## Marijuana talks set

**ROCHELLE** – Marijuana dispensaries in Rochelle could be a reality in the not so distant future.

The Cannabis Taxation and Regulation Act was signed by Governor J.B. Pritzker back in late June, meaning recreational marijuana use will no longer be illegal for adults starting Jan. 1, 2020.

The City of Rochelle will hold a Town Hall meeting on Monday, Aug.

19 at 6 p.m. to discuss the details of the new law and there will be conversation about whether Rochelle will be allowing dispensaries, and if so, what part of town would they be permitted.

“We are going to be doing a Power-Point presentation and getting with the attorney to talk about the specifics of the law, some of the grey areas, if its allowed in Rochelle, what parts would it be allowed in and ultimately what steps the city would have to go through to allow a dispensary,” explained Jeff Fiegenschuh, city manager.

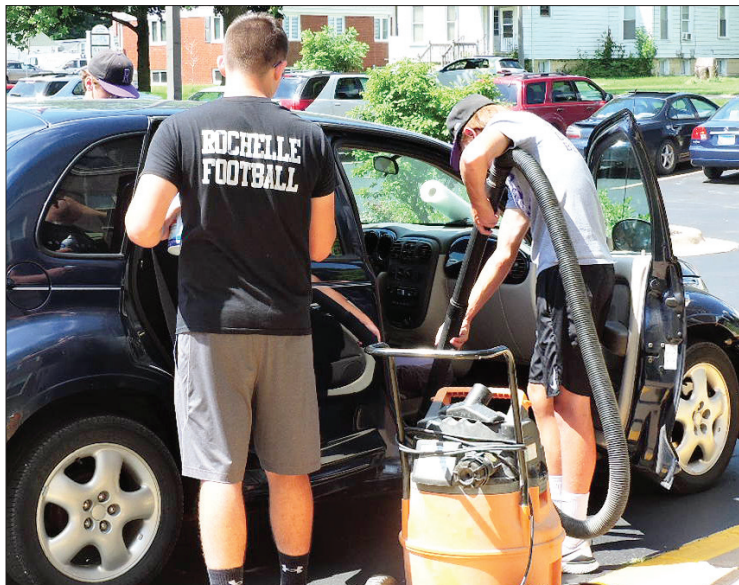
The majority of the Rochelle City Council will be present at the meeting and the meeting is open to the public. The meeting is meant to inform the public of the new law and gather feedback and interest from the community. There will be no votes or decisions made that night.

“It is a public information meeting to talk to the community about what this law is. There is not going to be a vote and the main point of the meeting is going to be talking about the law that was passed by the state and what it is and isn’t,” added Fiegenschuh.

### Football players tackle projects for seniors at Lincoln Manor

**ROCHELLE** — Rochelle Township High School football players used their day off from weightlifting and training this week vacuuming out cars and cooking a meal for the residents of Lincoln Manor Senior Housing of LSSI.

Kerri Villa-Nantz, the assistant property manager at Lincoln Manor, and her son have been doing this consistently throughout the years and it has grown into an annual event. When

they first started, Nantz’s son was in fifth grade and it was just him and his team. Each year it has continued to grow with 25 players participating last year and nearly 50 this year.

“It used to be just his team and now we have kind of grown to where it is a lot more than just his age group, and our residents love it,” said Nantz.

At the event kids were hard at work washing the outside of cars, vacuuming the inside, and both preparing and serving a spaghetti meal with lemonade, water or coffee to drink and a fan

favorite, root beer floats for dessert.

While cleaning out the cars, cooking and serving the meals and earning service hours are all very beneficial to the students, possibly the most rewarding aspect is the connection it creates between the two generations.

“It’s a great fundraiser for them, but I think the biggest benefit is the interaction between the two groups. They really do just enjoy each other’s company,” explained Tonya Sarver, property manager.

Most of the manor residents seem to enjoy the energy and company the kids bring, along with being very grateful for the work they do and how helpful it is to the people that live there.

“I just thank them for even thinking about doing it for us and I think it is really nice. There are just so many of us that can’t do it anymore, we can’t get in there and crawl around,” said Genevieve Rains, resident of Lincoln Manor.

“Her mom had her come in and talk to me direct as an idea and if it would be something I would want to do, and I told her absolutely,” explained Kristi Scherer, library director.

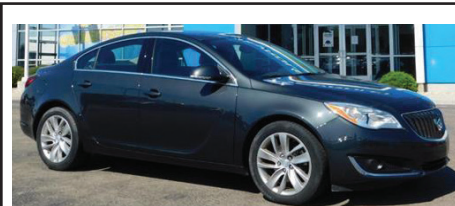

## Two more mosquito pools in county test positive for West Nile

One pool found near Rochelle, one in Monroe Center

**OGLE COUNTY**—The Ogle County Health Department has confirmed two more mosquito pools positive for West Nile virus in Ogle County for 2019.

A pool of mosquitoes found near Rochelle and another separate mosquito pool collected in Monroe Center tested positive for West Nile virus on July 16. There was also a previously confirmed positive mosquito pool near Polo earlier this year.

With three separate mosquito pools from three different locations throughout the county being confirmed as positive, it is imperative to be alert and take protective measures against West Nile virus.

The Ogle County Health Department will continue surveillance and testing mosquito pools from across Ogle County, as well as conducting mosquito abatement and working with local municipalities on mosquito abatement methods such as larviciding to help control mosquito populations across Ogle County.

Monitoring for West Nile virus in Illinois includes laboratory tests for mosquito batches, dead crows, blue jays, robins and other perching birds, as well as testing humans with West Nile virus-like symptoms. People who observe a sick or dying crow, blue jay, robin or other perching bird should contact their local health department, which will determine if the bird will be picked up for testing.

West Nile virus is transmitted through the bite of a Culex mosquitoes, commonly called a house mosquito, which has picked up the virus by feeding on an infected bird.

Common symptoms include fever, nausea, headache and muscle aches. Symptoms may last from a few days to a few weeks. However, four out of

five people infected with West Nile virus will not show any symptoms. In rare cases, severe illness including meningitis or encephalitis, or even death, can occur. People older than 50 and individuals with weakened immune systems are at higher risk for severe illness from West Nile virus.

Precautions include practicing the three "R's" — reduce, repel, and report.

### Reduce

Make sure doors and windows have tight-fitting screens. Repair or replace screens that have tears or other openings. Try to keep doors and windows shut. Eliminate, or refresh each week, all sources of standing water where mosquitoes can breed, including water in bird baths, ponds, flowerpots, wading pools, old tires, and any other containers.

### Repel

When outdoors, wear shoes and socks, long pants and a long-sleeved shirt, and apply insect repellent that contains DEET, picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus, or IR 3535 according to label instructions. Consult a physician before using repellents on infants.

### Report

Report locations where you see water sitting stagnant for more than a week such as roadside ditches, flooded yards, and similar locations that may produce mosquitoes. The local health department or city government may be able to add larvicide to the water, which will kill any mosquito eggs.

# Welcome to the 'Hub City'

## City creating program for new residents

**ROCHELLE** – The City of Rochelle is creating a program for new residents moving to town that will both make them feel welcomed in the community and help their transition go smoothly.

According to Mayor John Bearrows, new residents in town will receive a phone call from the city along with a basket full of items from him. They will also receive an invitation to the first ever new resident reception that will take place on Aug. 22 at Kennay Farms Distillery.

The main goal of the reception is to bring people together and to help them get acquainted with city officials and some of the businesses.

"I feel when a new resident comes to town we need to make them feel very comfortable in that they know who to call to have their car worked on, or go to the dentist or a doctor or whatever," said Bearrows. "Now, there are very few phonebooks out there, so I felt it was important to put together a packet to give to the

new resident that has all the various phone numbers of all the things that you and I take for granted."

Bearrows came up with the idea and when he brought it up to the city, the staff ran with it. Within four hours after meeting with the first staff member about choosing a location, Kennay Farms had been locked in. Bearrows said everyone on the city staff has pitched in to help this program come together, even designing welcome baskets to hand out.

"This is not just a Mayor Bearrows type thing, the whole city staff has really pulled together and made this all happen. I came up with the idea and the entire staff jumped on it and said what can we do, how can we help?" explained Bearrows. "I don't know of anyone on the City of Rochelle staff that doesn't have their whole heart in this community."

The event will last between one and a half and two hours and will feature many local businesses and city officials for new residents to get to know. There will also be snacks including local restaurant Ralfie's BBQ. This is the first and only reception that will take place in 2019, but the city plans to have

two receptions next year while rotating locations. The receptions next year are scheduled for mid-June and early November.

"At the second one my vision is, we could have the new residents along with some of the ones from the event before. They are now a seasoned resident and they can relate to these folks and say, 'I know how you feel,'" explained Bearrows. "and then there is a sense of trust and comfort with that person who has already been through what they are going through."

While the reception is aimed at helping the new residents get acclimated, it is also geared at changing the way the community looks at newcomers.

"People that come from the outside can sometimes be looked at as outsiders and I want to eliminate that stigma. I don't want people to think that if you weren't born here or were you raised here, it really doesn't matter," said Bearrows. "You're here and you chose this spot, you could have chosen any of the other 49 states but you chose Rochelle, Illinois and we want to show that we appreciate that and make people feel at home."

### Annual golf outing raises funds for Steve Tobler Scholarship

**ROCHELLE** – It has been just over two years since the unexpected and heartbreaking passing of Steve Tobler.

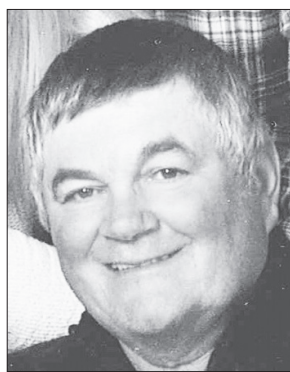
To remember the legacy he left at Kings School and the Rochelle community and to honor his love for kids and their education, the second annual Steve Tobler scholarship golf outing and dinner will take place Thursday, Aug. 1 at Fairways Golf Course and Salt 251 restaurant.

The outing will be a shotgun start and will include 18 holes of golf in a scramble format, a dinner and a silent auction with items ranging from homemade crafts to a six-night stay in Hollywood, California.

All of the profits earned from the event are invested in the Rochelle Township High School Foundation and eventually used as scholarships for students who graduated from Kings and went on to graduate from RTHS.

"Last year we gave out two \$500 scholarships because the girls were just so even, but our goal is to at least have a \$1,000 scholarship each year," explained Belinda Luxton, former teacher at Kings.

Tobler spent his entire life in the Rochelle

area, working on his family farm during the day and at UPS at night to help make ends meet.

Kings educational program was very important to him, his entire family went to Kings and then went on to graduate from RTHS. Tobler served on the Kings School Board and eventually served as the board president for 12 years until one night in May of 2017 when he went to sleep and never woke up at the age of 64.

"He was always at the school helping out and he was very devoted to education. He wanted quality education to be made at Kings School," said Luxton.

Tobler and Luxton were classmates in high school and sat at each other's study hall table. She thought it was fascinating that he worked on his family farm and they began talking and got to know each other. When they were older their families had a great

friendship because they both have four sons of the same age.

After Tobler passed away Luxton thought of many different ways to honor him, until deciding on a scholarship in his name.

"After this happened I just kept thinking about what could we do. We could put up a plaque but that wouldn't have been something Steve would have thought much of," added Luxton. "So, I thought he loved education and wanted to see kids be the best that they can be in their life, and I just thought of a scholarship."

Along with participating in the golfing event, individuals or businesses have the option of sponsoring a hole on the course or simply donating to the cause. The cost to sponsor a hole is \$100 that includes a plaque with the name of the business, company or family displayed near a green. Donations of any kind are also appreciated and helpful in keeping the dreams of Steve Tobler alive.

"We are just coming alongside Steve and his love of education and young people. We don't want anyone to be left behind, we want to see those kids succeed in their goals in life," said Luxton.

## Recent Kishwaukee College nursing grads achieve 100 percent first-time pass rate

**MALTA** — Students graduating from the Kishwaukee College Registered Nursing Program in December 2018 and March 2019 achieved a first-time pass rate of 100 percent on the National Council Licensure Examination-Registered Nursing (NCLEX-RN). A total of 25 students, who completed the two-year registered nursing program at the college, passed the required examination on their first attempt, placing Kishwaukee College among the few institutions to accomplish this goal.

The achievement is an important one for the nursing program, which earned accreditation through the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN) in 2018. The nursing students exceeded the 2018 state and national average first-time pass rate of 88 percent.

"This is an important milestone for the program. The 100 percent pass rate reflects the dedication and commitment of our nursing faculty and graduates," states Mindy Finch, dean of instruction and director of nursing. "Training qualified nurses in our accredited program who can contribute safely and effectively to healthcare brings a

sense of pride to the program. The program will continue to deliver a level of excellence that helps meet and exceed standards."

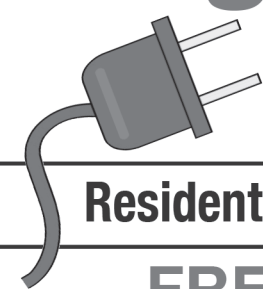
The NCLEX-RN exam has been the national testing standard for nursing since 1982. The purpose of the exam is to ensure nursing candidates have the knowledge and skill set to begin practicing as an entry-level nurse. It measures a candidate's application and analysis abilities, critical thinking and judgment. Candidates from associate and bachelor programs sit for the rigorous exam to become registered. Six of the 25 Kishwaukee College students passed the newer version of NCLEX-RN, which went into effect April 1 and included a clinical judgment module.

"The future is very bright for these new nurses and I wish them all the best in their careers," Finch adds.

Kishwaukee College's registered nursing program offers a two-year degree in registered nursing and a Registered Nursing to Bachelor of Science dual enrollment program with Northern Illinois University for students interested in earning a four-year degree.

## Annual 4-H Blue Ribbon Livestock Auction set

**OREGON** — The Annual 4-H Blue Ribbon Livestock Auction has been set for Saturday, Aug. 3. It will be held at the Ogle County Fair at the fairgrounds in Oregon.

The 4-H Auction Committee invites the public to support 4-H project work by bidding on a quality 4-H animal.

The auction will start at 3 p.m. in the Swine Barn. It will feature 4-H market hogs, lambs, beef animals, goats, poultry, and rabbits as well as the champion and reserve champion beef, swine, lamb, and goat carcasses.

Live animals may be purchased and sent to a locker or may be bought and resold at a slaughterhouse. Slaughterhouse buyers will be attending. Transportation to processing plants will be provided. A floor price will be set according to the current market trends the day of the auction. A list of current market prices will be available. Champion and Reserve Champion market animals will be sold first. Pork and lamb carcasses will be sold whole. Beef carcasses will be sold in halves.

Auction order will be: Swine Carcass, Live Swine, Dairy Basket, Dairy and Meat Goat Wethers, Live Poultry, Live Rabbits, Beef Carcass, Live Beef, Sheep Carcass, Live Sheep, Live Swine, Live Beef, and Live Sheep.

## Certified food protection course offered

**OREGON** — Do you currently have a position handling food or are you looking to find a position in the food industry? If so, this class may be required for you to get a step ahead.

The Certified Food Protection Manager Course will be offered by University of Illinois Extension Nutrition and Wellness Educator, Marilyn Csernus, MS, RD at the Ogle County Extension office located at 421 West Pines Rd., in Oregon. The course is taught over two days on Tuesday, Aug. 20 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. and Friday, Aug. 23 from 9 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. The exam will be administered from 12:30 to 2:30 p.m. on Friday. A valid photo ID is required for the course.

The fee for this course is \$125 for the two days and includes the book, educational materials, examination and lunch.

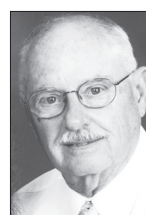

## NOT ALWAYS BURIAL

In many parts of the world, burial is the most common form of final disposition - but it is not the only form. Many bodies are entombed, or placed in above-ground mausoleums. The procedures are similar to an earth burial, since the body is placed in a casket and is usually driven from the funeral ceremony in a procession. Entombment is the traditional form of final disposition in some areas. In New Orleans, for example, high water tables make ground burial impossible.

Cremation is another form of final disposition that is gaining increasing acceptance in North America. However, this option is still not as popular



here as in other parts of the world. The cremation rate is roughly 15 percent in the U.S. and about 25 percent in Canada. By contrast, in European countries more than half of those who die are cremated. In some cultures, such as Japan, cremation is the most common form of final disposition.

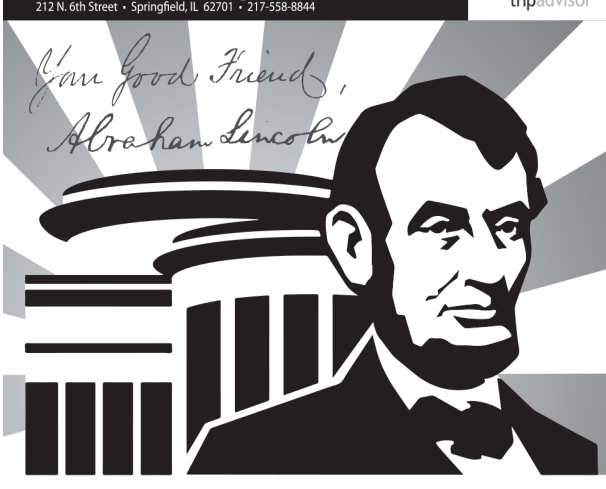

Fiegenschuh pointed out that city council and staff aren't sure how community members might react to the possibility of legal cannabis dispensaries popping

up in Rochelle, but if residents are going to be able to legally purchase cannabis products in other towns, then local leaders at least need to look at the revenue possibilities.

"I think there is probably ap-

prehension about the legalizing of adult cannabis, but the way the law is written people are allowed to smoke it and if people are allowed to partake in that, then maybe the city should look into generating some revenue off that," he said.

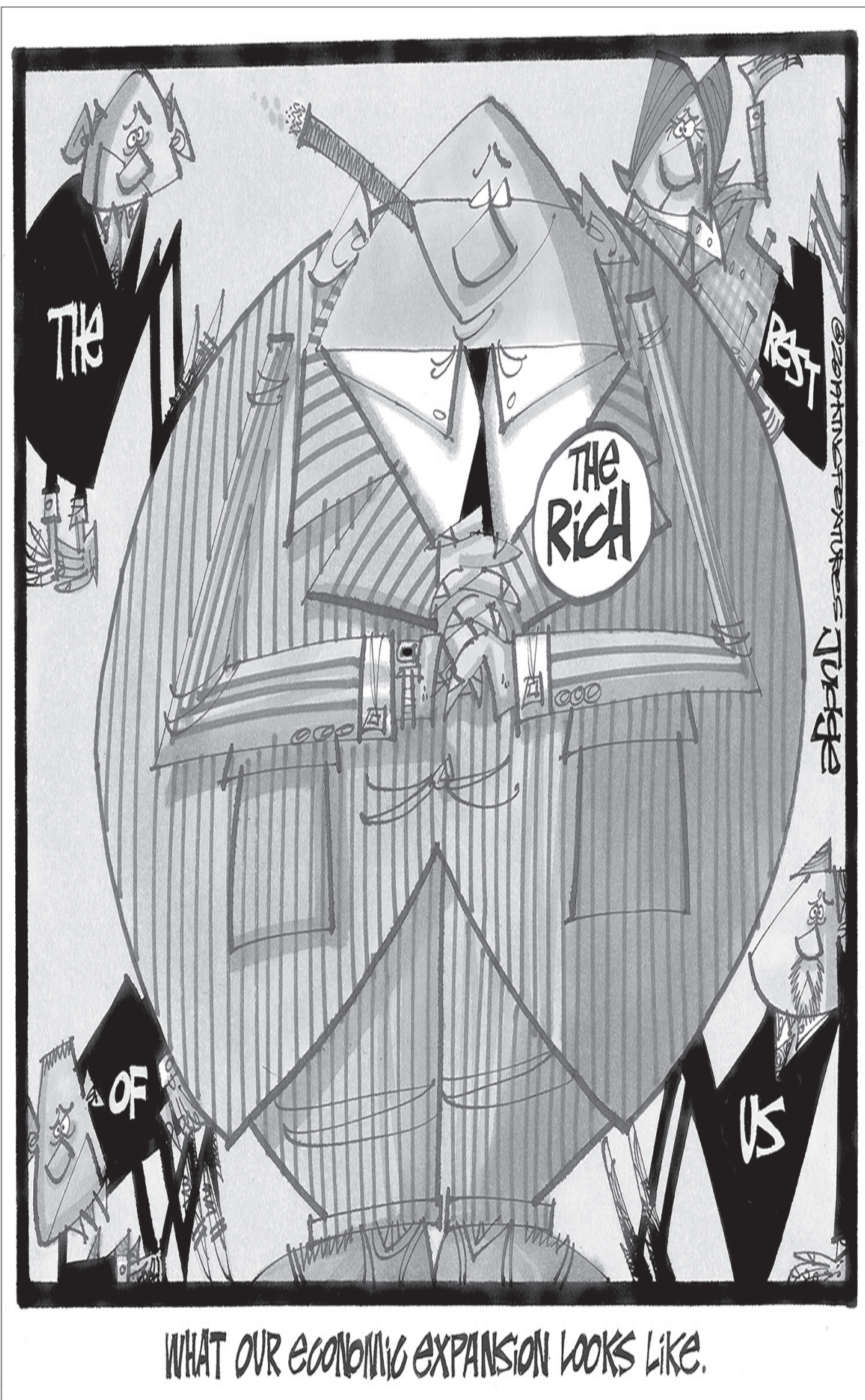
### Rewarded for doing good

## Marijuana law allows on-site consumption

**Dear Editor,**  
The marijuana law includes an exemption to the Smoke-Free Illinois Act ban on indoor smoking, and lets cities decide whether to allow on-site marijuana use at bars, restaurants, and cannabis smoking lounges, the Chicago Sun-Times reported. Rep. Kelly Cassidy and her colleagues decided that social consumption of marijuana would be allowed, but not licensed by the state, leaving that up to local officials, according to the Chicago Sun-Times. Public health and safety are concerns with on-site consumption. Legislators thought video gambling would only be limited to bars, restaurants, and veteran organizations. However, video gambling machines are everywhere, except in the 125 municipalities and counties where they are banned. We could see a similar situation with marijuana unless local officials pass an ordinance to ban recreational marijuana dispensaries, processing, transporting, cultivation facilities, and on-site consumption of marijuana in municipalities and counties. Living near marijuana dispensaries makes youth more likely to use marijuana, according to a study by the Rand Corp. Youth who use marijuana are more likely to experience negative consequences, such as increased risk of mental and physical health problems, according to the researchers. Contact your mayor, city council and county board to ask for a ban on recreational marijuana businesses and on-site consumption. Act now to protect your family and community before it is too late.

## Sheriff's department contract approved

**OREGON** – The Ogle County Board on July 16 finally approved a new contract for the Ogle County Sheriff's Department.

The new six-year deal covers about 70 people, said Ogle County Sheriff Brian VanVickle, including patrol deputies, corrections officers and "non-sworn" workers including office staff. They have all been working without a contract since Dec. 1, 2017.

The new contract includes pay increases of 2 percent for 2017-18; 2.5 percent for fiscal year 2018-19; and a 2.75 percent increase in each of the final four years.

VanVickle said the pay is retroactive, and that the union has already ratified the agreement, which focused on pay.

"Wages are always the No. 1 concern," he said. "That's what the majority of the negotiations were in regards to."

VanVickle said the new contract puts the pay in his department "right in line" with the industry standard.

**JOLIET**—Hotweather didn't hold 11-year-old Rochelle Area Track Club hurdler Zachary Dreska back from performing his best during the USATF Junior Olympic Regional Championships at Memorial Stadium this past weekend. Dreska competed in two events at the regional including the javelin throw, where he placed fourth out of seven athletes in the 11-12 Boys Division with a distance of 19.42 meters, or 63.71 feet.

Dreska's mark was long

enough to qualify him for the USATF National Championships, which will be held at Horner Stadium in Sacramento, California from July 22-28. While Dreska will be unable to attend, he said he was thrilled to learn he had advanced to the national level.

"I was super excited when I qualified for nationals," Dreska said. "Hopefully I will qualify again next year and be able to go. It would be so cool to be there... Regionals were really, really hot, and I wanted to make nationals but there was really hard competition.

I was so excited when they announced who qualified and they said my name."

Dreska picked up track and field when he was 6 years old, and he's been competing in the sport for the last five years. The javelin throw has quickly become his favorite event, and he said the transition from a turbo jab to an arrow javelin this year has been most exciting.

Dreska aims to follow in the footsteps of his older brother's fiancé Gabby, who won her events at nationals in college.

"My favorite part about track and field is being able

to get better each year," Dreska said. "This is my first year with the arrow javelin and it's been awesome to use. I really enjoy making new friends in the Rochelle Area Track Club each summer. Coach Dobbs, coach Miller and coach Dreska have really helped me."

Dreska finished sixth in the discus throw with a distance of 14.56 meters at the regional event.

RATC member Ashyley Dwyer also competed, placing seventh in the 13-14 Girls Division javelin throw with a distance of 11.30 and taking 13th in the discus throw with a mark of 9.80.

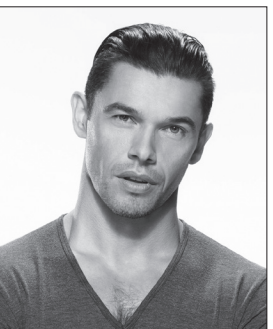
