'Pedal'ing a dream

ONE local man who purchased his dream car just two years ago, is now restoring a scaled down replica pedal car as close to his full-size version as possible.

Xavier Valdivieso, a Rochelle resident and owner of an original 1968 Mustang convertible, was flipping a house when the previous owner of the property mentioned an old pedal car was left in the attic. Once Valdivieso asked what kind of car it was and heard it was a Mustang, he said that he had to have it.

"We were inspecting a house in Ashton and the previous owner had found the car in the attic above the garage," said Valdivieso. "I asked what kind of car it was, and once he said it was a Mustang, I said that I wanted it."

The previous owner had no connection to the car, so he sold it to Valdivieso. Valdivieso said the type of pedal car that he acquired was fairly rare.

When Valdivieso acquired the car, it had been sitting for a long period of time, so it had become very dirty and rusty. He sand-blasted it, cleaned it up and began searching around for someone who knew how to paint

a pedal car like his.

After some time of calling around, he found a person at Kunes Country Chrysler dealership in Sterling, who was experienced in painting pedal cars.

"They treated this just like a real car," said Valdivieso. "He put a primer coat on it, body filler to take the little dents out, then another primer coat. He then sanded it, put

a third primer coat on it, applied the Acapulco Blue paint and topped it off with three coats of finish."

According to the painter, normally a regular car only gets two coats of finish, but he put a third coat on the car for extra protection.

The pedal car is a replica of a 1965 Mustang, while Valdivieso has a 1968 Mustang, his goal is to make the

pedal car look as close to his car as possible. To do this, Valdivieso searched online for wheels, rims and hubcaps to match the specific model and year of his car.

The detail put into matching the two cars is very precise, from wrapping the steering wheel with identical materials, to copying the exact decals.

Water main work begins

ROCHELLE — Following approval of a reimbursement agreement at the Jan. 27 Rochelle City Council meeting by council members, work on redevelopment work by MECEN, LLC - commonly known as Acres Bistro - began Monday.

Teresa Petry, owner of The Artists' Garden located downtown, is

incorporating the Acres Bistro into the building the store is located and requested a development agreement with the city for the property located at 407 Lincoln Highway.

As per the agreement, the city agrees to reimburse MECEN, LLC up to \$50,000 for the purposes of fostering the redevelopment of the building. Stipulation of the grant is the money may only be used to reimburse expenditures for the in-

stallation of a larger water service from the city's water main to the building and for the installation of an approved fire suppression system and back flow valves.

"This project continues to support the city's strategic plan goals by improving and developing our downtown," community development director Michelle Pease said.

Funding for statewide broadband expansion released

THE first \$50 million of the \$420 million dedicated to statewide broadband Internet expansion was released during the week, along with information about how to apply for the grants.

Applicants for the grant are anticipated to include Internet service providers, rural cooperatives, nonprofits and local governments.

Grant responses for the first round of funding can be submitted through April 3, with up to \$5 million available per project. Interested applicants can find more information about the Notice of Funding Opportunity at <https://www2.illinois.gov/dceo/AboutDCEO/GATA/Pages/2366-1333.aspx>.

The Rebuild Illinois capital plan has slated \$420 million toward

broadband expansion — \$400 million for the grant program and \$20 million to strengthen the Illinois Century Network. The matching requirements in the grant program will leverage state funds to attract at least an additional \$400 million from Internet service providers.

Legislation eliminates

FOID card

Those wanting to purchase firearms would no longer need to possess a FOID card under legislation introduced recently. Filed on Feb. 4, Senate Bill 2535 would repeal the Firearm Owners Identification (FOID) Act, which supporters of the bill say is outdated and redundant.

The FOID Act was

created in 1968 as a way to identify people who were eligible to own firearms as part of a public-safety initiative in Illinois to meet the requirements of the federal Gun Control Act of 1968. However, with updated technology allowing for the use of instant background checks, the bill's sponsors say the FOID card serves no real purpose.

While Senate Bill 2535 would eliminate the need for a person to own a FOID card, it would not change any of the other requirements for purchasing a firearm. Those who buy a firearm would still need to undergo strict federal background checks at the time of purchase.

Earned Income

Tax Credit

Tax season is here and the Illinois Department of Revenue (IDOR) is reminding taxpayers to take full advantage of the Illinois Earned Income Credit (EIC) and the Federal Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC).

Anyone eligible for the federal EITC automatically qualifies for the Illinois EIC, which is a refundable tax credit worth up to 18 percent of a taxpayer's federal claim. However, IDOR says nearly 20,000 Illinoisans claimed a federal EITC credit without also claiming the state EIC, leaving more than \$5 million unclaimed.

To be eligible for the tax credit programs,

taxpayers must meet certain income and residency qualifications and file a tax return, even if they do not owe any tax or are not required to file. To find out if your family qualifies for the credit, visit the Internal Revenue Service's EITC Assistant at <https://www.irs.gov/credits-deductions/individuals/earned-income-tax-credit/use-the-eitc-assistant>.

"I want to match it to the 68 that I have, so Russ Barber from Printing Etc. made all of the decals," said Valdivieso. "These are the exact decals my car has, and we even scanned my license plate to put onto the car."

Valdivieso purchased the car

and began his restoration project on Aug. 13, 2019 and hopes to have it all finished within the next two weeks. This is the second pedal car that he has worked on, the first one being a fire truck.

One of the main reasons behind completing this project is because he has grandchildren

on the way, but he also looks forward to bringing it to his first ever car show.

"We will be taking it out when we do some shows with the other car," said Valdivieso. "I have never been to a car show, but when I do, I will bring this along and it might even be more popular than my real car."

According to City Manager Jeff Fiegenschuh the project is reimbursed on an annual basis and based on when the project can be completed up to three years.

"I commend Teresa and her family for doing this project," Fiegenschuh said. "This is another example of - when we're talking about downtown development - these folks are putting significant dollars of their own into this building. Trying to bring a restaurant into the downtown that goes along with a lot of the other things that are happening.

This seemed like the best way in my mind to keep this project going."

Council member Tom McDermott added that the

whole downtown should be looked at.

"I really think we need to look at the whole downtown and I know

we've got some massive alley projects we've been looking at and things like that," he said. "If we're going to make that honest effort to redo our downtown, sprinklers are going to become a big issue in every building, at least on the east side. It is going to be struggling to get the water supply, so I'm all for this one and I hope when we look at this one we look at that whole block and if it's better for us to jump bigger, then let's maybe get that done also."

The motion passed 5-0. Funding will come from the city's water fund.

pecially appreciated the relationship with fellow grade-school colleagues and was also grateful for all the support and help offered by the retired teaching community in her time of need. Kathy favorite past-times were reading and watching football on TV. She was also noted as a quilter and home decorator.

Her greatest joy was spending time with twin 6-year old granddaughters. Kathy relocated to Salt Lake City, Utah, two years ago to be with them. She stayed for six months before returning to Oregon.

She is survived by her husband, Andy, of Oregon; son, Blair Colbert, of Salt Lake City, Utah; daughter, Jorie (Carlton) Getz of Salt Lake City, Utah; grandchildren, Alexandra and Liliya Getz; father, Dick Hilliard of King, Wisconsin; brother Rich Hilliard of Tampa, Florida, brother Rob Hilliard of Tomah Wisconsin; mother-in-law, Bobbie Colbert, of Rochelle; brother-in-laws Bo (Cindy) Colbert of North Carolina and Tony (Catherine) Colbert of Wyoming; and sister-in-laws Jodi (Brett) Kemp of Montana and Suzie Colbert of Virginia.






Opioids: Facts parents need to know

What are opioids?

There are legal opioids like prescription pain relievers and illegal opioids like heroin and illicit fentanyl.

Prescription opioids are powerful pain-reducing medications. Some prescription opioids are made directly from the opium poppy plant. Others are made by scientists in a laboratory although they have similar chemical structures.

What is heroin?

Heroin is an addictive illegal drug made from morphine, a natural substance that is found in the seed pod of opium poppy plants in Southeast and Southwest Asia, Mexico, and Colombia. It is a type of opioid. Heroin can come in powder form or as a black sticky substance. Heroin can be injected, sniffed, snorted, or smoked.

Heroin may have many street names including Big H, Black Tar, Chiva, Hell Dust, Horse, Negra, Smack, and Thunder.

What is the connection between prescription opioids and heroin?

Prescription pain relievers and heroin are chemically similar and produce similar effects. You can become addicted to both and overdose on both. Some people get addicted to prescription opioids and then switch to heroin. Others simply start using heroin.

In some communities, heroin is cheaper and potentially easier to get than prescription opioids, which is why some people who are addicted to prescription opioids sometimes switch. Data from 2011 showed that an estimated 4 to 6 percent who misuse prescription opioids switch to heroin 4–6 and about 80 percent of people who used heroin first misused prescription opioids. 4–6

More recent data suggest that heroin is frequently the first opioid people use. In a study of those entering treatment for opioid use disorder, approximately one-third reported heroin as the first opioid they used regularly to get high.⁷

What are the effects of heroin on the brain, body, and behavior?

Just like other opioids, heroin binds to the opioid receptors in the brain and body, causing euphoria and relieving pain. This means that the short-term and long-term effects will be similar to those experienced from prescription opioids. However, people who inject heroin can also experience collapsed veins.

Additionally, people who inject drugs increase their risk of getting HIV or hepatitis C. These diseases are passed from person to person through blood and other bodily fluids. When people share needles or other drug equipment, they can come into contact with these fluids. HIV, and less often hepatitis C, can also be spread through unprotected sex.

What are the most commonly used prescription opioids?

Common opioid medicines include:
 hydrocodone (Vicodin®)
 oxycodone (OxyContin®, Percocet®)
 oxymorphone
 morphine (Kadian®, Avinza®)
 codeine
 fentanyl


How do opioids affect the brain and make people feel high?

Opioids attach to and activate opioid receptors located in many areas of the brain, spinal cord, and other organs in the body, especially those involved in feelings of pain and pleasure.

When opioids attach to these receptors, they block pain signals sent from the brain to the body and release large amounts of dopamine in the brain's reward regions. Dopamine is the chemical responsible for motivating our actions and repeating pleasurable experiences. This release can strongly reinforce the act of taking the drug, making the user want to take the drug again and again despite negative consequences.

What are the health effects of opioids?

In the short-term, opioids can relieve pain and make people feel relaxed. However, opioids can also have harmful effects, including:

- extreme drowsiness
- confusion
- nausea
- constipation
- slowed breathing

Over time, opioid use and misuse can lead to insomnia, muscle pain, heart problems, pneumonia, and addiction.

How do people use opioids?

Prescription opioids are prescribed by doctors to treat pain and other health issues, such as controlling coughs and diarrhea. When used as prescribed and for a short time, opioids are relatively safe. But when they are misused, they can be dangerous.

People misuse opioids by:

taking a prescription in ways other than instructed, like taking more than prescribed or taking it more often getting and using prescription pills from a friend or family member, even if it's for a real medical condition taking prescription drugs to get high mixing prescription opioids with alcohol or other drugs crushing pills or opening capsules, dissolving the powder in water, and injecting the liquid into a vein, or snorting the powder.

Some opioids, like heroin, aren't available by prescription. People use these drugs just to get high.

How many teens misuse opioids?

According to NIDA's annual Monitoring the Future Survey of eighth, 10th, and 12th graders, the use of one popular prescription opioid, Vicodin®, has been decreasing since 2009.8 In 2018, 1.7 percent of 12th graders misused Vicodin. These declining numbers likely reflect the hard work of parents and local community public health experts. However, opioid misuse rates increase after the age of 18, so it is critical to talk with teens early and frequently, to reinforce these health messages as they prepare to leave home and start their adult lives. Why do young people use opioids?

Curiosity, peer pressure, and the desire to fit in with friends are common reasons that preteens and teens start misusing opioids. For some, opioid use begins as a way of coping with anxiety, anger, depression, or boredom. Preteens, and teens in particular, may struggle with depression and anxiety but do not recognize it or want to talk about it. Parents often assume there is nothing wrong if their children do not discuss their feelings. Being high can be a way of simply avoiding the problems and challenges of growing up. Parents, grandparents, and older siblings are models who children follow, and research suggests that family members' use of alcohol and drugs plays a strong role in whether a young person starts using drugs, such as opioids.

Addiction means a person continues to seek and take the drug despite negative consequences. All aspects of the teen environment—home, school, and community—can influence if they will try, or even become addicted to drugs.

Sobering Facts: Drunk Driving in ILLINOIS

- Thanks to dedicated efforts, rates of drunk driving and alcohol-involved fatal crashes have gone down in recent years.
- Still, drunk drivers got behind the wheel millions of times in 2010.


Persons Killed in Crashes Involving a Drunk Driver¹

Drunk driving laws

Drunk driving laws make it illegal nationwide to drive with a BAC at or above 0.08 percent. For people under 21, “zero tolerance” laws make it illegal to drive with any measurable amount of alcohol in their system. These laws, along with laws that maintain the minimum legal drinking age at 21, are in place in all 50 states and the District of Columbia, and have had a clear effect on highway safety, saving tens of thousands of lives since their implementation.

Sobriety checkpoints

Sobriety checkpoints allow police to briefly stop vehicles at specific, highly visible locations to see if the driver is impaired. Police may stop all or a certain portion of drivers. Breath tests may be given if police have a reason to suspect the driver is intoxicated.

Ignition interlocks

Ignition interlocks installed in cars measure alcohol on the driver’s breath. Interlocks keep the car from starting if the driver has a BAC above a certain level, usually 0.02 percent. They’re used for people convicted of drunk driving and are highly effective at preventing repeat offenses while installed. Mandating interlocks for all offenders, including first-time offenders, will have the greatest impact.

Alcohol screening and interventions

Alcohol screening and brief interventions take advantage of “teachable moments” to identify people at risk for alcohol problems and get them treatment as needed. This combined strategy, which can be delivered in health care, university, and other settings, helps change behavior and reduces alcohol-impaired crashes and injuries.

School-based programs

School-based instructional programs are effective at teaching teens not to ride with drunk drivers. More evidence is needed to see if these programs can also reduce drunk driving and related crashes.

Binge drinking

BINGE drinking is a serious but preventable public health problem. Binge drinking is the most common, costly, and deadly pattern of excessive alcohol use in the United States.^{1,2,3} The National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism^{External} defines binge drinking as a pattern of drinking that brings a person’s blood alcohol concentration (BAC) to 0.08 grams percent or above. This typically happens when men consume 5 or more drinks or women consume four or more drinks in about two hours.⁴ Most people who binge drink are not alcohol dependent.¹

Who binge drinks?

One in six US adults binge drinks about four times a month, consuming about seven drinks per binge. This results in 17 billion total binge drinks consumed by adults annually, or 467 binge drinks per binge drinker.⁵

Binge drinking is most common among younger adults aged 18–34 years, but more than half of the total binge drinks are consumed by those aged 35 and older.⁵

Binge drinking is twice as common among men than among women. Four in five total binge drinks are consumed by men.⁵

Prevalence of binge drinking by age group, 2015. This bar graph depicts the percentage of the total U.S. population age high school and up who report binge drinking. The percentage value for each category is as follows: high school students grades 9-12 are 17.7 percent, ages 18-24 are 25.1 percent, ages 25-34 are 25.7 percent, ages 35-44 are 19.6 percent, ages 45-64 are 13.7 percent, and ages 65 and up are 4.6 percent.

Binge drinking is more common among people with household incomes of \$75,000 or more and higher educational levels. Binge drinkers with lower incomes and educational levels, however, consume more binge drinks per year.⁵

Over 90 percent of U.S. adults who drink excessively report binge drinking in the past 30 days.¹

Most people younger than age 21 who drink alcohol report binge drinking, often consuming large amounts.^{6,7}

Binge drinking has serious risks

Binge drinking is associated with many health problems,^{8–10} including the following:

- Unintentional injuries such as car crashes, falls, burns, and alcohol poisoning.
- Violence including homicide, suicide, intimate partner violence, and sexual assault.
- Sexually transmitted diseases.
- Unintended pregnancy and poor pregnancy outcomes, including miscarriage and stillbirth.
- Fetal alcohol spectrum disorders.
- Sudden infant death syndrome.
- Chronic diseases such as high blood pressure, stroke, heart disease, and liver disease.

Cancer of the breast, mouth, throat, esophagus, liver, and colon.
Memory and learning problems.
Alcohol dependence.

Binge drinking costs everyone

Drinking too much, including binge drinking, cost the United States \$249 billion in 2010, or \$2.05 a drink. These costs resulted from losses in workplace productivity, health care expenditures, criminal justice costs, and other expenses. Binge drinking was responsible for 77 percent of these costs, or \$191 billion.²

Preventing binge drinking

The Community Preventive Services Task Force recommends evidence-based interventions to prevent binge drinking and related harms.¹¹ Recommended strategies include:


- Using pricing strategies, including increasing alcohol taxes.
- Limiting the number of retail alcohol outlets that sell alcoholic beverages in a given area.
- Holding alcohol retailers responsible for the harms caused by illegal alcohol sales to minors or intoxicated patrons (dram shop liability).
- Restricting access to alcohol by maintaining limits on the days and hours of alcohol retail sales.
- Consistently enforcing laws against underage drinking and alcohol-impaired driving.
- Maintaining government controls on alcohol sales (avoiding privatization).
- Screening and counseling for alcohol misuse.





Hubs clip Cardinals

Rochelle overcomes slow start to dominate Stillman Valley 75-62

ROCHELLE — A stern message from head coach Tim Thompson set the Rochelle boys basketball team into high gear when the Hubs hosted nonconference foe Stillman Valley on Wednesday.

The Cardinals opened the contest with a 7-0 run over the Hubs, who went scoreless over roughly the first four minutes of action. Rochelle called a timeout to reset, and the Hubs responded with fervor, dominating the second and third quarters and coasting to a 75-62 win over Stillman Valley. “We came together after the first quarter and coach Thompson wasn’t happy about that run,” senior Seth Gould said. “We knew we shouldn’t have let that happen, and from that point, we were in agreement that we weren’t going to let that team beat us.”

Rochelle erased Stillman Valley’s lead with a 9-0 spurt early in the second quarter behind a drop-off layup and a corner 3-pointer from sophomore Tanner Lager, who has missed the bulk of the season with a

lower-body injury. With his team leading 25-19, Rochelle guard Garrett Burdin took over the final minutes of the first half, putting two layups home before sinking back-to-back 3-pointers. The Hubs took a 36-29 lead over the Cardinals into halftime.

“It felt good to get the win tonight and it feels good to get back into the mix,” Lager said. “I started strong in the sophomore game and I was able to get into my rhythm. I shot the ball well tonight, and I’m hoping to play a role with the varsity team as the season moves on.”

The Cardinals had no answers for Rochelle’s fast-paced offense in the third quarter, where eight Hubs entered the scorebook including Gould, who scored all 12 of his points in the second half. Guards Spencer Warborg and Landan Martin each knocked down triples for the Hubs, who blew the game wide open with a 62-44 advantage entering the fourth quarter.

“I knew I could score against these guys,” Gould said. “I got to the rim a lot in the first half, but I wasn’t able to finish my shots. I told myself during

halftime that layups are my specialty and I need to make them... Having so many players score really motivates us. When we hear the crowd scream-

ing for every player, those cheers motivate us to finish the game strong.”

Rochelle led by as many as 22 points in the fourth quarter before Still-

man Valley came within 13 points behind a strong effort from Evan Davidson, who led the Cardinals with 18 points. Martin scored a team-high 19

points for the Hubs, with Burdin adding 16 points and Lager totaling seven points. Seniors Austin Brown and Ben Hickey combined for 11 points.

Lady Hubs earn emotional victory over Plano

Rochelle edges Reapers 50-47 as players show support for Lodico family

ROCHELLE — The LadyHubs were playing for more than just one victory when Rochelle took on the Plano Reapers at home for an Interstate 8 Conference basketball game Thursday evening.

With several players wearing blue headbands and garments in support of teammate Bella Lodico, the Lady Hubs went down to the wire before ultimately edging out the Reapers 50-47 and snapping their 15-game losing streak. In a show of sportsmanship, Plano players also wore blue on Thursday, and team captains presented Lodico with flowers and a card for her mother Tricia, who’s currently battling cancer, before tipping off the conference battle.

“It felt really great to know that I can rely on my teammates and the community to support me and

my family,” Lodico said. “We’re always looking out for each other... They said before the game that not only were they playing for me, but they were playing for my mom, and that really stuck with me. I think that’s something that will stick with me for the rest of my life.”

Fittingly, Lodico was the player who sparked the Rochelle offense in the first quarter, scoring six straight points on an old-fashioned 3-point play and a 3-pointer from the left elbow to tie the game 15-15 entering the second quarter. Despite Plano’s Maddie Jule making three triples and totaling 15 first-half points, the Lady Hubs (4-24, 1-12 Interstate 8) held a 25-23 lead.

“I feel like we took a step forward tonight,” Lodico said. “We’re going to have more confidence as we prepare for our next game.”



ROCHELLE — Senior guard Austin Brown had been going head-to-head with Rochelle coach Tim Thompson in free-throw shooting contests during a few of the team's recent practices. Those friendly competitions were put to the test Friday night, when the Hubs needed Brown to step up at the line during the final moments of their Interstate 8 Conference game against Plano.

Rochelle held a 26-point advantage over the Reapers early in the third quarter, but Plano flipped the game on its head after switching to a 1-2-2 defensive press. The Reapers brought the Hubs within only a few points late in the fourth quarter, but Rochelle went 8-for-8 from the free-throw line down the stretch, with Brown sinking six of those shots to help the Hubs survive Plano 73-70. Brown finished with a game-high 21 points for Rochelle (14-11, 5-5 Interstate 8).

"Coach [Thompson] and I have had some free-throw contests recently," Brown said. "When I walked up to the free-throw line tonight, I thought about beating coach Thompson. I was able to stay calm under pressure and make some free throws for our team." While Plano's furious fourth-quarter comeback

put the Reapers in a position to win Friday's game, Rochelle was the team to dominate the early portion of the second half. Leading 36-27, the Hubs nearly blew Plano out of the gym, breaking off an 18-1 run that included three 3-pointers from junior guard Garrett Burdin and a triple from Brown. Rochelle capitalized on poor Reaper passes, intercepting balls in the open court and creating easy scoring chances.

"Shooting's contagious," Brown said. "When we make one shot, we hear the fans go crazy and we feed off their energy. We know we can create easier shots by getting takeaways, and we were passing up good shots for great shots. We were pressuring the ball, and we felt they were trying to force the ball and make flashy passes."

The scoring surge put Rochelle ahead 54-28 halfway through the third quarter, prompting the Reapers to begin implementing their 1-2-2 three-quarter press. The Hubs struggled to move the ball against Plano's press, with back-court and sideline turnovers creating extra offensive possessions for the Reapers, whose superior size started to factor into the game.

Behind 6-foot-8 forward Griffin Cross and 6-foot-6 forward Robbie Taylor, Plano closed the third quarter on a 12-4

run before opening the fourth quarter with 10 unanswered points. With 2:18 remaining in the game, the Reapers were on a 21-7 stretch and only down 65-61.

"We had a lot of miscommunications," Brown

said. "We weren't flashing in the middle and we were making a lot of bad moves with the ball... We knew we had to want it more. They were a lot bigger than us, and the last time we faced them, they pounded us on the boards."

Brown's first pair of free throws in the final minute led to a quick 3-point rebuttal from Plano guard Gabe Rodriguez to make it 69-68 Rochelle with 29 seconds remaining. After Brown hit two more freebies, Cross knifed through

the Hub defense for a layup before the Reapers used their final timeout trailing 71-70 with 6.1 seconds to go. Rochelle successfully inbounded the ball to senior Landan Martin, who swished two free throws to finish with 19 points.




