

County releases voting information

OREGON - For the April 2, 2019 Consolidated Election, Ogle County, Ogle County Clerk, Laura J. Cook announces that her office complies with the Federal Voting Accessibility for the Elderly and Handicapped Act.

Temporarily physically incapacitated voters who find it difficult or nearly impossible to go to the polls on Election Day may now ask for a Vote by Mail ballot without having the signature from their physician, as long as they contact the office of the County Clerk and ask for an application. You can Early Vote in person at the County Clerk's Office, or request a Vote by Mail ballot and

we will send an application to be filled out and on return of that application, we will then send out the

You can download an Application by visiting the Ogle County Official website at www.oglecounty.org by going to the "I Want To" tab, select "Application for Vote by Mail Ballot."

This application must be filled out and mailed or hand delivered to the County Clerk's Office, who will then mail the Vote by Mail ballot to the voter. After voting the Vote by Mail ballot it must be mailed or hand delivered back to the County Clerk's Office, so it can be counted on Election Day.

The Ogle County Courthouse is accessible to the handicapped for voter registration. We will send a deputy registrar to the residence of any person who wishes to register to vote and is unable to go to a registrar. For information on this service, please call the County Clerk's Office at 815-732-1110.

The last day to register to vote or change your address is March 5, 2109, (with the exception of grace period voter registration and transfer of registration beginning March 6, 2019 and ending April 2, 2019, in the office of the Ogle County Clerk.)

Early Voting will be conducted at the Ogle County Clerk's Office located at the Ogle County Courthouse, 105 S. 5th Street, Oregon, Feb. 21,2019 through April 1,2019, for all Ogle County Precincts.

Early Voting will be conducted at the Flagg Township Building located at 303 W.Rt.38 in Rochelle March 27,2019 through March 29, 2019 from 9 a.m.-4 p.m. and March 30, 2019 from 9 a.m.-noon, for Flagg and Dement Precincts, only.

The first day to apply for a Vote by Mail ballot for the April 2, 2019, Consolidated Election is Jan. 2, 2019.

The first day to mail a Vote by Mail ballot is Feb. 21, 2019 with the last day for mailing a ballot from the County Clerk's Office is March 28, 2019. Early voting in person at the County Clerk's Office may be done through April 1, 2019, until 4:30 p.m.

If there are any voters in Ogle County who cannot get into the polling place, we can send two Judges of Election within 50 feet of the polling place with the ballot.

A request should be made prior to the Election on a form provided by the County Clerk's Office. If we can assist you in any way, within the law, please let



County offers recycling grants

OREGON – The Ogle County Solid Waste Management Department (OC-SWMD) is announcing that limited funds are again available for Waste Reduction/Recycling Grants for the 2019 fiscal year.

The grants of up to \$2,000 are available to Ogle County businesses, schools, churches and non-profit organizations wishing to establish or improve on waste reduction and recycling programs and services. Applicants must provide a minimum 20 percent match of the total project cost.

Total grant funds available this year are limited to \$6,000, so grants will be awarded on a competitive basis in amounts from \$100-\$2,000, in three rounds or until funds are depleted. The deadline for submittal of applications for the first round of grants is 4 p.m. Thursday, March 7, 2019.

The application for the grants is simple and flexible. Businesses could use grant funds to help purchase waste reduction and recycling materials and equipment such as collection bins, carts, balers and storage containers. Equipment needed to switch from disposable packaging to reusable packaging for products and supplies could

also be considered. Businesses are encouraged to consider projects to reduce food waste or implement food waste recycling pro-

Schools may seek funds for special projects that will further a student's understanding of how to reduce the amount of trash sent to the landfill. The requests may be for materials and equipment, such as recycling bins/ carts, videos, books, worm (vermicomposting) bins, composters, or other waste reduction equipment.

Municipalities seeking to improve commercial, curbside, or multifamily recycling programs are encouraged to apply. Grant applications for equipment and materials needed to improve electronics recycling options in Ogle County are also encouraged since most electronics have been banned from landfills since January of 2012.

These examples are not all inclusive and applicants are encouraged to find innovative ways to reduce waste and increase what is recycled. The grants may not be used to pay for ongoing expenses such as staffing, collection, and hauling costs. Priority will be given to new applicants.

All applications will be reviewed by the Ogle County Solid Waste Management Department and the Ogle County Board Solid Waste Committee. Grants will be evaluated based on the following criteria: management ability; project quality; project impact; realistic goals & expectations; accuracy of application; education potential; use of recycled content products when available; potential for waste stream diversion; and future continuity of project.

In 2017, Ogle County residents, businesses and other entities recycled approximately 31 percent of the municipal waste generated in the County. This recycling rate is due to the efforts of many individuals doing their part to reduce waste and recycle as much as possible at home, work and school. The OCSWMD urges businesses and other organizations to strive to find new ways to reduce waste and increase what gets recycled in the County. These grants can help make that possible.







Nearly all of the wealthiest democracies of the world, members of the OECD (Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development), charge slightly higher taxes than the US and provide more social services (Canada, Australia, Germany, France, Switzerland, Japan, etc.). The Scandinavian countries are usually thought of as providing the greatest amount of services.

Brian Stewart, newly elected Illinois State Senator, sites articles that claim Denmark's citizens are "boring, average, helpless, hopeless, and mediocre!" (Freeport "Journal-Standard") Here are some statistics on the Scandinavian countries and

the US: (These statistics vary slightly from year to year.)

Income Equality (35 OECD Nations) – Denmark 7th, U.S. 31st. 49 percent of people worth 50 million or more live in the US. The top 0.1 percent owns as much as the bottom 90 percent. (World Wealth& Income Database).

Trade Balance – Denmark +2.86, U.S. 4.43.

Debt – Denmark 36.1 percent of GDP, U.S. 107.17 percent.

Homicides per 100K – Denmark .99, U.S. 4.88.

Life Expectancy – Denmark 80.9 yrs., U.S. 78.69 (CIA ranks the US 50th among

nations in longevity).

Health Expenditures – Denmark 16.8 percent of GDP, US 21.3 percent.

Citizens Lacking Health Insurance – Denmark 0 percent, U.S. 10.4 percent.

Top Tax Rate – Denmark 55.8 percent, U.S. 48.6 percent.


Economics Intelligence Unit (EIU) Rating of Democracies – Norway 1st, Sweden 3rd, Denmark 5th, U.S. 21st (US dropped from a full democracy to a flawed democracy).

PISA test scores for HS students in Math, Science, & Reading – Denmark ranked 15th, 18th & 19th respectively; U.S. – 29th, 17th & 20th among OECD nations.

OECD Happiness Factor (Quality of Life) – Finland 1st, Denmark 3rd, Sweden 9th, U.S. 19th.

Denmark and other Scandinavian countries don't seem quite as "hopeless and mediocre" when the facts are known. Debates over how much government should tax and how many services it should provide involve some of the most important decisions of our time. Those decisions look very different to someone living in a "mansion on a hill-top" than to someone who earns minimum wage and has no benefits, including health insurance.



Together, they teach classes and workshops, answer telephone inquiries concerning home horticulture, guide planting and educational demonstrations in community and school gardens, represent the program at the county and state fair, and work with many community organizations to convey up-to-date, research based gardening information.

To become a Master Gardener, you must apply and be accepted into your local county Extension program. Upon acceptance in your county, you then take the Master Gardener Core Training. After completing the core course, Master Gardeners Interns are required to volunteer a

minimum of 60 hours over two years in their county. Certified Master Gardeners are those who have completed their classroom training and internship. To remain an active Master Gardener, you must complete 10 hours of continuing education and 30 hours of volunteer service yearly.

Ogle County will be having an in-person training this spring, and is now accepting applications. Submitted applications will be reviewed and interviews will be set up with Extension staff. Applicants must complete an application, interview, and screening.

The Master Gardener training for 2019 will be offered Thursdays, starting March 28 and running through May 30, from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. at the Ogle County Extension office located in the Farm Bureau building, at 421 W. Pines Rd, Oregon, Illinois 61061.

In-person training costs \$260 and includes the Master Gardener manual with helpful resources and other materials.



At the January 2018 event, they registered 110 people and collected 103 units. Our little Community came Very Close to surpassing these results.

Because Key Club volunteers exclusively with Rock River Valley Blood Center, we are 'rewarded' through their Scholarship Appreciation Program. We earn college scholarships for graduating seniors, based on the units collected. From the two blood drives Key Club hosted during the 2017-2018 school year, we 'earned' a \$300 and \$400 scholarship.

At the February 2018 drive, we were seven Donors away from a \$500 scholarship. Because this is a Community Drive, all seniors at Byron and Stillman Valley high schools are eligible to apply.

What it really means to 'live by faith'

Life in Christ is absolutely amazing when you learn to live by faith. And Romans 1:17 says that those who are believers in Him "shall live by faith" (NKJV). It's the key to really experiencing the abundant life Jesus died to give us (John 10:10)l.

The question is, how do we live by faith? What does it look like, practically speaking, to release, or use, our faith in our everyday lives?

Learning from Lazarus' Story

In John chapter 11, we read about the time when Jesus raised His friend Lazarus from the dead. Lazarus and his sisters, Martha and Mary, were good friends to Jesus, and He'd had been to their home multiple times.

But when Lazarus was sick and his sisters sent word to Him saying "he whom You love is sick" (John 11:3), Jesus didn't come right away to heal Him. His immediate response was, "This sickness is not unto death, but for the glory of God, that the Son of God may be glorified through it" (v. 4).

Jesus wanted them to trust Him and believe that no matter how bad the situation was. He could still do something to make it right. But that's not the reaction He received.

The Bible says that Jesus was deeply disquieted when He approached Lazarus' tomb (John 11:38 AMPC). He was visibly disturbed. And Martha, Lazarus' sister, came out to meet Him and said, "Lord, if You had been here, my brother would not have died." Think for a moment how Jesus must have felt. He knows what has happened and has

come to fix the problem, but no one really understands what He's capable of doing. He's surrounded by unbelief. And in the midst of the confusion, Jesus says to the people, "Take away the stone."

It's interesting that Jesus was getting ready to raise a man from the dead but He told

It's interesting that Jesus was getting ready to raise a man from the dead but He told them to roll away the stone. He wanted to see their faith in Him through their obedience.

Faith That Speaks Louder Than Words

Romans 12:3 says God "has dealt to each one a measure of faith." So you have faith... but are you using it? It's so important for us to use our faith because that's how we grow stronger in our relationship with God and trust Him more in every situation in our lives. Hebrews 11:6 (NKJV) says, "Without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who

comes to God must believe that His is, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him." God rewards our faith when He sees it in action.

Using your faith simply means that you do what you can do—what God shows you to do—and you trust Him to do what you cannot do. For example, if you're praying for your spouse to become a believer in Christ, then don't go to lunch with your friends and complain about how he or she will never change.

When you release your faith, you take some kind of action that shows you believe God will do what He says He will do. You line up your attitudes and actions with God's promises for you, according to His Word, and hold on to those truths when life gets tough. That's what Jesus was asking the people to do when He told them to roll away the stone from Lazarus' grave.

It's Not Too Hard

So many times when God asks us to do something for Him, we look at the situation and say, "There's no way I can ever do that. It's just too hard!"

Maybe you need to forgive people who have hurt you. Maybe you're asking God for a new house and He's telling you to clean up the one you've got. Maybe you're facing a mountain of debt, yet you're still using credit cards everywhere you go.

When challenges are greater than our ability to resolve them on our own, we often say things like, "I can't do it, God. It's just too hard." But that's a lie the devil wants you to believe.

The truth is, God is never going to ask you to do something without giving you the ability to do it. Whatever the direction is, He'll give you the strength, understanding, support, resources—anything you need—to do your part when you simply step out in obedience to follow His lead.

In these times, remember Philippians 4:13, which says, "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." In other words, you can do whatever you need to do in life through Christ. You can roll away the stone that stands between you and your miracle!





"The Nutcracker and the Four Realms" (PG-13) -- At Christmas, a spirited young woman named Clara (Mackenzie Foy) receives an enigmatic gift from her late mother. The key to this gift is presented by her godfather (Morgan Freeman), who sends her on a quest across a fantastic land where she must battle as queen for the Fourth Realm against the Mouse King and the plucky and terrifying Mother Ginger (Helen Mirren). Delightful and fanciful but moderately hard to follow, the whole thing is a little too over-the-top, including Keira Knightly as an aggressively flighty Sugar Plum Fairy. But we loved relative unknown Jayden Fowora-Knight as the steadfast Nutcracker soldier Phillip.

"Boy Erased" (R) -- Nicole Kidman and Russell Crowe play small-town, religious parents whose world is rocked by the admission that their seemingly normal son (Lucas Hedges) is gay. The preacher and his wife send the boy to a Christian conversion camp, where he is to be reprogrammed

out of his wayward feelings. It's tragically hard to be a loving parent whose values are at odds with your child's sexuality. It's tragically hard to be happy and well-adjusted at the expense of being yourself. This film recognizes those realities while exposing the shameful practices and futility of so-called conversion programs. Based on the autobiographical account of Garrard Conley.

"Hunter Killer" (R) --When a U.S. submarine goes missing in icy waters off Russia, intel determines that a coup d'etat is developing and a super-sinister rogue minister is looking to cause World War III. Sub commander Joe Glass (Gerard Butler) is called upon to check it out -- because he's not like those other by-the-book captains, obviously -- while the Navy Seals go in to rescue the kidnapped Russian president. Glass brings his special brand of rule-breaking disaster management, enlisting the help of a salty Russian commander (the late Michael Nyqvist). "The Hunt for Red October," it's not. So batten down the hatches, because



this cheese-action flick has no chill at all.

"Suspiria" (R) -- Talented, ambitious American dancer Susie (Dakota Johnson) is accepted into a renowned German dance company, whose artistic director (Tilda Swinton)

runs a decidedly immersive program. Another student, Patricia (Chloe Grace Moretz), goes missing after outing the dance company to her therapist as a coven of witches. Susie climbs the ranks, while violence and mayhem surround the ritualistic actions of the

dance company. Swinton plays three parts in this film and one is an older German male psychotherapist. I still can't tell if it's supposed to be obvious that it's her under all that latex. That about sums up how I feel about this art-house horror.






