# Colson earns honor

## Makes World Series of Drag Racing Hall of Fame

MOUNT MORRIS – Oregon native Ron Colson wasn't expecting the surprise he received during the Ogle County Board meeting in August.

Colson arrived at the meeting prepared for plenty of tense discussion about solar farms, which drew a standing-room-only crowd and served as the meeting's primary debate topic. Colson jokingly admitted that he planned to play peacemaker in case arguments became heated.

But after Colson began the meeting with an invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance, he received stunning news from his fellow board members that the board planned to pass a resolution for Saturday, Aug. 25, 2018 to be recognized in Ogle County as Ron Colson and Ron Leek Day in honor of their most recent achievements in the sport of drag racing.

OREGON—Ogle County Collector Linda Beck reminds property owners that the second installment of their property tax bill is due on Sept. 7.

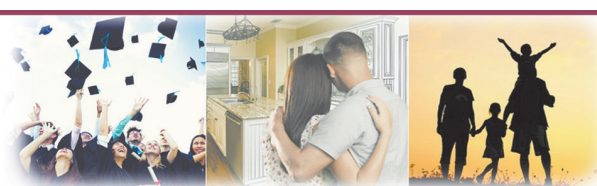
Payment methods include cash or check (payable to Ogle County Collector). In-person payments can be made at the Treasurer's office in the "old" courthouse at 105 S. 5th St., Ste. 114 in Oregon, or at any bank in Ogle County. The mailing address is Ogle County Collector, P.O. Box 40, Oregon, IL 61061.

Mailed payments must be postmarked by the due date to be considered timely. Late payments will incur a fee of 1.5 percent per month or part of a month after the due date and must be remitted. By mail or at the Collector's office.

Beck's office is also offering the option of online credit card payments. You may get to this site by going directly to [www.oglecounty-treasurer.org](http://www.oglecounty-treasurer.org) or through [www.oglecounty.org](http://www.oglecounty.org) and then selecting the Treasurer's department. Choose the "Online Tax Payments" link and the "Pay Now" button. Fill in the information as prompted. Be sure to receive a payment confirmation for your records. Please note that this service carries a fee, so review the convenience fees prior to making your payment.

# COLSON: A three-time hall of famer

“That announcement floored me,” Colson said. “We had three solar farms coming up for vote and it was a very pretentious issue... That was really what was on my mind. But the other board members brought up a special item that wasn't on the agenda and I thought, ‘We can't vote on something that isn't on the official agenda.’ Then they said they were dedicating a day to Ron and I, and I about had to pick myself off the floor after that one.”

Colson and Leek were honored in recognition of their recent selections for the inaugural class of the World Series of Drag Racing Hall of Fame. The two racing legends were enshrined at Cordova International Raceway on Aug. 25. Colson is now a three-time Hall of Famer after he was selected for the Great Lakes Dragaway Hall of Fame in 2008 and the East Coast Drag Times Hall of Fame in 2015.

Colson said he was honored to be enshrined at Cordova International Raceway alongside many of his close friends and role models in the racing community including the late Bob Bartel, Leek and track founder Don “Big Daddy” Garlits.

“I always thought it would happen some time,” Colson said. “I'm as honored to be in that group of people as I am to be in a Hall of Fame... Bob Bartel got me started in the sport and he hired me for my first paid match race. To be going in with him has a tremendous impact on me.”

Colson's history with racing can be traced all the way back to when he was around 5 years old. His father Leo owned an auto repair shop, and growing up, Colson used to work on cars inside

his father's garage, doing things like grinding valves for customers once he had enough experience. His father also had harness horses, and Colson said his father was a prominent figure in the local harness horse racing scene.

“His garage was a mainstay in the community,” Colson said. “I combined the horse racing side of things with the automotive side, and I never expected it to turn into a lifetime profession.”

Colson's interest in racing grew tremendously as he moved into high school. He even recalled an exchange with his high school principal about pursuing a career as a race car driver.

“My high school principal tried giving me some guidance, and when I told him I wanted to have a race car and go racing from track to track, he said I wouldn't be able to do that. A couple of years later, I was racing.”

It was thin living at the beginning of his racing career, but Colson was more than happy to go along for the ride. He started learning how to build his own cars after high school, and not long after, he was sought out by many notable names in the racing

industry such as Gary Wood, to race cars for them.

Colson's racing career spanned roughly 20 years from 1961 to 1980. The most memorable experiences of his career include his infamous burnout on the sidewalk in front of the Buckingham Fountain at Chicago's Grant Park in 1962. His record-setting performance at Cordova (after previously setting a record in Oswego) while driving a 1941 Studebaker with a 1962 Corvette engine (a car built by Wood) earned him national exposure in Hot Rod Magazine in 1963.

A classic race-to-the-finish against rival competitor Don “The Snake” Prudhomme at Union Grove, Wisconsin in 1979 (one of the last races of Colson's career) also stays true in his mind. Colson traveled a lot throughout his racing career, but he enjoyed the sport so much that long trips didn't bother him much.

“It was just about living the dream,” Colson said. “Being on the road is a negative aspect for a lot of people but I always focused on what was over the next horizon.”

While Colson stopped racing cars in 1980, he remained heavily involved with the

sport. He produced races for broadcasting with the United Drag Racers Association, and he worked with a drag racing newspaper (United Racer) for about 10 years to help promote up-and-coming racers. He also moved into more consulting work with race tracks all across the area, even working on facilities such as Cordova International Raceway.

Colson and his girlfriend currently live in Mount Morris, and Colson has been a member of the Ogle County Board for roughly 16 years, holding a (not-so) coincidental position as chairman of roads and bridges. He still works in track consulting on occasion, but much of his time over the past decade has been focused on his health. However, his passion for racing has never wavered, and he said he couldn't imagine his life without the sport he knows so well.

“It's taken my life to such as extend that I feel the most complete when I'm in a funny car and I have 5,000 horsepower in front of me,” Colson said. “I'm most on top of the world when I'm in the race car and I have the engine running.”

# Byron river sweep Sept. 8

**BYRON** – The Tenth Annual Byron Area Rock River Sweep will be held on Saturday, Sept. 8, from 8 a.m.-noon.

Check in will begin at 7:50 a.m. at the park on River Road across from the Byron Forest Preserve entrance.

Volunteers are needed on foot or in boats to clean up our local section of the Rock River. This year we are targeting the section from Byron down to the confluence with the Leaf River. Boaters, paddlers, river land owners, scout groups, service organizations and individuals are needed to help pick up trash as well as sort the recyclable items from the trash. Students can earn community service hours by helping out.

The Byron Forest Preserve will be providing a limited number of canoes for use in the effort. Paddlers are encouraged to bring their own canoes and kayaks. Free rides will be provided from the landing at the Leaf River confluence back to Byron.

All participants are asked to check in at the park on River Road, where they will be assigned a section of the river to focus on. Those with motorized boats can then proceed to the boat landings to cover their section. Those on foot will walk or drive to areas accessible from shore.

Trash and recyclables will be returned to the park on River Road, to be sorted and brought to the recycling facility on German Church Road.

Gloves, trash bags, bug spray, snacks and water will be available. Participants are encouraged to wear long sleeves, long pants, and old shoes, and to bring a reusable water bottle to the event to reduce waste.

The Rock River Sweep is an effort by many groups up and down the Rock River, from Horicon, Wisconsin to where the Rock meets the Mississippi River. It is sponsored by RockRiverSweep.org, a grass roots, non-for-profit organization dedicated to preserving the health and ecosystem of the Rock River and its tributaries. Other sponsors include the Rock River Trail Initiative and the Rock River Times.

Locally, the Byron Area Rock River Sweep is also sponsored by the Byron Forest Preserve, American Rivers National River Cleanup, and the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints.

# Electronic recycling will be Sept. 15, 28

**OREGON**—The Ogle County Solid Waste Management Department (OC-SWMD) will be holding two electronic recycling events this September at the County Annex Building, located at 909 Pines Road in Oregon.

The first event is on Saturday Sept. 15, from 8 a.m. to noon. The second event is the regular monthly event on Friday Sept. 28, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

These events are for household electronic items from Ogle County residents only. If you have business generated electronics that you wish to recycle, or if you live outside of Ogle County, call the OCSWMD at the number listed below for other options. Proof of Ogle County residency will be required. Ac-

ceptable forms of identification include a drivers' license, a voter ID card, or a recent utility bill.

Items accepted at this event include all televisions, computer monitors, CPU's, laptops, keyboards, electronic mice, computer speakers, printers, copiers, FAX machines, VCR/DVD players, satellite receivers, computer cables, stereo equipment, phone systems, digital clocks, cell phones, tablets, video game consoles, holiday light strands, extension cords, CFL bulbs, rechargeable batteries, and printer cartridges. Microwave ovens are accepted at a charge of \$5 per unit. These and similar items are banned from Illinois landfills. Residents are limited to 7 items per collection event.

Items not accepted include appliances, such as refrigerators, washers, and dryers, dehumidifiers, smoke detectors, lamps, fans, coffee makers, bread makers, fryers, toaster ovens, alkaline batteries, yard/power tools, exercise equipment, vacuum cleaners, electric razors and toothbrushes, electronics which have been scrapped and harvested for valuable parts, and boxes, Styrofoam, and other packaging from electronics. Please pre-sort your items. Sorting items at the event takes time and makes for extended lines.

## MOMENTS IN TIME

\* On Sept. 20, 1565, Spanish forces capture the French Huguenot settlement of Fort Caroline, near present-day Jacksonville, Florida. The French lost 135 men in the first instance of colonial warfare between European powers in America.

\* On Sept. 23, 1846, at the Berlin Observatory, German astronomer Johann Gottfried Galle discovers the planet Neptune. The blue gas giant has eight known moons and a ring system containing three bright and two dim rings.

\* On Sept. 17, 1884, Judge Allen disposes of 13 criminal cases on his Oakland, California, docket in only six minutes. Defendants did not stand much of a chance of gaining an acquittal. In a 40-year period only 1 defendant in 100 was acquitted.

The mall has more than 800 stores, 100 restaurants, three radio stations, two hotels, a full-size ice-skating rink, nightclubs and a chapel.

\* On Sept. 19, 1995, The Washington Post publishes a 35,000-word manifesto written by the Unabomber, Theodore Kaczynski. Since the late 1970s, Kaczynski had carried out bombings that killed three people and injured another 23. David Kaczynski realized the writing style was similar to that of his brother, Theodore, and notified the FBI.

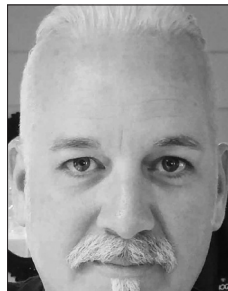

mer, with your warm days and perfect evenings. Your beautiful green trees and sparkling blue rivers. Your mosquitoes and torrential downpours.

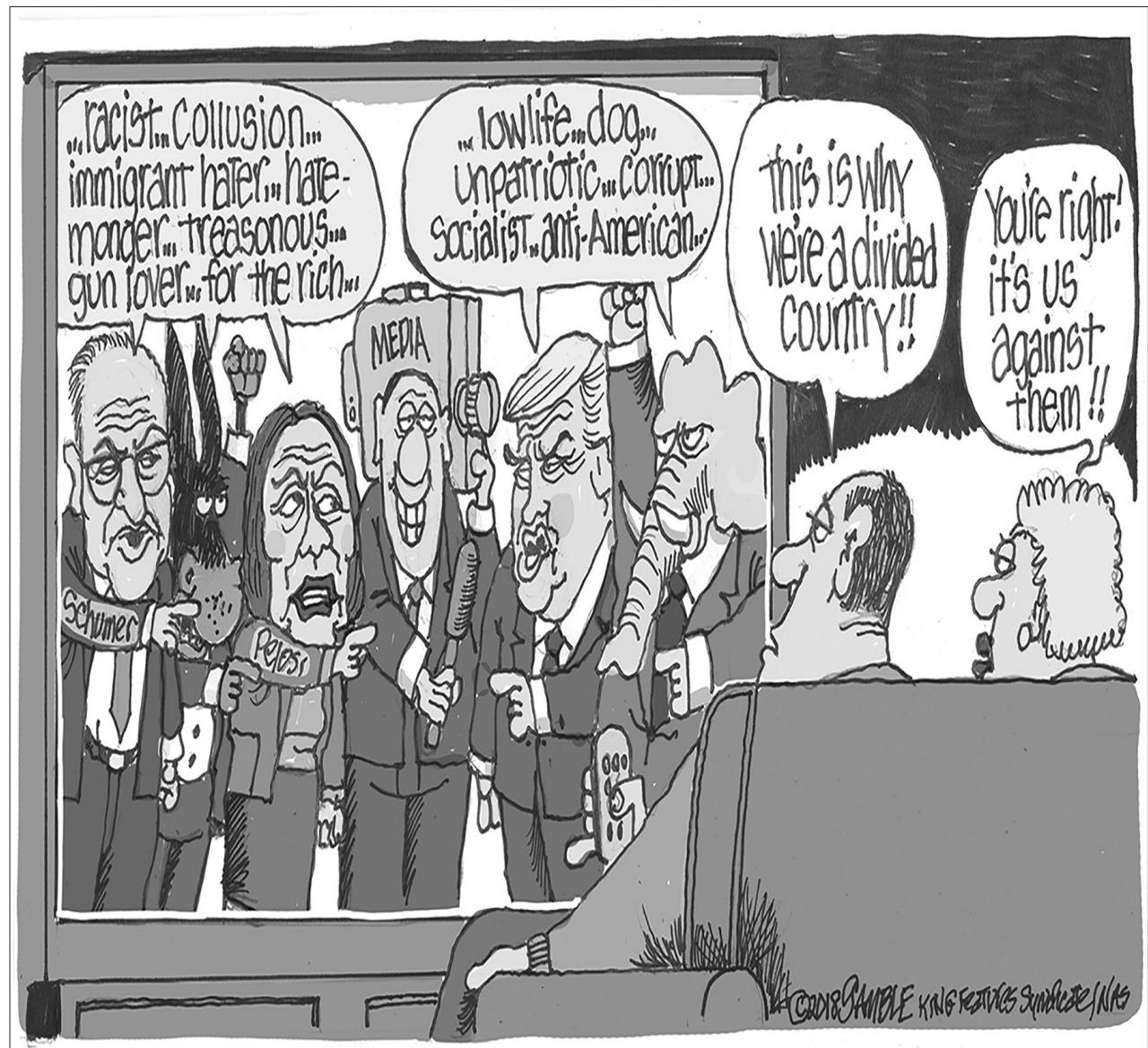

We also need to give a special thank you to the Mount Morris Fire Department who came and helped with our final party. The families enjoyed the water fight and games.

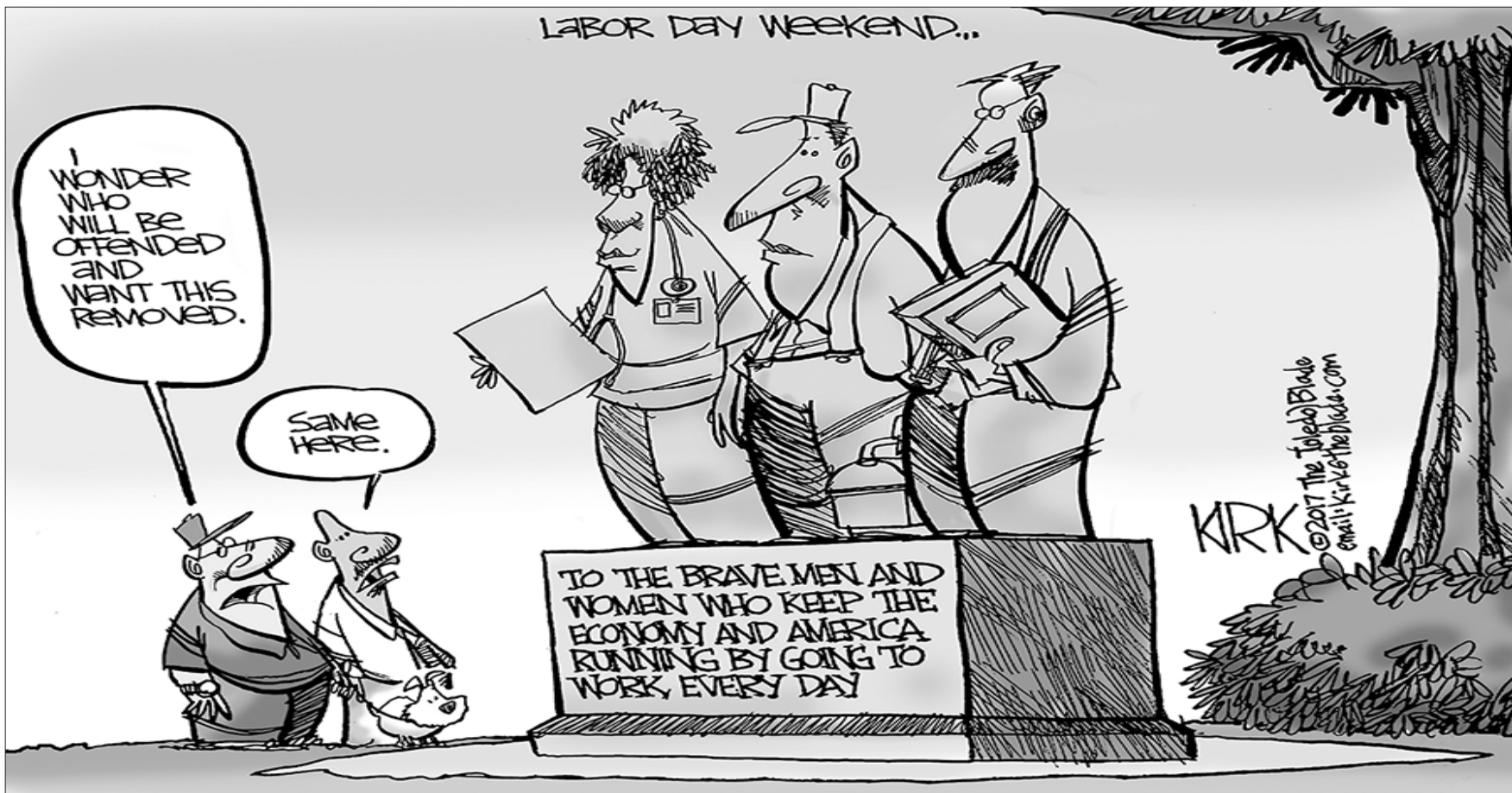

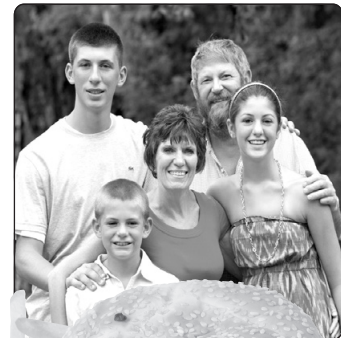



# Busy year for Habitat for Humanity

This year continues to be a whirlwind of activities for Habitat for Humanity of Ogle County as the organization looks ahead to what's in store for 2019.

A little over a year ago Derek and April Price and family donned hard hats and with shovels in hand broke ground on a new home in Rochelle. The family of five moved into their three-bedroom home in May of this year.

HFHOC also rehabilitated a home in Polo and recently completed a Brush with Kindness project for a family in Hillcrest. Vanessa White-Broome, Executive Director, said the organization is grateful for all of the support given; the 2018 projects have benefited three families.

"We would like to express our thanks to all of our donors and supporters," White-Broome said. "Those individuals continue to allow us to carry out our mission in helping those in our community who need decent, affordable housing."

White-Broome explained the Hillcrest project involved tree removal, extensive yard work, new gutters, pressure washing and improvements to a wheelchair ramp.

The organization is looking forward to not only providing more new homes for families, but also assisting homeowners with needed projects.

"In these Brush with Kindness programs we partner with families who own their home but because of circumstances, need assistance in resolving repairs such as roofs and accessibility issues," she said. "We anticipate serving more Ogle County families in 2019 as we utilize lots donated to us in the Rochelle area. We are also very excited to begin identifying more individuals that might benefit from our Brush with Kindness program or who might qualify to become future homeowners."

## Changing lives

Since 2002, HFHOC has built 12 new three-bedroom homes in Mt. Morris, Oregon, Byron, Polo, Forreston and Rochelle as well as investing in the communities with the Brush with Kindness program.

White-Broome said the organization remains committed to helping families with their housing needs. Historically the new home builds have ranged between \$80,000 and \$90,000 and with no-interest loans it gives families the affordability to own their own home.

"Our goal remains serving lower income, working families in order to break the cycle of poverty and poor living conditions. Building strength, stability and self-reliance through homeownership can make a huge difference to families in need," White-Broome said. "Our programs are a 'hands up, not a hand out' and partner mortgage



funds are reinvested to build more homes and assist us in serving more families."

### The foolproof anger management strategy

Anger is a common problem and we all have opportunities to get angry. But when we get hurt and don't deal with our anger, we hang on to it and become bitter, hard-hearted, and miserable.

Living in anger is like banging your head against the wall, so to speak, because it keeps you stuck, doing something that is never going to work. The truth is, giving it to God and trusting Him to be your Vindicator is actually easier than continuing to live with it.

Uncontrolled anger hinders our prayers, makes us miserable, causes mental illness and can even make us physically sick. These are just a few problems anger causes.

The good news is God wants to be our Vindicator (Job 19:25) and we can make the choice to release the offenses to Him and trust Him to make wrong things right. I know it's not easy, and God may not move as quickly as you'd like Him to or do things the way you'd like Him to do them. But He will vindicate you if you will trust Him and do things His way because He doesn't like it when people mistreat His children!

#### Facing My Anger Problem

My dad was an angry person and he was very abusive. When I left home at the age of 18, I thought I would be free of the pain and anger I had experienced most of my life because I was leaving it behind me.

It took a long time for me to realize that although I had left that situation, I actually took the problem with me. It was etched in my soul – in my thinking, my emotions, the way I talked and how I dealt with relationships. So I spent years after that experiencing all kinds of problems, expressing destructive, dysfunctional behaviors that I blamed on everything and everybody else.

Instead of taking responsibility for my anger and the hurt in my soul, I would say things like, "I wouldn't be angry if Dave would pay more attention to me," or "I wouldn't be angry if my boss paid me more to do this job." Whatever my problem was, it was somebody else's fault.

Thank God, I eventually learned that I needed to let Jesus deal with what was going on inside of me so I could experience the freedom He wanted me to have (John 10:10).

#### God's Anger Management Strategy

The best thing we can do when we're struggling with anger is go to God immediately. Don't think about what someone did to you over and over or talk about it repeatedly. Instead, make the choice to give it to God by asking for His help right away.

Ephesians 4:26-27 (NLT) says, "Don't sin by letting anger control you. Don't let the sun go down while you are still angry, for anger gives a foothold to the devil."

I used to think that just having the feeling of anger was wrong, but these verses show us that it's not the emotion itself that is sinful but what we choose to do with it. The *temptation* to act in anger is not sin, and there is great victory when we face it and exercise self-control with the help of the Holy Spirit.

Turn it over to Him instead of trying to defend yourself, get revenge, hate people or hold on to your anger.

You may be thinking, "But Joyce, you don't understand what they did to me. It's so hard to forgive – I just can't do it!" Believe me, I do understand how hard it can be. But God never tells us to do something without giving us the ability to do it, and you CAN release your anger to Him and forgive if you will trust Him to help you.

God's Word has the answers we need to successfully defeat anger. So I want to share several scriptures you can study to help you manage anger God's way:

**Romans 12:21** says, "Don't let evil conquer you, but conquer evil by doing good." When you fight evil with evil, you'll never win, but if you fight evil with good, you will win every time!

**Ecclesiastes 7:9** gives this instruction: "Control your temper, for anger labels you a fool." People who are offended and stay angry become filled with bitterness and resentment, letting the enemy steal the best God has for them.

**James 1:19-20** says, "You must all be quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to get angry. Human anger does not produce the righteousness God desires."

Make a determined decision to do what the Word says, but don't strive to do it in your own strength. Spend time with God, studying scriptures about anger, forgiveness and love. Write down verses that remind you to be slow to get angry and to overcome evil with good. Speak them out loud as declarations of your faith in God to help you. He loves you and has a good plan for you. All things are possible with God (Matthew 19:26) and in Christ, you don't have to live an angry life!

**"Won't You Be My Neighbor"** (PG-13) -- As its subject is the revolutionary but soft-spoken icon of kindness Fred Rogers, it's no surprise that director Morgan Neville's "Won't You Be My Neighbor" (1) is the highest-grossing biographical documentary of all time, and 2) left zero dry eyes in my viewing audience (the DVD really should come fitted with a travel pack of tissues). Through 31 seasons of "Mr. Rogers' Neighborhood" covering a gamut of difficult issues -- race, death, family structure, violence, disability and more -- we came to know a man who modeled empathy, hope, acceptance and, without fail, love for all of us, big and small. This moving portrait is a deeper look into a life of a man whose values are worth emulating and who set an example worth striving for.

**"Adrift"** (PG-13) -- Shailene Woodley and Sam Claflin star in a tale of disaster, resilience and romance set (literally) on the high seas. Tami Oldham (Woodley) and Richard Sharp (Claflin) meet and fall in love in Tahiti, then are booked to sail a yacht from Tahiti to San Diego. Into their path, a category 5 hurricane develops, which they miraculously survive. Since Sharp is physically incapacitated, against all odds and adrift in the middle of nowhere, Oldham must pull it together and save them both. It's inspirational, yes, but

also a horrible nightmare and one more reason that I do not like sailing -- especially considering this Dramamine drama is based on a true story!

**"Hereditary"** (R) -- In his directorial debut, Ari Aster delivers a disconcerting and terrifying story of the burden of familial legacy. Annie (in a luminously deranged performance by Toni Collette) has just lost her distant, secretive mother. Her mental state already degrading, she joins an emotional support group where she meets a fellow mourner, Joan (Ann Dowd), who introduces her to the world of the occult. Annie and her family (Gabriel Byrne, Alex Wolff and a creepily disconnected daughter played by Milly Shapiro) experience a series of terrifying occurrences that unravel them -- immolation or decapitation, anyone? This film is genuinely unnerving and is built for serious deep-horror fans.

**"Ghost Stories"** (NR) -- This lovely little British horror anthology stars Andy Nyman as Professor Goodman, host of a ghost-story-debunking television program. He receives a triptych of case files, meant to effectively scare him supernatural. The mysteries in question involve: a night watchman (Paul Whitehouse) at an abandoned women's asylum; a young man (Alex Lawther) who possibly ran over the devil in the middle of the woods; and a city businessman (Martin Freeman) haunted by



his late wife and their demon child. Scary, yes, and funny too. "The brain sees what it wants to see," says the professor. I see deliciously dark, creepy fun.


