices if those drugs cost \$100 or more for a 30-day supply or if their prices jump 200 percent or more in a single year.

Manar, who is sponsoring the bill in the Senate, called it “a reasonable step in the right direction that will say to all of the purveyors of profit in today’s health care system when it comes to the affordability of prescription medication, you’re going to have to cut it out.”

Also speaking at the news conference was Graciela Guzman, a woman who suffers from endometriosis and is a campaign director at the Healthy Illinois Campaign public policy

group. She said the cost of one of her medications recently jumped from \$68 to \$500. Because of that, she said, she chose to split her pills in half in order to stretch out her supply, but that also meant she wasn’t well enough to go about her normal daily routine.

“Medications can’t work for me if I can’t afford them, period,” she said. “I know I’m not alone in that. So many Illinoisans across this state need the peace of mind to know their prescrip-

tions are going to be there for them and that they will be able to afford them.”

Guzzardi introduced the bill last year but it stalled in a House committee after it failed to win a majority of votes to advance to the House floor.

At that time, the bill drew opposition from the Pharmaceutical Research and Manufacturers Association, or PhRMA, a group that represents the biopharmaceutical industry. It was also opposed by the Illinois Chamber of Commerce, the Illinois Manufacturers Association and a host of other business groups.

This year, Guzzardi said he is proposing some minor changes based on the feedback he heard from the committee and other interest groups.

Tiffany Haverly, director of public affairs at PhRMA, issued an email statement saying the group is sympathetic toward those who struggle to afford their medications.

“With that said, proposals like HB 3493 that arbitrarily set prices are

the wrong approach and could limit Illinoisans’ access to treatments and cures,” she said. “Further, HB 3493 fails to address the long line of middlemen in the pharmaceutical supply chain that impact what patients pay at the pharmacy counter.”

“One of the best ways to lower out-of-pocket costs is to make sure patients get their share of the rebates and discounts that biopharmaceutical companies already provide; rebates and discounts that exceeded \$166 billion in 2018 alone,” the statement continued. “At the end of the day, the government price setting proposed in this legislation could threaten further research into lifesaving medicines and put patient access at risk.”

The bill is still pending in the House Prescription Drug Affordability and Accessibility Committee, which Guzzardi chairs. It was scheduled for a hearing this week but the committee was canceled and is expected to be rescheduled.

## GRADS: Garcia and Belmonte are primed for positions with Rochelle schools after completing NIU education

Garcia, meanwhile, a 2013 alumna of RTHS, met Harper when she took a job working for a district-sponsored, after-school program. She became a site coordinator three years ago, and Garcia Belmonte joins her four days a week in operating the program at Central Elementary School.

Now the two are attending NIU for free: Rochelle Community Consolidated School District 231 is paying the tuition for the third and fourth years of school for both Huskies.

They will complete their clinical and student-teaching placements in Rochelle and, following their respective 2022 and 2021 graduations, will take the guaranteed jobs awaiting them there.

“It’s really helpful for me because my parents don’t have that financial burden,” Garcia Belmonte says. “I don’t have to worry about what it’s going to take to finish college. I can put my time into thinking about my schooling and focus on graduating.”

“It’s amazing. I wish I would’ve started earlier,” Garcia adds. “When they came to me with this idea, I already was planning to stay in Rochelle because it’s home. I knew the teachers. I knew the administrators. I knew it would be a good fit for me. I signed the contract.”

Jennifer Johnson, director of Teacher Preparation and Development for the NIU College of Education, appreciates the opportunity to develop and foster university-school partnerships that provide dynamic opportunities for engaged learning and clinical field experiences.

“It’s exciting to see the incredible level of energy, passion and understanding of their community that Morelia and Bryan have brought to their field experiences,” Johnson says. “We value agreements like this one because we embrace the culture of preparing future educators to teach in their home community. This not only supports the intentional recruitment efforts of the district, but also removes some of the financial barriers for our students.”

Raised in Spanish-speaking homes, Garcia Belmonte and Garcia find rewards and inspiration in those classroom moments when students “finally understand something” – and equally feel an obligation to serve students like themselves.

“I want to be a good role model for these Latino kids as Rochelle continues to grow in Latino homes,” Garcia Belmonte says. “When I was younger, I just spoke Spanish. I took En-

glish classes in summer school from preschool through kindergarten. I didn’t take dual-language classes until I got into high school.”

He also hopes to expunge negative perceptions of “the male Latino,” and is grateful for his NIU-empowered opportunity to do so in his hometown.

“All my family is here, and I don’t feel like I can leave Rochelle because I have unfinished business here,” he says. “Hopefully, I can make a change, and hopefully I can inspire other kids to also make that change, little by little.”

For her part, Garcia wants to deliver a beacon of light for families like hers.

“Growing up as an English Language Learner for my whole education, and being in a first-generation American family, with my parents not speaking English, it was very difficult when I was younger because I had no one to help me with my homework. I want to help kids in the same position I was, and helping their parents as well. My family needed translators. I grew up with that. Coming to NIU is a good way to become a bilingual teacher and to help and support those students.”

Superintendent Harper has great confidence

in his pair of trailblazers, both of whom he also mentored through their associate degree programs at Kishwaukee College.

“They’re young. They’re vibrant. They’re passionate about education. They’re passionate about supporting our students. We have routine meetings to support both of them as they go through their education courses, and that serves a couple purposes. One, to make sure they’re able to stay on top of things, and two, to provide support and insight to help them with real-life applications of what they’re learning.”

He is eager to identify the next Huskies who will follow in their paths.

“We’ll have bilingual teachers who are homegrown, who understand our community, who understand our kids, who understand the culture and climate of our buildings, who’ve had multiple opportunities to be mentored by our teachers,” he says. “And when they come here to teach, they’re ready to impact our students to the best of their abilities.”

Rochelle’s need for bilingual educators obviously isn’t going away, he says, and soon will include middle school teachers, special education teachers, reading specialists, school psychologists and social workers.

Fortunately, he adds, members of the two school boards clearly recognize the implications of the demographics.

“They’re supportive of our efforts and identify, support and employ high-quality candidates, no matter the position,” Harper says. “They deeply understand the general shortage of teachers, and the specific shortage of bilingual teachers and bilingual specialists, and that we need to find creative ways to compete with other districts that might offer higher compensation.”

Partnering with NIU offers that creative way, the superintendent says, and promotes excellence for Rochelle schools.

“Our end product is going to be something really special,” Harper says.

“We’re going to graduate students who are fully bilingual, fully biliterate and fully bicultural, who read, write and speak Spanish and who understand the culture, the perceptions and the viewpoints of other cultures within in our community, our country and the landscape beyond our borders,” he adds. “Without a doubt, this is a 21st century skill – and our graduates will be competitive in that global economy.”

It sets up the same way as a bouncy house, but is a fully functioning pub for attendees to enjoy a drink. While the event this year has not occurred yet, coordinators are already brainstorming ideas for next year. One thing that has been brought up as a possible idea is extending the hours of the event. Other ideas include creating an Irish Heritage organization in Ogle County. The nearest organization of this kind is located in Rockford. "Next year I am hoping that we could expand a little more and extend it more into the evening," said Bingham.

When families gather after a death, one characteristic seems to hold true: however somber the adults may be, young children, after a while, cannot resist the urge to scamper around, play and, in general, act like children. That's because they are children, and their reactions to grief don't match those of adults. That doesn't mean children don't feel grief or know that something sad or final or tragic has occurred. Children are highly attuned to the emotions of the people around them, but they grieve in their own way, and it's important that adults recognize a child's need for honesty, love, and reassurance when death occurs.

Sometimes adult's

preoccupation with grief prevents them from seeing that a child's reaction to death is just as deep as theirs – even though it may be expressed differently, depending on the child's age and stage of emotional development.

Toptracer technology, which is owned by Top Golf, allows golfers to combine technology with real clubs and balls to play a variety of games.

The driving range features eight bays where groups up to eight players can compete in games including longest drive competitions, hitting lighted targets or even playing classic courses like Pebble Beach.

Players can watch the flight of their ball in front of them, or on the screens mounted at each bay.

“Basically, it allows people, when they are using the bays in the driving range, the Toptracer will track the ball to see how fast it's going, how high it's going, how far it's going, that type of thing,” said Scott deOliveria, assistant general manager at PrairieView.

He said it is the same technology that tracks the ball on televised golf

events. But deOliveria said this is an actually driving range too.

“You are actually hitting out onto a range, so you can actually see the flight of the ball all the way to the ground,” he said.

There is also a separate bay that will be used by head PGA pro Andrew Schlupp to give lessons.

But PrairieFire isn't just for golfers. There will be plenty of comfortable seating, food and a bar with 10 draft beer lines that

will feature some craft and seasonal brews.

“There's an entertainment factor involved, to come out and enjoy some food and drinks,” deOliveria said. “(It is) a very cozy, relaxed atmosphere with the lounge furniture and the lighting and the heated bays. It's kind of set up to be a real social experience.”

PrairieFire will be open from 9 a.m.-10 p.m. Monday-Thursday, and from 9 a.m.-midnight on Friday

and Saturday. Reservations are highly recommended for those who want to golf, deOliveria said. Prices range from \$25 to \$40 per hour, depending on the day and time. He said that for a foursome to play a specific course on the Toptracer range, it will take about three hours.

With winter being down months for a golf course in this region, deOliveria said this type of year-around golf experience will help the bottom line.

“We can continually generate revenue throughout the year to support the golf operation,” he said.

He said many courses in the area are keeping an eye on PrairieFire.

“I get the feeling that this will be a trend that golf courses will definitely be taking a look at.”

And the golfing community is already primed for it to open, as deOliveria said the feedback has been great and excitement for the opening is high.

## Byron nuke plant marks anniversary

**BYRON** – Last week the Byron Generating Station in Northern Illinois is celebrating an impressive 4,500 consecutive days producing carbon-free energy for Illinois and beyond, while also marking 45 years on site.

Employees, retirees and local leaders were on hand recently for a cake cutting to mark the occasion. Oregon's own O's Bakery designed an incredible edible replica of the plant for the occasion.

Construction work started at the Exelon Generation location in Byron in 1975, with the Unit 1 reactor coming online in 1985 and Unit 2 in 1987. Nuclear reactors like the ones at the dual-unit Byron Station are very reliable, running around the clock. Every 18 months, operators shut down a reactor for only few weeks to support refueling and maintenance. Over the past 13 years, when one reactor shut down for maintenance, the other unit stayed online allowing the facility to continuously provide electricity to the region. The nuclear plant's 700-plus workforce prides itself on precision monitoring and maintenance programs, which help the plant sustain its status as a model of reliability.

The plant generates enough carbon-free electricity to power more than 2.3 million homes and businesses while preventing the release of nearly 12 million metric tons of carbon dioxide annually. Over the lifetime of both units' operation, that's the equivalent of taking approximately 2.5 million cars off of the road every

year.

“Clean power-generating facilities like Byron Station are on the front lines of combatting climate change,” said Byron Station Site Vice President Mark Kanavos. “Americans want carbon-free electricity, which our nuclear plants deliver to millions every day. They also want reliability, and nuclear plants are the unquestioned champion of reliable electricity production in this country.”

The average nuclear plant in the United States operated at full power about 92 percent of the time of 2019. On average, Exelon's nuclear plants ran at full power more than 95 percent of the year. Byron Station topped the company's and country's average run time by operating at full power more than 96.9 percent of the time in 2019. The always-on aspect of nuclear power isn't lost on its residents.

“Living in this area my whole life, I can attest to the importance of the station for both its important part in electricity distribution and its positive effect on the economy,” said Sarah Downs, executive director of the Byron Area Chamber of Commerce.

“When one reactor goes offline for a maintenance project, there's still a positive outcome as local businesses see a big uptick in sales. With hundreds of contractors temporarily staying in the area during refueling projects, our business owners are staffing up – with some even extending their hours – to take care of the workers visiting our shops, restaurants and stores.”

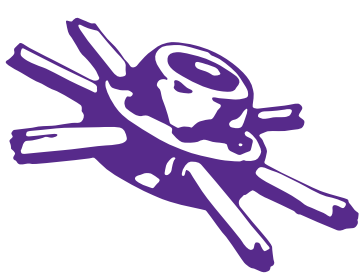

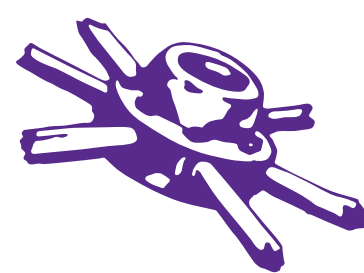

### Jandak commits to Washu football program

CHARLIE Jandak wanted to find a school that would challenge him both in the classroom and on the gridiron. When Jandak visited the Washington University in St. Louis campus earlier this school year, the senior lineman said he felt right at home.

Jandak wrapped up his high school football career as one of the top linemen in the state, and he'll be continuing on at the next level after committing to the WUSTL program. Jandak will become the second Rochelle Township High School student-athlete in three seasons to suit up for the Bears, joining former Hub standout and current WUSTL linebacker Alex Harvey.

"I was looking for a school with a good academic and athletic balance, and WashU felt like the right school for me," Jandak said. "I've been to a lot of different schools, but it feels different when I walk on the WashU campus... The football program is great and everybody wants to be there. Their football program has a family-like atmosphere similar to the Rochelle program, and that's what I was looking for from a school... It feels like a place that's meant for me."

Jandak spent four years with the RTHS football program and three seasons on the varsity team. He started at tight end his sophomore season before transitioning inside and playing multiple guard and tackle positions over his junior and senior seasons. He earned All-Conference First Team honors from both the Northern Illinois Big 12 and the Interstate 8, and his senior campaign garnered a Class 5A All-State Honorable Mention from the IHSFCA.

"I think Charlie is a special kid and he has a unique set of athletic abilities," Rochelle head coach Kyle Kissack said. "Not only is he physically gifted, but the mental capacity he has to excel at each of those positions is significant. His work ethic and his physicality set him apart... We haven't had many offensive linemen receive recognition at the state level, and that speaks to his durability, his mental capacity and the work he put in daily to excel in all of those areas."

The WUSTL Bears currently play in the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin, which includes North Central College, where Jandak's brother William and former RTHS student-athletes Eddie Villalobos and James Hart achieved NCAA Division III National Championship honors this season. Jandak said he's looking forward to not only reuniting with a former RTHS teammate in Harvey, but facing off against his former teammates

at North Central.

"I've always been a competitor," Jandak said. "I want to compete against the best players in the country... I've talked with Alex a lot and he's definitely helped me with the recruiting process and getting to know the school... I'm super excited to compete against North Central, and it will be exciting to see how we stack up against that team next season. I've always enjoyed competing with my brother, and I'm excited to see who's going to be better."

The 6-foot-2, 265-pound lineman will represent Rochelle in the 2020 IHSFCA Shrine Game this summer before beginning his collegiate career with the WUSTL Bears. Jandak helped lead the Hubs to an IHSA 4A State Quarterfinal appearance his sophomore season and an IHSA 5A Playoff berth his junior season. He said he plans to major in systems science and engineering.

"I've always been interested in engineering because I like being creative," Jandak said. "Engineers have to work on their own and figure out solutions to problems, and that really interests me... Systems engineering is a lot more lenient in that I can explore different areas before I figure out what I want to specialize in."

# Hubs close regular season with red-hot finish

### Rochelle tops LaSalle-Peru 82-70 as IHSA 3A Regional approaches

**LASALLE** — Senior members of the Rochelle boys basketball team haven't defeated the Sterling Golden Warriors since entering high school roughly four years ago. The Hubs will have their chance to exact the ultimate revenge when they square off against the Golden Warriors in the semifinal round of the IHSA 3A Sterling Regional next Wednesday at 7 p.m.

Rochelle closed out its regular season and conference schedule Friday night, topping the 80-point mark for the second straight game in an 82-70 victory over LaSalle-Peru. Garrett Burdin and Landan Martin each totaled 24 points for the Hubs (19-11, 9-5 Interstate 8), who enter regionals as the No. 5 seed having won 15 of their last 17 games. "I think the boys are really excited to play Sterling in their home gym," head coach Tim Thompson said. "They're due for a win against them and they're excited about the matchup... Not only do we have to shoot the ball well, but we have to do the little things like boxing out on defense and getting of-

fensive rebounds. We need to make sure we're diving on the floor for loose balls, taking charges and limiting them to one-and-out possessions."

The Hubs closed Friday's first quarter against L-P on a 10-1 run, taking a 20-10 lead into the second quarter after three players including seniors Austin Brown, Ben Hickey and the junior guard Burdin knocked down 3-pointers. Leading 39-27 entering the third quarter, Rochelle continued to fire from beyond the arc, with sophomore Ryan Simmons hitting back-to-back corner triples to extend the advantage. Simmons scored 12 points on four 3-pointers Friday.

"Ryan's come so far this season," Thompson said. "There were times earlier in the season where he'd shoot the ball once and not shoot again for the remainder of the game. His confidence is growing, and he was huge for us tonight with those four 3-pointers. He's shooting with confidence, and he's going to play a big role because the teams that scout us will probably play him as our fourth or fifth option, and that's dangerous because he can knock down shots."

Rochelle led by as many

as 24 points in the second half before LaSalle-Peru's Drake Weber caught fire from the 3-point line, hitting four triples over the third and fourth quarters and ending the game with a team-high 18 points. The Hubs maintained a 63-50

lead entering the fourth quarter, but the Cavaliers came within five points with less than two minutes to play.

Despite Brown and senior Seth Gould fouling out of the game, Rochelle managed to close the vic-

tory out at the line, with Burdin sinking three free throws in the final seconds. The winner of the regional semifinal game Wednesday night will advance and play for the title Friday night, likely against No. 2 seed Geneseo, another

former Northern Illinois Big 12 rival for the Hubs.

"I think our shooting is the X-factor," Thompson said. "We're going to have to shoot like we did against Ottawa, and we're also going to need some offense inside."

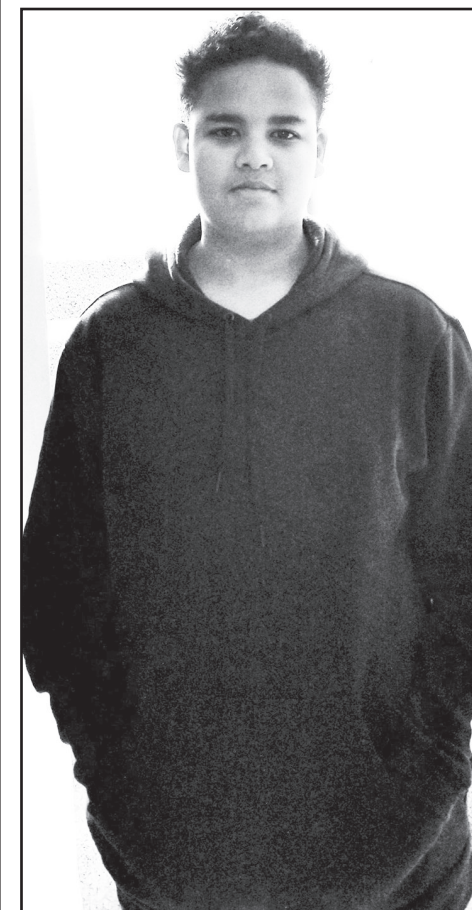

## RTHS alum Brizuela signs with eSports team

Former Hub student-athlete to play Fortnite, League of Legends

**ROCHELLE** — Kishwaukee College will feature a competitive eSports program for the first time next year, and one Rochelle Township High School alum plans to plug his way into the action.

While the Kougars are still searching for a head coach, former Hub student-athlete Josafat Brizuela signed a letter earlier this week to compete with the Kishwaukee College eSports team next season. Brizuela is currently studying to earn his associate's degree in photography and cinematography, which he will use to pursue a photography and videography business. Brizuela is the first student-athlete in RTHS history to sign with a collegiate eSports program.

"I've always been into playing video games and I want to compete against other schools," Brizuela

said. "I also want to meet new players from my school and other schools... I've been gaming since I was a kid playing Atari games like Space Invaders. I enjoy playing video games because it's a stress reliever and it makes me more competitive. I want to be a better player."

Kishwaukee College, along with other NJCAA schools, will compete in the National Association of Collegiate eSports (NACE). The NACE holds fall competitions for games such as Overwatch, Paladins, Smite and Rocket League. Games currently listed under the spring competitions category are Counter Strike, Rocket League, League of Legends and Fortnite. Brizuela said he plans to compete for the Kishwaukee College League of Legends and Fortnite teams.

"I really like these games because they involve skill and technique

to win," Brizuela said. "Players can't just pick up the game and expect to win without any knowledge of what's going on or what they're doing... I'm looking forward to joining the eSports program, working as a team and seeing how these tournaments go. I've competed online for Call of Duty and [Tom Clancy's] Rainbow Six Siege, but this will be my first time playing with a team with the actual team members physically there. I'm excited for the competitive vibe in the arena."

eSports was one of three new athletic programs (bowling and golf) that Kishwaukee College introduced this past fall. Brizuela, who spent one season with the RTHS soccer program as a junior, said he enjoys strategy and competitive games most. Brizuela is one of two student-athletes currently signed to the eSports program, with more expected to come.
