## Fatal accident Friday

**ROCHELLE** — Rochelle Police investigated a fatal accident that took place Friday morning at a local industry. Emergency personnel were called to Coated Sand Solutions, 1951 Steward Road, a short time before 11 a.m. Friday. It was reported that a male subject from Chana was on the side ladder of a rail car on the east side of the facility

when he was pinned between the rail car and a parked semi-truck. The man was transported by ambulance to Rochelle Community Hospital where he was pronounced dead. As of press time, his identity had not been released by officials. Ogle County Coroner Lou Finch is expected to conduct an autopsy Monday.

## Marijuana talks Monday

**ROCHELLE**—City of Rochelle leaders will be holding a town hall meeting this Monday at 6 p.m., to discuss the possibility of marijuana dispensaries operating in town. The meeting will take place at the city council chambers and will be run by the city manager and the city staff. The public is encouraged to attend to voice its opinions on the issue, and there will also be a chance for attendees to write down questions that will be addressed by the staff. There will be no decisions made at the meeting as the main goal is to inform residents about the new laws and get their

feedback on the topic. “It is an opportunity for local citizens to voice their opinions one way or another regarding the subject of cannabis being offered through dispensaries in our local community,” explained Rochelle Mayor John Bearrows. During the meeting, possible state laws and city regulations will also be discussed. Whether the response from the community is positive or negative, the city thinks it is important to hear a variety of viewpoints from community members before any decisions are made. “We were elected by the people to represent them and that is what this meeting is for, to get their opinions,” added Bearrows.

## K9 training facility gets green light

**ROCHELLE** — A special dog training facility will soon be operating on the west edge of town after Rochelle City Council members approved a request from Eloy and Claudia Cervantes to lease out space at their trucking company to a professional dog trainer. The facility will be located at 2000 W. 8th Ave. and the south end of 20th Street near Lawnridge Cemetery. Don Blair, a CIA K9 dog trainer from Sycamore, explained to the Rochelle

Planning Commission that he trains K-9 detection dogs and also does training for recreational K-9 Nose Work competitions. According to Blair, no dogs will be housed at the facility overnight at any time. “Owners and dogs would come for their training sessions and then go home,” he stated at a meeting in June. “It’s a great location and people will come if we offer a good facility and staff.”

## A brush of kindness

**B**RUSH with Kindness, a program launched by Habitat for Humanity of Ogle County, recently built a new ramp leading into the home of two Rochelle residents. BWK is a program that provides services such a painting, landscaping and minor exterior repairs for lower income homeowners. This year alone, they are completing four to five different projects all throughout Ogle County and this was one of the first. Hub City Senior Center officials reached out to the Habitat leaders about completing this ramp for the homeowner’s wife. “The wife had recently been in the hospital and the husband was very concerned about her mobility and being able to get her in and out of the house without having a ramp already in place,” explained Vanessa L. White-Broome, executive director of Habitat for Humanity of Ogle County. She began speaking with the family and getting measurements in July. The work took about three weeks to complete, and it was just finished this last Friday. All of the funding for the project came from the Rochelle Area Community Foundation.

White-Broome said the project could not have been completed without the help from the foundation and the senior center. “I want to put a thank you out to The Rochelle Area Community Foundation because without them we wouldn’t have been able to serve this family or do another project in Rochelle because these funds are so important for us,” she added. “We also appreciate getting the referral from the senior center there in Rochelle. Prior to this ramp being built, the couple had to use a smaller ramp that was located on the side of the house. It was much smaller and did not work very well for access into the home. The new ramp is much bigger and is now located on the front of the house leading in to the main entrance. “I actually went out met the homeowner and took some pictures and followed up last Thursday and he was just elated,” White-Broome said. “He was happy it came together so quickly and he was glad we were really able to help them with the situation.” This was one of the first projects of the year to be completed within Rochelle. Habitat for Humanity has more smaller scale projects in the works for Rochelle, but nothing has been finalized yet. Habitat for Humanity of Ogle County is also looking for more board members, if anyone is looking to serve on the board of volunteers they can contact White-Broome by e-mail at vanes-sawhite82@yahoo.com or by phone at 815-440-6598.

## NIU gets grant

**SPRINGFIELD** — Secretary of State and State Librarian Jesse White awarded \$365,449 in FY20 Radio Information Service grants.

The RIS grants support 11 radio stations, ensuring that Illinois residents who are unable to read standard print material due to a disability have equal access to information published in newspapers and magazines.

“By providing audio versions of printed material, residents who have visual or physical disabilities can access printed information for educational, informational and recreational purposes,” said White. “The service keeps people engaged in their local communities.”

Northern Illinois University in DeKalb received \$28,273.

## Kishwaukee College maintains accredited status with the Higher Learning Commission

**MALTA** — Kishwaukee College has received formal notification of its reaccreditation by the Higher Learning Commission. The decision follows a comprehensive evaluation and visit to Kish campus by a team of HLC peer reviewers in April. Accreditation is valid until the next Reaffirmation of Accreditation cycle in 2028-29.

“Receiving reaccreditation by the HLC demonstrates the quality education Kish offers,” says Dr. Laurie Borowicz, president of Kishwaukee College. “The rigorous accreditation process and feedback from the HLC reviewers gave us an outside perspective on the College, has affirmed we are doing good things to help our learners achieve their educational goals,

and will help us to continue improving services for our students and our local communities.”

The accreditation process is designed to help colleges and universities critically evaluate their curriculum, instruction and support services. The overall objective is to help the institution meet threshold standards and engage in continuous improvement.

The visiting team of peer reviewers remarked on how well prepared and organized the college was for the visit, noting in their final report that, “All participants at site visit meetings spoke with confidence and enthusiasm regarding the direction of this college, their passion for being part of Kishwaukee, and the importance of Kishwaukee College to all

district communities.” The reviewers also commented, “[...] the college may be on a trajectory to emerge as a noteworthy model institution in [the assessment of student learning].”

The HLC is one of six accreditation agencies in the United States that provides institutional accreditation on a regional basis. The HLC requires institutions to undergo a comprehensive evaluation every 10 years. Kish has earned accreditation by the agency since 1974.

“During the site visit, it was observed multiple times that the new, shortened mission (the college ‘improves lives through quality, affordable education’) embodies a widely shared passion for college purpose,” the final report states.

Village trustees unanimously voted to approve a motion adding four security cameras to monitor activity around the Village Hall property. Trustees passed the motion, which allocated \$2,500 to fund the new cameras, during the Hillcrest board meeting Wednesday evening. “We had some minor vandalism done to the old police car,” Fore said. “It was sitting out by the road and someone wrote, ‘There is no cop in here, nice try’ on the window... The incident pointed out that we have some very big blinds spots on our property so we’ve gathered information on purchasing additional cameras for the property.”

The board held discussions regarding the possible sale of its former police car Wednesday before deciding to table talks until September while trustees consider adding an ordinance officer. The board also chose to postpone its transition yard ordinance discussion until its September meeting.



## COUNCIL: New speed limit for truck route on city's west side

On the recommendation from the planning commission the council approved the rezoning of the property to an Industrial-2 zone last month, and then this past Monday night approved the conditional use permit for Blair's operation on Cervantes' property by a 7-0 vote.

### New speed limit

In an effort to improve safety and reduce noise for the residential area on the 14th Street truck route, council voted to reduce the speed limit from 30 m.p.h. to 20 m.p.h. on 14th Street from Lincoln Avenue to Eighth Avenue.

In 2001, the 400 block of north 15th Street was permanently closed for the expansion of Silgan Containers. North 14th Street was then listed as an authorized truck route allowing access to the north side of Silgan and other businesses along Eighth Avenue.

Truck traffic using north 14th

Street has also increased with the addition of a trucking company located off of Eighth Avenue, and some residents have raised concerns about the amount of truck traffic, deterioration of the roadway, noise and speed of the trucks driving through the neighborhood.

The vote to reduce the speed limit in that zone passed 7-0 at Monday night's council meeting.

### Other business

Council members approved the purchase of a 2019 Altec DH50 Digger Derrick truck through the Cooperative Purchasing program for \$231,002. The truck will replace the 2006 Altec GMC Digger Derrick, which will be used as a trade-in.

The Illinois Department of Transportation has determined through pavement evaluation studies and the weight of aircraft landing, that a portion of the Rochelle Municipal Airport asphalt runway is in need of an upgrade. On Monday night, the council authorized

the city manager to execute an intergovernmental agreement with the State of Illinois and authorize the payment of the city's 5 percent local share of \$94,063 toward the project. Federal funds will cover 90 percent of the project and state funds will cover the remaining 5 percent.

The council approved a change order for the work being done with the city's industrial rail improvements south rail extension project. Due to the wet spring, additional soil stabilization is required to remove moisture from the borrowed soils being used to build the six-track rail bed south of Johns Creek. The change order amounts to \$540,514, but since the bids for the overall construction bids came in \$650,000 under budget, the additional money being spent on the soil stabilization falls within the original \$7 million budget for the entire project. The city's portion of the \$540,514 change order is just \$176,365 with EDA and IDOT covering the rest.

## A trip to Switzerland

**A**UBREY Headon and I had something in common recently. No, it is not athleticism...she is much more talented in that area. I can't imagine competing on a national team on any level, yet she does it with ease.

Switzerland is the commonality. She was there competing; my wife and I were there visiting our daughter, who lives there. Pardon me while I ramble about Switzerland. It is beautiful. Our daughter lives in a town near Lake Geneva, and I can sit on her balcony and watch the boats on the lake with the French and Swiss Alps as a background. It is clean. Yes, there is a lot of graffiti, or maybe I am just noticing it more, but cities are generally cleaner than what you would expect a city to be. I was chatting with her friends about life there. We got on the topic of insurance. You must have health insurance if you live in Switzerland. The government sets the standards, but private companies provide the plans. I asked how this was enforced. One person told me if you want a bank loan, mortgage, apartment rental, or to purchase a car, you will be asked for proof of insurance. No proof, no business. People also have accident insurance, usually provided by the employer. The difference? If you get hit by

a car, accident insurance covers that. If you have a heart attack, health insurance covers that. I was also told that if you were crossing in the middle of the street and not a crosswalk, accident insurance may not cover you. The Swiss constitution recognizes four official languages... My daughter is in the French speaking park, my nephew is in the German speaking part, while people on the east end may speak Italian and a few in remote communities speak Romansh. This nation of eight million has no trouble communicating. Young people may speak three or four languages, including English. I talked with a 10-year-old who speaks German at home, French in school and English with me. She flowed effortlessly from one language to another. They have a different view of education. School calendars have breaks in the summer, fall, winter, spring and in February for skiing. Parents will be denied permission to take children out of school at other times, unless it is a family emergency. At around sixth grade students take a test to determine if they will attend a university prep type school, or a school that will train students for a career. It's a big deal. Switzerland also is a major wine producer, although they do not export wine to the United States. 

## Reaching a milestone

Village of Progress to celebrate 50 years

If anyone understands the history of the Village of Progress, it's Donna Mattison — she has been there pretty much from the beginning, when it was a day care in a Mount Morris Church.

Now serving adults with developmental disabilities from across Ogle County, Village of Progress will be celebrating its 50th anniversary on Aug. 28 from 1 to 2:30 p.m. There will be tours of the Oregon facility, snacks and a plaque unveiling honoring Bob Glaser and John Herrmann for their leadership.

In that 50 years, VOP has grown into an organization that offers a wide variety of vocational, recreational and social programs. The Village boasts a 28,000-square-foot production facility where nearly 100 people with developmental disabilities work on any given day.

Mattison, who is now program director, said she has "no plans of retiring."

"I love this place," she said. And she is not alone. Brion Brooks, executive director of the Village, said very few non-profits ever reach 15 years. He said what

put VOP on the road to longevity was the first parents who saw a need for their children and were motivated to address that need.

"There is no greater motivation for action than a parent sensing a lost opportunity for their children," he said.

Glaser was hired in April of 1969 to help establish the Village, and on Sept. 6 of that year it officially opened its doors in Mount Morris. It was a day care center and a "sheltered workshop," where they worked with a local textile manufacturer.

Over the years, the Village has moved to Oregon and grown its manufacturing work as well as its social and recreational programs.

Assistant Director Sherri Egan said their recreational and social programs aimed at people who can't necessarily work include swimming, cycling, bowling, track and field and basketball, among other activities.

The Village also runs the Village Cleaning Service, which has about 30 clients, both large and small. It also

operates the popular Village Bakery in Oregon. Brooks said the idea at the bakery was to have disabled folks work alongside people who are not disabled. He said 75 percent of the workers at the bakery do not have a disability.

"I wanted to give our people a sense of what it's like to work in the real world," he said.

Back at the production facility, people do a variety of work. It is a large, open space buzzing with activity and plenty of smiles. Brooks said VOP has bought into the idea that being productive helps give people a "sense of identity and accomplishment."

And there is plenty to accomplish there, with work being done for Wahl Clippers in Sterling, MTE Hydraulics in Rockford, Etnyre in Oregon and Ducks Unlimited, among others.

Brooks said some people can work longer stretches than others, but they all are a part of the team.

"There are also people at the Village who

are unable to work, or unable to work for more than a few minutes at a time," he said, adding that those who can't work much still get a paycheck. "It may not be much – just a few bucks, but they receive a paycheck because there's that pride in doing something."

The public is invited to the event on Aug. 28, when they will also officially honor Glaser by naming the training center after him.

# Chicago skydiver heads to world championships

**CHICAGO**—Chicago resident Alexey Galda is heading to the 2019 World Cup of Wingsuit Flying in Ravenna, Italy, later this month as a member of the prestigious U.S. Parachute Team.

Galda will go up against nearly 100 of the best wingsuit skydivers from around the globe at the World Cup Aug. 23-29. Galda earned his place on the U.S. Parachute Team, the nation’s most elite aerial athletes, by winning silver at the 2018 U.S. Parachute Association National Championships.

With the growth of wingsuit skydiving over the past few years, more skydivers are taking up this exciting discipline. In wingsuit skydiving, jumpers wear technologically advanced suits that are specially designed to increase their horizontal glide across the ground, allowing them to soar like birds through the sky at horizontal speeds approaching 200 mph. In the performance flying event, individual competitors are

scored on their horizontal distance, flight time and speed as they zoom across the sky.

Galda, 32, works as a physics research assistant professor at the University of Chicago. He trains locally at Chicagoland Skydiving Center in Rochelle.

# Harriers take flight

Several players returning from record-setting 2018 campaign

**ROCHELLE** — The Rochelle varsity boys soccer program went further than any team in school history last season. While the Hubs graduated several players from the record-setting 2018 campaign, returning players are confident they can follow up with an equally impressive performance during the 2019 season.

Rochelle kicked off fall practices this past week, and the Hubs will open the season with three consecutive nonconference games against Hinckley-Big Rock, Earlville and Somonauk from Aug. 26-28 before traveling for the annual War on 34 Championship. The Hubs, who went 20-1-1 with both Northern Illinois Big 12 Conference and IHSA Class 2A Regional titles in 2018, make their Interstate Eight Conference debut against Sandwich on Sept. 3.

"I feel like it's going to be a good season," senior Max Torres said. "We learned last year that no matter how hard it gets, we have to keep our focus on the game and giving

everything we have... Our goals this year are to try and bring back all of the championships we won last year, and hopefully we can go farther than we went last year."

Despite losing record-setting scorer Jessee Infante, the Hubs bring back plenty of firepower at the forward positions including Torres and the Orozco brothers (junior Brayan and sophomore Josue). The three players combined for 55 goals and 34 assists in 2018. Senior Austin Brown returns to headline the midfield positions, with juniors Zane Walters and Josh Hurtado primed for breakout campaigns.

"We're going to have to come a long way since we have a lot of young kids," Brown said. "But they're really good so we should be able to build up pretty quickly and get off to a good start this season. We need to stay positive and we have a lot of potential. We want to win the conference right away, and I don't think making the regional finals is a long shot this year."

Rochelle will need some new players to step into starting roles on defense after losing keeper Mason DeLille and backs Josue



## Huskies bringing attitude, work ethic to practice

Family Fun Day offering chance for fans to watch NIU team in action

**DEKALB** — One day after the first extended scrimmage of 2019 pre-season, the Northern Illinois University Huskies put in a spirited and fast-moving practice in shorts and helmets Sunday in front of a crowd of season ticket members invited to attend the workout.

Following Sunday's practice, the season ticket members in attendance were invited onto the field for a Q&A session with Thomas Hammock and a chance to meet the Huskie players. The next opportunity for fans to see the NIU football team in action, and secure autographs from the Huskies, takes place Sunday, Aug. 18 beginning at 2:30 p.m. when NIU will hold its annual Family Fun Day, open to all NIU fans and members of the community. Following the open practice, during which the Huskie inflatables will be available for kids in the North End Zone, the players will be available for autographs.

NIU head coach Thomas Hammock was happy with the effort and said Sunday's practice proved an important point.

"They definitely came out with the right attitude," Hammock said. "I was prepared to send them back inside and get the pads on, but they came out with the right attitude. We really want them to understand that you don't have to put full pads on to get quality work at practice. Tomorrow will be another day where we will go back to a very physical practice, but today was important for us for our

maturity and our development as a team."

Sunday's workout included individual drills, a passing circuit with the quarterbacks throwing different routes as the receivers rotated, and turnover and ball security drills. The Huskies spent 30 minutes on special teams, including punt return and "gunner" sessions. The practice concluded with 7-on-7 work, with tight end Mitchell Brinkman recording a highlight reel catch between two defenders, and a two-minute situational 11-on-11 period.

After reviewing the video from Saturday's scrimmage, Hammock said a handful of players stood out, including tailback Tre Harbison, the starting linebacking trio of Antonio Jones-Davis, Kyle Pugh and Lance Deveaux Jr., and center Christopher Perez.

"There were certainly some big plays on both sides of the ball," Hammock said. "I wanted to let plays carry on and we tried to do that; the defense had a few sacks which is good to see, and then I thought our receivers made some plays and the quarterback threw some nice balls. I think we have a lot that we can clean up. It's good to keep putting our players in those situations where they have to go out there and play on their own without the coach being able to help them on the field, so we're going to try to get that a couple more times."

In fact, Hammock said a concentration on situations, decision-making and seeing how players on both

sides of the ball respond to plays — both good and bad — would be a point of emphasis for the Huskies in practice this week.

"We're going to really put an emphasis on moving the ball, getting the coaches off the field and letting the players play," he said. "We want to see how they respond and react to different situations throughout the course of practice on their own. On Aug. 31, they are the ones that are going to have to go out there and play, so we are going to try and put them in situations this week. With a bad play, how do you respond, good plays, can you put a couple of good plays together?"

## From hardwood to gridiron, Monfils finding success

It took some time for former Rochelle Township High School student-athlete Tim Monfils to transition from basketball to football. But Monfils felt that many of his skills on the hardwood transferred to the gridiron, so it's unsurprising that Monfils has already carved out a significant role with the Cornell College football program.

Monfils spent his freshman season with the Cornell College basketball program, playing forward and earning Academic All-Midwest Conference honors. Monfils appeared in seven games, totaling 25 minutes, six points, two rebounds and one blocked shot. When Monfils became interested in football, he said he originally wanted to play both sports before later deciding to play football exclusively.

"I stuck with football in the interest of time management and how much I had enjoyed football," Monfils said. "I miss basketball a lot since I played the game all my life, but I'm very happy with where I am and I can't wait for my last camp as an athlete to start. It took quite a bit of adjusting with different conditioning, more meetings... Luckily for me, all of my teammates and coaches were very encouraging and they helped me each step of the way."

Standing 6 feet 5 inches tall, Monfils started his football career with Cornell College as a tight end, catching two passes

for 31 yards and appearing in all 10 of the team's games. He then changed positions before his junior campaign, moving inside to the offensive line due to several injuries depleting the team's depth. Monfils played nine games at offensive tackle his junior season, earning Second-Team All-Midwest Conference recognition.

"I was skeptical about changing positions at first, but I've really learned to enjoy it because of the other offensive linemen and coach [A.J.] Rachal," Monfils said. "My play is still a work in progress, but with the people I'm surrounded by in the program, I don't doubt I can reach my potential. I've performed best when we're running the ball, and we've established a pretty solid running game. I'm still working on perfecting my deep sets in pass protection."

Monfils has added at least 30 pounds to his frame since his freshman basketball season, and as the former Hub prepares for his senior season, he'll attempt to model his play after the team's performance against Knox College in 2018, when the Rams won 22-7 behind stout play on the offensive line. He said his teammates have helped him make some of his favorite sporting memories in recent years.

"My very first day of spring practice as a freshman, everybody walked into the locker room with smiles on their faces to shake my hand and make me feel welcome," Monfils said. "The guys have been nothing but good to me and that's why I'm able to keep improving."
