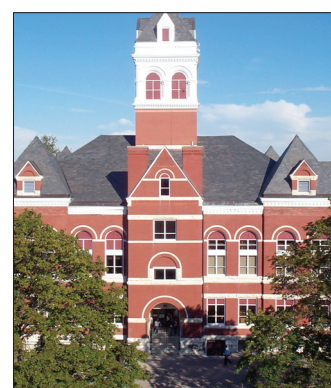

Event will be held on Dec. 1 at Barnacopia

POLO-When it comes to the Angel Ball, Mary Meiners knows how to bring a touch of class and excitement.

Meiners has been the decorator for the event for 18 years. And for the 25th anniversary celebration this year, set for 6:30 p.m. on Dec. 1 at Barnacopia, she went all out.

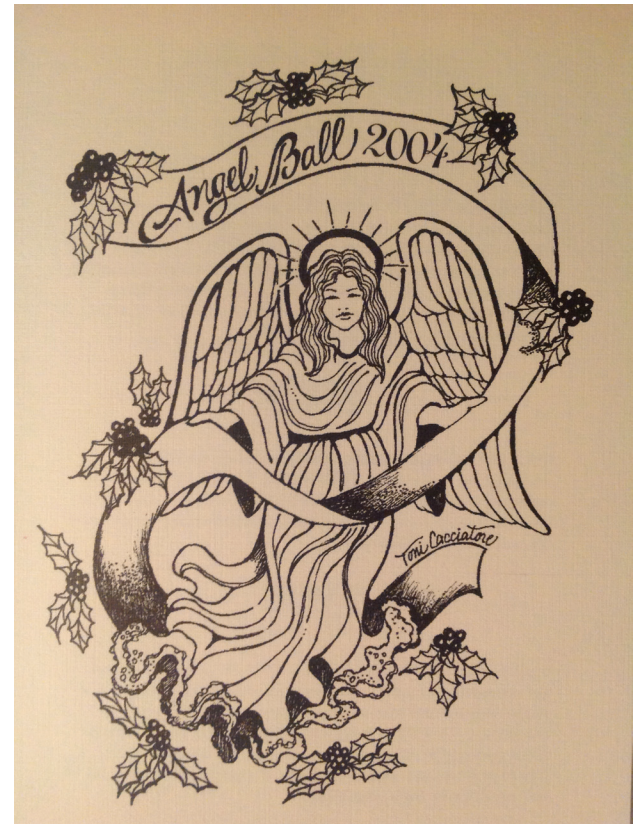



MOMENTS IN TIME

* On Dec. 10, 1915, the one-millionth Model T car rolls off the assembly line at Ford's River Rouge plant in Detroit. Ford would go on to sell more than 15 million Model Ts, and toward the end of their run in 1927, had cut the price to just \$300 (about \$3,700 today).

* On Dec. 14, 1939, the League of Nations, the international peacekeeping organization formed at the end of World War I, expels the Soviet Union in response to its invasion of Finland on Oct. 30.

* On Dec. 15, 1944, legendary bandleader Glenn Miller's aircraft disappears over the English Channel while en route to France. Miller had set aside his music career at its peak in 1942 to serve his country as leader of the USAAF dance band.

* On Dec. 12, 1963, a vinyl LP record, "John Fitzgerald Kennedy: A Memorial Album," sets a record for album sales. Some 4 million copies sold in the first six days of its release. The album included recordings of some of the late president's most memorable speeches.

* On Dec. 16, 1977, "Saturday Night Fever," a movie that ignites the disco dance craze across America -- along with the movie career of its star, John Travolta -- opens in theaters. Travolta earned a Best Actor Oscar nomination for his performance as a 19-year-old dancer Tony Manero.

* On Dec. 11, 1981, Jamaican boxer Trevor Berbick beats former heavyweight champion Muhammad Ali in a unanimous 10-round decision in Nassau, the Bahamas. At the age of 39, Ali (born Cassius Clay) was attempting his second comeback from retirement.

I remember the moment well.

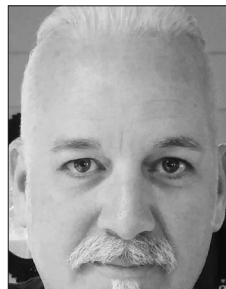

I also played in a band. In fact, this was my big push to make it in the music business. We had a handful of original songs and some huge dreams. We were also all pretty broke. It was often tough to decide whether to spend money on food or on a rehearsal space. Needless to say, I didn't eat much.

It happened one night while we were rehearsing. There was another band rehearsing in a nearby room in the same building and we stopped in to hear them play a song. Their guitar player was 17 years old and as confident as anyone I had ever met. And once he started playing, it was clear to me that this kid was incredible. He could play things I could not dream

of playing. He technique was spectacular. I was truly blown away.

I also realized right then and there that I would never be as technically good as this kid. I had been playing much longer than him, but he had lapped me long ago.

He would probably go on to get the gig I never could. There is no participation medal in real life.

It was a lesson in reality and one that I probably needed at the time. I had to

make an adjustment that day -- an adjustment to the way I thought; an adjustment to my goals. Ultimately, it made me a better player, songwriter and musician. It turned out being severely out-played by a teenager is just what I needed.

Did it hurt my ego? Sure, some. But reality is reality.

That also eventually led me to college and a career. That one moment was an important one in my life, and I was thankfully smart enough to recognize it for what it was.

We all have moments in our life that can be jarring. Getting smacked upside the noggin by reality tends to be a bit brutal. But if you take the lesson that it is trying to teach you, it can work out for the best.

This is a reason I don't like T-ball, as I have said in this space before. Everyone bats, no score is kept and honestly, no lessons are learned. Losing now can help you win later. That is

a very important lesson we can't deprive our kids of experiencing.

Look, there is nothing wrong with adjusting expectations. There is nothing wrong with staring reality right in the face and acknowledging it. I am not talking about giving up or accepting less.

I am talking about being realistic.

You have heard the term, "get real." Sadly, some never do. Yes, the world needs dreamers, and I still put myself in that category. But we also need people who get things done. You can be both.

If you want to be an astronaut, but hate science, then you need to adjust your goal. If you want to be a professional singer, but couldn't carry a tune in a dump truck, it might be time to go to Plan B.

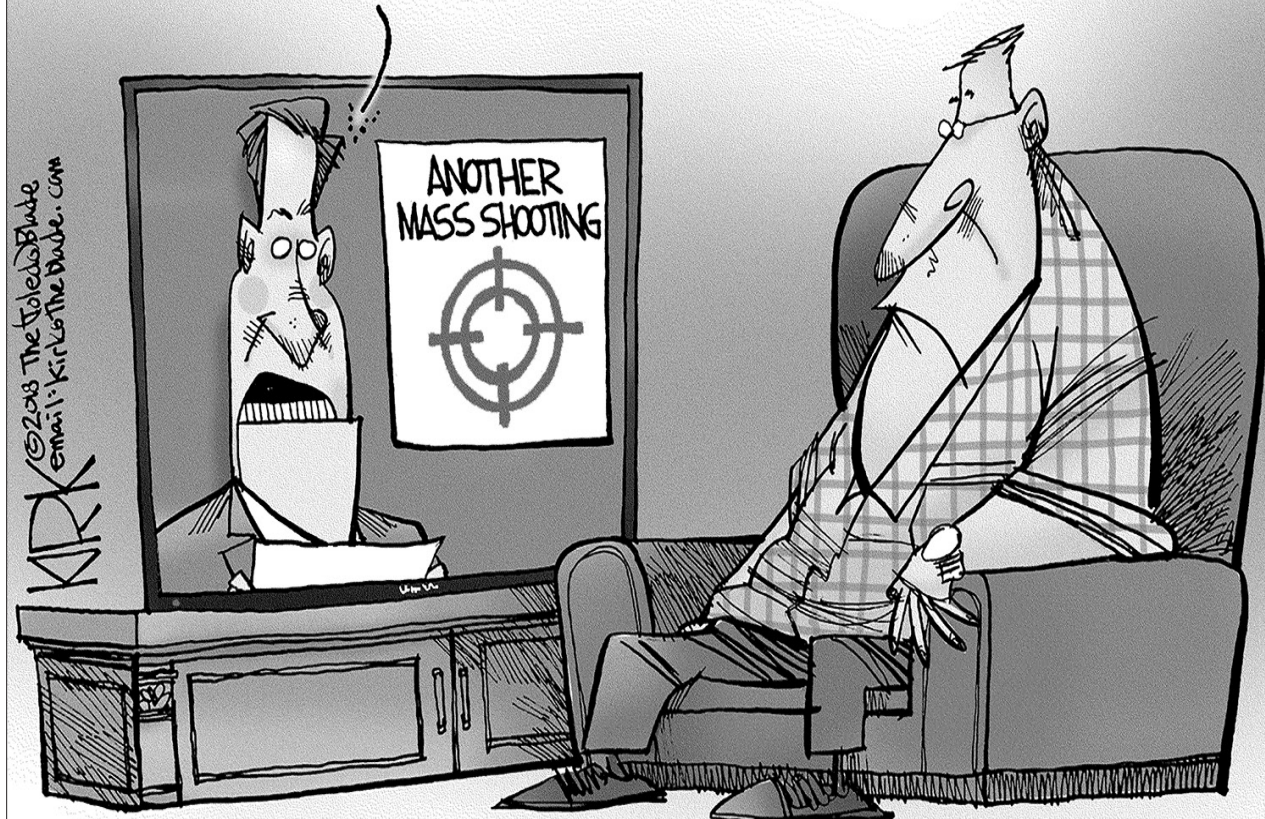
Keep dreaming, but with your feet planted on the ground.

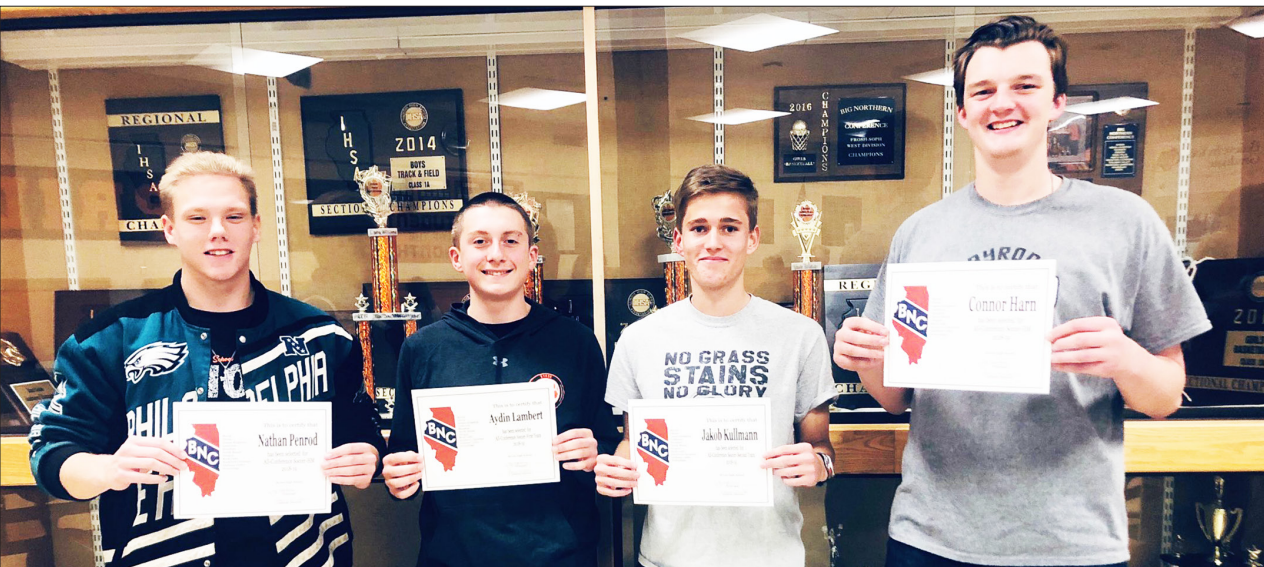

Don't waste your pain

Life can be hard, and we all get hurt at times by someone or something that happens to us. But there is good news if you are a believer in Christ Jesus: God is the Healer, and He can heal us everywhere we hurt!

I'm so passionate about this message because I know it's true from personal experience. I was sexually abused by my dad and other men throughout my childhood, and as an adult I went through years battling migraine headaches and also had breast cancer at one time. So I know what it's like to hurt so badly you don't think you can go on another minute, and I know how amazing it can be to experience healing and restoration through Christ.

The key to going through the healing process—letting go of the past and moving on—is committing yourself to do things God's way, trusting Him and obeying His Word. It's not always easy...it takes time and means you're going to have to do some things you'd rather not do...things you think are unfair or that don't feel good.

But when you realize that God really is smarter than you and He will give you the ability to do everything He shows you to do, then you can experience His power in your life!

The Reason We Get Stuck in Our Pain

One of the things God asks of us is that we forgive everyone who has hurt us and trust Him to be our vindicator. Before I came to this revelation, I wasted many years being angry, bitter and resentful of the abuse I'd endured while I was growing up. And it affected every part of my life: my mindset, attitudes, ability to get along with others, and all of my relationships. I was miserable and believed that everyone had a problem but me!

When God showed me in John 10:10 that Jesus came so I could have a good life that I actually enjoyed, I became determined to have it, no matter what I had to do to get it. In Mark 11:24-25 (NLT) Jesus says, "I tell you, you can pray for anything, and if you believe that you've received it, it will be yours. But when you are praying, first forgive anyone you are holding a grudge against, so that your Father in heaven will forgive your sins, too."

Jesus is saying that whenever I'm praying, if I am harboring unforgiveness in my heart, then God cannot answer my prayer. There have been times when I've prayed for God to change my husband, Dave, or our kids or someone who was upsetting me, and what I needed to do was pray for Him to forgive my sin, ask Him to help me forgive the ones who had hurt me, and choose to love them.

We have to learn to love people right where they are, the way they are, because that is how we can help them get to where they need to be. Now, I'm not suggesting that you let people abuse you or continually take advantage of you, but you can't live with bitterness in your heart and experience the healing and restoration that you desperately need.

The Why Behind the What

It helps us forgive others when we understand that hurting people hurt people. In other words, when someone is wounded, they often end up wounding others if they don't get healing in their soul. Many times when people hurt us, they are acting out of their own pain and may not even realize what they are doing.

A long time after I left home and escaped that abusive situation, I came to see that my dad had done those things to me because of the way he had been raised. He grew up in a family that practiced incest and it caused him to behave like that in our home. He knew it wasn't right, but I really believe that he didn't understand how badly he was hurting me all those years that he abused me.

Understanding this about my father helped me forgive him, and I actually felt sorry for him. He led such a miserable life and at the end, he had more regrets than anything else to speak of. Thankfully, he accepted Christ as his Savior when he was 83, but it's sad that so much of his life was wasted because of his pain from the past.

If you've been hurting for a long, long time because of something that's happened in your past and you've refused to lay it down, I hope you'll see that there's a much better way to live. Don't settle for a life of misery due to bitterness and unforgiveness. Instead, make a determined decision to trust God and do things HIS way.

Remember: God is smarter than you and whatever He tells you to do, He has your best interest at heart. Trust Him and forgive!



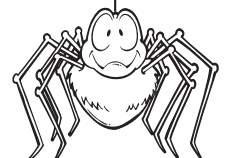

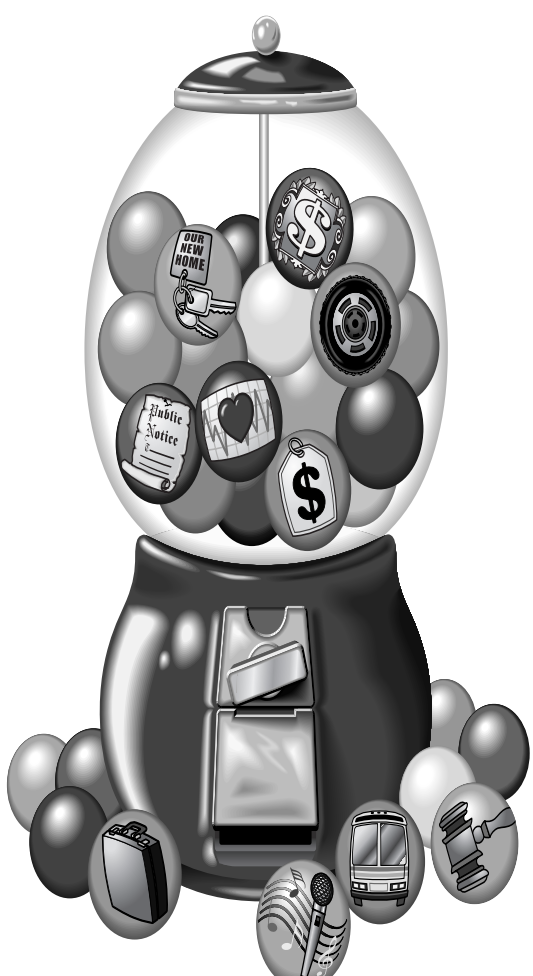
