# One injured in trailer fire

ROCHELLE – One woman sustained minor injuries in a trailer fire and was transported to Rochelle Community Hospital Friday afternoon.

The Rochelle Fire Department, with assistance from the Ogle-Lee Fire Protection District and the Ogle County Sheriff's Office, responded to a trailer fire at Shangri La trailer park around 2:15 p.m. Friday just west of Rochelle.

The Rochelle Fire Department received a call at 2:16 p.m. of a trailer on fire at 102 Lilac Lane. By the time Rochelle firefighters arrived on scene, the Flagg Center firefighters were attempting to put out the fully engulfed trailer.

At the time of the fire one resident was inside. She was able to escape with minor injuries.

"When we arrived, the

only resident had managed to get out of the building, but she was having trouble breathing," explained Rochelle Fire Chief Dave Sawlsville. "She was transported to Rochelle Community Hospital to be treated for smoke inhalation."

After making sure that no one else was hurt, firefighters began to put out the flames that were shooting out of a hole on the west side of the trailer.

On scene were the Rochelle Fire Department, Flagg Center Fire Depart-

ment, Steward Fire Department and the Hillcrest Fire Department. The Creston Fire Department took over command at the Rochelle Fire Department while crews were on scene at Shangri La.

Since the trailer was fully engulfed at the time of arrival, the only way to get the fire under control was with lots of water.

"When we arrived, we were a little behind the curve already, and at that point the only thing that could stop the fire was lots and lots of water," added Sawlsville.

There were three engines on scene, one that held 800 gallons of water, one that held 1,000 gallons and Flagg Center's engine that held 3,000 gallons of water.

The trailer along with the contents were a total loss. There was no damage to any surrounding property.

The cause of the fire remains under investigation.

# Body of one missing boater recovered

DIXON — The body of one missing Ogle County boater was recovered Friday from the Rock River in Dixon.

The body of James Swift, 64, of Forrester, was recovered near the dam in Dixon, according to Lee County Coroner Jesse Partington. Swift was one of two boaters to go missing Nov. 20 when the boat he and another fisherman were in capsized near Oregon on the Rock River.

"The body was transported to the Ogle County morgue and was positively identified by tattoos on the body," Partington said, adding an autopsy on the body would most likely be conducted Monday.

# Forever a part of Rochelle history

ROCHELLE – Betty Lu Barnes, a local resident and historian who passed away on Dec. 20, 2019, will forever be remembered for all that she did within the community and preserving its history for future generations.

Barnes was born on May 25, 1918 in Princeton, graduated from Rochelle Township High School in 1936 and then went on to study and graduate from the Northern Illinois State Teacher's College with an associate's degree in education. She taught in a one-room school on house for two years before marrying her

husband Floyd "Barney" Barnes in the year 1940.

After getting married her passion for history began to grow, she began traveling to different local schools giving presentations on the history of the area. While Barnes was interested in all things history, she was especially interested in genealogy and Native American history.

Throughout her time in the community she was part of many different local organizations such as the Rochelle Women's Club, the Daughters of American Colonists and the Camp Fire Girls, as well as serving on their national board of directors. On top of being a part of these organizations she

continued following her passion for history.

Anytime Barnes would hear or read something she thought was interesting, she would write it down on a notecard or cut it out and document it in boxes for the future.

"She was very meticulous with writing things down and holding on to things, from obituaries to extensive research she had done into genealogy, as well as even holding onto clothing," said Jan Devore, Flagg museum director. "All of her donations have totaled up to about 50 boxes

that we are currently storing in our jail cell number two."

Barnes has always shown an interest in local history and was even part of the original historical society, the group who was responsible for establishing the museum in the 1970s.

Throughout the years of collecting historical documents and storing them in boxes, one of her daughters would send them to the museum anytime it was something she thought would be good to display.

**ROCHELLE** – The Future Farmers of America Youth Organization is turning 90 years old in the United States as well as at Rochelle Township High School, and the community is hosting a big bash to celebrate the special occasion.

The FFA is an organization that was founded at Rochelle Township High School in November of 1929 and

is the oldest continued running program or club at the school. The organization is open to anyone at the school who has an interest in agriculture or business in agriculture and is taking at least one agriculture class.

While the organization aims to educate its members on agriculture and farming, the focus is on improving certain areas of an individual that also prepares members to become future chemists, veterinarians, government officials, entrepreneurs, bankers, international business leaders, teachers and premier professionals in many career fields.

"At the end of it, the three things that we focus on are leadership, because the future leaders of the country are the kids at the high school right now. The second one that we focus on is personal growth and the third one is career success," explained Donna Page, agriculture teacher and FFA advisor at RTHS. "We are trying to

find a way to link those students with potential careers that they might be interested in."

The FFA at RTHS currently has 106 members with approximately 55 being active members, meaning they did at least one thing during the first semester of the year.

To celebrate 90 years at the high school and in the community the FFA and RTHS are hosting a 90th birthday bash. The celebration will take place on Saturday,

Jan. 11 from 2 to 4 p.m., at Bearrows Auction House located on Fowler Road in Rochelle. The event will include an open house with current and former members of the FFA there chat with and reconnect with.

Current RTHS employees and members of the FFA are hoping that everyone comes out to celebrate the impact that the FFA has made on both the high school and the community.

"We would love to see any members or alumni come out to celebrate 90 years at RTHS and 90 impacting the community," added Page.

## Roller rink has new owner

Jones adds skating business to her growing portfolio

**MOUNT MORRIS** — Growing up, Oregon native Rebecca Jones used to go skating at the White Pines Roller Skating Center.

As of Dec. 23, she now owns it.

“Oh my gosh, yes,” she said with a laugh when asked if she skated there when she was growing up. “I spent a lot of time here when I was a kid.”

The roller rink, located at 6929 W. Pines Road, fits perfectly with her other businesses. On April 1, 2019, Jones became the owner of the Pine Creek Canyon Wedding venue, three acres next to the venue, office space and the Pine Creek Cabins. The area is now Pine Creek Escape. Add-

ing the skating center means she now owns 12 acres in that area.

“It kind of romantically fits into my portfolio,” Jones said, adding that she never thought she would own a skating

rink.

She said her plan is to keep it open as a skating center for people to enjoy.

The rink first opened in 1947, and Jones said it still has its original

marble floor.

“It’s in impeccable shape,” she said. “Not one crack in it.”

Jones bought the property from Dave and Maggie Johnson. Dave purchased the business

in 1984 and had run it since, but Jones said the couple had moved to Tennessee.

“I had a feeling that they were thinking about selling this property,” Jones said.

And now she owns a business with deep roots in the community and her own family. Not only did Jones skate there as a kid, but her grandmother also skated there throughout high school. Her grandmother’s sister even met her husband at the rink.

The rink is open Friday 7-10 p.m., Saturday 1-5 p.m. and 7- 11 p.m. and Sunday 1-4 p.m. It is also open for a variety of special events and is for rent for private parties and events.

The space also has a concession stand and a full arcade.

Jones said he main goal for now is to clean up the front entrance and continue to operate, “a safe, fun place where kids can be active instead of sitting in front of a TV.”

## History of rink goes back to WWII

**T**HE story goes that the rink, built in 1947, was an airplane hangar from WWII brought down from Minnesota. There used to be an airport style searchlight on the top of the rink years ago, and it had a tag on it stating it was a WWII surplus.

The terrazzo floor was laid for the 160-foot by 80-foot skating area, one of the largest in the Midwest and is still there today, in perfect condition.

Ken Sheely, who owned The Canyon for years, remembers attending the day it



opened, when he was 6 years old. Back then it was 5 cents for a soda at The Rink.

Dave Johnson bought The Rink in 1984, when he was 21 years old and has operated it for the

last 35 years. The inside has been remodeled over the years and even offers a large arcade today.

At the time of the boaters' initial disappearance, recovery efforts were made by dive teams. At one time, a body was located; however, worsening river conditions and strong currents prevented recovery of the body.

"We are grateful for the recovery of Mr. Swift and the closure it will bring to his family and friends," Ogle County Sheriff Brian VanVickle said. "The Sheriff's Office continues to plan and implement future river operations with hopes of locating the second individual in the near future."

**CREMATED REMAINS**

As cremation gains in popularity, some odd dilemmas crop up. Some years ago, for instance, funeral directors in Florida realized they had a delicate problem on their hands. Their storage rooms were filling up with containers of unclaimed cremated remains, some of which had been there more than half a century.

In some cases the deceased had no immediate survivors and had left no directions beyond a request for cremation. Sometimes the widows or widowers had planned to claim the remains within a few weeks, but died themselves before doing so.

Then, too, there were plenty of instances in which survivors

apparently didn't understand that while cremation satisfies the law's demand for the "final disposition" of a body, the ashes that emerge from the fire are the tangible remains of a human life and call for something more dignified than being dumped into the trash bin.

# YEAR IN REVIEW

## July

**Sunday, July 7**

**ROCHELLE**—When many people hear the name Mike Rowe they might first think of the celebrity's hit television show *Dirty Jobs*, where he travels across the country and demonstrates the most disgusting jobs people do for a living.

But Rowe might now be better known to Rochelle area residents for his generous donation to Rochelle's very own The Kitchen Table, operated by Carolyn and Grant Brown and other volunteer board members.

Rowe produces a new internet series titled "Returning the Favor," in which he searches for stories of organizations and people who put others in the community before themselves.

Local non-profit organization The Kitchen Table was selected a few months ago to be featured on an upcoming episode in the fourth season of the series which will air on July 22 through Facebook Watch.

"The Kitchen Table recently received both the attention and a \$50,000 donation from celebrity Mike Rowe as a part of his new internet streaming series," said Mark Schwendau, kitchen table board member, in a press release.

**Wednesday, July 10**

**ROCHELLE**—For the first time in nearly 20 years, travelers along Illinois Route 251 on the north side of Rochelle will have a new option when choosing where to fill up their gas tank, pick up some items, grab a bite to eat and more.

Construction on a new Mobil branded gas station and convenience store is currently underway at the northeast corner of Flagg Road and Illinois Route 251 and the operation is starting to take shape.

"There will be five gasoline dispensers with a separate diesel island, a 6,300-square foot convenience store that will include seating for about 25 people and eventually a quick serve restaurant," explained Tim Hayden, developer and owner.

**Wednesday, July 17**

"We have put brand new LED street lights in and they look amazing, we have also increased the electricity so now when vendors are there, they have a place to plug into at the base of those lights," explained Michelle Pease, community

development director.

**Sunday, July 21**

**ROCHELLE**—Rochelle Township High School football players used their day off from weightlifting and training this week vacuuming out cars and cooking a meal for the residents of Lincoln Manor Senior Housing of LSSI.

Kerri Villa-Nantz, the assistant property manager at Lincoln Manor, and her son have been doing this consistently throughout the years and it has grown into an annual event. When they first started, Nantz's son was in fifth grade and it was just him and his team. Each year it has continued to grow with 25 players participating last year and nearly 50 this year.

**Sunday, July 28**

**ROCHELLE**—Workers from Americold Logistics and children ages 7-12 at the Rochelle Child Care Center teamed up Tuesday afternoon to build benches, learn to work as a team and support the day care operation.

The Rochelle Child Care Center recently reached out to different corporations in the community seeking donations. Americold was contacted and came up with the idea of hosting a team building exercise rather than simply donating money.

"As Americold we look for opportunities to give back to our community. The theme today is building towards the future, and these are the youth that are going to be driving the next employees," said Dan Lundquist, Americold general manager.

**Wednesday, July 31**

**ROCHELLE**—Rail fans from near and far gathered at the Ken Wise Railroad Park Tuesday morning to witness the Union Pacific Big Boy steam engine No. 4014 live in action.

In honor of the 150th anniversary of the completion of the transcontinental railroad, Union Pacific has sent its newly restored steam engine on a cross-country tour making stops in different cities. The renovation process took two years to finish and makes the big boy the world's only operational locomotive.

Even people who aren't dedicated rail fans couldn't pass up a chance to see this piece of history.

## August

**Sunday, Aug. 4**

**STEWART**—A local team will be running in the Chicago Marathon this year as part of a life-changing mission.

Jennifer Knetsch from Stewart and her team from Heartland Community Church in Rockford will be participating in the Chicago Marathon this year as part of Team World Vision, a fundraising program of World Vision International. This program focuses on providing lower income families across the world with access to clean water.

"They are the largest non-governmental supplier of

clean water and every \$50 earned brings clean water to one person forever, not just a year or a month, but forever," explained Knetsch.

While Team World Vision will have thousands of runners in the marathon, the goal of Knetsch and her team is to earn \$300,000.

**Wednesday, Aug. 7**

**ROCHELLE**—As a continuation on Rochelle's re-branding project, the city is partnering with Western Illinois University in a "Mapping the Future of Your Community" program starting in September.

"Rochelle Revved Up!" is a new community-wide campaign geared at creating involvement of residents to not only identify a vision for the future of the city but to also help execute a plan to achieve the goals.

"We have seen many exciting changes over the past few years," said Jenny Thompson, City of Rochelle marketing and public relations manager. "We have a renewed excitement with community events, new downtown businesses, new wayfinding signage, downtown lights with banners and new murals and now we want to take things to the next level."

**Sunday Aug. 18**

**ROCHELLE**—Brush with Kindness, a program launched by Habitat for Humanity of Ogle County, recently built a new ramp leading into the home of two Rochelle residents.

BWK is a program that provides services such as painting, landscaping and minor exterior repairs for lower income homeowners. This year alone, they are completing four to five different projects all throughout Ogle County and this was one of the first.

Hub City Senior Center officials reached out to the Habitat leaders about completing this ramp for the homeowner's wife.

"The wife had recently been in the hospital and the husband was very concerned about her mobility and being able to get her in and out of the house without having a ramp already in place," explained Vanessa L. White-Broome, executive director of Habitat for Humanity of Ogle County.

She began speaking with the family and getting measurements in July. The work took about three weeks to complete, and it was just finished this last Friday. All of the funding for the project came from the Rochelle Area Community Foundation.

White-Broome said the project could not have been completed without the help from the foundation and the senior center.

# YEAR IN REVIEW

**Wednesday, Aug. 21**  
**ROCHELLE** – Americold of Rochelle officials hosted a grand opening ceremony for their new \$93 million cold storage facility Tuesday morning.

The event took place outside in the parking lot of the Americold facilities in Rochelle and included food, comments from the CEO of Americold and the Rochelle mayor, a ribbon cutting ceremony and tours inside the new facility.

The new building, features 173,000 square feet of refrigerated space and 7,000 square feet of non-refrigerated space for offices, electrical and engine rooms, maintenance and other operational duties. Everything within the new facility will be 100 percent fully automated and it will also feature a state-of-the-art fire protection system, eliminating the need for a traditional sprinkler system.

**Wednesday, Aug. 28**  
**ROCHELLE** – It was quite the sight for a Corvette lover at the Petro Travel Plaza in Rochelle Tuesday as nearly 200 Corvettes were parked bumper to bumper in the parking lot.

The cars were all part of the North Central Region of the 2019 Corvette Caravan that is heading across the country. The caravan features Corvette owners from all around that get together to drive to the National Corvette Museum in Bowling Green, Kentucky. The museum is expecting 8,000 Corvette owners to convene on the museum to celebrate its 25th anniversary.

For some, this was their first time participating in the caravan, and for others, they take part every five years. No matter how often or how many times they have participated, everyone attending the event shares a love for the same type of car.

## September

**Sunday, Sep. 1**  
**ROCHELLE** — Wednesday marked the beginning of a new era for the Hub City, as members of the Rochelle community gathered at Helms South to celebrate the start of construction on the \$14 million park district recreation center with a special groundbreaking ceremony.

Representatives from several groups involved in the project took part in the groundbreaking ceremony including the Flagg-Rochelle Community Park District Board of Commissioners and Rochelle Mayor John Bearrows, who was one of four people to speak during Wednesday's ceremony. Township residents voted in favor of funding the community center back in April.

**Wednesday, Sep. 14**  
**ROCHELLE** – Tyson Foods is donating \$26,388 to help fund Rochelle school district teacher projects.

The company has partnered with DonorsChoose.org to support teachers with a \$1 million investment. This comes as part of Tyson's commitment to support the communities in which their plants are located.

The money will be used to fund projects for 46 school districts in 37 different Tyson communities. Rochelle has received a total of \$26,388 to split between the two districts with each project receiving a max of \$1,000.

**Sunday, Sept. 15**  
**ROCHELLE** – On Friday, officials from Washington, D.C., Chicago and Springfield assembled for an event promoted as Rochelle's Infrastructure Celebration Day.

The event was held to commemorate the more than a dozen infrastructure projects that the City of Rochelle is building to attract new businesses and industries.

"This investment is what secures the city's future, as we are among a small number of communities that can say they are truly 'open for business' because we have what companies need and want to build and expand," mayor John Bearrows said when acknowledging the more than \$50 million investment the city has put into the projects.

Some of the major projects that support the mayor's charge is the \$7 million upgrade to the wastewater treatment plant and the more than \$15 million spent on improving a number of wells and water mains to increase Rochelle's water supply.

**Sunday, Sept. 22**  
**ROCHELLE** – The Vince Carney Community Theater held a ground-breaking ceremony at their future home on Wednesday morning.

VCCT was created in 1981 with a goal of bringing quality productions to Rochelle and Ogle County. Since its creation they have performed many different plays for the community, but were forced to find a new location to rent each time to perform.

Since acquiring the former Lincoln School property from the Kennay family and announcing to the public in June of 2018 that it will be the future home of the VCCT, crews of volunteers have been working hard cleaning it out and making it safe for renovations.


**Wednesday, Sept. 25**  
**ROCHELLE** – Rochelle City officials along with the water department held a ribbon cutting ceremony Monday morning to celebrate the completion of the Southview Drive water well No. 10.

The new well and its house were completed in 2018 and went online the first of the year. The new well and house were built in order to replace the previous well and house that were constructed in the 1960s and had become outdated.

**Sunday, Sept. 29**  
**ROCHELLE** – With the United States Census being counted next year, the City of Rochelle is doing everything in its power to ensure an accurate number is recorded.

Every 10 years the U.S. Constitution mandates that the U.S. government conducts a complete count of the country's population. To prepare Rochelle residents for the upcoming count next year, the city has created census partners, a group that has joined forces with many local non-profits and businesses to help spread the word to the community.

"The main goal of the group is to Inform, educate and encourage the community to complete the census," explained Rochelle City Clerk Sue Messer. "In the 2010 census it was estimated that there were roughly 8,560 people who went uncouncted in Ogle County and it is estimated that each uncouncted person corresponds to a minimum of \$1,535.

# Senior Night stunner

Harding, Portzen honored before Friday night showdown with Morris

**ROCHELLE** — The Lady Hubs were less than five minutes away from sending seniors Lilly Portzen and Gabby Harding out with a win when the Rochelle girls hosted Morris for their annual Senior Night basketball game on Friday.

Dominant defense and solid scoring performances from Josie Lundquist and Sam House helped the Lady Hubs build a seven-point halftime advantage and remain ahead five points after three quarters. Morris didn't lead for the majority of the contest, but the Redskins rallied behind Alexis Johnson and Mackenzie Lind, who combined for 13 fourth-quarter points as Morris erased its deficit and escaped Rochelle with a 40-35 win. The Lady Hubs are now 3-14.

"Gabby's a very vocal player whether she's on the court or off the court," head coach Tony Rowan said. "I'm very proud of her. She had a very bad injury on the first day of summer, but she came to everything she could. We talk about

having leadership characteristics in our program, and she has them... Lilly's a very positive player and she always tries to put a smile on our faces. She strives to improve herself and her teammates."

Rochelle has faced the three-quarter court press many times this season, but the Lady Hubs were the players getting active defensively early in the game. Morris guards had trouble getting the ball over the half-court line, and the Redskins mustered only one field goal in the first quarter, which Rochelle led 6-4 entering the second quarter. All six points came from Lundquist, who finished the night with a team-best 12 points.

"The girls were great in the first half," Rowan said. "We worked on our press today and we've seen a lot of different presses throughout the season. We knew how to run the press simply from knowing how other teams ran the press against us."

Six different Lady Hubs scored points in the second quarter including House, who was dynamite in the mid-range area all evening long. Sophomore Abby

Luxton made two putback layups over Morris defenders in the quarter, allowing Rochelle to build an 18-11 lead at halftime. House canned four mid-range jumpers in the second half, finishing the game with 10 points.

Johnson gave the Redskins their first lead of the game, knocking down a 3-pointer from the top of the line that put Morris ahead 29-27 with about four minutes remaining. Lind added two layups, including one on an inbounds

pass, that helped the Redskins remain ahead 36-33 with 45.6 seconds to play. Johnson sunk three free throws in the final minute of the fourth quarter, where Morris outscored Rochelle 19-9. Johnson led all scorers with 13 points.

"They spaced the floor well and they took good shots," Rowan said. "When we rotate slow on defense, it opens up shooting lanes for them, and they started taking advantage of those shooting lanes in the fourth quarter."

### Burdin bringing scoring mentality to the Hubs

ROCHELLE guard Garrett Burdin looks up to some of the greatest scorers in school history. Those players include Hall of Famer Ben Rand, Grant Prusator and Matt Rosenwinkel, who all played collegiately and found success as NCAA Division I student-athletes.

With those players in mind, it's no surprise that head coach Tim Thompson credited Burdin for having a scorer's mentality after the 6-foot-2 guard strung together his best performances of the season during the E.C. Nichols Holiday Classic in Marengo. Burdin's 24-point effort and six made 3-pointers propelled the Hubs over Belvidere in dominant fashion, and his 25-point outing led Rochelle to a near-upset against Crystal Lake Central this past weekend.

"Having a scorer's mentality fuels my game," Burdin said. "I like picking up the scoring for my team and doing whatever it takes to win. It all starts over the offseason, and our program is great when we dedicate ourselves because it's all about how much work we want to put in. Working over the offseason and at home has helped me a lot, and our team chemistry is great because we feed off each other and we help each other get better."

Burdin has been exposed to higher competition since his freshman season, when he played up with the sophomores and helped Rochelle win the Plano Christmas Classic and compile over 20 victories. He averaged over 10 points per game in his first varsity season last year, but an improved offensive arsenal including mid-lane floaters and short-range jump-stops has allowed him to increase his scoring output and average nearly 16 points per game this season.

"I've been creating goals and dreams for myself ever since I touched a basketball," Burdin said. "My dream is to play Division I basketball and I'm willing to do whatever it takes to make that dream come true... I want to shoot at a higher percentage than I am right now, and when I'm shooting a high percentage, I can create more opportunities for my teammates."

Burdin enjoys scoring the basketball as much as he enjoys playing to the crowd, and the talented guard had that chance when Rochelle and Kaneland engaged in a high-octane shootout this past season. The battle pitted Thompson against his coaching mentor Russ Zick, and the game featured several high-level scoring efforts including a 22-point night from Burdin, who canned four triples in the second quarter and six 3-pointers for the game.

"My favorite moment was the Senior Night game against Kaneland when we

won 88-84," Burdin said. "It was a high-scoring and fast-paced game and that's how I like to play... It was a really fun moment in the home gym. I feel that when I can bring energy to the floor, it brings out energy from everybody, and I want to be that high-energy player who hypes everybody up. Shooting is contagious, and I feel that energy is contagious too."

Burdin and his Rochelle teammates are looking to build off their strong finish to the Marengo tournament this past weekend. While the Hubs (4-8) struggled with some early-season adjustments, Burdin is confident that the team's renewed chemistry will result in more wins for the purple and white over the next few months.

"I felt like we struggled during the early part of the season, but I feel like we've become closer since we got through the Christmas tournament," Burdin said. "I think that tournament can be a big turning point in our season, and I feel that we have a lot of games coming up that we can win. I think we're going to start hitting our stride as we get ready for February and March."

RTHS recognized former Hub and Lady Hub student-athletes Alex Harvey and Jacie Wyatt during halftime of Wednesday's game. Both Harvey and Wyatt excelled in sports throughout the 2017-18 school year before graduating RTHS in 2018.

Harvey currently attends Washington University in St. Louis, while Wyatt attends Colorado State University. Wyatt currently studies business administration at Colorado State, while Harvey studies biomedical engineering at Wash-U.

"I'm extremely honored to have been selected for this award and I think that recognizing both academ-

ics and athletics is awesome," Harvey said. "So far college has been a very fun challenge. I've had to adapt to a lot of new things, but I've made new friends that have helped me along the way, which is probably my favorite part about college. I enjoy the collaboration and the ability to meet new people."

"I'm so thankful to have received this award," Wyatt said. "It's an honor to be recognized for balancing athletics and academics at the same time throughout high school. ## Rare spare helps Shank reach IHSA Sectional

RTHS grad advanced out of January regional event

**FREEPORT** — The 4-6-7-10 split, known as "The Big Four" or "Grandma's Teeth" by many players, stands as one of the most difficult splits to convert in the sport of bowling. According to data gathered from the PBA website, the chances of successfully making the split are roughly 1 percent.

Rochelle senior Brady Shank left the 4-6-7-10 split during the IHSA Freeport Regional at Four Seasons Bowling Center on Saturday. The tough conversion chance left Shank discouraged, but when he lined himself up to throw his spare ball at the 6-10 combination, something magical happened.

The senior hit the 6-10 combo with enough speed and power that one of the pins ricocheted off the back wall and flew into the 4-7 combo, knocking over both pins to complete the split conversion. It was only the second time

that Rochelle head coach Doug Koch had seen the 4-6-7-10 made during high school competition.

"I was a little upset when I left the split and so I carried on like usual and threw at the 6-10," Shank said. "I was very excited and I was actually really shocked. It's very rare to see somebody pick that split up, and to see all the bowlers surrounding me cheer me on and give me high-fives was a fun and exciting experience."

It couldn't have come at a better time for Shank, who led the Hubs with an 1,163 series over six games to place 13<sup>th</sup> in the regional tournament. The big conversion helped Shank qualify for the IHSA Rockford Jefferson Sectional as a top-10 at-large player, and Shank will compete at Don Carter Lanes this coming Saturday for a chance to reach the IHSA State Championship.

"I felt a wave of excitement and motivation when I heard my name called," Shank said. "I have lots of support from bowlers in

other towns who knew I'd make it and who believed in me. Having their support helps so much more. I'm more than happy."

Rochelle finished ninth out of 10 teams at the regional tournament, with Freeport knocking down 6,003 pins for first place. The Hubs recorded 4,909 pins behind Shank and seniors Dallas Driver and Tyler Johnson, who recorded 1,049 pins and 1,035 pins, respectively. Senior Nick Stevens added 938 pins, with freshmen Devansh Patel and Sergio Guevara combining for 724.

Shank began the tournament with 216 in his opening game before rolling 185 and 172 to finish with a 573 series. The senior shot a tournament-best 222 to begin the second half of competition, adding 191 and 177 games to finish with a 590 series and seal an at-large bid.

"I think everything went smoothly for the most part," Shank said. "There were some roller-coaster emotions but that just comes from my de-

termination for the sport. I was able to jump back up and get my feet under me, and I continued going with my plan to bowl well. I'll need to be prepared to pick up my spares and come in with a hungry attitude next week."

Rochelle totaled 800 pins in the first game before adding 780 pins

in the second game and recording 831 pins during the third game behind Johnson's 215. Driver's 232 helped the Hubs knock down 937 pins in the fourth game, and Rochelle wrapped up the tournament with 787 in the fifth game and 774 in the sixth game.

"I will be practicing for

at least 2-to-3 hours every day and I will be working a lot on my spares, especially single-pin spares," Shank said. "I want to spend some time getting back to the fundamentals and getting to the root of my game. I'll be doing a lot of mental preparation and positive thinking this week."

# Hubs topple Interstate 8 Conference opponents

Rochelle grapplers defeat Morris, Ottawa in home double dual

### ROCHELLE

An opening-round loss couldn't hold Rochelle senior Hezekiah Jefferson back from delivering a critical victory for the Hubs during their Interstate 8 Conference double dual against the Morris Redskins and the Ottawa Pirates on Friday.

Jefferson faced a tough opponent in Rochelle's first dual with the Redskins, falling against 195-pounder and fourth-ranked state wrestler Robby Bates. The Hubs needed Jefferson to step up in their dual with Ottawa, and the senior came through with an enormous cradle against Pirate grappler Brett Galletti in the final seconds of the first period to help Rochelle defeat Ottawa 56-24.

The Hubs (12-2 overall) topped Morris 49-26 earlier in the day. "I took my loss and I remained focused," Jefferson said. "I had to figure out what I could do to win the next match... I tried shooting a high crotch, and when the wrestler came into my leg, that's when I had the opportunity to put him in a cradle. It's a good win for me, and as long as I do what I have to do, that's all the matters."


Ottawa gained the early advantage after 160-pounder Hunter Duffy pinned Rochelle's Zeke Horn early in the

second period. The Hubs bounced back when 170-pounder Bryan Garza notched a first-period fall over Colton Johnson and Ben Harvey edged Pirate wrestler Cedric Fairrow by 6-3 decision in the 182-pound bout.

Jefferson's fall over Galletti gave Rochelle a 15-6 lead and preceded Gavin Ansteth's second-period fall over Brandon O'Brien in the 220-pound bout. Back-to-back pins from 285-pounder Zack Capes and 106-pounder Ivan Pineda capped off the team's 33-point scoring run.

"It's a big relief and it's refreshing for me to be back," said Ansteth, who has returned to the Rochelle lineup after recovering from an ankle injury during the football season. "I'm happy to be back down to weight and have my ankle healthy. As long as we keep chugging along, we'll be in good shape. We need to keep working hard in practice, and our practices have been more intense recently. I think that's helped us beat a lot of these teams."

113-pounder Riley Hanson's fall over Weldon Nay snapped Rochelle's scoring streak, but the Hubs were quick to strike back after forfeiting the 120-pound bout. Caleb Nadig made slight work in the 126-pound bout with a 58-second fall over Cole Flores, and Grant Thompson won the 132-pound

bout with a fall.

State-ranked wrestler Luke Fleming claimed Ottawa's fourth and final win with a fall over Wade Samp in the 138-pound bout. Keegan Davis-Carter dominated the 145-pound bout, totaling five takedowns and three near-falls for an 18-3 technical fall. Ethan Tooley capped off the dual victory with a forfeit win in the 152-pound bout.

### Morris

The Redskins claimed two consecutive bouts to

open the first dual, with Bryce Claypool defeating Zeke Horn in the 152-pound matchup by 16-4 major decision and Diego Escobar forfeiting the 160-pound matchup after suffering a knee injury near the end of the first period. Bryan Garza put Rochelle on the scoreboard with a third-period fall in the 170-pound bout.

Ben Harvey compiled three scoring moves (reversal, takedown and near-fall) for a 7-0 decision against Drayden McKerron in the 182-pound bout

before Robby Bates defeated Hezekiah Jefferson by fall in the 195-pound bout. Gavin Ansteth turned Juan Gutierrez over in the final seconds of the first period for a fall in the 220-pound bout. Both Zack Capes and Ivan Pineda took forfeits in the 285-pound and 106-pound matchups to give the Hubs a 27-16 lead.

Weldon Nay continued his recent winning ways with a third-period fall over Nolan Washburn in the 113-pound bout. After Rochelle forfeited the

120-pound bout, Caleb Nadig crushed Cameron Skoff in the 126-pound bout, winning by fall in only 36 seconds. The Hubs took two of the final three bouts, with Keegan Davis-Carter pinning Milton Mondragon at 138 pounds and Ethan Tooley notching a 14-4 major decision at 145 pounds.

Rochelle will continue conference competition with a home dual against Sandwich on Thursday, Jan. 9. The Hubs will then wrestle in the Sycamore Invitational on Jan. 11.


"My teammates were telling me that they knew I could do it," Mickley said. "I was pretty shocked when everything happened... I'm going to make sure I stay positive at the sectional and
