

Amboy School District receives top Financial Profile Score from the state

AMBOY – Amboy School District’s annual audit was approved by the board following a report presented by auditor Ryan Steines of Winkel, Parker & Foster, CPA PC. Reporting at the Oct. 23 board of education meeting, Steines said the district’s financial records for fiscal year 2018 were all in order. Steines then gave some highlights from the report.

* Financial profile summary - Issued by the State of Illinois, District 272 received the highest score possible (4 on a 1 to 4 scale). The financial profile indicates strong financial health in the areas of fund balances, expenditure to revenue, cash on hand and the amount of long-term debt.

* Property tax receipts - A total of \$6,843,000 was collected during fiscal year 17 and the tax levy that year was \$6,909,000. The 2017 tax levy is \$7,141,561, which is being received in

the current fiscal year and ends on June 30, 2019.

* The district’s total operating expense for the year ending June 30, 2018 was about \$8,075,000. Divided by 653 students, the estimated operating expense per pupil is \$12,355, a slight increase from \$11,742 per pupil the year prior.

* Outstanding bond is \$1,978,000. Steines said the district’s legal debt margin is a little over \$17,562,000, so they are well within the limit.

* Tax rates have been pretty consistent over the past three years with only a slight increase.

*The ending total fund balance as of June 30 was \$8,474,000.

SUPERINTENDENT & FINANCIAL REPORT

Superintendent Joshua Nichols reported on some maintenance issues. The first occurred at Central School where cracks in boiler #2 were discovered. Nichols noted that the same thing happened to boiler #1 last year and said it will

take about two weeks to get the parts and have the cracks repaired.

Faulty fire alarm sensors caused several false alarms at Amboy Junior High. Nichols said there were false alarms at night and also one during the school day. “We have been able to get the sensor fixed and so far, it’s going well,” he told the board. “I want to thank Mrs. Schamberger for coming in late at night to help.”

Nichols said the fire doors at the junior high are still not working, however. Both the fire alarm company and an electrician have tried to determine the cause of the problem but neither could find it. “We’re still trying to figure out what happened,” he said.

Election Day on Nov. 6th

LEE COUNTY — The General Election is scheduled for Tuesday, Nov. 6, 2018. The polls for the General Election will be open from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m., on Nov. 6.

On the ballot in the General Election are the Illinois state offices of: Governor/Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State, Comptroller and Treasurer.

For Governor, voters will decide between Democratic candidate JB Pritzker, Republican candidate incumbent Bruce Rauner, Libertarian candidate Grayson Kash Jackson, and Conservative party candidate William “Sam” McCann.

In the Attorney General race, voters will choose between Democratic candidate Kwame Raoul, Republican Candidate Erika Henry and Libertarian candidate Bubba Harsy. One of the three candidates will replace current Illinois States Attorney Lisa Madigan, a Democrat, who is leaving office after 16 years in the position.

For Secretary of State, voters will decide between Democratic incumbent Jesse White, Republican Jason Helland, and Libertarian Steve Dutner.

For State Comptroller, voters will cast their vote between Democratic incumbent Susana A. Mendoza, Republican Darlene Senger, or Libertarian Claire Bell.

For State Treasurer, voters will decide between Democrat incumbent Michael W. Frerichs, Republican Jim Dodge and Libertarian Michael Lehency.

Voters will also decide who will be their representation both on the national level and the state level.

For the Representative in Congress in the 16th District, voters will decide between



Republican incumbent Adam Kinzinger and Democratic opponent Sara Dady.

At the state level, voters in the State Senate 45th Legislative District, voters will decide between Democrat David Simpson and Republican Brian W. Stewart. These candidates will be vying for the position being vacated by Republican State Senator Tim Bivins.

At the state level, voters in the General Assembly 19th Representative District will decide between incumbent Republican Tom Demmer and Democrat challenger Amy Davis.

Republican Incumbent State Representative in the 74th District Dan Swanson is running unopposed.

Lee County officials running unopposed include: Cathy Myers for Lee County Clerk; Paula Meyer for Lee County Treasurer; John C. Simonton for Lee County Sheriff; and Robert Sondgeroth for Regional Super-

intendent of Schools Lee, Ogle and Whiteside Counties.

For Lee County Board, only three candidates are running for three seats in each of the four districts.

Amboy Schools will be asking voters to approve a \$15.8 million in school building bonds to improve the site of, build, equip additions to and alter, repair and equip the Amboy High School Building to replace the Amboy Junior High School.

Vote by mail and early voting began on Sept. 27. Vote by mail signed applications will be accepted through Thursday, Nov. 1.

Early voting must be conducted in person Monday through Friday between the hours of 8:15 a.m. and 4:15 p.m. and on Saturday, Nov. 3, from 9 a.m. to noon.

Votes cast during this time will be not counted until Election Day. The last day to register to vote in the General Election was Oct. 9.

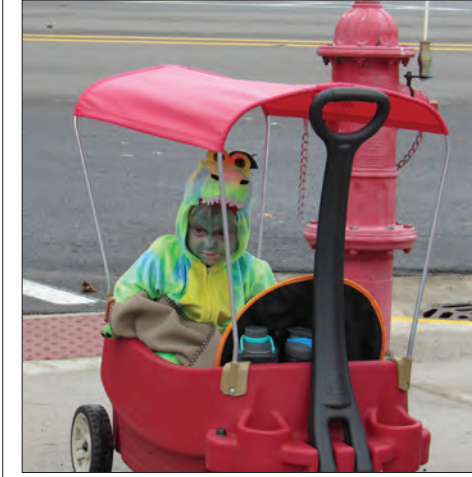

Lee County Veteran's Treatment Court celebrates first graduate

DIXON — The Lee County Veteran's Treatment Court celebrated its first graduation on Oct. 23.

Lee County started a Veterans Treatment Court in November 2016. The program was awarded a 3-year funding grant from the Bureau of Justice Administration, a part of the United States Department of Justice in late October 2017.

The program began as an effort by the courts to offer intensive rehabilitation services to justice system involved veterans of the United States Armed Forces who have been identified by mental healthy and/or drug treatment professionals as having significant problems with mental health and/or drugs and/or alcohol.

The Mission of the Lee County Veterans Treatment Court is to increase outcomes for justice involved Veterans

by assessing and directing individuals with mental health and/or substance abuse problems into the judicial supervision of treatment with a goal of developing stable, substance free, productive citizens and thereby breaking the cycle of criminal recidivism.

There are currently five veterans active in the program, with another three awaiting entry.

The first graduate of the program, Jeff Woods, has met and exceeded the requirements. He has been clean and sober for more than a year, he has secure employment, a fiancé and a new daughter.

Because of his compliance with the program, the charges pending on him were dismissed.

In addition to recognition from the court system, the Illinois Valley Quilt of Valor representatives were on hand to present him with a quilt and honor him for his service.

White urges student readers to enter "Letters About Literature" competition

SPRINGFIELD — Secretary of State and State Librarian Jesse White is urging students in grades 4 through 12 to enter the 2019 "Letters About Literature" contest, a national reading and writing competition. This event is funded by the Dollar General Literacy Foundation, the Library of Congress Fund, the Center for the Book in the Library of Congress and the Illinois Center for the Book.

"Letters About Literature" invites students to read a book, poem or play of their choice and write a letter to the author about how the work changed their life or view of the world. Students can enter on their own or through their schools, libraries or youth organizations.

"Every year, thousands of students in Illinois enjoy participating in this inspiring competition," said White. "Illinois has had more entries than any other state for 11 years in a row. Anyone who has read past letters can see how literature inspires and touches the lives of our young people. I encourage all our students to take part in "Letters About Literature," and I hope their participation leads to a lifetime of reading."

There are three levels of participation: Level I for grades 4-6,

Level II for grades 7-8 and Level III for grades 9-12. This year, students ages 13 and above will be able to enter their letters online after November 1, 2018. The State Library will also accept written letters from all participants.

One Illinois winner will be selected for each level and receive a \$200 cash award. Teachers of the winning students will receive a \$100 cash award to purchase materials for their school library. Winners and teachers will be invited to an awards ceremony

in Springfield. The state winners' letters will be forwarded for national judging.

The deadline to enter the competition is Friday, December 14, 2018 for all competition levels. State winners will be announced in April 2019. A Dog's Life

Virginia Woolf's "Flush" is a biography of Elizabeth Barrett Browning's cocker spaniel, and surely one of the best novels ever written about a dog. In Woolf's clever, comic prose, the world of Victorian England comes to life in all its decorous gentility as well as its cruelties and degradations, as experienced by the intrepid Flush.

Born in 1842, Flush's unbridled freedom at a down-at-the-heels country estate is short-lived when he is given as a present to "England's foremost poetess, the brilliant, the doomed, the adored Elizabeth Barrett herself." He enters the great house on London's august Wimpole Street, where carpets caress his paws and smells of grand food fill his nostrils. When he enters the invalid's darkened bedroom, he smells cologne and falls in love. He will spend the next several years in seclusion with his mistress, but for walks in the summer on a leash lest he be dognapped for ransom. "It was for her he had sacrificed his courage."

In time, the famous secret courtship of Elizabeth Barrett by Robert Browning commences via daily letters and visits. Flush experiences a terrible loneliness in the velvet cage; moreover, his mistress no longer feeds him her dinner, but eats it all up. Twice he tries to kill his enemy by biting Mr. Browning, but to no avail. And then, disaster. Flush is dognapped. Elizabeth's father, brother, and Mr. Browning all agree, no ransom. She resists the "fathers and tyrants," and asks Robert if he would do the same if the banditti had kidnapped her?

Woolf is masterful in her description of both the physical and emotional deprivation of the poor when she follows Elizabeth, who has screwed up her courage, into the slums of Whitechapel to rescue Flush. Elizabeth is deeply shocked by the filth and the squalor a few yards from genteel Wimpole Street. She ransoms poor Flush, who for days was chained by his paws among starving and sick pure-bred dogs.

Soon after, Elizabeth marries Robert in secret and they move, to Flush's amazement, to paradise, to Pisa. In Italy he is a prince among mongrels, not a pure-bred anywhere in sight. "In Italy was freedom and life and the joy that the sun breeds." Flush discovers the incredible smells of the city and the cool tiles of the churches against his paws: he ran, he raced, there was no chain, no need of protection, "he was his own master."

Elizabeth Barrett's early poem to Flush ends his story: "You see this dog. It was but yesterday/I mused, forgetful of his presence here,/Till thought on thought drew downward tear on tear;/When from the pillow, where wet-cheeked I lay,/A head as hairy as Faunus, thrust its way/Right sudden against my face,—two golden-clear/Large eyes astonished mine..."

Your real self

In the last 50 years Halloween has gone from being a kiddie-oriented candy festival in the 1960s and 70s, to being reinvented in the twenty-first century as a grown-up's excuse to "behave badly." One might even see it as an attempt to bring back the medieval festival of Carnival, that period of partying celebrated just before Lent.

Over the years Disney characters were replaced by ever more morbid blood and guts ghouls. The innocence of "Trick or Treat" was overwhelmed by an increased desire for "Terror and Trauma." But grisly ghouls are beginning to lose their hold on Halloween—at least that is my hope. After all when you can tune in "zombies" featured in half a dozen shows every night of the week, they start to lose their ability to startle and scare. Halloween has morphed itself again—making itself a night that is not so much scary as it is revealing. What you do, who you "are" on Halloween has become a personal message for people who are increasingly longing to "be themselves."

When I walked the streets of Amboy as an eight-year old with no adult supervision collecting candy on Oct. 31, 1968, I had no idea how much society would change in the 50 years that followed. The 21st century "street" we are all gathered along now is the digital highway, the social media interstate. It is along this venue that we present ourselves to the world. Who we "are" online becomes our identity. One of the common boasts of having a social media presence is that online we can feel free to be totally "ourselves." No holds barred. No trying to please others. No confines of social correctness. Unlike in our family unit, in our workplace, in face-

to-face encounters, where we feel the pull of behaving in certain expected ways—as a parent or child, as an employee, as a customer. But on the digital highway, those constraints are removed. We are "free" to "be ourselves" without the need to edit or curate our words, thoughts, or behavior. Or so it seems.

The problem is how do we decide who the "real me" is on any given day, at any given moment? We all have many sides, many facets, many feelings that come and go. We are all made of "multiple personalities," mixed moods, revealing different aspects of ourselves at different moments and under differing conditions. When we are "our real self" in the world, we have to choose which "real self" we will present. And we try to present the one that is most Jesus, or at least most civil. The Apostle Paul put it this way: "put on Christ." That does not mean "put on" in a hypocritical way. We are to put on Christ by letting the light of Jesus shine through us because he resides in us.

We are inevitably and genuinely different "selves" under different circumstances and in differing contexts. That is not wrong. God made us complex. You do not behave the same way around your great aunt Faye as you do around your five-year old niece. You have different responses to your boss than you do your intern or employee-in-training.

But there is a time and a place when we must throw off all of our protective covering to find and face our most genuine self. Jesus shows us in the Gospels that it is when we come "face-to-face" with Him that all pretense must fall away and our most basic needs and desires be revealed to the One who has the power to heal us and heal the world.

How to make an extra \$3 billion, the Illinois way

Buried beneath the election chatter this week was a wonky labor ruling in a Springfield appellate court. But the issue at hand could wind up being more costly than almost anything else Illinoisans hear discussed on debate stages.

AFSCME – the largest government worker union in the state – may pull off one of the most insulting waiting games in state history. The payoff? More than \$3 billion, courtesy of Illinois taxpayers.

This saga begins all the way back in December 2014.

That's when then-Gov. Pat Quinn started negotiations for a new state worker contract with a somber tone. His administration set the stage by noting a \$6.4 billion backlog in unpaid bills, a \$1.6 billion budget deficit and \$111 billion in unfunded pension liabilities.

AFSCME's reply to the state?

Hike the income tax, then scrap the Illinois Constitution's flat income tax protection and hike taxes some more. In other words, "rob Peter to pay me."

One month later, Gov. Bruce Rauner took office. In part, he was elected because taxpayers were frustrated with the power balance in Springfield and wanted a more fiscally conservative voice at the bargaining table.

AFSCME knew they would not be facing a negotiator they helped elect, so their strategy was two-fold. The first tactic was to try to bargain with someone else, but efforts to remove Rauner from the negotiating table in the General Assembly fell short on multiple occasions.

The other option? Stall. AFSCME knew it could tie up any attempts at reform in court. Meanwhile, they could fund efforts to elect a new governor willing to play ball.

Before getting into specifics, it's important to know Illinois state workers are not to blame for any of this. It's also important to know what those state workers receive.

For one, they are the highest paid state workers in the nation after adjusting for cost of living. Second, they receive platinum-level health insurance at a bronze-level price. And third, many state workers receive overtime pay after a 37.5-hour work week. That's not to mention pension benefits that are far out of line with anything one can expect in the private sector.

None of this is necessarily bad in isolation. Public-sector workers should expect decent pay and benefits. But AFSCME worker incomes grew 5 times faster than Illinois private-sector incomes from 2005-2014. In the face of a sputtering state economy where taxpayers are already shouldering an enormous tax burden, there must be a compromise. We all can't work for the state.

The Rauner administration introduced its first AFSCME contract proposal in February 2015. It and subsequent offers avoided widespread layoffs, preserved extremely generous disciplinary procedures, sick time, and holiday policies, and instituted a temporary wage freeze. It also would have increased employees' contributions to their health care costs and not paid out overtime until employees clocked 40 hours.

AFSCME countered with wild demands, including wage increases of 11.5 to 29 percent by 2019, platinum-level health insurance at little cost to workers, and a work week with overtime for workers after just 37.5 hours.

The state estimated AFSCME's demands would cost an additional \$3 billion compared with what Rauner proposed.

Board explains decision on junior high

Dear Editor,

What to do with Amboy Junior High?

For years, this question has been asked, and the current school board believes we have the answer. On Nov. 6, voters will see a \$15.8 million General Obligation bond question on the ballot. The passage of this proposition supports a junior high addition to the high school and improvements to the high school.

We believe this investment is necessary to provide quality education to our students and a good work environment for teachers and staff.

The Board has advanced this proposal because:

Projected renovations at the current junior high will cost in excess of \$10 million dollars. In 20 years, however, the district will still have an old building with costly problems to solve.

Maintenance and improvement projects at the elementary and high school buildings also need attention . . . and significant monies to undertake the work.

Passage of this bond issue will permit the Board to build a new junior high and frees funds for use at the elementary and high school.

Now that the state has a budget and a new school funding

formula, we can confidently pledge up to \$2 million from school funds to this project. That is \$2 million previously designated for improvement projects at all three buildings that will now be spent just at the junior high.

We have weighed the pros and cons of renovation, consolidation, keeping fifth grade at Central Elementary and putting sixth through eighth grades at the high school with no improvements. The proposed plan achieves efficiencies in energy use, improves classroom space, secures our schools and is fiscally responsible.

On the surface this may seem to be just about brick and mortar. The greater discussion goes much deeper. The Board believes this is about the future of our communities – our students.

Another side to the school story

Dear Editor,

I think that everyone can agree that we all want the best for our kids. I think that is why in 2002, when the schools asked for property tax increase it passed even though economic times were tougher. In 2002 the schools told the community about all of the problems at the junior high. Since the referendum passed in 2002, the local property taxes pertaining to the schools have gone up about 135 percent which translates to tens of millions of dollars.

Now, 16 years later, and after millions of extra tax dollars, the junior high looks virtually the same as it did 30 years ago. Where did all the extra money go?

Now the schools are asking for \$15.8 million to build a new school because of a report showing that the junior high is going to take \$10 million to repair. This report was generated by the same company who wants to bid on the new \$15.8 million addition, so of course they stand to benefit on claims of an inflated \$10 million of current repairs. To my knowledge, the report showing \$10 million of repairs has never been made public. Why wouldn't the schools get an independent report on current repairs from a company not doing the work? Or maybe get multiple bids on repair work, not just one.

Now the schools are sending out mailers that state our property

taxes are going up no matter what so we have to choose between \$10 million repair of \$15.8 million new school. This is totally false. The school's income from local property taxes is at an all-time high and the student body is about half what it was 25 years ago. If you vote no on the \$15.8 million referendum it forces the school to be more fiscally responsible with all of the money they currently get.

What's going to happen in five or 10 more years? Are we going to get another \$15-20 million referendum for Central school? The local community can only shoulder so much tax burden.

Let's not forget the community just passed the 1 percent sales tax increase which will generate hundreds of thousands of dollars for the Amboy Schools.

The bottom line is several of the problems at the junior high are general maintenance items that have been completely ignored to paint a picture that the junior high is completely falling apart and beyond repair. I'm not saying that the junior high doesn't need attention, but maybe the repairs may be able to be done at a much-reduced costs than \$10 million.

Please take the time to weigh all of the information on both sides before you cast your vote.

The old AFSCME contract expired June 30, 2015.

By September, the state and AFSCME were on their third tolling (or temporary) agreement, which included language assuring they would continue meeting in good faith until both sides declared an impasse or the Illinois Labor Relations Board ruled both sides were at impasse.

After more than 20 bargaining sessions and 67 days of negotiations, nothing was moving.

The state declared an impasse on Jan. 8, 2016. And after much back and forth, the Illinois Labor Relations Board finally issued an impasse decision in November 2016, which meant Rauner could finally move to implement the state's last, best offer.

But rather than obey the ruling, AFSCME filed a lawsuit in their home turf of St. Clair County, declaring the board's ruling illegitimate.

Days turned into months turned into years of appeals. And on Oct. 23, 2018, the Fourth District Appellate Court ruled in AFSCME's favor. Of course, there will be more appeals as the clock keeps ticking.

So, will the four-year stalling gamble pay off for AFSCME? The answer will become clear soon enough. And taxpayers will be on the hook for the winnings.

The Amboy Clippers posted their second win of the season Friday evening as they defeated the Mount Carroll Hawks 42-20 in the Clippers' homecoming football contest.

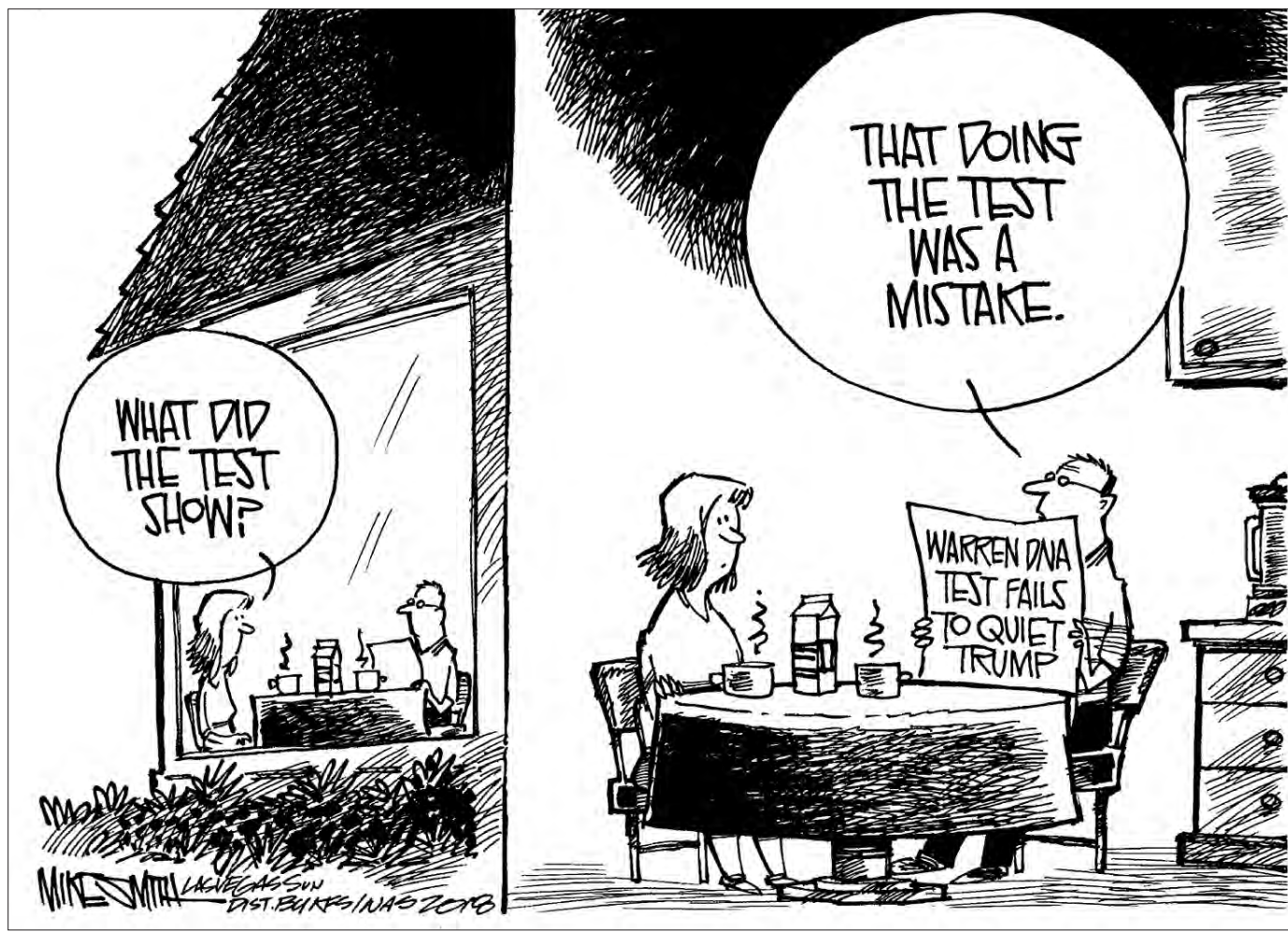

I am a mother of three. My kids attended and graduated from Amboy Schools.

Watching the community discuss the building referendum is disappointing. One group has been talking about this for so long and another chooses the final days before Nov. 6 to voice their opinions. A project of this size can't be adequately discussed in a week. For almost a year, meetings open to the public – school board and open houses – have been offered.

In a recent conversation with an Amboy School Board Member, I asked why the junior high had fallen into such disrepair? The answer, the district was balancing a slim budget and had to prioritize projects, people and student needs.

I asked, what is the cost of repairing the junior high versus adding a new addition to the high school? The answer, approximately \$10 million plus would fix the infrastructure. Who knows what type of

extensive work could be found once renovations begin? Windows, doors and floors would be replaced. Bathrooms, classrooms and the elevator would be brought to code. The building would be fully abated. But not all the infrastructure issues would be tackled. On the other hand, a new addition would cost \$16.5 million of which the school board is asking taxpayers for \$15.8 million.

Do you want your children or grandchildren learning in a safe, healthy place without asbestos? Would you rather have the school district spend money on an “estimated” \$10 million plus in repairs or know that a new addition is going to be exactly \$16.5 million?

The community and Amboy Schools need to work together to resolve this. This vote is about keeping children safe and healthy while they are earning their education. A yes or no vote equals higher taxes. You decide how to spend your money.

I am voting Yes on the Amboy Schools building referendum on Nov. 6. Join me.

They tried – all the way up to and through the televised debates – to no avail.

At some point during the second debate, hope was extinguished. The low-grade amusement of watching men call each other names in public had worn off early in the first matchup. Anyone waiting for a real discussion of ideas was disappointed. It didn't happen.

Where was the back-and-forth on solutions to the state's \$130 billion unfunded pension liability? The state's biggest financial problem got short shrift on the campaign trail.

Moody's has estimated the adjusted net pension liability from the state's five pension systems at about \$200 billion. Despite the Illinois' economic advantages and other strengths, the rating agency noted that “the state's governance framework has allowed practices that greatly offset these strengths.”

Yes, the candidates talked about the problem

and journalists asked questions about it. But we didn't get anywhere.

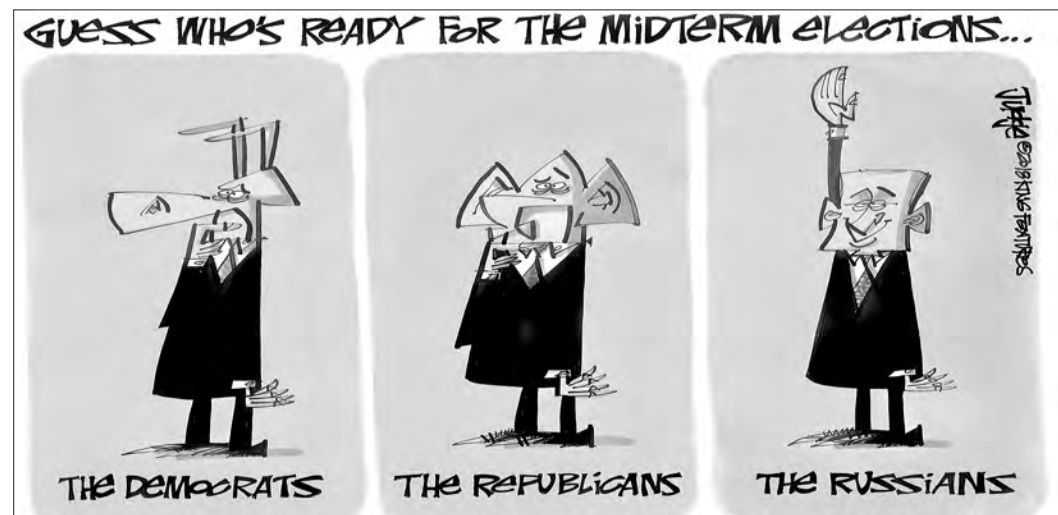
Same with the state's \$8 billion in IOUs. That heavy anchor on Illinois' finances wasn't fun to talk about. Not when there was name calling to do.

While these problems are allowed to fester, the

state's options for the future dwindle.

Ultimately, it's up to voters to decide what level of substance they want to hear on the campaign trail and in the debates. But time's running out.

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Illinois Top 200 - Obama heads list of minority trailblazers

SPRINGFIELD—The nation's first African-American president heads the list of minority trailblazers selected in the Illinois Top 200 project, followed by two Native American rivals, a Chicago mayor and a groundbreaking diplomat and cabinet secretary.

Barack Obama, who rose from community organizer to senator to president during his time in Illinois, was the top pick in online voting conducted as part of the celebration of the state's 200th birthday.

He was followed by Black Hawk, the Sauk warrior who fought American expansion into Illinois, and Chief Keokuk, a rival who gave up land to avoid bloodshed as settlers arrived.

The top five also includes Harold Washington, Chicago's first African-American mayor, and Patricia Roberts Harris, the first African-American woman to become an ambassador or serve in a presidential cabinet.

"This list reminds us that Illinois would not be what it is today without hard work and sacrifice by people of all races, religions and orientations," said

Governor Bruce Rauner. "We should all be grateful for the trailblazers honored here by voters in the Illinois Top 200 project." Top 200 blue gold small

The Top 200 project lets Illinoisans vote every two weeks on the state's most inspiring leaders, greatest inventions, top businesses and much more. By the state's bicentennial on Dec. 3, voters will have chosen 10 favorites in 20 different categories — the Illinois Top 200.

Voting in the next category, top leaders, is underway at www.IllinoisTop200.com. The nominees include Abraham Lincoln, Ronald Reagan, Jane Addams and Ida B Wells.

Here are the top 10 "minority trailblazers" chosen in online voting:

Barack Obama — Obama was the first African-American president in U.S. history. He started as an Illinois legislator and then was elected U.S. senator in 2004. He came to national attention that year with a powerful speech at the Democratic National Convention. Four years later, he won the presidency.

Black Hawk — The Sauk warrior sided with the

British during the War of 1812. Twenty years later, after being forced out of Illinois, he led hundreds of people back during the brief "Black Hawk War." He also produced the first Native American autobiography.

Chief Keokuk — Keokuk was a Sauk chief and rival to Black Hawk. Convinced that armed resistance was futile, he negotiated with U.S. officials during a series of removals of Native Americans from northern Illinois and southern Wisconsin.

Harold Washington — Washington was the first African-American mayor of Chicago, a victory the Democrat achieved despite opposition from many white leaders in his own party. He won re-election but died just months into his second term.

Patricia Roberts Harris — A Mattoon native, Harris was the first African-American woman to serve as an ambassador. As secretary of Health, Education and Welfare under President Carter, she was the first African-American woman in a president's cabinet, making her the first to enter the presidential line of succession.

Minnie Minoso — Minoso was the first Latino superstar in major league baseball. Born in Cuba, he became the game's first black Latino player when he debuted in Cleveland on April 19, 1949. He was traded to the Chicago White Sox in 1951, becoming that team's first black player.

Steve Chen — Born in Taiwan, Chen came to the U.S. at 15, attending the Illinois Mathematics and Science Academy and then the University of Illinois. Three years after graduation, he changed the world of video by co-founding YouTube.

Jean Baptiste Point du Sable — Du Sable was the first non-indigenous settler to take up permanent

residence where Chicago would later spring up. Of African descent, he was a frontier trader, trapper and farmer.

Cardiss Collins — Collins was the first African-American woman from the Midwest to win a seat in Congress. She was the first woman and first African-American named to the leadership post of Democratic whip-at-large.

Jesse Jackson — Jackson began his civil rights activism as an aide to Martin Luther King Jr., who put him in charge of Chicago-based Operation Breadbasket. Out of that grew the organization now known as Rainbow/PUSH. He ran for the Democratic presidential nomination in 1984 and again in 1988.

The nominees who did not make the top 10 were Claude Barnett, founder of the Associated Negro Press; Roland Burris, the first African-American to hold statewide office in Illinois; African-American congressman Oscar Stanton De Priest; gay-rights pioneer Henry Gerber; John Jones, the first African-American elected to political office in Illinois; Black Panther leader Fred Hampton; economist Abram Lincoln Harris Jr.; football player Joe Lillard; Larry McKeon, the first openly gay Illinois legislator; "Free" Frank McWorter, the former slave who founded a town; Carlos Montezuma, the first Native American man to get a medical degree; early Japanese immigrant Michitaro Ongawa; and John W. E. Thomas, the first African-American elected to the Illinois legislature.

The Illinois Top 200 is a joint initiative of the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum, The (Springfield) State Journal-Register and the Illinois Bicentennial Commission.

Stamberger is the sixth individual state qualifier in Amboy history, while the Clipper team was only the second team to make it to the sectional round.

Brock Loftus turned in a 22nd-place effort for Amboy-LaMoille and was clocked in 17:26. Mateo Ramis occupied the 41st slot with a time of 18:16, while Ian Eller finished 43rd in 18:17. Calvin Deering (126th, 20:33) and Andruw Jones (137th, 21:05) completed the Clipper competitors.

The overall individual champion was Christopher Collett of Seneca in a time of 15:54.

Teams advancing to the state meet were Rock Falls, Pontiac, Seneca, Winnebago and Sterling Newman. The Clippers were

eighth in the team standings.

In the girls' race, Margaret Vaessen was the lone competitor for the Lady Clippers and she finished in ninth place with a time of 20:12. She earned a trip to state for being one of the first seven runners to cross the finish line who was not a member of a qualifying team.

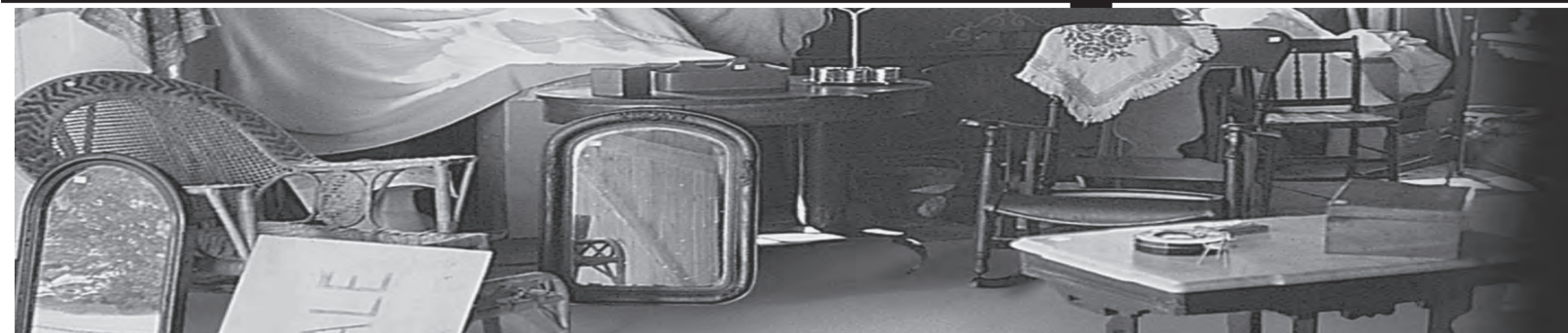
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Chicago is known for Capone, but Illinois gangsters had much wider reach

When it came to organized crime in Illinois, Chicago-based Prohibition-era gangsters loomed large during the 1920s and 1930s.

Al Capone, Frank Nitti, Lester "Baby Face Nelson" Gillis, Jack "Machine Gun" McGurn and George "Bugs" Moran earned international infamy that persisted for decades after their deaths. For years, the general perception was that when world travelers informed locals they hailed from Chicago, the locals responded with "bang, bang" and a finger-gun gesture.

The combination of enterprising criminals, complicit public officials and Prohibition gave rise to crime syndicates involved in bootlegging, gambling, prostitution, extortion and murder.

Organized by ethnicity and geography, the syndicates were known as the Chicago Mob or the Outfit. They produced the likes of Capone, Nelson and Moran — Capone's rival and the target of an attempted assassination in 1929 known as the St. Valentine's Day Massacre, which claimed the lives of seven men, including Moran associates and an innocent bystander or two.

But Chicago wasn't Illinois' only hotbed of criminal activity. Southern Illinois was home to Russia-born gangster Charlie Birger, who was involved in gambling and bootlegging in Saline, Williamson and Franklin counties. According to historians, Birger's onetime partners-in-crime were the Shelton Brothers, leaders of another southern Illinois Outfit. Eventually Birger split from The Shelton Gang, leading

to bloody territorial disputes that rivaled Chicago's early mob wars.

Rock Island had its own version of Capone in Ottawa native and onetime lawyer turned crime kingpin John Patrick Looney, whose life inspired the graphic novel "Road to Perdition." It was turned into a 2002 movie that starred Tom Hanks and Paul Newman, who played the gangster based on Looney.

"Baby Face" and Dillinger
Chicago-born Gillis — whose youthful appearance earned him the nickname "Baby Face" — embraced the criminal life early, garnering convictions for auto theft as a teenager.

Imprisoned for a 1931 bank robbery, he was set to stand trial for a second bank robbery in Wheaton in 1932, but escaped from the guards who were transporting him to the Illinois State Penitentiary in Joliet, according to the FBI.

Several years later, Gillis joined the Indiana gangster and bank robber John Dillinger. Gillis, Dillinger and Homer Van Meter were involved in a June 1934 bank robbery in South Bend, Indiana, where a police officer was killed.

About a month later, on July 22, 1934, police and FBI agents confronted Dillinger as he exited Chicago's Biograph Theater. Dillinger ran to a nearby alley, where he was killed in a shootout.

Several months later, on Nov. 27, 1934, in what is now Langendorf Park in Barrington, FBI agents Samuel P. Cowley and Herman Edward Hollis encountered Gillis and fellow gangster John Paul Chase in a stolen vehicle. Hollis was killed during the ensuing gun battle.



Cowley died from his wounds the next day. Chase and the seriously injured Gillis fled in the agents' car. Gillis' body was found the next day near a Skokie cemetery.

The Touhys vs. Capone
The son of a Chicago policeman, Roger Touhy was the youngest of six brothers, five of whom embraced lives of crime. Touhy and two of his brothers operated a Des Plaines trucking company.

At the start of Prohibition, they began a bootlegging operation in the northwest suburbs and later expanded into illegal gambling. Capone, who had been buying illegal beer from the Touhys, tried to take over their operation in 1929. Over the next few years, battles between the rivals took place in then-rural Cook County, including what is now Inverness.

Capone twice framed Touhy for kidnapping. Touhy was eventually convicted of kidnapping the brother of cosmetics mogul Max Factor Sr. in 1933 and sentenced to 99 years. In 1954, a federal judge determined the kidnapping was a hoax.

Touhy, who served addi-

tional time for his 1942 escape from Stateville Correctional Center, was released in November 1959.

A month later, he and his bodyguard were gunned down. His killers were never caught.

Sent to the gallows
In November 1926, according to historians, Birger ordered the murder of West City Mayor Joseph Adams, who was reportedly connected to the Sheltons. That attempt failed, but a second attempt a month later succeeded. Con-

victed of his involvement in Adams' murder, Birger was hanged in 1928.

The jail where he was held, as well as the gallows, are now the Franklin County Jail Museum in Benton.

The Shelton Gang was led by brothers Carl, Earl and Bernie, Wayne County siblings who started out making moonshine and graduated to bootlegging and gambling. A 1926 power struggle over southern Illinois bootlegging operations between Birger and the brothers led to a mob war notable for the combatants' use of homemade tanks.

Ultimately, Birger's testimony helped send the brothers to prison for robbery. After they were released from prison, the brothers attempted to regain control of their criminal operation, which was then headed by former fellow gang member Frank L. "Buster" Wortman, who went on to dominate illegal gambling in the region.

Wortman reportedly ordered the murders of Carl and Bernie Shelton. Earl Shelton survived several assassination attempts and died in Florida at age 96.

Quad Cities kingpin
Rock Island had its own version of Capone in Ottawa

native and onetime lawyer turned crime kingpin John Patrick Looney.

Looney ran gambling, prostitution, auto theft and bootlegging operations around Rock Island, where, according to the LaSalle County Historical Society Museum, he founded a newspaper and used it to attack enemies and to extort powerful residents by threatening to print unflattering stories about them.

Convicted of murdering a saloon keeper in 1925, Looney was sent to prison for 14 years. Released in 1934, he kept a low profile until his 1947 death in a tuberculosis sanitarium in El Paso, Texas.
