# Passerby alerts family that house is on fire

A passerby alerted a family that their house was on fire early Thursday morning.

Two people, and their pets, were able to escape the burning house, located west of Chana Road on IL Route 64, said Oregon Fire Chief Michael Knoup.

Knoup said his department got the call at 1:28 a.m. Thursday, and was the first on the scene. He said the outside front corner of the house was on fire and flames could be seen inside the home as well.

While the exact cause is under investigation, Knoup

said it appears to have been electrical. He said the home suffered "at least" \$50,000 in damage, as there is smoke damage throughout the structure.

The two-alarm fire included departments from Mount Morris, Stillman Valley, Rochelle, Byron, Franklin Grove, Lynn-Scott-Rock, Flagg Center and Ashton.

"I think the crew did an excellent job getting a stop on it," Knoup said, adding that in another five minutes it would have been, "a fully engulfed house fire."

## Sheriff releases holiday enforcement numbers

The Ogle County Sheriff's Office conducted traffic enforcement from Nov. 16-26, reminding motorists to buckle up and not drive impaired, day or night, as part of the nationwide Click It or Ticket/Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over enforcement effort.

The Sheriff's Office joined other state and local law enforcement agencies across Illinois to reduce highway deaths by issuing citations to unbuckled motorists and arresting impaired drivers.

During the 10-day mobilization, Deputies issued 122 citations including:

- \* 51 speeding citations
- \* 11 uninsured motorists
- \* 7 seat belt citations
- \* 6 suspended/revoked license arrests
- \* 6 Distracted driving (cell phone) citations
- \* 3 DUI arrests
- \* 1 felony arrests
- \* 30 Traffic Offense Citations (no turn signal, expired registration, etc.)

As a part of the enforcement period, Deputies logged 28 hours of additional traffic patrol which was funded by a grant received from IDOT. Of the above citations, 28

citations were issued during the extra patrol time.

The annual campaign may be over in Ogle County, but that isn't an excuse to stop buckling up. Not wearing your seat belt is a primary offense, meaning law enforcement can stop you and issue a citation for that alone. All vehicle occupants, regardless of seating position, are required to wear a properly adjusted seat belt.

The Click It or Ticket/Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over enforcement effort is funded with federal highway safety funds administered by the Illinois Department of Transportation.

Arriving at Leader Dog you will see their brand new remodeled facility and be welcomed by several differ-

ent people. We will receive a tour of the facility and see all the puppies! You will get to see where the dogs are cared for in their veterinary clinic, their breeding area, and also where the recipients stay while being accustomed and trained with their Leader Dog. There will also be some free time to look around and visit their Leader Dog store.

You will hear from several of the staff that work there as well as meet and hear from some puppy raisers and also a person with a Leader Dog. Lunch will be provided at Leader Dog and we will leave midafternoon. We will stop at Bob Evans in Battle Creek for dinner Friday evening and arrive back in Leaf River around 10 p.m.

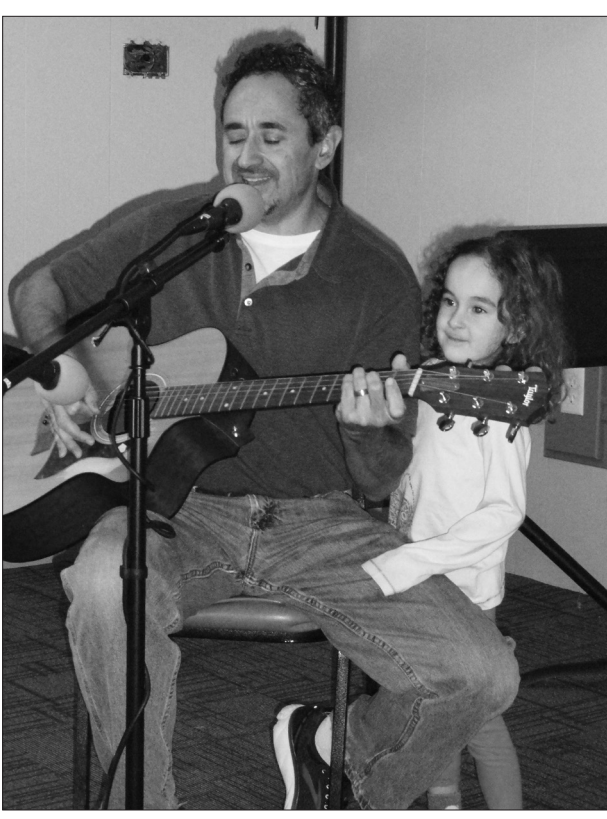

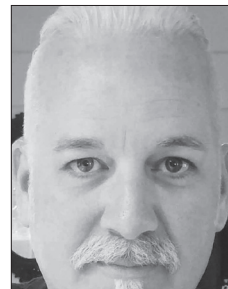
Of course, I - like all of you - choose to live in this part of the country, so I know what to expect. Winter might not be my favorite season, but I muddle through.

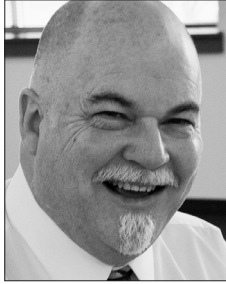
## Holiday giving starts at the Kitchen Table Community Cafe

stations, local newspapers and radio stations and, soon, Northwest Quarterly. We have been recognized by the Ogle County Health Department as safe food handlers, local food suppliers distribute food overages to the hungry through us, and all the other governmental bodies (both State and local) who assure we operate the Kitchen Table at Rochelle in accordance appropriate to our IRS 501 (c)(3) non-profit status. We are all-volunteer and the money taken in all goes to pay for things like property taxes, utilities, building maintenance and upkeep, and of course, food we have to buy that is not

donated.

Rockford Urban Ministries paid us a visit and indicated their desire to replicate our, "One World Everybody Eats" cafe model somewhere up in Rockford. Rockford's new Mayor, Tom McNamara, has indicated he will soon be visiting the Kitchen Table with his wife and children as he wants to see and learn about our community cafe model! These are truly exciting times for the Kitchen Table!

So why do we do it?

Speaking for myself, as a teacher in 2013 when I first met Carolyn and Grant Brown (the founders) of the Kitchen Table, I was already

keenly aware that one in four Illinois children often go hungry. In a State and Nation as rich as ours, this should not be happening! Large food retailers often have to throw out mass amounts of food just before expiration dates are reached. Many of them would rather not waste food in this fashion. The trick is to connect the dots, so to speak, such that we match food overproduction with outlets like the Kitchen Table looking to alleviate local hunger. Carolyn and Grant did not need to do much persuasion to get me to come on board with them.

The Kitchen Table at Rochelle gives everyone a

## Solar zoning process can still move forward

Dear Editor,

I am writing in response to the recently published letter, from the group of concerned citizens in the Stillman Valley area, in regards to the solar development issue in Ogle County. I believe their opinion skews the truth.

Zoning can at times be a very complex topic. Many times individuals or groups confuse the zoning process because they do not understand it, or they do not realize the authority granted to various entities involved in the decision-making process.

Zoning is allowed in Ogle County, or any other county, because it is statutorily allowed by State of Illinois Law. The County can choose to have or not have zoning. There are over thirty counties in Illinois who have chosen not to enact zoning laws.

Statutorily the State of Illinois also allows for local governments i.e. counties, municipalities and townships to form planning commissions. These planning commissions are allowed to act in an advisory role, but do not possess any statutory authority to make zoning decisions. They may have input into zoning decisions, but do not have authority to decide their outcome.

So even though the Ogle County Regional Planning Commission has decided not to consider applications for solar array development it does not preclude the zoning process from moving forward.

By State of Illinois Law all zoning matters changing land use are required to go to a public hearing. In the case of Ogle County

that hearing is conducted by the County Zoning Board of Appeals. Once the hearing is completed their findings for or against the request are submitted to the full County Board for consideration. This is the law!

The public hearing is held because of two reasons: It allows the public to voice their concerns and present evidence concerning the zoning change; and it allows for the applicant making the request to have access to due process of the law. You cannot legally disregard either.

Just because the Ogle County Regional Planning Commission decides not to consider a zoning request does not remove the statutory requirement for a public hearing. Once the request begins the process it is entitled to the public hearing. This is why in Ogle County these requests continue to be submitted to the Zoning Board of Appeals. It is required by the law.

In closing I found it petty and petulant that this group of concerned citizens referenced earlier, took it upon themselves to disparage the integrity of Ogle County Zoning Administrator Mike Reibel. I have had to opportunity many times over the past two decades to counsel with Mr. Reibel on zoning issues in Ogle County. He has always represented himself and the county with knowledge, dignity, integrity and professionalism. You may not always agree with him or the zoning code, but he represents it fairly and accurately. He did not deserve this disparagement.

# Legal Issues in the News

## Postnuptial Agreements: Keeping the Romance Alive!

Many people are familiar with the concept of a prenuptial agreement. It is a premarital agreement entered into by a couple to determine ownership of assets and other financial obligations if the marriage were to fail. But did you know that there is such a thing as a “postnuptial” agreement? As the name implies, it is a post-marital agreement entered into by a couple to determine and establish their respective financial rights and obligations if the marriage were to fail. Some states do not recognize this sort of agreement, while others have very strict limitations on what the agreement can govern or how it is entered into. Illinois allows such agreements if they meet the basic requirements of contract law. However, contractual defenses such as fraud, coercion, or duress may be used to invalidate such an agreement.

In Illinois, a postnuptial agreement allows the married couple to modify the definition of marital property to exclude certain items. A couple may decide to do this for many reasons. A spouse may be starting a new business and want to protect his or her business if a divorce were to occur. He or she may make a significant non-marital contribution to a down payment on a house and want to ensure they receive their contribution back if the parties were to divorce. It is important to note that a postnuptial agreement may only deal with financial issues. Issues regarding children cannot be agreed upon through a postnuptial agreement. This includes parenting time, allocation of parental responsibilities, child support, and child-rearing expenses. Additionally, before a postnuptial agreement becomes valid, Illinois law requires a full disclosure of assets and liabilities of each spouse.

## Same-Sex Parenting Rights

Same-sex marriage has been legally recognized in the State of Illinois since June 1, 2014, and became legal at the federal level on June 26, 2015. However, custody and visitation rules for same-sex couples with children vary from state to state.

Our 2nd District Illinois Appellate Court recently affirmed the decision of Winnebago County Family Court Judge Joseph Bruce, who ruled that a local non-biological mother of a child born through artificial insemination has parental rights. In 2009, two women married in Iowa and purchased a house together in Rockford, Illinois. Several years later, the two of them decided that they would try to conceive a child through artificial insemination. Seven months after the birth of the child, the couple separated, and eventually divorced. Judge Bruce ruled that the non-biological mother was legally a parent of the child, even though she did not carry the child. The decision was appealed, and the 2nd District Illinois

Appellate Court affirmed the trial court’s ruling based in part on the standards set forth in the following cases.

In 2003, the Illinois Supreme Court ruled that an unmarried adult who consented to artificial insemination has parental rights. In re Parentage of M.J., 203 Ill. 2d 526 (2003). The Court reasoned that if an unmarried man who unintentionally impregnates a woman is legally obligated to support the child, then the same rule should apply to parents who intentionally conceive a child through artificial insemination. This ruling was later extended to same-sex couples when an Illinois Appellate Court held that if a nonbiological parent acted in such a way that demonstrated actual consent to the artificial insemination procedure and was actively involved in the child’s life, then he or she has parental rights to the child. The Court further stated that denying a nonbiological parent their parental rights would deny the child his or her right to the physical, mental, and emotional support of two parents. In re T.P.S., 978 N.E.2d 1070 (5th Dist. 2012).

Regardless of your stance on the issue, one thing is undeniably true: the expansion of the rights of same-sex couples adds variables which further complicate existing laws that were not written with current social “norms” in mind.

Spousal Maintenance

On June 19, 2018, Senate Bill 2289 was sent to Governor Bruce Rauner that would amend how spousal maintenance is calculated. The bill is a response to the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017 that eliminated the spousal maintenance deduction. The elimination of the deduction applies to any divorce decrees entered after January 1, 2019. Currently, spousal maintenance is calculated by taking 30% of the payor’s gross monthly income and subtracting 20% of the payee’s gross monthly income. The monthly award is capped at 40% of the couples combined gross monthly income. If Governor Bruce Rauner signs Senate Bill 2289, the calculation will change to 33.3% of the payor’s annual net income, minus 25% of the payee’s annual net income. The change in calculation would only be effective for orders entered after January 1, 2019. In addition to the calculation change, Senate Bill 2289 would require the court to consider the tax consequences to each party when considering a maintenance award. The Senate Bill passed 52-00 on April 24, 2018.

**CHAMPAIGN** — The Forreston varsity football team completed its third state championship run in five seasons this past weekend. The Cardinals overwhelmed Camp Point Central throughout the Class 1A Championship, leading 30-0 at halftime and forcing a running clock in the fourth quarter before ending the game with a 44-6 victory. Forreston (12-2) also won state titles in 2016 and 2014.

"This team truly embodies everything that it means to be a team," head coach Kyle Zick said. "They came together and played with a passion that was amazing to watch and I'm blessed to be along for the ride."

Forreston outgained Camp Point Central 404-226 in total offense this past Friday, and every single Cardinal yard came from the ground game. Evan Kelsey led Forreston with

148 rushing yards on 17 carries while Garrett Badertscher totaled 96 rushing yards on 16 carries.

Forreston took an early lead on Kelsey's 23-yard rushing touchdown, and the Cardinals build their advantage up with touchdowns by Kelsey (14-yard rush) and Ethan Mulder (1-yard run) and two 2-point conversions.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE COMBINED ANNUAL BUDGET AND APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE 18-1 FOR THE BYRON MUSEUM DISTRICT, OGLE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2018 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2019.

WHEREAS, Section 20 of the Illinois Museum District Act (70 ILCS 1105/20 et. seq.) requires the Byron Museum District (the "District") to adopt, within the first quarter of each fiscal year, a combined annual budget and appropriation ordinance as provided in the Illinois Municipal Budget Law (50 ILCS 330/1 et. seq.); and WHEREAS, on September 25, 2018, the Board of Commissioners of the Byron Museum District (the "Board of Commissioners") adopted Ordinance No. 18-1, the Combined Annual Budget and Appropriation Ordinance for fiscal year 2018-2019; and WHEREAS, Section 3 of the Municipal Budget Law, 50 ILCS 330/3 et. seq., authorizes public bodies to amend the budget and appropriation ordinance from time to time by following the same procedures as required for the original adoption of a budget and appropriation ordinance; and WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners has determined it to be necessary to amend the Budget of the District for fiscal year 2018-2019; and WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 18-3 does not change the appropriation amount set forth in Ordinance No. 18-1, and further complies with the Truth in Taxation law (35 ILCS 200/18-55).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF BYRON MUSEUM DISTRICT, OGLE COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

Certified copies of this ordinance shall be made available to the public for inspection. This ordinance shall take effect ten (10) days after being so published.

SECTION 5. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval and publication as required by law.

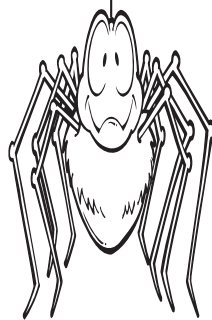

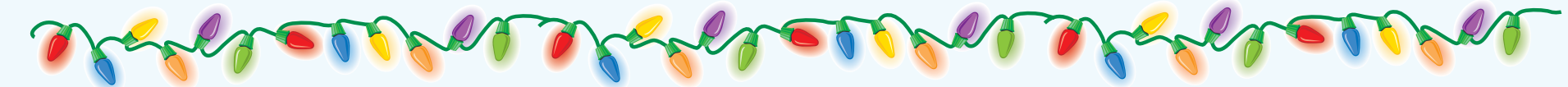
